We started off this year's season like a fired cannon ball by beating Carolina 21 to 14. At the end of the third quarter we led by 21 points, 14 of which were credited to Ken Trowbridge. Ken did a wonderful job of filling Dick Christy's shoes and the State fans loved it. But from here on out State had a rough time breaking into the winning column. We lost seven games this year but five of them were by only one touchdown. Unfortunately we made one or two mistakes in each game and it hurt. Handicaps were many during the year as we lost 12 of the 33 boys that we started with. Of the players who made the final game at South Carolina, 18 were sophomores. But next year these sophomores will have had game experience, so to our opponents we say—look out for State, we're going to have a winning season.

It may be 3 against 1 but it threw Carolina for a 7 yard loss.

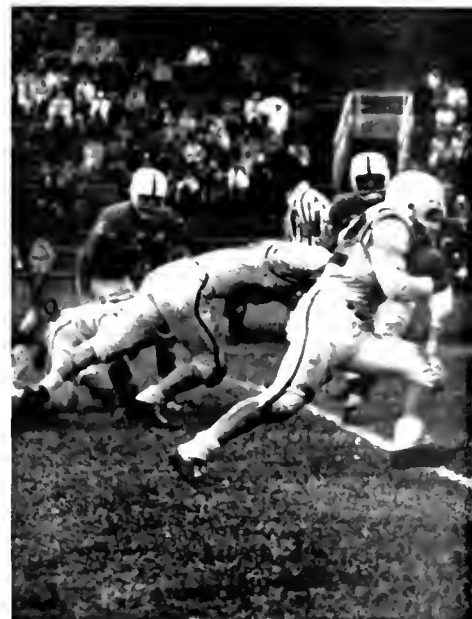


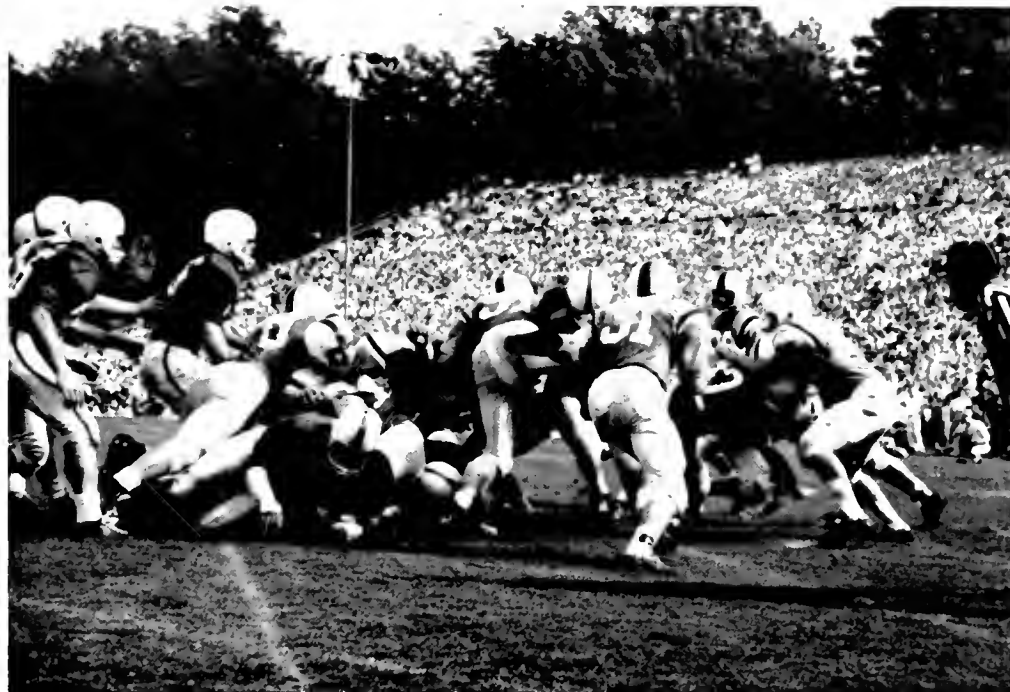
Frank Marocco made the key block to set State's Jim D'Antonio off for a 12 yard gain against Maryland.



State's bench strength was called upon more than usual this year and the boys did a good job. Even though we had a losing season we gained over 100 yards more than our opponents on the ground.

Bernie Latusick who averaged 30 yards per kickoff return made a diving catch of this pass to give us possession on the 15.





This play produced another touchdown for State bringing the score up to 21 to 0 against Carolina. It was Ron Podwika who took it over from the one yard line and giving State a victory 21 to 14.

V.P.I. couldn't stop Podwika on this play as he tore in for 13 yards. Final score—State 14, V.P.I. 14.



If one did not look at the final score he would think that State had a victorious season. Against many of our ten opponents we out ran, out passed, out kicked and in general out played them. We only lost by 40 points in the scoring battle, 160 to 120. We actually won the ground gaining race, compiling 1,746 yards against the opponents 1,634 yards. In kickoff returns we averaged 19.1 yards which was 5 yards over what our opponents averaged. We also led in punting, rushing per carry, and had less penalties and yards loss.

