



#### STORY OF STEPHENSON COUNTY, ILLINOIS

If Stephenson County, in the northwest corner of Illinois, is today a peaceful, flourishing locality of farms and pastures and site of the important industrial city of Freeport, it was not so calm and orderly in its beginning days more than a hundred years ago. In the period just before the county was born, and for several decades afterwards, this region was the scene of numerous historic conflicts and struggles, among them the Black Hawk War, the Wisconsin territorial dispute and the great Lincoln-Douglas debates.

But Stephenson County early settled down to a routine existence and in time its county seat, Freeport, emerged as a leading manufacturing center of the northern Illinois area. And in time, too, the county was producing a number of men and women who became renowned beyond its borders. Among the foremost of these was the late Jane Addams, now regarded as one of the greatest of American social workers. Another outstanding social worker of the county was Mrs. Oscar Taylor. It was Stephenson County, also, that nurtured Horatio Chapin Burchard, one-time Director of the United States Mint, and Major General Smith D. Atkins, noted Civil War commander.

In recent years the county's principal city, Freeport, has won national attention for its many fine iris gardens, in some of which are grown rare varieties of the flower. The National Iris Society has twice held its annual show in Freeport, and during the blooming season in May and June the city is crowded with visitors to the Quality Gardens and other showplaces maintained by the Freeport Garden Club. On their way to and from Freeport, these visitors observe a county spread out on both sides of the winding and attractive Pecatonica River—a county about equally productive as a manufacturing and agricultural locality.

#### INDIAN OCCUPATION

When Americans first appeared in the region that now is Stephenson County, they found it largely in the hands of the Sauks and Foxes, tribes that had long hunted and fished in the woods and on the waters of the Pecatonica and other tributaries of the Rock River. Also to be seen in the region were a few Winnebagoes who had wandered down from Wisconsin. By the late 1820's, when white men first began crossing future Stephenson County on their way to the Galena lead mines (in Jo Daviess County), the Sauks and Foxes of the region were formed into a close alliance by Chief Black Hawk, whose principal village was at the mouth of the Rock River, near present Rock Island city. In forming this alliance, Black Hawk thought he might successfully resist the inrush of white settlers into his region.

#### KELLOG'S TRAIL

It was in 1827, during the height of the "Lead Rush" to Galena, that O. W. Kellog appeared in the area later to become Stephenson County and blazed a trail through it that came to be known as Kellog's Trail. Although not recorded as the first permanent settler of the county, Kellog not only laid out a road but constructed several log cabins at a point near the present village of Kent and this place soon was being called Kellog's Grove lafe twards it was named Timm's Grove).

What caused Kellog to build his cabins here was its suitability as a "half-way station" on the Kellog Trail; a toad that led from Dixon to Galena. This trail was part of a longer route from Peoria to Galena—the route most favored by men from the South and East who were then rushing to the rich lead mines in and about Galena.

#### BLACK HAWK WAR

After the Black Hawk War of 1832 opened, future Stephenson County became the scene of an important and decisive battle in that conflict. This was the Battle of Kellog's Grove. Realizing the strategic value of the grove, ambitious to take it over so that he could control the trail between Dixon and Galena, Chief Black Hawk sent a sizable ferce of Indians to attack the place. But in the battle that followed, fought here on June 25, 1832, the Indians were repulsed by the forces of Colonel John Dement. A monument erected here in 1886 contains the names of twenty-five Stephenson County volunteers who were killed at this and other battles in the Black Hawk War.

#### FIRST SETTLER

At the end of the Black Hawk War, a conflict which resulted in the permanent removal of the Indians from Illinois to reservations west of the Mississippi River, what is now Stephenson County began to fill rapidly with settlers. Instead of coming from the East, however, many of these early settlers came from the Westfrom the Galena lead mines. A goodly portion were unsuccessful miners who decided to take up farming on the fertile lands bordering the Pecatonica River. Among these were numerous Pennsylvania Germans.

On record as the first permanent settler of Stephenson County is William Waddams, after whom the present village of Waddams Grove is named. A native of New York state, William Waddams came west with his family, and, like so many of his contemporaries, took part in the "Lead Rush" to Galena. Then, just after the close of the Black Hawk War, he gathered up his family (Mrs. Waddams was a native of Vermont) and settled at the place now called Waddams Grove in Stephenson County.

Referring to this first settler of the county, Addison L. Fulwider, in his History of Stephenson County, Illinois, has this to say: "The first permanent

settlement in Stephenson County was made by William Waddams, in West Point Township, at Waddams Grove, in the summer of 1833. . . . There were no schools in the first years of Mr. Waddams life here but, being interested in the education of his children, he procured the services of a private teacher for his children."

The description continues: "He was forty-seven years old when he built his first permanent residence in this county on Section 13, in West Point Township. He was a man of decided opinions and in politics was at first a Whig and then a Republican. Mr. Waddams was the pilot who led the way for many a family into Stephenson County. Many a settler partook of his hospitality while selecting a claim here. Frequently he hitched his team to the end of the newcomer's wagon tongue and pulled him through mud holes or across the fords on the Pecatonica. He was for a long time justice of the peace, and earned the title of Squire Waddams."

