#### PREFACE

This volume contains a list of the Latin and English Salutatorians, Valedictorians, Honormen, Junior Orators, Lynde Debaters, Prizemen, Fellows, First Group Men, and University Debaters, from the first Commencement in 1748 until the present day. It is unfortunately incomplete for the years 1750-'53, 1755-'59, 1763-'64, 1776-'77, and in minor detail; a careful search through the files of nearly all the current newspapers, from which source the honormen for the first seventy-five years have been obtained, has failed to supply the omissions. In 1757 and in 1777, however, the public exercises of Commencement were omitted, and it is believed no honors were assigned. The absence of official source-material, notably the Minutes of the Faculty, for the eighteenth century and a period of some twenty years in the nineteenth, has made the task of collation one of the greatest difficulty, which will account for the fragmentary nature of the record during the early years of College history.

From 1748 until 1835, the honors have been compiled from the published accounts of the Commencements which appeared in the various newspapers of the day, supplemented by the Minutes of the Faculty where extant, by biography and history, and the manuscript records of the University. From 1835 until 1902, they are taken from the Minutes of the Faculty and the official lists of honormen printed in the yearly catalogues.

Unless otherwise specifically stated in the notes, the arrangement of the honormen is in the order of their standing; where the Minutes of the Faculty are available, they have been strictly followed in this particular. Since the adoption of the system of honor groups by the University in 1886, the names under each group are arranged in alphabetical order.



## INTRODUCTION

#### Commencement Honors

The following statement of the origin and relative importance of the various honors and prizes, will be found of use in connection with the text.

The custom of awarding honorary orations, to be delivered at the annual Commencement as a token of good scholarship, had its origin with the founding of the College. Of these orations the Latin Salutatory is the oldest, dating back to the first Commencement in 1748. It was ordinarily awarded to the student attaining the highest individual rank in scholarship, and still maintains its distinctive quality as the highest honor at the disposal of the Faculty.

The Valedictory was probably first awarded as a graduation honor in 1760. Prior to this it was delivered by a candidate for the degree of Master of Arts. It was usually awarded to the best orator of the class, without regard to academic standing; of late years, however, scholarship is also taken into account with the qualifications of the student as a Valedictorian.

In 1786 a Second Latin Salutatory oration was awarded, doubtless to the next highest in standing; this was changed the year following to a Greek Salutatory, which in 1788

became the English Salutatory, for more than an hundred years the second honor. This oration was discontinued in 1897.

Other honorary orations were added from year to year, the Mathematical in 1792, the Belles Lettres in 1793, the Theological and Moral Science in 1804, and others. Orations denoting excellence in the various arts and sciences were regularly awarded during the last century, but have since been discontinued.

#### PRIZES

Witherspoon in his "Address to the Inhabitants of Jamaica," published in Philadelphia in 1772, gives the following account of the competitions for prizes which were then held the day before Commencement:

"On the day preceding the Commencement last year there was (and it will be continued yearly hereafter) a public exhibition and voluntary contention for prizes, open for every member of College. These were first, second, and third prizes, on each of the following subjects. I. Reading the English language with propriety and grace, and being able to answer all questions on its Orthography and Grammar. 2. Reading the Latin and Greek languages in the same manner with particular attention to true quantity. 3. Speaking Latin. 4. Latin versions. 5. Pronouncing English orations. The preference was determined by ballot, and all present permitted to vote, who were graduates of this or any other College."

The first of these competitions was held in 1771. Upon this occasion Aaron Burr received the English prize, Henry Brockholst Livingston the Latin, Henry Lee the prize for "Turning English into Latin," and William Bradford that for public speaking. These exercises were probably discontinued about the year 1800, with the exception of an isolated contest in 1815. The prizes awarded in 1815, according to the Minutes of the Faculty, were books, and the names of the successful candidates were publicly mentioned on Commencement day. As the only account of these contests exists in the newspapers of the period, a complete record is impossible.

