Gold for Prince Albert Olives

Our own Prince Albert Olives won a gold medal at the recent South African Olive Industry Association (SAOIA) Extra Virgin Olive Oil Competition. Their Karoo Blend, a blend of Frantoio, Coratina, Favalosa and Mission olives, was judged the top "delicate" oil in the Commercial category.

Fred Badenhorst, owner, and Essie Esterhuizen, olive oil maker, were understandably delighted. Unfortunately neither was able to attend the awards ceremony but Fred told the *Friend* that getting the news late on 31 August was a wonderful and emotional moment. Essie summed up by saying "We are walking tall!"

Both men are proud to have won Gold the first time they entered the prestigious competition, especially because the blend was a product of the Great Karoo. Essie explained that olive oil producers in other parts of the Western Cape believed that making delicate oil in the Great Karoo was impossible because of the harsh climate. "We believed otherwise. By adapting our irrigation schedules and tweaking

the management of our orchards, we showed that we could. We also believe that South African consumers' tastes lean towards delicate olive oils."

Fred and Essie are grateful for the contribution of Gerrie Duvenhage of Morgenster Olives, whose guidance in developing Karoo Blend was important. Although he too believed at first that the Karoo could not produce a delicate olive oil, he was always on hand to give advice and help. Both men are clearly passionate about Prince Albert Olives and both produce a high quality product. Essie explains that it took some time before he was satisfied with Karoo Blend and says that he still has a lot to learn about the science and "feel" of blending.

For Fred winning Gold is reward indeed for years of hard work, discipline and pursuing a dream with passion and determination. He says he knew nothing about growing olives when he bought his first farm in the Prince Albert district in 1998. However he saw that the harvesting season was different to other major farming activities and consequently could provide employment for most of the year. Today, Fred employs over 50 people permanently

on his farms in the Prince Albert and Leeu-Gamka areas, at the olive nursery and at his olive press.

The new olive press building was designed in-house and built by Clive Cleaver. It houses the olive press and has storage facilities for 90 000 litres of oil. It also has offices, storage areas for processed olives, tasting and demonstration rooms along with a deli shop. This is clearly a team that dreams big and is satisfied with nothing but 'gold.'

The thorough research they have done and their feel for the product are also evident in new branding and labelling of Prince Albert Olives. The label combines Karoo and Victorian Prince Albert motifs, as well as modern lettering and unique shades of yellow, light green and bone white. The quirky touches of a tiny rooster, a field mouse and an owl on the label are especially delightful.

What comes next? Fred says that he while he may now have plans to spend more time in the Wilderness and at his game farm in Somerset East, he and his family remain committed to Prince Albert and the olive industry. Fred's wife, Anobé, plans to develop the cosmetics side of their olive crop.

With a smile Essie says, "We're going hell for leather forward! We want to be in the medals again next year." He believes that the gold medal is good for the local olive oil industry and also for Prince Albert.

Starry Splendour over Prince Albert

In October of this year, as in every year, it will be the ideal time to admire our Spring Constellation. This is the huge Pegasus (the flying horse of Greek Mythology) that was said to have inspired the Muses – and should also inspire our thoughts today!

The Square of Pegasus, also known as the Spring Rectangle analogue to the Summer Triangle and Winter Triangle, can hardly be missed as it culminates over our Meridian. That means you have to look in a northerly direction parallel with Church Street. Pegasus, like the constellations of Orion or Scorpius, can be recognized right away because it is in an upright position for us in the southern hemisphere.

At the lower right corner of the Square of Pegasus there is a string of four stars, the hind legs of Pegasus so to speak. Yet they belong, in fact, to the constellation of Andromeda and it is under the middle of this line that you can find the **Andromeda Nebula** with the naked eye (although a pair of binoculars will help). Also known as **M31** this is the closest neighbouring **spiral galaxy to our Milky Way Galaxy** ... and one and a half times the size of our home galaxy!

