It's been a while since there was a scene report on Hugtown. I host a radio show here in Toronto called Equalizing-X-Disort and there are loads of local bands coming through playing on-air. As a result I am privy to all sorts of updates on the local scene that I would like to share. There were also a lot of people who helped fill in the blanks, so this is more than a one person effort.

Probably the most important thing that has happened in Toronto in the last couple of years was the opening of a punk store called Hits and Misses. Now those familiar with Singles Going Steady, or at least the lore of that Seattle institution can get an idea of the kind of store we are talking about: loads of new stock, ample vintage stock, crates of used vinyl, and a patch wall—a whole store that is dedicated to punk. Sure we had stores with punk sections, like Rotate This and Soundscapes, and in the past we had some strictly punk stores like Full Blast, Who's Emma?, and Sketchy's, but these stores didn't carry the magnitude nor wealth of stock that Hits and Misses has. Peter Genest, the store owner, packed up from his Seattle digs a couple years back and set up shop in Toronto. This wasn't some rash decision, as Pete had always

wanted to move back to Toronto. Pete's older brother was the bassist in the YOUNG LIONS who were one of the cornerstones of the Toronto hardcore scene. Anyway, the place is a punk rock Mecca and is located on the west side of town at Bloor and Ossington, 860 Bloor Street West. The store has hours every day, usually opening around noon. If you are in town you should make the pilgrimage.

Alright, let's get into the band news... CAREER SUICIDE just released an EP titled *Cherry Beach*. This was released on Sewercide as a temporary press. CS want to go back into the studio to re-record *Cherry Beach* and hope to do a full length's worth of recordings while they are at it. They also hope to tour Europe and the West Coast. Jonah, the guitarist of CAREER SUICIDE started up a one man band called MAD M.F.N. Jonah played all the instruments and did the recording, which makes this truly a DIY feat. He has three demos to date and these were recently collected onto one. MAD M.F.N are rumored to

URBAN BLIGHT has been more active in the last six months than anytime during their existence. They have a self-titled EP coming out on Slasher Records, rejected titles include: *Blight Supremacy*, *GUILTY OF BEING Blight*, and *Hockey Blight* in Canada. The singer Beav has started a new band called BAD CHOICE, which takes a cue from Criminal Damage in taking influences from the early UK scene with bands like Blitz and The Oppressed, and some USHC like Kraut and The Effigies. DANGERLOVES broke up last spring. Their latest EP *Young Pretender* was released by Static Shock, a record label run by Ellis, the bass player of the Shiny Limits in the UK. You can reach Static Shock at: staticshockrecords@gmail.com. DANGERLOVES also covers X and contributed two unreleased tracks for an upcoming Schizophrenic comp. THE RAYONETTES broke up after their 2007 west coast tour, with their last

show being at 929 Gilman. They recorded a final single *Guilty Pleasure* for Demerged that did not get past the test press stage.

LEGION666 has been around for just over ten years now. They are planning on releasing something to commemorate their decade of existence such as a special, one-off release. Last year they released the *Black Goat Armageddon* LP to rave reviews and it is still available through Schizophrenic Records. They have a Germs cover on the *No. 2.0* comp. Blas, the guitarist from LEGION666, has started drumming for a metal band that formed out of MEGHDO called SEPULCHRE. They are AMELIX, HELLHAMMER and SODOM inspired, kind of like the '80s proto-thrash bands. They will be playing their first gig with the new RAMMER band called ST. AUGUSTINERSTRIKE. This brings me to RAMMER. They broke up after Al Riddle joined TONIC HOLOCAUST, Joel and Dave teamed up with Andy, Eric and Ben from the ENDLESS BLOCKADE to form ST. AUGUSTINERSTRIKE.

