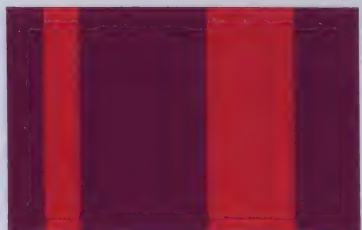
STUDENT LIFE

HOME COMING

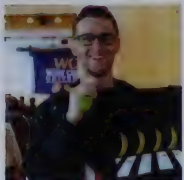

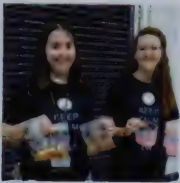
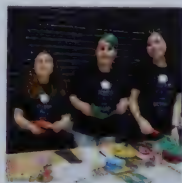
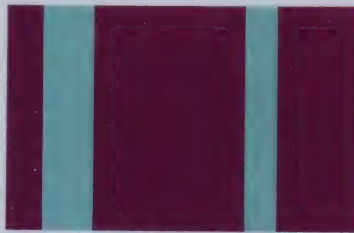
MR. WCU

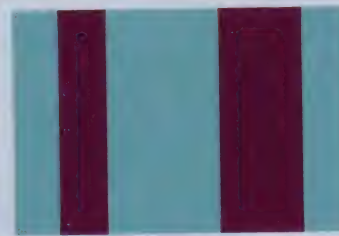
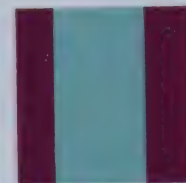

MEN'S BASKETBALL

The fifteen player men's basketball team was led by coaches Damien Blair, Roy Blumenthal, and Dane Watts. The team played a total of thirty games and won twenty of them. Some of the most competitive games they had this season were against Gannon University and Lock Haven University, where the scores were 73-72 and 87-84, respectively. In addition, they were able to make it all the way to the PSAC Championship game. The team played against Bloomsburg University in the PSAC Quarterfinals and won 99-89. In the semifinals they won 77-76 against Gannon University. Although they did not take the Championship game, they fought hard against East Stroudsburg University. Due to their performances on the court, senior Troy Hockaday and junior Cory Blake were chosen for the All-PSAC East team.





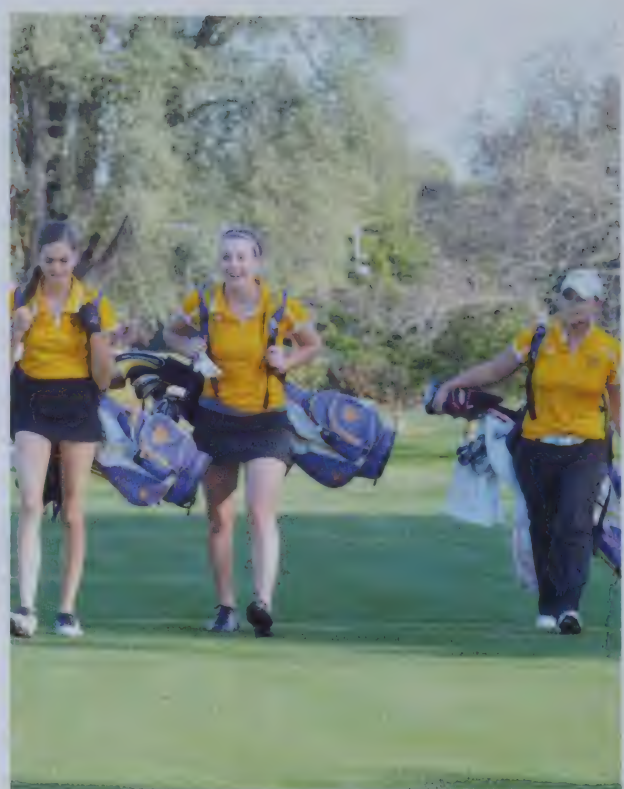
WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

The thirteen players of the women's basketball team were headed by coaches Deirdre Kane, Kiera Wooden, Bridget Carlin, and Mary Fromhartz. The team had a busy season playing twenty-eight games and winning nineteen of them. They played and won against many teams including Lock Haven University, Shippensburg University, and Edinboro University. During the season, they were able to maintain a few winning streaks, with six games being the longest streak. Three players were honored with the chance to represent West Chester University on the 2013-2014 All-PSAC East Women's Basketball squad. The players were junior Kendal Benovy, and sophomores Dallas Ely and Brittany Sicinski.