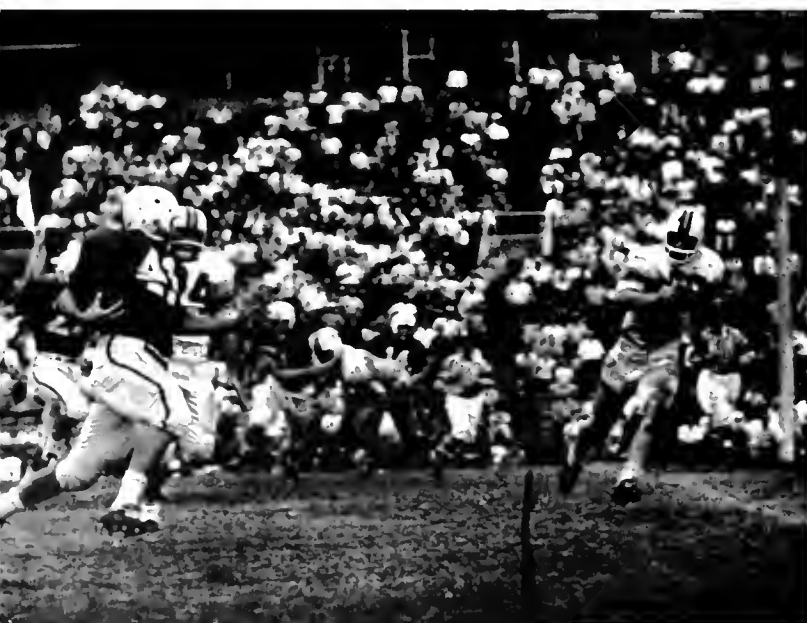
What hurt the most was our passing: we completed only 40 per cent of our passes for 692 yards while the foes hit 54 per cent for 1,058 yards. However, we threw seven touchdown passes while being scored on only six times in this manner. Yes—by the statistics North Carolina State should have had a winning season, but the scoreboard was just a little off balance. We had the men, we had the team, but the breaks just weren't with us.

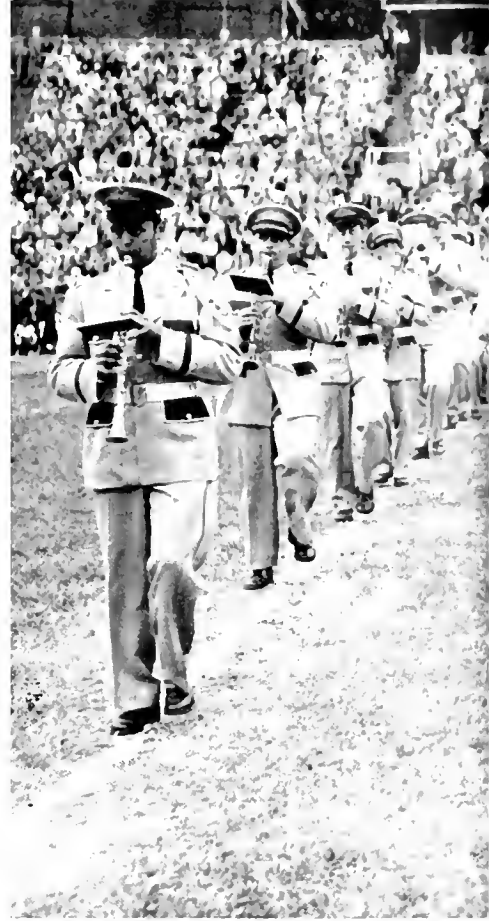


Our UNC friend seems happy but the score was 14-0 at this point. Oh well, maybe he was drunk!

Due to the loss of 12 of our starting 33 players many sophomores were able to obtain invaluable experience on the field this year. In the backfield Randy Harrell did some fine stepping for a sophomore averaging 3.3 yards per carry. Claude Gibson is also another sophomore who may be a threat in the conference next year. Not only is he a good runner but he caught 5 passes this year for an average of 30.2 yards gained per catch. Jim D'Antonio will also see action next year if he keeps up his pace. Jim averaged 4.1 yards per carry this year even though he saw limited action. As for weight in the line, we can't complain. Sophomore Dick Reynolds will probably be used to block up the hole at tackle with his 262 lbs. Dick isn't too fast but he sure can stop off-tackle plays.

So for the next couple of years State should remain a real threat to any team it plays. Coach Earl Edwards has done a wonderful job in adding North Carolina State to the Football Kingdom here in the South.

