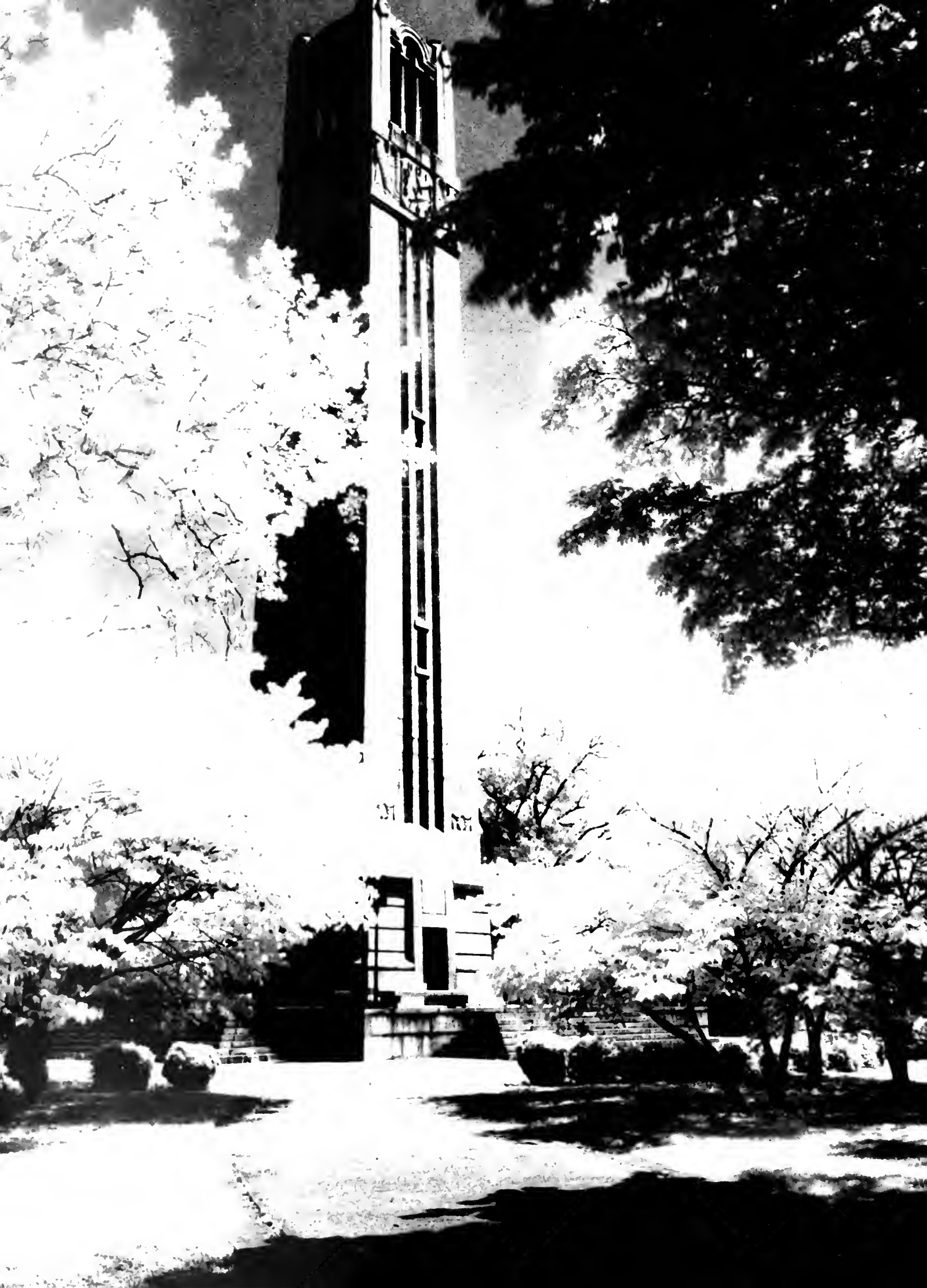

The questions below are considered to be general, and should be easily answered in a matter of four years. If you run into any difficulty, forget it.

