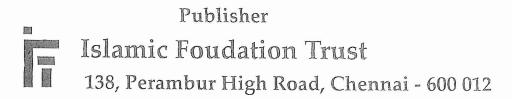

FOREWORD

The need for a book containing selections from the Glorious Qur'ān with explanations in English and within the framework of my book *Durūs al-Lughaḥ al-'Arabiyyaħ li-Ghayr al-Nāṭiqīn Bihā* has long been felt. I hope this book will meet this need.

It contains eight selections taken from different parts of the Qur'ān, and have been selected mostly on linguistic bases.

I earnestly hope that this book will help the students of Arabic to learn some of the linguistic elements of Arabic needed to fully comprehend the style and the language of the Glorious Qur'ān, and prepare them for their future study of the entire Book of Allah.

An electronic recording of the recitation of these passages by two famous *qārī*s is planned to be provided with the book *in šā'* Allāh.

INTRODUCTION

The plan followed in the book is set out in the following lines:

Each lesson is divided into the following four sections:

- 1) First, the complete text of the selected *āyāt* is given. It is taken from the electronic format of the *Muṣḥaf al-Madīnah al-Nabawiyyah* published by King Fahd Qur'an Printing Complex, Madinah Munawwarah. I have provided more space between the words of the text to help the reader go through the text more easily.
- 2) In the second section, 'Lexical and Grammatical Notes', each āyāħ is given with the translation of its meanings. The translation is based on some of the existing translations, especially M. M. Pickthall's, but slightly modified in the light of my own judgment. All translations of Qur'ānic texts are in boldface.
- 3) The text and its translation are followed by lexical and grammatical notes. I occasionally refer the reader to my book *Durūs al-Lughaħ* for a fuller treatment of the grammatical point in question. This I do by saying, See D3:7 which stands for *Durūs al-Lughaħ*, Part 3, Lesson 7.
- 4) The aim of the third section, 'Additional Notes' is to provide the reader with a fuller discussion of a lexical or grammatical point, or more Qur'ānic material on a particular subject. The sign [AN#] placed at the end of a lexical or grammatical note in Section Two points to the existence of an Additional Note in this Section.

5) The last section, Exercise, is meant to test the student in comprehension, grammar and some language skills.

NOTES ON THE ENTRY OF VERBS

Verbs are mentioned in the $m\bar{a}d\bar{i}$ (with the third person masculine singular ending) and, for convenience, explained with the infinitive, e.g. 'to write, though to be accurate, it means he wrote. The abwāb of the thulāthi mujarrad verbs are shown in the following manner:

The *maṣdar* of each verb is mentioned immediately after the verb, and is given in the $manṣ\bar{u}b$ case thus making it the $maf^{\bar{u}}l$ muțlaq as it is done in Arabic dictionaries.

HOW TO TEACH THE BOOK?

If the book is taught in a class, the following guidelines may be followed:

- 1) The class listens to the recitation of the Qur'ānic passage from the cassette/CD twice.
- 2) The students then try to understand the first *āyaħ* with the help of the Lexical and Grammatical Notes. They are advised not to look into the translation until they have understood the *āyaħ* completely on their own.

- 3) After the time fixed for the study of the *âyaħ* is over, the instructor asks the students to translate the meaning of the *âyaħ*. He then asks the class various types of questions covering comprehension, grammar, and meanings of words.
- 4) The class listens to the recitation of this *āyaħ* from the cassette/CD. Then the students start reciting it.
- 5) The class then moves on to the next āyaħ.
- 6) After the students have studied all the *āyaāt* in the passage in this manner, they listens to the recitation of the entire passage once again.
- 7) The class then answers the questions mentioned at the end of the lesson first orally in the class, then in writing at home.
- 8) The instructor may ask additional questions as he deems fit.

- (1) In the name of Allah, the Compassionate, the Merciful.
- 1) In the alif has been omitted in writing also. In some $\bar{a}y\bar{a}t$ it is retained, as for example, in the following $\bar{a}ya\hbar$,

So glorify the name of your Lord, the Great. (56:74)

- 2) The *jārr* and its *majrūr* بِسْمِ are related to a verb like أَبْدأُ, 'I commence', or أُقْرَأُ, 'I read'.
- 3) In the word اللَّه, the initial letters do not constitute the definite article, but they are part of the name. The hamzaħ is hamzaħ al-waṣl, and it is omitted in pronunciation when the word is preceded by another word, e.g. مِن الله, but it is not omitted in يا الله which is pronounced yā ʾāllāh.
- (i-a), to have mercy. رَحِمَ اللهُ فُلاناً رُحْماً، ورَحْمَةً، وَمَرْحَمَةً

The ism al-fā'il is رَحِيمٌ, and the ism al-mubālaghaħ is رَحِيمٌ. is another ism al-mubālaghaħ.

كَرِيمٌ، سَخِيُّ، signifies an inherent quality as in عَلِيلٌ signifies an inherent quality as in جَلِيلٌ , whereas the pattern فَعْــلانُ signifies a momentary quality as in السرَّحِيمُ So عَضْبانُ، سَكُرانُ، عَطْــشَانُ points to the inherent

quality of mercy in Allah السرَّحْمَّنُ, and السرَّحْمَّنُ to the manifestation of His quality of mercy in time and space.



- (2) Praise belongs to Allah, the Lord of the worlds.
- 1) آخمِدُ (i-a), to praise.

: The definite article in this word is the generic *al*- which signifies all types of praise are meant. [AN1]

(AN2] أُرْبَابٌ lord, master, pl أَرْبَابٌ [AN2]

Here رُبِّ is the badal of الله

عَالَمُونَ world, pl العَالَمُ (3)

There are two types of nouns which have the sound masculine plural form (جَمْعُ الْمُذَكَّرِ السَّالِمُ). They are:

- a) proper names, e.g. الْمُحَمَّدُونَ. الْمُحَمَّدُونَ الْمُحَمَّدُونَ. 1
- b) derived nouns and adjectives referring to male human beings, e.g. صَالِحُونَ مُهَنْدِسُونَ مُدُرِّسُونَ,

Both these rules have exceptions which you may learn later in $s\bar{a}$ 'Allāh.

Derived nouns mean derivatives like ism al-fā'il, ism al-maf'ūl and al-ṣifaħ al-mušabbahaħ.

So words likes وَلَدٌ , كِتَابٌ ,رَجُلٌ do not have the sound masculine plural form. Likewise حامِــلٌ meaning 'pregnant' does not have

¹ If a proper name is made plural, it takes the definite article *al*-because after it becomes plural, it is no longer a proper name.

this plural form, because though it is a ism al-fā'il, it is feminine.

But there are some nouns which do not belong to either of the two categories mentioned above, yet have the sound masculine plural form. Following are the most important nouns of this category:

عَالَمٌ pl of عَالَمُونَ.

[AN3] أَهْلُ plof أَهْلُونَ

أَرْضُ pl of أَرْضُ. Note that in the plural the second letter (ز) has fathaħ.

رَّ اللَّهُ اللَّهُ pl of سَنُونَ (year). Note the the fatḥaħ of the first letter has changed to kasraħ in the plural.

ذُو pl of ذُو It has no $n\bar{u}n$ at end because it is always $mud\bar{a}f$.

أُولُو pl of غُو. It has no $n\bar{u}n$ at end because it is always $mud\bar{a}f$.

