1. Roger, son of Pascarius, *and* Peter Passator. 10 messuages and half a virgate of land and half an acre of meadow in Westminster. *Anno* 10.
2. John, son of Edward, *and* Hibernicus de Luitone and Matilda, his wife. One acre of meadow in Westminster. *Anno* 10.
3. Clementia and Juliana, daughters of Martin, *and* Gilbert le Brazur. One messuage in Westminster. *Anno* 10.
4. Matilda, daughter of 'Alwin Tornegold, *and* Richard le Paumer, William, son of Asketill, and William Ruffu'. Half a virgate, and 2 acres of land and one messuage in Stanewell and Bedefunte. *Anno* 10.
5. Geoffrey, son of Osbert, *and* Andrew Plundit (?). 40 acres of land in Stebehee. *Anno* 10.
6. Ailwin de Alprinton *and* Richard de Hinton. One virgate of land in Greneford. *Anno* 10.
7. Walter, son of Gerard, *and* Matilda, daughter of Alexander. One hide of land in Bedefunte. *Anno* 10.
8. Richard de Ely, *and* Constantine, son of Alulf. One virgate of land in Egeswere. *Anno* 10.
9. Ailward de Cherringe and Hawisia, his wife, *and* the abbot of Westminster. 3 virgates of land in Tudinton. *Anno* 9.

10. Ralph de Septemfontibus, *and* John, son of Eadward Prepositus. One acre of land in the vill of Westminster, next the road towards the Hospital of St. James. *Anno* 9.

11. Roger Enganet *and* Geoffrey Picot. One acre of meadow in the vill of Westminster, in Langedich', in exchange for two acres of land in the fields of Westminster, which Matilda, who was the wife of Alnoth, held within the Long Hedge (*Longa Haia*). Warranty by Nicholas, son of Geoffrey, and William, son of Ordric. *Anno* 9.

12 & 13. Lucy, daughter of Wufr' Boquinte, *and* John, her son. 2 carucates of land in Heggewer; to wit, all the land which the same John holds of the fees of William de Reimes and Adam Boquinte in Heggewer, and 5s. rent from the land where timber is sold, which Robert Barun gave to the same Lucy. *Anno* 9.

14. William, son of Thurstan de Coleham, *and* William, abbot of Westminster. Concerning a proxy (*senescantia*) of the abbey of Westminster. *Anno* 9.

15. Ralph de Cormeiles and Matilda, his wife, and Estrilda, sister of the same Matilda, by John Burgunum, their attorney, *and* Henry, son of Ailwin. One virgate and a half of land in Stebenee which belonged to Edwin Bilewit, Walter Bilewit, and John Bilewit. *Anno* 9.

16. Richard, son of Edward, *and* Ralph de Septemfontibus. One virgate of land in Chelchud'. *Anno* 8.

17. Ralph de Heirun of Estre, *and* Ralph de Heirun of Edelm'. A fourth part a knight's fee and one virgate of soccage land (*terra de soccag'*) in Edelm'. *Anno* 8.

18. Letia de Montini (?), widow of Henry Foliot *and* Ermemard' (*sic*), prioress, and the convent of Clerkenwell. 2 virgates of land in Clerkenwell; to wit, 13 acres of land in which the priory of the said nuns is founded, which lie in the court of the same, within the walls and without, on all sides, and extend to the court of the hospitalers of Jerusalem; and the land which is between the court of the same nuns, on which there is a great vivary

