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PREFACE.

The following pages comprise 1st, an introduction, exhibiting the lineal connection between Ralph Hemenway of Roxbury, Mass., 1634, and Daniel Hemenway of Shrewsbury, Mass., b. in 1719; 2d, a Record of the descendants of said Daniel H. down to 1881.


The arrangement of the Record will be obvious upon a slight inspection. The children of Daniel H. are designated by Roman numerals, and the record of the descendants of each one in its order is traced by itself through to the present time. The later generations are designated by Arabic numerals, each generation being placed a little to the right of the preceding one.

The usual abbreviations are used, viz., b. for born, m. for married, etc. The work is now offered to the kindred whose records are embodied in its pages, believing that, in the main, it is correct. Some errors may have escaped the eye both of the compiler and the proof-reader.

The compiler acknowledges his obligations to all the kindred for furnishing their personal family records, especially to some who have furnished still larger records. He is greatly indebted to Horace P. Hemenway, M.D., for the Introduction, the fruit of patient and thorough research. Also he is indebted to R. D. H. Allen of Terryville, Ct., for services rendered in carrying the work through the press, and to him and Samuel H. Chipman for the means of publishing it.

INTRODUCTION.

The first record relating to the Hemenway family that has been found in New England is in the Town records of Roxbury, Mass., where Ralph Hemenway married Elizabeth Hewes July 5, 1634.

From Ralph probably descended all in this country bearing the name of Hemenway, alias Heminway, Hemingway, Hemmenway, Heningway, and Heneway.

It has been found difficult to trace the family prior to 1634. The same difficulty is found by all whose ancestors immigrated about that time, as the time 1632 to 1636 was the period of the great rush of immigrants to New England, and many expedients were resorted to to get passage. Many unmarried men and women were entered as "servants," no name being given, and they cannot be traced by either ship or nativity. In the New England Historical and Genealogical Register, Vol. 11, page 259, 1857, is given "a list of Pedigrees contained in William Paver's consolidated visitations of Yorkshire, England; being those taken in 1584, 1612, and 1665. Then follows, on page 263, "a list of alliances, or marriages with some of the families named in that list." In this list the name of Hemingway is found recorded as having made three alliances. It may therefore be fairly inferred that the family was in Yorkshire, or its immediate vicinity, at that early date.

This statement may lead to further investigation by some one having an opportunity, and the question be definitely settled. The early records of Roxbury are meager and fragmentary. It is supposed the earliest records were destroyed either by a fire that happened in 1645 or during the Indian troubles in 1675 to 1680.

There was great negligence in keeping important family records. At that time marriages were not performed by ministers, but by magistrates appointed by the General Courts, and church and town records often afford little or no information regarding marriages, births, and deaths.

Ralph is mentioned as "active in town affairs." "He was early a member of the Roxbury church." He must have brought property with him; as by "a note of ye estates and persons of ye inhabitants of Roxbury," made about 1638, he appears to have been one of the largest tax-payers and landholders.

His wife was a sister of Joshua Hewes, also one of the wealthy men of the town.

He took the freeman's oath Sept. 3, 1634. The date of admission as "freeman" is no criterion of age. It only shows he had previously joined a church here. His wife was born in 1603, and died in 1684-5, aged 82. He died in 1678, and his will made May 4, 1677, and recorded in Suffolk Probate Records, (Roxbury District,) mentions his great age. His will and the custom of the time would indicate that he was older than his wife. eldest son, Samuel, settled in New Haven, Conn., and no attempt has been made to trace his descendents for this work. His other sons John and Joshua, remained in Roxbury. John, by the will of his father, retained the homestead; as appears by the following extract which may be of interest to some. "Item. My will is that my wife Elizabeth shall have my whole estate for her comfort and subsistance during her natural life, to remain wholly in the hands of my son John Hemenway, to improve for her comfort; for to him, in a peculiar manner, do I commend and commit the care of my loving wife; hoping that he will for the future be careful and dutiful, as he hath formerly been; and after the death of my loving wife, my will is as followeth—Item. I do give unto my son Samuel Hemenway twenty shillings, to be paid to him by my son John Hemenway, within one year after the death of my said wife, in current country pay: and the reason why I do give him no more is because I took upon myself, indebted, and engaged unto my son, John Hemenway, who hath taken care of me and my wife in our age, and knowing that God hath dealt bountifully with my son Samuel, I desire him to accept my love in this legacy." Then follow "Items" bequeathing, after the death of his wife, a certain piece of land to Joshua, and directing John to pay certain legacies in money to his daughters, Ruth Hemenway and Elizabeth Holbrook. John was, by the will, appointed one of the executors. From Roxbury, branches of the family settled in Framingham, where lived Joshua, Ichabod, and Ebenezer, sons of Joshua, son of Ralph of Roxbury.