يَسْعُونَ through عِشْرُونَ Likewise

Note that عَالَمْ has a broken plural also. It is عَوَالِمُ

Its ism al-maf ul is مَدِينٌ. It occurs in the following āyaħ,

When we die and become dust and bones, shall we really be brought to book? (37:53)

يَوْمُ السَّدِّينِ (the Day of Recompense) is one of the names of يَوْمُ السَّدِّينِ القِيَامَةِ

- (5) You alone we worship, and Your aid alone we seek.
- 1) عَبَدَ عِبَادةً (a-u), to worship.
- . أُعْوَانُ , helper, pl عُوْنُ (2

أُعَانَ فُلاناً إِعَانَــةً iv, to help. (The ism al-fāʿil is أُعَانَ فُلاناً إِعَانَــةً).

x, to seek help. اسْتَعَانَ فُلاناً، وبِفُلانٍ اسْتِعَانَــةً

The ism al-maf َul is مُسْتَعَانُ as in اللَّهُ الْمُـسْتَعَانُ, Allah is the One Whose help is sought.

3) إِيَّاكُ نَعْبُـــــُـــُ, The object has been placed before the verb for the sake of emphasis, so the meaning is 'We worship none but You.'

أَهْدِنَا ٱلصِّرَاطُ ٱلْسُتَقِيمُ الْ

(6) Guide us to the straight path,

(a-i), to lead, guide. هَدَى اللهُ فلاناً الطَّرِيقَ هِدايَةً

There are two more ways of using this verb. They are:

a) using إِلَى with the second object as in the following āyaħ,

Say, 'My Lord has indeed guided me to a straight path, a right religion, the faith of Ibrāhīm, the man of true faith. He was no polytheist.' (6:161).

b) using J with the second object as in the following $\bar{a}ya\hbar$,

They said, 'Praise be to Allah Who has guided us to this. We could not have been guided had Allah not guided us.' (7: 43). In الْمُرَاطُ, the pronoun لَا is the first maf لَا المُرَاطُ is the second.

- 3) The sentence صِلَةُ الْمَوْصُولِ is أَنْعَمْتَ عَلَيْهِمْ and the pronoun مِلَةُ الْمَوْصُولِ is the عَلَيْهِمْ is the عَلَيْهِمْ
- 4) عَيْرِ is badal of عَيْرِ (4
- (i-a), to be angry. غَضِبَ عَلَى فُلانٍ غَضَبًا

The ism al-maf ul of مَغْضُوبٌ عَلَيْهِ is مَغْضُوبٌ عَلَيْهِ , and its plural is مَغْضُوبٌ عَلَيْهِمْ and the pl, مَغْضُوبٌ عَلَيْهِمْ . The feminine singular is مَغْضُوبٌ عَلَيْهِمْ .

In the same way the *ism al-maf ul* of مَشْكُو كُ فِيهِ is مَشْكُو كُ فِيهِ, and its plural is مَشْكُو كُ فِيهِمْ.

6) ضَلَّ ضَلَاً (a-i), to lose one's way, go astray, err.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

- 1) The definite article \mathring{U} is of three kinds. They are:
- a) Referential,
- b) Generic,
- c) Extra.

The Referential

This \mathcal{J} points to an object known both to the speaker and to the listener. The source of this common knowledge may be one the following:

- a) The presence of the object in their vicinity. Referring to man who is in their vicinity, one may say, نَادِ الرَّحُــلَ (Call the man). This is known as العَهْدُ الحُضُورِيُّ المُعْدُ الحُضُورِيُّ.
- b) The fact that the object has already been mentioned by one or both of them, e.g. مَاْءَنِي رِجُلٌ غَرِيبٌ فِي مَكْتَبِي. كَانَ الرَّجُلُ بُوذِيّاً A stranger came to me in my office. The man was a Buddhist.'

 This is known as العَهْدُ الذِّ كُرِيُّ .
- c) The context, e.g. when the grammar teacher says هَاتُوا الدَّفَاتِرَ, the students know that they have to submit the grammar notebook.

This is known as العُهْدُ الذِّهْنِي.

The Generic J

This type of J refers to the generic nature of the object, and has no reference to the speaker's or the listener's knowledge of it, e.g.

الْعِنَبُ أَغْلَى مِنُ التُّفَّاحِ, 'Grapes are more expensive than apples.'
The generic الْعِنَبُ أَغْلَى مِنُ التُّفَّاحِ



And man was created weak. (4: 28)

الْ الْجِنْسِيَّةُ لَاسْتِغْرَاقِ means 'every man'. This is called الْجِنْسِ (the generic al- referring to every member of the genus). It may also refer to a quality present in the genus, but not in every member of the genus, e.g. الرَّجُلُ أَقْوَى مِسنَ الْمُسرُ أَوِّ 'Man is stronger than woman', but this cannot be said of every man and woman.

The Extra 🗓

The third kind of الله is neither referential nor generic, but it depends upon the usage, e.g. the al- in الله العُزَّى، القاهِرَةُ The use of al- in such words is mandatory.

There is another kind of the extra al- which may be used with a proper name to suggest that the person bearing the name has the quality contained in the meaning of the word, e.g. the proper name عَبَّاسُ literally means one with a frowning face. If a man with this name is referred to as الفَيِّابِيلُ, it is suggested that he is in fact a man who never smiles. But this also follows Arab usage, and one may not add al- to any proper name they like.

O People of the Book! Come to common terms between you and us: that we shall worship none but Allah, and that we shall ascribe no partners to Him, and that none of us shall take others for lords beside Allah. And if they turn away, then say, 'Bear witness that we are Muslims.' (3: 64)

They have taken as lords beside Allah their rabbis and their monks, and the Messiah, son of Maryam ... (9: 64)

4) Here is an āyah with أَهْلُونَ:

Those of the bedouin Arabs who stayed behind will tell you, 'Our wealth and our families preoccupied us. So ask forgiveness for us.' (48: 11)

Here is an āyaħ with أَهْلِينَ:

يَّاأَيُّهَا ٱلَّذِينَ ءَامَنُوا قُوَّا أَنفُسَكُو وَأَهْلِيكُو نَارًا وَقُودُهَا ٱلنَّاسُ وَٱلْحِجَارَةُ عَلَيْهُا مَلَيْكُةً فِلَاظُ شِدَادُ لَا يَعْصُونَ ٱللَّهَ مَا أَمَرَهُمْ وَيَفْعَلُونَ مَا يُؤْمَرُونَ اللَّهَ مَا أَمَرَهُمْ وَيَفْعَلُونَ مَا يُؤْمَرُونَ اللَّهَ مَا التَّحْرِمِ ١١].

O you who believe! Save yourselves and your families from a fire which has men and stones as its fuel over which are set angels stern and severe, who do not disobey Allah in what He commands them to do, but carry out what they are commanded. (66:11)

4) Here is an Arabic proverb, إَوْهَلْ يَسْتَقِيمُ الظّلُّ والعُودُ أَعْدُو جُ؟, 'Can the shadow be straight when the stick is curved?', i.e. the shadow of a curved stick cannot be straight. A similar English proverb is, 'Like father, like son.'

4) قَامَ بِالأَمْر, to undertake, carry out, execute.

قَيْوُومٌ so it is originally قَيْعُولُ from قَامٌ, so it is originally قَيْعُولُ. The meaning is He who manages the affairs of the whole universe. [AN2]

5) وَسِنَ يُوسَنُ وَسَناً is the maṣdar of سِنَةٌ (i-a), to be drowsy.