#### SOME EARLY SETTLERS

Soon after William Waddams built his first log cabin home in the summer of 1833, other newcomers began to arrive and settle in the area. In the spring of 1834, we are told, Lyman Brewster came and established Brewster's Ferry on the Pecatonica River near present-day Winslow village. A year later, James Timms arrived with his family and settled in the cabins at Kellog's Grove, after which the place became known as Timm's Grove.

Then came Miller Preston (1835), who brought with him a drove of cattle from Ohio and who settled in present-day Harlem Township near the then Galena stage-coach road. That same year, Benjamin Goddard and family arrived and staked out a claim in the region between the present communities of Freeport and Cedarville.

Another who appeared in 1835 was William "Tutty" Baker, who set up a log trading post and wayside inn that became the nucleus of the present city of Freeport. But there were numerous others who came in 1835, too, among them William Robey and his sons, Levi, John, William W., and Thomas, and three daughters, Frances, Elizabeth and Mary.

#### FREEPORT FOUNDED

As more and more settlers came to the region in 1835 (it was then partly in Jo Daviess County and partly in Winnebago County), William "Tutty" Baker prospered at his wayside inn and trading post on the Pecatonica River. It was this wayside inn, built early in 1835, that marked the beginning of Freeport city. In addition to his tavern and trading post, Baker established a ferry service across the river here and soon a settlement grew up about the Baker place.

At first, this settlement was called Winnesheik, so-named after a local Winnebago chief who had earlier lived nearby on the banks of the Pecatonica. But about 1837 (the same year in which Stephenson County was formed) the Baker

settlement acquired a new name "Freeport." But how did such a land-locked community receive such a maritime name? In answer to that question, so often asked, there is a local legend to the effect that Mrs. Baker was responsible for the name.

It seems that Mr. Baker was something of an over-generous host. When he decided to lay out a city here, Mr. Baker served free meals to numerous prospective lot-buyers, all of which meant extra cooking for Mrs. Baker. So one day she became impatient of the whole thing and announced to her husband: "Look here, this place is getting to be a regular free port for everybody coming along the trail. You'd better call your new town 'Freeport,' because that's what it will be if you run it."

#### STEPHENSON COUNTY IS BORN

By the year 1837 there were several hundred settlers in the countryside bordering the western reaches of the Pecatonica River-enough to form a new county. As it was a rapidly growing period in which new counties were being formed almost yearly, the people of Freeport, Waddams Grove, Rock Creek and other settlements on both sides of the Pecatonica began talking of a county of their own; one that could be organized out of the western portion of Winnebago County and the eastern portion of Jo Daviess County.

This talk soon enough crystalized into action. A meeting was held, petitions were circulated, and finally the matter was brought before the Illinois state legislature at Vandalia (which then was the capitol of the state). There followed the passage of an act on March 4, 1837, creating a new county "to be called Stephenson, as a tribute of respect to the late Colonel Benjamin Stephenson." The act was signed into law a few days later by Governor Joseph Duncan.

#### COLONEL BENJAMIN STEPHENSON

When the new county on the northern border of Illinois was named "Stephenson," it honored the memory of one of the founding fathers of the Prairie State. It was during the War of 1812 that Benjamin Stephenson was commissioned a colonel of Illinois Militia. Later he was appointed Adjutant General of Illinois Territory. Then, from 1814 to 1816, Colonel Stephenson represented Illinois Territory as a delegate in Congress. As a member of the Constitutional Convention of 1818, Colonel Stephenson played an important part in the drafting of the first constitution of Illinois.

#### FREEPORT BECOMES COUNTY SEAT

Although the then new village of Cedarville made a strong bid to become seat of justice of the new county, emphasizing the desirability of its central location, it was Freeport that won the title. When the state legislature appointed three men from outside the new county to serve on a commission for the selection of a county seat site, it ordered that they should meet for this purpose at the home of William

Baker in Freeport. Apparently the commissioners were well fed by the generous-hearted Mr. Baker—and not only that but Mr. Baker and other citizens offered a contribution of \$6,500 in cash to the new county, as well as a donation of land for the court house square, if Freeport were chosen as county seat. Impelled by such inducements, the three commissioners voted in favor of Mr. Baker's new town.

#### FIRST COUNTY ELECTION

It was also at the home of William "Tutty" Baker that Stephenson County held its first election. This was on the first Monday in May, 1837. The number of votes cast was 121. Serving as judges at that election were Orleans Daggett, James W. Fowler and Thomas J. Turner; the clerks were Benjamin Goddard and John C. Wickham. When the votes were counted it was found that the following early settlers were elected the county's first officers: Lemuel W. Streator, Isaac S. Forbes and Julius Smith, commissioners; William Kirkpatrick, sheriff; Lorenzo Lee, coroner; Orestes H. Wright, recorder; and Frederick D. Bulkley, surveyor.

