President's Annual Address.

LADIES :

Since last year when you placed in my hands the privilege of guiding the work of the Women's Canadian Club, we have had the most gratifying success both as to the quality and number of lectures, the increased membership and the indications of a general interest in our work by the outside public.

Every member of your Executive has given unflagging enthusiasm to the work, and I think I may say that they have endeavoured to maintain the high standard set by their predecessors and have advanced another step towards the ideals which are held in common by the Canadian Clubs.

Realizing the varied personnel composing the membership and having due consideration for the wide field for our efforts in social and national work, we have had as diverse a programme of lectures as the time at our command would permit, and judging by the excellent averages of attendance and the fact that the membership now stands at over a thousand we may reasonably conclude that the lectures have been attractive and satisfying to the many interests represented by our membership. Only the President and Executive and more especially the Honorary Secretary can quite understand the uncertainty and anxiety of our work. Many attempts, much correspondence, and engagements, sometimes broken, take place before the lecturers appear on the platform, and your Honorary Secretary breathes a sigh of relief when one more lecture becomes an accomplished fact. Sometimes it has happened that we have not been sure whether we would have an audience and no lecturer, or a lecturer and no audience. But "All's well that ends well," and the unfailing attention of the Executive and the harmony which has existed throughout has made these difficulties and uncertainties fall very lightly on our shoulders.

Whenever it has been practicable, and especially in touching upon the bigger and more vital questions involving two distinct points of view, we have tried to present both sides of the question, thus maintaining the underlying motive power of Canadian Clubs—that of neutrality—while encouraging and advancing individual intelligent understanding and judgment.

I wish to take this opportunity of thanking the members for the words of encouragement they have given us from time to time, and also for their suggestions as to speakers and subjects which have always received the careful consideration of the Executive. To the Honorary Secretary, Mrs. Tyrrell, for her able and enthusiastic assistance, and to Mrs. Ramsay, our Honorary Treasurer, for her splendid work in managing the finances of the Club, especially since the work has become so heavy, I would like to extend my most grateful thanks.

Owing to the fact that many professional and business women have joined this year and have taken an active interest in the Club, it has been necessary to make the hour of our lectures as late as possible and also sometimes to hold meetings on Saturday afternoon.

It is unfortunate that this arrangement may be inconvenient to some women and interfere with social functions and domestic arrangements. But in view of the fact that we only have meetings once, or at most twice a month, and that while all can stretch a point and attend a late lecture occasionally, for some it is utterly impossible to come early at any time, and the Executive have felt they must do what seems best for the membership as a whole, trusting in the sympathetic co-operation of the members and a generous spirit of give and take in a club of such diverse interests. A number of minor rules made solely for the purpose of preserving the dignity and standing of this Society as a private club have been pretty generally accepted and loyally adhered to by the members, and the Executive wish to express their appreciation of the support they have received in this respect.

All the lectures delivered this year have been recorded verbatim and carefully filed. Whether in time the Club should feel in a position, financially, to publish these valuable papers is a matter for future consideration. In the meantime, the Executive have decided that it would be in keeping with the broad educational spirit of our work to throw these papers open for reference, or as a loan to other societies for the purpose of readings at their meetings. The Women's Institutes have already requested this privilege.

When the future history of Canada is written it is obvious to those who grasp the scope and possibilities of our Club work that the Canadian Club movement will be accorded an important and conspicuous place as a factor in the moulding and strengthening of Canadian character. The units which compose this simple and elastic organization are now working in many towns of every province, attracting hundreds and thousands of men and women who, feeling the promptings of scattered and undefined ideas and ideals of patriotism and national responsibility, only need the crystalizing influence of just such an organization in order to weld them into concrete definite form.

Lord Grey said not very long ago, "If I were asked, 'What has Canada given to the world?' I would reply—'The Canadian Clubs.'" Lord Grey's quick perception of the things which matter—the things which are going to leave their mark upon national character, pointed with absolute accuracy to the present significance and growing power of Canadian Clubs. He saw the need for an awakening of national spirit and the encouragement of public opinion, and realized with clear vision that in the Canadian Clubs we have an organization unique in its formation, separated from all party or sectional influence, independent as individual bodies, yet, nevertheless, bound together by the strongest ties of mutual sympathy and unity of purpose. A unity of purpose based on the fostering of all those ideals which have always been an integral part of the

British character. To this end are the Canadian Clubs of Canada pledged, though it may be that the goal is reached by devious ways of thought and action.

In this noble work the women of Canada claim an equal and inseparable share of study and work, and thus have a definite and personal responsibility as women in the great questions which must ultimately safeguard our destiny as a Nation and Empire.