Note that the $w\bar{a}w$ of the $mith\bar{a}l$ $w\bar{a}w\bar{\imath}$ in certain verbs belonging to i-a and u-u groups are not omitted in the $mud\bar{a}ri'$ as (\dot{z}) , to be afraid. [AN3]

The *mithāl wāwī* verbs have two types of *maṣdar*: one with the *wāw*, and the other without it. Here are some examples:

- 7) For أِذْ see Lesson 3/āyaħ 258/Note 4.
- 8) اَذْ كُرُوا نِعْمَةُ اللهِ عَلَيْكُمْ إِذْ كُنْتُم أَعْسِداءً : Here أَا اللهِ عَلَيْكُمْ إِذْ كُنْتُم أَعْسِداءً : relation to نَعْمة which has the force of أَنْعُمَ أَنْعُمَ , i.e.

أَنْعَمَ اللهُ عَلَيْكُمْ إِذْ كُنْتُمْ أَعْداءً, 'Allah bestowed His favours on you when you were enemies'.

8) عَـــــُوُّ enemy. It is also used in the plural sense (enemies). In the following āyaħ it is singular:

Therefore We said, 'O Adam! This is indeed an enemy to you and to your wife...' (20:117).

And it is plural in the following āyaħ:

فَإِنَّهُمْ عَدُوٌّ لِيِّ إِلَّا رَبَّ ٱلْعَلَمِينَ

They are indeed enemies to me except the Lord of the worlds. (26:77).

It has also a plural form, أَعْدَاءُ as in this āyaħ which we are studying, and in the following āyaħ (4:45),

وَٱللَّهُ أَعْلَمُ بِأَعْدَآيِكُمْ

Allah is better aware of your enemies.

9) أَلَّفَ بَيْنَ النَّاسِ تَأْلِيفاً ii, to unite, join, combine, put together. أَلَّفَ بَيْنَ قُلُوبِكُمْ He joined your hearts in love.

iv, to become in the morning. Here it is a *nāqiṣ* verb, and so, it is a sister of غلن and takes *ism* and *khabar*. It means 'to become in the morning', and may also mean just 'to become' without reference to time as in this *āyaħ*.

ii, to explain, expound, make clear.

16) اهْتَدَى اهْتِدَاءً viii, to be guided.

- (104) Let there arise from you a group of people inviting to all that is good, enjoining what is right, and forbidding what is wrong. Such are they who are successful.
- 1) وَلْــَــُكُنْ : This is *lām al-amr*. Note that it has *sukūn* because of the preceding *wāw*. (See D3:13).
- 2) الْمَعْــرُوفُ means that which is known, well-known, universally accepted, and as an Islamic term, it means that which is recognized as good by the šarīʿaħ.
- 3) أَنْكُــرُ إِنْكُــاراً iv, to disown, disclaim, refuse to recognize. The ism al-mafūl is ثُنْكَــرُ . So literally it means that which is disowned, disclaimed, not recognized, and as an Islamic term, it means that which is not recognized by the šarīʿaħ as good.

- 2) أُولَئِكَ لَهُم عَذَابٌ عَظِيمٌ : The khabar of أُولَئِكَ لَهُم عَذَابٌ عَظِيمٌ is the nominal sentence

- (106) on the day when some faces will brighten and some darken. As for those whose faces darken, (it will be said to them), 'Did you reject faith after professing it? So taste the torment for your rejection of faith.'
- 1) يُعَذَّبُونَ is *maf ul fihi* and points to the time of يُومَ (they will be punished) which is understood from the word عَذَابٌ occurring at the end of the previous *āyaħ*.
- 2) اَبْيَضَّ ابْيضَاضاً ix, to become white.

- ix, to become black. اسْوَدٌ اسْو دَاداً (3
- 4) The verbal sentence تَبْيَضٌ وُجُوهٌ is muḍāf ilayhi, and so it is في مَحَلِّ جَرِّ .
- 5) أُدُوهٌ is indefinite, and so means 'some faces'.
- 6) ... أَمَّا الَّذِينَ اسْوَدَّتْ وُجُوهُهُمْ أَكَفَرْتُمْ ... The jawāb of أَمَّا مَعْ أَكَفَرْتُمْ ... omitted which may be construed as فَيُقَالُ لَهُ مَ and this is the khabar of the mubtada 'الَّذِينَ ' khabar of the mubtada
- 7) مَسِلَةُ الْمَوْصُولِ This verbal sentence is مَسِلَةُ الْمَوْصُولِ, and the فَحُوهُهُمْ is the pronoun هُمُ in هُمُ فَعُهُمْ أَنْ أَنْ فَائِدٌ

- الَّذِينَ is the khabar of فِي رَحْمَةِ الله (1
- 2) هُمْ فِيهَا خَالِدُونَ is *ḥāl*, and its *ṣāḥib al-ḥāl* is the *fāʿil* of the verb اسْتَقَرُّوا

In a sentence like الوَلَدُ فِي البَيْت, the *šibh jumlaħ* في البَيْت is said to be the *khabar*, but the actual *khabar* is said to be a verb which may be construed as اسْـــتَقَرَّ meaning to settle down, to establish oneself, to take up one's position.

This applies to the zarf also, e.g. الْمُدَرِّسُ عِنْدَ الْمُسدِيرِ. Here also the actual khabar is اسْتَقَرَّ

(108) These are the revelations of Allah. We recite them to you (O Prophet) in truth. Allah wills no injustice to (His) creatures.

- اَ اللهِ اللهُ أَنْ أَلُوهَا ... أَيَاتٌ is *ḥāl*, and its *ṣāḥib al-ḥāl* is تَتْلُوهَا ...
- 2) لِلْعَالَمِينَ is called لِلْعَالَمِينَ is called لِلْعَالَمِينَ is called لِلْعَالَمِينَ (the *lām* of strengthening). This is prefixed to the *maf tīl bihī* if the action of the verb becomes weak. The action of the verb is said to be weak in the following two cases:
- a) if the maf ul bihī precedes the verb as in the following āyah:

O courtiers, tell me the meaning of my dream if you can interpret dreams. (12:43)

Here the *maf ul bihī* (الرُّوْيَا) precedes the verb, and so it has taken the *lām al-taqwiyah*. It does not need the *lām* if it follows the verb (إِنْ كُنْتُمْ تَعْبُرُونَ الرُّوْيَا).

b) If it is the *mafʿūl bihī* of a *maṣdar* or of a derivative like the *ism al-fāʿil* or the *ism al-mubālaghaħ*, e.g.

Here ظُلْمَا is the *mafūl bihī* of the *maṣdar* ظُلْمَا. It does not need the *lām* if it is the *mafūl bihī* of the verb directly as in,

Send him with us tomorrow that he may enjoy himself and play. And we shall take care of him. (12:12).

Here the *mafʿūl bihī* (هُ) has taken the *lām* because its عَامِلُ is an *ism al-fāʿil* (حَافِظُونَ). If it is the *mafʿūl bihī* of the verb, it has no need of the *lām* (إِنَّا نَحْفَظُهُ).

Indeed your Lord does whatever He wills. (11:107).

Here the *mafʿūl bihī* (الله) has the *lām* because its عَامِــل is an *ism* al-mubālaghaħ (الفَعَّالُ). If the verb is used, there is no need of the lām (إِنَّ رَبَّكَ يَفْعَلُ مَا يُريدُ).

The lām al-taqwiyah is optional in some cases. [AN4]

(109) To Allah belongs whatever is in the heavens, and whatever in the earth. And to Allah are all matters returned.

1) The verb رُخَعُ has two meanings. They are:

a) رَجُعَ رُجُوعاً، ومَرْجَعاً، ورُجْعَى (a-i), to come back, return as in: (a-i), to come back, return as in: ﴿ كُنَّ مَنَ مَكَةً ﴿ When did you return from Makkaħ?'

