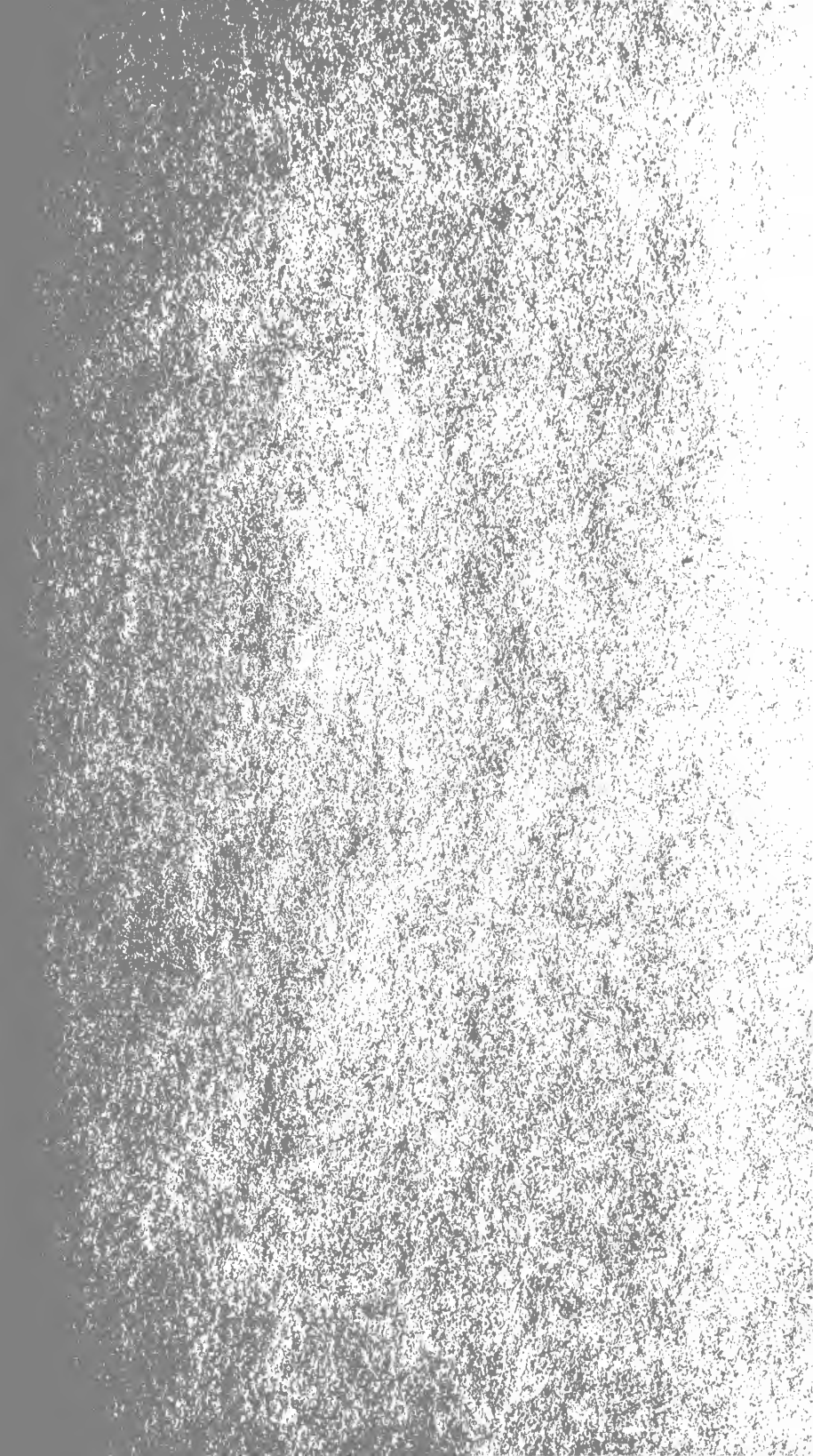

Proceedings of the Alabama Baptist State Convention.

Ninetieth Session.

GREENVILLE, ALA., JULY 19, 1911.

1. The Alabama Baptist State Convention met this day at 10 o'clock a. m., in the meeting house of the Baptist church in Greenville, Alabama., in its nintieth session.

2. W. M. Blackwelder read Phillippians 3, stressing "Prayer the Athleticiam of the Soul," and R. S. Gavin led in prayer.

3. R. E. Pettus, President, called the Convention to order, and delegates were enrolled as appears at the end of these proceedings. (See page 57).

4. Election of officers. On motion of Richard Hall, the rules were suspended and R. E. Pettus was unanimously re-elected president by acclamation.

On motion of W. J. E. Cox, H. S. D. Mallory was elected First Vice-President and W. W. Campbelle Second Vice-President.

On motion of A. J. Dickinson, the President cast the vote of the Convention for M. M. Wood for Secretary of the Convention.

5. R. S. Gavin presented to the Convention, in behalf of the First Baptist church, Huntsville, Alabama, of which he is, Pastor, a gavel, the head of which was made from the taproot of a walnut tree, which grew within a few feet of the meeting house of the Flint River Baptist Church, the first Baptist church organized on what is now Alabama soil, and the handle of which was made from a shittim wood tree, which grew in the vicinity of Huntsville, Alabama, which was gracefully accepted by the President.

6. Richard Hall presented the report of the Programme Committee. On motion, the programme for the first day was adopted, and the Committee continued with special instruction for the remainder of the session.

10. The Annual Report of the State Board of Missions was called for and read by W. B. Crumpton, its Corresponding Secretary, which was referred to a Committee consisting of C. J. Bentley, J. L. Jackson, and P. L. Mosely, as follows, viz: (see Item 53).

THE FORTIETH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE STATE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

In this, our fortieth report, we are able to make some comparisons which are most gratifying. We submit for publication with this report the receipts for Missions with the membership, so far as could be gathered, for each year of the forty-one of our history.

The figures for each ten years are as follows:

A study of these figures will show a steady increase in membership every year since the statistics have been kept with any degree of accuracy. The receipts for Missions were fluctuating until 1900, since which time, with only a few exceptions, they have increased each year.

While our growth in numbers and contributions is gratifying, our gifts are not commensurate with our growth in material resources. Mr. Edmonds, of the Manufacturers' Record, probably as fine statistician as our country knows, who is also a working member of a Baptist Church, said only a little while ago: "The South is increasing its wealth at the rate of *seven million dollars a day*, and twenty per cent of this wealth is coming into the hands of the Baptists." If this is so, what a mighty responsibility is coming upon the Baptists of Alabama, and all the South!

The contributions for this year include \$10,000 to each of the three Mission Boards from the estate of Brother J. C. Bush. We should endeavor to make an advance that will more than make up for the \$30,000 bequests, so that there may be no falling back another year. The Committee on Co-operation in its suggestions, have gone upon this idea. If an all-pervading ambition could dominate the preachers and churches to do something heroic, we would fix the figures at \$100,000 for Missions, as suggested by the Committee. \$25,000 for Home Missions, which is the amount apportioned by the Southern Baptist Convention, and, \$3000 additional for chapel building; \$36,000 for Foreign Missions, the amount apportioned, and \$4,000 additional on the debt, with \$32,000 for State Missions. This would be something worthy of the great cause. We cannot afford to give one cent less than \$32,000 for State Missions. This would be almost double what we have given in either of the two last years; but the demand is upon us and we will be recreant to the great trust committed to us, unless we undertake it.

There are numbers of places along the railroads, to say nothing of the needs of the country, where the Baptists must take hold *vigorously or lose the ground*. Some of the points are in the midst of territory which is all our own now, but, unfortunately our people, on the ground, are undeveloped and do not see the importance of seizing the situation. The next winter will witness such a flood of new settlers in the State as we have never seen before. Aggressive work only, will hold what we have, and meet the new demands coming upon us. Now, with the finest crop that ever grew out of the ground, giving promise of such a harvest as we have never known, we should attempt great things for God, since we are expecting great things from His bountiful hand.

We began the year with a debt of \$3,900. It has continued with us, it is now \$5,275; a part of this, \$2,090, is due the Bible and Colportage Fund, so that we owe outside parties, including the Missionaries, \$3,184.

It is distressing to have to report a debt every year. It can be avoided; either by decreasing appropriations, or by the churches increasing contributions. The latter is the remedy we recommend to the Convention.

In 1909, the financial system suggested by the Board was formally adopted by the Convention and recommended to the churches. It has been in use for two years. Only a few of the large churches use it. Most of the town and village churches and many in the country, work it successfully.

It was to be expected that in the beginning, there would be a falling off in contributions because of the introduction of the new plan. That was true for the three Boards in 1910. But in 1911 we are in advance for all the Boards over 1910. There would have been a large advance, if the leading churches had earnestly taken hold of the plan from the start.

Pastors had as well face the situation now: the prize, or high pressure, collection, has gone out never to return. That the pastors are conscious of this, is shown by their reluctance and, in many instances, by their flat refusal to make appeals to their churches. It is the sign of the dawning of sane Scriptural methods. But to give up the old and not introduce the new method means financial ruin to the churches and every denominational interest.

Experience and observation confirm us in the opinion that we should adhere to our financial scheme. The envelope system used with the wall cards

and every Member Book, if persisted in, will solve all the financial troubles from which our churches have been suffering.

The Sunday School Board, Nashville, Tenn., has helped us generously in our work, giving \$500 to the support of our State Superintendent, and \$152.00 worth of Bibles, which was another contribution to our Sunday School Department.

The Home Board, besides a generous appropriation to our general work, made liberal provision to the expense of the office. Besides this, it takes care of four Mountain Schools, aids the Swedish Church in Baldwin County, and helps liberally on church building in Alabama.

The Foreign Board provided generously its share of the expenses of prosecuting the campaign of Education in Alabama.

We are spending much for postage, printing, and extra clerk hire, in the effort to reach our people by every agency possible. The Rural Mail Delivery is a great blessing, making it easier to reach more people in their homes; this we are doing by circular letters, tracts and books.

Brother W. J. Ray, after several years of successful evangelistic work, resigned to take work in Texas. Brother Curtis S. Shugart is the only man we have employed now in the State work. He has met with gratifying success thus far. Brother A. A. Walker, a very efficient evangelist, we have employed in the Birmingham Association.

The choice of H. L. Strickland, as State Sunday School Superintendent, we regard as most fortunate. He is eminently fitted for the place. Having been a business man, he knows men and easily fits into the public life he has to lead and his long experience as Superintendent of a large, up-to-date, Sunday School, eminently fits him for the training work our teachers so much need. We append herewith his report. The Sunday School Department could be entirely supported by the Sunday Schools, if the pastors would keep it before the Superintendents and Teachers. This they should do, not only to support the work, but to train the pupils in the grace of giving.

We have done little with the Colportage this year. Our fund is too small on which to operate successfully. The churches do well to make contributions to this cause in regular order. If the large churches would take hold of it and do as well, in proportion, as the small ones, we would soon have something in hand with which to work.

We received from the estate of Brother J. C. Bush, a check for the \$10,000 to be used as endowment. The following action was taken by the Board:

"First:—That for the present, the money be lent out, to be secured by first mortgage on real estate. That the interest be accumulated and held as part of the Endowment Fund, the last recommendation being made in view of a possible investment of the fund in a Home for the Board.

"Second:—That the lending of said money and the management thereof, be placed in the hands of G. G. Miles, Geo. W. Ellis, L. Lasseter and W. B. Davidson, one of whom shall be made Treasurer to be named by the Board."

G. G. Miles was made Treasurer.

The Committee reports, that the money was loaned for a term of years on the best security, at eight per cent interest, the interest and \$1,000 of the principal to be paid each year.

Doubtless there are many persons who would remember their Lord in their wills, if they only knew how to frame the paper. We therefore, recommend a simple form to be printed on one page of the minutes, from year to year. We urge the pastors to call the attention of their people to it and encourage them to make bequests to worthy objects. If we are "*Only remembered by what we have done*," how comfortable it must be to the dying to feel that they have projected their lives into the centuries to come, by leaving some of the means God has given into their keeping, for the benefit of His Kingdom.