MATH:

4. A 96 pound projectile is fired upward at a 60 degree angle and with an initial velocity of 3200 feet per second. How deep will the projectile sink into the ground if the last rain came on Tuesday of last month?
5. Mr. Bratwurst is driving his 3800 pound car 60 miles per hour or 88 feet per second when he hits a 5600 pound truck parked on the street. If the two coupled vehicles move 5.75 feet and stop in 2.48 seconds, was Mr. Bratwurst drinking?

Answer the ten questions intelligently by using the context of the abstract printed below. Use short answers only—save your lengthy discussion for the Social Studies Department.

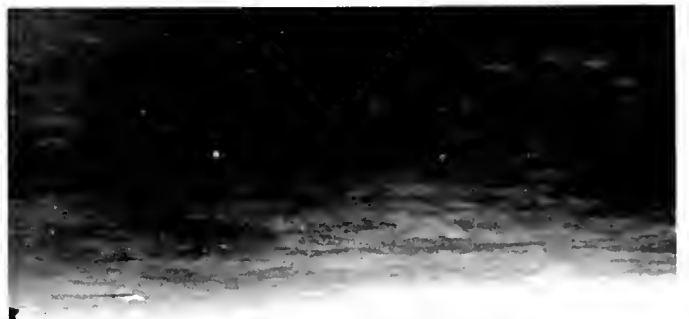
The School of Design is devoted and dedicated to the development of a native architecture and its accompanying art forms for the southern region.

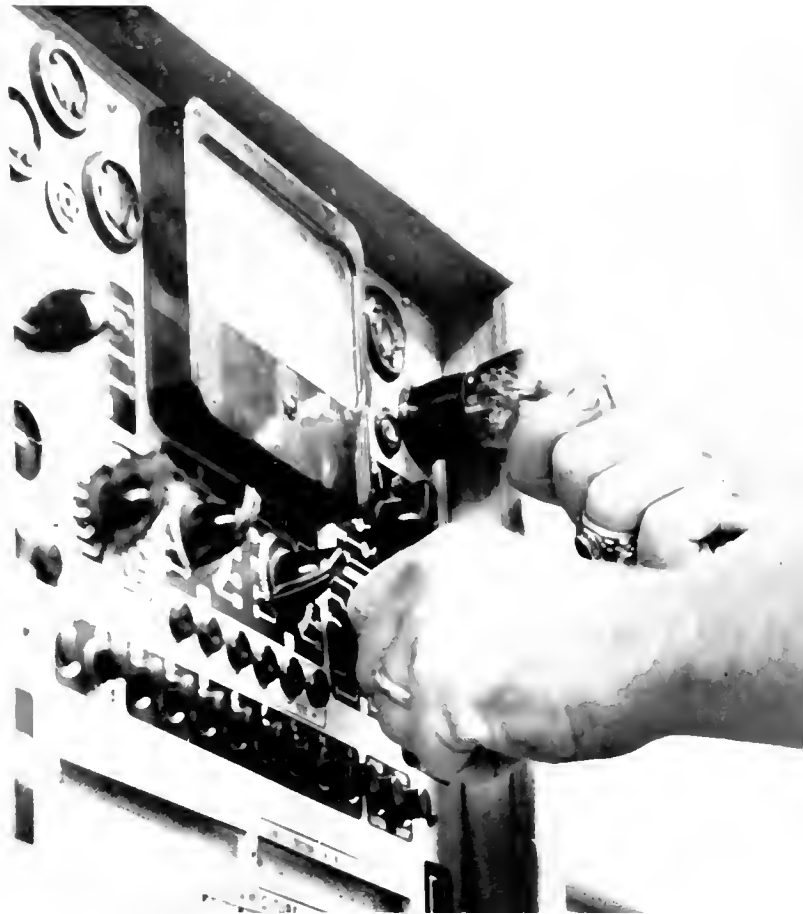


School of Education

Each year the Council sponsors the Engineer's Exposition. It is also responsible for directing the publication of the "Southern Engineer."