Here is an example from the Glorious Qur'ān,

Mūsā went back to his people angry and sad. (20:86) This is the intransitive use of رُحْنَ.

b) رَجْعَ رَجْعاً (a-i), to return, give back as in:

أَخَذْتَ كِتَابِي قَبْلَ شَهْرٍ ولَمْ تَرْجَعُهُ إِلَيَّ إِلَــى الآنَ. 'You took my book a month ago, and have not yet returned it to me.'

Here is an example from the Glorious Qur'ān,

And We returned you to your mother so that she might rejoice and might not grieve. (20:40)

This is the transitive use of this verb. And it is in this sense that this verb has passive voice.

(109) You are the best community that has been raised up for mankind. You enjoin what is right, forbid what is wrong, and believe in Allah. If the People of the Book had believed (in Muḥammad مَنْيُ وَسَامً), it would have been better for them. Among them are believers, but most of them are transgressors.

1) كَانَّمْ خَيْرَ أُمَّةِ : This is the type of كَانَّ which does not signify a past action, but is used to emphasize the relationship between its ism and khabar as in the following āyāt:

Allah is ever Forgiving, Merciful. (4:69)

And do not go anywhere near adultery: it is an abomination and an evil way. (17:32)

Then she pointed to him. They said, 'How can we talk to one who is a child in the cradle?' (19:29).

- 2) أُمَّةٍ This sentence is a na't of أُمَّةٍ.
- 3) خَيْرَ أُمَّةٍ is ḥāl and its ṣāḥib al-ḥāl is تَأْمُرُونَ بِالْمُعْرُوفِ.
- 4) كَانَ خَيْراً لَهُمْ : The ism of كَانَ خَيْراً لَهُمْ is the damīr mustatir which refers to الإيمانُ. The sentence may be construed as,

see D3:12. وَ عَنْ For

ADDITIONAL NOTES

- 1) The capital city is called العَاصِـمَةُ because it protects the country.
- 2) The word شَنْ مَا occurs in the Glorious Qur'ān twice. Here is the other āyaħ:

Is he who founded his building upon piety to Allah and His pleasure better, or he who founded his building on the brink of a crumbling bank of a valley so that it toppled with him into the fire of Hell? Allah does not guide wrongdoing folk. (9:109)

- 3) Note that حَافِرٌ means hoof (literally, that which digs).
- 4) As in the following *āyaħs*:

An account of the mercy of your Lord to His servant Zakariyyā. (19:2)

Here the word عَبْدُهُ is the *maf tīl bihī* of the *maṣdar* رُحْمَة, yet it has not taken the *lām al-taqwiyaħ*.

So do not think that Allah will fail to keep His promise to His messengers... (14:47)

Here وَعُسِدِهِ, yet it has not taken the *maf ūl bihī* of the *maṣdar* وَعُسِدِهِ, yet it has not

- 4) الله مُسنُ : Here إِلاَّ مُسنُ is the fā'il of الله as the istithnā is mufarragh. And قَدْ آمَنَ is the ṣilaħ al-mawṣūl.

- 5) For the word أُوحٌ and its being مُصْرُوف, see D3:34.
- 6) اَبْتَأْسَ ابْتَآساً viii, to be distressed, be sad and worried. It is الْفَتَعَلَ see Q12: 69.
- 7) بما كَانُوا يَفْعُلُونَ : Here أَه is either maṣdariyyah or mawṣūlah. In the first case, the meaning is 'at their doing', and in the second 'what they have been doing'. In this case the عَائِد has to be supplied (يَفْعُلُونَه).



- (37) Build the ship under Our Eyes and according to Our revelation, and do not speak to me on behalf of the wrongdoers. They shall surely be drowned.
- 1) مَنْعُ صُنْعاً (a-a), to make, manufacture.
- 2) الفُلْساك, ship. It is feminine, but can also be masculine as in Q26:119,

And We saved him and those with him in the laden ship.

Its plural has the same form as the singular, and of course it is feminine.

Here are some examples from the Qur'an of its being used as a plural:

It is He Who enables you to travel on land and sea until, when you are in the ships and they sail with them with a fair breeze, and they rejoice at it, a stormy wind overtakes them, and waves engulf them (those in the ship) from every side... (Q 10:22).

Note the word جَرَيْنَ which is third person feminine plural.

The sentence يُخْزيهِ is a na't.

- 3) كُلُولًا (a-i), to descend, befall.
- 4) أَقَامُ إِقَامَةُ iv, (1) to raise, to make someone stand up. (2) to stay, remain, dwell, reside.

- (40) (This was so) till, when our command come, and the earth burst open (with water), We said, 'carry into it a pair of every species, and your family except those against whom the Decree has already been passed and those who have believed, though none but a few had believed with him.
- أَوَامِرُ (1) matter, affair, pl أُمُورٌ (2) command, pl الأَمْرُ (1)
- 2) فَارَ يَفُورُ فَوْراً، و فَوَرَاناً (a-u), to gush out, boil over. [AN2]

The gushing out of the water from the surface of the earth has been likened to the boiling out of hot water from a pot.

4) كُمُلُ حَمُلًا (a-i), to carry.

أَمُّ حَامِلٌ, a pregnant woman (not: حَامِلَةُ). Arabic is logical: as this attribute is not shared by men, why waste a tā marbūṭaħ?

احْمِلْ of مَفْعُولٌ بِهِ is the زَوْجَيْنِ.

- 6) زَوْ جَانِ This is a na't of زَوْ جَانِ. The words وَاحِدٌ and وَاحِدٌ are used for emphasis, e.g.

is the *ism al-makān* and *ism al-zamān*, and means place and time of sailing. It may also be *maṣdar mīmī* meaning sailing.

Note that the word مُحْرِيهُ in this āyaħ is pronounced majrêhā.

Pronouncing a as e is called $im\bar{a}la\hbar$ (i). It is a phonetic phenomenon, and many words are pronounced with $im\bar{a}la\hbar$ in the reading of Warsh prevalent in North West Africa like Morocco, and the neighbouring countries. Note the sign of $im\bar{a}la\hbar$ placed under the letter $r\bar{a}$.

4) is the mubtada', and its khabar is مُحْرَاهَا (4).

The meaning is, 'Its sailing and anchoring is in the name of Allah.'

- (42) and it sails with them amidst waves like mountains, and Nuh called out to his son- and he was standing alone -, 'Come board with us my dear son, and do not be with the disbelievers'.
- 1) مُوْجُةٌ, waves. It is *ism al-jins al-jam'ī*, and the singular is مُوْجُةٌ. See Q24:40. (See D3:3).

2) عَــزَلَ فُلائَــا عَــزُلاً (a-i) (1) to remove, separate, isolate. (2) to depose, dismiss.

'I have nothing to do with this matter.' , أَنَا بِمَعْزِلٍ عَنْ هَذَا الأَمْرِ

3) أُبْنُ is the diminutive of أُبْنُ. One of the meanings of $taṣgh\bar{u}r$ is endearment. So يَا بُنَيُّ means 'O my dear son!'

Note that in يَا بُنَيَّ the pronoun of the first person singular has been omitted. The word originally is يَا بُنَيُّ (bunayyī). يَا بُنَيُّ as explained in D3:26.

Note that ارْكَبْ مَعْنَا is pronounced *irkamma anā* with the assimilation of *bā* to *mīm*.