The Corresponding Secretary attended the great Baptist World's Alliance in Philadelphia. A movement was launched there, for the establishment of a Baptist Theological Seminary in Europe. Young men, called of God into the ministry, many of them from countries where the Baptists are cruelly persecuted greatly need such a school. The plan fallen upon, was for the English Baptists to furnish the site and the Baptists from other parts of the world to erect the building. One hundred thousand dollars was the amount named. The effort is to raise this amount in three years. Our Secretary, very properly we think, pledged Alabama for one thousand dollars. It might be well for the Convention, in recognition of the great movement, to put its approval on the action of the Secretary.

The Woman's Missionary Union have had a record breaking year. They raised \$4,093 for State Mission, a considerable advance over last year, and \$18,000 for all purposes. They are pressing the work of organization all over the State. This is cause of thanksgiving for every interest fostered by the Convention, for through the Societies will flow a steady stream of information, enlightenment, and blessing into every section. We cannot praise too highly the modest, enthusiastic efforts of Miss Kathleen Mallory, the corresponding Secretary of the Union, and her assistant, Miss Mary Rhodes. Mrs. T. A. Hamilton, true and tried through years of service, has been diligent in institute work all over the State. Mrs. D. M. Malone's services are invaluable during the Associational period.

We are pained to chronicle the untimely death of one of our most consecrated preachers and missionaries, H. R. Schramm. He was at the time of his death doing missionary service at Warrior, Cory and Mine 13.

Brother George G. Miles, after twelve years of earnest service as President of the Board, surrendered the charge, much to the regret of every member of the Board.

Miss Maud Merritt, the efficient stenographer and bookkeeper of the office, after nine years of service, becomes Mrs. C. W. Johnston, and retires from her position. She was watchful of every interest of the Board, keeping up with every detail of the office, and was an invaluable helper. She retires with the confidence and good wishes of every member of the Board. Miss Alpha Tucker of Montgomery takes her place.

We continue aid in maintaining the Theological Department of the Selma University, colored. Brother S. T. Clanton, who has charge of that department has done a good work. He has the confidence both of white and colored brethren who know him. He has given instruction to sixty-six preachers, some of them pastors, besides conducting a correspondence course for those who could not attend the school.

The terms of the following brethren expire this year and their places are to be filled at this Session: W. J. E. Cox, W. J. Elliott, W. M. Anderson, H. M. Anderson, H. S. D. Mallory, G. G. Miles, R. E. Pettus and Chas. A. Stakeley. Besides these, the place of S. H. Campbell, removed from the State, whose time expires in 1912, needs to be filled.

We submit with this a summary of the work done by the Missionaries and the Financial Statement.

REPORT OF EDUCATIONAL COMMISSION.

The Educational Commission was appointed by this Convention at its meeting in July, 1910. We had meeting after meeting in our efforts to organize and start the work, but were unable to secure the services of a Secretary until Febuary, 1911, at which time we secured the services of Dr. W. J. E. Cox, who began work on the 15th of Febuary, since which time he has worked hard and faithfully, covering a great deal of territory and overcoming many obstacles. We believe now that the work is well under way, and that with the co-operation of the pastors which we must earnestly seek, success awaits the work. Our Treasurer's Report will show receipts of \$8,035.11, with disbursements of \$5,878.91, leaving a balance cash on hand, \$2,156.20. We trust that this is encouraging to you, considering the fact that it represents only five months work, during the most unfavorable season of the year.

Believing that this Convention should know just what the Baptists of the State have done altogether during the year for denominational education, we are submitting some facts obtained by our Secretary, in addition to what is shown in our Treasurer's Report.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF HOWARD COLLEGE.

To the Alabama State Convention,
Dear Brethren:

On behalf of the Board of Trustees of Howard College, allow me to present the following report for the academic year 1910-1911.

In attendance, the year was fairly prosperous, 170 students being enrolled. In work accomplished, the session was very successful.

Of the total number 57 were students for the ministry, who paid no tuition, twelve were sons of ministers, who paid half tuition charge. Thus there were 69 students who, except for the payment of certain very small fees, contributed nothing in money to the support of the College.

In other words about 40% of the student body were practically non paying.

This fact, with the conditions existing at the last meeting of our Convention, when the creation of the Alabama Baptist Educational Commission made it inexpedient to appeal for financial help for Howard College, led to the incurring of some debt, small when we consider on the one hand the very large amount of free tuition which the College gives, and on the other the vast improvement in the teaching force, an improvement not excelled in any college in the South. You can not have the best for nothing, or next to nothing; and the Baptists must have the best, as in doctrine, so in education.

The contributions of our people will take care of this debt, and moreover the Board of Trustees passed an order at their last session on May 26th, that the President of the College with the co-operation of the faculty, should conduct the affairs of the College within the limitation of our income. We now have an interest bearing income from an endowment of approximately \$80,000.00.

Without impairing the efficiency of the work, the President of the College, acting under the instructions of the Board, has reduced the Faculty Budget of the coming session by \$1,600.00.

It affords me pleasure to report that, maintaining the record of other years, the graduates of our College have in the very recent past, attained high positions in the leading universities of the East and South.—Harvard, Cornell, Columbia, Johns Hopkins, Tulane and others, thus adding much to the reputation of the School; while the representative of our College at Oxford University, England, said by the Presidents of our State Colleges to be the best Alabama student ever sent there by the Cecil Rhoades Commission of this State. A recent number of the "Alabama Baptist" gives to Howard College the credit for his success in this oldest of English Universities.

Our College, with the University of Alabama, has led in the establishment of the Alabama Association of Colleges and in the standardizing of colleges in this State. To this association is due the introduction in Alabama of what is known as the Carnegie System of Units, which is simply raising the standard of Southern Colleges to the rank of the Eastern and Northern institutions of learning.

The President of our College has since the close of last session been closely occupied in canvassing for students, in furtherance of this work, in the establishment, in various cities and towns of Howard College Clubs, the purpose of which is to induce young men to attend the college. Other members of the faculty will now take part in this canvass, and thus we hope to have next session, the largest enrollment in the history of the College.

We earnestly invoke your support in the continued development of our old and honored College. While we hope for the loyalty of our people, and in a sense have a right to expect it, we ask your patronage on the ground of merit, of thorough preparation, to give your sons the best in education.

13. The Report of the Trustees of Judson College was read as follows, by R. G. Patrick, President of the College. viz (see Item 32).

REPORT OF JUDSON COLLEGE TRUSTEES.

It gives us pleasure to report that Judson College has had in many respects one of the most satisfactory years in her history. The enrollment for the year was 240 students. Thirty-eight teachers and officers were employed, and the work of the session, considered from the standpoint of scholarship, and all the elements of strength, including the high attainments of the students in their classes, their beautiful deportment, and their zealous attention to religious duties, was the very best in the history of the school. The attendance fell

short of the last year by thirty-four, but when it is remembered that the courses of study were raised to the "A" college basis, fourteen units being required for entrance to the Freshman Class, the attendance of students was far in advance of what was expected. Thirty-one diplomas were issued at the Commencement in May.

Religious Life.

The usual large contributions were made by the religious societies to missions and other objects fostered by our Convention. More than sixty diplomas were issued in the International and the Baptist Sunday School Board Teachers' Training Courses. This in connection with the splendid three year courses in Bible study offered as a part of the regular college course, under the instruction of Dr. Paul V. Bomar, has given the greatest satisfaction* It has been the purpose of the faculty and officers of the Institution to place the greatest emphasis on the religious work of Judson, and in every way to make it a strong Christian College. This work has been strengthened by the visits of a number of eminent Lecturers, prominent Pastors, Missionaries, and Missionary-workers, as well as representatives of the Home, Foreign, and State Mission Boards, and the Sunday School Board. All the great interests of the denomination, including the Missionary Training School, Woman's Missionary Union, the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary have had representatives to present these various causes, and to add the inspiration of their personality to the efforts of the regular college forces. The work has been a benediction to the Institution as a whole, and individual lives have been blessed as is attested by the number of students baptized.

Health.

The fine health record of the past few years has been fully maintained. During these years there has not been a single case of serious illness in the college.

Notable Additions and Improvements.

Much attention has been given to the improvement of the buildings' grounds and equipments of the Institution, and we are pleased to report that everything is in better condition than heretofore. Among the improvements may be mentioned the painting of the buildings, inside and out, and the laying of splendid cement walks to all parts of the grounds. A notable addition was made in putting in a filter.

In addition to the improvements made by the College, itself, we mention gratefully the great interest of the students in the up-building of the Institution, as manifested in the furnishing of the new Y. W. C. A. Hall, at a cost of about \$250.00. The Glee Club also donated its entire profits for the year, amounting to \$235.00 to the General Improvement Fund. The Alumnae Association has been at work and has raised more than \$250.00, which has been added to The Lydia Hornbuckle Memorial Fund. It is their purpose to complete that fund this summer, that they may have in College the coming session some worthy young girl, who will do credit to the memory of this noble woman, who gave so many years of service to her Alma Mater.

Bequests.

The year was made memorable by two generous bequests. In the report of last year, an announcement was made of the gift of the late J. Curtis Bush of \$10,000.00. During the year this amount has been paid into the Treasury of Judson, and has been invested in good securities, bearing eight per cent per annum. At the last meeting of the Board of Trustees, it was decided that this fund should be known as

"The J. Curtis Bush Chair of English."

It is proposed that this shall be the basis for an endowment for this great department, of the college.

"The M. Farnham Donation."

The late Judge G. R. Farnham, of Evergreen, Ala., left a bequest of \$5,000.00, which will be paid sometime during the present year, the interest of which is to be available for the education of indigent but worthy girls. According to the terms of the bequest, it is to be known as the "M. Farnham Donation," in memory of his wife who was a loyal and devoted Judson girl, a friend of the Institution throughout the years, and one whose life of beautiful service is appropriately commemorated by this gift.

It is hoped that others will imitate the example set by these two noble christian men.

It is highly gratifying to know that the hearts of our consecrated business men are turning to the great Institutions of our denomination, which have done so much for the furtherance of Christian education.

Financial Condition.

Throughout the years of the present administration, it has been unnecessary for the Institution to call upon the denomination at large for help in meeting the current expenses of the school. A large part of the money expended in the purchase of additional property, and the erection of new buildings has been paid out of the income of the school. These additions were made necessary by the growth of the school, and by the general progress being made in educational institutions all over the South. The needs of our other institutions being so great and their income proportionately small, it has been the policy of the Trustees to use all the resources within their power to provide for the enlargement and improvement of the Institution. These resources have proved inadequate to meet the growing demands, and in this way there has accumulated through the years a deficit. From a property valuation of \$75,000, fifteen years ago, the assets of the Institution are now appraised at about \$250,000. It is evident from the above showing that in spite of the deficit, splendid progress has been made in the increase of the assets of the Institution.

Reports have been made from time to time, directing the attention of the Convention to the imperative need of giving the Judson the right of way in making an appeal to the whole denomination to provide for necessary buildings and equipments. However, it has not been deemed possible at any of the meetings of the convention to grant this request.

The Institution needs and must have the support of the denomination very soon, or it will not be possible for it to make the advances necessary to maintain its leading position among the Institutions of the South.

Attention is called to the fact that the terms of the following Trustees expire in 1911: C. W. Ashcraft, S. V. Woodfin, W. W. Campbell and T. T. Daughdrill, and it will be necessary for the convention to fill these vacancies.

14. The following resolution submitted by W. B. Crumpton, President of the Trustees of the Healing Springs Industrial Academy, was referred to a committee consisting of J. D. Anderson, G. W. McRae, J. H. Creighton, W. A. Darden, C. E. Moreman, W. W. Lee and J. R. Keyton, viz (see Item 46).

HEALING SPRINGS INDUSTRIAL ACADEMY.