At a distance of two and a half million light years it is the furthest celestial object that can still be seen with the unaided eye. But this distance is not far in astronomical terms and all other spiral galaxies are even further away from our Milky Way galaxy.

It was the famous **American astronomer Edwin Hubble** who discovered that the universe was expanding and that there was a tendency among most galaxies to recede from each other.

But not the ones that are close together like our Milky Way Galaxy and the Andromeda Galaxy. Both of these are members of the local group of galaxies and are not drifting apart from each other into the expanding universe but are approaching one another at the tremendous speed

of **300km/second** (1,08 mil km/h). At this rate of travel the two galaxies will merge in three billion years to become one super large galaxy. The huge mass of these galaxies exerts such a strong gravitational pull that even the vast distance between the galaxies is overcome!

Examples of such merging galaxies can be observed with the keen eye of the Hubble Space Telescope.

The Moon will be new on the 7th of October and full on the 23rd.


Venus is still very bright (mag. - 4.6) early in the evening for the first half of the month after which it will get too close to the Sun and become the Morning Star again next month.

Jupiter at a magnitude of - 2.9 (brighter than any star) will be visible all night and is quite a sight at present with only one of its equatorial belts visible. It is so bright at present because it was at opposition ("Full Jupiter") on September 21.

In the South the crosses are disappearing below the horizon with the Southern Cross just dipping behind the Swartberg mountain but still visible from Cape Town because it is circumpolar for our latitude thus visible the whole year and not sinking below the horizon.

To make up for this the **Small and Large Magellanic Clouds**, our irregularly shaped galaxy neighbours, rise high enough to become real attractions. At a distance of 190,000 and 160,000 light years respectively these small galaxies are our close neighbours indeed!

Keep the stars (and galaxies) in your eyes!



Brett the Vet: Free Blind Vice

London September 2010

One of the delights of Saturdays in central London are the Farmers Markets that have become very popular in recent years echoing the rise in food consciousness. I took a detour to visit the market in Chelsea on my way to work at the practice where I'm currently doing a locum. The journey took me via congested roads (apparently due to the Pope's visit), through the tranquillity of Battersea Park with its gracious plane trees, past the peace pagoda, and over Chelsea Bridge that crosses the river Thames at that point. The market place off Mozart Terrace was crowded with people filling their baskets with beautiful organic vegetables of every description while a jovial pensioner played lively tunes on his accordion in the crisp morning sunshine.

The most glamorous food stall in the world, Daylesford Organic Farm Shop, is located beside the market on the Pimlico Road. The interior is completely lined with white marble and the shelves are all made of glass. The packaging on the delectable produce is so chic it seems a shame to rip it off to get to the food. The scene is picture perfect, and everything comes at a fantastic price.

This morning on the pavement outside between the shop window and a busy road, there were three frightened sheep quivering in a crate, pupils dilated, panting, and trying to hide their heads in the straw, while people gazed on from tables in the window, sipping frothy cappuccinos. Urban children, unused to signs of farm life were squealing, and

reaching through the bars to grope at the sheep. The managers stood posing in their tweeds looking very pleased with their attempted creation of a 'country atmosphere' in the heart of London, having extricated the ovine trio from the fields at dawn for the display.

I expressed my dismay at the careless cruelty imposed on the sheep in this clearly stressful situation: perhaps this was unwitting on the part of the owners but they had been separated from the flock, confined on paving, without grazing, near traffic and children, all for the sake of pseudo-rural amusement. Every given situation means something different from others' perspectives. For the children the sheep are just cuddly looking creatures that need to be touched. For the management, it's a publicity stint. For the street sweepers, more work. Most onlookers would see three woolly objects in a pen so remote from the cardigan they may be wearing, Sunday roast, or Pecorino Romano. But for the sheep the experience was pure terror. This was apparent to all too few observers.