- (43) He said, 'I shall take refuge on a mountain that will save me from the water. He (Nūḥ) said, 'Today there is no protection from Allah's decree except for him on whom He has had mercy', and the waves came in between them, and he was among the drowned.
- 1) أَوَى إِلَى الشَيْءِ أُويّاً (a-i), to take refuge. Note that سَآوِي is for the سَأُوي as سَأُوي is for لُكُلُ is for أُكُلُ a shelter, place of refuge.

The verbal noun is مُعْصِورُمُ. A prophet is said to be مُعْصِورُمُ, i.e. protected from sins.

So the meaning of لَا عَاصِمُ اليَوْمُ مِنْ أَمْرِ اللهِ إِلاَّ مَنْ رَحِمَ is, 'There is no savior today from Allah's decree, but those on whom Allah has mercy will be saved.' The khabar of يَعْصِمُ is لاَ النَّاهِيَةُ لِلْجِنُسِ is which is muqaddar.

And اليَوْمَ is maful fihi, and its nāṣib is the verb لا عَاصِمَ) يَعْصِمُ اليَوْمَ مِنْ أَمْرِ اللهِ

4) In مَنْ رَحِمَ the عَائِدٌ has been omitted. With the مَنْ رَحِمَ it is مَنْ . The sentence مَنْ مَحِمَهُ la مَنْ مَحِمَهُ.

حَالَ الْمَرَضُ عَيْنِي وَبَيْنَكَ حَيْلُولَةً (a-u), to intervene, e.g. حَالَ الشَّيْءُ بَيْنِي وَبَيْنَكَ حَيْلُولَةً (5) (a-u), to intervene, e.g. حَالَ الشَّيْءُ بَيْنِي وَ بَيْنَ السَّفَرِ (Sickness prevented me from travelling.' In the Qur'an (8:24):

Know that Allah comes in between a man and his heart. (8:24)

The meaning is that Allah can prevent a man from carrying out his plans.

أَلْمَصْدَرُ النَّائِبُ عَنْ فِعْلِهِ is here الْمَصْدَرُ النَّائِبُ عَنْ فِعْلِهِ, and the meaning is 'May they be removed far away!'

- 3) اَحُكُمْ مُكُماً (a-u), to judge, decide, pass judgment.

أَحْكُمُ الْحَاكِمِينَ, the most just of judges.

- (46) He said, 'Nūḥ! He is certainly not of your household. It (what he did) is indeed an unrighteous deed. So do not ask me that which you have no knowledge of. I admonish you lest you should be among the ignorant.'
- 1) The pronoun in إِنَّــهُ عَمَــلُّ غَيْــرُ صَــالِح refers to the son's disobedience. It may refer to the son himself, and in that case it means, 'He is an embodiment of unrighteousness.

2) سَأَلَ فُلانٌ شَيْعًا (a-a), to ask for. It takes two objects, e.g. اللَّهُمَّ إِنِّي Here is an example from the Glorious Qur'ān (42:23):

Say (O Prophet), 'I ask of you no fee for this except the affection due to kinsfolk'.

In the $\bar{a}ya\hbar$ we are studying the first object is the pronoun of the first person ($y\bar{a}$ which has been omitted) (see below #3), and the second object is \checkmark .

- 3) فَلا تَسْأَلْنِ is for فَلا تَسْأَلْنِ. The omission of the yā of the first person is common in the Qur'anic Arabic. See Q89:15, 16.
- 4) وَعَظَ يَمِظُ وَعُظًا (a-i), to admonish, exhort, warn.
- 5) أَنْ تَكُونَ مِنَ الْحَاهِلِينَ : The maṣdar muʾawwal is muḍāf ilaihi, and the muḍāf is omitted which may be a word like خَـشْية or مَفْعُولٌ لَهُ and this word is مَفْعُولٌ لَهُ , and this word is
- 6) جَهِلَ جَهُلاً، وَجَهَالَةً (i-a) (1) to be ignorant (2) to be irrational, or foolish.

The first is the opposite of عِلْتُم, and the second is the opposite of جُلُم، and the second is the opposite of عُلْم. It has the first meaning in this $\bar{a}ya\hbar$. Here is an example of the second meaning:

The servants of Raḥmān are those who walk on earth humbly, and who, when the foolish confront them, they say, 'Salam.'

- (47) He said, 'My Lord, I seek refuge in You from asking You what I have no knowledge of. If You do not forgive me, and have mercy on me, I shall be among the losers.'

4) خَسِرَ خَسَارَةً، وَخُسْرًا، وَخُسْرَاناً (i-a), to incur a loss.

(48) It was said (to him), 'Nūḥ! Disembark with peace from Us and blessings upon you, and upon some of the communities (that will spring) from those who are with you. There will be other communities whom We will provide enjoyment (for a while), and then a painful punishment from Us will overtake them.'

1) هَبُطَ هُبُوطًا (a-i), to descend, come down.

Note مُهبطُ الْسُوحْي, 'place where the revelation came down from the heaven', an epithet of Makkah and Madinah.

- 2) أُمَّةُ, nation, community, pIأُمَّةً
- 3) مَتَّعَ فُلاناً تَمْتِيعاً ii, to provide enjoyment.
- 4) مُسَّ يُمَسُّ مُسَّا (i-a, مُسسْتُ), to touch, to hit, befall.
- 5) أَلَّمْ, pain, suffering, pl أَلَمْ

أَلِيمٌ, painful.

6) مُوْصُوفَةٌ Here أُمَمٌ is mubtada' because it is وَأُمَمٌ سَنُمَتَّعُهُمْ (as it stands for وَأُمَمٌ أَخْرَى

أَمْنُ مُعَــكُ , 'other communities (springing) from some of those who are with you'.

- (49) These are of the tidings of the Unseen that We reveal to you (O Muhammad). Neither you nor your people knew this before this. So be patient. The future belongs to the pious.
- 1) أُنْبَاء news, tidings, pl أُنْبَاء أ
- 2) عُوَاقِبُ , end, result, outcome, pl عُوَاقِبُ. The future can be happy or unhappy. What is meant here is happy future.
- 3) عَالَمُهَا أَنْتَ وَ لا قَوْمُكَ : If a noun is to be joined to a ضَمِيرُ ، with a conjunction, the corresponding ضَمِيرٌ مُنْفَ صِلٌ with a conjunction, the should first be mentioned as in this āyaħ. See Lesson 2/āyaħ 249/Note 9.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

1) The word الْمَــلاً also means assembly or gathering as in the following ḥadīth:

If he approaches Me a span, I approach him a cubit, and if he approaches Me a cubit, I approach him a fathom. If he comes to Me walking, I go to him running."

(Reported by al-Bukhārī in Kitāb al-Tawḥīd, 15).

2) Note: رَجَعَ فُلانٌ مِنْ فَوْرِهِ, 'He returned immediately'. خَرَجَتُ فُورِهِ, 'I went out soon after my entry'. (See D3:24).

The word فُوْرُ has acquired the meaning of 'immediacy' from the idea of 'boiling' as if the second action takes place before the first cools down.

From فَوَّارَه is derived the Urdu فَوَّارَه for a fountain.

But in Arabic a fountain is النَّافُورَةُ.

Note that in modern Arabic قُرْصٌ فَوَّارٌ is effervescent tablet.