#### **ELECTION PRECINCTS**

As its first order of business, the commissioners' court (as it was then called) of the new county, meeting at the home of Orestes H. Wright (who had been elected recorder), created six election precincts and appointed judges of election for each. The six, and their judges of election, were: Freeport precinct, Seth Scott, A. O. Preston and L. O. Crocker; Central precinct, Ira Jones, Levi Lucas and Alpheus Goddard; Brewster precinct, L. R. Hull, John M. Curtiss and N. E. Ransom; Rock Grove precinct, J. R. Blackmore, Jonathan Cora and Eli Frankenberger; Waddams precinct, William Waddams, Othmiel Preston and John Garner; Silver Creek precinct, names of judges not ascertained.

#### WISCONSIN BOUNDARY DISPUTE

If a majority of the early citizens of the county could have had their way, Stephenson today would be in the State of Wisconsin instead of the State of Illinois. Also, the great city of Chicago would be in the Badger State instead of the Prairie State. Although occupying a new Illinois county formed on their own initiative, the early residents of Stephenson—as well as of eight other counties in northern Illinois—voted overwhelmingly, at a convention held in Rockford in 1840, in favor of Wisconsin's claim that its southern boundary should be fixed on a line running due west of the southern tip of Lake Michigan.

This was the original boundary line set up in the Ordinance of 1787 which created the Northwest Territory, so-called because it lay northwest of the Ohio River. When Illinois became a state in 1818, however, she succeeded in having this ordinance amended so that her northern boundary would be some sixty miles north of the foot of Lake Michigan, thus giving her a waterway outlet and the port of Chicago.

Discussing this matter, the Stephenson County volume of the Inventory of the County Archives of Illinois says: "The year 1840 witnessed the greatest activity on the part of citizens of Stephenson County in support of Wisconsin's claim... As a result of a meeting of the citizens of Stephenson County, February 19, an election was actually held throughout the disputed tract on the 5th of March, at which, of five hundred and seventy votes cast, all but one were in favor of uniting with Wisconsin."

The volume continues: "On May 25, 1840, there was presented to the United States Senate a petition signed by sixty-two citizens of Stephenson County, asking that 'Wiskonsin' be given those 'ancient rights secured to them by the ordinance (of 1787) aforesaid, through the repeal of so much of the act for the admission of Illinois as conflicts with the ordinance referred to.'

"On July 6, 1840, representatives from Stephenson, and from eight other of the fourteen counties in the disputed area, met in convention at Rockford. The convention formally declared that Wisconsin was entitled to the fourteen northern counties as claimed, and the citizens were recommended to elect delegates to a convention to be held at Madison, on the third Monday in November, 'for the purpose of adopting such lawful and constitutional measures as may seem to be necessary and proper for the early adjustment of the southern boundary."

Strong as this movement was, however, it did not succeed in attaining its objective. When Congress, in 1848, passed an enabling act for the admission of Wisconsin Territory into statehood, it fixed the new state's southern boundary about sixty miles north of the tip of Lake Michigan. Thus was Stephenson and its neighboring counties—as well as Chicago—retained in the State of Illinois.

#### FIRST COURTHOUSE

Although Stephenson County was organized in 1837, it was not until 1840 that its first permanent courthouse was completed at Freeport. It was built by Thomas J. Turner, later to become a prominent lawyer, congressman and first mayor of Freeport after its incorporation as a city. The county's first courthouse was a two-story frame structure described as something of "a marvel of architecture" and considered as surpassing in size and elegance any other courthouse west of Detroit and north of St. Louis.

"During the early days," says Fulwider's history of the county, "the old courthouse served as a meeting place for new congregations before they could build churches. It was there, too, that mass meetings were held, as well as conventions and railroad gatherings, but as early as 1850 citizens and the newspapers began to complain that the old courthouse was not in keeping with the progress of the county. It was argued that a community would be known by its public buildings, and Freeport should have a more modern structure as a means of attracting settlers and building up the town."

#### TOWNSHIP ORGANIZATION

Until 1850, Stephenson was governed by a "county court" composed of three elected commissioners. In that year, the citizens of the county voted in favor of adopting the township form of government, which meant that a supervisor would be elected from each township and these would form the County Board of Supervisors, governing body of the county.

As a result of this change, fifteen townships were created. These original fifteen townships, and their first elected supervisors, were: Lancaster, Johnston Reitzell; Rock Run, C. G. Epley; Rock Grove, James J. Rogers; Oneco, George Cadwell; Winslow, Cornelius Judson; Waddams, Michael Lawyer; Buckeye, John Montebus; West Point, Daniel Wilson; Harlem, William M. Buckley; Erin, John I. F. Harman; Florence, Conrad von Brocklin; Ridott, Gustavus A. Farwell; Silver Creek, Samuel McAfee; Loran, Hiram Hart; and Freeport, E. S. Hanchett. Since 1850, three new townships were created—Jefferson, Kent and Dakota.