The Trustees failing to have a meeting before the Convention, we now report:

The session of 1910-1911 closed in May. We had something over sixty pupils enrolled.

The property is now being repaired, and we will open the next session October 2nd.

Rev. W. A. Darden has been secured as principal.

We regard the out-look as hopeful. No more healthy country can be found than that about Healing Springs.

As the lands, from which all the timber is now removed, is disposed of to white settlers, we will have a good patronage and hope to see the day when this school will take rank beside Newton and the very best of our secondary schools.

Resolved, That a committee be appointed to consider the advisability of the Educational Commission taking charge of the Baptist Collegiate Institute at Newton, Ala.

Also, to look into the condition of the Healing Springs Academy, and if it is deemed wise that important changes be made touching the future of the school, that the trustees be empowered to act.

That the report of the trustees be furnished the Secretary of the Convention, for publication in the minutes.

15. The Report of the Trustees of Newton Collegiate Institute was read by A. W. Tate, as follows, and the report was referred to the Committee appointed to consider the report of the Healing Springs School. (See Items 14 and 46).

REPORT OF THE NEWTON SCHOOL.

Thirteenth Session.

It gives me much pleasure to say that the past session of our school closed with a fair record, leaving no blots or blurs or misfortunes to mar its year's history. The health of both students and teachers has been remarkably good during the whole year. The enrollment from the town and community was a little off, compared with last year's enrollment, owing to the fact that Newton has a good public school. We had eighty students from the town and community, two hundred eight boarding students during the regular session and, counting the new students in the summer school as has been our custom, the total number enrolled is three hundred twenty.

All departments were well attended during the entire year and the grade of work the best we have ever done. There were fourteen young preachers with us, one hundred fifty young teachers and those preparing to teach, large classes in music, voice, expression and a fairly good class in Sunday school and Bible work. There were fifteen in the graduating class, four young women, and eleven men, three of whom are promising young preachers.

The session was marked by earnestness and good order on the part of the student body and by the success of our young teachers in passing the state examinations—facts which speak well for their training.

We are facing a serious trouble about a building. The old one is past repair and must be replaced by a new one, or the splendid school which has been built up with great sacrifice, must be seriously crippled. We put our case before the Convention and the Educational Commission. We have

assets in the shape of good subscriptions amounting to \$3,600.00. We need \$1,250.00, but we are not allowed to make a debt.

Rev. S. O. Y. Ray, after faithfully serving the school as agent one and one-half years voluntarily retires with the prayers and good wishes of every member of the Board. We ask the Convention for instructions as to the future.

The new Auditorium, a handsome two story brick structure, though not quite finished, is now in use. It cost about \$6,500.00 and is furnished with elegant hard wood seats. We owe a little balance of about \$500.00 on the Auditorium and need the money to pay it.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF AGED AND INFIRM MINISTERS FUND.

Resignation.

Mrs. Wilkinson for more than a year rendered a most unselfish, zealous and devoted service to this cause, planning and directing practically all of our work. Any success achieved has been chiefly due to her wise plans, and intelligent directions, and we desire to express our regret that she found it necessary to sever her connections with our board, and we desire to give assurance of our appreciation of her splendid work in this cause. May God bless her, and fully restore her to health and make her a blessing.

We secured as Mrs. Wilkinson's successor, Mrs. Annie H. Townsend, who has done a most faithful and efficient work.

It will be necessary to elect successors to the following Trustees whose terms expire this year, viz: G. M. Morrow, G. W. Macon, W. H. McElroy, and W. W. Campbell.

SECRETARY'S REPORT OF BOARD OF AGED AND INFIRM MINISTERS' RELIEF FUND.

It is with pleasure that the Board of Aged and Infirm Ministers' Relief Fund presents its second annual report to the Alabama State Convention.

With profound gratitude we acknowledge that God's blessing has rested on this work. As a grateful acknowledgement of faithful service, as an act of mercy and Christian kindness, this cause will make its own appeal to Christian hearts and Christian conscience.

Publishing Committee: G. W. Macon, W. J. E. Cox, H. J. Willingham.

It will be necessary for the Convention to elect four new members to the Board, to take the place of G. M. Morrow, G. W. Macon, W. M. McKelroy and W. W. Campbell, whose terms expire this year (1911).

Resume of Years Work.

There has been a universal awakening to the importance of this great work as a result of the work of the Board for Ministerial Relief, and it bids fair to be well taken care of in the future.

This work has been presented through our Associational Secretaries and Moderators, to our Associations, where it has met with favorable consideration, and to the Church individually, through a personal letter to each pastor, church clerk, Sunday school Superintendent and to each President of the Woman's Missionary Societies of our State, also to individuals interested in the work. The Secretary has sent out since November last, at which time she took charge as Secretary to the Board, letters numbering in all 4,100, and from a large portion of the letters, we have had liberal responses. The Board has followed the schedule adopted by the Convention, and on the 20th of each month the churches, according to the collection calendar, are notified that they are expected to contribute to this fund during the next month.

I would say that while there was an average of ten beneficiaries during the last Convention year, we have now seventeen regular beneficiaries on our list who receive monthly \$10.00 each, a total monthly expenditure of \$170.00 on beneficiaries alone. The Board has now on hand three other applications,

to be placed on the list as soon as the fund will justify. If all who deserve such recognition could be placed with these seventeen it would make a roll of honor the just pride of our denomination.

Not only do the old ministers, broken down in the service of the Master need help, but many of our younger men break down and are unable to take a much needed rest because they are not financially able to do so. We should take care of them.

Women's Missionary Unions Have Advanced the Cause.

The Woman's Board in Montgomery set aside the month of May as a special month for giving amongst the women to this noble cause, and the Board of Aged and Infirm Ministers' Relief Work sent out personal letters to each president of the W. M. U. Societies of the State, making a special appeal to them in behalf of these who have borne their share of our denominational work, and can now no longer sustain themselves, which met with marked success.

Funds Inadequate to the Need.

From the Treasurer's report you will note that we have fallen far behind the amount apportioned by the Convention for the annual current expenses of this Fund (from which our beneficiaries are paid). As a business proposition it is the duty of our people to care for the old "Soldiers of Zion". One of the wisest acts of the Convention was the recommendation, that we make a worthy provision for these. Can we hope that our progress will be "onward" while we ignore this sacred obligation? We believe that all Baptists are indebted to these, our Spiritual Fathers, and the obligation therefore rests on ALL, to contribute to their comfort, during their last years.

In Memoriam.

Three of our former beneficiaries—Rev. C. A. Owen, Cullman; Rev. W. C. Avant, Ansley; and Rev. L. M. Thomasson, Andalusia have been called to their deserved rest. It is with saddened hearts that we think of the very short time that is given us in which to help these who have ministered to us for more than half a century. Swiftly these old Soldiers of the Cross are passing to their reward. We realize that our great loss is their eternal gain.

Recommendations of the Board.

In closing this report, the Board begs that all of our churches will, this year contribute to this noble cause proportionate to their means, and ADEQUATE TO THE NEED. We are sorry to note that so many of our churches failed to make any contribution at all to this cause. It is not because they do not wish to help in this work, but merely because they do not stop to think. We especially commend this FUND to the thoughts and prayers of every church and Sunday School in the Convention.

Send all funds for Ministerial Relief to our Treasurer, Capt. R. F. Manly, Birmingham, Ala., as it gives to us more accurate and prompt information as to the exact sources from which our contributions come, if sent direct to our Treasurer.

17. The Report of the Board of Trustees of the Alabama Central Female Collage was read by H. B. Foster, as follows, viz:

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE CENTRAL COLLEGE.

In making this first formal report to the Convention it would be well to repeat in part a leaflet containing some facts that are well known to some of our people, and that ought to be recorded in the Minutes of this convention. It is worth while to note in what follows that the buildings as they now stand were not all erected by the State. This leaflet written by the President of the Board of Trustees is paraphrased by numbers as follows:

1. The building occupied by the Central College was once the Capitol of Alabama, built at a cost of \$180,000.00 and was afterwards given by the State to the University for educational purposes.

2. The University found the distance (more than a mile) so great that the building could not be used to advantage and so abandoned it to decay.

3. Later on several gentlemen proposed leasing it to carry on the work the University found itself unable to do. Glad to have the property cared for and to get the work done, the University leased it to these private parties for 99 years, with the privilege of renewing the lease at the end of that time. The consideration to be paid was the free tuition of five girls annually. The special grade or size of the school was not stipulated. This was strictly a private transaction with which no Baptist body had anything to do. The lease was of great value to the lessees and they had the legal and moral right to use it for private gain, but with rare generosity they dedicated it to the public good. So far from deriving profit, they expended much time, care and money to present to Tuscaloosa and to Alabama a great institution.

5. They secured a charter, raised \$50,000.00 in cash, put the building in thorough repair, thus saving it from decay, erected the four-story dormitory in the rear of the Capitol, added necessary equipment and opened a high grade college for women. They secured these gifts from the people at large to found the college the charter describes and thus what was legally a private concern became morally a public institution.

6. The Trustees of the College to whom its affairs were entrusted have never, do not now and can never receive any personal profit from the School. They give much of their time and no little of their money to maintain the great trust committed to them without any sort of return.

7. In operating the school the Trustees secure a first class Educator as President, require him to employ a high grade faculty, to put \$500.00 a year in repairs on the buildings, and to give free tuition to five girls. He gets the entire income of the college, pays the faculty and is responsible for all bills. It will be seen that the college itself has no income beyond this \$500.00 referred to and which is by contract spent on the buildings. It may be wise to change this method of conducting the school at the expiration of present contracts.

8. Its founders in dedicating their school to the public service stipulated that two thirds of the Trustees should always be Baptists. This is fixed by the charter. The Board of Trustees is self-perpetuating, but at the request of the college, the Alabama Baptist State Convention at the Andalusia meeting designated five men to serve on the Board, all of whom have been elected to the office. The relation between the Denomination and the College which was always close, was made by this act closer still. In view of these facts the Baptists of Alabama are giving the school their hearty co-operation.

It only remains to be added that the appeal made last year at Albertville for help to put the Buildings in repair met a hearty response. The pledges made there, the money raised in Tuscaloosa and the very valuable sympathy and financial help of the Educational Commission resulted in \$3,000.00 cash, which has all been put on and into the buildings. A limited amount of painting and plastering needs yet to be done, but it will require no great amount.

The college has no debts of any kind and has been for a number of years easily self supporting so far as its current expenses are concerned.

It has a full, strong faculty whose work with the necessarily limited number of the school is eminently satisfactory.

Last year there were fifty-five boarding, and thirty-five day pupils in the college and the prospects for another year's patronage and work are all that could be wished.

Next session will be the fifty fourth. Our people can hardly appreciate how little the school has cost them since our fathers spent the first \$50,000.00 to give it life. And just as little can they know the vast work it has done in this more than half century.

Mr. Tom Tart, one of the Trustees named by this Convention has resigned. It will be necessary at this meeting to name a man whom the Trustees can elect to fill his place.

18. The Report of the Board of Ministerial Education was read by W. M. Blackwelder, as follows, viz (see Item 31):

REPORT OF BOARD OF MINISTERIAL EDUCATION.

We are gratified to report that our Board is at the close of this year's work in better financial condition than for several years past. The young men assisted have been diligent in their studies and have shown themselves worthy of confidence and esteem.

The number of students from Alabama attending the seminary last session was 18. Attending Howard College 56. Newton Institute 14. We assisted one at University of Alabama. Making a total of 89.

Of this total, the number of beneficiaries of the Board was 47. The assistance rendered ranged in amounts from incidental fees to \$150.00

Each case of course being acted on according to its merits.

Though the collections from the churches was larger this year than for some years previous, still the amount was inadequate to meet the needs of the Board. Several young men were forced to leave college for lack of assistance. Others wanted to come and would have come, if we could have rendered them aid.

