The Interfraternity Council is composed of representatives from each fraternity on the campus. Its purpose is to promote friendship among the brotherhoods.



ARTHUR PASCHAL, DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS




Trophies are presented to the winners and the


This year, sixty-five students are participating in the Fellowship Team program — fiftythree as team members and twelve as alternates. All of the members of the ten teams have participated in a special training period.


















Tower

For its initial production of the 1955-56 season, the Tower Players chose George Bernard Shaw's brilliant satire, "Arms and the Man."

While many amateur groups refuse to attempt Shaw with his subtlety and barbed wit, the Tower Players won excellent notice for their skill in producing "Arms and the Man." After the first performance, a review, captioned "Tower Players Capture Sparkling Wit of Shaw," appeared in the *High Point Enterprise*, High Point's daily paper.

In this delightful satire, from which the operetta "The Chocolate Soldier" was taken, the author pokes fun at the belief of some people in the romantic glory and honor of war. The action of the play takes place in Bulgaria in 1885 and is based upon a war between Serbia and Bulgaria. From this background, Shaw developed a plot rich in polished but lively dialogue and amusing incidents.

The crews and cast, under the skillful direction of Miss DeSpain, combined to make this difficult production a success. A very able cast brought the play to life and turned in a commendable performance. Because the script required three sets, the stage crew had an added task which it han-

"GLASS MENAGERIE"


A talented cast, excellent lighting, an extremely realistic set, and skillful directing all added up to a memorable performance of Tennessee Williams' "Glass Menagerie."


"NICK OF THE WOODS"

If this is the index of modern radio, then High Point College radio productions during the past year were up to par.




Student Government








COACH VIRGIL YOW

The Purple Panthers began the season in grand style by winning eight games before they left High Point to go on a game-playing tour during Christmas vacation. Highlighting the early season play was a sparkling triumph over A.C.C. In the games before Christmas holidays the Panthers passed the century mark on six occasions. The Christmas trip was fairly successful as H.P.C. took four games out of six. The Purple Panthers probably turned in one of their finest offensive performances of the season against the Paris Island Marines to gain one of those victories. Against Elon, Jack Powell sustained an ankle injury which handicapped him and the club for several games. The remainder of the season proved to be very disappointing since High Point was able to win only four games before the end of the regular season. the students: "Maybe next year will be our year." When questioned about the Panthers both of the present and in the future, Coach Yow stated, "We are building slowly on a sound



Harold Crump finished the year in a blaze of glory by finding the basket much too often to suit H.P.C.'s opponents. Tom Payne, the "little" rebounder did his best to aid Powell with the rebounding chores, but the Panthers were still weak in that department. Maury "Buckshot" Beauchot and Ken Williams, two freshmen, aided the Panther's play considerably at times. Maury, a fast-moving guard from Indiana, combined his talents with those of Bill Huegele to give High Point a pair of the better guards of the conference. Only one Panther, J. C. Bledsoe, will graduate this year; therefore, next season will find High Point College with an experienced basketball team.








WAYNE HOOVER, JAYVEE COACH







1955 BASEBALL SEASON

The 1955 baseball season brings several sad memories to our minds. The High Point nine suffered throughout the season from inexperience. Elwood Maybry, anchor of the pitching staff, was the only letterman returning from the '54 squad. With an abundance of rookies the yowmen succeeded in winning only two and dropping eighteen. Both victories came at the expense of Guilford. Springing to the forefront through the fog of defeat were three boys who displayed better than average talent. In spite of a leg injury which hampered his slugging ability, Bill Kiser, H.P.C. first-baseman, led the team in hitting with a .323 average.