MEN'S GOLF

Under the coaching of Harry Hammond, seven members of the men's golf team played in matches across Pennsylvania, as well as in West Virginia, North Carolina, Delaware, and New York. The team had overall low rounds in the first rounds of the Howard "Bud" Elwell Fall Classic and the Cecil Spadafora Invitational with a score of 293. Fifty times throughout the season, individual players scored between 70-76; also having ten team low rounds ranging from 293 to 301. The team tied for third at the PSAC golf championships, placed second at the Goldey-Beacom Spring Invitational, and finished in third at the Cottrell Invitational—among many other honorable placements throughout the year.





WOMEN'S GOLF

The 2013-2014 team consisted of five members under the coaching of Doug Hendricks. The team placed fifth at the Randolph-Macon tournament, finished third at the Kutztown Spring Invitational, and second in the ESU Invitational—among many other honorable placements throughout the year. The top fifty individual player low round scores ranged from 77 to 89. The lowest team rounds were in the second round of the Michael Corbett Fall Classic with 334, and in the second round of the PSAC Championship with 335.

MEN'S SOCCER

The twenty-five person men's soccer team was led by Michael Benn and Mark Fetrow. The team played nineteen games of which they won thirteen, lost four, and tied in two. Although they did well the whole season, the team performed especially well towards the end when they maintained a winning streak of ten games. Highlights of the season include four of the team's players making it onto the All-PASC team, and three of the players honored with positions on the 2013 Daktronics All-Atlantic Region Team. The players that made it onto the All-PASC team are junior Dan Venuto, senior Conor Malrney, sophomore Ryan Shultz, and freshman Miguel Ross. Conor Malarney, Dan Venuto, and Miguel Ross were also on the Daktronics All-Atlantic Region Team. The team also made it into the PSAC Semifinals beating Shippensburg University in a close game ending in a score of 1-0 with overtime.

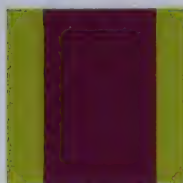

WOMEN'S SOCCER

The women's soccer team of thirty-two players was led by Betty Ann Kempf Townsley and Chris Przemieniecki. The team had a great season, winning thirteen out of twenty-one games, also earning a spot in the PSAC Championship. To make it into the championship game, team played hard in the Quarterfinals and Semifinals against Kutztown University and Gannon University, respectively. In addition, some of the players were honored with the opportunity of playing on teams outside of the University team. Senior Noelle Harner and juniors Carly Yost and Dana Hunt were on the All-PSAC Team. Junior Cara Deola was on the Academic All-District Team. Noelle Harner and Carly Yost also made it onto the NSCAA/ Continental Tire NCAA Team. Additionally, Noelle Harner played on the Daktronics All-Atlantic Region Team.

MEN'S TENNIS

With ten team members under the coaching of Tina Tharp, the team finished with an overall record of six wins and ten losses. The team played within Pennsylvania, New York and New Jersey, and traveled to Florida in early March for matches against St. Thomas Aquinas College, Florida Southern College, and South Eastern University. Senior JJ Cooke won the PSAC Champion Scholar Award, and Jared Howatt was named the men's PSAC Tennis Athlete of the Week in April.



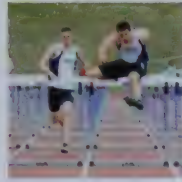
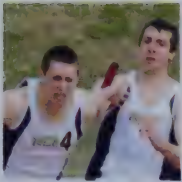


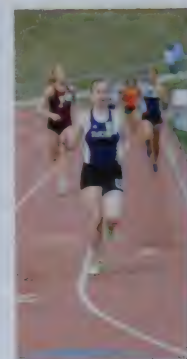
WOMEN'S TENNIS

The thirteen player women's tennis team had a winning season with a total of eleven wins out of twenty-one matches. During their regular season, the women played and won matches against universities including East Stroudsburg University, Cheyney University, and Millersville University. In the PSAC Tournament they made it into the Semifinals after defeating Kutztown University in the Quarterfinals with a score of 5-1.

