Eschatology -- the Doctrine of the Last Things

This is all about the end of the story, the eternal end of the drama of redemption.

Individual Eschatology

- 1. The Nature of Physical Death Matthew 10:28
 - 1. Termination of physical life by the separation of body and soul.
 - 2. Not annihilation or cessation of existence, but cutting off of the natural relations of life.
- 2. The Connection Between Sin and Death
 - 1. Sin introduced death into the world -- Romans 5:12
 - 2. Jesus Christ has conquered sin and death -- Romans 5:17
- 3. The Significance of the Death of Believers
 - 1. Not a punishment -- Romans 8:1
 - 2. Rather: puts an end to sin and is an entrance into eternal life
 - 3. Also works for the sanctification of God's people in this life. The anticipation and observation of death has a beneficial effect: humbles the proud, puts to death the flesh, checks worldliness, fosters spiritual-mindedness.

The Intermediate State

- 1. Sheol and Hades
 - 1. Sometimes the place of punishment for the wicked (hell) Deut. 32:22
 - 2. Sometimes the condition or state of death Psalm 89:48
 - 3. Sometimes the literal grave Psalm 16:10
- 2. Roman Catholic Concepts of the Intermediate State
 - 1. Purgatory
 - 2. Limbus Patrum
 - 3. Limbus Infantum
- 3. Soul sleep
 - 1. Jehovah's Witnesses and others
 - 2. But see Matthew 17:3, Moses and Elijah speaking with Jesus.
- 4. Annihilationism
 - 1. Those who continue in sin are deprived of immortality and destroyed.
 - 2. But see Luke 16:19-31 and many other passages which speak of a hell of eternal, conscious torment for those who do not believe.

The Second Coming of Christ

- 1. Events Preceding the Second Coming
 - 1. The Drawing in of the Fullness of the Elect Mt. 24:14, Mk.13:10
 - 2. The Conversion of Israel (?) Rom. 11:25-32
 - 3. The Coming of Antichrist 1 John 2:18
 - 4. Various signs and wonders Mt. 24:29-30, Mk. 13:24-25, Lk.21:25-26
 - i. Wars
 - ii. Famines
 - iii. Earthquakes
 - iv. False prophets, etc.
- 2. The Second Coming Itself
 - 1. Personal Acts 1:11, 3:20-21, Mt. 24:44
 - 2. Physical Acts 1:11, Heb. 9:28, Rev. 1:7
 - 3. Visible Mt. 24:30, Mk. 13:26, Titus 2:13
 - 4. Sudden 1 Thess. 5:2-3, Mt. 25:1-12, Rev. 16:15
 - 5. Glorious and Triumphant Heb. 9:28, Mt. 24:30, Rev. 19:11-16
- 3. The Purpose of the Second Coming
 - 1. To inaugurate the age to come in which God will be all in all.

The Millennium

- 1. The Issue
 - 1. How do we interpret Revelation 20:1-6? Is there a literal 1000 year kingdom of Jesus Christ and if so, when does it take place?
- 2. Postmillennialism
 - 1. Some Reformed people have held this position.
 - 2. The second coming of Christ will follow the millennium
 - 3. Christianity expands and the world gradually becomes Christianized.
 - 4. But: what about the theology of the cross? Cf. Mark 10:21, etc.
 - 5. What about the sufferings mentioned in Matthew 24?
- 3. Premillennialism
 - 1. Very popular today in broader Christian circles. Theology of "Left Behind" books and films.
 - 2. A number of varieties. One looks like this:
 - i. Christ wanted to establish his kingdom among the Jews, but failed.
 - ii. The Church was plan B, a distinct entity separate from Israel.
 - iii. Rapture occurs
 - iv. Period of tribulation, during which Israel is converted
 - v. Christ returns to earth to judge the nations and rules for 1000 years. The tribulation saints are resurrected.

- vi. Antichrist is destroyed
- vii. Christ and his saints rule in Jerusalem, the temple is restored and so is the sacrificial worship.
- viii. The world is converted.
 - ix. After 1000 years, there is a final battle with Satan. Satan is cast into the bottomless pit.
 - x. Resurrection of unbelievers and final judgement.
- 3. But: how do we understand apocalyptic literature? Literal or symbolic?
- 4. What about those Scriptures which portray the kingdom as a present reality? Cf. Matthew 11:12, 12:28, Luke 17:21, John 18:36,37, Col. 1:13
- 5. What about those passages which speak about the resurrection of the righteous taking place at the last day? John 6:39,40,44,54; 11:24
- 4. Amillennialism
 - 1. Most Reformed people today hold this view.
 - 2. The millennium is a present reality. Christ reigns now.
 - 3. The Church is the continuation of Israel, not its (temporary) replacement.
 - 4. The rapture takes place when Christ returns, it is another way of expressing the resurrection of believers.

The Resurrection

- 1. Definition
 - 1. At the return of Christ, the dead will be raised (cf. 1 Cor. 15)
- 2. Character
 - 1. Bodily Rom. 8:23, 1 Cor. 6:13-20, Rom. 8:11, 1 Cor. 15
 - 2. Involves both the Just and the Unjust John 5:28,29
 - 3. Unequal for the Just and the Unjust
 - i. The just \rightarrow deliverance and glorification
 - ii. The unjust \rightarrow shame and the extreme penalty of eternal death.
- 3. Time
 - 1. At the return of Christ, at the last day 1 Cor. 15:23, 1 Thess. 4:16
 - 2. Immediately preceding the final judgement John 5:27-29, Rev. 20:11-15

The Last Judgment

- 1. The Judge and his assistants
 - 1. Christ is the judge Matthew 25:31,32, John 5:27
 - 2. The angels will assist Matthew 13:41, Matthew 24:31
 - 3. The saints will also have a role -1 Cor. 6:2-3, Rev. 20:4
- 2. The Parties that will be judged

- 1. Every individual of the human race 2 Cor. 5:10, Rev. 20:12
- 2. Satan and his demons Matt. 8:29, 1 Cor. 6:3, Jude 6
- 3. Time of the judgment
 - 1. At the end of the age
 - 2. Immediately after the resurrection of the dead John 5:28-29
- 4. The Standard of Judgment
 - 1. The revealed will of God
 - i. Law of nature (written on the hearts of all)
 - ii. Old Testament Revelation (Jews)
 - iii. New and Old Testament Revelation (Christians)
 - 2. Degrees of punishment and reward Mt. 11:22,24, Luke 12:47-48, Luke 20:47, 2 Cor. 9:7,

The Final State

- 1. The Wicked
 - 1. A hell of eternal, conscious torment Rev. 20:7-15.
 - 2. The state in which they will exist: totally deprived of divine favour, recipients of divine wrath. Degrees of punishment commensurate with their sinning against the light they had received.
 - 3. Duration will be eternal Mark 9:43,48.
- 2. The Righteous
 - 1. The New Creation
 - 1. The present world will pass away Heb. 12:27, 2 Pet. 3:13
 - 2. A new creation established Rev. 21:1
 - 2. The Eternal Abode of the Righteous
 - 1. A place called heaven the house of the Father (John 14:2)
 - 2. Not only heaven, but the entire new creation Mt. 5:5, Rev. 21:1-3
 - 3. In this abode, the righteous will enjoy perfect communion with God and eternal bliss 1 Cor. 2:9
 - 4. There will be degrees in the blessedness of heaven (2 Cor.9:6), but there will be no discontent
