1. WILLIAM JR² CORAM (*WILLIAM*) was born October 02, 1756 in Virginia, and died June 10, 1821 in Warren County, GA. He married ANN HODO 1783 in Unknown, daughter of PETER HODO and SUSANAH.

Notes for WILLIAM JR CORAM:

William Coram Jr. was born October 2, 1756, in Virginia. Very little is known of William prior to his joining the Virginia Line of the Continental Army. It is suspected that his father is William Coram who came to the American Colonies as a "Bonded Passenger" aboard the Rappahannock Merchant Ship and landed in Maryland in 1727. William, the immigrant, was serving a sentence for theft and was transported from Newgate Prison in London. Upon completion of his sentence he married Mary Champ. This marriage produced three sons, Champ Coram, Robert Coram, and a third son who is believed to be William Coram, Jr. *Efforts to verify this have been unsuccessful.

Earliest information found on William Coram, Jr., has been obtained from his military service. He joined the 3rd Long. of the Virginia Line of the Continental Army in 1775, at the age of 18/19. Despite his young age, William Jr. was apparently an outstanding soldier as he was selected for the Commander-in Chief's Guard when it was reorganized May 1, 1777. General George Washington previously had a Commander-in-Chief's Guard that was formed in March of 1776, but after many conspiracies and some attempts on his life the General disbanded this Guard. General Washington later realized the absolute necessity of a Commander-in Chief's Guard for the purpose of guarding him, his post, his baggage, papers, etc. On April 30, 1777, he issued circular letters to the colonels of the Virginia Regiments of Infantry attached to the main army at Morristown, NJ, requesting that four men from their respective commands be immediately furnished him for the reorganization of his Guard. His letter was as follows:

Morristown, 30 April, 1777

Sir:

I want to form a company for my Guard. In doing this I wish to be extremely cautious, because it is more than probable that, in the course of the campaign, my baggage, papers, and other matters of great public import may be committed to the sole care of these men. This be premised, in order to impress you with proper attention in the choice, I have to request that you will immediately furnish me with four men of your regiment; and it is my farther wish that this company should look well and nearly of a size, I desire that none of the men may exceed in stature five feet ten inches, nor fall short of five feet nine inches, sober, young, active, and well made. When I recommend care in your choice I would be understood to mean men of good character in the regiment, that possess the pride of appearing clean and soldierlike. I am satisfied there can be no absolute security for the fidelity of this class of people, but yet I think it most likely to be found in those who have family connections in this country. You will therefore send me none but natives, and men of some property, if you have them. I must insist that, in making this choice, you give no intimation of my preference of natives, as I do not want to create any invidious distinction between them and the foreigners.

"Go Washington"

General George Washington began interviewing the men sent to his headquarters on May 1 and interviewed and selected men for 6 days. William Coram was selected on the first day--May 1.

VALLEY FORGE 1777-1778.

One week before Christmas of 1777 General George Washington's Army
went into winter quarters at Valley Forge. Selected because it lay
between the British in Philadelphia and Congress at New York, little
else recommended it. No buildings were available for the Army, and
until mid-January when some rudimentary log huts were completed,
the Army-including Washington-faced the onset of winter camped on
the ground and in tents. Barefoot and half-naked, many of them froze

to death: hundreds of horses perished of starvation and before the winter ended nearly one-fourth of the men who had gone to Valley Forge were dead of privation. The ordeal was almost beyond the capacity of men to endure. Nathaniel Greene wrote "God grant we may never be brought to such a wretched condition again." The worst of it was that the Army suffered far more from the neglect of fellow Americans, who were guilty of graft and speculation, than they did at the hands of the enemy. The remarkable aspect of the winter was that the Army emerged from the ordeal an entirely new force, largely as a result of what they had learned from a Prussian officer named Friedrich Wilhelm Augustus Von Steuben. In May of 1778 they received supplies, arms, ammo, etc., from the French. This raised the morale of the troops tremendously. The Commander-in-Chief's Guard was increased in size from 47 privates to 180, and it was here that soldiers other than Virginians were accepted into the Guard. General Von Steuben trained them sternly and continuously. They became such an outstanding unit that they were commonly referred to as the "Flower and Pick of the entire American Army." William Coram endured that horrible winter but became ill in June of 1778 and remained in the hospital at Valley Forge until October of that year.

District 00 designated by the author was commanded by Captain Neal in 1790. The entire district was put into Warren County in December 1793 and the same taxpayers can be found on the same waters in Capt. Neal's District of the 1794 Warren County Tax Digest. The eastern part of the area was put into McDuffie County in 1870. The area now includes the town of Warrenton and eastward to the edge of Thomson

in McDuffie County. These lands were on the waters of Brier Creek, Upton's Creek (Maddox Creek), White's Creek and Rocky Comfort Creek.