MEN'S TRACK

Under the coaching of Andrew Huber and Pat Mosley, the men's track and field roster consisted of twenty-six members. Junior Eric Hunter topped a 25-year old pole vaulting record, clearing 15 feet, 9³/₄ inches during the indoor season's Kutztown Invitational in January. Among several other achievements during the indoor season, the 4x200 relay team of Ricky Bruno, Ryan Heimbach, Alexander Foulke, and Nick Drodze set a new school record with a time of 1:331.62 at the Collegeville Indoor Classic. The Golden Rams placed seventh at the 2014 PSAC Indoor Track and Field Championships at Bucknell University. In June, the men's track and field team became one of the 50 institutions named on the team all-academic list for 2013-2014, being honored for academic success with a cumulative GPA of 3.15 during the academic year.



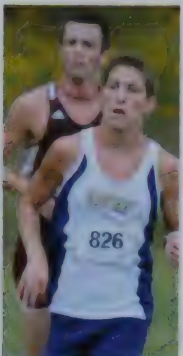
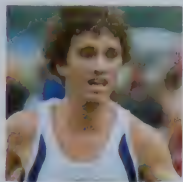
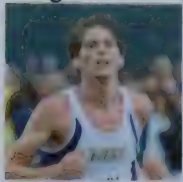


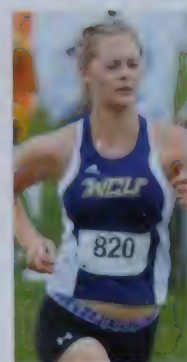
WOMEN'S TRACK

Under the coaching of Andrew Huber and Pat Mosley, the women's track and field team consisted of thirty-one members. The team had three wins and three second place finishes, ultimately leading them to first place at the Collegeville Indoor Classic at Ursinus College. At the Kutztown Maroon & Gold Indoor Invitational, Devan Kerecman set a new WCU record, clearing 10 feet, 11½ in the pole vault, while Kayla Owens set a new WCU indoor record in the weight throw of 11-4¼. Kerecman's record now has the second longest vault ever at WCU. At the PSAC Championships, Kayla Owens placed third in the discus, and proved a top shot putter in the conference. In June, the women's track and field team became one of the 105 institutions named on the team all-academic list for 2013-2014, being honored for academic success with a cumulative GPA of 3.35 during the academic year.

MEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

With ten members and seven races, the men's cross country team had a successful season. In September, the team placed second at the Mansfield Invitational (5k), with four runners in the top ten. The team placed eleventh in the Division II/III Challenge (8k) in Kutztown, with Zack Musselman joining the top 50 with a time of 27:08, Andrew Dombrowiecki finishing with a time of 27:49, Jake Sigel with 28:06, and James Vadas with 28:38. The team also finished ninth at the Lock Haven University Invitational, eleventh at the PSAC Championships, and thirteenth at the NCAA Regionals at Lock Haven. At the Blue and Gold Invitational at White Clay Creek State Park, WCU had five runners in the top twenty-one—with Zack Musselman placing fourth with a time of 27:30, James Vadas in fifteenth place with 28:32, Andrew Dombrowlecki in seventeenth at 28:44, Chris Bucci in nineteenth at 28:57, and Jake Sigel in twenty-first with 29:04.



