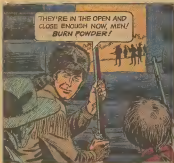


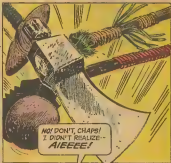












Osceola, Seminole Chief



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The word "Seminole" means outlanders or runaways in the language of the Creek Indians. The Seminole tribes of Florida had emigrated to Florida after breaking away from the Creeks in Georgia.

For many years the Seminoles sheltered slaves who had fled the plantations of Georgia. In the early 1800's the United States began sending soldiers to recover the escaped slaves. Negroes and Indians alike were captured and sold into bondage.

In bitter resentment the Seminoles took up arms and fought the raiders, often wiping out whole Army units. In 1832, the Government demanded that the Seminole chiefs sign a peace treaty in which they would agree to move their tribe west of the Mississippi. Those of partly Negro blood, however, were to be sold into slavery. A few frightened chieftains signed the agreement. But one fiery warrior, Osceola, refused. Indeed, Osceola angrily plunged his knife through the treaty parchment.

"This land will always be ours," he proclaimed. Osceola swore the Seminoles would fight to the last drop of blood.

Arrested by the Indian agent, Wiley Thompson, Osceola was imprisoned briefly

and then freed. The Seminole chieftain had another score to settle with Thompson. Some years before, this Indian agent had captured Osceola's wife and sold her into slavery.

The Indian chieftain realized that only by force of arms could the Seminoles hope to keep their land. In a carefully laid ambush he killed Wiley Thompson and on the same day in December, 1835, another war party of Seminoles almost wiped out an Army detachment under Major Francis Dade.

The Seminole wars were on. Troops poured into Florida. From the swamps and undergrowth Osceola and his tribesmen fought back. Under his skilled leadership, and in spite of overwhelming odds, they fought the soldiers to a standstill.

In 1837, however, 3,000 Seminoles gathered to surrender, but Osceola convinced them to return to the swampland and continue their defiance. General Jesup, leader of the Government troops, tricked Osceola into a truce conference and then arrested him. Osceola died in prison soon afterwards.

Bitter at the betrayal, the Seminole chiefs swore to avenge Osceola. Inspired by the dead chief's example, they swept out of their swamp-land fortress to fight one bloody engagement after another with the Army, Navy and Marines. After each battle they melted back into the trackless marshes.

In a new tactic the military began a scorched-earth policy, burning the Indian crops and villages. Faced with starvation, thousands of Seminoles surrendered and were deported west of the Mississippi. But hundreds of others, true to their dead chief, Osceola, retreated still deeper into the swamp-land fastness, refusing to give up the fight for freedom. Their descendants live in that area to this day.

In their six-year fight the Seminoles cost the United States 6,000 casualties and up to \$50,000,000 in military expenditures. Yet this gallant tribe was never truly defeated.

As for their leader Osceola, today his grave bears the simple inscription—PATRIOT AND WARRIOR.