- 3) The word تَـــــُـــُور has been corrupted to تَــــُـــُور in Urdu.
- 4) The *ism al-fāʿil* of رَاسٍ is رَسَا meaning 'something firmly fixed'. It is also used for a mountain, and its *pl* رَوَاسٍ occurs in nine *āyāt*s of the Qur'an, one of them is the following:

The word al- $R\bar{u}m$ (\tilde{l}) means the Byzantines. The first few $\bar{a}y\bar{a}t$ of this $s\bar{u}ra\hbar$ (2-6) refer to defeat of the Byzantines at the hands of the Persians in 614-15 CE, and the prophecy that the Byzantines would be victorious within nine years.

LEXICAL AND GRAMMATICAL NOTES



- (17) So glory be to Allah when you enter the night and when you enter the morning.
- 1) الشَّرَّ اللهُ تَسْبِيحاً ii, to glorify Allah, i.e. to declare Him free from any defect or blemish, or from any attribute that is unbecoming of Him.

أَسُبُحانُ اللهِ ism al-maṣdar from سُبُحانُ اللهِ. It is manṣūb as it is mafūl muṭlaq. It is a maṣdar functioning as its verb, so سُبُحَانُ اللهِ here means سُبُحُوا اللهِ (Praise Allah).

2) حَينٌ, period of time, pl أُحْيانٌ, and its pl is حِينٌ.

is here *maf ūl fīhi*. Here is another example,

رَأَيْتُكَ حِينَ خَرَحتَ مَنَ الْمَسْجِدِ, 'I saw you when you left the mosque.'

- نَّ مُسُونَ here جِينَ تُمْسُونَ is mudāf, and the verbal sentence تُمْسُونَ is mudāf ilayhi and is, therefore, fī maḥall jarr.
- 3) الْمُسَاءُ, late evening (extends from the approach of sunset to the time of 'išā' prayer).

iv, to spend the evening, enter into the evening.

4) أَصْبُحُ iv, to spend the morning, enter into morning.

5) Here both أُسْنَى and أَصْبَحُ are tāmm verbs. A tāmm verb is one which takes a fā il like دُخُلُ، خَرُجَ، جَلُسُ . It is the opposite of a nāqiṣ verb which takes an ism and khabar like كَانَ ، صَـــارُ etc. The following examples will make the point clear:

Nāqiṣ: أَمْسَى بلالٌ مَريضاً, 'Bilal was sick in the evening'.

Tāmm: لَمَّا أَمْسَى بِلالٌ خَرَجَ لِلـــَّانِ وَهَة, 'When it was evening, Bilal went for a walk' (*literally*, 'when B. entered the evening, he ...').

Nāqiṣ: أُصَبُحْتُ نَشِيطًا, 'I was active in the morning'.

Tāmm: جُلُسْتُ أَقْرَأُ هذا الكِتابَ حَتَّى أَصْبَحْت, 'I sat reading this book till it was morning (*literally*, '... till I entered the morning').

- (18) To Him belongs praise in the heavens and the earth, and at the sun's decline and in the noonday.
- is a parenthetical وَلَهُ الْحَمْدُ فِي السَّمُواتِ وَالأَرْضِ is a parenthetical clause, and the word عَسَشِيًّا is $ma' t\bar{u}f$ of the word إنه in the previous $\bar{a}ya\hbar$. So the construction of the sentence is like this: فَسَبِّحُوا الله حِينَ تُمْسُونَ وحِينَ تُصْبِحُونَ، وعَشِيًّا، وحين تُظْهِرُون. وَلَهُ الْحَمْدُ فِي السَّمُواتِ وَالأَرْض.

2) حَمِدُ حَمْدًا (i-a), to praise. حَمِدُ جَمْدًا , praiseworthy.

مُحَمَّدٌ ii, to praise excessively. Its ism al-maf ûl is مُحَمَّدٌ

- 3) : the *khabar* has been placed before the *mubtada*' for the sake of emphasis.
- (4) فِي السَّمُواتِ والأَرْضِ : the *šibh jumlaħ* is a ḥāl of الْحَمْدُ
- 6) عُشِيٌّ , evening (from noon to sunset).

is here maf al fihi.

7) الظُّهُ أَنْهُرَ إظْهَاراً iv, to spend the noon (الظُّهُ أَنْهُرَ إظْهَاراً), enter the noontide.

(This verb is not used as a nāqiş verb).

8) These two āyaħs refer to the five daily prayers.

refers to *maghrib* and 'išā' prayers.

refers to fajr prayer. تُصْبِحُون

refers to 'aṣr prayer. عَشِيّاً

refers to zuhr prayer. 1 تُظْهِرُونَ

- (19) He brings forth the living from the dead, and He brings forth the dead from the living, and He revives the earth after its death. And even so will you be brought forth.
- 1) أُخْرَجَ إِخْرَاجاً iv, to bring out.

2) حَيِيَ يَحْيا حَيَاةً (i-a), to live, be alive. ﴿ with idgham is also used instead of حَيِيَ . See Q8:42.

أُحْياءً live, living, pl حَيُّ.

iv, to give life, quicken, revive. Its ismu l-fā il is مُحْسِي إِحْيَاءُ مُحْسِي, and with الْمُحْسِي.

أيخيري has two $y\bar{a}s$ as both its second and third radicals are $y\bar{a}s$, but in this $\bar{a}ya\hbar$, this word is written in the $mushaf^2$ with only one $y\bar{a}$ as the second $y\bar{a}$ is lost in pronunciation due to $iltiq\bar{a}$ 'alsākinayn:

yuḥyī l-arḍa → yuḥyi l-arḍa. يُحْيِي الأَرْضَ

In āyaħ No 24, the second yā remains, but it is written separately as a miniature letter. This is how letters omitted in the 'Uthmānic Codex are indicated.

- 3) يَخْرِجُ ٱلْحَيِّ مِن ٱلْمَيْتِ: This refers to natural phenomena like the growth of a tree from a seed, the formation of an embryo from the sperm etc which appear 'dead' to the common man. But more significantly it refers to the emergence of a staunch believer from a former disbeliever and vice versa.
- 4) أَرْضٌ (with al- الأَرَاضِ, earth, pl
- 5) مَاتَ يَمُوتَ مَوْتَاً (a-u), to die. The *māḍī isnāde*d to *mutḥarrik* pronouns is مُتُ etc with *ḍammaħ*. [AN1]

l A very common name in the Indian subcontinent is مُحْثِي الدِّين meaning 'the reviver of the religion'.

² Muṣḥaf means the written or printed copy of the Qur'ān. While discussing orthographical matters, we use this word instead of the word Qur'ān, e.g. 'This word occurs in the Qur'ān and it is written like this in the muṣḥaf'.

6) وَكَذَلِكَ تُخْرَجُونَ : Here كَذَلِكَ is mafūl muṭlaq as it represents the maṣdar إِخْراج because the meaning is إِخْراجاً مُمَاثِلاً, or رَّتُخْرَجُونَ إِخْراجاً مُمَاثِلاً The idea is that you will be brought to life after your death just as the earth is brought back to life by the rain after its death during the time of drought.

- (20) And of His signs is that He created you from dust, and surprisingly you are human beings scattered all around.
- آيُّ، آياتٌ a sign, pl آيةٌ.
- 2) خَلْقَ خُلْقًا (a-u), to create. The word خُلُقُ is a maṣdar meaning 'creation', but is also used (just as in English) in the sense of ism al-maf ūl, i.e., 'that which has been created'.
- 3) The maṣdar mu'awwal أَنْ خَلَقَكُ أَوْ اللهُ اللهُ اللهُ أَنْ خَلَقَكُ أَلهُ أَلَا أَلُهُ اللهُ أَلُهُ اللهُ أَلُهُ اللهُ أَلُهُ اللهُ أَلُهُ اللهُ اللهُ اللهُ اللهُ اللهُ اللهُ اللهُ أَلُهُ اللهُ ال

The conjunction has been used here instead of is as the process of creation undergoes a number of stages till dust is converted into a moving human being.