Cultivating an attitude that respects all life is the natural human response to escalating environmental destruction. Support for methods that shun the use of poisons and chemical fertilizers has grown phenomenally. The case for improving the freedoms of domestic animals is getting stronger as we begin to understand the meaning of sentience. But true empathy is revealed only when one is able to feel the experience of another being through its own impressions of the world.



Gin Traps: Best Practice or Brutal Killing?

In the August edition of the *Friend*, Mary Hunter speaks out against the use of gin traps, which she describes as cruel. As a farmer, I agree that gin traps may be not the best way to catch predators, but if there were more effective and affordable means, we would use them. Gin traps may be expensive but they are still one of the most sensible methods for protecting sheep.

Although Mary referred to the “interesting behaviour” of predators in the Karoo, I don’t know of any scientific research done on the behaviour of predators on large sheep farms in the Karoo. It is, however, a fact that when animals have more and better quality food, they breed larger litters and at a younger age. Recent scientific research in Australia has shown that the solution is to remove predators over a bigger area and not just one or two per farm as has been done. Research in the USA found that at least 70 % of the predator population must be removed before there is any noticeable effect on predation.

Mary mentioned “needless killing” and I agree, but only in the context of the baby lambs. These defenceless babies are easy prey and often eaten alive or brutally mutilated by predators and left to die in suffering. My view is that there is no place for predators on sheep farms. Then we would not need gin traps and no harm would be done.

A few years ago, Prince Albert was the district with the most guard dogs supplied by the Grootfontein Agricultural College Guard Dog Research project. There are none left today because, mainly, they were simply not effective on our large farms. A delegation visited the USA earlier this year to see what research on predator management has been done and what methods had been used in the past 20 years. They found that lethal methods of predator management, including gin traps are still used in the USA. Guard dogs were never mentioned.

Dr Bard in his letter to the *Friend* in

August 2010 stressed that farmers must protect their own livestock. And I agree. It makes no sense to prevent farmers from doing so by removing the most successful methods of protection available. We need support for more effective methods, not regulations banning the very methods that work.

Why not regulate the management of wild animals instead of wiping out the contribution that we sheep farmers make to food security of our country? Joseph Steyn’s letter, which appeared in the July 2010 edition of this newspaper, was a plea for help because farmers cannot fight the problem on their own anymore.

Rather than branding commercial farming as ‘barbaric’ and ‘farcical’, why not protect game by doing the right things within boundaries of nature reserves? Why should farmers take the blame for nature conservationists’ failure to adopt proper fencing policies and to control predator numbers?

Readers may be interested to know that the Karoo National Park had to replace some of their springbok recently. And also that there are no springbok left in the Swartberg Nature Reserve. While the conservation authorities do not like to admit it, the losses were all due to predation.

God placed man on earth to watch and care over His creation, not decimate it.

Neither the National Parks nor private game farmers can preserve the diversity on their land without regularly having to bring in more game to maintain their numbers. This is not sustainable in the long term and is the reason some have begun using lethal methods to fight predation.

It would be appreciated if readers could support the farming community by addressing this important issue rationally, with empathy... and by getting their facts right.

Museum News: Dolls – Part 1

Human beings all over the world have made dolls for thousands of years.

Originally....“dolls were made as ancestor images, idols, fetishes imbued with supernatural powers, fertility symbols, talisman against evil spirits, or sometimes used in rites of magic...” Funerary dolls, representing wives and servants were placed in tombs to join their master on his journey to the next world. Dolls were made out of twigs, stone, leaves, clay, wood, cloth, metal and beads.

It is not known when exactly dolls were first used as toys for children but there are records of toy dolls in Europe in the Middle Ages.

From the 18th century onwards sophisticated dolls were made out of wax, *papier mâché*, cloth, china, bisque porcelain; later celluloid rubber, various metals, hard plastic and soft vinyl.

Dolls represented historic figures, actors, uniformed WRAF and WRNS, Superman, Popeye, The Little Prince and many more. Parisiennes resembled fashion models (in the 1860s). There were ethnic dolls and Barbie (1959).