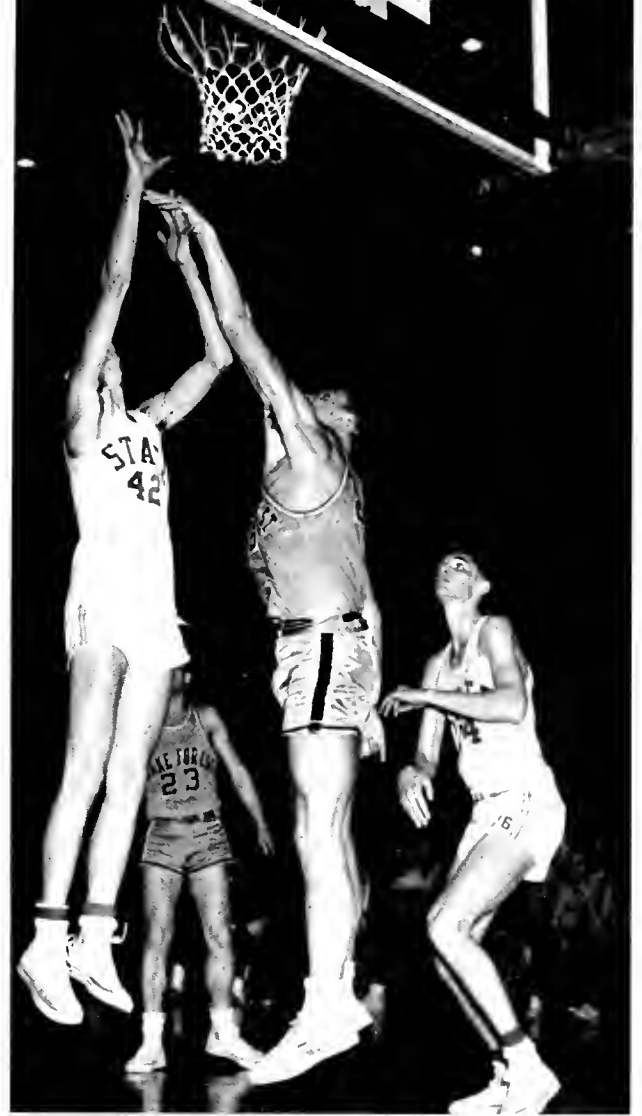

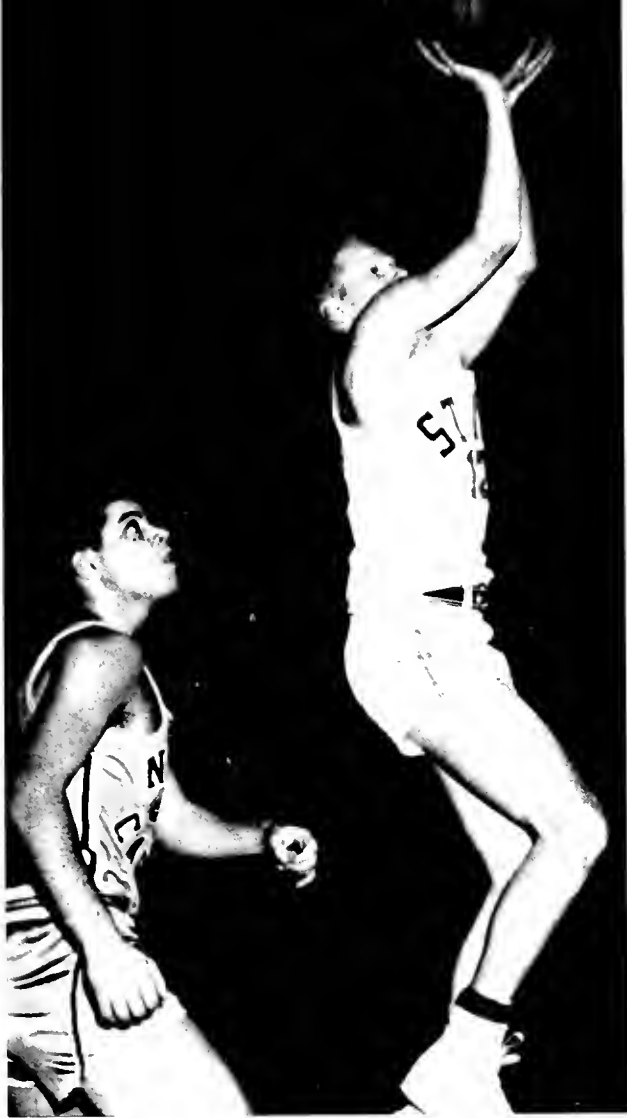

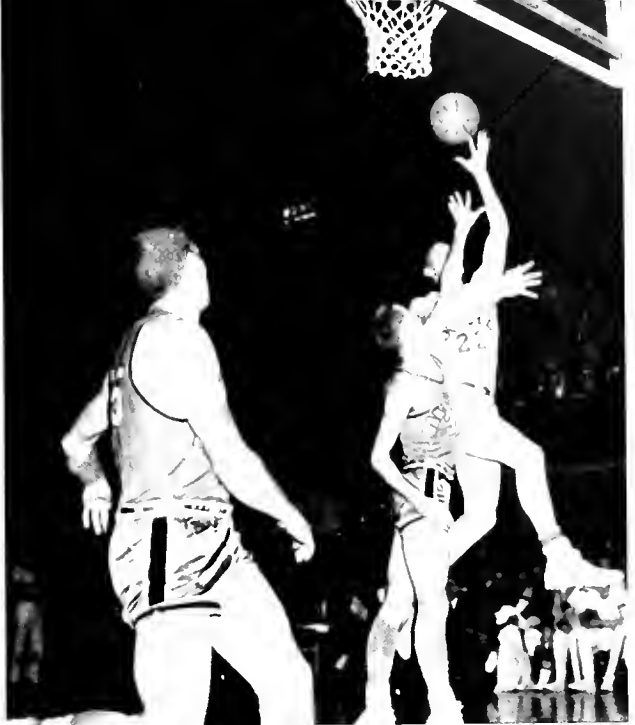

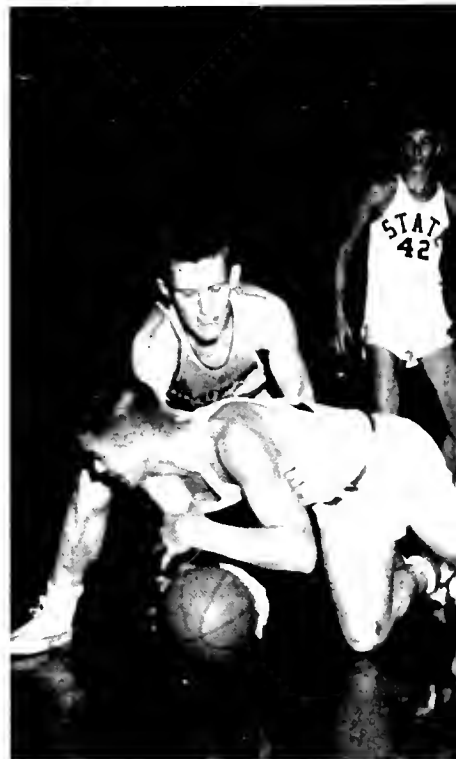

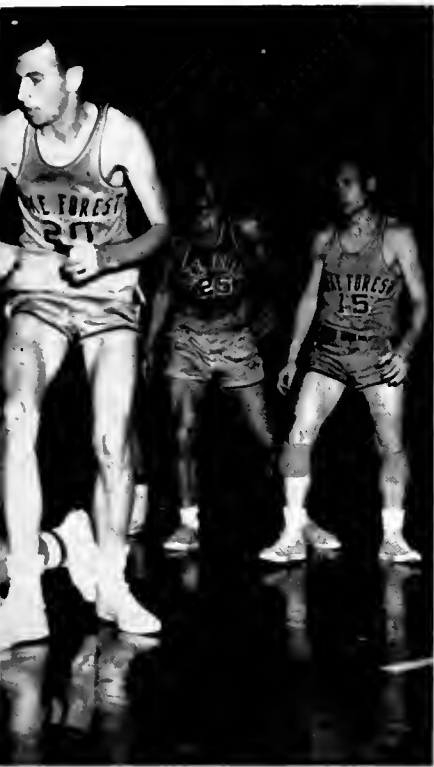

