IT is taid that the fecond Turkifh Ple nipotentiary at Paffarowitz is actually preparing to go io Erance, and will imhark in abour 20 Days on Board a French Merchant Ship which is to carry him to Marfilles; he takes with Kim a Rétmate of so Perfons. Some Daysago Sig Eme, the Veneridil Bailo arrived here, whereupon Sig. Ruzzini the Ambalfadour Extraordinary is preparing to return home, and propotes to imikith by the End of nex: Aonth.

Onthe 21f Inftantatrived a Brigantine from Port Mahon, by which the Bitin Contul here received a Letrer from Lieutenant Governour Kane dated the 33 d paft, O.S. advifing, that on the firt Notice he had received of the Plague's beime broke out as Marfeilles, he had caufed fuch Care to be taken by Guards kept at the Ports and round the whole inand, that no kind of Veffel from the Coaft of Fiance had been admitted into any Part of Minorea, but obliged to setire from that Coaft; particularly the Packet-Foat of that Illand, employod to carry Leters to and from Marfeilles, artiving from Marfeilles on the 16th of Auguit, $\mathrm{O} . \mathrm{S}$ was o . bliged to anchor without the Port, no Perfon was permisted to go aboard her or to come from her; and the was forced to put to Sea again. Letters from the Conful of this State as Merfeilles of the 8 th Infant advice, that from the 5 th to the 6th Inftant thete died 214 Perions, from the 6th to the 7 th 230 , and. to the 8 th in the Morning 86 ; and that the Officers of the Town with 40 Grenadiers of the Gallies and 200 Slaves, had gone about the City, and taken away all the dead Bodies which for fome time had lain in the Streets and increafed the Infection; the Number of the dead of the Plague in that Town and Neigbbourbood to the 8th Inftant, was reckoned to be 18000 . Lalt Night
arrived Letters from the forementioned Conful dated the J 2th, advifing, that the Fevers whicin till then had brought on the Mortality, were turned into large Tumours breaking out on the Shoulders, Arms and Neck; that fome fo affected had been cured; that from the 8th Inflant to the gth there died 208 from wieg ght to the 10th 365, from the 10th to the 11th 121, and from the It to the 12th ini the Moning 73 ; that the Duke Regent had rom inated M. de la Geran Commander of the Gallies, Governour of Marfeilles: and that they were in ha pes of better Government and fricter Obfervance of Orders, from the ample Comniffion givenhim. This Republick has interdicted all Correfpon. dence with Tufcany, the great Duke having done the fane fome time ago wirh Refpeet ro thisflate, withourany known Reafon. We do not hear that the Plague is gor as yat into any Part of Italy.

## London, Sittember 30.

By a Courier who arrived bere on the 30 th of the lift Monta we received Advice thas the Pincefs of Modena rhe Dike Regent's Duughter is in a Manaer recovered, but the eldeft frincefs Daughter of the Duke of Moden, is ill of the Small Pox. Though the Coniad gion has apread to fome Villages in the Neigh bourhood of Marfcilles, and even as far as Apr, the Mortality vifibly abates at Marfeilles, inforuch that tis thought if we had any Froff the Difemper would entirely ceafe. We tave xeceived Adyice, that the Pienipotentiaries of the King of Spain are on their Journey hither, from whence they ate to proced to Cambray, at whish Place feveral Houtes have been hired for foreigu Minitors ; but notwithtanding all thefe Difpofitions, tis thought the Congeds will nut be opened fo foon as was expeeted.

Baron Hop, Ambalfador Extraordinary of the Siates General, had Yefterday -a private Audience of the King and Duke Regent, he will fet out in a few Days for the Hagae, where he defigns to flay about two Nionths, and then return to this Courr. Sinoe the late irrer for calling in the Money and recoining ir, the Difcoun upon Sanin Notes daily erncreafes; and Yefterday they gave out sti Lives in Specie lor a Bil of a hurdred.