Most of these young men while pursuing their studies at Howard College and the Seminary have been engaged in useful christian work. Some doing pastoral work, others engaged in Sunday School and Mission work.

It will be of interest to record that more than a dozen have volunteered for the Foreign Mission fields. Thus it will be seen that this is in the highest sense Mission work.

We must lay emphasis upon the fact that adequate supply for the ministry includes not only *quantity* but *quality*. No one doubts the fact that many with but little preparation have rendered most valuable services in the Lord's cause, but the few who have made a great success with but incompetent preparation serve only to show the value of complete training.

There never has been a time, when there was such a demand for men thoroughly equipped for their work. It is no longer enough that a church have a pastor, but in order to be effective, he must be such as the church needs. The great increase in general education makes the decrease in the preparation of thoroughly educated men who are entering the ministry a subject that should engage our most earnest attention.

There is need that we lay upon the hearts of our young men that the thing best worth having in this world is *service*. That not in science, or law, or medicine, or in great achievements of the commercial world, can either the

greatest good or the greatest happiness be found, but that it can be obtained only by those willing to give all they are to save a lost world.

The Board urges the Churches to an increased and more liberal support to the cause of Ministerial Education.

The Board desires to thank Prof. J. A. Hendricks of Howard College for the very efficient service rendered in vbehalf of our work.

19. M. C. Reynolds read the Report of the Trustees of the Orphans Home as follows, viz (see Item 38):

**EIGHTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF LOUISE
SHORT BAPTIST WIDOWS’ AND ORPHANS’ HOME OF
ALABAMA.**

Covering the Conventional Year, July 1, 1910, to July 1, 1911.

To the Baptist State Convention: Dear Brethren:—

The eighteenth year of this institution has just closed and your board thinks substantial progress has been made. God’s blessing has been upon the work. The health of the children has been reasonably good; not a death has occurred among them for several years, a record of which we are justly proud.

Children in the Home.

A year ago we reported 87 children; since then we have received 14 and sent out 11 leaving the number at this time 90. Of this number 47 are boys and 43 girls. The ages of the children are as follows:

The number of admissions have not been so large as for the previous year but this is due no doubt to the more careful investigation we are making of applications. It is our earnest desire to receive all children that should be sent here, at the same time it is equally our duty to see that the Orphanage is not imposed upon.

We still find a disposition on the part of some of our people to place their children here "because we are better prepared to educate and train them than they are," but of course no children are received for these reasons: only homeless, dependent children are admitted. If admission were upon any other basis it would be impossible to care for the large number of children that would be immediately dumped upon us.

Religious Opportunities and Moral Training.

The children attend church, usually morning and evening. A Sunday School is conducted in our chapel every Sunday afternoon. In addition to this, devotional exercises are conducted by one of the officers each morning. A boys prayer-meeting, organized the past year, has been very helpful.

Higher ideals are being placed before the children and our earnest, consecrated workers of the past year have done much for us along this line. Fifteen children have been baptized and become members of the church since the last convention.

School Advantages.

A distinct advance has been made in this direction. Not only has the the work been well done in the school room, but much has been accomplished along the line of real industrial training. We feel now that both boys and girls are being better prepared to become useful members of society. While we are perhaps in advance of the most of our State orphanages in this work we are planning for further development along this line. This work has been specially interesting to visitors the past year who have greatly encouraged us by their commendation.

An attractive reading room has been provided, reasonably well supplied with books.

Repairs and Improvements.

While not so much has been expended as last year, still the large buildings are constantly needing repairs.

We have installed this year the laundry, bought additional machinery for the boy's industrial plant, a number of new sewing machines for the girl's sewing room. These and many minor repairs small as to cost yet aggregate a considerable sum.

The question of new roofing for several of our largest buildings will have to be provided for in the near future.

Death of Mrs. Woodson and Statement as to Her Property.

Two years ago your Board, feeling that it was a duty that they owed her, brought Mrs. Marie Louise Woodson to the Orphanage. Since that time she

has been under our care. Being greatly afflicted, it has been necessary to keep a special trained nurse constantly with her.

At the ripe age of 84 she passed away on May 26, 1911. In order that the institution might be in a measure reimbursed Mrs. Woodson placed us in possession of the property last July which she had deeded to the institution nearly twenty years ago (she reserving the rents during her lifetime.) The income from this property was very small on account of large repair bills (this property having come to us in very bad condition.) In addition, we had to pay the taxes and insurance.

We have now a good prospect of an income of something like \$1,200 from this property for the coming year.

Endowment Funds.

Your attention is especially called to a financial statement made in this report in connection with this fund.

It will be recalled that our late brother, Mr. J. C. Bush of Mobile, Ala., left us the sum of \$10,000.00 in cash and Mrs. Marie Louise Woodson gave us some real estate situated in Selma, Ala. In both cases it was clearly provided that only the income could be used. Up to this time we have had no return from either (the amount from Mrs. Woodson's property, \$327.24, being insufficient to reimburse us for her care the past year).

It is proposed to use the income from this fund for the specific purpose of providing industrial training for the children, repairing the buildings and making necessary improvements. We trust this will be the fixed policy of this institution and that this fund will never be used to meet the ordinary expense of support and education, believing that this should come to us, as it has in the past, from the churches, Sunday Schools, Womens Societies and individuals.

Financial Support.

There has been a falling off on the part of the larger churches during the past year; at the same time there has been an increase on the part of our Sunday Schools, as well as a very great increase sent in by the Womens' Societies. The total amount sent us is \$2,336.68, short of the receipts last year and in addition to this we have had the entire expense of clothing the children (this was formerly done by the Womens' Societies but at our suggestion they are now sending the money instead) naturally putting more work on our officers but the results have been very gratifying.

A study of the table that gives receipts by the month indicates that our people are not following very closely the calendar plan that was adopted by the Convention. Our money comes largely in the fall and we could make a better financial showing if this report could be made at that time.

The Orphanage no longer keeps a financial secretary in the field and we will, in the future, be even more dependent on the cooperation of our pastors, and Sunday School superintendents. The financial statement we are making at this time is necessarily longer than usual and we trust that it will be given careful study.

Our Needs.

Your Board has always believed that if the Orphanage work was well done that the Baptist of our State would gladly furnish the means for its support; still relying on this we face the new year with the desire to do better and more satisfactory work in the past profiting, as we should, by our experience.

Let it be understood that "Progress" is our watch-word. In addition to the improvements mentioned elsewhere in this report, we would be greatly pleased to have an artesian well. This matter was placed before our good women at their annual meeting held at Evergreen, last November and it seemed

to meet with their hearty approval. If some of our people could appreciate just what this improvement really would mean to us the money would be quickly forth coming.

Come to See Us.

We are always glad to have our brethren and sisters look over this work. It is not perfect but by your prayers, money and good advice we can still greatly improve it.

Come to see us, it is your work and you should know whether or not it is being well done.

REPORT OF STATISTICAL SECRETARY.

I succeeded in obtaining a copy of the minutes for 1910, of all the Associations except the Central Liberty.

From these minutes there has been prepared seventy-six tables of membership and contributions, and seventy-three Sunday School tables, in the preparation of which the Secretary received valuable aid from Mr. A. S. Barnes, Mobile, Ala. Statistical secretary of the Alabama Sunday School Association.

First Day—Evening Session.

27. The Convention reassembled at 8 o'clock p. m. and, after singing, reading the scriptures and prayer, with First Vice-President H. S. D. Mallory in the chair, the Report on Home Missions was called for and read by W. F. Yarborough, Chairman of the Committee, as follows, viz:

REPORT ON HOME MISSIONS.

Our Lord's program for world-wide evangelization contemplates Home Missions as a vital and fundamental factor in the execution of the task. This means that the home land is to be regarded as a force for missionary activity rather than as a goal of Missionary achievement. From this view point there is great significance in the statement of Dr. Harper, some years before his death that, "America is the world's greatest mission field, because of what it is and what it is to be." Providence plainly points to this land of ours as one of the mightiest agencies of the kingdom for the execution of the great commission. At the same time no prophet's vision is needed to show that the South must play an increasingly important part in America's mission as a world power. Our predominantly Anglo-Saxon civilization, our rapidly increasing material prosperity, our revival in political influence, and our loyalty to the principles of New Testament Christianity, all point to a new day in Southern leadership. The contest is on in the South between the forces that shall make or mar our civilization. The question is not yet settled whether God or mammon shall rule in the new order of things. If our people forget God, becoming base, sordid and godless, to what quarter shall our nation look for redemption, and if America fails where is the hope of the world's salvation

Our Home Board with a profound sense of its responsibility has set itself to the task with heroic endeavor. It is seeking to meet the demand for a practical demonstration of the saving power of the gospel in the home land by applying itself to the task in hand. As the exponent of applied Christianity it insists that the gospel is the only solution for the vexed problems which confront us. It realizes that the efficiency of our foreign mission propaganda depends in a large measure upon the type of Christianity we ourselves produce. At the same time it stands for world-wide missions and the fullest co-operation with every form of missionary activity fostered by our denomination. It is the unfaltering friend of all our mission Boards, and every true friend of missions must rejoice at the new era of prosperity that has come to the Board under the leadership of our statesman-secretary. Of course we realize that this prosperity would be impossible but for the faithful and untiring labors of others who stood nobly by the work in the day of small things. The lamented Tichenor, seer and statesman as he was, saw this day and was glad, though its light was just breaking as he left us. A comparative summary of the leading items of work reported in 1902, the year of his death and 1911, a period of nine years may be of interest:

Truly the Lord hath done great things for us whereof we are glad, but we feel that we are just on the threshold of still larger things. The great and growing West, the menace of the city problem, the peril of the incoming millions, the evangelization of the Negro, the appeal of hundreds of homeless churches, the unlimited possibilities of our mountain school work, all challenge our patriotism and our religion. The home mission task is assuming proportions that commend it as one of the highest forms of patriotism in which our people can engage. At the same time we can not neglect it with out being disloyal to the Captain of our salvation. The Home Board is easily one of the mightiest forces in the hands of Southern Baptists for the bringing in of the Kingdom.

Your committee would note with commendation the attitude of our Home Board and its representatives toward the complicated situation in New Mexico. True, the problem had a much larger significance than a mere home mission question, but, it was from the nature of the case, a question with which our Home Board had to deal, and, we feel assured that the Christian courtesy and loyalty to principle which characterized our representatives have contributed in a large measure to the prospective happy solution of the problem.

The Board in its last report at Jacksonville called attention to the permanence and thoroughness which now characterizes our home mission work. This is certainly gratifying, but possibly the item of greatest interest was the absence of a debt when debt seemed inevitable. This was due not to the fact that our people gave what they were asked to give, but to the fact that the Board began to retrench when it saw the tendency to fall back on the part of the givers. Such retrenchment is not always possible and in this case leaves the Board at the beginning of the new fiscal year, almost in the condition of having a debt, since payments must be made on appropriations, the conditions of which, have just been met together with other deferred payments which are now falling due. While there was a slight increase in total receipts over the preceding year, eight states showed a de-

crease of \$24,219.00. There was an actual decrease in contributions if we eliminate special bequests. The largest of these was from the estate of our own lamented J. C. Bush, which if deducted from the amount credited to Alabama leaves a very slight increase over the preceding year. The total receipts of the Board for last year were \$333,534.43 of which Alabama is credited with \$30,496.37.

The apportionment for another year was placed at the same figures as that of the preceding year, a total of \$400,000.00 with \$25,000.00 for Alabama. In accepting this apportionment we should remember that we have no bequest of \$10,000.00 with which to begin the year. Surely Alabama Baptists will not lag behind sister states of less wealth and fewer Baptists. The problem with us is one of enlightenment and enlistment. We have the resources with which to meet the situation. It is simply a question of Christian loyalty.

Recommendations.