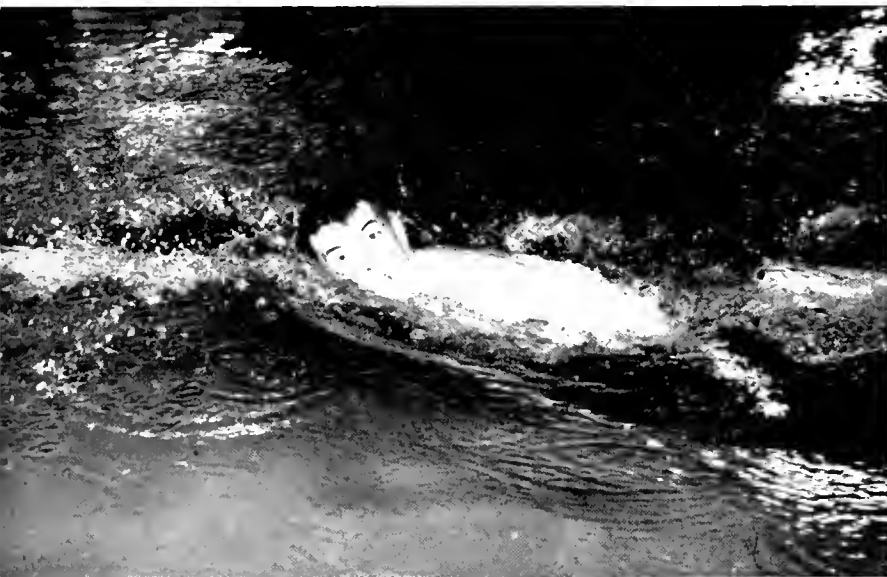

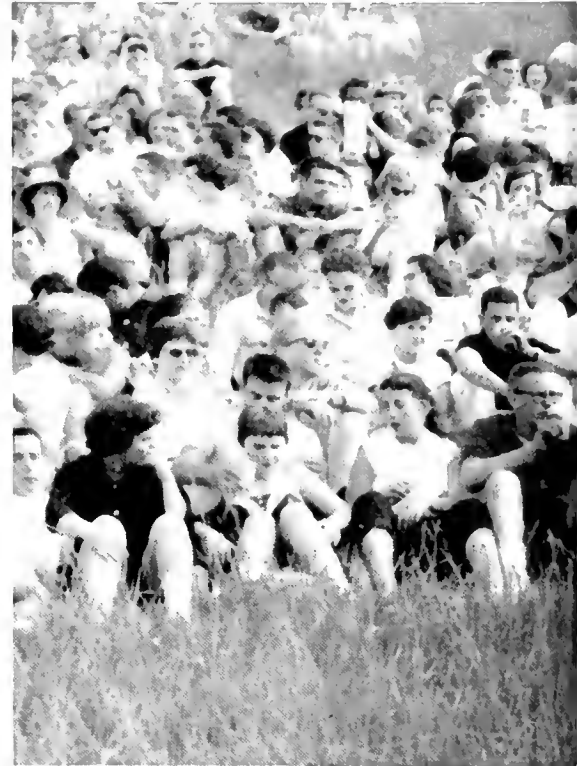


The winter goes and spring comes, with it comes the spring concert. It was a rousing day for the Greeks, for some it was too rousing.