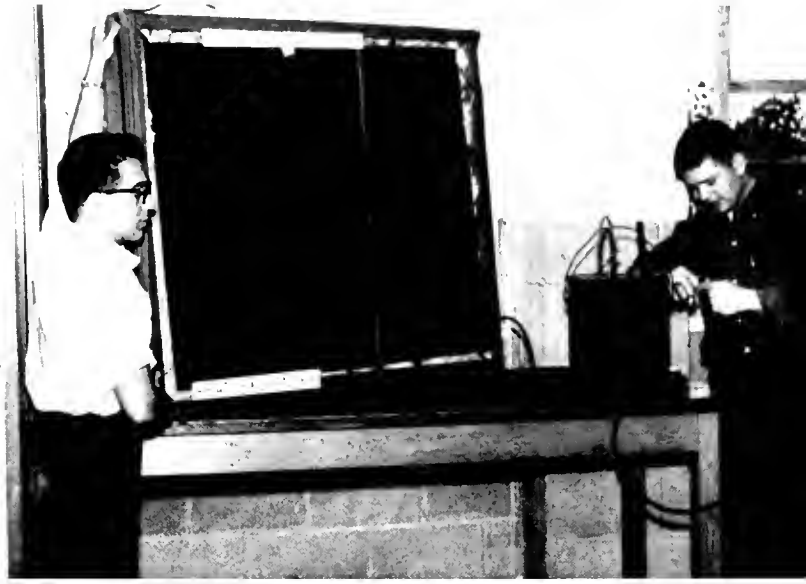

College Union

The College Union is a building for the students. Containing the elements of a hotel, a restaurant, and a community center, it is open to all students sixteen hours a day.

The heart of the College Union, however, is not located in the steel and concrete of the building, but rather in the Union organization itself. The building is merely the instrument through which the Union idea is accomplished, and its success reflects the combined efforts of its Officers, Board of Chairmen, Committees and Board of Advisors.

The College Union Board of Directors puts the stamp of approval on the social budget and on the rules concerning the use of the Union Building. It also sets the College Union policy.