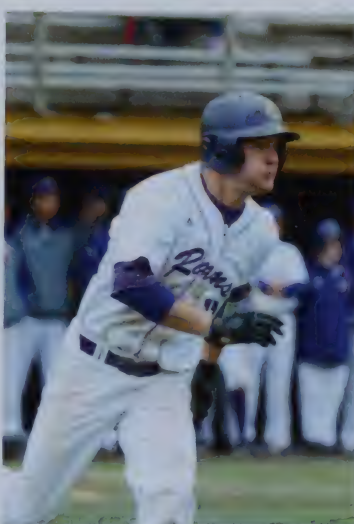


WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

In their first race of the year, the WCU women's cross country team raced to third place at the Mansfield Invitational, with Amanda Eisman finished in fourth place with a time of 18:42, Leigh Manning Smith finishing seventh, and Mallory Drake placing ninth in her inaugural college run. At the Division II/III Cross Country Challenge in Kutztown, Amanda Eismann made her mark by racing to the second best time in WCU history, finishing in ninth place. Overall, the team placed seventh in the competition. The women's cross country team also placed second at the Lock Haven University Invitational, tenth in the PSAC Championships, and twelfth at NCAA Regionals.

BASEBALL

During their most recent season, the twenty-nine man baseball team headed by Jad Prachniak and Ryan Giblin won twenty-five out of forty-three games. The highlights of the season include the Division II Spring Baseball Tournament in Virginia and the 2014 Baseball Invitational in Florida. In the tournament, the team played three games and won two of them and in the invitational they won three out of four games. In addition, three team members were honored to play on the 2014 PSAC Baseball All-League Squad. The players were senior Kyle Weary, junior Matt Petrizzi, and sophomore Justin Roman. The team was also ranked eighth in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Association Division II Atlantic Region Poll.





SOFTBALL

During their very busy and successful season, the twenty-three woman softball team coached by Diane Lokey and Margaret Kichler played a total of fifty-five games. Out of the fifty-five games, the team won thirty-six of them. The highlight of the season was undoubtedly the PSAC East regular-season championship. The team played against Edinboro University, Shippensburg University, and Gannon University to be able to claim the title of champions of the Eastern Division. At the beginning of the season the team played in the Shaw Tournament in North Carolina where they won three out of four games. They also went to Florida to play in the Dot Richardson Spring Games where they played nine games and won five. Other highlights of the season include doubleheader wins against universities such as Mansfield, Shippensburg, and Millersville.

FOOTBALL

The football team of ninety-four players were led by coaches Bill Zwaan, Gerald Toney, Mike Furlong, Osagie Osunde, Bill Zwaan Jr., Jim Brazill Sr., Nick Sama, and Jojo Patrick. They had a great season winning thirteen out of fifteen games, which won them the title of Division II ECAC Meadowlands Football Award Winner. In addition, six of the players were honored with the opportunity to be on the 2013 Don Hansen FB Gazette All-Super Region 1 Team. Those players are seniors Rondell White, Trey Farmer, Justin Bathurst as well as juniors Dereck Schatz, Ronell Williams, and Al-Hajj Shabazz. Fourteen players earned positions on the All-PSAC East Team. The six players on the Don Hansen Team were included in the roster. The other players on the time were Adam Citko, James Colivas, Erick Brundidge, Andrew Cohen, Eric Edwers, Mike Labor, Shawn Krautzel, and Shawn Leo.



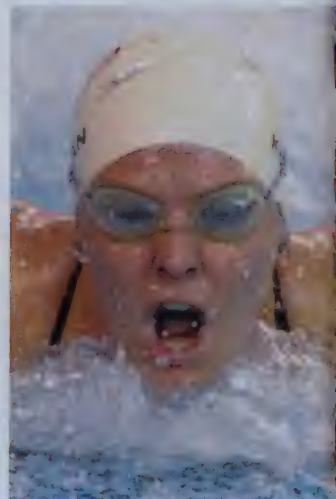


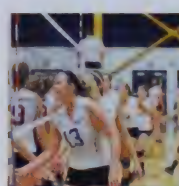
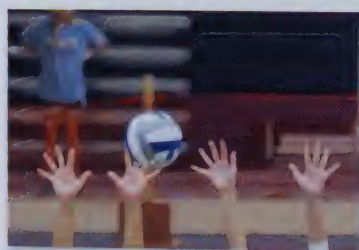
WOMEN'S RUGBY

The women's rugby team of forty-one players was led by Tony DeRemer. The team had an extremely successful season. They played seventeen games and won twelve of them. They crushed most of their opponents including Kutztown, Temple, and Princeton. In addition, they were champions of the Mason-Dixon Tournament where they defeated Virginia Tech, East Carolina University, and the University of North Carolina. After the Mason-Dixon Tournament they went on to play in the USA Nationals. The women won against Georgia Tech in the first round with a score of 63-26. Then they triumphed against the University of New Mexico in the quarterfinals winning 48-14. The team's hard work and dedication is admirable and is sure to bring them even more successful seasons in the future.

