

Shipwreck of the Whale-ship Essex by Owen Chase

"Narrative of the most extraordinary and distressing shipwreck of the whaleship Essex of Nantucket which was attacked and finally destroyed by a large spermaceti whale, in the Pacific Ocean: with an account of the unparalleled sufferings of the captain and crew during a space of ninety-three days at sea, in open boats, in the years 1819 & 1820."

Owen Chase (October 7, 1797 – March 7, 1869) was First Mate of the whale ship Essex, that was struck and sunk by a sperm whale on October 28, 1820. Chase wrote about the incident in Narrative of the Most Extraordinary and Distressing Shipwreck of the Whale-Ship Essex. This book, published in 1821, would inspire Herman Melville to write Moby-Dick. (Wikipedia)
