We celebrate your intellect, energy, and pursuit of excellence. We only hope that your new degree will open many doors to achievement in the years to come.

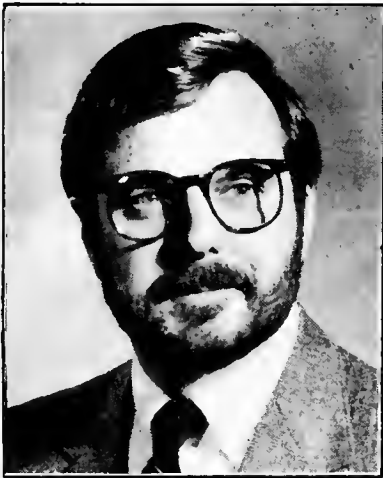