- (6) إذا الفُحائِيَّةُ this is إذا
- 7) بَشْر, human beings. It is also used to denote a single human being as in:

Say, 'I am only a human being like you'... (Q17:110).

8) انتَــشَرَ انتِــشَرَ انتِــشَاراً viii, to be scattered, spread out. The sentence أَنْتَشِرُونَ is a na't qualifying تُنْتَشِرُونَ

- (21) And of His signs is that He created for you spouses from yourselves that you might find rest in them, and He ordained between you love and mercy. Therein indeed are portents for people who reflect.
- 1) مِنْ أَنْفُ سِكُمْ Mote that مِنْ أَنْفُ سِكُمْ means that both the spouses are from the same species.
- 2) زُوْجٌ spouse. It is used both for husband and wife, pl زُوْجٌ (2).
- 3) سَكُنَ سُكُوناً (a-u), to be or become still, tranquil, to calm down, rest, repose.
- لَّنَـسْكُنُوا, this is $l\bar{a}m$ al-ta' $l\bar{i}l$, and the $mud\bar{a}ri'$ following it is man, $s\bar{u}b$ because of أَنْ which is usually omitted, but may be mentioned as in Q39:12,

I have been commanded (to do this) so that I may be the first of those who surrender to Him.'1

Note that أُنْ cannot be omitted if it is followed by *lā al-nāfiyaħ* as in أَسْرِعْ لِئلاَّ يَخْرُجَ الْمُدِيرُ مِنْ مِكْتَبِهِ , 'Hurry up lest the director should leave his office.' And here is an example from the Qur'ān (2:150),

مَكْنَدُمْ فَوْلُواْ وُجُوهَكُمْ شَطْرَهُ، لِكَلَّا يَكُونَ لِلنَّاسِ عَلَيْكُمْ حُجَّةُ مَا مُعَيْدُمْ فَجَّةً and wherever you may be turn your faces towards it (the Ka'bah) so that people may have no arguments against you ...'

5) المنافذة ال

- 6) يُنْكُمْ : 'between you', i.e., between you and your spouses.
- 7) وَدَّ يُودُّ وُدَّاً وَوَدَّاً أَنْ أَزُورِكَ (i-a) to love, to like, e.g., وَدِدْتُ أَنْ أَزُورِكَ , 'I wanted to visit you'.

أَرُدُّة, 'love' is the *maṣdar mīmī*. [AN2]

8) حَعَلَ (a-a), to make, create. نعَد in this sense takes only one object. Here is another example from the Qur'ān (6:1),

Praise belongs to Allah Who created the heavens and the earth, and made darkness and light.

¹ The maf ûl bihi of أمِرْتُ بِذَلِكَ لِأَكُونَ أُوَّلَ is omitted. The sentence may be construed as أَمِرْتُ بِذَلِكَ لِأَكُونَ أُوَّلَ

For the other meanings of حَعَل see D3:25.

9) إِنَّ فِي ذَلَكَ لآيَاتٍ: This is the *al-lām al-muzaḥlaqaħ*. This *lām* is attached to the *khabar* of إِنَّ e.g.

Indeed the weakest of houses is the spider's house. (29:41) But if the *khabar* is a *šibh jumlah*, and precedes the *ism*, then the $l\bar{a}m$ is attached to the *ism* as in the $\bar{a}yah$ we are studying. Here is another example,

Therein indeed is a lesson for him who fears. (79:26)

10) أَقُــوَامٌ, people. It is a الشمُ الْحَمْــي, and its pl is أَوْمٌ, This word originally means a group of men (excluding women). It is used in this sense in Q49:11,

O you who believe! Men should not deride others. It might be that they are better than they. Nor should women deride others. It might be that they are better than they.

The pre-Islamic poet Zuhayr (زُهْيْرٌ) says,

'Are the people of the fortress men or women?'

11) تَفَكَّرُ تَفَكَّرُ الله viii, to contemplate, reflect.

The sentence فَوْمِ is a na't qualifying يَتَنفَكُ رُونَ

- (22) And of His signs is the creation of the heavens and the earth, and the difference of your languages and colours. Herein indeed are signs for people who have knowledge.
- 1) اخْتَلُفَ اخْتِلافاً viii, to differ, be different. Here is an example:

إِنْكِلِيزِيَّةُ أَمْرِيكَا تَخْتَلِفُ عَنْ إِنْكِلِيزِيَّةِ بِرِيطَانِيَةَ فِي أُمُورٍ كَثِيرةٍ.

'American English differs from British English in many points'.

2) لَسْنَ and أَلْسَنَةُ and أَلْسَنَةً and أَلْسَنَةً إلى اللهِ عَلَيْهِ عَلَيْهِ أَلْسُنَ

In the following $\bar{a}y\bar{a}t$ it is used in the sense of tongue (the member),

Did We not assign to him two eyes, a tongue and two lips? (90:8-9).

And in the following āyaħ it is used in the sense of language,

And We never sent a messenger except (speaking) the language of his folk that he might explain to them. (14:4).

اللَّغَة In the present-day Arabic the normal word for 'language' is اللَّعانُ though مَدْرَسَةُ الأَلْـسَنِ is also used in certain contexts as in مَدْرَسَةُ الأَلْـسَنِ 'languages institute'.

- . أَلْوَانً / colour, pl أَوْنَ (3
- 4) أَعْلِمُ عِلْماً (i-a), to know.

5) لِلْعَالِمِينَ: this is in qirā'aħ of Ḥafṣ (حَفْصُ). In other qirā'āt it is لِلْعَالَمِينَ i.e. 'for the whole world'.

- (23) And of His sings is your sleep by night and by day, and your seeking of His bounty. Herein are signs for those who take heed.
- 1) نَامُ نَوْمًا (i-a), to sleep.

is the *maṣdar mīmī*. Note that رَأَى فِي الْمَنَامِ means 'he saw in a dream', but literally it means, 'he saw in sleep', 'he saw while sleeping'. [AN3]

- 2) لَيْلُ night, pl لَيْالُ (with al- اللَّيَالِي).
- 3) اَبْتَغَى ابْتِغاءً (a-i), to seek. ابْتَغَى ابْتِغاء viii, also means to seek.

The expression 'seeking of His bounty' means to work in order to earn. Obviously, this should also be understood to be by day and by night.

- 4) الفَضْلُ, grace, favour.
- 5) أَسْمِعُ سَمْعًا وسَمَاعًا (i-a), to hear, listen.

(24) And of His signs is that He shows you the lightning to induce fear and hope, and sends down water from the sky, and thereby quickens the earth after its death. Herein are signs for a folk who understand.

- 1) أُو قُ lightning, pl البَرْقُ (1
- 2) أَرِي يُسرِي إِراءَةً, to show. It is form iv of رَأَى يُسرِي إِراءَةً, pl أَرِي يُسرِي إِراءَةً, feminine singular is أُرِينَ , and its pl أُرِينَ.

It takes two objects, e.g. أُرني كتابُكُ الجديد, 'Show me your new book'. Here is an example from the Glorious Qur'ān (6:75),

And thus do We show Ibrāhīm the kingdoms of the heavens and the earth.