There are no church or town records showing that Joshua,

Ichabod, and Ebenezer were brothers. That is proved, however, beyond a doubt, by reference to Suffolk Probate Records (Rox. Dist.), where may be found recorded an order by the court for the distribution of the estate of Joshua Hemenway of Roxbury; and "his grandson Benoni Hemenway, who is the eldest son of Joshua, son of the first-named Joshua," was appointed trustee. "He saving unto Elizabeth Hemenway, relict widow of said Joshua, her right of dower during her term of life;" and further ordering him "to pay unto the children of said Joshua Hemenway, or their representatives, namely: to Ralph, deceased or his heirs; Ichabod; Samuel; deceased or his heirs; John, deceased or his heirs; Ebenezer; Elizabeth Stanhope, deceased or her heirs; and Joanna Ainsworth ten (10) pounds, eleven (11) pence each." A further distribution was ordered to be made after the death of his widow. This order was dated June 13, 1734, and shows who of Joshua's children were dead and who living at that time.

The three brothers settled near each other in Framingham, and families of their descendants have lived in the town ever since.

Several families have also lived in Shrewsbury, Marlboro, Southboro, Barre, and other towns in Mass.

From Ralph Hemenway in Roxbury, 1634, through his son Joshua, have descended the families hereafter mentioned, as follows:

- 1. Ralph Hemenway, married in Roxbury, Mass., Elizabeth Hewes, July 5, 1634, and had 'Mariah, b. Apl., 24, 1635, buried May 4; 'Samuel, b. June, 1636; 'Ruth, b. Sept. 21, 1638; 'John, b. Apl. 27, 1641; 'Joshua, b. Apl. 9, 1644; 'Elizabeth, b. May 31, 1645, married —— Holbrook; 'Mary, b. Apl. 7, 1647, died 1653. Ralph died June, 1678; and his wife, Feb. 2, 1684-5, æ. 82.
- 2. Samuel, "son of Ralph (1), settled in New Hayen, Conn., married Sarah, daughter of John Cooper, and had 'Sarah, b. July 26, 1663; 'Samuel, b. Dec. 13, 1665; 'Mary, b. July 5, 1668; 'Hannah, b. Sept. 14, 1670; 'Abigail, b. Feb. 16, 1672; 'John, b. May 29, 1675; 'Abraham, b. Dec. 3, 1677; 'Isaac and Jacob (twins), b. Dec. 6, 1683."—Savage's N. England Genealogies.
- 3. John, son of Ralph (1), m. in Dorchester Mary Trescott Oct. 6, 1665, and had in Roxbury, 'Thankful, b. 1668, married Jacob Parker in 1687; 'Marie, b. 1670; 'Marie, b. 1674; 'Sarah, b. and d., 1687; 'John, b. 1690. John, the father, died Oct. 4, 1724, æ. 82. (There is no record of the son John, except of his birth. Probably he died unmarried, and, as he was the only male issue, this family disappears from the record.)