Doll manufacturing provided ample opportunity for creativity and imagination. In Victorian times a German invented the *Autoperipatetikos* – walking-around-by-

yourself-doll! Another German came up with a Two Faced Doll, which revealed a crying or a smiling face when one pulled a string. Piano Dolls' bodies were supported by four bristles and when placed on a piano, their hanging legs ‘danced’ to the vibration of the piano.

These days there is hardly anything dolls can't do. They open, close and move their eyes. They crawl, swim, drink, urinate and talk. They grow hair when one turns a screw on their back! What will be next?

Among the dolls exhibited at the Fransie Pienaar Museum you'll find carved wooden dolls, a 120 year old stuffed porcelain doll, a mechanical wind-up clown, a grandmother doll made of plaster of Paris, a Pierotti Baby from the second half of the 19th century, fully dressed right down to its flannel petticoat under which its wax legs and feet are a ‘perfect pink’.

The top dogs of Prince Albert are bringing their wayward handlers smartly to heel.

Prince Albert might count itself one of the most dog friendly centres in the Cape, despite recent cases of cruelty and allegations of poisoning. While dogs are barred from almost all Cape beaches, in Prince Albert, dogs are welcome everywhere from the Post Office to the Library and most especially the butchery, where the well-behaved dog is rewarded with a meaty treat.

It took an enterprising Yolande Singery to take the leash firmly in hand and sort out potential canine rabble rousers when she acquired one of the most charming dogs in Prince Albert, a harlequin Great Dane called Bentley. When Bentley was a few months old, his size seemed to double overnight and Yolande compared her pet with another harlequin Great Dane in town, two-year-old Boris, who towers above his petite owner Chantal Schoeman. Clearly something had to be done.

So Yolande unearthed a trainer prepared to travel from Oudtshoorn and recruited owners and their dogs. Now on Wednesday afternoons, the show grounds ring to the cries of "heel" and "sit" as half a dozen dedicated dog owners under the command of trainer Michelle Wolmarans from Oudtshoorn attempt to transform a rowdy bunch of canines into a socially acceptable class.

Michelle, who adopts a take-no-prisoners attitude towards errant handlers, is a veteran of the dog training circuit, with provincial colours achieved in 1996 in the South African Working Dog Open Stakes. Over the years, her own Rottweilers have won kudos in many an obedience and working trial test. She has a special interest in problem dogs – or rather, dogs with problem owners.

It is a mixed bunch that confronts Michelle every week – from the two Great Danes aforementioned to a Giant Schnauzer, a Ridgeback, a German Shepherd and more. Differing hugely in size and appearance, the dogs soon settle down and the work begins.

However, there could be a down side to instant obedience. One dog accompanying its owner to the Saturday market was told to "sit" outside a plant stall. The dog immediately sat – plumping its ample bottom right on top of a pot plant.

Prince Albert Film Fest

Lovers of South African films were treated to a surprise at the recent screening of *Paljas* at the Jans Rautenbach Schouwburg. Local filmmaker, Johnny Breedt, production designer for *Paljas*, gave a talk on the making of the film. For anyone who doesn't know, the job of a production designer is to conceptualise from a script everything that will be used on a film set ensuring that it is both visually and culturally accurate for the period, down to the last detail.

Johnny gave a fascinating account of the making of the film, the crew, and the location. Anant Singh and Katinka Heyns are top filmmakers who collaborated to produce an essentially South African film with an eye on the international foreign film awards. Katinka invited Johnny to join the art department initially as the make-up designer.

Due to the constrained budget of R3,5 million, the crew was limited to twenty-five, plus locals when a crew of two hundred is the more the norm. Johnny's eventual role was to be the hands-on production designer. With nostalgic humour he related some of what his work involved – procurement of circus animals from Boswells Circus and the locomotive and carriages from the Reef, shunting the circus train by hand with a crowbar and one helper, scouring the country for a bus of the times, and having to buy a vintage car in order to use it.