Aid the other, That he had fold only s:0001. Subfription, and that he wias scady to make the Bargaia void.
Mr. Cragg, Sen, whofe Speech was much appoved of, faid on this Suhject, That be tivought it wrald be reguifite, to appoint a Commifition to determine thofe Differences, in the fame maner as after the Fire of London; and obfervec, That he thought it incumber: on all thofe who had got great Sums of Mnney, to lay it ali out in the Support of the Publick Credit: And added, That for his owin Part he would do it, if he reduced him:felf only to what wrould amount to the Weckly Expence of bis Eamily.

Sir Gilbert Heathcore faid, He was an old Man, and had lived to fee many Storms, and all of them pafled over; and he coubted not tut to tee the like with refpect to this, as finn as People are rid of this lifatuation. To which Caufe, he impured this prefent cala. mity.

Tnere were alvers Clamours againft the Directors, and one Perion was to hot as to move for a Refolation to addrefs the Parlia. ment to cilquire into the Matter, and to bring to Juitice the Beirayers of their Country, as he expreffed it But feveral of the Direetors 1aid, they were ready to fubmit to any Fxamination; and orhers fiaid, It was an improper Place, and hereafter there might be an Opportunity; liut for the prefert it was' more con fiftant to be unamimous in their Proceedings. And the Eall of liay fpoke fo well on this Head as to qualify all Heats among chem; and the Refolution being agreed to, the Court adjolined.

## Madrid, september 16.

THE Court continues at the Efcurial, and the King; the Queen, who is as tis faid, fix Months gone with Child, as alfo the Ptince of the Auffrias, and the Infantes, are in perfect HealthThe Marquis de Lede, who arrived there the 7th, made only one Days Stay at Court, and his Majefty conferred on him the Command in chief of the Forces which are to be emo ployed in the Expedition defigned, as tis faid, againt Africa, and gave him the Nomination of all the General Officers who are to ferve under him The next Day the faid Marquis returned hither, and has, been two Days in Conferences with the Secretary at War, and went the isth for Cadiz, whither alfo Signior Patino is to go to Morrow to have the Direetion of the Fleet defigned for the Enter-a prize. The Preparations made for it are fo Surprizing, that many People doubt its being intended againft Africi, but rather that this Court has fome other Defign in view.

> Turin, Sept. II.

The 7 th Inflant the Anniverfary of the Raif ing of the Siege of this City was obferved with great Solemnity, and the King of Sardinia and the Prince affilfed at the Proceffion which was made on that Occation, as did alfo the Knights of the Annunciation. The 8th the King and the Prince fet out for the Frontiers by the way of Pignerol, heing accompanied by the Generals Rhebinder and Schu lemburgh, who are to 2 fift in the Review that is to be made of the Troops and Fortifi. cations on the Frontiers.

Vienna, Sept. 18:
The Vicechancellor of the Empire Count Schonborn, went on Monday laft for Saltz. burgh, with the Minitter of the Elector of Bavaria, where they are to meet Count Schlick, Chancellor of Bohemia, and as the Electoral

Prince of Bavaria is expected here in a few Days. People believe they are to treat about the Marriage of that Prince with one of the Archduccheffes; and it is faid thev are to remain there abour three $W_{\text {teks. Prince Alex- }}$ ander of Wirtemberg having ointained the Place of Prefident of the linperial Council of Servia, which includes the Counties of Temefwaer and Belgrade, and alfo the chicf Counmand over all the Imperial Forces in thofe Courries, is to fet out in two or three Days, the Ships which are to tranfport his Servants and Biggrge lying ready for that Service in the Danibe. That Prince is to repair the Fortificitions of Belgrade with all fpeed, this Courc having received feveral Advices from Turkey, intimating, that the Turks are defirous of a Change, and are in general weary of this Peace, whith they fay has been concluded on difhonourable Terms. Several Spies have been fient thither, and alfo feveral Expreifes, to enquire into the Truch of thefe Keports. This Court has alfo refolved, feeing General Ste:nville who is very infirm, and has defired to be difmiffed, eo fill his Government of Tranfilvania with an experienced and active Officer, and have, as tis §aid, given that fovernmens to Count Mercy. The Affairs of Religion will tis hoped be amicably adjufted, the rather becaufe the Court of Bavaria has declared they will not intermeddle there with; and that the $\mathrm{SaxCO}_{\mathrm{a}}$ Minifter has Orders to join with the Proteftants, to infilt upon a full Redrefs of their Grievances. A Company of Infurance is going to be fer up in this City, to be added to the Bank, which is to confit of 100 Altions, at 1000 Rixdollars each. The Markgravine Dowager of Baden is expected here in few Days, in order to propofe a Marriage between the Prince her Son and a Pincef's at this Court. -