1. That we accept our apportionment of \$25,000.00 and pledge our earnest efforts to raise it.

2. That our associational vice-presidents for the Home Board, be earnestly requested to begin immediately a campaign to reach every church in every association for an offering for Home Missions during the next year,

3. That our churches replace the unbusiness-like and unscriptural practice of waiting till the close of the Convention year to make their offerings to missions with the State Board's calendar plan or some other system of regular systematic giving.

4. We are gratified to know that the Committee on apportionment provided for the apportionment of the amount to be raised among the associations. We suggest that the associations in turn, apportion the amount among the churches.

5. That our pastors be urged to present the cause of Home Missions from their pulpits, through the tracts of the Home Board, through circulating the Home Field among their membership, and by reading the new book to be issued from the Board on "The Home Mission Task."

28. The Committee on Programme reported for Thursday, which was adopted and after announcements the Convention adjourned to 9 o'clock a. m., Thursday.

Second Day—Morning Session.

29. The Convention re-assembled at 9 o'clock a. m. in its second day's session, and was led in prayer by A. T. Camp, Northport, President R. E. Pettus in the chair.

30. Under the head of Miscellaneous Business, A. G. Mosely made announcements concerning a Baptist Encampment to be held at Shocco Springs near Talladega, Alabama, August 21 to 28.

31. The Report on Ministerial Education was called up (see Item 18) and the Convention was addressed in that interest by W. W. Lee, and P. T. Hale, Lecturer on Evangelism, and Financial Secretary of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, and the Report was adopted together with the following resolutions offered by H. S. D. Mollory, viz:

“Appreciating the debt which we owe to the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, and realizing the importance of that great Institution to all our progress, we earnestly hope that our churches will promptly complete the apportionment of our State toward the Endowment.”

32. At 10 o'clock a. m. W. M. Blackwelder conducted a devotional service for fifteen minutes, after which the reports of the Educational Commission (see items 11 to 13), Howard College, Judson College, Alabama Central Female College and the Convention was addressed in the interest of these schools, W. J. E. Cox presiding, as follows, viz:

Wright, President of the Educational Commission, and W. J. E. Cox, Superintendent of the Commission, and subscriptions to the Educational Fund to the amount of \$5,000.00 were made and the reports were adopted, and the Convention adjourned to 2:30 o'clock p. m.

Second Day—Afternoon Session.

33. The Convention re-assembled at 2:30 o'clock p. m. and was called to order by the President and J. G. Lowrey led in prayer.

34. Miscellaneous Business was called, and the Committee on Time, Place and Preacher reported through its Chairman, G. L. Comer, as follows, viz:

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON TIME, PLACE AND PREACHER.

Your Committee would respectfully recommend that the next Session of this Convention be held in Jasper, on Wednesday after the Third Sunday in July, 1912.

To preach the Convention Sermon:

Dr. Preston Blake. Alternate, P. L. Mosely.

That the following brethren be the Committee on programme: J. H. Longcrier, W. W. Lee, W. B. Crumpton, W. M. Anderson, D. W. Morgan.

The vote was taken, first on the place of meeting. Motions were made to amend: by O. P. Bently by inserting Enterprise instead of Jasper, and by J. A. French by inserting Eufaula. After discussion by J. H. Longcrier, O. P. Bently, J. A. French and G. L. Comer, Jasper was selected as the place.

The vote was next taken on the time of meeting. E. B. Farrer moved to insert November instead of July. After discussion by E. B. Farrer, F. P. Nichols, S. S. Broadus, C. S. Rabb, J. B. Ellis, J. J. Hagood, J. M. McCord, W. J. E. Cox, Preston Blake, J. C. Wright, T. W. Palmer, C. A. Slakely, G. L. Comer, the action of the committee was sustained, and the report was unanimously adopted as a whole.

35. A telegram from G. G. Miles, a former President of the State Board of Missions was read and the Secretary instructed to reply on his return from Colorado.

36. Vice-President W. W. Campbell in the chair, the Report on B. Y. P. U. was read by Jesse A. Cook, and after addresses by T. J. Wingfield, J. E. Robinson, W. B. Crumpton and A. D. Glass, the Report was adopted as follows, viz:

B. Y. P. U. REPORT.

"The future of Baptist churches will be marked by strength or weakness in proportion to their faithfulness towards those who are today in their hands for training." The B. Y. P. U. is the logical training school for our young people. "And it is developing within itself and working out on it's own lines, in a way full of encouragement and really commanding in what is being done."

The eighteenth annual convention held in Prattville, April 11-13, was marked by a high tide of enthusiasm, and our State work was given great impetus. We are glad to announce that Mr. Harry L. Strickland, our efficient Sunday School Secretary, will devote a part of his time to the B. Y. P. U. work. We be-speak for him great success.

B. Y. P. U. day at the State encampment last summer was a signal success and was far reaching in stimulating the interest of our young people, and causing the older members of the denomination to appreciate more than-ever the work being done.

We would recommend that the pastors over the State give the work their wise and sympathetic cooperation, so that our young people may turn their enthusiasm into the greatest channels of usefulness.

That our churches and associations give a larger place in their work to the life of this movement, and that the older members of the churches enter sympathetically and aggressively into the work.

37. The Report on Woman's Work was read by J. H. Barber and after addresses in this interest by H. S. D. Mallory, A. S. Smith, C. W. Hare, R. E. Pettus, W. B. Crumpton, the report was adopted as follows, viz:

REPORT ON WOMAN'S WORK.

In beginning this report it is well to make mention of the gratitude the leaders of Woman's Work in Alabama have for those pastors who are seeking to inspire the women of their churches to greater Christian activity; and of the gratitude they have for the cooperation on the part of Moderators of Associations in arranging for annual women's associational meetings, and for the cooperation of the Alabama Baptist.

The financial report of Woman's Work is not the most important, probably, but certainly it is the most prominent in as much as actual results can be tabulated. And then it should not be forgotten that the giving of money is a fairly good test of one's devotion to a cause.

From July 1st, 1910 to July 1st, 1911, the women of Alabama sent to the State headquarters \$18,910.78, of which \$4,095.26 was for State Missions.

Taking as a basis the year ending April 30th, 1911, it is found that the women contributed to the Woman's Missionary Union, Auxiliary to Southern Baptist Convention \$239,753.45, which went for Home and Foreign Missions, Sunday School Board, Margaret Home, and Training School in Louisville. Of the above amount Alabama contributed \$14,401.08, thus standing *eighth* among eighteen states. The young women contributed \$21,045.51, of which \$1,324.81 was contributed by the young women of Alabama, thus standing *seventh* among fifteen states that contributed.

The Sunbeams contributed \$15,670.03, of which \$672.50 was contributed by the Sunbeams of Alabama, thus standing *ninth* among sixteen states that contributed.

The Royal Ambassadors (composed of boys) made offerings that amounted to \$1,099.20, of which the Royal Ambassadors of Alabama gave \$41.35, thus standing *sixth* among ten states.

To emphasize more emphatically the great work being done by those who are actively interested, it should be pointed out just here that the number of churches in Alabama without Missionary Societies is 1538, there being in all, over 552 societies. In other words three-fourths of the Baptist women of Alabama have had no part in the splendid showing made above, which means that one-fourth of the Baptist women in Alabama have done the work.

This condition of things constitutes a call to the pastors of Alabama to take a more active hand in developing the women of their churches.

The leaders of the Woman's Work are not discouraged, but very hopeful. Word comes from them that the gifts are more regular, more proportionate and more cheerfully made than at any other time. The women of the stronger associations are not any more holding their meetings when the men do, or at the same places. The reasons for this are obvious, and more and more this should become a practice.

One phase of Woman's Work is of such importance as to merit especial mention, namely, that done in the Woman's Training School in Louisville. This Institution has just closed its fourth, and most successful year's work. The various states had contributed, up to April 30th, 1911, \$8,698.18, of which Alabama contributed \$570.00, thus standing *sixth* among sixteen states.

Another phase of Woman's Work, worthy of a definite place in this report, is the interest shown in the Aged and Infirm Ministers' Relief Fund. To this cause the women of Alabama gave, from November 1909 to November 1910, \$366.16. And in the Proceedings of the Seventeenth Annual Session of the Woman's Missionary Union of this State, held in Evergreen, November 1910,

is to be found a most thorough and inspirational report made by Mrs. Grace Hiden Wilkinson, Secretary of the Aged and Infirm Ministers' Fund.

It is earnestly desired that every general Association shall give at least five dollars annually to Woman's Work. Twenty-one associations did this the past year.

The women of Alabama are expected to give this Conventional year to the Woman's Missionary Union of Southern Baptist Convention \$16,230 which, together with their Contribution to State Missions, will be considerably over \$20,000. This amount will be forthcoming, God willing if patience, enthusiasm and hard work can bring the result.

C. S. Rabb presented to the Convention, a gavel made by one of the boys in the Industrial Department, on which is the following inscription, "Made and Presented by the Boys' Industrial Department, Orphanage, to Alabama Baptist State Convention, July, 1911." and the report was adopted.

39. F. H. Farrington, by appointment, addressed the Convention in the interest of the Religious Press.

40. The Report on Nominations was called for and read by W. C. Bledsoe and adopted as follows, viz:

Second Day—Evening Session.

42. The Convention re-assembled at 8 o'clock p. m. After singing and prayer, Vice-President H. S. D. Mallory in the chair, the Report on Foreign Missions was read by J. M. Cord, and, after discussion by J. D. Anderson, W. F. Yarborough, W. J. E. Cox, W. D. Upshaw and W. H. Smith, Editorial Secretary of the Foreign Mission Board, the report was adopted as follows, viz:

REPORT ON FOREIGN MISSIONS.

Southern Baptists gave for Foreign Missions last year \$510,008.97, of this amount Alabama gave \$35,285.24.

We have on the Foreign field 273 Missionaries, and 531 native helpers; a total of 804, which is the largest number we have ever had.

There were 3618 baptisms last year, a larger number than in any former year.

Our Church membership on the Foreign field is 21,343. About 17 per cent of the present membership was added by baptism last year, while the gain in Alabama was about 5 per cent.

If there were no baptisms to report the command to go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature would be just as binding, and while the Lord is setting his seal on the work by saving a large number he is calling

in loud tones to the churches to rally to those on the field both by reinforcements and money.

In his last report the Secretary of the Foreign Mission Board states that there are important pressing calls for help in our various mission fields which ought to be heeded by our people at once. A number of Missionary homes are needed, chapels need to be enlarged to meet the demand of the growing congregations. There are a number of places where we have no chapels at all; the meetings are being held in private homes, or under sheds, or in the open air.

That report calls special attention to the Theological Seminaries and training schools in the following words:

"Many of our people do not know that we have nine theological schools training young preachers, and eight training schools for women preparing the sisters on the Foreign field for the mission work. In all of these there are 350 men and women who are soon to go out far better equipped than those before them have been to present the cause of Christ to their own people."

Anyone who will examine the report of the Treasurer of the Foreign Mission Board will see that for all expenses it took 12 cents on the dollar, which means that 88 cents went to the foreign field. Of the 12 cents it took $3\frac{1}{2}$ for expenses in the various states and $2\frac{1}{2}$ for interest on borrowed money.

The Board having to pay interest is no argument against our plan of Mission work, but the fault of pastors and churches because of a lack of system. The $3\frac{1}{2}$ cents on the dollar for State expenses is used for State Mission work and is well spent.

If you boil the expense of the Board down to its last analysis and lay it down at the feet of our Board in Richmond you will find it only six cents on the dollar.

Our people need information above everything else; the pastor is the man to give it. The Bible, the Foreign Mission Journal (25 cents each in clubs) and the free tracts and leaflets are all at his command to be used after his own method.

It is a great thing to be a leader among God's people. It is glorious when we think of the victory of these people through their development for service, but it is a fearful thing when they fail to develop because of a lack of information which ought to have been furnished by the pastor. A child of God wants to do his duty and will try to some extent to do it when he sees it though his progress may be slow.

Alabama Baptists are asked to give \$36,000.00 this year for Foreign Missions, which is about 20 cents per capita.