The Board of Chairmen consists of the student president, vice-president and secretary of the Union, and the Chairmen of the sixteen standing committees. The Board meets weekly. It critically

analyzes all the programs of each committee and coordinates events that are sponsored jointly.

The Union Committee is a proving ground for initiative, dependability, loyalty, and tolerance. Since students graduating from college are often grade "A" technicians and grade "D" leaders, the Union's prime objective is to teach students to become effective leaders and citizens. 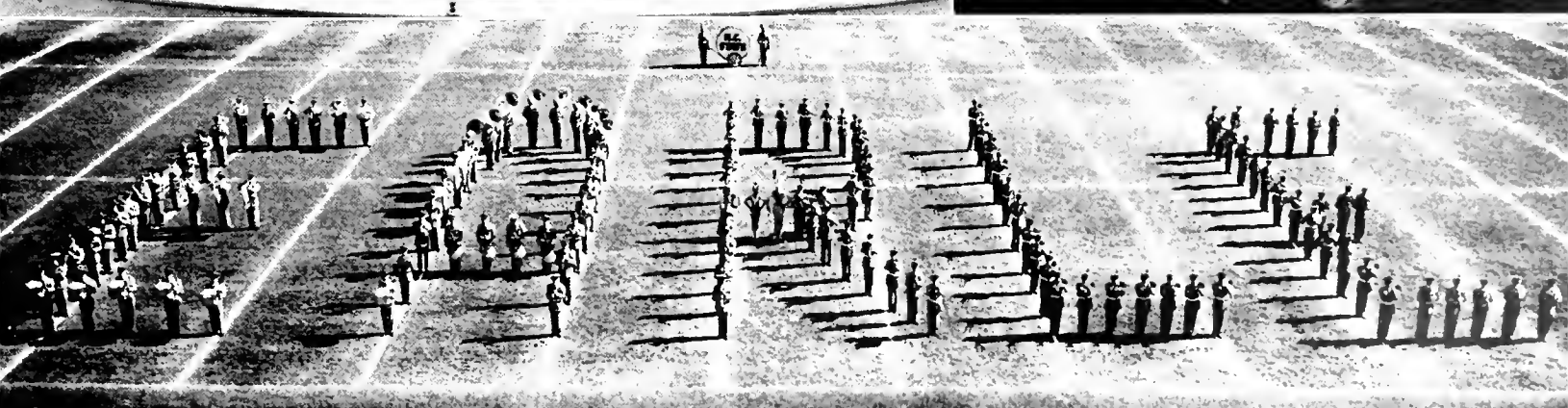
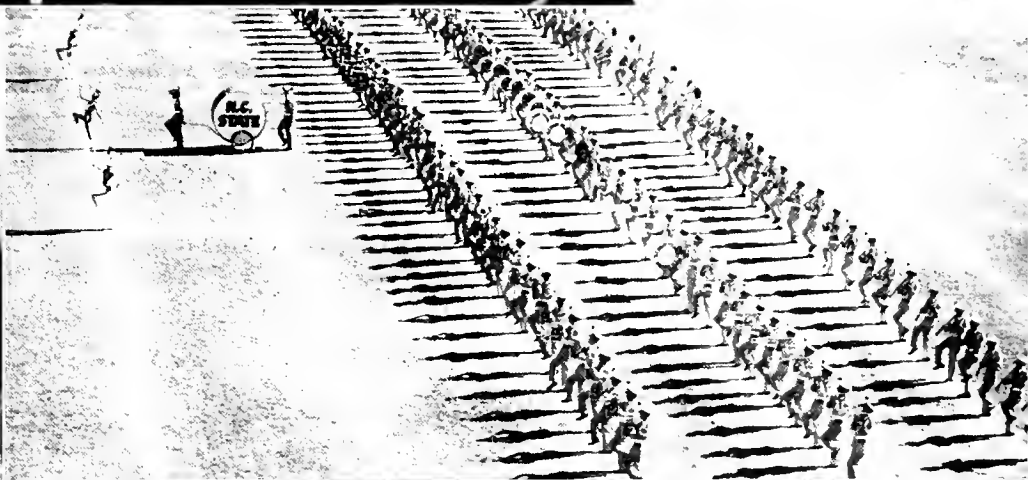
Since the early days of N. C. State College its musical organizations have played an important part in the life of the campus. These groups present concerts, furnish music for official college functions and perform at athletic events.