Mystic River

By Dennis Lehane

Having recently discovered Lehane through his books *Shutter Island* and *Gone Baby Gone* I was intrigued to find one of his much earlier books on our library shelves. The title *Mystic River* was somehow familiar so I glanced through the first few paragraphs to make sure I hadn't read it.

Half an hour later I was still there...

Absolutely pitch-perfect dialogue combined with economy of words and fast-paced writing made the book un-put-

downable. I took it home and finished it in one sitting.

Mystic River is a shattering, suspenseful novel of friendship, love and betrayal. The three main characters, former school friends, are all deeply flawed and lacking in the attributes usually associated with heroes. Yet they command centre-stage throughout the story.

It begins in 1975 in a blue-collar Boston community when three young boys run into a pair of child molesters passing themselves off as policemen. Sean Devine and Jimmy Marcus escape but watch in fright as ten-year-old Dave Boyle is driven off... for an ordeal that changes his life (and theirs) forever.

The story then shifts to the year 2000 and takes up the lives of Devine, Marcus and Boyle as they become men, husbands and fathers. It is both a murder mystery and a novel of character. It is about hope, grief, fear, the importance of family, the vulner-


ability of children, and the countless ways in which the past influences the future.

It was the most critically acclaimed best-seller of 2001 and made into an award-winning film directed by Clint Eastwood and starring Sean Penn, Tim Robbins and Kevin Bacon.

"If you want to know when innocence dies, just look these people in the eye," says the *New York Times Book Review*. While the *Denver Rocky Mountain News* proclaimed it, "One powerful, wrenching tale of murder, revenge, the meaning of friendship, and the vagaries of fate...."

Fast but tragic, *Mystic River* is overwhelmingly complex and full of raw emotion. You may think you know where everything is going but you can't possibly. The climax blindsides you leaving you dazed yet dazzled by Lehane's extraordinary dexterity with words.

The only sponsorship for the film was from Klipdrift Brandy, enough to fill a container. It was handed out in exchange for various favours, and led to a break-in, but that is another story.

The word 'paljas' means roughly a benign spell, something the dysfunctional family in the film needed to turn around the bitterness that separated them. The arrival of the clown, Manuel, and his friendship with the young boy in the family was depicted with powerful dramatic episodes and symbolism. Having passed first base with the Academy, *Paljas* was entered for the Oscars – an achievement in itself – but it was unfortunately not a winner. The film has however won seventeen other awards from all over the world.

The Film Fest this year saw the screening of five South African films all of which were iconic for their times, and inspired by the social, cultural and political environments during which they were made. They were *All the Way to Paris*, *Kom Saam Vanaand*, *Wild Season*, *Die Kandidaat* and *Paljas*. It is a privilege to see South African filmmaking at its best on the wide screen and it is hoped to make the Film Fest an annual programme starting at the Olive Festival each year.

Road Safety Feature: Speed kills

You may think you are the most skillful driver in the land. But no one can respond well to the unexpected at high speed. And by 'high speed' I don't mean faster than 120km/h... I mean driving too fast for the prevailing road and weather conditions.

Road safety is a simple matter of common sense and good judgement together with a mature and responsible attitude towards one's fellow citizens. It is obvious that driving at 90km/h through a heavily built-up area is dangerous. It is obvious that road conditions, poor visibility, bad weather, sharp bends, pedestrians and animals on the road all play a part in determining what is a safe speed. But how many of us ignore the obvious believing that we don't make mistakes ... that we are in control ... that we are excellent drivers?

But accidents do happen and speed has emerged as a critical factor in road fatalities.

What is too fast?