To this end we must study the problems of National and Imperial Defence, the necessity for the improving of the Emigration Laws and Naturalization Laws, the closer trade relations between the different nations composing the Empire, the encouragement and welcome of our own kith and kin of British stock as emigrants, thus following the splendid example of our sisters of Australia and New Zealand. To the study of all questions which will help to solve and make possible the splendid accomplishment of Imperial Federation, I trust the Women's Canadian Clubs as well as those of the men will devote all the energy and foresight of which they are capable.

In closing, I desire to extend to the New Executive and to the Club in general my heartfelt wishes for its continued prosperity and increasing influence in all that counts above and beyond things material in the cherishing and development of those ideals which make for what is really precious in the life of a nation.

Honorary Secretary's Annual Report.

MADAM PRESIDENT AND LADIES :

It is a great pleasure in presenting the Fourth Annual Report of the Canadian Women's Club of Toronto, to tell of the great progress made during this year, so that now it is not only the largest Women's Canadian Club in Canada, but is also the largest body of women in one organization. There are other organizations with perhaps more members, but broken up into units. There is a membership of 1,006, an increase of 555 during the year. This is due to two causes—first to a large number of teachers who were thinking of forming another Women's Canadian Club. Our Executive appointed the President, Miss Boulton, and the Second Vice-President, Dr. Helen MacMurphy, as a delegation to confer with the teachers. When it was found possible to arrange for our meetings to be held at a later hour in the afternoon, the teachers gave up the idea of a separate Canadian Club.

The second cause of the increase was due to the splendid course of lectures that the Executive have been able to provide. People became really interested, and at each meeting of the Executive Committee there were many new names brought up for membership. One old member said to me, "Whether I want to attend the lectures or not I have to, because I must hear them."

The President, Miss Boulton, has not only possessed vision, but from her large experience in women's work knew what women were specially working for and thinking of; therefore she has endeavored to procure lecturers to speak upon subjects of live and real interest. Miss Boulton has thrown her whole soul into the work of this Club, and soul always counts wherever you find it.

The officers and members of the Executive have taken a keen interest in the work of the Club. There

have been fourteen meetings of the Executive Committee held during the year, all of which were well attended and most harmonious. These things all tended to make the year 1911-1912 the most successful year of the Women's Canadian Club of Toronto. Next year, with the help of the members, the Club ought to grow to 1,500 or 2,000.

In January, at a short business meeting, two new members were added to the Executive Committee. These were Miss Eubank and Miss Melville, representing the teachers, and they have proved a great addition by their wise and business-like understanding of the needs of the Club.

These were both most interesting and gave some idea of the work carried on by the other Women's Canadian Clubs of the country.

Also Report of Third Annual Conference of Associations of Canadian Clubs.

The Commission of Conservation at Ottawa has most kindly sent us copies of its reports, one on "Prevention and Pollution of Canadian Surface Waters," one with accompanying maps on "The Great Water-Powers of Canada," and another on "The Conservation of Mines, Fisheries and Forests."

One of the new members, Mrs. Stephenson, who is much interested in Social Reform, has sent two books by J. S. Woodworth, "Strangers within Our Gates, or Coming Canadians," and "My Neighbour; a study of City Conditions, a Plea for Social Service." The Club is getting quite a library and will soon have to add a Librarian to the list of Officers, so that the Reports and books may be kept in one place to be referred to by any of the members.

During the year the following invitations have been received to meet with other Societies :

1. From Civic Guild to a Course of Lectures by Mr. Manson, on "Civic Planning."
2. From the Canadian Institute to a Lecture by Prof. Bryce, on "Technical Education."
3. From the Nurses' Association to an Address by Dr. Cabot, on "Social Service."
4. From the Social Study Club to an Address by Miss Clara Brett Martin, on "Laws Regarding Women in Ontario."

During the season there have been ten lectures.

We were disappointed in many that we had hoped to have, but those that we did have were sufficiently interesting to bring out splendid audiences. Never has the attendance been under 300, and at several lectures the full capacity of the Hall (850) was taxed to its utmost.

The first lecture of the season was given in November by Lady Fraser. In a very simple, though most interesting way, Lady Fraser told of the great awakening of the high-class women in India. How they were coming from the Zenanas and beginning to take their part in the great Woman Movement of the World.

In December, we heard Mrs. Pankhurst, the great leader of the English Women's Franchise Movement. While many of us may not have agreed with all Mrs. Pankhurst said, yet she told us much of the need and misery in the great class of working women, and how many little children were neglected and suffering under the present poor laws made for their protection. The intelligent help and sympathy of women all over the world was needed to place these down-trodden and helpless ones on a better footing.