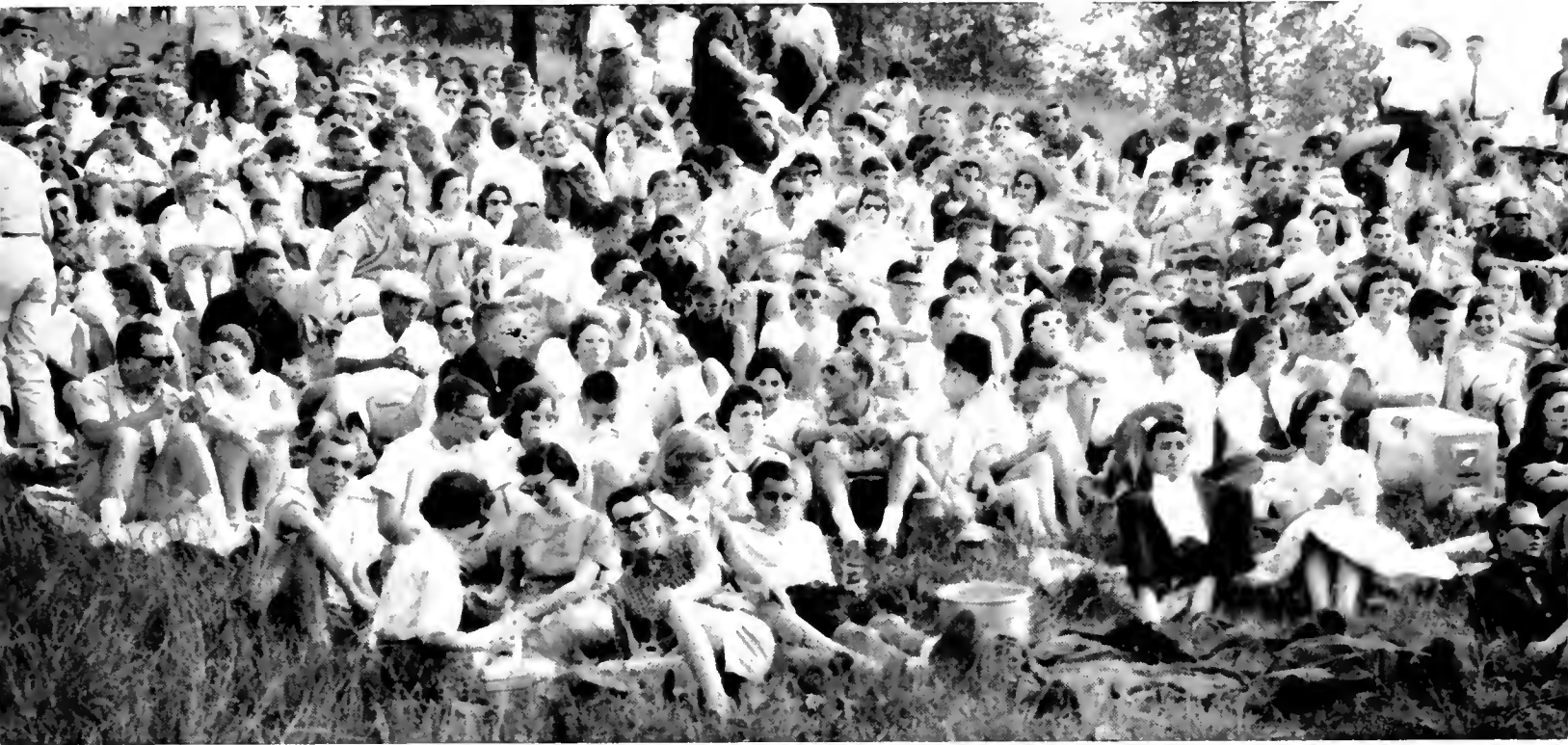

This year's Intramural program started with a bang. Football was won by Bagwell No. 1 and the "Kappa Sig's." Verville and the "Sig Ep's" won volleyball while the "K.A.'s" took golf. The track meet was the most successful that we have ever had. A record number of 283 participants made the track field look like Madison Square Garden. Turlington dormitory took first place along with the "Kappa Sig's" in the fraternity division. So far this year the "Sig Ep's" are way ahead with 613 points in the frat division with the "Kappa Sig's" in second with 462. In the dorm league Bagwell No. 1 is ahead with 403 points with Turlington in second with 369. Last year Becton No. 1 won as did the "Sigma Chi's."