The laws on speed are not there to make your life miserable or an indication of petty bureaucracy. They are there to protect you, other drivers, pedestrians and all the other road users. The general speed limits are as follows but may be overridden by traffic signs where necessary:

- Public roads in urban areas: 60km/h
- Public roads outside urban areas (not freeways): 100km/h
- Freeways: 120km/h

These limits do not take into account abnormal road conditions, such as surface water, gravel or other hazards. They do not take into account drunk drivers or reflexes slowed by drinking. They do not take into account vehicles operating without proper brakes and tyres or overloading. Nor do they take into account hazards such as children, pedestrians, poor lighting or buck leaping out of the bush. All of these factors, combined with speed, dramatically increase the likelihood of an accident.

Most accidents happen because drivers are in too much of a hurry, don't indicate their intentions and don't pay proper attention to other road users.

So take a conscious decision today to reduce your speed. Because the faster you go the harder you hit.

Speed kills... horribly.

Creativity Builds Children's Self Esteem



Op 28 Augustus het hy met sy borriegeel 1962 Mini Moke net 7,63 liter petrol gebruik oor die afstand van 170 km. Die roete behels verskeie stoppe by Caltex vulstasies – George, Blanco, Voorbaai, Danabaai, Heiderand, George - waar daar verseker word die tenk bly verseël. Daar word ook lekker gekuier, gebraai en prys gewen by elke stop! Hierdie jaar het 53 motors deelgeneem – die enigste vereiste is dat die motor ouer as 25 jaar moet wees. Die poedelprys is “gewen” deur ‘n Cadillac wat ‘n volle 39,2 liter petrol opgeslurp het...

Die feit dat Gawie se bekende “dorpskarretjie” net 500 kg weeg, het natuurlik die skaal in sy guns geswaai. “Die Mini Moke,” vertel Gawie, “is oorspronklik tydens die Tweede Wêreldoorlog gebou en met valskerms uit vliegtuig gegooi sodat offisiere daarmee kon ry. As jy dié storie nie glo nie, vra maar vir Kiep le Grange – hy het in die oorlog met so een gery. Later jare het Tiekie van die Wilkie Sirkus ook met enetjie gery, maar vandag is die motortjies so skaars soos draketande.”

Gawie, wat twee jaar lank die voorsitter van die Mercedes Benz Klub in die Suid-Kaap was, is ook die trotse (gewese) eienaar van ‘n seldsame voorwielangedrewe 1969 Cadillac Eldorado wat hy met 400 perdekrag en al uitgevoer het Australië toe. “Daai kar is gebou in die tyd toe die mense maan toe gevlieg het – al die modernste tegnologie was in hom ingebou – dit was nou vir jou ‘n wondermotor.” Van sy vier besonderse SL Mercedesse met hul afslaankappe en twee deure, het hy swaar afskeid geneem, maar aan sy ’38 Chevvy wat hy in 1964 vir £50 (R100) gekoop het, hou hy stewig vas. “My kinders is in hom gedoop, geskool en getroud – hóm verkoop ek nie sommer nie. Ook nie my twee en ‘n half ton 1933 Chev Lorrietjie wat ek vir £350 (R700) gekoop het nie. Hy is gebruik in die film *Heroes* en het baie intervarsity-optogte in Stellenbosch gery.”

Sy jongste toevoeging is die 1952 Vanguard bakkie wat hy in 2005 in Merweville geruil het vir een van sy handgemaakte muurhorlosies. Die bakkie, wat 15 jaar lank onder ‘n bloekomboom gestaan het, word gereeld ingeskryf vir motorskoue op George en word eersdaags gebruik in die film *Faan se Trein* wat by Klaarstroom geskiet gaan word.

Op erfenisdag het Gawie en sy vriende die geleentheid gevier deur in sy drie noagsmotors rond te ry en só sy bewaarde erfenis met almal te deel.

cal requirements, including qualifications, previous experience, and personal attributes.

Use the information in the PS to draw up an advert and place it on the various notice boards in town or in the *Friend*.

Pay attention to the layout of the CV/ Applications you receive, as they will be a good indicator of the quality of the applicant. Create a short list of potential candidates.