WILLIAM was living in Wilkes Co., GA, in 1793 and returned taxes for 420 acres of land. (Note: Warren County, GA, was created from part of Wilkes County in 1793. WILLIAM CORAM'S land was in the part of Wilkes County that became Warren Co.)

Coram returned taxes on 278 acres of land in Warren Co. in 1794. He apparently sold 142 acres of land during the latter part of 1793 or in 1794.

February 29, 1796, William Coram was witness on a deed where Burkhalter sold land to Daniel Hutchinson in Warren Co.

On May 18, 1797, William Coram sold to Joseph Armstrong 50 acres of

land on Bushy Fork of Brier Creek. This land was part of 420 acres granted to Wm Coram in 1797.

AUGUSTA CHRONICLE AUGUST 23, 1797.
Sheriff's Sale

On the first Tuesday in October next, at the Court House Warren County,

WILL BE SOLD

228 acres of pine land of good quality, on the waters of Brier Creek, a good peach orchard, and considerable improvements, being the plantation whereon WILLIAM CORAM now lives, adjoining Clark Blandford and others; under execution as the property of said CORAM at the suit of Hugh Blair.

Also some 75 acres of land third quality, on the waters of Rocky Comfort, adjoining Abner Fullen and James Parker's land; under execution as the property of Nathan Dabney Abbett at the suit of said Blair.

Likewise the balance or remainder of a tract of land, third quality, whereon Jeffe Parker now lives, after 214 acres are deleted out of said tract, lying on the waters of Hart's Creek, adjoining land of James Parker and others; under execution as the property of George Weatherby, at the suit of Isaac Stubbs. Conditions CASH.

Note: An identical copy of the above ad also appeared in the September 9, 1797, edition of the Augusta Chronicle.

Wm Coram sold 142 acres of land on the head of Brier Creek to Robert Willis for one hundred dollars. Date of sale was March 5, 1798.

On December 19, 1798, Wm Coram sold to Jesse Ricketson 34 1/2 acres of land on the Head Branch of Big Brier Creek. The land sold for 34 dollars.

William Coram witnessed the sale of 200 acres of land by Peter and Sallie Hodo to Drury McCullers on June 25, 1801.

On March 5, 1804, William Coram sold to Jesse Ricketson, for 400 dollars, 237 acres of land on which he lived.

For the year 1805 Wm Coram returned taxes on no land in the State of Georgia. It appears he had sold all the land he owned to Jesse Ricketson in 1804.

Wm and Ann Coram's only son, Thomas, was married to Deborah Hays on December 20, 1808.

July 29, 1809, Union Baptist Church was formed in Warren County, GA, as 20 Christians met at the Union Meeting House and finalized the organization plans. William Coram was one of the charter members of this Church. William served as Clerk of the Church from 1813 to 1820. He was recorded as a Building Trustee in 1817. William was a member of this Church at the time of his death in 1821.

William Madison Coram, the first grandchild of Wm and Ann Coram, was born September 4, 1810. The following additional grandchildren were born during his lifetime:

Mary Ann Coram born July 15, 1813.
Nancy J. Coram born October 5, 1814.
Susan Coram born June 19, 1816.
John Jasper Coram born November 19, 1818.

In 1818 Wm Coram returned taxes on 132 acres of land on Maddux Creek in Warren County. The land was bought from a Stubbs. It adjoined land owned by a Johnson. Wm also paid poll taxes for himself and son Thomas Coram in 1818.

1820 U.S. Census for State of Georgia:

2 free white males age 45 and up (this is Wm and an unknown white male)
1 free white female age 45 and up (this is Ann Hodo Coram)
1 person was engage in agriculture.

At the time of this census William was 64, Ann was 65, and the exact

age of the unknown white male living with Wm and Ann is unknown.

AUGUSTA CHRONICLE APRIL 15, 1820.

Personally came before me, WILLIAM CORAM and Evan Davis who being sworn to ascertain the value an Estray filly, bright sorrel, three years old past, about four feet seven inches high, near hind foot white, unbroke, taken up by Thomas Johnson and appraised by the subscribers to thirty two dollars and fifty cents.

William Coram died June 10, 1821, in Warren County. Cause of death is unknown.

The following article was published in the Augusta Chronicle June 7, 1821.

Died on the 10th instant at his residence in Warren County, CAPT. WILLIAM CORAM, about 70 years of age. He served 7 years in the Revolution and was one of the life guard of the immortal Washington for many years. He was a worthy member of the Baptist Church and died in the triumphs of faith. He has left an aged widow to lament the loss of the noblest work of God, a truly honest man.

