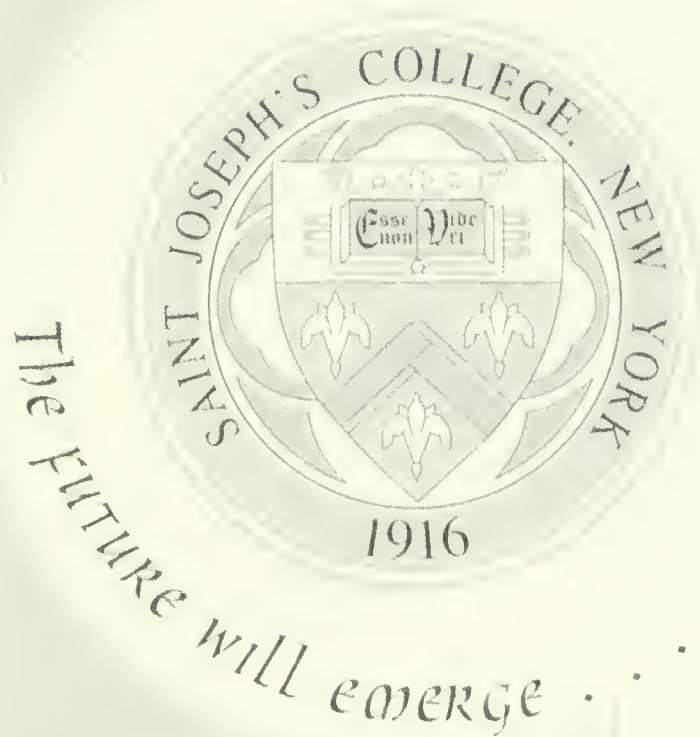

Hill, C.S.J., J.D. was elected the College's fifth president at last night's Trustees' meeting. S. Elizabeth will take office on July 1, 1997 succeeding S. George Aquin O'Connor, C.S.J., who has served as President for 28 years.

S. Elizabeth Hill has held the position of Executive Assistant to the President at St. Joseph's College since 1980. In addition to acting as legal counsel for the College, she has worked in every area of College administration and has participated in long-range planning for SJC, particularly in the areas of fund-raising and public relations. In her prior capacity as Staff Attorney for the Catholic Migration Office, she was responsible for six field offices and developed an expertise in dealing with federal regulations, which has enabled her to judiciously direct members of the St. Joseph's College community through this litigious age. During her seventeen years at St. Joseph's College, S. Elizabeth has also served as Lecturer in the Department of Political Science and taught Federal Government and Constitutional Law. S. Elizabeth holds a J.D. from St. John's University School of Law, an M.A. in History from Columbia University, and a B.A. from St. Joseph's College.

Cyberspace, Word Processing, Internet, Networks, Spreadsheets, Browsers, Hypertext, Information Superhighway!!!! Or is it just hype and information overload?

Learning how to work with computers is like learning a new foreign language. There are so many new terms and concepts to digest. The difference with learning computers and learning a foreign language, however, is that computers can make your day to day life much simpler; both in your business life, and academic life and your personal life.

Word Processing makes writing reports, letters, memos, etc. easier. Unlike with typing on a typewriter, using Word Processing software offers you the ability to create, format, edit, revise, and print your documents with ease. If your spelling and grammar is not the best, most Word Processing Software now comes with Spell Checking, Grammar Checking, and Thesaurus features to help you create the perfect document. The Word Processing software that we use here at St. Joseph's is Microsoft Word.

Spreadsheet software enables you to create your budget documents, accounting ledgers, etc. using preset formatting and formulas. It eliminates the need for calculators or anxiety over whether or not you remember your statistical formulas correctly. Microsoft Excel is the Spreadsheet we use.

Presentation Graphics is software that allows you to create a slide presentation to supplement an oral presentation. You can include graphics to spruce it up. You can even print it out to give your audience hand-outs. We have to experiment with Microsoft Power Point in class.

Database software enables you to create inventories and listings and sort them in alphabetical order or numerical order. This is great for address files, employee or student listing, etc. Microsoft Access is the Database St. Joseph's has installed on the computers in the Computer Lab.

Then there is the Internet. The Internet Software we use is Microsoft Explorer. The Internet is a worldwide Network of Networks that literally puts the world at your fingertips. You can search the World Wide Web for information on virtually any topic. In class we found multiple ways to look up the weather, not just of the local area but also for the North Pole to make sure that Santa could still make his Christmas trip. We looked up information on Ebola Virus, Ebonics, Bill Gates as well, and that only scratches the surface of the possibilities.

I'm sure you've noticed by now that all the Software we use at St. Joseph's is Microsoft software. This is because they are all a part of the "Suite" of software that was purchased at the time the computers were purchased. A Software Suite is one Manufacturer's collection of Word Processing, Spreadsheet, Database, Presentation Graphics and Communication Software. In addition to Microsoft, Lotus and Corel also have popular software suites. The Microsoft Suite we use is also called Microsoft Office 97.

So as you can see, even though there is a lot to learn it is well worth the time to learn it because it will make all of our lives easier as a result.