Interview Techniques

Stick to the same interview structure for every applicant. Have a set of core questions to help you compare individual responses fairly. Always ask your questions so that the person has to think before answering you in detail. For example, asking a candidate, "Can you deal with pressure?" paves the way for

them to answer simply, "Yes." Rather ask, "How do you deal with pressure, and how does it affect you?"

Ask specific questions about their previous work experience. For example, ask what the single greatest achievement in their previous position was... and then probe further. For example, if a candidate answers that they increased the profitability of their previous employer say, "That's great... how did you achieve that?"

Pay particular attention to dates of previous employment, and ask questions if dates and other information, don't stack up. Always ask for references, and be sure to check these out.

Be aware of body language

The way applicants present and conduct themselves during the interview will give you a good idea of whether or not you

want them to work for you. Remember that an interview is a two way process and you should also pay attention to the questions that the candidate asks you. A person whose only question is about the salary, is probably more interested in the money than the job itself.

Look for connectivity between yourself and the applicant. Even if the candidate has all the right credentials, but you don't feel that he or she is somebody that you would like to deal with on a daily basis, don't appoint them. Listen to your instincts.

Similarly, if a candidate is lacking in experience or qualifications, but you feel that they have potential then take them on. Have faith in the people you appoint, trust them, and give them your full support and guidance.

Tourism is the mainstay of PA's economy

Tourism has overtaken agriculture as the major contributor to the economy of Prince Albert, Juanita Fortuin, the town's Municipal Manager and guest speaker at the Tourism Association AGM, noted at the well-attended meeting at the Jans Rautenbach Schouwburg on 26 August. The challenge for the future of the town, she observed, lay in finding ways of ensuring that all sectors of the community benefited fully from tourism and its growth.

Fortuin confirmed that Prince Albert has become a sought-after destination in the Karoo in recent years and also acknowledged that greater attention needed to be paid to the maintenance of the Swartberg Pass, which has recently been added to the Department of Environmental Affairs and Tourism's priority list.

Responding to Tourism Chairperson, Di Steyn's comments on areas of positive co-operation with the Municipality in the last year and those where there was much-needed room for improvement, Fortuin undertook that by the time her contract ended in 2012, problem areas would be resolved and that a service level agreement between the two organisations would be signed and fully operational.

Fortuin also noted that the Municipality allocates approximately R200 000 a year towards the marketing and development of tourism in the Prince Albert district. Di Steyn in turn thanked the Municipality for its financial support. However, the inconsistent transfer of funds to the Association in the last year hampered its operations and meant a reduction in staff. This was complemented by uncertainty about what the Municipality expected of the Association in terms of tourism development.

Over 20 members and friends of the Tourism Association attended the AGM and had the opportunity to meet Cllr Willem Jansen, who is responsible for the tourism portfolio and Pedro Oliphant, the manager of the Municipality's Integrated Development Plan.

Munisipale Nuus

Betaal jou skuld of word afgesny

Vanaf die einde September sal die Munisipaliteit summier krag en watervoorsiening staak by huishoudings en besighede wat agterstallig is met betaalings en wat nie reëlings aangaande hulle terugbetaalings met die munisipaliteit getref het nie. Munisipale rekeninge is die finale waarskuwing en geen verdere individuele kennis van opskorting sal gegee word nie. In terme van die Munisipaliteit se krediet beheerprocedure, mag die Raad besluit om boetes op huishoudings te hef én te bepaal hoe die verpligte terugbetaalings moet plaasvind.

Volgens Jannie Neethling van die Munisipaliteit se finansiële dienste, was daar 'n bemoedigende reaksie op die Munisipaliteit se poging, aan die begin van September, om inwoners van die drie dorpe aan te spoor om hulle agterstallige diensterekeninge te vereffen. Met die aanvang daarvan het inwoners die Munisipaliteit R6 miljoen in onbetaalde dienstegelde geskuld.