#### 'ARRIVAL OF THE "CARS"

An event of major importance in the history of Stephenson County was the building of the first railroad through it in 1853. This was the Galena and Chicago Union, which not only was the first "steam line" to be constructed in Stephenson County but was the first railroad to be built in Chicago, now the railroad capital of the world. Today, the old Galena and Chicago Union is part of the Chicago and North Western System. The one hundredth anniversary of the North Western was observed in 1948 by many public events and by the publication of Pioneer Railroad, a history of the system by Robert J. Casey and the late W. A. S. Douglas.

After the Galena and Chicago Union was completed to Freeport in 1853, the Freeport Journal commented: "Finally, after all the disappointments and difficulties of reaching us, the cars have at last come. We have seen and heard the panting of the iron horse and heard the shrill whistle of the Jocomotive for the first time in Freeport. Yesterday, the construction train crossed the bridge over the Pecatonica and today will probably reach the depot grounds at the lower end of town. Our farmers, merchants and business men will rejoice over this event heartily and hail with delight this new advance of wealth into our midst."

Almost immediately after the arrival of this first railroad, both the population and the productivity of Stephenson County increased to an unprecedented degree. The county had now come to the end of its pioneer period and had entered its modern phase. In 1859 the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul & Pacific Railroad was completed to Freeport, and soon the towns of Davis, Rock City, Dakota and Florence were built along its right-of-way. Then came the Chicago & Great Western in 1889. Soon after the turn of the century (1904) the Rockford & Interurban Railroad was built, an electric line that provided fast service between Rockford and Freeport.

#### LINCOLN-DOUGLAS DEBATE

At North State Avenue and East Douglas Street, in Freeport, may be found today a memorial boulder marking the site of the second of the series of debates between Abraham Lincoln and Senator Stephen A. Douglas—a series of debates on the slavery question now considered to be the greatest in American history. The Freeport debate was held on August 27, 1858, before a crowd estimated at between 12,000 and 15,000.

Then known mostly as a leading Springfield lawyer, Abraham Lincoln, tall, smooth-shaven, dressed in a black frock coat, arrived in Freeport on a special train at 10 o'clock in the morning on the day of the debate. He was greeted by a crowd of 5,000 and escorted to the new Brewster House. There, on the balcony of the hotel, Lincoln delivered a brief reply to a speech of welcome from Thomas J. Turner, a leading Freeport lawyer of the period.

In the meantime, Senator Douglas, a short, stocky, dynamic individual known familiarly as the "Little Giant," was in his room at the Brewster House. He had arrived the night before and had been escorted to the hotel by a large torchlight procession.

On the day of the debate, crowds began gathering early at the site chosen for it. Although it was a cold, damp day, there was great enthusiasm in the crowd for the forthcoming event. Just before 2 o'clock in the afternoon, Senator Douglas, with a group of friends, walked from the Brewster House to the debating stand two blocks away. Lincoln, however, arrived at the stand in a Conestoga wagon drawn by six horses.

As we have said, a crowd of between 12,000 and 15,000 listened to the two speakers. This second of the series of Great Debates, staged during the Illinois senatorial campaign of 1858, was important because of its famous "Freeport Question." Lincoln addressed this question to Douglas on that afternoon: "Can the people of a United States Territory, in any lawful way, against the wish of any citizen of the United States, exclude slavery from its limits prior to the formation of a State Constitution?"

Although the "Little Giant's" affirmative answer made him the winner of the senatorial race that year, it proved fatal to his presidential prospects two years later. And although Lincoln lost the senatorial race, the Great Debates brought him forward as a national figure; as a presidential possibility in 1860.

#### BIRTH OF JANE ADDAMS

Perhaps the foremost of all of Stephenson County's native sons and daughters was the late Miss Jane Addams, founder of Hull House in Chicago and one of the greatest of American social workers. She was born in the village of Cedarville,

just north of Freeport, on September 6, 1860, one year before the outbreak of the Civil War.

Her father was John H. Addams, early Stephenson County settler, gristmill owner, state legislator, friend of Lincoln's, organizer of the "Addams Guards" in the Civil War, and one of the founders of the Galena and Chicago Union Railroad (now part of the Chicago and North Western System). It was in her parent's house at Cedarville that Jane Addams spent her childhood and young womanhood.

After her father died in 1881, young Jane Addams went to Chicago, became a social worker, and established Hull House in 1889. She subsequently made this institution into one of America's most famous social settlements. Since the death of Jane Addams in 1935, the Cedarville house in which she was born and reared has become something of an historic shrine, although privately owned.

#### THE CIVIL WAR

When President Lincoln sent out his urgent call for 75,000 volunteers at the opening of the Civil War in 1861, Stephenson County quickly responded with more than its quota of men and money for the Union cause. At the end of the conflict in 1865, it was found that 542 men of Stephenson County had either been killed in action or died of illness while in the service of their country. On the courthouse lawn in Freeport today stands the tall stone Civil War Monument, erected in 1869. On the four corners of its base are life-size figures of a Civil War sailor, militiaman, cavalryman and artilleryman. The names of Stephenson County men who fell in the Civil War are engraved on a bronze plaque at the base of the monument.