Mr. Richard H. Edmonds of Baltimore says that "the wealth of the South is increasing at the rate of Seven Million Dollars a day." He estimates that at least 20 per cent of this wealth is coming into the hands of the Baptist. That would make our increase one million five hundred thousand dollars a day.

For the Baptist of Alabama it means more than One Hundred Thousand Dollars a day. We are asked to lay aside the small amount of one-third of the increase of one day to support the work of the Foreign field for the entire year.

Giving and praying ought to go together. If we measure our praying by our giving how will the two appear to the Master when they come up as a memorial before him

When the Lord lays his hand upon us and wants us to either go or send let each one be ready to do the will of him who has come into the world and died to save us.

We cannot close this report without calling attention to the debt of \$89,614.13 which confronted the Board at the end of the last conventional year.

Let us as Baptists of Alabama see to it that there shall be no debt at the close of this year, due to any failure on our part.

43. The report on Co-operation was read and adopted as follows (for apportionment table see last page of minutes) viz:

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON CO-OPERATION.

We recommend that the Baptists of Alabama attempt to raise the following amounts for the Convention Year of 1911-1912.

Foreign Missions.....	36,000 00
For Debt of Foreign Board.....	4,000 00
Home Missions.....	25,000 00

These figures may seem large in view of the fact that the State Board of Missions has reported a debt of about \$5,000.00, but we should not forget that a crisis is upon us. What is here suggested will not begin to meet the urgent demands that are now upon us. New and inviting fields are opening to us every day, and in the near future there will be an immense influx of population into our State, which will bring greater responsibilities to the constituency of this Convention.

Here are some figures our people would do well to study: The Baptists of Alabama have 483 churches without any Sunday Schools. We have 183,239 church members in the State, and 69,656 do not attend Sunday School. Last year we had 1,979 churches in the State, and 930 of them gave nothing for Foreign Missions, 942 gave nothing for Home Missions, 1,067, more than half, gave nothing for State Missions, 1,396 gave nothing for Educational purposes, 794 gave nothing for the Orphanage.

In view of these conditions, in January your Committee addressed a letter to the Baptist of the State, urging upon our people the importance of concerted action *to secure a better support for our pastors*, and with this letter a Tract on "The Alabama Convention", and also urging the churches to use the Calendar, Wall Cards, and Every Member Book. In March another letter was addressed to the Baptist of Alabama emphasizing the importance of the *co-operation of the churches in doing the Convention's work*, calling attention to what good results might come from such co-operation. We trust that the labor and expense of sending out these letters will be amply rewarded. It is our opinion that the work of this Committee should be vigorously prosecuted, and no note of discouragement should be sounded. The Committee on Co-operation of the General Association of Virginia on last year reported that out of 1063 churches in the State only 86 contributed nothing to the work of the Association. These good results came in large measure through the practical earnest efforts of the Committee on Co-operation. What the Baptists of Virginia have done, under God the Baptists of Alabama can do.

We suggest that in the future this Committee be composed of five members who shall live in easy reach of the city of Montgomery, and that the chairman be located in the Capital City, or some near-by community, in order that he may the more easily co-operate with the Corresponding Secretary of the State Board of Missions.

The experience and observation of the past shows that the Associations that have tried to raise the amounts suggested by the Apportionment Table, have, through their churches put more money into the Treasury of the State Board of Missions than the Associations that have discarded it; hence, we again recommend that Moderators of Association, and others interested in our organized work, see that a Committee on Apportionment be appointed at each Association to prorate the amounts suggested by this Convention for missions and other benevolences among the various churches of the Association. This gives the churches a basis on which to work.

We learn from the Corresponding Secretary that the most regular givers are the churches that have adopted and are using the Collection Calendar, Wall Cards, and Every Member Book which have been adopted by this Convention. Hence, we renew our recommendation of these most useful helps in all the churches of the State. As a means of education alone, to say nothing of other benefits, they are vastly helpful.

The Apportionment Table is appended to, and is a part of this report.

45. The Convention re-assembled at 9 o'clock a. m. in its third day's session, and J. R. Stodghill led in prayer.

46. The Convention was called to order by President R. E. Pettus, and J. D. Anderson read the report of the committee to which was referred the resolution in reference to Healing Springs Academy and Newton Collegiate Institution's annual report (see Items 14 and 15) which was adopted as follows:

REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON NEWTON AND HEALING SPRINGS SCHOOLS.

Your committee beg leave to report as follows, viz:

We recommend that the Educational Commission take charge of the Baptist Collegiate Institute at Newton, and as speedily as possible supply the necessary buildings for the successful operation of the school.

As for Healing Springs Industrial Academy, we recommend that the Secretary of the State Board of Missions and the Secretary of the Educational Commission be requested to visit Healing Springs, and confer with the Trustees as to the future of the Academy. If any changes are deemed wise that these Secretaries and the Trustees be empowered to make them.

We recommend that a report, yet to be furnished by the Board of Trustees, be printed in the minutes.

47. The Sunday School report was read by D. W. Sims as follows, viz:

REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

At a meeting of this committee last October we determined to do several things, among them was to use the time aloted for Sunday School work at this Convention, partly as an institute, we believed this would be more practicable than a discussion of any report we could submit—hence this report is followed by a short program.

The committee has given some thought and work to statistics (for some of our District Associations reports are not complete.) To aid in supplementing figures furnished by the District Associations, we took the liberty of adding to the Committee Brother A. S. Barnes of the First Baptist Church of Mobile, who is Statistical Secretary for the Alabama Sunday School Association. Brother Barnes has given much help and furnished numerous corrections and additions to the statistics from District Associations, which will help to make the figures in the Sunday School columns of our minutes more accurate.

The Committee has cheerfully borne its own expenses for stationary and postage.

According to the minutes of last Convention there were 381 Baptist Churches in Alabama without Sunday Schools. We rejoice to report that many new schools have been organized in the past year, and regret to find now about 340 Baptist Churches of Alabama yet without a School, there are (according to estimate,) between 175 and 200 other Baptist Sunday Schools that suspend during the winter months. Again from careful calculation based on school reports we find that less than half of the Baptist church members in Alabama attend Sunday School.

The foregoing facts are appalling and should cause us to do better:

Encouragement by Comparison.

While the facts given are very nearly correct, and we should improve the conditions, we find some little consolation in comparing Alabama with our sister states, for by doing so we find that in the points named Alabama not only compares favorably, but, is actually ahead of nearly all the other states of Southern Baptist Convention.

The percentage of church membership in the Baptist Sunday Schools of Alabama is greater than in Georgia, Kentucky, Maryland, Mississippi, Texas and Tennessee.

Suggestions:

We beg to suggest :

First: That District Association Moderators and Clerks would greatly help the work by insisting on complete statistics.

Second: Many more new schools could be organized if our Moderators would use a part of the Sunday School period in District Associations in pre-

senting the names of the various churches that have no Sunday Schools and take pledges from different individuals present to become responsible for organizing a school in each of the churches, the clerk making a record so these brethren would be asked for a report at next meeting.

Recommendations:

First: That each Sunday School aim to form an organized Adult Bible Class, with teacher, president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, devotional membership and social committees, for as the half of our church membership not in Sunday School, is almost entirely composed of adults, and without exception the Organized Class will get the adults.

Second: As the important thing after getting people to Sunday School is to teach them, we recommend that pastors and superintendents pass the matter of teacher training. This is our only hope of ultimate success, it is practical in any school and not expensive. *The Convention Normal Manual* prepared by Dr. B. W. Spillman, Prof. L. P. Leawell and Rev. H. C. Moore and issued by the Sunday School Board at Nashville, Tenn., and highly recommended by the Board, costs but 35 cents in paper back. If a class cannot be organized, individuals should start with this first book of the course.

Third: According to the minutes 930 of the 1979 churches of the State give nothing to Foreign Missions, hence we recommend that a Mission Committee be appointed in each Sunday School, whose duty is not so much to collect as to educate for Missions, this Committee could arrange in connection with pastor and Superintendent, to give out tracts on some mission field quarterly, and at some time to have a mission program.

With D. W. Sims in charge of the service, helpful addresses were made on different phases of the Sunday School problem by D. W. Sims, R. M. Hendley, A. S. Smith, H. S. D. Mallory, H. L. Strickland, Sunday School Secretary of the State Board of Missions, W. J. E. Cox, A. J. Dickinson, J. G. Dobbins, J. W. Dean, Preston Blake and the following resolutions offered by W. J. E. Cox was unanimously adopted, viz:

Resolved, that this Convention heartily endorse the plan suggested by our Sunday School Secretary, Brother H. L. Strickland, of dividing the State into four districts as outlined by him and that the Secretary of our State Board of Missions and Brother Strickland be authorized to appoint a committee for each of these districts to cooperate with our Sunday School Secretary in carrying out such plans as he may devise.

48. The report on the Laymen's Movement, was called for and read by H. S. D. Mallory, Chairman of the State Committee, as follows, viz:

**REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE LAYMEN'S MISSIONARY
MOVEMENT.**

Your Committee report that soon after the Albertville Convention, it districted the State into groups of associations, assigning one district to each member who was expected to visit each association in his district, or procure some competent laymen to represent the movement there. Many associations in the aggregate were thus visited by some member of this Committee.

Our effort has been to have the movement organized in the churches of this State, but with what success we have no means of ascertaining. Under present organization, progress has been and will necessarily be slow.

There is a near limit to the time, the members of this Committee or any similar Committee, can give to this important work. The movement will not push itself. The churches will not take hold of it until it is presented, and its great possibilities shown. It should be popular, and we think will be, when better understood and known by our people.

The work done the past year by your Committee has been mainly educational.

We are looking forward to the time when the laymen of Alabama will provide the means to employ a well equipped laymen to give all his time to the development of the movement, and its organization in the several churches. This is necessary to the successful prosecution of the work.

The plan is so simple and the possibilities so great, that all christian people should be quick to support it. It does not contemplate any boards or other machinery, except the simple banding together in the individual church, of the laymen, for better missionary work and consequently better work in all the other branches of the church work, and consequently spiritual growth in the members. We earnestly request all pastors to give encouragement to this Movement.

We verily believe it means much for the strengthening of their hands in the work of the Lord.

49. The report of the committee on Memorials was read by M. M. Wood, and after an address by W. B. Crumpton, was adopted as follows, viz:

REPORT ON OBITUARIES.

The following ordained ministers have been called from the scene of their earthly labors since our last session, viz:

Elder L. H. Hastie.

He was ordained to the ministry quite young, entered the Confederate Army early in 1861, and was so seriously wounded at Gettysburg that he was never able to return for service.

He was educated at the Baptist Central Institute in Coosa County.

He was married to Miss Mary Looney, to which marriage were born five sons and four daughters.

He was moderator of the Central Association twenty-five years, and pastor of churches in that section of the State over fifty years.

He lost his life by fire trying to save valuables from his burning residence at Talladege Springs, May 25, 1911.

Elder A. J. Lambert.

Was born December 3, 1820. He was converted in early life and began his long and very useful career as a minister at twenty years of age. He was for a time a student in Howard College, but ill health cut his college course short.

August 7, 1851 he was married to Miss Josephene Shaumfield to which marriage was born ten children, seven sons and three daughters. Five sons, two of whom are ministers, and two Sunday School Superintendents, and two daughters still survive him.

He was an earnest student of the bible, an influential minister of the gospel, and a very popular citizen in Monroe and adjoining counties.

His long and useful life ended February 12, 1911, after a brief illness of only two weeks.

Elder J. H. Mackey.

(Letters of inquiry were not answered)

Elder T. E. Morgan.

(Letters of inquiry were not answered)

Elder Charles A. Owen.

He was born in Morgan County, Ala., December 5, 1844. He was converted in early life, and ordained to the ministry at Emmaus church in 1871, having received a good common school education. His ministerial life was spent in Cullman and adjoining counties. For forty years he was pastor of churches, and for twenty years moderator of his association in that section. His was a useful life, which ended in peace February 22, 1911.