3) الْـــرِيكُمُ الــــبرْقُ is for يُـــرِيكُمُ الـــبرْقُ which is maṣdar muʾawwal, but the ḥarf maṣdarī (أَنْ) has been omitted, and with its omission the verb has become marfū. Note this construction in the well-known Arabic proverb,

'It is better to hear about al-Muʿaydī¹ than to see him', wherein أَنْ تَسْمَعُ stands for أَنْ تَسْمَعُ.

- 4) خَافَ خَوْفاً (i-a), to be afraid of, to fear.
- 5) طَمِعَ في الشيء طَمَعاً (i-a), to covet, desire, aspire, expect, hope.
- are maf ul li-ajlihi.

¹ Al-Mu^caydī was a wise man, but he was very ugly and short. So it was said, 'It was better to hear about him than to see him.'

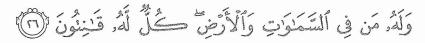
- 7) نَزَّلَ تَنْسزيلاً ii, to bring down.
- 8) السَّماء here means the clouds.
- 9) عُقُلُ عَقُلُ عَقُلًا (a-i), to understand, comprehend.

- (25) And of His signs is that the heavens and the earth stand fast by His command, and afterwards, when He calls you from the earth, surprisingly you will come out.
- 1) قَامَ يَقُومُ قِياماً (a-u), to stand, be standing, exist.

The meaning of أَن تَقُـومَ الـسَّماءُ والأَرْضُ is that they function according to the laws governing them.

- 2) دُعَا يَدْعُو دُعاءً (a-u), to call. دُعُوَةً is maṣdar al-marraħ. And in the sentence it is maf ūl muṭlaq.
- 3) اِذَا دَعَاكُمْ: Here اِذَا san adāħ al-šarṭ, and the jawāb al-šarṭ is اِذَا دَعَاكُمْ there اِذَا دَعَاكُمْ is an adāħ al-šarṭ is اَنْتُمْ تَخْرُجُونَ. It is a jumlaħ ismiyyaħ, and so should take fā. But the fā has been replaced by إِذَا الفُحائِيَّةُ (D3:26)
- 4) مِنَ الأَرْضِ : this *šibh jumlaħ* is a *ḥāl* of the pronoun حُصة in دُعَاكُمْ



- (26) To Him belongs whoever is in the heavens and in the earth. All are obedient to Him.
- 1) وَ لَهُ مَنْ فِي السَّمُوَاتِ والأَرْضِ : The meaning is that all those that are in heavens and earth are his slaves.
- 1) قَنْتَ قُنُوتًا (a-u), to be obedient, humble.
- 2) خُانُ : The word خُانُ is always muḍāf, and so it is a maˈɾifaħ. Even when it stands alone as in this āyaħ, it is a muḍāf with its muḍāf ilayhi omitted. It may be treated as a singular in view of its form, and as a plural in view of its meaning as in this āyaħ. Here is an example of its being treated as a singular:

And He has subdued the sun and moon (to do their work), each running to an appointed term... (31:29).

- (27) It is He Who produces creation, then reproduces it, and it is easier for Him. His is the sublime similitude in the heavens and the earth. He is the Mighty, the Wise.
- الَّذِي is its khabar, and الَّذِي is its khabar, and الَّذِي is its khabar, and الَّذِي is silah al-mawṣūl (صِلَةُ الْمَوْصُولِ). And the sentence ثَمَّ يُعِيدُهُ is connected to the first sentence with the harf 'aff مُعِيدُهُ .

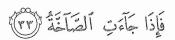

There is a strange feature in the word الْسُـرُوُّ: it takes the case-endings in two places, in the last letter as all other words, and also in the letter preceding the last letter. Note the following examples:

قَالُ امْرُقٌ, 'A man said.' (*qāla mruʾu-n*).

أَلْتُ امْرُّعاً, 'I asked a man.' (sa 'altu mra 'a-n).

أَيْتُ امْرِئ, 'The house of a man.' (baytu mri i-n).

Here are some examples from the Glorious Qur'an:

If a man dies and has no children... (4:176)1

O sister of Hārūn! Your father was not a wicked man nor your mother a harlot. (19:28)

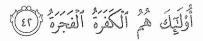

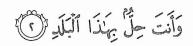
The statement that follows the *qasam* (oath) is called *jawāb al-qasam* (مَوَابُ الْقَسَمِ). If the *jawāb al-qasam* commences with an affirmative verb in the *mādī*, it should be preceded by the emphatic particle وَاللهُ لَقَدْ رَأَيْتُهُ يَسْرِقُ , e.g. وَاللهُ لَقَدْ رَأَيْتُهُ يَسْرِقُ , 'By Allah I saw him stealing.'

Here the jawāb al-qasam is لَقَدْ خَلَقْنَا ٱلْإِنسَانَ فِي كَبُدٍ.

2) The negative particle الم أُنْسِمُ is not related to the verb أُنْسِمُ. It is used to refute the arguments of the opponent. So the meaning is, 'The matter is not as you say. I swear ...'

This 's is used by the Arabs even today. If you were to ask an Arab friend of yours what he thinks of your new suit, he would say, الان وَالله حَمِيلَا . This 's is used to remove the fear lurking in your mind that you might have been tricked into buying something of an inferior quality.

3) البَلَدُ is meant Makkaħ), pl .

1) حَلَّ حِلاً (a-i), to be permissible, to be unrestricted. لَّ is what is permitted. So also is حَلاَلً

This āyaħ contains a prophecy that Makkaħ will be conquered by the Muslims, and that the Prophet مَا اللهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَالُمُ will be permitted to enter the City as a conqueror. So وأَنْتَ حِلٌّ بِهَذَا البَلَدِ means that you will be free to do what is needed during the conquest.

2) The word $\stackrel{\checkmark}{}$ is mostly used to refer to things and animals. But less frequently it is used to refer to human beings also as in following $\bar{a}ya\hbar$ (4:22),

And do not marry women whom your fathers married, except what has already happened in the past.

1) حُسِبَ (i-a), to think, consider, regard.

It takes two objects which are originally *mubtada*' and *khabar*, e.g. الْحَوَّ بَارِدً 'The weather is cold.' أَلْحَوَّ بَارِدً بَارِدً 'I thought the weather was cold.' The Pre-Islamic Poet لَبِيدٌ الْعَامِرِيُّ says,

'I regard piety and generosity to be the best trade with regard to profit when man gets heavy (with age and sickness).'
Here are some examples form the Glorious Qur'ān:

Do not think that Allah is unmindful of what the unjust are doing. (14:42)

And you would have deemed them awake though were sleeping. (18:18)

You think they are united, but their hearts are divided. (59: 14)

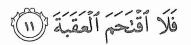

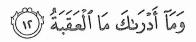

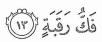

The plural الرِّقَابُ is also used in this sense (see Q2:177; 9:60).

Only my information about his being a public speaker comes after my information about his being a learned man. In such a context, it may be translated as in addition to, furthermore, moreover:

- 2) تُمَّ كَانَ مِـنَ ٱلَّـــٰذِينَ آمَنُـــوا: This expression not only refers to someone's being a believer, but also to his belonging to the Muslim *ummaħ*, and the following part of the *āyaħ* emphasizes the idea of communal life, and one's duty to the community.

ask one another about the guilty, 'What has brought you to Scorching Fire?' They will say, 'We were not of those who prayed, nor did we feed the poor. And we indulged in vain talk with those given to vain talk, and we used to deny the Day of Judgment till the inevitable overtook us...'

Do you see the person who denies the Judgment? It is he who rebuffs the orphan, and does not urge others to feed the poor. (107:1-3)