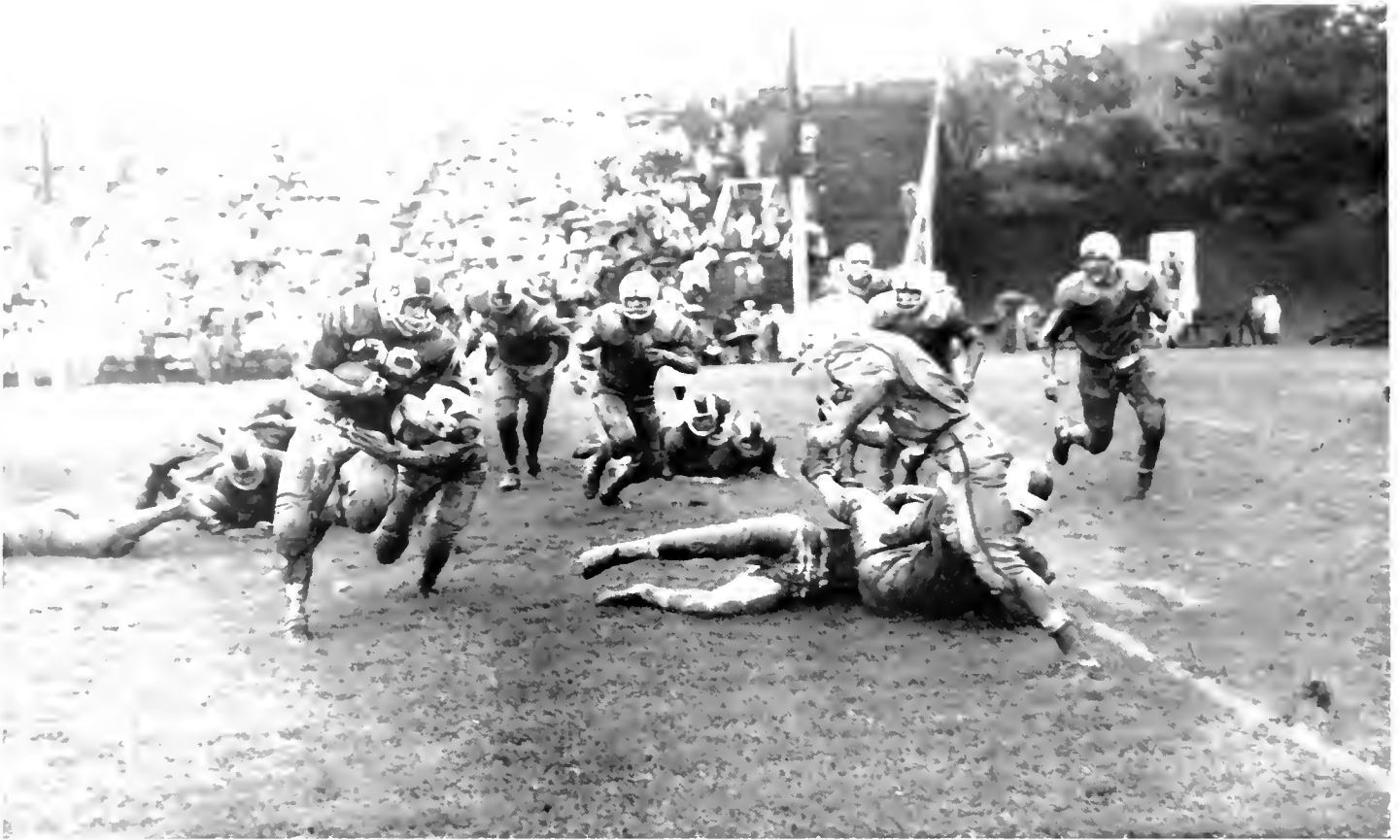

The Wolfpack played a fine brand of ball all season with the exception of two games. The Wolfpack could have been on the winning side of any game. The poor showing in the Wyoming game could possibly be attributed to the Wake Forest and Duke heartbreakers the two weeks previous. The Wolfpack had 148 first downs while holding its opponents to 122. State didn't receive any penalties in two games to show the clean brand of ball State played. State gained 1288 yards on passes and five touchdowns while its opponents netted 980 yards and ten touchdowns. In rushing the Wolfpack lost, gaining only 1116 yards to the opponents' 1582. Losing only seven players, Balonick, Minyard, Latusick, Podwiko, Nelson, Marocco, and Nye, through graduation means that the Wolfpack will be back next year fighting, even though the loss of these players will be great.