(*vivarium*) <sup>(1)</sup>, and in which valley (*valle*) is Skinnereswell; and 3 perches of land beyond the valley towards the north in the length of the valley to Holeborne; and the same valley and vivary, if there be a vivary; and the land which is between that valley and Godewell below the road to Holeburn, and above the road towards the east, to the ditch; and 3 perches of land beyond Godewell, below the road and above the road toward the north; and 5 acres of land next the aforesaid valley which lies in length towards the south and towards the north; and the land and meadow which is between Holeburn and the ditch which goes from Holeburn to the mill of the aforesaid nuns; and this same ditch; and the site (*sede*) of the mill aforesaid; and the curtilage next that mill; and the land and meadow and garden, which are between the aforesaid mill and gardens of the hospitalers of Jerusalem, which is upon Holeborne; and the lands and messuage and rent and gardens which are between the aforesaid garden of the hospitalers aforesaid and the bar of Smethefeld upon the river of Fackeswell, towards the north; and the land and messuage which the aforesaid nuns have of the fee of the same Letia between the aforesaid river and Chikennelan; and one messuage before the house which was of Robert de Foleli; and 2 acres of land next the street which goes from the bar without Aldredesgate towards Iseldon, next the garden of the hospitalers of Smethefeld; and all the field which is between Wite . . . hesi (P) and Farncroft; and all Farncroft; and the little valley next Farncroft toward the north, in length from Farncroft; and the ditch beyond that valley towards the north; and all the land which Wll' Clericus of Smethefeld held of the same Letia, next the curtilage of the aforesaid nuns, towards the east; and all the land which . . . 19. Alice Gule, *and* John de Westmonasterio. One message in Westminster which the said Alice claims as dower of Ralph Gule formerly her husband. *Anno* 8.

20. Isabella . . . , by Roger, son of Alan, her attorney, *and* Ermegard, prioress of Clerkenwell. 2 virgates of land in Bote . . . . [*Torn*]. *Anno* 8.

21. Goda, daughter of Effreed, *and* William de Westmonasterio. The dower of the said Goda, in a message in Westminster, which Alan, who was the husband of the same Goda, held. *Anno* 7.

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## JOHN.

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1. Katherine, widow of Robert Morell, by Geoffrey, her husband, her attorney, *and* Martin de Capella. The dower of the said Katherine, of the gift of the said Robert, in Twiford. Martin gives to Katherine the rent which Roger (?) Palmer, Walter his brother, Ailward Stoker, Ailwin Phede, . . . . and Brihthina, the widow, held in Twiford. *Anno* 1.

2. Gilbert de Hendon, *and* Martin de Brainte. Half a hide of land in Hendon. *Anno* 1.

3. Roger, son of Pascarius, *and* Geoffrey Picot. 4 messages in the vill of Westminster. *Anno* 1.

4. Roger, son of Pascarius, *and* Solomon Presbiter. 2 acres of land in the vill of Westminster. *Anno* 1.

5. John, son of Edward Prepositus, by Alban Clericus, *and* Master Ernald Postard'. One message in the vill of Westminster between the land of Gervase Bachelor and the land which was of Wlmt (?) la Lavendere, mention of Nicholas, son of the said Ernald. *Anno* 2.

6. John and Richard, sons of Thorold de Bedfunte, *and* Richard de Herierd'. 10 hides of land in Bedfunte. *Anno* 2.

7. Roger, son of Pascarius, *and* Roger Capellanus of Westminster. One message in Westminster, for which

Roger Capellanus, quit-claims to Roger, son of Pascarius, the curtilage in the vill of Westminster which John le Furner held. *Anno 2.*

8. Roger, son of Hugh, *and* Peter, prior of the Holy Trinity, London. One hide of land in Bramleia. *Anno 2.*

9. Robert, son of Bernard, *and* Henry de Bedfunt. Henry gives to Robert a quarter of 20 acres of land in Stebenei, in exchange for the capital messuage of Bernard, his father, with the vivary, and the land called Winheard (?), Estfeld, Sortland, 4 acres in the field called Sudhdon, the lands called Rugecroft, and Nieweland, with the pool and field called Alftonesland, the fields called Petitewurth and Granwurth, lands called Langefen' and Long Pre (except half-an-acre), the services of Roger Hurscarl', Robert son of Robert de Pinkeni, Thomas, son of Alexander, Henry (?) son of Robert, Richard de Caulestoke, Matilda daughter of Bernard, Hugh son of Warine, Walter son of Bernard, Edwin de Haringue, Alice widow of Brunig' and Roger Faierloc' with their tenements; also 4 acres which Roger Horloc' held with the messuage. The said Robert retains to his use of the said quarter of 20 acres of land, the messuage which was of Edmund, son of Alured, and other land in Edrichesmad', upon Suthdon, and in Longo Prato, Fridaldre, and Niewland. *Anno 2.*