#### Dickinson Prize

In 1782, Governor John Dickinson, of Delaware, presented to the Trustees his note for £100, suggesting that the interest be applied in procuring a gold or silver medal to be awarded for the best dissertation on one of several named subjects. But one dissertation was presented in 1783, and the President was directed to republish the subject the year following without award. For several years this medal was awarded, but the students took little interest in it and the competitions were abandoned. In 1871, upon complaint being made to the Trustees by some of the descendants of Governor Dickinson that the fund had been diverted from its original purpose, a committee was appointed to investigate the matter. This committee later reported that the Board had received from Governor Dickinson the sum of £,100 currency, and that the interest, save for a few years, had never been applied in the manner designated by the donor. They recommended that one thousand dollars be appropriated to reëstablish the Dickinson Prize Fund, and that the interest be used for the purpose originally intended. This report was adopted, and the first award under the new endowment was made at the Commencement of 1872.

#### Minto Medal

It is recorded in the Minutes of the Trustees that, in 1789, Dr. Walter Minto, then Professor of Mathematics and Natural Philosophy, gave a medal of the value of five pounds to be competed for at that Commencement. There is no mention of any later award.

#### Junior Orations and Junior Orator Medals

The custom of holding contests in oratory, usually on the day preceding the annual Commencement, had its origin early in College history. The first contest of this kind, open to all undergraduates, was held in 1771. These exercises continued regularly for several years and became a feature of the Commencement. About the year 1802 a material change took place in the method of choosing the competing orators; eight were selected, four from each Literary Society, so that the exercises became in reality contests between the American Whig and the Cliosophic Societies. Later the competitors were chosen entirely from the Junior class, and were known as "Junior Orators." For many years these contests rivalled in popularity the graduating exercises of the Senior class, becoming in no small degree a feature of the academic year, and bitter was the warfare waged by the two Halls in pursuit of honors. Mention of the distribution of these honors, prior to 1865 when medals were first awarded to the successful contestants, has been omitted, as no authentic data for such a record exists.

On December 20, 1864, a committee of Trustees was appointed to decide upon the matter of Junior Orator prizes; this committee later reported favorably (June 28, 1865), and the following resolution was adopted: "That the Faculty

be empowered to procure four gold medals, costing fifteen dollars each, and have them suitably inscribed; and to present them to the young gentlemen to whom prizes were awarded by the Committee on Junior Orators." The value of the medals has since been increased to twenty dollars.

The choice of representatives was originally with the Societies themselves, but the disorders consequent upon these elections, amounting in some cases to "riots" and "acts of violence," according to the Trustee Minutes, forced the Board to change the manner of their appointment. The first measure was to authorize the Faculty (1859) to make the appointments of Junior Orators independent of any action taken by the student members of the Societies. In 1864 it was decided that the selection of speakers should be made by the Faculty, after a fair trial of the merits of the different candidates. At present the orators are chosen by committees appointed by the two Societies from their own members in the Faculty.

#### Leonard W. Jerome Prizes

In 1866 Mr. Leonard W. Jerome, of New York, donated five thousand dollars to establish a fund, the interest from which was to be expended in the purchase of two medals or other testimonials to be awarded to members of the graduating class. It is not clear from the Minutes upon what basis the awards were to be made. Popularity apparently was the chief requisite, as the selection was to be determined by ballot, each member of the Senior class having the right to vote for the person who, in his opinion, was best entitled to the distinction, and the medals were to be awarded to the two, one from each Literary Society, who received the greatest number of votes. The students, however, refused

to accept the prizes, and the money was returned several years later at the request of donor, without any award having been made.

#### Class of 1859 Prize in English Literature

In 1869, the Class of 1859, through its representatives, Alfred Hosea Kellogg, Henry Everett Russell, and Samuel Richards Colwell, conveyed to the Trustees two thousand dollars in trust, for the establishment of a prize foundation in English Literature, open to members of the Senior class. The first award was made in 1870.

