Whereas in "Freddy's Revenge" his potential was vastly overlooked this time he comes across with brutal force and a cunning mind. In "Dream Warriors" he's more menacing and much more a cumning minu. in pream warriors he s more menacing and much more creative about his form and method of murder (bless you Mr. Craven). Physically Freddy can change his appearance, from lovable (?) Fred as rnysically rreddy can change his appearance, from lovable (/) rred as we most commonly know him to Fred the snake? or is it a worm? whatwe most commonly know him to fred the snake; or is it a worm; whatever, Fred the puppet and puppet master and Fred the reborn skeletal frame. What's next? Fred the mayhemic mailman!!! I wonder.

The special F/X are utterly amazing (the best I'd say of the 3 "Nightmare" films) and with the minor exception of a couple of folks "Nightmare" films) and with the minor exception of a couple of following is a step above "Freddys Revenge" but not the original. In "Dream Warriors" Fred's background is given and we learn that Fred's deceased mother was a nun who was brutally raped (almost to the point of death) by 100 criminally insane men locked in an attic in a church so Fred was born (obviously) as the "bastard son of a hundred maniacs", explains his mean disposition I guess. Honestly though, the storyline is good and the special F/X




FROM BEYOND

IRROW BELLOND:

An outright classic! Stuart Gordon, Jeffrey Combs, Mark shostrom and co. have certainly outdone themselves on this flick. This film has all the ingredients (and alot more to spare) for the making of a truly entertaining horror/sci-fi flick. For those of you unfamiliar with "From beyond" it was based on the H.P. Lovecraft short story and although the basic foundation of the story stayed the same as the short new storylines were added and original parts were omitted. Although the short story version comes across as a more streamlined, (and in the long run) macabre version the film comes across with a definitely more contemporary feel to it. Alot more depth and characterization has been added to the film and I'm not saying that that reason alone makes the film more entertaining than the short story as it stands on it's own as a well written literary horror masterpiece. Effects wise "From Beyond" is a must for gore fans as it contains some spectacular scenes. I fully recommend this movie see it now


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

Q: How do you feel about the state of the union of Hardcore as a whole?





Since then, time has both mellowed and changed our opinions. What you do is your choice, as long as you're not screwing over (or throwing up) WHAT THE HELL ARE WE DOING? REBEL, HEAL THYSELP on someone else in the process. Personally the philosophy means alot to me. It is the theory of balance, and I apply it to all as-I AM SCARED BY THE WAY YOU ACT DO YOU ALMAYS KNOW WHO'S REALLY BIENG ATTACKED? WITH AN UNKNOWING SHRUG, YOU GO AND TURN YOUR BACK ON THE ONLY THINGS THAT WE HAVE LEFT pects of my life. It's basic economics and we do ok. Q: Besides the band what does everyone do? Work, school, hobbies etc?  $\overline{A}$ : Everyone graduated from high school last year (except for Doug) and hasn't gone to college yet. Doug works as a carpenter for a living, Dylan and pete do various things, but at press time pete's main skill seems to be sleeping late. SNFU interview conducted with Mr. Chi Pig in Guelph Ontario