#### SECOND COURTHOUSE

If Stephenson County residents began to clamor for a new, and more modern, courthouse as early as 1850, it was not until 1873 that the type of building they sought was completed. When the new edifice was finished in that year, citizens of the county beheld an imposing structure of white limestone, four stories high and surmounted by an ornate tower. In the tower was hung a bell weighing 1,850 pounds, and here also was installed a large Seth Thomas clock weighing 2,000 pounds. The new courthouse was completed at a total cost of \$130,413.56. Several years after this courthouse was built, the county erected a new jail at a cost of \$35,000.

#### IRIS CAPITAL OF THE MIDWEST

In the past fifty years, Stephenson County's principal city and seat of justice, Freeport, has not only emerged as an important manufacturing place but as a leading iris-growing center. It is often called the Iris Capital of the Midwest. During the blooming season in the latter part of May and early june, many visitors from Illinois, Wisconsin and Iowa arrive in Freeport to view both familiar and rare iris

plants in the Quality and other gardens of the city. These showplaces are sponsored by the Garden Club of Freeport. The National Iris Society has twice held its annual show in Freeport.

#### STEPHENSON COUNTY TODAY

On the basis of latest United States census figures, a statistical profile may be drawn of Stephenson County as it was in 1950. This will show that it then had a total population of 41,595—an increase of 2.3 per cent over its 1940 figure. Its largest city and county seat, Freeport, had a population of 22,467.

With a land area of 568 square miles, the county's density of population was 73 inhabitants per square mile. Of the county's total population, 22,467 were classified as urban (all of whom lived in Freeport), 10,055 as rural farm dwellers and 9,073 as rural non-farm residents. There were 3,998 infants under five years of age in the county in 1950, and 4,805 persons sixty-five years old and over. The median age was given as 33.6 years. The number of potential voters then was 27,774.

Under the heading of vital statistics, Stephenson County in 1950 had 850 live births, 464 deaths (including 23 infants), and 393 marriages.

There were 11,120 families (two or more persons related by marriage or blood) in the county then, and the median income of all of these families was given as \$3,231. Slightly more than 24 per cent of these families had incomes of less than \$2,000, while 19.4 per cent had incomes of \$5,000 or more.

In the field of education, the county had a total of 6,830 young persons between the ages of seven and seventeen years (school age). There were 4,370 between the ages of seven and thirteen years (primary school age), and 95.0 per cent of these were enrolled in primary schools. The figures also showed there were 1,885 between the ages of fourteen and seventeen (high school age), and 84.5 per cent of these were enrolled in high schools.

In 1950 the county had a total potential labor force of 31,810 (persons fourteen years old and over). Actually employed, however, were 17,794, of which 83.1 per cent were males and 31.2 per cent females. The labor figures revealed further that 4,292 were employed in manufacturing, 3,731 in agriculture, 2,960 in retail and wholesale trade, 1,347 in professional and related services, 1,294 in transportation, communication and other public utilities, 837 in business and personal services, 787 in construction, 736 in finance, insurance and real estate, and 29 in mining. The labor figures were concluded by showing that 25.0 per cent of the total employed in Stephenson County during 1950 were engaged in manufacturing, while 21.7 per cent were engaged in agriculture.

With reference to housing, the county had a total of 13,120 dwelling units in 1950 (in 1940 its total was 12,036). The median number of rooms per unit was

given as 5.8. Slightly more than 76 per cent were one-dwelling unit detached structures (including occupied trailers), 7.0 per cent were built in 1940 or later, and 53.7 per cent had hot running water with private toilet and bath. The housing figures showed further that 58.3 per cent were owner-occupied, 1.7 per cent were occupied by non-white households, 73.9 per cent had central heating, 89.1 per cent had mechanical refrigerators, and 98.1 per cent had radios. There were 10,287 houses classified as non-farm dwelling units, and the median value of these was given as \$7,047. The median gross monthly rental of renter-occupied houses was given as \$46.76.

In 1948, when the last United States business census was taken, there were 547 retail stores in the county which employed 2,162 persons and which grossed \$44,923,000 in sales. Largest group in the retail field were food stores, which numbered 129 and which grossed \$9,927,000 in sales. The next largest group were eating and drinking places, which numbered 107 and which grossed \$3,257,000. There were 73 wholesale establishments in the county then and total sales of these amounted to \$27,084,000.

As we have already noted, Stephenson is about equally productive as a manufacturing and as an agricultural county. In 1947, when such figures were last obtained, the county had 80 manufacturing establishments which employed 4,686 persons and which produced goods and materials in the amount of \$18,846,000.

