


















## **DEDICATION**


Dr. Richards sets a good example for us students through his leadership roles in several organizations within our county and state. His outgoing personality and service to our college distinguish him as an excellent president.

## HISTORY OF UNC-D



The University of North Carolina—Dobson was founded in 1716 by Jed Clampett as he was passing through Surry County on his way to California. The school was started in a one-room shack and was originally called Surry Community College. It offered only three basic classes: readin, 'ritin,' and 'rithmetic. The population of Surry County rose astronomically after the technological breakthrough of the invention of the plow. Increased food production resulted in a baby boom, which later inspired the college to begin offering specialty courses in quilting, wood cutting, and fundamental mule grooming. These classes were soon full, and there was a waiting list to get into the college. The trustees of the college recognized a growing need for education in Surry County and from this point on, the college expanded quickly.

Over the years UNC-D has developed into one of the finest institutions for higher learning in the continental United States, comparable only to Harvard and Yale in its high academic standards and educational excellence.

Today UNC-D still centers around the point where that one-room schoolhouse called Surry Community College was once located. Currently, there are seventy-five buildings on the UNC-D campus, with twenty of those buildings housing students from all over the world who have chosen to continue their education here. We students of the LANCER staff are proud of the history of our fair school.