ENDLESS BLOCKADE is still hard at work. Toronto's favorite ultra-core band has loads of new releases and lots of plans. Most recently 20 Buck Spin released the *Primitive* full length on LP and CD. A split 7" with Shank is in the works and is to be released in limited press of 300 copies. Fuck Yoga has released a 7" of their demo and a split LP with Iron Lung, but they are both sold out. Not to be content with that list, the band has a bunch of releases in the works like the split that Relapse is doing with Agoraphobic Nosebleed. 20 Buck Spin is also doing a split LP with Bastard Noise, which should be out in the summer. Chrome Peeler is doing a split LP with Unearthly Trance but this is just at the writing stage. There is also talk about a split with Wadge on Regurgitated Semen Records out of Germany. The band hopes to tour later this year with Haired Surge. Also, the band has an alter ego noise project called DEATHAGONIES with some self-released material; some of the members have some splinter noise projects. CURSED are over no thanks to a thief in Europe that stole most of their gear and stuff. It became the straw that broke the proverbial camel's back. Chris has started a little fun project called MATURE SITUATIONS with Dan James who used to be in the EXCRETIONS. BURNING LOVE was a short-lived band with Chris and two-thirds of OUR FATHER. They did a recording and played a few shows and have a 7" coming out soon on High Anxiety Records.

OUR FATHER has a few recordings that you should check out. They sound like Kyuss having sex with Black Sabbath and giving birth to a crust-punk child. The band released a six-song CD titled, *First Giant*, in 2006, a two-song demo with the songs "Snow Thunder" and "Dirty Streets" in 2007, and recently a two-song EP on Valhalla Records. The scene has turned over a new leaf with a new generation of bands. **BAD SKIN** is one of those bands. They are kids who moved to the big smoke from Gananoque. They have some tracks coming out on the new *Toronto City Omnibus* comp and hope to tour and record this year for a split with the defunct **GUNNAR HANSEN**. SCHOOL JERKS is a new band featuring two members of the now-defunct **TERMINAL STATE**. 
The **REPROPHATES** has broken up. This was the band that the Luyblom brothers helped form, with Gabby, John, and Lenny in the band. They had a couple of recordings together, one of which was a five-song cassette demo. That was pretty awesome. The other recording was purloined out to some comps and an EP on No Way Records called *Stress*. The **FUCKED UP** pissake called "Year of the Magical Pig over Berlin" came out on a comp titled *Sick of Fun* released by Stress Domain Records. A C.O.C. cover is going on a tape comp out of Austin put out by COAXT Records. And three songs are going on the new *Toronto City Omnibus* comp, one of which is an Upright Citizens cover. And then Lenny, the drummer, split for Vancouver and then came back and their status is a little unsure. Try writing: reprobatescum@gmail.com.

Lenny moved back to Port Dover and started recording some bands like **DEADS** and **DESTROYED**. Lenny also played in **DISGUSTING BODY**. MOLESTED YOUTH is one of the youngest bands in the city. Warren got into hardcore because his hairdresser told him to check out **CARRIER SUICIDE**. Their first singer dropped out at the ripe age of 17 so Warren's brother has taken over vocal duties. Newmarket is a new city north of Toronto and they have had a pretty good scene dating back in the days of SUDDEN IMPACT. As of recent, the Newmarket scene has been marginalized by the high cost of venue rentals. Any all-ages venues in town generally hold about 300 people and as such need a large audience to cover costs since there's no booze being sold. The all-ages scene peaked around 2006 and since many of the kids have come of age and have taken over Tomboos, a small downtown bar. Josh who runs Underscore Productions is the only one booking things in town at this point. In order to avoid a large overhead, all-ages shows have been moved to Sharroo Hall about five minutes out of town. These don't happen very often (once every two-three months) and hold just over 100.

One of the bands that I know about are the SICK NEEDS, who features Ronald Pagan of the METAL FDDIES, Kovacs from the THROWAWAYS, and Dean from EXCRETION. They have three five song CD/EPs that they will self-release in the summer and will be followed up with a split with the METAL FDDIES, and then splits with other bands in late fall. Hopefully a summer tour will materialize. The SICK NEEDS are playing Tomboos once every six weeks and the random all ages gig. You can contact Ronald at: metaleddies@hotmail.com. I don't think the METAL FDDIES are still together but they do have a 20-song CD available, called *Brains of the Operation*. And there must be some unreleased material because Ronald is working on a split with the SICK NEEDS for the summer. It will come out on Ronald's label No Vinyl Records, so it will probably be a CD. Christian Cannibal will be organizing the Pinktoberfest event in October again, which is a big annual all-ages show that showcases the scene's bands.