In 1950 the county had a total of 2,534 farms, of which 2,396 were classified as commercial farms. Of all of the farms in the county, 41.8 per cent were operated by tenants. The average value of land and buildings per farm for all farms was given as \$22,971. The value of all farm products (crops, livestock, poultry, dairy products) sold in 1949, four years after the close of World War II, was given as \$20,167,000. Farm expenditures in that same year amounted to \$2,552,000 for livestock and poultry feed and \$1,164,000 for hired labor.

Total bank deposits (of individuals, partnerships and corporations) in Stephenson County on December 30, 1950, amounted to \$37,113,000. On that same date the county's three savings and loan associations had savings capital totaling \$4,473,000, with \$3,754,000 in first mortgage loans outstanding.



#### CITY OF FREEPORT


As the story of Stephenson County is largely the story of Freeport, details of the city's past will be found in the opening historical narrative of the present work. An important manufacturing center of the northern Illinois area, Freeport in 1950 had a total population of 22,467, which placed it 31st in population rank among the cities of the Prairie State.

Freeport is located 115 miles northwest of Chicago and serves as a gateway to Apple River Canyon State Park (in Jo Daviess County) and the scenic Mississippi River bluffs region. The city is situated on US 20 and on state highways 75 and 26. It is also on the Illinois Central, Chicago and North Western, Chicago and Great Western and Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific railroads.

Among leading manufacturing plants in Freeport are the Micro Switch Company (electrical switches), Burgess Battery Company (electric batteries), W. T. Rawleigh Company (proprietary products), Fairbanks-Morse Company (electrical machinery), Strucko Manufacturing Company (toys), Stover Steel Tank Company (steel tanks), Hoefer Manufacturing Company (heavy machinery) and the Freeport Manufacturing Company (mops and brooms).

It was in Freeport that the second debate between Lincoln and Douglas was staged on August 27, 1858. A memorial boulder at North State Avenue and East Douglas Street marks the site of the debate.



#### CEDARVILLE

Some six miles north of Freeport, on State 26, lies the incorporated village of Cedarville, with a population of 466. Still standing in the village is the house in which the late Miss Jane Addams, one of the greatest of American social workers, was born and reared. Her father, John H. Addams, was an early Stephenson County settler, state legislator, friend of Lincoln's and one of the organizers of the Galena and Chicago Union Railroad, first "steam road" to be built in the county. Cedarville village is the principal community of Buckeye Township, which has a total population of 1,304. First settler of the township is believed to have been John Goddard, who came in 1835 and settled near the site of Cedarville.



#### RED OAK

Another community of Buckeye Township is the small village of Red Oak, with a population of 95. It is located on the Illinois Central Railroad just northwest of Cedarville. The village was founded in 1888 by W. R. Bender, who also opened the first general store.



#### BUENA VISTA

Also in Buckeye Township is Buena Vista, which has a present population of 45. It is served by the postoffice at Red Oak. Buena Vista was platted in 1852 by Marcus Montelius and Philip Reitzell.

This village is the principal community of Florence Township, which has a total population of 1,177. The township contains Krape Park, located near Freeport and named after W. W. Krape, founder of the Order of the Knights of the Globe. First settler of the township was Conrad Van Brocklin, who came in 1836.



## BOLTON

Another community of Florence Township is the small village of Bolton, with a population of thirty. It is served by the postoffice at Freeport. Through it runs the Chicago & Great Western Railroad. Platted in 1887, Bolton stands near the site of an earlier village called Van Brocklin after the first settler of Florence Township.





#### CITY OF FREEPORT

As the story of Stephenson County is largely the story of Freeport, details of the city's past will be found in the opening historical narrative of the present work. An important manufacturing center of the northern Illinois area, Freeport in 1950 had a total population of 22,467, which placed it 31st in population rank among the cities of the Prairie State.

Freeport is located 115 miles northwest of Chicago and serves as a gateway to Apple River Canyon State Park (in Jo Daviess County) and the scenic Mississippi River bluffs region. The city is situated on US 20 and on state highways 75 and 26. It is also on the Illinois Central, Chicago and North Western, Chicago and Great Western and Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific railroads.

Among leading manufacturing plants in Freeport are the Micro Switch Company (electrical switches), Burgess Battery Company (electric batteries), W. T. Rawleigh Company (proprietary products), Fairbanks-Morse Company (electrical machinery), Strucko Manufacturing Company (toys), Stover Steel Tank Company (steel tanks), Hoefer Manufacturing Company (heavy machinery) and the Freeport Manufacturing Company (mops and brooms).

It was in Freeport that the second debate between Lincoln and Douglas was staged on August 27, 1858. A memorial boulder at North State Avenue and East Douglas Street marks the site of the debate.



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

#### SCIOTO MILLS

Located on Richland Creek, just northwest of Freeport, the incorporated village of Scioto Mills has a present population of sixty-five. It is served by the Illinois Central Railroad. Scioto Mills is the outgrowth of an early settlement here established by Thompson Cockrell, a pioneer of Harlem Township, who came in 1839. He later built the first of a series of mills on Richland Creek in this vicinity. Scioto Mills is the principal community of Harlem Township, which has a total population of 1,182. Believed to have been the first settler of the township was Miller Preston, who arrived in 1833.




