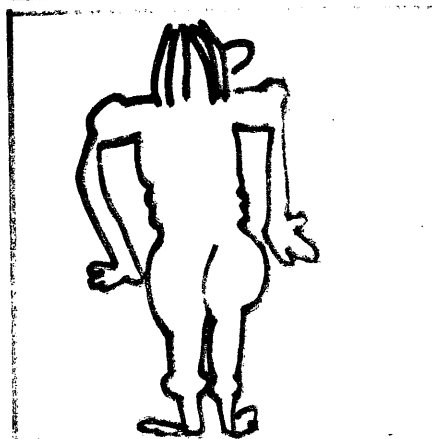


# TED SLEIGH'S BACK

Minister Trudeaut.

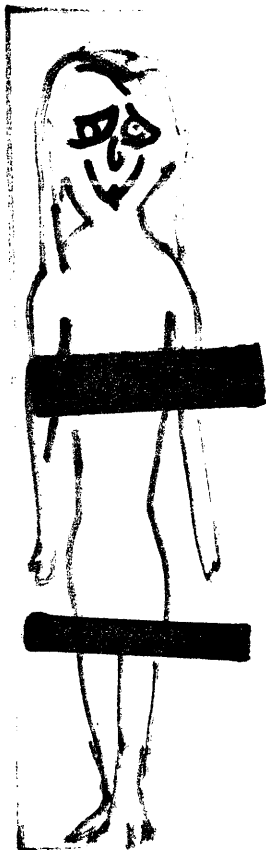
Monday's election saw an over-
