

Interest in the career of Abraham Lincoln lives always, and it is because of this fact that the Abraham Lincoln Memorial Association has been formed.

This Association, incorporated as a corporation not for profit, under the laws of the State of Ohio, was started in July, 1910, and has for its object the securing of relics of the life and death of Abraham Lincoln and the preservation of these for the patriotic education and the benefit of the many generations of American citizens yet unborn.

By far the largest and most important collection of relics of Abraham Lincoln now existing is that owned by Comrade Osborn H. Oldroyd in Washington, D. C., in the house where Lincoln died.

It is the securing of this collection that is sought by the Abraham Lincoln Memorial Association.

For several years a bill for the purchase of the two houses adjoining the one in which Lincoln died and the making of the building in which he died fireproof has been introduced annually in the Federal Congress.

Feeling that the chances for the passage of this bill are not the best, some of the Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic of the State of Ohio have decided to take up this work, and carry it on with the help of the Comrades of the Grand Army of the Republic and all kindred organizations and patriotic men, women and children.

It is the desire to secure members at the nominal fee of 25 cents each, and if possible to purchase from Comrade O. H. Oldroyd his splendid collection, feeling confident that when this has been accomplished Congress can then be relied upon to fire-proof the buildings and to purchase the other property desired.

Applications for membership, the entire cost of which is the one payment of twenty-five cents, are earnestly desired.