#### CEDARVILLE



#### LORAN

In the southwest corner of Stephenson County, on Plum Creek, is located the small village of Loran, with a population of fifty. It is served by the postoffice at nearby Pearl City. Loran was founded in 1854 by George Lashell, early settler. It is the only community in Jefferson Township, which has a total population of 291. The township was organized in 1859 from a part of Loran Township. Believed to have been the first settler of the area that now is Jefferson Township was Hector C. Haight, who arrived with his family in 1837 and built a log cabin near the present village of Loran.



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





#### KENT

It was near the present village of Kent, in the western part of the county, that O. W. Kellog, as early as 1827, built a half-way station on what came to be known as Kellog's Trail; a wagon route from Dixon to the lead mines at Galena. And it was at Kellog's Grove, as the half-way station was later called, that an important battle took place in the Black Hawk War of 1832. Today, Kent village has a population of ninety. It is located on the Chicago Great Western Railroad. The village was ladd out soon after the railroad was built through this section in 1887. It is the only community in Kent Township, with a total population of 759. First permanent settler of the township was James Timms, who purchased the old Kellog's Grove place, which afterwards came to be known as Timm's Grove.



Only community in Lancaster Township, northeast of Freeport, is part of the incorporated village of Cedarville, which lies mainly in Buckeye Township. That portion of Cedarville situated in Lancaster Township has a population of fifty-five. In the southeast corner of the township is located Hillcrest Airport, which serves Freeport city. Lancaster Township has a total population of 2,183. First settlers of the township were Benjamin Goddard, John Goddard and John Jewell, all of whom arrived in 1835.





The incorporated village of Pearl City, with a population of 491, is located in the fertile farming area west of Freeport. Some forty years ago, it was described thus: "While it is a village in point of organization and number of inhabitants, Pearl City, as its name rightly indicates, has many of the qualities of a miniature city." This village had its origin in an earlier settlement here called Yellow Creek. Today, Pearl City, situated on the Chicago Great Western Railroad and on State 73, finds itself the only community in Loran Township, which has a total population of 1,135. First settler of the township was William Kirkpatrick, who came in 1836 and who later built a gristmill. He was elected Stephenson County's first sheriff.



## ONECO TOWNSHIP ORANGEVILLE ONECO





#### ORANGEVILLE

It was about 1846 that John Bowers came to Stephenson County and laid out the village of Orangeville in the north part of the county. At first it was called Bowersville. When the Illinois Central Railroad was built through Orangeville in 1888, it rapidly increased in population and acquired quite a few German families. Today, Orangeville is an incorporated village of 460 inhabitants. Through it runs State 26. It is the principal community of Oneco Township, which has a total population of 1,175. According to local tradition, the first settler of the township was one Simon Davis, who arrived in 1833. He was followed several months later by Andrew Clarno and John M. Curtis.



#### ONECO

Another community in Oneco Township is the small village of Oneco, with a population of fifty. It is located northwest of Orangeville on State 26. This village is one of the oldest in the county, having been laid out as early as 1840. It was platted by Henry Corwith, a pioneer of the area.




#### GERMAN VALLEY

In the southeast corner of the county, on the Chicago Great Western Railroad, lies the incorporated village of German Valley, with a population of 206. In addition to a number of retail stores and service establishments, the village contains Pleasant Prairie Academy, with a present enrollment of sixty students. The village had its origin in an early German settlement here known as Baalton. It did not grow very rapidly, however, until the Chicago Great Western Railroad was built through the area in 1887. Today, German Valley is the principal community of Ridott Township, with a total population of 1,378. First settlers of the township were Andrew Jackson and Jefferson Niles, who came in 1836. About 1850 the township was largely settled by German farmers.



#### RIDOTT

Also in Ridott Township is the incorporated village of Ridott, with a population of 187. It is located on the scenic Pecatonica River and on the Chicago Great Western Railroad. The village was founded in 1860. It was originally called Cochranville after J. S. Cochran, early land developer of the area.




#### **EVARTS**


In the northeast corner of the county is located Rock Grove, one of the oldest villages of Stephenson County. It has a present population of 150 and is served by the postoffice at nearby Rock City. It was as early as 1835 that the first permanent settlers came and staked out farms near the site of Rock Grove village. These first pioneers were Albert Albertson, Jonathan Corey and Eli Frankeberger. It was not until 1850, however, that Rock Grove was formally platted as a village by Samuel Guyer. The township in which it is located, bearing the same name, today has a total population of 696.






#### ROCK CITY

Another community of Rock Run Township is the incorporated village of Rock City, with a population of 157. It is situated on the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul & Pacific Railroad and on State 75. The village was platted in 1859 by George Raymer on the site of an earlier settlement called Rock Run Mills. The latter was established by H. G. Davis as early as 1841.