Ons Munisipale Bestuurder, Me Juanita Fortuin, het 'n beroep op inwoners gedaan om hulle diensterekeninge gereeld te betaal en beklemtoon dat die Munisipaliteit uiters teësinnig is om dienste op te skort. Ongelukkig bepaal beide die Munisipale kredietbeheerprocedure en Munisipale Wetgewing dat dit wél gedaan moet word.

Municipality's Finance Head Suspended

Mayor Maria Benjamin confirmed on 21 September that the head of the Municipality's financial department, Jakobus van der Westhuizen, had been

(Municipal News... Continued from p 25) suspended earlier in the month, pending a disciplinary hearing. Cllr Benjamin was not in a position, she said, to discuss the charges against van der Westhuizen but described them as serious.

Confusion over Municipal Accounts

Are you still mystified by your monthly Municipal account? Based on feedback to the *Friend*, you are not alone. Jannie Neethling of the Municipality's finance department confirmed too that his department continues to receive a range of queries from residents about their accounts. In response, the Municipality will soon introduce accounts that are more user friendly.

"Why can't we revert to the old accounts that we all understood and that were seldom incorrect?" is a question that is often asked. Neethling explained that in August last year municipalities country-wide were obliged to change their com-

puter software and formatting of accounts to comply with the Municipal Financial Management Act (MFMA) and with the National Treasury's regulations and accounting systems. As the Municipality's software was outdated, it had no choice but to upgrade. Hence, the change to the current formatting, which raised the ire of many residents at the errors and often inexplicable information carried in accounts for nearly a year.

Fire Engine a Priority

Recent service accounts levied an annual tax for the availability of a fire service. At the moment, Prince Albert does not have a fire engine after it was written off in an accident more than a year ago.

Juanita Fortuin, the Municipal Manager, explained that the levy is used for the maintenance and replacement of fire-fighting equipment and that the Municipality does provide a fire service: its two sewerage trucks have been adapted so that they

can carry water in their tanks and extinguish fires. As Fortuin described it: "They can 'suig en spuit'!"

Fortuin also told the *Friend* that the purchase of a fire engine is a priority for the Council. The Municipality is currently negotiating the loan of an engine from the City of Cape Town, which it hopes eventually to buy.

A New Community Services Manager?

The Municipality's selection committee made its recommendation to the Municipal Council in September for a new Community Services Manager. The Executive Mayor, Cllr Maria Benjamin, formally asked the Speaker, Cllr Stoffel Botes to convene a meeting of the Council for 29 September to finalise the appointment.

The selection committee – comprising DA and ANC councillors, trade union representatives, Debbie Mooneys,

Municipality's HR, and Juanita Fortuin, Municipal Manager, – shortlisted five candidates from over 90 applicants. The committee interviewed four candidates after one dropped out of the selection process. However, as reported in the *Friend*, July 2010, all three DA councillors withdrew from the interviews as they objected to the short-listing of two applicants. Grounds were that one allegedly had been suspended and faced investigation by his current employer and the other had resigned from his previous place of work. Cllr Botes said the DA was concerned about the transparency of the process and wanted to ensure that the right person was appointed to the job. Cllr Benjamin countered by accusing the DA of wasting ratepayers' money and hampering service delivery.

Cllr Benjamin told the *Friend* that the selection committee had requested written references on the four candidates from their current or most recent employers. This was a requirement of the selection process following the interviews. Cllr Benjamin said that only two employers had responded and these provided positive feedback. As far as she was concerned the DA's reservations were unfounded. It was on this basis, she said, that the committee had made its recommendation to the Council.

At the time of going to press Cllr Botes had not yet decided whether to agree to the Mayor's request for a Council meeting. He did, however, tell the *Friend* the DA was sticking to its position that incorrect procedures had been followed and that the position had to be advertised again.

DA leader to visit PA

As the *Friend* went to press DA Cllr Stoffel Botes confirmed that Anton Bredell, the MEC for Local Government, Environmental Affairs and Development Planning, will visit Prince Albert on Thursday, 21 October.

During his visit Bredell will meet with the community at a place and time yet to be finalised.