- $\underline{\mathtt{Q}}$ : Clue us in on what's been goin' on in the SNFU camp in the last  $\mathtt{6}$ months or so ?
- $\underline{\Lambda}$ : Since the last time anyone out in Eastern Canada has seen us what we've been up to is..well first things first, we got back home from our tour really safely and it was a big success, we had a really good homecoming show and than after that our drummer left us (Mr. Jon Carp), so now Jon's playing with D.O.A., so he moved to Vancouver to play with them, plus his girlfriend's there and then we called up a friend of ours named Ted and he's from Winnepeg so he moved all the way from Winnepeg to Edmonton and we've been jamming with him and before Jon left we recorded our new LP "If you swear you'll
- Catch no Fish". A few gigs on this tour had to be cancelled, Winnepeg etc. Why was that  $\overline{\mathbf{A}}$ : Yeah, the thing that happened there was they were scheduled and then the schedule got kicked back 2 weeks so that's why we're here now, but we did manage to get a show in Calgary and that went pretty good. it was a last minute thing. We played with PROBLEM CHILDREN, it was at a hall that basically held 150 people but 300 decided to show up so it was a real hot and clamped show, it was fun and what happened with Winnepeg was that they couldn't get us an all-ages show which we were demanding coz we played there 4 times previous within the last year and each show has been at an overaged bar so we thought if the kids coulbn't come this time we weren't gonna fuckin' do it at all. So we spent the weekend in Winnepeg but we didn't play coz we couldn't get an all-ages show but we hope to get one when we get back, and they know that we mean it this time so they'll get us one.
- Q: Are a good percentage of your shows all-age ones and do you strive for them ?
- Yeah, we request an all-ages show because more of our enthusiastic fans just happen to be young kids.
- Q: In terms of production, are you happier with the new LP ?  $\overline{\Lambda}$ : Yeah, we are!! We produced it with a guy named Dave who lives in Edmonton and we took our time on it as opposed to the first album where we mixed down 13 songs in 8 hours so the mix was pretty rushed.
- Q: I heard one particular thing you weren't pleased with was the guitar
- sound, why was that ? A: Well,we're basically a guitar band and the guitar was pretty lacklustre and we wanted something a bit heavier and sharper. We basically got that on the new record but than again what happened was from the time we heard the last studio recording of it to the time it got mastered it did lose a bit but not as much, so it's better then the first record but because we're picky fuckheads it's still not the definitive SNFU record but it is a cut above the first one and if we ever get around to doing a 3rd one sometime in the future which I can't predict, but with that one we'll take even more time on. We're basically getting better as far as recording goes.
  We also have 2 songs coming out on a upcoming "Skate Rock" comp. LP,
  I think it's "Skate Rock"#5 and that will be out sometime in the new
  year and we also have a reworked version of "She's not on the Menu" and that was supposed to be on a Flipside compilation album but we missed the deadline on that so I don't know what's gonna happen with it but we'll release it in some form or another.
- Q: Would you say your new album is much of a change from the 1st ?  $\overline{\lambda}\colon$  It's less simplistic,a bit more complex and there's actually a slow song on it,totally one-paced, not from the fast to the slow. I'm not saying we're the inventors or anything like that,it's just different for us to do that, a totally slow song and we managed to pull it off.
- Q: (shock!horror! A ballad? Shame on you!). God forbid is it almost a ballad:??:
- A: Yeah it is! It's a romantic kind of thing!
- $\overline{\mathbb{Q}}\colon$  OK,lyrically you seem to take serious subjects,juggle em'around and wind up with a sometimes humourous approach, any reason for this ? Do you just not want to come across so heavy ?
- A: Yeah, that's basically the way I am. If you get too seriously heavy people take it to the point of preaching per se the DEAD KENNEDYS and D.O.A., coz they're very serious and people accuse them of preaching and y'know, they can do that to us coz I don't really give a fuck but just to satisfy myself I throw in a bit of humour coz I think humour's a very important thing and if we can make people smile and still get a message across then we're doing what we wanna do.