(The above obituary/eulogy leads one to believe that WILLIAM CORAM possibly died on May 10, 1821, instead of June 10, 1821 as is indicated in the obituary/eulogy listed below. The above article was published on June 7, 1821, and it is now believed the announcement was received by the Augusta Chronicle during the month of May. The statement "died on the 10th instant" was signifying he died on the 10th of May. 'Tis believed that use of the word "instant" led two other newspapers to publish WILLIAM CORAM'S death date as June 10.)

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF WILLIAM CORAM, DECEASED

In the name of God Amen.

I William Coram being low of body, but of sound mind and disposing memory, do make, constitute, and ordain this my last will and testament.

1st. I will that all my just debts be paid.

2nd. I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Ann Coram, during her natural life, the tract of land where I now live, together with my stock and plantation utensils. I further give unto my beloved wife all my household furniture forever; except such as is otherwise disposed of by this will.

3rd. After the death of my beloved wife I give and bequeath unto Thomas Coram all my estate both real and personal, that is not otherwise disposed of, forever.

4th. I will and bequeath unto William M. Coram, after the death of my beloved wife, the following articles(sic), viz. my large family Bible, my bed, bed sted(sic) and furniture; one table, and chest; painted red; and my shotgun. If any of these articles should be sold, it is my wish Thomas Coram, his father, should keep the money untill(sic) the boy comes of age of twenty one; and then give it to the said William M. Coram.

sth. I do hereby appoint, constitute, and ordain Ann Coram, Thomas Coram, and Robert Lazenby my executors; and executrix, to this my last will and testament. signed with my hand and sealed this 30th of March, 1821.

ABSTRACTS FROM "HISTORY OF MCDUFFIE COUNTY, GEORGIA,
Compiled by Mrs. W.C. McCommons and Miss Clara Stovall:

UNION CHURCH:

Union Church is located five miles northwest of Thomson, formerly in Warren County. In the year 1808 there came into the minds and hearts of the people of this community a desire to organize a church here, as the nearest church of this faith was Sweetwater, about ten miles distant. The interest continued and the following year the Church was

organized, with twenty charter members. It is fortunate that the records from the beginning are preserved. In the first record book is this---"The names of the members, both the males and females that composed the new constitution at the Union Meeting House, Upton's Creek, July 29, 1809" - viz: Nathaniel Thompson, Mark Hardin, James Smith, Hugh Rees, Jacob Smith, WILLIAM CORAM, John Wall, Nancy Thompson, Frances Hardin, Mary Farr, Sally Ellis, Jeremiah Larks, Mary Smith, Patsy Smith, Polly Wilson, Elizabeth Lazenby, Christian Smith, Frances Smith, Dorcas Wall and Elizabeth Rees.

The first church building was a small log house. On March 22, 1817, the trustees were Michael Cody, WILLIAM CORAM, Billington Sanders, Nathaniel Thompson and Robert Walton.

The Church Clerks have been: Nathaniel Thompson 1809-1913; WM. CORAM 1813-1820.

The cemetery near the Church is not nearly so old as the Church, the first grave put here in 1866, for in the early days every family had its own burying grounds. (This statement supports the belief that William and Ann Hodo Coram were buried in a private cemetery on their land, probably in unmarked graves as a fifteen year search for their graves has produced no results.)

Believing the grave of William Coram, Jr., to be lost forever, Thomas F. Coram, Sr., erected a memorial in Pleasant Grover Cemetery, Eclectic, AL. The granite memorial reads as follows:

IN MEMORY OF
WILLIAM CORAM

Born Oct. 2, 1756, in Virginia
Died June 10, 1821, in Warren County, GA
Enlisted in the Virginia Line of the
Continental Army in 1775
Transferred to General George Washington's
Commander-in-Chief's Guard when it was
formed on May 1, 1777. He faithfully served
as a bodyguard for General George Washington
for 6 years, 1 month, and 5 days.

The location of his remains is
known but to God.

Notes for ANN HODO:

Ann Hodo, the daughter of Peter and Susannah Hodo, was born June 12, 1755. Place of birth is unknown.

The old family bible of William Coram which was passed on to William Madison Coram and on his death was passed to Sarah Coram Mitchiner, and is now (March 1, 2000) in the possession of Dr. James Mitchiner, a Professor of Medicine at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan, contains the following entry: William Coram, born October 2, 1756. Ann Coram, born June 12, 1755. Married in the year of our lord 1783.

Ann Hodo Coram's only child, Thomas, was born in 1788.