10. Robert, son of Turoid, *and* Henry de Bedefunte. The whole vill (*tota villa*) of Westbedefunte. The said Henry and Robert grant the premises to Richard de Herierd', who gives to the said Henry 50 marks of silver, and to Robert the moiety of the said vill, with certain exceptions. *Anno 2.*

11. Ralph de Querendon, and Cristina, his wife, by Henry de Stoka, *and* James Blundum.  $4\frac{1}{2}$  acres of land in Edelmeton. *Anno 3.*

12. Albretha, daughter of Hugh, *and* Stephen Marescallus, and Alice, his wife. One messuage in the vill of Westminster. *Anno 3.*

13. Roger, son of Paskarius, *and* Nicholas Clericus. One curtilage in the vill of Westminster. *Anno* 3.

14. Geoffrey de Forde, *and* Ailward de Forde. 12 acres of land and one acre of meadow in Edelmeton. *Anno* 3.

15. John Bocoite, *and* William Blemund. One carucate of land in Totenhale. *Anno* 3.

16. William, son of Alulf', *and* John de Hulle. 8 acres of land and 3 acres of meadow in Brambeleg'. *Anno* 4.

17. Ralph de Querendon' and Cristina, his wife, *and* the *Infirmi* of St. Giles's, London. 5 acres of land, and one messuage, and 1 acre of meadow in Edelmeton. *Anno* 4.

18. William, son of Reinerus, *and* Robert de la Forde. 4 acres of land, and 2½ acres of meadow in Edelmeton. *Anno* 4.

19. William, son of Alulf, *and* Ida Triket, whom Robert Burell calls to warrant. 8 acres land and 3 acres of meadow in Brambeleg'. *Anno* 4.

20. Henry Clericus, son of Humphry Buonte *and* Richard, prior of the church of St. Bartholomew, London, by Andrew Canonicus. One virgate of land in Heggwere. *Anno* 4.

21. Robert Mauditt *and* Paveia de Langeditch and Thomas, her son. Half an acre of meadow in the vill of Westminster.

22. Stephen Parmentar' *and* Henry, son of Reinerus, Richard Serico (?), and William Carpenter. One curtilage, and 5 messuages in the parish of St. Clement Danes. *Anno* 4.

23. Robert, son of Edward, *and* Robert de Clifford. 18 acres of land in the parish of St. Pancras *justa* Purtepol. Warranty by Robert de Clifford to Richard, son of Gunhild. *Anno* 4.

24. Luc' de Greneford *and* Adam de Estgreneford. Half a virgate of land in Estgreneford, to wit:—6 acres in the field called Lukemere towards the west and 3 acres towards the east; and in the field which extends towards

Brainte, 2 acres towards the south, and 4 perches (?); besides one acre towards the church; and towards the north, one acre; and in Estfeld  $1\frac{1}{2}$  acres towards Horsendun; and in Westfeld,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  acres towards the same place. *Anno 4.*

25. Roger, son of Pascar', and John, son of Edward. One curtilage, 3 messuages, and 6 acres of land in the vill of Westminster. Warranty by the same John to Umphry de Langemere, Martin King, Robert le Marun, Cecilia, widow of Edward Prepositus, and William Cunarius. Memorandum as to right of way. *Anno 4.*

26. Henry, son of Humphry, and Andrew Blundun', and Lucy, his wife. One virgate of land (*described*) in Eggeswer'. Warranty by John, son of Walleramin'. *Anno 4.*

27. Robert de Lenelande (Leveland?), and Osbert de Lutleton. One knight's fee in Lutleton with the advowson of the Church of the same vill. *Anno 5.*