- 4. Joshua, son of Ralph (1), m. 1st Joanna Evans of Dorchester Jan. 16, 1667, and had in Roxbury 'Joshua, b. Sept. 15, 1668, bap. Aug., 1669, settled in Framingham; 'Joanna, b. Oct. 2, 1670, married Edward Ainsworth; 'Ralph, b. May 18, 1673, died unmarried June 1, 1699; 'Ichabod, b. about 1675. His wife, Joanna, died about this time (1675). He next married Mary ——, 1678 or 9, and had 'Ebenezer, b. 1681; 'Samuel, b. Sept. 30, 1683; 'John, b. ——. His second wife, Mary, died May 5, 1703. He next married Elizabeth Weeks, Apl. 5, 1704. He died Oct. 29, 1716, &. 73. Elizabeth, his widow, died Sep. 20, 1737, &. 82.
- Joshua, son of Joshua (4), and wife, Margaret, were admitted to the Roxbury church in 1691; and had children in Framingham -1Hephzibah, Beulah (twins), b. Oct. 5, 1691; Benoni, b. Apl. 21, 1694, died unmarried Feb. 9, 1754. Margaret, wife of Joshua, died May 12, 1694, and he married, 2d, Rebeckah ----; and had ⁴Joshua, b. Apl. 2, 1697; ⁵Ralph, b. Oct. 7, 1699; ⁶Huldah, b. Sept. 30, 1702, died May 1, 1707; Rebeckah, b.—, died Apl. 30, 1707; Phinehas, b. Apl. 26, 1706; Huldah, died Aug. 1, 1709; ¹⁰Ebenezer, b. May 31, 1710; ¹¹Jonathan, b. Aug. 22, 1712. Joshua, the father, was an original member of the church in Framingham, and chosen deacon at its organization. "He was active and influential in town affairs;" "a man of decided convictions and earnest piety." Phinehas, his son, was the first native-born son of Framingham to graduate at college (Harv. Coll., 1730); and was elected master of the grammar school at the close of his senior year, and taught one year. He was ordained as the first minister of Townsend, Oct., 1734, and his ministry continued twenty-seven years. He died May 20, 1760, aged 55. Rev. Moses Hemenway, D.D., who graduated at Harv. Coll. 1755, taught school in Lancaster 1757, and was ordained minister of Wells, Me., 1759, where he died Apl. 11, 1811, in the 76th year of his age, and the 52d of his ministry, was a son of Ralph, son of Joshua (5).
- 6. Ichabod, son of Joshua (4), m. in Roxbury Margaret Brown, 1702, and had in Framingham 'Margaret, b. March 20, 1703, died young; 'Ichabod, b. Apl. 20, 1706; 'Elizabeth, b. Aug. 21, 1710, d. young; 'Margaret, b. Oct. 13, 1715, married John Ball, 1734, and had children in Hopkinton; 'John, b. ——, 'Daniel, ——. He with his wife was received into the church Oct. 10, 1725. "He was held in esteem as an amiable man. He was of unusually large stature, and robust."
 - 7. Ebenezer, son of Joshua (4), married Hannah Winch, May 17,

1711, and with wife was admitted to the church Feb. 19, 1721. Their children were, ¹Ebenezer, b. Oct. 24, 1712; ²Hannah, b. Feb. 14, 1714–15; ³Keziah, bap. Aug. 4, 1717; ⁴Daniel, b. Feb. 2, 1719; ⁵Jacob, b. March 20, 1721–22; ⁶Samuel, b. Aug. 3, 1724; ⁷Elizabeth, b. June 19, 1727. His wife Hannah, d. April 27, 1737; and he married Tamazin Nurse, Feb. 23, 1737–38.

The foregoing records are taken mostly from Barry's History of Framingham. Changes have been made in accordance with the more accurate information obtained recently in regard to the family of Joshua. Sr.

RECORD OF DANIEL HEMENWAY.

The above genealogical record of the Hemenways, prepared by H. P. Hemenway, M.D., of Somerville, Mass., shows a regular line of descent from Ralph of Roxbury, 1634, to Daniel of Shrews. bury, Mass., 1750, whose father's family record appears above. In tracing from this point the line of descent in our branch of the Hemenway family, we take Daniel, the fourth child, and second son of Ebenezer of Framingham, and propose to trace his descendants. as far as may be, in chronological order, down to the present time (1880). Daniel, son of Ebenezer, b. in Framingham, Feb. 2, 1719, m. 1st, Ruth Bigelow, June 7, 1743, and both were admitted to the church from Marlboro to that of Shrewsbury, in 1750; Ruth d. May 4, 1768, aged 49, leaving 8 children. m. 2d, Elizabeth Johnson of Marlboro, Mass., Dec. 1, 1768, who d. Oct. 23, 1782, leaving one son. Daniel's 3d wife was Abigail, widow of Nahor Wheelock, m. 1783. He d. Nov. 15, 1794, in Shrewsbury, aged 75. He was by trade a housewright. framed the present (1847) meeting-house of Shrewsbury, the south one in Worcester, in which Rev. Mr. Whitney long officiated, and many other public buildings. He was one of the strong men of the town, was a warm patriot in the Revolution, and a delegate to the Convention that framed the Constitution of Massachusetts. Through Jacob, his next younger brother, he early became interested in the settlement of Vermont.