Q: What's your little t-shirt creature all about ?  $\overrightarrow{A}$ : This is a deadhead, not a GRATEFUL DEAD fan mind you, even though alot of them look like this. It's just a rotting skull and we actually stole this from a comic book from about 5 years ago. It's not ours but we used it and we haven't got into trouble yet, and people like it  $\underline{\mathtt{Q}}\colon$  In Edmonton are you guys actively involved in getting out of town bands gigs in your hometown ? : Since we're a touring band we meet alot of other bands so they...well if they come to our hometown and if we've played with them and know them and have taken a liking to them we help em' out and let em' stay at our houses and show em' around town, basic tour guide shit coz it's really nice to have that when you're a total stranger and to link up with someone that you're vaguely familiar with, so we try to help out as many bands as we can. Sometimes when we can swing it we'll do our own shows. Q: What was all the controversy o over the 1st LP's cover all about  $\overline{A}$ : That's an old story, basically what it boils down to is we used a photograph without permission which you can't do so we had a friend duplicate it which is totally legal so we used that instead of the photograph. We were getting some flack but no one actually sued us so we just agreed not to use it anyway. There's another American cover out which is a really ugly thing. It's a picture of a kid getting a beebee gun for Christmas with his mom and dad smiling behind him and it's really ugly looking, but it's funny coz it's so ugly. I don't know how many of those they pressed but the past is the past. Q: You've done benefits before right ? Yeah, we've done benefits but we haven't done any in a real long time. We owe one to a band called Euthanasia, they helped us out and so that's the next benefit we do and after that unless it's a really good cause we really can't afford to do it coz we draw alot of crowds these days. If we feel really strongly for the benefit we'll do it.  ${f Q}$ : After your last Toronto gig (the whole 12 minute fiasco) did you hold any hard feelings towards Toronto promoters ? A: It was just the certain promoters, organizers, so that's why we haven't approached them to do a 2nd show for us,..because well, I don't know if it was totally their fault, but it was just very very poorly organized and unfortunately we were the sufferers and so was Toronto coz we'd never played there before and people had waited hours to see us and they only got to see us for 12 minutes so the crowd was kinda ripped off and maybe there should have been a refund, but it's just sad that that's the way things worked out. Q: Favorite wrestlers ? A: I like Jesse "The Body", even though he doesn't wrestle any more, he's got style, I like his new hairpiece, he talks well, he's definitely a creative talker. I like King Kong Bundy Hulk Hogan sucks big eggs in hell, Magnificent Muraco, I like him, the Road Warriors. I like alot of the bad guys, the ones that everybody hates!  ${f Q}$ : What are your favorite Saturday morning cartoon shows ?  $\underline{\mathtt{A}} \colon \mathsf{Pee}\mathsf{-Wee}^\mathsf{t} \mathsf{s} \; \mathsf{Playhouse} \; \mathsf{is} \; \mathsf{hot}, \mathsf{even} \; \mathsf{though} \; \mathsf{I} \; \mathsf{don}^\mathsf{t} \mathsf{t} \; \mathsf{get} \; \mathsf{up} \; \mathsf{early} \; \mathsf{enough} \; \mathsf{to}$ watch it sometimes, Astroboy's really cool, Flintstones are really good, I grew up with those people, I like the Munsters, the Adams Family, I like all the shows that you can't really see anymore,I like wrestling but I don't like the Wrestling cartoon. Alot of the new cartoons are really bad,I mean,what's the purpose of a cartoon? A cartoon is to be a cartoon and than you have all these cartoons trying to be real life and that kinda defeats the purpose of a cartoon. Q: How's the present H/C scene in Holland?  $\overline{\underline{\Lambda}}$ : The N/C scene in Nolland is doing quite well, lots of good bands, clubs and fanzines. The Dutch scene is very independent/self man- ${\sf aged}$  ,  ${\sf all}$   ${\sf bands}$   ${\sf release}$   ${\sf their}$  own  ${\sf vinyl}$  and  ${\sf most}$   ${\sf II/C}$   ${\sf clubs}$   ${\sf here}$ like the Vanhall, Chi-Chi club, V. H. C. Venlo, Kippenhok, Goudvishal.. etc. are all run by bands and punks themselves (most of them are squats), the scene is very political and everything goes on a nonprofit base, always low priced gigs, cheap records/tapes/t-shirts... etc. I think that on this point the dutch scene is one of the better and most honest scenes in the world... Some bands have split up lately: PANDEMONIUM, BLOEBAD, NOG WATT, DISGUST, STANX, DEADLOCK etc. that's sad but there are still lots of great H/C and thrash bands left like: B.G.K., NEUROOT, GØTEFIX, W.C.F., LAITZ, FUNERAL ORATION, LÄRM (HA HA), ROYAL VOMIT, M.B.P., AMPAACHEN, TOTAL VERLEPT, NO PIGS, B.T.D., HISTERIA, MAD RATS, LOUD WARNING, etc. Most of them play fast H/C or thrash, if you can, check em' out!  $\underline{\mathtt{Q}}\colon$  What bands influenced you to play this style of speed thrash ? When we started the band it was mostly Finnish bands and English H/C bands like RIISTETYT, DISORDER, KAAOS, CHAOS UK, TERVEET KADET etc. Later our biggest influences really were: early S.S.D., A.O.D., D.R.I, S.O.A., SIEGE, NEGATIVE FX, MINOR THREAT etc.