Elder H. W. Roberts.

He was born in Forsythe County, Ga., May 22, 1852. He was converted in August 1870, and ordained to the ministry in February, 1888. He died at Leesburg, Ala., November 23, 1909, his entire ministerial life being spent in Cherokee and adjoining counties. January 15, 1874, he was married to Miss Nannie Holmes, to which marriage was born eight children all of whom are faithful members of the Baptist church, as is also his devoted wife.

Elder Henry R. Schramme.

He was born in Macon, Ga., in 1854, and moved in early life with his parents to east Alabama. He was converted at about twenty years of age, licensed to preach in 1877, and ordained at Pine Flat church Perry County, Ala., in 1883. He graduated from Howard College, with the degree of Bachelor of Arts, June 1885, and a few years later spent one year at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary.

During his ministerial life of twenty-five years he was pastor of churches in nearly every section of our State, and ended at Corey, Alabama, where he was pastor, by taking a dose of poison through mistake.

He was happily married to Miss Laura Turner, January 30, 1889, who survived him only a few days, leaving three children to mourn their departure.

An intimate friend pays this just tribute to his memory, viz:

"Pure in his life, a man of prayer and boldness in preaching the gospel, his ministry was effective. The great work of missions thrilled his soul and moved him to speak with power. In physical stature he was not large, but when he appeared in the pulpit his hearers could soon see that they were listening to a man who towered like a giant in spiritual power—a man who communed with God."

Elder B. T. Selman.

He was born August 18, 1853, converted and received into the church in 1869. He was ordained to the ministry in August, 1892. He was married April 25, 1874. He died August 25, 1910 in Birmingham, Ala.

His ministerial life was spent largely in Fayette and adjoining counties.

Elder J. E. White.

He was born in Kemper County, Miss., September 27, 1833. He was converted and baptized in youth, and at about twenty years of age was licensed to preach, and at about the same time was married to Miss Mary Perkins, a daughter of the minister who baptized him. To this marriage was born fifteen children, seven of whom still survive him. His first wife having died at Starkville, Miss., in 1875, he was married again in 1876 to Mrs. Mary Green, of this same place, and shortly after moved with his entire family to Gainsville, Ala. To his second marriage was born three children, two sons both of whom are ministers, and one daughter. These eighteen children, with four step-children, and four sons of a brother all found a large place in his loving heart, and was most successful in rearing them for usefulness as christians and citizens of our State.

December 9, 1910, at Ashford, Ala., he quietly and triumphantly closed a successful ministry of more than fifty years, thirty-five years of which was spent in Alabama. His children, in character and conduct rise up and call him blessed.

Elder F. M. Williams.

On August 12, 1910, the death angel visited Arkadelphia and called Rev. F. M. Williams to his eternal home. He was a young Baptist preacher who was much loved and respected by all who knew him. He leaves a wife, four children, a father, step-mother, several brothers and sisters to mourn his loss, and while we extend our deepest sympathy to the bereaved, we bow in humble submission to the will of Him that doeth all things well.

Elder F. W. Williams.

On the 22nd day of October, 1910, heaven's gate opened wide to admit the sweet spirit of our beloved brother, Rev. F. W. Williams, a devoted father, a faithful husband and one of the sweetest Christian characters, who was carried on the wings of a swift death to the courts of heavenly bliss. Besides a heart-broken wife, he leaves six children, whose hearts are heavy with the burden of grief. How could it be otherwise, when he was so gentle, earnest, consecrated and true to all the virtues that glorify a good man's life. Words are not adequate to express our sorrow, or are we able to pay a just tribute to all the graces he possessed as a father and loyal Christian. With sad hearts we turned our faces away and left a cherished spot made sacred by the memory that one of the best men that ever lived is sweetly sleeping beneath the roses and evergreen, but who will some day awake in the likeness and glory of his Lord.

Mrs. Monroe Henderson, Phenix City, Ala.

50. A. J. Dickinson read the report on a Baptist Hospital as follows, viz:

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON HOSPITAL.

To the Alabama Baptist State Convention:

Your committee on the advisability of establishing a Baptist Hospital in some city in the State beg to report:—

1. That hitherto no opportunity for instituting such a hospital has been presented to the committee which seemed to be feasible.
2. That such an opportunity may come at any time, and when it does it would be wise for this Convention to have an agency ready to take hold of it.
3. Therefore we recommend that the committee be continued with its original powers to act in such an emergency. (See Page 65 Minutes 1909.)

54. The report of the committee to whom was referred the report of the State of Board Missions (see Item 10) was read by W. A. Davis, and adopted as follows, viz:

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON STATE BOARD'S REPORT.

Your Committee to whom was referred the Report of State Board of Missions respectfully suggests that this Convention concur in the suggestions and approve the recommendations made in this annual Report looking to enlargement of our work as Baptists in Alabama.

First of all, we appreciate mention of the increase in gifts of money to our work during all these years of our Convention history and we recommend that our people especially note that part of the report that says, "our growth in members is gratifying, but our gifts are not commensurate with our growth in material resources". In the second place we respectfully suggest that our people should praise God for the liberality shown in the bequests made by our Brother Bush to our Lord's work. We also recommend that this Convention adopt the suggestion in the report that we raise each year, the amounts requested of us for State, Home and Foreign Missions, \$32,000.00; \$28,000.00; and \$40,000.00 respectively.

We again recommend that this Convention set its seal of approval on the promise of our Secretary that we, Alabama Baptists, will raise that \$1,000.00 or more to assist in the erection of the European Baptist Theological Seminary.

We also call attention to the debt reported by the Board, \$5,275.00. This should be cleared away.

Then, in conclusion, let us not be indifferent to the suggestion of our Board's report that says, "There are numbers of places along the railroads to say nothing of the needs of the country, where the Baptists must take hold vigorously or lose the ground", and again, "aggressive work only will hold what we have and with the new demands coming upon us".

We urge upon our churches to follow the State Board's financial plan of regular, systematic and proportionate giving to our Lord's cause.

55. The report on Aged and Infirm Ministers was called up and adopted. (see Item 16)

56. The report on Temperance was called for and read by A. S. Smith, after discussion by Brooks Lawrence, Superintendent of the Alabama Anti-Saloon League, C. S. Rabb, Geo. D. Motley and C. W. Hare, and the adoption of the following resolution of sympathy, viz:

"We sympathize deeply with the friends of prohibition in Texas and Maine and extend our best wishes for success in the coming amendment election in those states," the report was unanimously adopted as follows, viz:‡

REPORT ON TEMPERANCE.

Social reform and civic righteousness are questions of the hour. The problem of temperance through the means of moral suasion and prohibition, is social and personal, economic and civic, moral and vital. It involves the state and the church; the community and the individual. The separation of church and state should not, and does not, interfere with the duty of the church to effect citizenship for righteousness, or with the duty of the state

to give to morality and religion the best possible protection that can result from the enactment and enforcement of just and wholesome laws.

The followers of Christ dare not overlook the power of the gospel upon society, or fail to apply the teaching of divine truth to all civic and social conditions. There is a leaven that leaveth the whole lump. It has been fittingly suggested that the people of God should not only care for the man who has fallen among robbers on the way from Jerusalem to Jericho, but, to save others from a like fate, should also police the road.

Shall heathen China work for the overthrow of the opium trade, and the prohibition of the free use of the drug among her people, and Christian America legalize, license and protect the rum traffic

The American saloon has been indicted and condemned and is doomed to destruction. It is the unrelenting foe of Christianity and the Devil's most powerful weapon. The liquor traffic as a whole, together with drunkenness, and the drinking of intoxicants as a beverage, have been put under the ban. The history of nations, the Bible, the home, the church, the public schools, business corporations, scientific teachings, able jurists, good morals, and decent society all cry out against these things. To this common protest must be added the piteous wail of the poor victim of strong drink, who is conscious of his ruin and longs in vain to be free.

It is not the purpose of your committee to recite the crime, wretchedness, sorrow, and woe, involving the indescribable suffering of devoted women and innocent children, occasioned by the legalized sale of intoxicating liquors. These things are familiar to us all. It can be established beyond controversy that the traffic is tremendously costly in money, morals and men. Indeed its fruit is manifold, and wholly evil. In the face of all these facts, official and scientific, the wonder grows that a business so corrupt and damnable should find license and governmental protection among a civilized people.

Touching the cause of temperance and prohibition in general, we have every reason to be encouraged and hopeful. Prohibition obtains in nine whole states in the union, (we hope and pray that the great state of Texas, now on the eve of an election, may gain the victory for constitutional prohibition) and considerably over half of the area of the United States, by municipalities and counties falls to the dry column. The Christian home, the public school, the Sunday school, the pulpit, and the religious press are now educative forces creating and crystalizing sentiment against the legalized sale and free use of that which makes drunk and debauches.

All true progress here meets with fierce and determined opposition, and there are occasional temporary and local reverses, as with every work of reform and righteousness. But the sin of drunkenness and drunkard-making must be combated to the finish. The soldier of the cross cannot avoid the issue. It has been over strong opposition, and therefore by oft retarded processes, that our own beloved State, Alabama, has been opened for the return of the degrading saloon.

State-wide prohibition, through three of four years, under most unfavorable conditions, has by no means been a failure in our great commonwealth. Drinking, drunkenness and crime have been greatly diminished, and business prosperity has been unprecedented. Official reports from seventeen communities, with a population of 231,900, show that under statutory prohibition for the first year (1908) there was a decrease of 5,131 arrests for drunkenness, and 11,742 for all other offences, over the preceding year. The city of Birmingham showed a decrease in crime of 20 per cent. and an increase in property valuation of \$10 000 000.

We have been sorry to note that so many of our great daily papers have stood for the prevention and overthrow of prohibitory laws, and in this way have worked for the open saloon.

We agree with the *Birmingham Evening Ledger*, when it says, editorially: "The laws which the saloons are to operate, if they are brought back, are

far more dangerous, far more difficult of enforcement, and far more productive of utterly demoralizing conditions than any laws that have ever been on the statute books of Alabama".

We shall hail with delight the day when the Federal government shall in no way hinder the effectiveness of anti-liquor laws of any state in the union, by suffering whiskey to be shipped into dry territory, or by the granting of Federal licenses in such territory.

Your committee desires to recommend the good work done by all temperance organizations, chief among which is the Anti-Saloon League.

We call upon the moral and christian people everywhere to do all they can to prevent the return of the legalized whiskey traffic to our fair State.

We recommend that this convention, representing 185,000 Baptists, reaffirm its position as favoring temperance, prohibition, the enforcement of law and the punishment of law-breakers.

To a cause for which noble men and women have suffered, and for which many have died a martyr's death, let us all be faithful.

59. The following resolution, offered by B. F. Giles, was unanimously adopted, viz:

RESOLUTION.

Inasmuch as the *Birmingham Ledger* is the one great daily of Alabama, that pursues a policy of aggressive opposition to the return of the saloon in Alabama, we the Baptists of the State in convention assembled do express our appreciation of its course, and commend it to the patronage of our people in the State.

Resolved. First: That we extend our thanks to all of the good people of Greenville, for the charming manner in which they have entertained us.

Second: That we appreciate deeply the daily reports of our proceedings made by Messrs. Stanley and Thompson to the Montgomery, Mobile and Birmingham newspapers, and thank those and all other newspapers for their kindly interest in our work.

Third: That we are grateful for the special rates given delegates by the various railroads of the State.

When convenient, it is suggested that the Will be drawn by some one having experience in such matters, though this is not a legal requirement.

The following are suggested as simple forms:

"I hereby give to the Alabama Baptist State Convention, the following property" (Here describe the property so it can be easily identified.) Or

"I hereby give to (Here set out any of the other institutions or enterprises) the following property," etc., as above.

