Suc.—By direction of Maj. Gen'l. Banks, I have the honor to inform you that the General Order, issued by authority of Maj. Gen'l. Washburn, at Fort Espeanza, Texas, under date of December 23d, 1863, directing Commissaries to issue fresh beef to officers, free of charge, is disapproved, being in direct contravention of the Army Regulations as well as of General Orders from the War Department. The Commanding General directs that the above mentioned order be at once revoked.