#### George Potts Bible Prizes

Mrs. Sarah A. Brown, of Princeton, in 1866 gave one thousand dollars to found a prize in Biblical study, the interest of which was to be expended in the purchase of two copies of Matthew Henry's Commentary, to be presented annually to the two best Biblical scholars of the Senior class. Awards have been made annually since 1869.

## Experimental Science Prize

In 1870 a prize of one hundred dollars was offered by the Faculty to the member of the Senior class who should pass the highest examination in Experimental Science. It was not again proposed; the only award was made in 1870.

#### Maclean Prize

The Maclean Prize, of the annual value of one hundred dollars, was first awarded in 1872. It was founded by the will of Henry A. Stinnecke of the class of 1861. The following extract from the will, probated in 1866, is of interest:

"I further direct that a sum, the annual income of which shall amount to one hundred dollars, shall be applied by the said Trustees to the founding of the Maclean Prize, which prize shall be given to that one of the Orators chosen by the Literary Societies from the Junior Class, who shall on the night before Commencement, or at such other time as the Junior Orations shall be held, pronounce the best English Oration.

"The Commmittee that shall award said prize shall consist of the Professor of Rhetoric 'ex officio,' and two graduates of the College not members of the Faculty; the latter to be appointed by the Trustees.

"I found said prize as a Memorial of my esteem and regard for Dr. John Maclean, President of the College, and of my hearty appreciation of the kindness shown to my classmates and to me during our College course."

## Stinnecke Scholarship

The Stinnecke Scholarship was also established by the will of Henry A. Stinnecke, '61. It is awarded to the member of the Sophomore class "who shall pass the best examination at the opening of the session in September, in the Odes of Horace, the Eclogues of Vergil, and the Latin Grammar and Prosody, as well as the Anabasis or Cyropædia of Xenophon and the Greek Grammar." It is of the annual value of five hundred dollars, and is tenable during the undergraduate course. The first award was in 1873.

## Class of 1861 Prize

The interest of twelve hundred dollars, given by the Class of 1861, is annually awarded to the member of the Sophomore class passing the best examination at the end of the year in Mathematics. It was established in 1872.

#### Junior First Honor Prize

In 1870, and thereafter until 1876, Mrs. John R. Thomson gave two hundred dollars to the best scholar of the Junior class. In 1875 this prize was endowed by a bequest from Miss Maria Stinnecke, the annual interest of which amounted to two hundred dollars. It was known for several years as the "Miss Stinnecke Scholarship," and was awarded to the Junior first honorman until 1882, when upon receipt of the Wood legacy it was combined with the H. A. Stinnecke endowment.

In 1880 a legacy was received from George Bacon Wood, M.D., the annual income of which amounts to one hundred and fifty dollars. This has been awarded to the Junior first honorman since 1883.

## Science and Religion Prize

In 1872, Furman Sheppard, of the class of 1845, offered a medal valued at one hundred dollars, or its equivalent in money, to be given to the member of the Senior class who should pass the highest examination in the Harmony of Science and Revealed Religion. This prize was offered annually until 1887, when it was discontinued.

## Anonymous Prizes

In 1873, also in 1874 and in 1875, several prizes were offered by "a graduate of the College," as follows:

A prize of fifty dollars to the member of the Senior class offering the best essay on a given subject in Political Economy.

A prize of fifty dollars to the member of the Senior or Junior class offering the best essay on a given subject in Mental Philosophy.

A prize of fifty dollars to the member of the Junior class writing the three best essays in English Literature during Junior year.

A prize of fifty dollars to the member of the Junior class writing the best essay in French Literature upon a given subject.

A prize of one hundred dollars to the member of the Sophomore class passing the best examination in Greek and Latin upon certain named subjects.

A prize of one hundred dollars to the member of the Sophomore class standing highest at the Biennial Examination.

A prize of one hundred dollars to the member of the Freshman class passing the highest examination in the subjects required for entrance.

#### Freshman First Honor Prize

A prize of two hundred dollars to be given to the member of the Freshman class attaining the highest average in scholarship, was established in 1873 by a deed of gift from John S. Kennedy, Esq., of New York. This prize was awarded with the provision that it should not be given to the student taking the Stinnecke Scholarship. It was discontinued in 1900.