#### DAVIS

With a present population of 348 and with numerous retail stores and service establishments, the incorporated village of Davis serves as the principal trading center of Rock Run Township, northeast of Freeport. It is situated on the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul & Pacific Railroad and on State 75. The village was founded in 1857 after the Western Union Railroad (now part of the Milwaukee road) was built through the area. Its founders were Samuel Davis, John A. Davis, Thomas J. Turner and Ludwig Stanton. The township in which Davis is located has a total population of 1,377. First permanent settler of the township was a Mrs. Swanson, a widow with a large family of children, who arrived in 1835. Her children helped her in running a farm here.







### McCONNELL

A village of 225 population, McConnell derives its name from Robert McConnell, who in 1838 established a settlement here called McConnell's Grove. The village is located on the Pecatonica River and is the only community of Waddams Township, which has a total population of 965. The township is named after William Waddams, first permanent settler of Stephenson County. It is believed that the township was originally surveyed by William Hamilton, son of the American statesman, Alexander Hamilton. At that time William Hamilton was residing in the lead mining region about Galena. The first settler of Waddams Township was Levi Robey, who came in 1835. At that period William Waddams was living seven miles away, in what is now West Point Township.



# WEST POINT TOWNSHIP LENA WADDAMS GROVE





#### LENA

Second largest community of Stephenson County is the incorporated town of Lena, with a population of 1,227. It is located northwest of Freeport on the Illinois Central Railroad and on State 73. In addition to numerous retail stores and service establishments, the town contains several cheese factories which produce, among other kinds, such foreign types of cheese as Camembert and Brie. Here, also, are many chicken hatcheries.

The town of Lena was platted in 1854 by Samuel F. Dodds. The local historian, Fulwider, wrote of it: "The location proved to be a good one, for here grew up the largest town in the county outside of Freeport." Lena is today the principal community of West Point Township, with a total population of 1,986. First settler of the township was William Waddams, who also was the first settler of Stephenson County. He arrived here in 1833 and staked out a claim near the present village of Waddams Grove.



#### WADDAMS GROVE

Oldest village of Stephenson County is Waddams Grove, which today has a population of 100. It is located northwest of Lena on the Illinois Central Railroad. The village had its beginnings in 1833 when William Waddams arrived and became the first permanent settler of the county.



#### WINSLOW

At the northwest corner of the county, on the Pecatonica River, lies the old incorporated village of Winslow, with a present population of 355. Through it runs State 73. The village contains a number of retail stores, service establishments, banking facilities and a postoffice. Winslow was platted in 1844 by Cyrus Woodman, agent of the Boston Land Company. The company had acquired extensive land holdings in the vicinity. Winslow was named after Governor Winslow, one of the colonial governors of Massachusetts. Today, Winslow is the only community of Winslow Township, with a total population of 853. First settler of the township was William or Lyman Brewster, who came in 1834 and established Brewster's Ferry on the Pecatonica River here.

# STATE FLAG OF ILLINOIS

ILLINOIS' STATE FLAG was officially adopted on July 6, 1915, after a vigorous campaign by Mrs. Ella Park Lawrence, State Regent of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

Early in 1912, Mrs. Lawrence began visiting local D. A. R. chapters throughout Illinois seeking cooperation in promoting selection of an official State banner to place in the Continental Memorial Hall in Washington, D. C. In 1913, Mrs. Lawrence offered a prize of \$25.00 to the Illinois D. A. R. chapter submitting the best design for the banner. She also wrote to members of the General Assembly seeking their cooperation.

Four judges were then selected to choose the winning design. Thirty-five designs were submitted and the Rockford Chapter entry was chosen as Illinois' future emblem.

State Senator Raymond D. Mecker introduced the bill which was to legalize the flag. After passage in the Senate it was pushed through the House of Representatives, despite an overcrowded calendar.

The measure automatically became a law July 6, 1915, when the Governor failed to affix his signature to the bill.

The first official flag, made in Washington, D. C., was three by five feet in size, of white silk. Flags were given by Mrs. Lawrence to Secretary of State; Daughters of the American Revolution in Illinois; National Society Daughters of the American Revolution in Illinois; National Society Daughters of the American Revolution (to hang in Memorial Continental Hall, Washington, D. C.); Rebecca Parke Chapter, Galesburg and the Illinois State Historical Society.

Visitors to Springfield cannot fail to notice the State Banner flanking the States and Stripes in the Rotunda at the State House. In the same juxtaposition it appears in the office of the Secretary of State. It is flown on ceremonial days by numerous patriotic bodies throughout the State. For officials and the public alike it stands as a reminder of our greatness as a State and our pride in our membership in the United States of America.

Arbor Day is observed by the States on different days, usually in the Spring; in Georgia, in December. The dates in the same States often vary from year to year by proclamation.

Mother's Day is observed on the second Sunday in May.

Father's Day is observed on the third Sunday in June.

Saturday Afternoon is a holiday in many of the States and Cities and in the District of Columbia. Sundays are statutory holidays in Canada.

When a Legal Holiday falls on a Sunday, the following day is generally observed.





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