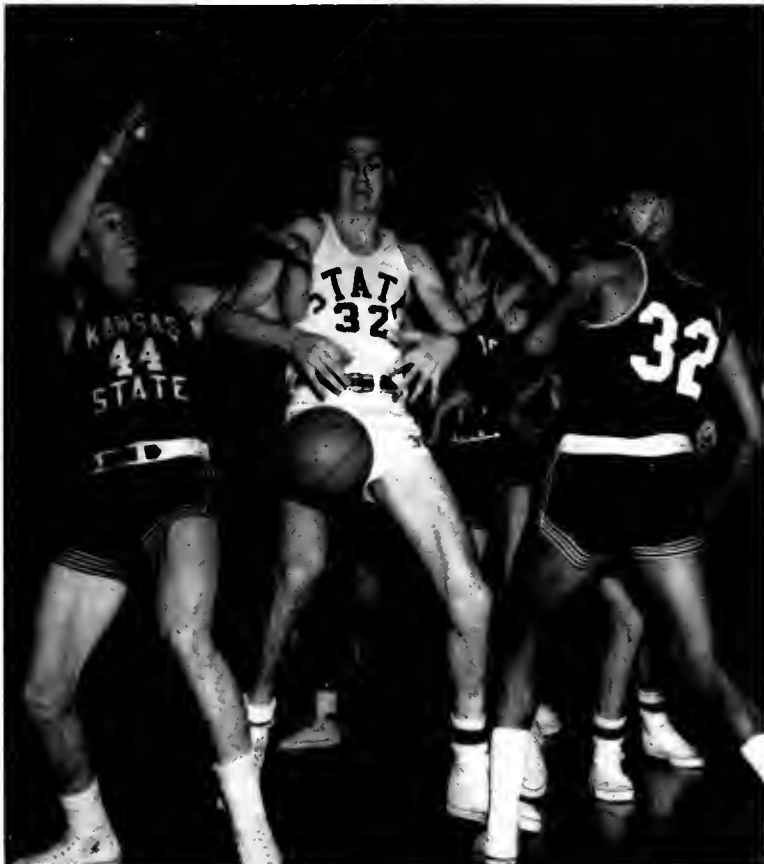

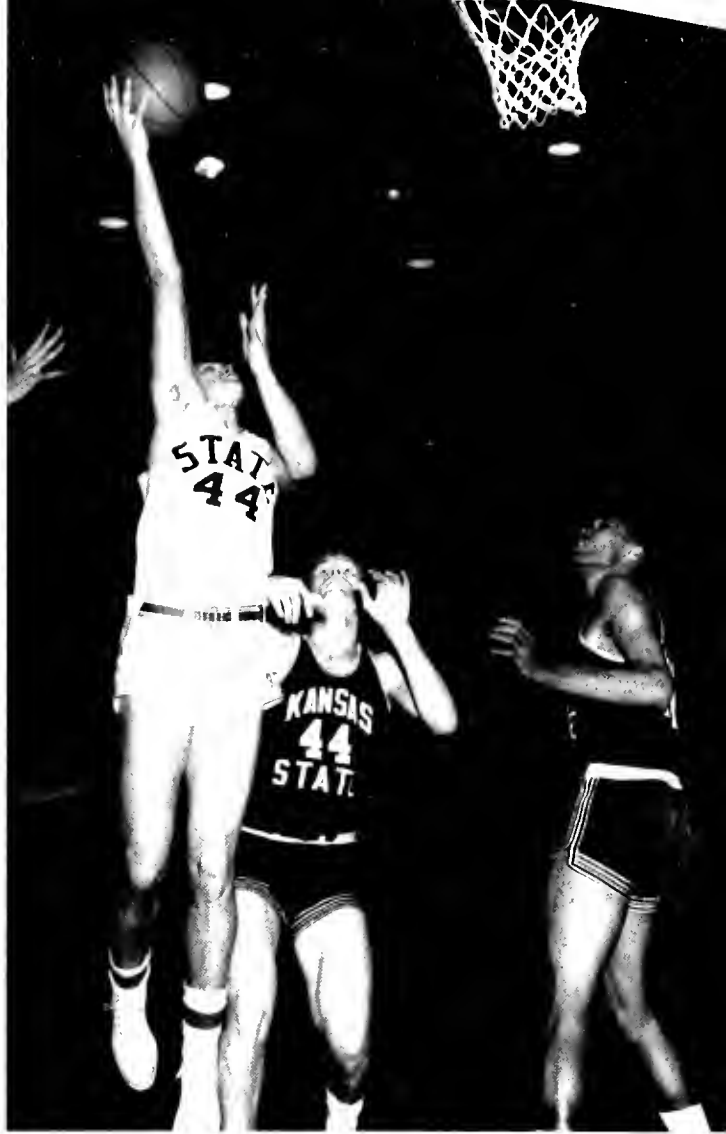

Interfraternity Council

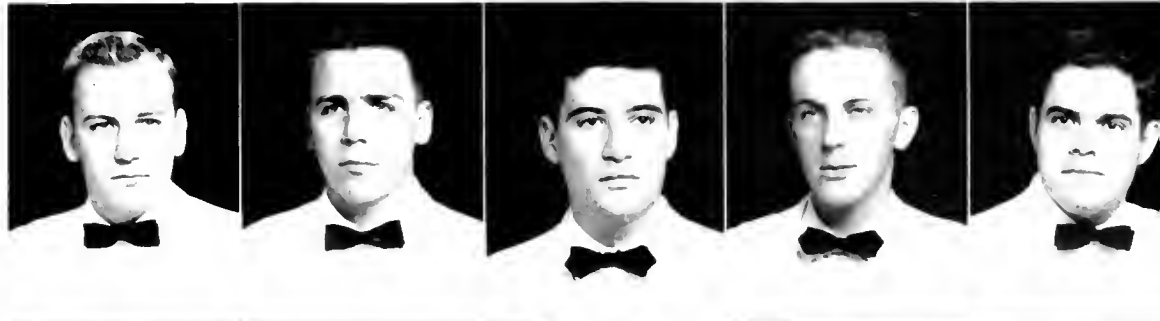
