In loving memory of these three who contributed so much.

My Great Grandfather, James Elijah White, who was interested enough to write things down.

The front cover and many pages of the journal are missing. The earliest date recorded is 1895. I can't but wonder what it might have revealed if it had remained intact in its entirety.

My Grandfather, Louis Payne White, whom I remember well, even though I was only nine years old when he died, continued to write in the journal where his father left off and added much to it. In fact, most of the journal as it exists now was written by him. At his death the journal was packed away and did not surface until the death of my Grandmother in 1950. An Aunt, Essie White Bailey, had it in her possession, and when I began researching in genealogy about 1960, she gave it to me.

Grandpa also kept records of two churches the family attended, Fowler's Chapel Methodist Protestant Episcopal Church and Pleasant Grove Church of Zone, Georgia. These records are in my possession. Neither church exists today, but their rolls are recorded for posterity.

My father, Louis Milton White, was also much help to me. He grew up in the "Pocket" and knew every place I wanted to find and more. Even though he never wrote in the journal, he told me many stories of things that happened and people involved. We hunted old cemeteries and home places so I would know where they had lived.

I am so grateful for what each of these special people contributed to my life.

JAMES ELIJAH WHITE

James Elijah White was born in South Carolina on February 24, 1828. His parents were Newton White and Edna Jane Cooper. The family came to Walker County, Georgia about 1842. Newton White was one of the original settlers of Walker County in the "Pocket" and Armuchee area.

Elijah married Martha Bernetta Stansell on February 20, 1851. She was the daughter of Elijah Stansell and Jane Akin. She was born October 26, 1830 in South Carolina. Elijah and Bernetta were the parents of eight children. They are buried in the White Cemetery at Villanow, Georgia.

LOUIS PAYNE WHITE

Louis Payne White was born April 9, 1855, in Walker County, GA. He was the third child of James Elijah White and Martha Bernetta Stansell.

He married Susan Elizabeth Bailey on December 14, 1882. She was the daughter of George Walker Bailey and Margaret Sephronia Hefner and was born August 1, 1861, in Walker County, GA. The family lived in the "Pocket" community, which was Gordon County at that time. There were nine children born to them.

Payne and Betty White moved to Rossville, GA about 1923. Payne died December 18, 1935 and Betty died March 2, 1950. They are buried in the White Cemetery at Villanow, Georgia.

LOUIS MILTON WHITE

Louis Milton White was the youngest son of Louis Payne and Betty White. He was born May 30, 1902 in Gordon County, GA. He married Eula Mae Chapman on June 28, 1925. Eula Mae was born May 22, 1906 in Cherokee County, GA.

Louis and Eula Mae had nine children; the eldest being Christine White Dooley, the compiler of this book.

Louis and Eula Mae lived all their married life in the Rossville, Walker County, GA and surrounding area.

Louis died on May 22, 1971 and Eula Mae died on September 17, 1972. They are buried in the Tennessee-Georgia Memorial Cemetery in Rossville, Georgia.

FORWARD

The "Pocket" is now a part of the Chattahoochee National Forest. It is located in the valley where Horn Mountain rises and curves around, doubling back and hemming in the valley to give it its name the "Pocket". Just north is John's Mountain with Keown Falls Overlook and Keown Falls. County lines have changed over the years. There are six counties involved in the Forest district, Floyd, Walker, Gordon, Whitfield, Chattooga and Catoosa.

A number of springs rise directly from the ground. The water is clear, cold and pure. The temperature never rises above 65 degrees. This is called the "Loop". The springs flow into a small tributary which feeds into John's Creek. There is no specific name for it, but it is referred to by Rangers and visitors as "Pocket Creek."

In winter the rains fill the many small streams and overflow John's Creek and flood the valley.

Except for the unpaved road from Lake Marvin to Villanow the Pocket is much as it was when the Cherokee lived there. Wild life abounds. There is fishing and hunting. Several agencies are participating in a combination of land improvement measures. There is a 150 acre lake for flood prevention and recreational development. There are picnic areas, camping, fishing and hunting privileges in season so long as everyone meets the legal requirements and rules laid down by the Forest Service.

John's Creek is stocked by the Georgia Game and Fish Commission. An open deer hunting season is held annually, usually in October.

The Pocket was once a thriving community and as populous as any of the surrounding country. There were approximately 25 families living there with many others north and south of the area. There were two churches, a Methodist and a Baptist. There are several old cemeteries in the area with markers dating before the Civil War. These are listed in the different County Cemetery Records.

There was a grist mill owned by Payne White. The mill was water powered from a dam built across John's Creek, with water delivered to its overshot buckets by a wooden-timbered flume. Its operation was automatic to a point. There was a furnace on Pocket Road where iron was either mined or smelted. Some cotton and wheat were raised and there was a cotton gin operated by water from John's Creek which processed up to eight bales of cotton a day. There was also a sawmill in the area.

During the 1930's depression a CCC Civilian Conservation Corps Camp built in the Pocket around the present site of the springs at the Loop. Many of the concrete foundations still stand but nothing remains of the barracks and storage buildings.

There are a number of sites in current use which are well worth the effort of searching out.