As early as Oct., 1762, we find the name of Jacob Hemenway among the patentees of Shoreham, Addison Co., Vt., a town lying on the shore of Lake Champlain. It was that fact, without doubt, that led Daniel to go there in 1783; and his going opened way for

four of his eight sons eventually to settle in Vermont. At the first meeting of those patentees, of which there is any record extant, we find Daniel there (1783) as treasurer for the patentees, and their superintendent to oversee the laying out of the lands of the town. His son Asa's name also appears in the said record as a collector of taxes of said patentees. It is also known that Daniel took up land there, on which he built a log-shop, which afterwards was used as a chair-shop by his son Samuel, who removed to Shoreham in 1792, two years before his father's death. It is not known how many visits he may have made there, but he is known to have been in Shoreham and Bridport, the adjoining town, in the winter of 1791, three years previous to his death.

RECORD OF THE MINER FAMILY.

Polly, 3d child and dau, of Silas and Molly Smith Hemen way, was b. in Shrewsbury, Mass., Apr. 7, 1772. She came to Vt. in company with her grandfather, Daniel H. (who took a lively interest in the then new State of Vt.), in the winter of 1791, to visit her sister, Ruth Jenison of Shoreham, who had m. Levi Jenison some years previous, and settled in Shoreham, Vt. remained in Shoreham and Bridport with friends one year, and then returned to her home in Shrewsbury, where, the succeeding year, she was preparing to go and make her home in Bridport. She was m. in Shrewsbury, Mass., by Rev. Jos. Sumner, her pastor (who had christened her in infancy), to Benj. Miner Jr., a farmer of Bridport, Feb. 17, 1793. Mr. Miner was a native of Stonington, Ct., b. Aug. 27, 1767, and moved to Bridport with his father after the Revolutionary war (1786). They were among the early settlers, when the people passed from point to point by marked trees, and often were in destitute circumstances.

young couple started in life with the full determination to do all they could to improve themselves and their surroundings. At the outset, his father presented Mr. Miner with an axe and a hoe, to which was added hand-cards, spinning-wheels, and loom, which were among their household effects. By industry and economy they attained to a comfortable estate. They reared a family of seven children, whom they lived to see settled in life. Mr. Miner held many town offices of trust. He represented Bridport repeatedly in the State Legislature, was a justice of the peace from 1809 to his death, in 1851. He joined in marriage 100 couples, always giving the bride the marriage fee. Mr. Miner died at his home in Bridport, Aug. 14, 1851, aged 84 years. Mrs. Miner lived on nearly seven years, dying May 13, 1858, aged 86 years. Their descendants are as follows:

III. Susannah, only dau. of Daniel H., of Shrewsbury, Mass., b. April 16, 1746. On the day of her birth her father planted a cherry tree. About twenty-one years after, on her marriage with Daniel Rand, May 21, 1767, he presented her with a center table as a wedding gift, made from the wood of that same cherry tree. When she died she presented it to her 7th child, Gates Rand, and it is now in the possession of Henry H., his grandson, who resides in Madison, Wis. It is now one hundred and thirteen years old.

Daniel and Susannah Rand settled on a farm in Rindge, N. H., where their twelve children were born; the same is still, at this date, 1880, in the possession of their descendants. Mr. Rand served his country during the last two campaigns of the Revolution successively as Ensign, Lieutenant, and Captain; was several years a member of the Committee of Safety, and was delegate to the convention that framed the constitution of Mass. Militia he was Major in 1782, and Colonel in 1785. He represented Rindge in the New Hampshire legislature ten years, and was one of the selectmen in Rindge seven years. Col. Rand d. July 3, 1811, and his widow Sept. 6, 1817, and were both buried on the site of the old log-house first erected, and their graves are shaded by a young oak, sprung from the roots of the first tree cut by Col. Rand on that farm or in that section of country. The two-storied residence built by Col. Rand in 1775, and occupied by him and his family, is still in a fair state of preservation. 

APPENDIX.

A letter has been received by the compiler from Mrs. P. E. M. Bennett of Bridport, Vt., granddaughter of Silas Hemenway, and great-granddaughter of Daniel Hemenway of Shrewsbury. contains many facts of much interest in relation to our common ancestor, which were handed down to her by tradition and gleaned from the early records of the town of Bridport, of which she has made diligent search. As it was received too late for use in its place in the Record, free use is made of its material as confirmatory of, or additional to, the record already given. From it we learn that Daniel Hemenway went to Bridport at a very early He was very much pleased with its location between the mountains and the lake. He liked its soil and the heavily timbered pine lands, and thought the country complete, all save its water. which he was sure would make its appearance by springs coming to the surface as the land became more settled. It proved to be so, and it was often remarked, "He guessed just right." He used his influence to get many of his old neighbors to settle there. was displeased with the religious government of that day which Mrs. M. writes, "partook somewhat of the old blue laws of Connecticut." About the time he was building the meeting-house in Worcester, he and others formed themselves into a company to go into that country and live as "Brethren" and make their own church rules, but the revolutionary war prevented their coming till after peace was declared and the United States constitution established. Then their grievance was righted and they had the privilege of worshiping according to their own faith.