#### Lynde Debate Prizes

Mr. Charles R. Lynde in 1876 donated five thousand dollars to establish a prize fund in debate. Three prizes, representing the income of this sum, are awarded by a committee appointed by the Faculty, to the successful competitors in a debate held during Commencement. The competitors in this debate, six in number, of the Senior class, are chosen from the American Whig and the Cliosophic Societies by a committee of their own members in the Faculty. The first prize was originally of the value of one hundred and thirty dollars; the second, one hundred and

twenty dollars, and the third, one hundred dollars, but the decrease in the rate of interest has lessened their value. They are at present worth one hundred, eighty-three, and sixty-six dollars, respectively. The first contest was held during the Commencement of 1876.

#### The Stinnecke Prizes

In 1877 three prizes, of the value of seventy, forty, and thirty dollars, respectively, from the income of the Stinnecke legacy, were awarded to the three members of the Sophomore class having the highest standing during Sophomore year. The awards were discontinued in 1880.

#### The Baird Prizes

Charles O. Baird, Esq., in 1882 offered the following prizes, open to members of the Senior class:

The Baird Prize of one hundred dollars to the best writer and speaker; a prize for Oratory of fifty dollars to the next best speaker and writer; and a prize of fifty dollars for the best poem, and of fifty dollars for the best written disputation delivered at the public oratorical exercises of the Senior class.

Through the liberality of the same donor, the Baird Prize fund was established the year following by a gift of six thousand dollars, and the number of prizes offered was increased. At present they are:

The Baird Prize of one hundred dollars, to the best speaker of those who have ranked among the first six writers, in any two of the three departments of English Literature, Rhetoric, and Oratory.

A prize for oratory, of fifty dollars, to the best speaker, exclusive of the Baird Prizemen, of those who in the same departments have ranked among the first twelve writers.

A prize for delivery, of thirty dollars, to the best speaker, exclusive of the above.

A prize for poetry of fifty dollars.

Two prizes of forty and thirty dollars, respectively, for the best and the second best written disputations.

#### The Lyman H. Atwater Prize in Political Science

In 1883 the Class of 1883 established a prize fund of one thousand dollars, as a memorial of the Rev. Lyman H. Atwater, D.D., LL.D., Professor of Political Science, who died during that year. The annual interest from this sum is awarded to the member of the Senior class who is adjudged to have passed the best examination and written the best essay upon a given subject in the department of Political and Social Science. This prize was first awarded in 1885.

#### The Alexander Guthrie McCosh Prize

Founded in 1885 by a gift of one thousand dollars from President James McCosh to establish a prize in memory of his son Alexander Guthrie McCosh. The endowment was increased by a further gift of five hundred dollars from President McCosh in 1889. The interest is annually awarded to the member of the Senior class passing the best examination and writing the best essay upon a given subject in Philosophy. The first award was in 1886.

#### The Francis Biddle Prize

Founded in 1887 by a gift of five hundred dollars from Henry W. Biddle, Esq., in memory of Francis Biddle of the class of 1875. The interest is yearly awarded to the member of the Sophomore class, not below fourth group, who in the judgment of a committee appointed by the Faculty, shall write the best English essay. It was first awarded in 1888.

#### Frederick Barnard White Prize in Architecture

Established in 1887 by a yearly gift of fifty dollars from Mrs. Norman White, in memory of her son, Frederick Barnard White, of the class of 1883. In 1890, Mrs. White gave one thousand dollars to the University to permanently endow this prize. It is open to members of the Junior and Senior classes, and is awarded for the best essay upon some given subject in Architecture.

#### The Class of 1876 Prize for Debate in Political Economy

Established in 1887 by a gift of one thousand dollars, which has since been increased to two thousand, from the Class of 1876. This prize, at present the income from two thousand dollars, is awarded to the successful contestant in a debate on a subject of current interest in American politics, to be held on Washington's Birthday. The competitors, four in number, one from each class, are chosen by a vote of their respective classes.