Director Art Hoch has done a wonderful job in organizing the teams and encouraging participation. 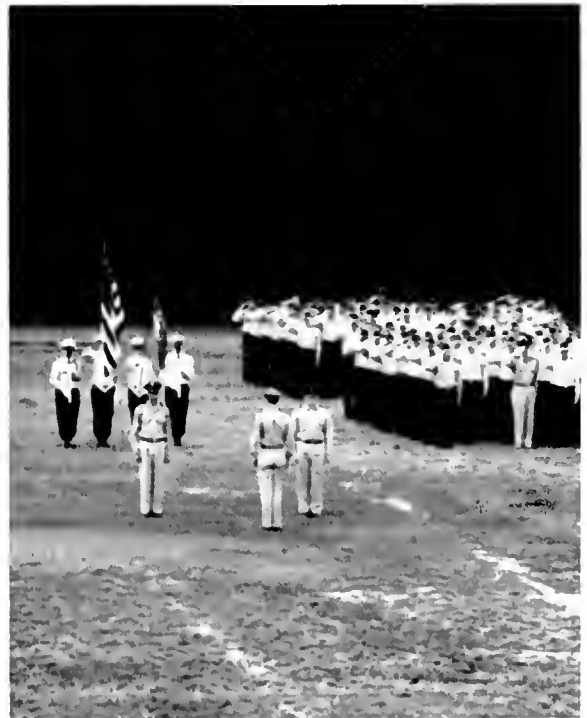

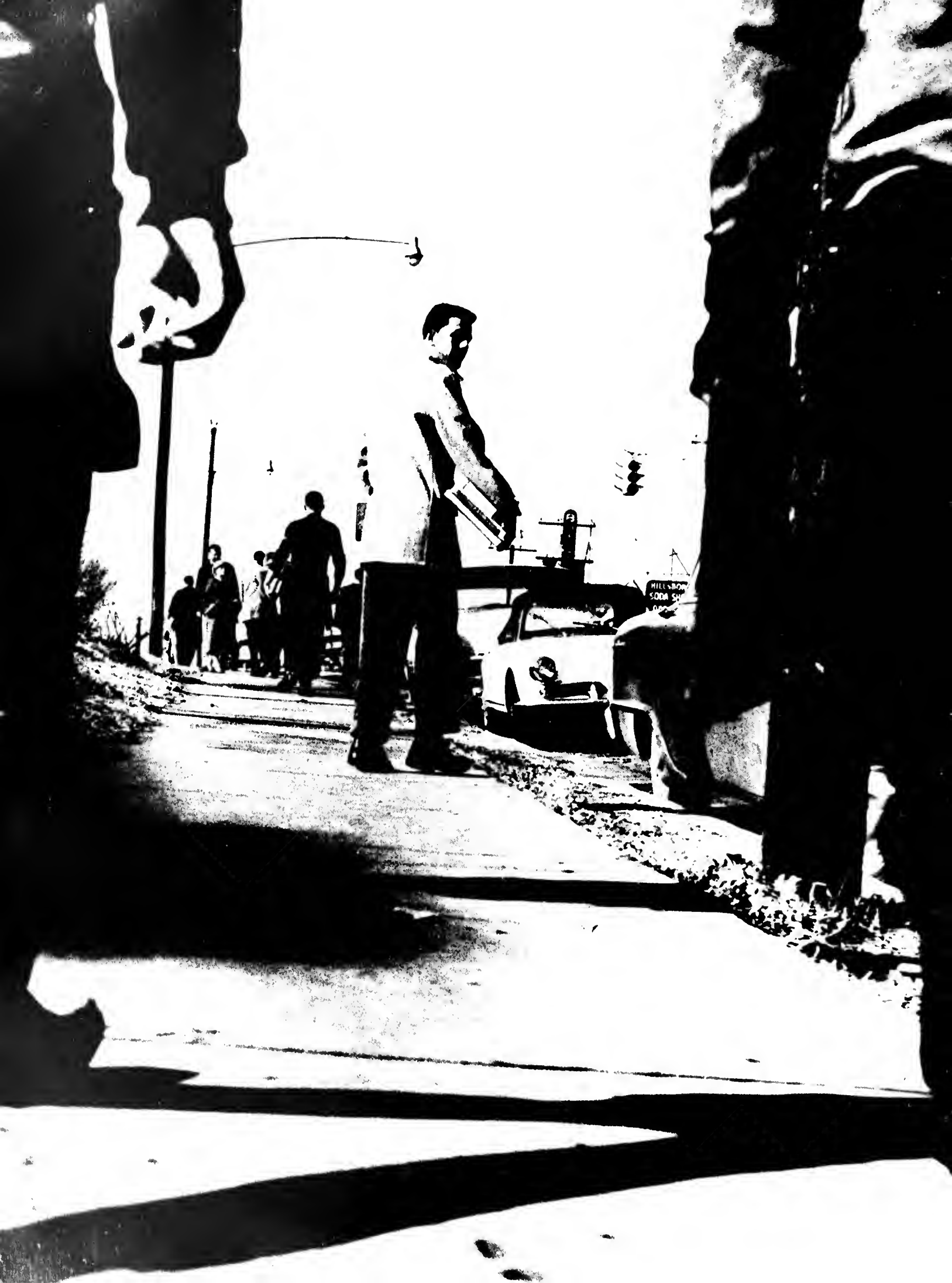

SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURE

More than one-third of the working force in this country is involved in agriculture in one way or another.