- (e) Louise Short, Baptist Widow's and Orphan's Home, Evergreen, Alabama.
- (f) Ministerial Education Board, East Lake, Alabama.
- (g) Judson College, Marion, Alabama.
- (h) Howard College, East Lake, Alabama.
- (j) Southeast Alabama Collegiate Institute, Newton, Ala.
- (k) Southeast Alabama Collegiate Institute, Newton, Alabama.
- (l) Healing Springs Industrial Academy, Healing Springs, Alabama.
- (l) Alabama Central Female College, Tuscaloosa, Ala.

In the bequest the testator may state the specific purpose for which the same is to be used, or may simply leave the property to the institution, board, etc., as the case may be, to be used as it sees fit in maintaining or supporting any of the objects or enterprises.

The Will may direct the corpus or body of the gift to kept intact and only the net income used, or may not so restrict it.

In each instance describe accurately the property so that it can easily be identified, and the particular uses to which it is to be applied.

Our law requires *Wills to be signed in the presence of two subscribing witnesses, who can write their names.*

Constitution.

ARTICLE I.—This body shall be known as “The Alabama Baptist State Convention,” and shall consist: (1) of three delegates from each Baptist District Association in Alabama co-operating with this Convention, if said Association shall have five hundred members, or under, and one additional delegate for every five hundred members, or fraction thereof, above that number, whose annual election or appointment shall be duly certified by the printed minutes or certificate of an officer of the Association represented by them; (2) of one delegate from each church co-operating with this Convention, if said church shall have fifty members, or under, and one additional delegate for every fifty members, or fraction thereof, above that number; (3) of persons who contribute funds or are representatives of churches contributing funds for the regular work of this convention, on the basis of one representative for each one hundred dollars actually paid into the treasury of the Boards of this Convention during the fiscal year preceding its assembly. But in all cases must delegates to this body be brethren of Baptist churches in good standing.

ARTICLE II.—The officers of the Convention shall be a President' First and Second Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary and a Treasurer' together with a Board of Directors, as hereinafter named, who shall be elected at each meeting, and who shall hold their offices until their successors are elected.

ARTICLE III.—The President, or, in case of his absence, one of the Vice-Presidents, in their order, shall preside at all the deliberations of the Convention, and discharge the duties usually imposed upon an executive officer of deliberative bodies.

ARTICLE IV.—The Secretary shall make a fair record of the proceedings of the Convention, and soon after the rising of each regular meeting of the body shall attend to the printing and distribution of the minutes of the same, of which he shall preserve a file, which file shall constitute the authentic record of the Convention. He shall also conduct the correspondence of the body. For his services he may receive a reasonable compensation. The printing of the minutes of the Convention and the compensation of the Secretary shall be paid for by a *pro rata* taken from the funds sent for the various objects fostered by this body each year.

ARTICLE V.—The Treasurer shall take charge of the funds of the Convention, and hold the same subject to the order of this body, or of the Board of Directors during the recess of the Convention; and he shall make an annual report of all receipts and expenditures, which shall be audited and published with the minutes.

ARTICLE VI.—The President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, with nine other brethren, shall compose the Board of Directors, five of whom shall form a quorum authorized to transact any business of the Convention during the recess thereof, and shall report their proceedings at each annual meeting of the Convention.

ARTICLE VII.—The President shall have power to call a meeting of the Board of Directors whenever the exigency of the circumstances may, in his judgement, require the same.

ARTICLE VIII.—The design of this Convention shall be to elicit, combine and direct the energies of the Baptists of Alabama in one sacred effort

encourage and promote (1) the propagation of the gospel in this State, and, through the Southern Baptist Convention, in the destitute parts of the world; (2) the education of those it believes called of God to the ministry; (3) the education of the youth of our country; (4) the publication and distribution of the word of God and other literature; (5) the organization and usefulness of Sunday Schools and other religious and educational movements it may deem promotive of the interests of the Kingdom of Christ and sanctioned by the Word of God.

ARTICLE IX.—The Convention shall have the supreme control of any literary or theological institution which has been, or may hereafter be originated in this body; and it shall choose for such institution a board of twenty-four trustees, to serve for six years, of whom one-third shall go out of office biennially; and the said trustees shall on all occasions be subject to the control of the Convention, and make an annual report to this body on the state of such institution.

ARTICLE X.—The Convention may receive funds from all such as may be disposed to aid in any of the benevolent purposes mentioned in the Eight Article and it shall faithfully apply funds contributed to the objects which may be designated by the donors, a portion, however, being taken *pro rata* from the same for contingent expenses in the event of the insufficiency of the general fund for that purpose.

ARTICLE XI.—The Convention may employ agents, whose duty it shall be to make collections, obtain subscriptions from societies, solicit churches and associations to unite with the Convention and to further all objects of this body.

ARTICLE XII.—The Convention shall have power to send delegates to the Southern Baptist Convention, and to any other assembly with which, in its wisdom, it may wish to communicate.

ARTICLE XIII.—The Convention shall hold its meetings at such time and place as it shall, from time to time, appoint.

ARTICLE XIV.—The funds of the Convention shall consist of voluntary contributions or donations and not otherwise.

ARTICLE XV.—The Convention disclaims all right of exercising authority over any church or association, hereby acknowledging that every church is independent, and, within its own sphere, is accountable to no body of men on earth.

ARTICLE XVI.—This Constitution may be altered or amended by the concurrence of three-fourths of the members present at any annual meeting; but not so as to infringe the Fifteenth Article.

ARTICLE XVII.—All amendments or alterations of this Constitution shall be proposed at one session and acted on at the next.

Kerfoot's "Parliamentary Law" and Mell's "Parliamentary Practice," so far as applicable, have been adopted for the government of the Convention, the former to govern in points where they conflict. (Item 19, Minutes 1900.)

ALABAMA BAPTIST MINISTERIAL BENEFIT SOCIETY.

GREENVILLE, ALA., JULY 20, 1911.

The ninth annual meeting of the Alabama Baptist Ministerial Benefit Society was held on Thursday, July 20, 1911, at 5 o'clock p. m., in connection with the session of the Alabama Baptist State Convention 1. The annual report of the President was read, as follows:

To the Ministerial Benefit Society—Dear Brethren:

The report of our Secretary-Treasurer shows that we have met every obligation and have some money in the Treasury.

Three of our members have died. One of these, Brother John T. Davis, was one of our most liberal laymen. He cheerfully paid his annual dues in advance and promptly met every assessment. The other two were ministers. To the family of one we have paid \$504 and have in hand for the other \$400 to be paid. What a blessing it is to them and what a pleasure to the members to make this small contribution!

We are sorry to discover that sixteen of our members have been suspended for failure to pay their dues. Doubtless these brethren did not intend to let their membership lapse, but grew careless or changed their post offices without notifying the Secretary-Treasurer.

We must run our Society on strictly business principles if we hope to commend it to business men. The Secretary-Treasurer follows the law strictly and drops the names when the parties do not respond within the time prescribed by the Constitution.

Our membership, now 302, is a very small number, compared to what we should have. When we consider the little cost of this sort of insurance and the benevolent feature, it looks like every active preacher would wish to have membership with us. Every member should exert his influence to bring every active preacher, within the age limit, to see his duty to his family to join. There are many laymen who need only to have their attention called to it, to become members.

MINUTES OF MINISTER'S MEETING.

GREENVILLE, ALA., JULY 18, 1911.

The Alabama Baptist Minister's meeting was called to order at 9 a. m., by Secretary, W. B. Crumpton in the Baptist meeting house at Greenville. On the previous evening in the same building a sermon had been preached by F. M. Woods, of Clanton, Alabama.

Devotional services for fifteen minutes were conducted by J. G. Dobbins, of Orrville. Psalm 23 was read and prayers were offered by J. L. Jackson and L. C. DeWitt.

A. T. Simms of Geneva, Ala., was elected moderator and S. A. Cowan of Montgomery was elected secretary. The program that had been arranged for the meeting was carried out with few changes.

The first topic for discussion was "The Minister and the Sunday School." W. F. Yarborough of Anniston, led the discussion stating that a minister must have Sunday School ideals, Sunday School convictions and be able to teach the teachers. No one else was given time to discuss the topic. "The Minister and Missions" was discussed by Richard Hall of Evergreen. The speaker set forth the fact that a minister should study missions, study to know something about the important subject, study to know how to meet the critic of mission work and above all study the Bible on missions.

The topic was further discussed by W. J. E. Cox, W. B. Crumpton, C. H. German, J. L. Rosser, F. W. Barnett, W. F. Yarborough and A. D. Glass.

A discussion of the "Minister and Church Finances" was led by S. A. Cowan of Montgomery, who urged the necessity of regular, systematic, intelligent and proportionate giving. The speaker said that the minister should teach his people first of all that they are to give, in the second place he is to teach them why they are to give and in the third place, teach them how they are to give. The topic was further discussed by J. G. Dobbins, Richard Hall and J. H. Longcrier.

Arnold S. Smith of Alexander City, led in discussion on the topic, "The Minister and Woman's Work." The speaker reviewed the work of women in the churches, referring to the faithful women of the New Testament and urged upon the ministers the duty of encouraging the women in their work.

"The Sermon to Ministers" according to the printed program was to have been preached by Rev. J. M. Frost, D. D., secretary of the Sunday School Board of the Southern Baptist Convention. Dr. Frost was detained in Nashville, but sent the following message by lettergram:

NASHVILLE, TENN., JULY 17, 1911.

"The Baptist Ministers' Meeting." care of Baptist Church, Greenville, Ala.

"Unavoidably detained. Cannot be with you. So sorely disappointed. All arrangements were made to leave tonight. Give brethren my love. My heart was set to be with you. Subject of the sermon, 'The God of Jonah, the Preacher's God,' Jonah 1: 8, 9. Wish I could bring the message."

There was general regret at the absence of Dr. Frost but the place was well supplied by Dr. W. J. E. Cox, secretary of the Baptist Educational Commission of Alabama.

The text of the sermon was Proverbs:3: 9. "Honor the Lord with thy substance and with the first fruits of all thine increase." The subject of the sermon as announced being, "Worshipping Jehoval with Our Property." Stress was put upon the duty of tithing. The speaker stating that tithing was a law of God that had not been revoked. The meaning of tithing was explained following some questions at the close of the sermon and the tithers were called for when quite a number stood and testified to the pleasure and profit of tithing. The meeting adjourned at noon with prayer by Dr. Cox.

The afternoon session was opened at 2.30 o'clock with devotional services led by George W. McRea, of Mobile.

The first topic of the afternoon, "The Minister in His Study," was led by J. L. Rosser of Selma. The speaker stated that a minister should have a study and that he should be found much in it. The fact was brought out that preachers who have gotten the ears of the people and instructed them in the word and work of the Lord have been men who have studied. No time was allowed for the open discussion of this topic.

The discussion of the "Minister and His Prayer Meeting" was led by E. M. Stewart of Florala. The leader emphasized that it is very appropriate in many cases to refer to the minister and HIS prayer meeting. This topic was the most generally discussed of all on the program of the day. Some advocated the abolition of the prayer meetings. Others vigorously opposed any such plan. All seemed agreed that the prayer meeting is a problem but that much good is gotten from them even if few attend. The open discussion was participated in by J. L. Rosser, A. J. Dickinson, W. B. Crumpton, W. J. E. Cox, A. D. Glass, Prof. Brown of Dothan, A. T. Camp, L. C. DeWitt, O. P. Bentley, J. G. Dobbins and A. T. Sims.

"The Minister and Pastoral duties" was discussed briefly by A. T. Sims. R. S. Gavin of Huntsville discussed the topic. "Reaching the Masses."

"The Minister and the Young People" was discussed by F. H. Farrington, H. L. Strickland and A. D. Glass.

The night session closed the Ministers' Meeting. In this session was commemorated the Three-hundredth Anniversary of the English Bible. A. J. Dickinson spoke on "Translation Prior to the Authorized Version" and C. A. Stakely spoke on "The Authorized and Subsequent Versions."

The enrollment showed 95 ministers present.

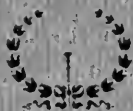
