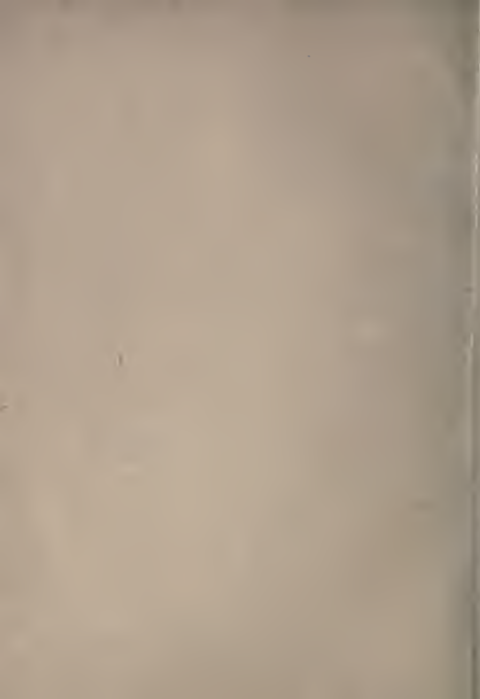

POSTAL INFORMATION.

LETTER POST.—In the United Kingdom, including the Channel Islands: for letters and parcels not exceeding one ounce, *1d.*; not exceeding two ounces, *1½d.*; and *½d.* for every additional two ounces or fraction of two ounces. No letter may exceed 18 inches in length, 9 inches in width, or 6 inches in depth. Unstamped or unpaid letters are charged double postage on delivery; those insufficiently stamped, double the deficiency.

BOOK POST.—The postage on any book packet within the United Kingdom, in a cover open at the ends, and not exceeding 18 inches in length, 9 inches in width, 6 inches in depth, and 5 pounds in weight, is *½d.* for every two ounces, or fraction of two ounces.

NEWSPAPER POST.—Newspapers registered as such at the General Post Office, and so marked, can be sent through the inland post for *½d.*, and abroad, if posted within eight days of publication, at slightly increased rates.

POST CARDS are sold as under:—stout cards, ten for *6d.*, one hundred for *5s.*; thin cards, ten for *5½d.*, 240 for *11s.* Reply post cards: stout cards, five for *6d.*, fifty for *5s.*; thin cards, five for *5½d.*, parcel of 120 for *11s.*

REGISTRATION.—Any letter, newspaper, book, packet, or parcel, duly stamped, may be registered to any place in the United Kingdom and to nearly all places abroad. All letters unquestionably containing coin, posted without registration, are charged on delivery with a fee of *8d.*, in addition to postage; on inland letters, &c., a fee of *2d.* gives compensation for *£5, 3d.* *£10, 4d.* *£15, 5d.* *£20, 6d.* *£25.* Fee to Colonies and Foreign Countries *2d.*

TELEGRAMS.—*6d.* for first 12 words, and *½d.* for each additional word; addresses to be paid for.

PARCELS POST.—Parcels must bear the words “Parcels Post” clearly written in the left-hand top corner. The parcel must not exceed 3 ft. 6 in. in length or 6 ft. for greatest length and girth combined, or 11 lbs. in weight. The rates are:—Not exceeding 1 lb., 3*d.*; and 1½*d.* for every additional lb. or part of a lb. up to 11 lbs.

PATTERN POST.—Packets weighing not more than 4 oz., 1*d.*; over 4 oz. but not more than 6 oz., 1½*d.*; over 6 oz. but not more than 8 oz., 2*d.* No packet to exceed 8 oz. in weight or 12 in. by 8 in. by 4 in. in bulk.

POSTAL ORDERS are issued for fixed sums; those of 1*s.* and 1*s.* 6*d.* at a charge of ½*d.*; 2*s.*, 2*s.* 6*d.*, 3*s.*, 3*s.* 6*d.*, 4*s.*, 4*s.* 6*d.*, 5*s.*, 7*s.* 6*d.*, 10*s.* and 10*s.* 6*d.*, 1*d.*; those of 15*s.* and 20*s.*, 1½*d.* Stamps to the amount of 5*d.* may be affixed to the face of an order to make up broken amounts.

MONEY ORDERS.—The commission on inland orders is:—For sums not exceeding £1, 2*d.*; not exceeding £2, 3*d.*; not exceeding £4, 4*d.*; not exceeding £7, 5*d.*; not exceeding £10, 6*d.*

TELEGRAPH MONEY ORDERS.—These are limited to £10, and are issued between all head and branch offices authorized to transact telegraph and money order business.

FOREIGN POSTAGE.—Letters can be sent at the rate of 2½*d.* per half-ounce to all countries in the world. 1*d.* post cards are now available to all places abroad to which post cards are transmissible, and reply post cards at 2*d.* each for all destinations to which the reply card arrangement at present applies. Newspapers, books, and printed papers generally, ½*d.* per two ounces. Patterns and samples, ½*d.* per two ounces, with a minimum charge of 1*d.* Commercial papers, ½*d.* per two ounces, with a minimum charge of 2½*d.*