In North Carolina there are 1,100 wholesalers and 18,000 retailers handling agricultural products. More than 5,000 plants process and manufacture products derived from agricultural production. In all there are 900,000 persons working in agriculture and related industries. Many of these positions require well-trained men. The School of Agriculture is the only institution of its kind in the state offering such training.

Rising to this challenge the faculty of the School of Agriculture has developed a new concept in agricultural training.

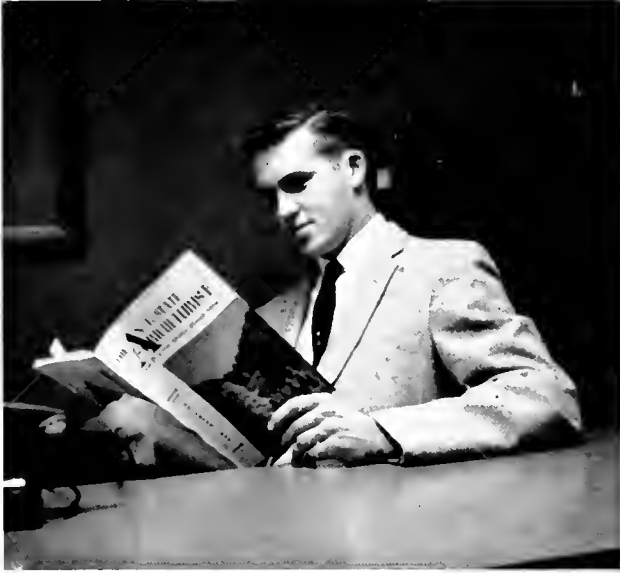
Three curricula—agricultural science, agricultural business, and agricultural technology—offer a variety of training to prepare the youth of our state for the thousands of jobs in agriculture and related fields.

The School of Agriculture also has two other important functions. Through agricultural research conducted on the campus and in 16 research stations scattered over the state, new information and techniques of production are developed. And through an Extension Service which has a small staff in each of the state's 100 counties, research information is supplied to the rural people of the state, and to industries closely associated with agriculture.

The agricultural field is full of challenge and change, but most of all it is filled with opportunity.

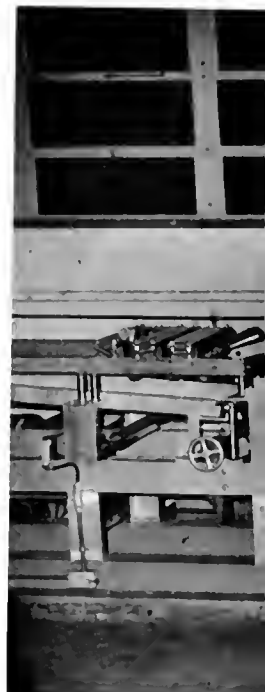


THE SCHOOL OF FORESTRY



To keep pace with the rapid development of forestry and the wood-using industries in the South, the School of Forestry has expanded its program and facilities. Undergraduate programs train students for careers in Forest Management, Wood Technology, Pulp and Paper Technology and Wood Products Merchandising. Graduate programs lead to the Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy degrees. The classrooms and laboratories in Kilgore Hall, the three permanent camps, and 80,000 acres of School Forests, the new Wood Products Laboratory, and the Robertson Laboratory of Pulp and Paper Technology provide exceptional facilities for education and research.

Since its beginning in 1929 the program in Forestry Education has been recognized by the Trustees as a regional program. This regional status is emphasized by the fact that this year students from twenty-four states and two foreign countries were enrolled, as well as by the unprecedented support being received by the School from the wood industries of the entire South. The rapid growth of the School necessitated departmentalization during the year with the establishment of the Department of Forest Management under the direction of Dr. T. E. Maki and the Department of Wood Products under the direction of Dr. J. S. Bethel.



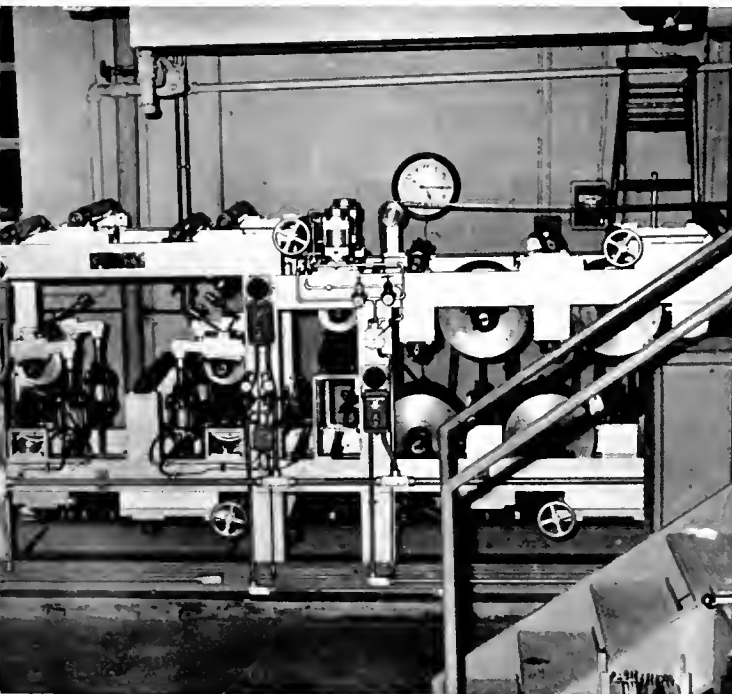

COLLEGE

The College Union is a building for the students. Containing the elements of a hotel, a restaurant, and a community center, it is open to all students sixteen hours a day.