The will of Ann Hodo Coram's father, Peter Hodo, was recorded as follows:

Peter Hodo (Signed Peter Hodoson) . Last Will and testament dated May 6, 1799; No date of probate shown. Gives to son Richard Hodo 150 acres of the land where the Testator now lives, the remaining two-thirds for the use of his wife Susannah Hodo for her lifetime or widowhood, then to said Richard. Gives to son Peter Hodo a horse. Residue of estate to wife Susannah for her lifetime with same passing at her death to testators children Ann Coram, Elizabeth Cullers, Peter Hodo, Mary Coday, Richard Hodo (with exception of a bed to Nathaniel Hodo, son of Richard) to be equally divided between said children. Executors: sons, Peter and Richard Hodoson. Witnesses: James Simpson, John Bayne.

Ann Hodo Coram died July 18, 1829, in Warren County, GA.

Ann's will as registered in Warren County, GA:

In the name of God Amen:

I, Ann Coram, being low of body but of sound mind and disposing memory do make, constitute, and ordain this my last will and testament.

1. I will that all my just debts be paid.

2. I will and bequeath unto Thomas Coram all that tract or parcel of land situated in the 10th District in the first section in the County of Lee, containing two hundred two and a half acres which is known and distinguished in the plan of said district by the number 206 being a tract of land that I drew. In witness thereof I do here set my hand on this 11th of April, 1829.

The land Ann Coram drew and willed to Thomas Coram was obtained in the Fifth Georgia Land Lottery in 1827. Authorized by an act of the Legislature June 9, 1825, this Lottery distributed lands in the counties of Lee, Carroll, Woweto, Muscogee and Troup. Land lot sizes in all these counties were set at 202 1/2 acres and required a Grant fee of \$18.00 per lot. Any person successful in a previous lottery could not participate in

this one. Ann Coram was allowed one draw in this lottery on the basis of being a widow who had resided in Georgia at least three years.

On December 30, 1864, Thomas Jefferson Coram submitted a petition to the Ordinary Court stating that he is the son of Thomas Coram, deceased, of Randolph County and requested that he be made administrator of the Thomas Coram estate.

On February 6, 1865, Thomas Jefferson Coram states to the Ordinary Court in Randolph County that Thomas Coram died intestate so far as he knows and believes.

On February 10, 1865, Thomas Jefferson Coram submitted a detailed appraisal of the estate of Thomas Coram. The total value submitted was \$13,709.75.

This is a very lengthy and detailed report on the sale of all of Thomas Coram's perishable items at the time of his death, and it gives us great insight into the belongings of an estate during the War Between the States. It is evident from the prices received on the items that inflation was rampant. The money used was surely Confederate money, the war was winding down with the fate of the South determined by the time of this sale in February of 1865.

Thomas Coram owned approximately 100 acres of land at the time of his death.

Thomas Coram is reportedly buried in the Benevolence Baptist Cemetery, apparently in an unmarked grave.

The Georgia Historical Society has placed a historical marker in front of the Benevolence Baptist Church which contains the following inscription:

Benevolence Baptist Church

This church, constituted May 16, 1840, succeeded Walnut Grove NW of here (called Mt. Paran when organized Nov. 1831, with 9 members). In 1840 Missionary Baptists, feeling a need for a separate church, met and accepted 5 acres of land for church and cemetery "with no charges ever" from Thomas Coram, first settler at this site. For this generosity, Abner Ward suggested the name Benevolence for Church and Community. Members hauled lumber from Dawson and built the first church building, dedicated May 17, 1842, with Rev. James Matthews, Pastor, and A.M. Albritton, Clerk. First Deacons were James Sherman and John Winfrey. Other early clerks were David Holman, Abner Ward, E.H. Keese, and G.W. King.

Notes for DEBORAH HAYS:

Deborah Hays was born in South Carolina probably in the year 1788.

She reportedly had brothers named Ambrose, William and Ezekial and a sister named Charlie, who married Vincent Smith. Her father and mother are unknown, however, it is suspected that Jason Hays might be her father. Jason Hays' name crops up quite often as a witness on many deeds and wills involving the Corams. Deborah's oldest son, William Madison Coram, named his second son Jason Hays Coram. Nothing has been found to ascertain that Jason Hays is the father of Deborah.

Deborah probably died sometime between 1850 and 1860. She was listed in the 1850 census but not in the 1860 census. Nothing has been found concerning her death. She is very likely buried in an unmarked grave in the Benevolence Baptist Cemetery. She was a charter member of the Benevolence Baptist Church.

were freed they formed a church of their own. None of the slaves could read or write and they secured the services of Thomas J. Coram to keep their records until one of their members could learn to read and write. Thomas Jefferson, a farmer by profession, was affectionately called "Uncle Bobbie". He lived to the age of 84, reportedly never used profanity, was never under the influence of strong drink, never used tobacco in any form. Neither did any of his six sons indulge in any of these excesses.
