

The organ should be used sparingly if at all. It would seem best to restrict it chiefly to a few pedal notes, to playing over the Chants and Hymn, and to the use of its full tone for the GLORIA.

Note on the pointing.

The figure above any syllable denotes the verbal rhythm or group of syllables which follow it. Two dots across the bar line indicate a slight syncopation which lengthens the previous and shortens the succeeding syllables.





Here follows The Lords Prayer said by all present.

Then may follow this prayer taken from The First English Prayer Book.

We commend into Thy hands of mercy, most merciful Father, the souls of our brethren* departed [here may be named the souls in whose sacred memory the Requiem is sung], beseeching Thine infinite goodness to give us grace to live in Thy fear and love and to die in Thy favour: that when the judgement shall come which Thou hast committed to Thy well-beloved Son, both these our brethren* and we may be found acceptable in Thy sight, and receive that blessing which Thy well-beloved Son shall then pronounce to all that love and fear Thee, saying: Come ye blessed children of my Father: Receive the kingdom prepared for you be-fore the beginning of the world. Grant this, merciful Father, for the honour of Jesu Christ our only Saviour, Mediator and Advocate.

Amen.

This prayer may also be added.

Almighty-God, we give Thee hearty thanks for these thy servants whom Thou hast delivered from the miseries of this world, from the body of death and from all temptation, And as we trust hath brought their souls which they committed into Thy holy hands into sure consolation and rest. Grant we beseech Thee that at the day of judgement their souls and all the souls of Thy elect may with us and we with them fully receive Thy promises, and be made perfect altogether through the glorious resurrection of Thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord.