28. John Bukuionte, and Peter, prior of the Holy Trinity, London. Half a virgate of land and 5 acres of meadow in Edelmeton. *Anno 5.*

29. James, son of Firmin', and Cristina his wife, and Jordan de Purtepole. 5 acres of land and one messuage in Hida. *Anno 5.*

30. Reginald Purcell, and Edith, widow of William Purcell. One acre of land in Holeburne, next the Old Temple, without the Bar. Reginald quit-claims all right in this land to Edith; and she releases to him all her claim, as dower, in the free tenement which was of William Purcell, father of the said Reginald. This agreement was made in the presence of William, son of Stephen, who had a charter of the said William, of 9 acres of land in Fuleham, contained in the dower of the said Edith; his right in this, he quit-claims for himself and his heirs for ever, and Reginald gives him half a mark of silver. *Anno 5.*

31. Hugh, son of Ailwin, son of Edward, and Henry, son of Ailwin. Half a hide of land in Edelmeton. *Anno 5.*

32. Richard, son of Ernulf, *and* Robert le Mascun'. One messuage in Westminster. *Anno* 5.

33. William de Barra, and Ascelina, his wife, *and* Clementia, prioress of Haliwell. 3 acres of garden in Eldestrate and two messuages in the parish of St. Giles, near Rosy Cross, without Cripelgate. Warrant by the said prioress to Richard de Umframville. *Anno* 5.

34. Gunild', widow of William, *and* John de Westmonasterio. One messuage in Westminster. *Anno* 5.

35. Roger de la Dune, and Godfrey, son of Ralph, *and* Robert le Simple. 2 parts of 2 hides of land in Coueleg'. Memorandum that Robert and his heirs warrant Roger and Godfrey and their heirs against the abbot and convent of Westminster of the service which that land owes to them; and that Roger and Godfrey and their heirs ought to warrant the premises against Walter de Grenefeld and his heirs, and that only Robert and his heirs ought to do the services which pertain to the land of Couele, to the abbot and convent of Westminster. *Anno* 5.

36. Roger, son of Alan, *and* John, son of Geoffrey Buk. One third of a hide of land and one messuage in Edelmetone. John acknowledges the premises to be the right of Roger; in consideration of which, Roger grants to John the capital messuage which was of William, son of Fubert, and the great field which extends therefrom to the highway, the fields called Stonifeld (?) and Chanterelefeld, the eastern moieties of Palmeresfeld, Wulvesfeld, Wenmaresfeld, Great Rudings, and numerous others; and also the moiety of the wood called Frith, all in Edelmeton. Boundaries described and owners' names given. *Anno* 6.

37. John de Coleville, and Alice his wife, *and* John de Wika. Half a messuage in Westminster which Alice claimed as dower of her former husband, William de London. *Anno* 6.

38. Gilbert, son of Walter, *and* Richard de Punchard. One hide of land in Tikeham. *Anno* 6.

39. John, son of Raenere, *and* Osgod' de Stanes. One messuage in Stanes. *Anno* 6.



40. William Parvus, *and* William de Herlaue by Nicholas de Herlaue. 3 acres of land, one acre of meadow, and 3 messuages in Eya. *Anno* 7.

41. Peter Fauset, *and* John le Butiller. One messuage in Westminster. *Anno* 7.

42. Hugh Capellanus, *and* Reinfrid' de Bruera and Alina his wife. Half a virgate, and 10 acres of land, in Herefeld. Recital of Charter:—Reinfrid de Bruera, son of Roger, and Alina his wife, daughter of Geoffrey, son of Baldwin, give and grant to Hugh, the chaplain of Geoffrey Fitz Pierre, Earl of Essex, for his homage and service, Geldehest (?) with all the assarts, between the burn of Rislay . . . and the highway from Watford towards Uxebridge, and from the burn of Ykeham to the same highway; saving the ways of Gateford and Ykeham, (*full description of premises*). *Anno* 7.