In January, Miss Beatrice Forbes-Robertson gave an exceedingly interesting lecture on "The Drama as a Social Teacher." She traced the Drama from the

early Greek plays down to the present time, and showed how the better class plays aimed to teach in an interesting, yet impressive way, many great truths. Miss Forbes-Robertson illustrated her lecture with several short readings from "The Servant in the House."

On February 1st, Professor Coleman, of Toronto University, gave an illustrated lecture on "Mining in Ontario." He showed the early beginnings of mining in the Province at Silver Islet, and from that took us on a most delightful trip to the Nickel Mines at Copper Cliff, Sudbury, and then to the great silver camp at Cobalt. This showed something of the inheritance that is ours as Canadians. He touched also on the human side of the life of the miner and his family.

On February 16th and 17th we had two lectures on "Sikh Immigration." The first was by the Reverend Doctor Wilkie who has spent many years of his life in India. He told us why the Sikhs should be admitted into Canada. They were British subjects, very intelligent and have power to profit by education, and possessed the capacity of making good citizens. In Canada, this is a very grave question to settle, for in India's great need the Sikhs came forward to help preserve the British Empire. If repulsed now, and a time arose when their help should be needed, would not the Empire suffer?

The following day, Mr. Stevens, M. P. for Vancouver, presented the British Columbia side of the question. While dealing with the matter from a political standpoint, he made it very clear that there was a great danger to Canada in admitting any Asiatics. They were taking the work away from the white labourers and driving suitable settlers out of the country. He would exclude all Chinese, Japanese and Hindus and give European settlers a chance. This is a white man's country, and as custodians of the present, we have to hand it down unsullied to the future. It is impossible to make Canadians from these Asiatics. Their ideals and traditions are different and intermarriage is not at all practicable.

Both sides of this important national question were certainly presented most faithfully by these two lecturers.

On the first of March, Doctor Wilfrid Campbell, the Canadian Poet Laureate, came from Ottawa to speak to us. The President, Miss Boulton, was unavoidably absent from the city, but Mrs. George Dickson, the First Vice-President, most capably filled her place. Doctor Campbell's subject was "The Responsibility of Women to the Race."

He spoke of the many evils of the present day, religious, moral, and social, and to right them they must be faced by men and women shoulder to shoulder, not each clamouring for separate rights, but true to the traditions of the noble men and women who have made this country the pleasant land it is to-day.

At the request of Mrs. Dickson, Doctor Campbell then read several of his beautiful poems, which closed one of the most interesting lectures of the year.

On March 14th, Miss Ruth Rouse, Travelling Secretary of the World's Student Christian Federation, gave a most enlightening address on "Women Students in many Lands." She told of the work that was being done all over the world to help women students to a higher plane of religion and morals. Miss Rouse in her work last year visited forty-one countries, and she gave many interesting incidents that had come under her notice. Some of these were amusing, but showed also a very pathetic side.

On March 29th, Mrs. Rossiter Johnson of New York gave a lecture on "Why Women should not Vote." The Executive felt that after having heard Mrs. Pankhurst, the other side of this great question of the enfranchisement of women should be presented to the Club. Through our able and business-like Honorary Treasurer, Mrs. Allan Ramsay, we were able to get Mrs. Rossiter Johnson to speak. She spoke very simply but convincingly to many. The great dread of the Nation in giving the franchise to women was in

breaking up the home, which we all agreed with her in thinking the most sacred and holy institution on the earth. Then she spoke of the evil that might result from putting power into such hands as the Mormon women and other women who would use it to degrade instead of elevating womanhood.

To-day we are to have the pleasure of hearing an address from Doctor Charles Hodgetts, Medical Adviser to the Commission of Conservation, on "Housing and City Planning from a Public Health Standpoint." This is to be illustrated by many slides of the condition of over-crowding in our own city and to show us how other cities have coped with the same difficulty, so that we may find some solution of the Toronto problem. This interesting subject ought to give us food for thought during the summer months.

Where, ladies, could such lectures be obtained for ten cents a piece, except at the Women's Canadian Club of Toronto?

Women's lives are perhaps in many ways confined and narrow, and if the Executive has given the members not only pleasure in this course of lectures, but also has kept before them the ideals of the Club in broadening their outlook along social, national and patriotic lines, so that the common round, the trivial task, has been brightened and we are better mothers, wiser teachers, more intelligent sisters and daughters, the work of the Executive, though oftentimes arduous and wearying, has *not* been in vain.