SWIMMING

The men's and women's teams swam their way to a very successful year. The men's team achieved several victories, leading them to nationals in Ohio in early March. Among many team and individual achievements, Victor Polyakov was named the PSAC Male Swimmer of the Week in November and set the DII national record in the 500 Free at the Frank Elm Invitational. Of the eighteen male divers selected for the 2014 NCAA Division II Men's and Women's Diving Championships, two were WCU's own, Christian Parker and Tim Cenja. Aside from swimming accomplishments, the team was honored for academic excellence with a 3.03 cumulative GPA, and ranked among the Top 30 academically throughout the Division II program. The women's team claimed several victories prior to contributing to WCU's eighth straight PSAC championship title. Kitty Fischer won a national title, breaking her own record in the 200-yard individual medley at the NCAA Division II Women's Swimming and Diving Championships, where WCU placed fourth. Fischer was also named Female Swimmer of the Year at nationals. The women's team was also recognized for their academic excellence with a cumulative 3.34 GPA in the Fall, and placed among the Top 15 academically in Division II.





VOLLEYBALL

The women's volleyball team of nineteen dedicated players were led by coaches Kassie Bellaver and Jim Holdren. The Lady Rams were only one game away from a winning season with sixteen wins and seventeen losses. Some of the highlights of the season include the Kutztown Tournament, and their games against Cheyney University and East Stroudsburg University. At the Kutztown Tournament they played against three other schools and won against all three. They played Cheyney twice and one both times 3-0. They also played East Stroudsburg twice and won both games by a long shot. In addition to playing well, the players are also excellent scholars. They were recognized for their academic achievements by the American Volleyball Coaches' Association. The team managed to keep a 3.345 grade point average this past year.

LACROSSE

The twenty-eight woman lacrosse team was headed by coaches Ginny Martino and Sue Burmester. Through hard work and dedication, the team was able to win twelve out of seventeen games this season. They also made it into the semifinals of the PSAC Tournament by winning in the quarterfinals against Seton Hill University. In addition, five of the women earned positions on the 2014 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference all-league women's lacrosse squad. Those players were seniors Juliane Williams and Jess Henderson, junior Sarah Dennison, sophomore Hannah Cowan, and freshman Dina Cifelli. Other highlights from the season include a five game winning streak, as well as their games against Kutztown University and Shippensburg University where the final scores were 22-3 and 20-5, respectively.



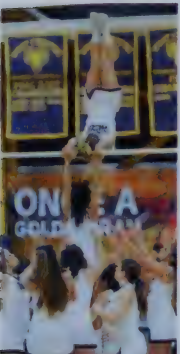


FIELD HOCKEY

The women's field hockey team of twenty-one players were led by Amy Cohen. The season was a winning season with a total of fourteen wins and six losses. Their longest winning streak was five games and in four of them, the other team did not score any points. The team played and won against many teams, including East Stroudsburg University, Kutztown University, and Bloomsburg University. Due to their success on the field, the women received many awards and recognitions. Seniors Kelsi Lykens, Stef Pirri, Megan Callanan, and Nancy Stehman made it onto the 2013 Longstreth/NFHCA Division II Field Hockey All-America Team. Kelsi Lykens, Stef Pirri, Megan Callanan were also on the 2013 ECAC Division II Field Hockey Team. In addition to playing very well, they are academically successful. Thirteen of the players were recognized for maintaining a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.