43. William Parvus, *and* Richard le Haut and Adelina his wife.  $5\frac{1}{2}$  acres of land in Eya. *Anno* 7.

44. Eustace, son of William, *and* Alexander Capellanus. 2 messuages and 2 curtilages in the parish of St. Clement extending from the highway to the Thames in the tenure of Gilbert Kanne and Robert Turkil' (?). Eustace had acknowledged the premises to be the right of the said Alexander, for which acknowledgement Alexander grants the same to Eustace and his heirs, to hold of Eustace de Faucunberg'. The brethren of the hospital of St. Bartholomew are chief lords of the fee. *Anno* 7.

45. Alexander, son of Alexander, *and* John, son of Ralph. 2 messuages and 2 acres of land in Westminster. *Anno* 8.

46. John, son of Ralph le Masoun, *and* Michael le Sergant and Gervase Parmentar'. One messuage and 8 acres of land in Holeborne, Purtepol, and Bradeford. These are acknowledged to be the right of the said John, who, in exchange, gives to Michael and Gervase a moiety of the

croft which Gamel held and half an acre of land this side (*citra*) Purtepol, towards the south. *Anno* 8.

47. Henry, son of Peter, *and* William, son of Pagan. Half a virgate of land in Latham which is acknowledged to be the right of the said William, in return for which, he gives to the said Henry a moiety of the premises lying in Langfurland, Middelfurlang, Brocfurlang, Becherferd, Brache, Shelve', Bottefurlang, &c. *Anno* 8.

48. Henry Tubelm', *and* Alice, prioress of Keleburne, by brother Osmund, her attorney. One virgate of land in Estburnham. Henry acknowledges this to be right of the same prioress and her church of St. John of Kelebirne. *Anno* 9.

49. Adam de Dierherst and Matilda, his wife, *and* Robert Mauduit. One messuage in Westminster. *Anno* 9.

50. Brand' Cocus and Alice, his wife, *and* Robert Molendinarius. One messuage in Westminster. *Anno* 9.

51. John, son of Ralph, *and* Ogbert Capellanus. 8 acres of land in Kentisston. Ogbert calls to warrant Simon le Serjant and they acknowledge the premises to be right of the said John, who grants to Ogbert 2 acres of the same land next to Broca towards the south. *Anno* 9.

52. William Cimentarius and Matilda, his wife, *and* John Testard'. One messuage in the vill of Westminster. Vouchee to warranty, Richard Testard'. *Anno* 9.

53. Ralph Treipiet, *and* Thomas le Hare. Half a virgate of land in Sceperton which Gunnilda, daughter of Frebert, demanded against the said Ralph. This the said Ralph gives to the said Thomas in exchange for 10 acres of land in Erbergefeld which Alurie Labie held. *Anno* 9.

54. Gunnilda, daughter of Frebert, by William de Halgefurd, her attorney, *and* Ralph Treipiet. Half a virgate of land in Sceperton, whereof the said Ralph calls to warrant Thomas le Hare. *Anno* 9.

55. Robert de Norf' and Theofania, his wife, *and*

Isaac the Jew, son of Joiceus "Episcopus." One message in London which was of Reinard Mercerus in the parish of St. Olave. *Anno* 10.

56. Brother Robert, prior of the hospital of Jerusalem in England, by brother Gilbert, his attorney, and Lecia de Munteun (?), by Robert, son of Gervase, her attorney. 3 hides of land in Clerkenewell. Lecia acknowledges the premises to be the right of the said prior and the other brothers of this said hospital, to hold of her and her heirs by the annual render of 12*d.* Saving the land of Gundreda de Warenn'. To hold from the first feast of St. Michael after the consecration of Joscelin, Bishop of Bath, for ten years, according to the fine made between the said Gundreda and Letia. Mention of Reginald de Mortuo Mari, attorney by the said Gundreda. *Anno* 12.

57. Robert, son of Tiel', and Hugh de Clahull, and Alice his wife, by John Haket, her attorney. Half a virgate of land in Herrefeld. *Anno* 14.