A little further north is a band in Barrie called GENERATION HEXED. The band changed their name from BROWN BELT and features Ditch Dog from SONS OF ISHMAEL, and Rob and Scott from PHALLOCRACY. You can contact the band through: www.myspace.com/generationhexed.

Hamilton is a city west of Toronto. It is a working class town and has always had a great scene that dates back as far as TEENAGE LIAD and SIMPLY SAUCER in the '70s. They are kind of in the reporting-area of Toronto so I wanted to mention some awesome bands from this area. GUNNAR HANSEN was one of my favorites and they reminded me a lot of 9 SHOCKS TERROR. The bassist released an EP on his label Audio Fellatio before breaking up. GUNNAR HANSEN has a bunch of unreleased songs that are going to be released on a split LP with Mississauga's U.T.I. GUNNAR HANSEN has also committed to playing a couple of record release shows, which will also give the band the opportunity for a proper goodbye. A couple of the members from GUNNAR HANSEN teamed up with Jon from the BLACK EYES CLUB to form NEVER TRUST. NEVER TRUST has a demo out which makes ample use of a marching sample that sounds like the "Holidays in the Sun." The guitarist Grant fucked up his hand and the band was on hiatus until he got better. He hasn't so they have stopped, and the demos are gone. Another good band bites the dust.

RAII is an awesome new band from the Hammer, although half of them live in Toronto now. They have a more straightedge sound and remind me a lot of ABOUT TO SNAP. They've recorded a demo and an EP titled *Intelligent Design*, which they self-released on a label they call Chez Ogilvie. The record has just had a second press and final pressing. The band is going into the studio in the spring to record their next EP and a split EP with a yet-to-be-disclosed Toronto band. Sadly, Jimmy's store Reigning Sound closed down. The VAPIDS released a full length CD titled *The Past Remains the Same* back when the store was open—absolute scorcher! The RESPONSIBLES is a band that features Jeff from RIOT STAR and some older guys from RAYBL RNS, MEAN RED SPIDERS, and CRAZED. They have two CDs out and borrow influences from the Clash, the Sex Pistols and the Specials. They have a website at: www.theresponsibles.ca. Another ex-RIOT STAR project is the PUNK RODS. Brian from RIOT STAR teams up with Candy of the LORRAINAS and the original SPOILED ROTTEN are playing out and day a mix of covers and originals. Class of '77:

Over the last few years this awesome band called THE SCREWED formed with the idea of playing music that was just from '77. The band featured members from the original scene and is made up of Cleave Anderson from the BATTERED WIVES, Steve Koch of the DEMICS and VII FIONES, Jon Borta of A NEON ROM, and Steve Saint from the SINISTERS. They self-released a covers CD titled '77, which has covers of songs that came out in '77. They have been behind a lot of the reunion shows that have happened in the last few years with nights that they would jam with guys from the early scene. One such collaboration involves a recording of a session with Cheetah Chrome from the Dead Boys.

TEENAGE HEAD released a similar session that they recorded with Marky Ramone, and it came out on Sonic Union. Frankie Venom passed away last fall due to complications with throat cancer, which was awful and floored a lot of people. There was an awesome tribute on

YouTube that was filmed at the wake. But the surviving members have teamed up with Tom Wilson to form a new band called SONS OF THE HAMMER.


SIMPLY SAUCER released a CD last year called *Half Human, Half Live*. Sonic Union did this release also, which they recorded at Catherine North Studios which was a converted church. A prestigious NYC label called Anthology Recordings is releasing an official bootleg called *Saucerland: Rare Archival Magnetic Field Recordings*, which will feature songs from '74-'79 with the exception of *The Story of Simply Saucer*, which is from '83. The same label has just released a lost Edgar Breda solo album from '83, called, *The Shadows of Lester*, and a documentary film by Greg Bennett entitled *Low Profile: The Simply Saucer Story* is slated for release this year. Greg Dick of the DREAM DATES has been doing a series of interviews with these early-wave bands on our radio show. They have been incredibly informative. Greg tells me that they are learning some material that was unrehearsed so that is exciting news. The band will be playing some shows on the West Coast of Canada in the summer and another NXNE appearance may

happen, Ian and John of the DIODES have formed a new band in between called the BEVERLEY BROTHERS. I think that is a reference to the old drinking hole, the "Dev."