The heart of the College Union, however, is not located in the steel and concrete of the building, but rather in the Union organization itself. The building is merely the instrument through which the Union idea is accomplished, and its success reflects the combined efforts of its Officers, Board of Chairmen, Committees and Board of Advisors.

The College Union Board of Directors puts the stamp of approval on the social budget and on the rules concerning the use of the Union Building. It also sets the College Union policy.

The Board of Chairmen consists of the student president, vice-president and secretary of the Union, and the Chairmen of the sixteen standing committees. The Board meets weekly. It critically analyzes all the programs of each committee and coordinates events that are sponsored jointly.

The Union Committee is a proving ground for initiative, dependability, loyalty, and tolerance. Since students graduating from college are often grade "A" technicians and grade "D" leaders, the Union's prime objective is to teach students to become effective leaders and citizens. Open to all students, the committee program is geared to teach them how to get along with other people and to organize events and ideas.

The Board of Advisors is composed of faculty and staff members who make themselves available to the committee for advice and guidance.

The scholastic courses on campus offer mastery of words, ideas, and principles—the usual concept of a college education. The Union, however, offers practical experience in understanding and working with people.

Professional educators in the physical education field have been concerned for some time over the lack of emphasis on activities that have lifetime value for all the people. Prominent among these are outdoor pur-

suits such as shooting, hunting, casting, fishing, and other outdoor activities which have significant implications for the conservation of human and natural resources.

Since February, 1958, N. C. State College has had its own Varsity Rifle Team. In the 1958 NRA National Intercollegiate Championships, and the National Indoor Championships, this team successfully represented N. C. State College. Today, the VARSITY RIFLE TEAM is recognized as being one of the best college rifle teams in the Southeast.

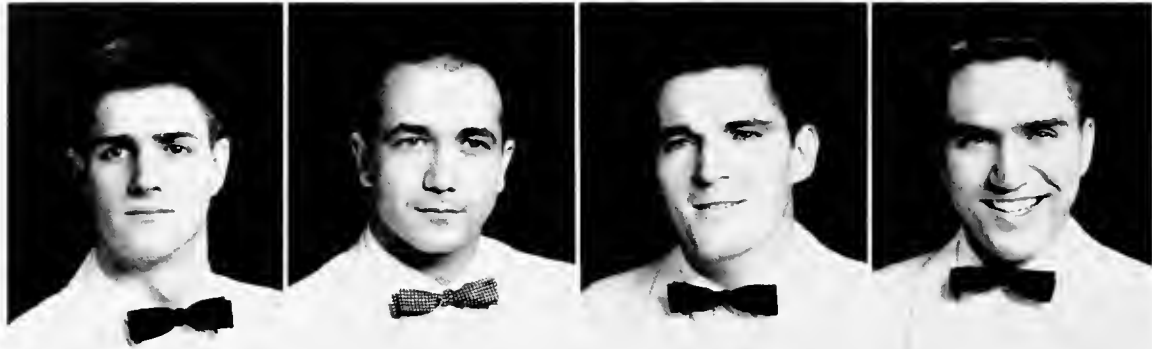

As the social feature of the college year, the Council sponsors two dances—the Pledge Dance in the fall semester and Spring Greeks.

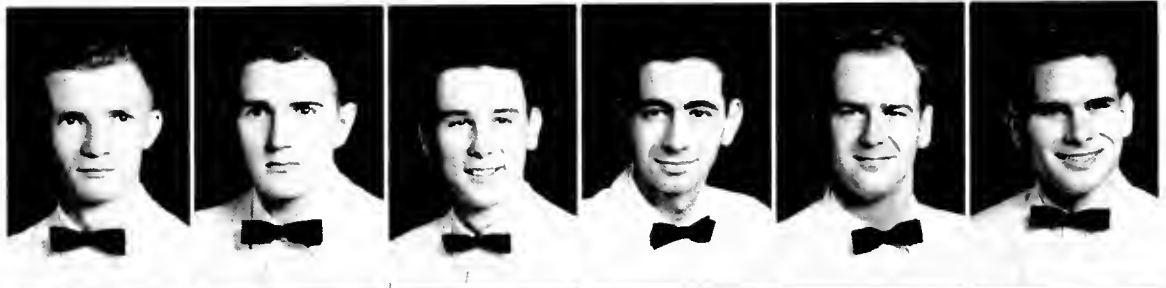

Seven men conceived the idea of FarmHouse at Missouri, having in mind the development of a social fraternity which would maintain high morals, develop outstanding leadership qualities, strive for high scholastic achievements and provide a home for worthy agricultural students while in college. With these definite objectives to reach, the motto, "Builder of Men," was adopted for the fraternity.

Since its beginning on the State College Campus in 1952, the organization has gained prestige through demonstrated ability in scholarship, leadership, intramurals, and joint fraternity functions.