CHEERLEADING

The sixteen woman cheerleading team of West Chester University was led by Kelly Moyer. The team has been involved in many events in the area and has also set aside time to help the community. The first event of the season was Rally with the Rams where they spent time exciting fans for the first football scrimmage of the year. Later in the season they cheered at the Pink Out, the Chili Cook Off, and the Christmas parade. Not only did the women spend time promoting school spirit and putting smiles on everybody's face, they also contributed to the community by participating in Adopt-A-Block and mentored a middle school cheer team. Through their hard work, dedication, and enthusiasm, the team was able to excite and inspire many fans of WCU and along the way, they touched the lives of those they encountered.





GYMNASTICS

Barbara Cordova and Sherri Missimer coached the gymnastics team of eighteen women. The team played a total of seventeen games and ended the season with eight wins. The highlights of the season include the ECAC Championships and the USAG Collegiate Nationals. At the ECAC DII Gymnastics Championships, the team placed second overall. In addition, due to their stunning performance, three participants received individual honors. Freshman Majesta Valentine was named ECAC Rookie of the Year, sophomore Meghan Brannon was chosen as Specialist of the Year, and senior Emily Seigel was named Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Six gymnasts participated in the USA Gymnastics Collegiate Nationals. 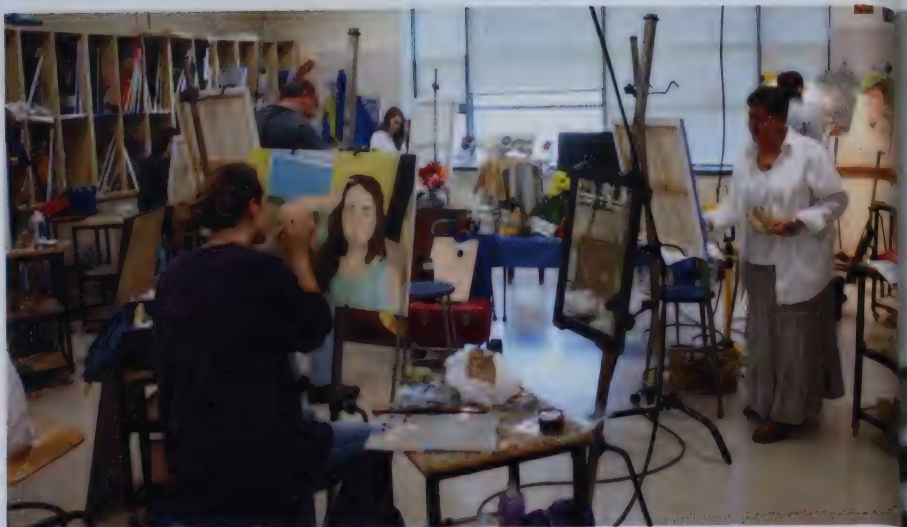
COLLEGE OF BUSINESS AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS

COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

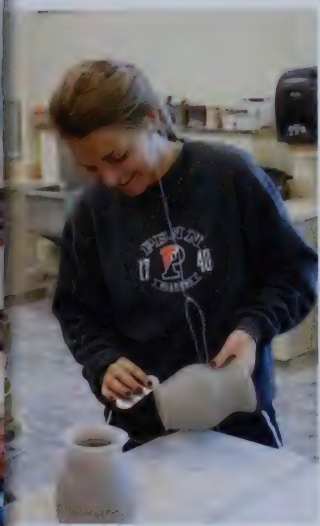
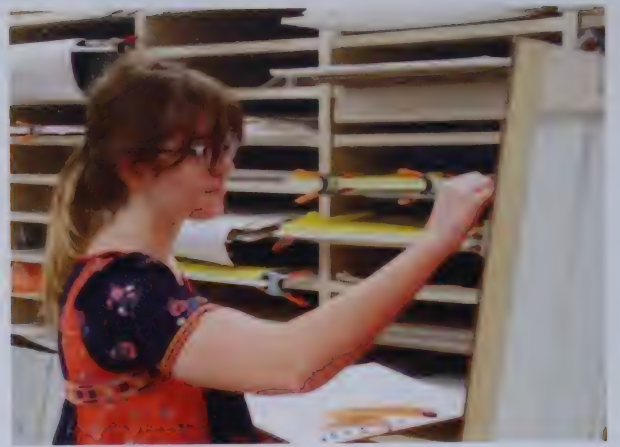