Zoo of the BAYONETTS filed in for the reformed TYRANNA when they got back together in the fall for their record release party. TYRANNA was a second-wave Toronto punk band formed back in 1978. They did a recording back in the day and the material was re-mastered so they could release some of it. Five of the songs came out as an EP. A local record book store, known as Frantic City, formerly known as Babel Books, released the EP on a label that they started up called Boppi Do Down. Rave Up Records out of Italy has been in touch with the band about a full length, so hopefully that will come together.

Cynthia from the B-GIRLS has a new band with some guys from New York called NEW YORK JUNK. It is rumored to be Johnny Thunders-esque. JOHNNY AND THE G-RAYS re-issued their *Every Twist Reminds*, which was recorded back in 1980. A filmmaker by the name of Randy Marsh is working on bringing to life some black-and-white footage of the band from a gig at the Palais Royale recorded back in 1979.

THE MOIDS re-recorded three songs back in April. They did "Bust Down," "New Breed," and "From A Window," and hope to release these with some old demo material and some live eight track recordings from back in '78-'80. It will be a show only release and features covers by LEGION666, CAREER SUICIDE, and some others. It's going to be a one-sided 12" on clear vinyl like the original. Craig is also working on a series of old local reissues which include SONS OF ISHMAEL *Hayseed Hardcore*, THE YOUNG LIONS demos as a 12", and the MICRO EDGE demo as an LP. There is the ENDLESS BLOCKADE / SHANK split which is limited to 300 copies, a DISCO ASSAULT *Saturday Night Bleeder* EP, a DEATHCAKE EP, and a BROKEN NEEDLE EP all in the works. Adrift Skate Shop has been a regular fixture of the hardcore punk scene for the past five years. They recently moved locations from Kensington Market to a new store at 116 Spadina Avenue. There was a photo show of both skateboarding and concert photography that commemorated the old Adrift location. Lyndsey and the Adrift team acquired an unused warehouse that they call the Adrift Clubhouse. Mark and SITC have been using the space for some of the most amazing shows the city has seen in a long time. Highlights include a secret NO AGE show, REIGN SUPREME / TRAPPED UNDER ICE, and an insane CAREER SUICIDE show with about 400 people in attendance despite sub-zero temperatures. An artist live-work loft space in the city's east end has also become a hub of activity. The building is called Siesta Nouveau and it was home to the High Art for the Low Down space—now being run out of Annie's on Queen—and Studio BLR which is where a lot of the smaller SITC shows find their home. A new space in the market has opened up called Rear View Mirror. It used to be a space that housed Bread and Circus. That's good to see another venue in the market now that Planet Kensington is closed. Graffiti's also does the odd in-store show. TOBP's Dee Jay "Yi Ma Bzzz" spins punk vinyl at Mitz's Sister and is dabbling in booking bands too. tinyurl.com/sympatico.ca is the email for bands that want a gig in Toronto at Mitz's Sister at 1554 Queen Street West. As Parkdale goes, the older scene has some shows at the Cadillac Lounge and Dakota's.

In terms of 19+ bar shows, Sneaky Dee's and Rancho Relaxo continue to regularly host punk and hardcore bands. Occasionally, the Kathedral will have worthwhile shows. And a new disco bar in Parkdale, called Wrongbar, promised to start having regular punk shows, but outside of a HARD SKIN / FUCKED UP show, the space has not lived up to its potential. I also heard that Lou Molinaro is opening up a nightclub in Hamilton.

Stores:

Babel Books is a great new store down the street, just south of Dundas on Ossington. My brother's friend Tim Hannah runs the store. The store has recently changed their name to Fratelli City and they are located at 123 Ossington Avenue. Rotate This has moved a little further west to 801 Queen Street West. They are one of the best places to get concert tickets and vinyl. They have a website at: www.rotate.com. Daniel Hannah of TERMINAL RAGE fame started up a video store called Eye Sore Cinema, which is above the new Rotate This location.