In the spring of 1766, as appears from the Vermont Historical Magazine, Col. Ephraim Doolittle, with twelve or fourteen others, among whom were Daniel and Jacob Hemenway, went from Worcester County, Mass., to Bridport, and built a log house and lived as one family the first year, the men taking their turns in cooking. Some of the party left on account of fever and ague,

but Col. Doolittle spent most of his time there, though he did not take his family there till 1783. There is recorded a deed, dated May 20, 1766, signed "Ephraim Doolittle, Worcester, Mass.," conveying to Daniel Hemenway "House right," six rights of land for the sum of six pounds. These rights were originally granted to Nathan Baldwin, William Craford, Noah Jones, Jacob Hemenway, Nahum Willard, and Samuel Brewer, by King George III., under seal of the Province of New Hampshire, "in the town ship of Bridport, situate on the Wood Creek or South Bay waters, on the east side thereof, near Crownpoint and Ticonderoga Forts, which townships of lands are now in New York. The said Ephraim Doolittle having received deeds of release from the said original grantees."

Mrs. Bennett also finds on record deeds in which Daniel Hemenway conveys the original right of Nathan Baldwin to Jacob Hemenway, yeoman, of Barre, Worcester county, Mass., consideration six pounds, dated Aug. 22, 1783. Also under the same date the right of Jacob Hemenway to Asa Hemenway, yeoman. Also others of the rights to Vashni Hemenway and to Daniel Rand, gentlemen of Cheshire, State of New Hampshire.


The following is the form of the deeds: "Know all men by these presents, that I, Daniel Hemenway of Shrewsbury, in the Commonwealth of Mass. Bay, house right, for and in consideration of the sum six pounds, lawful money, to me in hand paid, before the delivery hereof, by Samuel Hemenway of Grafton, in the County and Commonwealth aforesaid, house right, the receipt whereof I acknowledge, have given, granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents, give, grant, bargain, alien, convey and confirm to him the said Samuel Hemenway, his heirs and assigns, all my right and claim to the right or share of land of which William Craford was the original grantee in the township of Bridport, County of Rutland, and State of Vermont," etc. The charter of the town of Bridport, given Oct. 9, 1761, contains sixty-four names as grantees, the name of Jacob, but not of Daniel, being among them. At a meeting of the proprietors of the towns of Bridport and Shoreham, duly warned and held in Clarendon, April 28, 1783, to choose officers, make arrangements for dividing the lands according to charter, for laying out roads, and devising means to pay for surveys, Daniel Hemenway was chosen treasurer, also chosen as one of a committee "to settle with proprietors their rights by survey and appraise improvements and to carry out matters according to charter."

Mrs. Bennett writes: "Great-grandfather must have owned land aside from those shares he bought of Col. Doolittle. were some of the acre lots west of our Common that he used to own. My grandfather's land, which he had given him by his father, was in Shoreham, and was sold to Aaron Lawrence since my remembrance. Also some of the acre lots in Shoreham were I think the one where old Doctor Needham used to live, on the north side of the Common was one of his formerly. There may be other records here of him, in some shape, but I have only looked in those of the very oldest books. My grandfather Silas Hemenway made arrangements with your grandfather (Samuel Hemenway) to make my mother's furniture. He made her loom, bedsteads, a chest with drawers, chairs, and a cute little round table. which stands on one standard with three scroll feet. has a joint so as to turn up aside of house, or, turned around, will fit in a corner. I have this table and think very much of it, as it was my mother's only table when she and father began housekeeping in February, 1793."

We add to this a record of the death of Truman T. Birchard, at his home in Shoreham, Vt., Nov. 11, 1880, after a severe and protracted illness. (See p. 52.)

Also, of the death of Mrs. Sally Hurd Chipman, at the home of her son, Silas W. Chipman, in Warsaw, Ind., Dec. 24, 1880, aged nearly 90. She was buried beside her husband in Shoreham, Vermont. (See p. 75.)
