## A BILL

To be entitled An Act to define and punish conspiracy against the Confederate States.

The Congress of the Confederate States of America do enact, That 1 if two or more persons within any State or Territory of tho 2 Confederate States shall conspire to subvert, overturn, or destroy, 3 by force, the Government of the Confederate States, or to oppose, 4 by force, the execution of any law of the Confederate States, or, 5 by force to hinder. delig, or prevent the execution of any law 6 of the Confederate States, or to seize, take, possess, or destroy 7 any property of the Confel rat State, against its own consent, S or to prevent, del y or hinder, by force, or fearl, the tran port-9 ation of supplie or men to the army of the Mafulard States, or to lettuy or injure any real, bast engaged or north availaged 11 in such transport from, or to hold my secret communication or 12 intercour e with an enumy of the Conf locate State, or to aid 13 or abet the enemy in his war upon the Confiderate States, or 14

15 persons in rebellion against the same, or to promote disobedience, 16 mutiny or desertion in the army of the Confederate States, or 17 annoy the soldiers in the military service, each and every 18 person so offending shall be guilty of a high crime, and, upon 19 conviction thereof, shall be punished by fine not exceeding five 20 thousand dollars, and shall be imprisoned, with or without labor, 21 not exceeding five years.