#### Theodore Cuyler Prize in Economics

Established in 1889 by a gift of one thousand dollars from Cornelius C. Cuyler, of the class of 1879. In 1896 Mr. Cuyler added four thousand dollars to his former gift. Competition for this prize is open to members of the Senior class; it is awarded for the best examination and thesis on some stated subject in Political Economy. It was first offered in 1890.

#### The Thomas B. Wanamaker English Prize

Founded in 1889 by a gift of bonds valued at one thousand dollars from Thomas Brown Wanamaker, Esq., of the class of 1883. This prize, of the value of fifty dollars, is

awarded to the member of the Junior class passing the best examination in English Philology, who shall also write the best thesis on some topic therein. The first award was in 1890.

#### George W. Childs Preliminary Entrance Examination Prizes

Established in 1889 by a yearly gift of fifty dollars from George W. Childs, Esq., and awarded to the student from Philadelphia or vicinity, passing the best preliminary entrance examination into the Academic Department. In 1893 and afterward, prizes were awarded to both Academic and Scientific students, under the same conditions. The awards were first made in 1890 and were discontinued in 1896.

## Class of 1870 English Prizes

In 1890 the Class of 1870 gave the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars to establish a prize fund in English, designated and applied as follows:

Class of 1870 Junior English Prizes. Of the yearly interest of one thousand five hundred dollars, one-half will be given to the best Old English scholar, and one-half to the best English Literature scholar of the Junior Academic class.

Class of 1870 Sophomore English Prize. The yearly interest of one thousand dollars will be given to the member of the Sophomore Academic class who, at the close of Sophomore year, shall pass the best examination in the English studies of the year.

The first award was made in 1891.

## The C. O. Joline Prize in American Political History

Two hundred and fifty dollars, the gift of Adrian II. Joline, Esq., class of 1870, was received in 1890 to found "The C. O. Joline Prize in American Political History." An annual prize of the value of fifty dollars was offered for five years to the member of the Senior class passing the best

examination in American Political History (1789–1820), who should also write the best thesis on an assigned topic connected with that period. In 1896 the prize was renewed, under different conditions, by a second gift of two hundred and fifty dollars. It was then specified:

The sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, payable in annual installments of fifty dollars, will be awarded at intervals of not less than three years to that graduate of the University, pursuing the study of American History as a specialty, who shall have presented before graduation the best thesis on some topic assigned by the Professor of History, and connected with the political history of the United States between the years 1787 and 1820, and who shall annually, for two years thereafter, present as evidence of his work a satisfactory essay of not less than five thousand words on a kindred topic suggested by himself.

This prize was first offered in 1891; it has not been awarded since 1896.

#### New York Herald Prize

Founded by James Gordon Bennett, Esq., in 1893 by a gift of one thousand dollars. The prize is awarded to the member of the Senior class, or to the special student of satisfactory standing, who shall have taken the prescribed course in Political Science and English Literature, and who shall have prepared the best essay in English prose upon some subject of current interest in the domestic or foreign policy of the United States. The first award was in 1894.

## The M. C. H. Junior German Prizes

Founded in 1898 by the late Professor Willard Humphreys in memory of his mother, Mary Cunningham Humphreys. These prizes, of the value of twenty-five and fifteen dollars

respectively, were paid annually by Professor Humphreys during his life, and since his death, September 26, 1902, the principal sum of one thousand dollars, by a provision in his will, has been given to the University. The first awards were made in 1899. The prizes are given to the members of the Junior class (Academic) who, having taken the regular German course for at least two years, shall, at the close of the second term, pass the best examination on the work of the term, and on the life of the author whose works have been the principal subjects of the year's study.

#### FELLOWSHIPS

Below are listed the endowed fellowships and those paid annually by subscription in the order of their establishment. Special fellowships and such others as have not been noticed in the annual catalogues, are not mentioned.