58. Dionisia de Greneford, and Reginald de Cornhull, by Stephen de Boncistien (?), his attorney. Three parts of half a knight's fee in Greneford, which Dionisia claimed as dower given to her by her late husband, Luke de Greneford. *Anno* 14.

59. Adam de Westmonasterio and Matilda, his wife, and Robert Mauduit. 4*s.* rent in the vill of Westminster. *Anno* 14.

60. Peter, prior of the Holy Trinity, London, and Hasculf Gernet. One hide and a half of land in Brambeleg' of the fee of the Earl W. de Mandeville. Hasculf acknowledges the premises to be the right of the said prior and his church, as those which William, son of Guy (*Wydonis*), great-grand-father (*proavus*) of Hasculf, and William, his son, and Alice, mother [daughter?] of Galien, mother of the same Hasculf, gave to the said church. *Anno* 14.

61. Roger, son of Richard de Camberhirst, and Walter de Couele. Half a hide of land in Hatton. *Anno* 14.

62. Henry Bucuinte, and John Walram. The services

and customs exacted by the same Henry from the same John in respect of one virgate and 7 acres of land, held by John, of Henry, in Stanmere. *Anno* 14.

63. Juliana, widow of Robert Simplex, by Simon de Pinken', her attorney, *and* Umphry de Scovill (?), *and* Matilda his wife, by Richard de Scovill, her attorney. The third part of 3 parts of 2 hides of land in Couele, of one carucate of land in Feltham, of 2 virgates of land in Northal, and of 2 virgates of land in Rokeshal. Juliana claims the premises as her dower, given to her by Robert. Umphry *and* Matilda grant to Juliana a portion of the premises for term of her life, and she remits to them all her claim in the remainder. *Anno* 15.

64. Adam de Tarent, *and* Nicholas de Sancto Germano. 6 acres of land in Twikeham. And between the same Adam, *and* Richard Postell. Half a virgate of land in the same vill. And between the same Adam, *and* Richard Snel. Half an acre of land in the same vill. Richard Snel calls to warrant Geoffrey Postell. *Anno* 16.

65. Adam de Tarent, *and* Geoffrey Postell. One virgate of land in Twikeham. *Anno* 16.

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1. W., Bishop of London, by Walter de Buckingham, his attorney, *and* Reginald de Cornhull. Land in Stebehee. *Anno* 2.

2. Avicia, widow of John, son of Edward, *and* Geoffrey de la Hegelande. A third part of a messuage in Westminster. *Anno* 2.

3. Avicia, widow of John, son of Edward, *and* Richard le Herre. A third part of a messuage in Westminster. *Anno* 2.

4. Clementia, widow of Peter Aurifaber, by Thomas, her son, her attorney, *and* Joan, widow of Henry, son of

Reinerus. Half a messuage in Innocent's Street (*vico Innocentium*). *Anno 3.*

5. Clementia, widow of Peter Aurifaber, and William, son of Reinerus. Half a messuage in Innocent's Street. *Anno 3.*

6. Clementia, widow of Peter Aurifaber, and John de Windlesores. A messuage in the parish of Holy Innocents. *Anno 3.*

7. Geoffrey, son of Christian, and Katherine, widow of Robert Morel, and Henry de Capella. The dower of Katherine happening in Twiford, and a rent from certain lands described. *Anno 3.*

8. Stephen de Stranda, and Matilda, his wife, and Margaret, daughter of Sarra. A messuage "in Stranda," and messuages and land in Aldewich. *Anno 3.*

9. William Parmentarius and Acelina, his wife, and Agnes, sister of the same Acelina, and Master Guncelinus, master of the hospital of St. James. Land in Beggemere (?). *Anno 3.*

10. William, son of Alexander, and William, son of John. A rent in Smehefeld. *Anno 3.*

11. Walter, son of Avice, and Adam de Twiford. Land in Twiford. *Anno 3.*