#### Boudinot Fellowships

Founded in part upon a bequest of the Honorable Elias Boudinot of New Jersey. The invested funds at present amount to eight thousand dollars, and the interest, four hundred dollars, is divided between the Historical and the Modern Language Fellowships. They were established in 1869.

## Jay Cooke Fellowship in Mathematics

Founded in 1870 and maintained for several years by an annual gift of six hundred dollars from Jay Cooke, Esq., of New York.

## Field Fellowship in Classical Literature

Maintained for one year (1870) by a gift of seven hundred dollars from Honorable Richard Stockton Field, of the class of 1821.

#### Chancellor Green Fellowship in Mental Science

Established in 1870 upon an annual gift of six hundred dollars from Chancellor Henry Woodhull Green, of the class of 1820, and in 1877, after the death of Chancellor Green, endowed by a gift of ten thousand dollars from his widow, Mrs. Susan M. Green.

#### Marquand Fellowship in Classical Literature

Established in 1870 and maintained for a number of years by an annual gift of six hundred dollars from Henry G. Marquand, Esq., of New York.

## Class of 1860 Fellowship in Experimental Science

Founded in 1870 upon a gift of ten thousand dollars subscribed by the Class of 1860. A deficiency of income, owing to the depreciation of the value of the securities in which the principal was invested, has been paid from the income of the Magee Professorship of Mining and Engineering, founded by George G. Magee, Esq., of the class of 1860.

## J. S. K. Fellowship in Mathematics

Founded in 1873 upon a gift of eleven thousand dollars from John S. Kennedy, Esq., of New York City. The principal and accumulated interest now amount to sixteen thousand five hundred dollars.

## E. M. Biological Fellowship

Founded in 1878. There is no income to support this fellowship; the present perquisite is the use of a table in the National Seaside Laboratory at Woods Holl, Massachusetts.

## Ward Fellowship in Economic Geology

Founded in 1881 by a gift of six hundred dollars from W. S. Ward, Esq., of Leadville, Colorado, and awarded in 1882. A like sum, given the following year by Mr. Ward, was offered as a fellowship in Economic Electricity.

#### Fellowship in Chemistry and Mineralogy

The sum of five hundred dollars, given in 1881 by the residuary legatees of John C. Green, was offered for one year as a special fellowship in Chemistry and Mineralogy.

## Class of 1877 University Fellowship in Biology

Founded in 1887 by members of the Class of 1877. An income of four hundred dollars is paid annually by subscription.

## The South East Club University Fellowship in Social Science

Founded in 1887 by alumni of the classes of 1876, 1877, 1878, and 1879—former residents of the South East Entry of East College. The yearly income of this fellowship, paid partly from invested funds and partly by subscription, amounts to five hundred dollars.

## University Fellowship in English

Established in 1887 and maintained for a number of years by an annual subscription of four hundred dollars, the gift of Henry M. Alexander, Esq., of the class of 1840, and other gentlemen.

## University Fellowship in Archaelogy

This fellowship, established in 1887, yields an income of four hundred dollars, the annual subscription of several friends of the University.

#### Fellowships in Oratory

Established in 1891 and maintained for several years by an annual subscription of twelve hundred dollars, divided into two fellowships of six hundred dollars each, provided by certain friends of the University.

#### Thaw Fellowship in Astronomy

Founded in 1897 by a gift of ten thousand dollars from Mrs. Thaw, of Pittsburg.

## Charles Scribner University Fellowship in English

Founded in 1899 in memory of Charles Scribner, Esq., by his son, Charles Scribner, of the class of 1875, by a gift of twelve thousand dollars.

## John Harding Page Classical Fellowship

Established in 1900 by Mrs. James Laughlin, Jr., of Pittsburg, in memory of her father, John Harding Page, Esq. This fellowship yields the holder the income of six hundred dollars a year.

#### Francis Hinton Maule Biological Fellowship

Founded in 1901 by Mr. and Mrs. Francis Hinton Maule, as a memorial of their son, Francis Hinton Maule, a student in the University during the years 1895–1898. The endowment amounts to ten thousand dollars and yields the holder the annual income of four hundred dollars.