Darmall and Dr. Strahan; the former pleaded the Chatter was forfeited by the Proprieturs, for enacting fome Laws contiany to the Tenoz of it; hy nor providing for the Adminiftration of Jufice, thele being but one Judge for all the Courss in tiat Country, and by not providilig for the Security of the Colony againft the Indians, \&c. it is faid the Proprietors will Gubmit, and the Crown is to reanfume the Grant upon the Non-performance of the Cons ditions; and we hear Generai Nicholfon will be fent over as Governor of that Country.

## Lerida, Sept. 18.

guitin: She cruiz:d off of the Capes of Vir ghil and nook a great many Vefteis, moft of which we m:y conclude are wreck'd from the Somiards lighorance in Navigation ard the is bining of Land.

The Privateer Brigantine and Jacobs Sloop at latt aniving fafe into St. Augultin Harbour, W: $:$ have this further Account from Jacobs's Rhate, who was carried in there.

That Capr. Sipkins was loft on the Bat of Metarfis, and that the Capt of the Privateer was taken up, imprifoned and condemned to die for counterfeiting a Commifion from the Governor, the Prizes being delivered up to the Englith, Huik and Cargo ; but no Reltitution of fmall Plunder.

That Cap. Spicer in a Fink was taken the 23d of Seprember in Chefeapeak Bay, Virginia. Some Spaniards being ordered on board to navigate her to St. Augultin, proceeding on their way-was at laft chac'd by the fame Privateer Brigt. that took her; the Spaniards heing as much miftaken, thinking her an EngJith Veffek, run the Pink athore on the Bar of Si. Iohn's, 12 Leagues to the Northward of Auguftin. All the Men were faved, and part of the Cargo, excepting a Boy belonging to Capt, Spicer.

Capr. $S$ ymour in a Vefiei from New York, loaded with Bread and Flour, was alfo taken; which being manned with Spaniards, bound for. St. Augultin, took in their way a Sloop of 4 Carriage ard 4 Swivel Guns, with fmall Arms and Amunit on fit for Engagement, and an equal Number of Mea with the Spaniards. But the Englifhmen declining to fight, they ftruck immediately to them.

The Reafon of this Cowardice in the Eng. 1im. frequently found in our Merchant Veffels of Force, is not to be attributed to their Want of $S_{\text {? irit, }}$, hut the Inhofpitality they meet with from us; having no Retaliation made for their Lofs ot Limbs or Wounds fuftained, and a cerrain Knowledge that their being taken can not equilize the Lofs of Leg or Arm. Whereas in the King's Service in Men of War, in the Cifualties of Eight, Men are fure of fome Re compence and S.nart-ivoney, which fome way gratefully makes up the Dimage fuftained by thofe who efcape with Life, encourages to fight for Plunder and Penfion, and at leaft keeps them from Mifery. It would be well if our Marchants would have a Thought of this, and make fome Provifion as a Gratuity for thofe who ate maimet and lofe Limbs in their $\mathrm{Sat}^{2}$ $v i c c_{\text {, }}$ venturilg their Lives to preferve Ship
and Cargo; and this in the End would cere tainly tend to their great Advantage. as wall as caufe a thankitul Keturn from theis Navigators, if either a War with France or Spain be renew'd, or if there is fill fuch Difficulty of elcaping Pirates.

This Vilici of 8 Guns belonged to Capt. Martin, Mafter of a Flag of Truce Sloop; but what became of her is very uncertain, is is eafy to imagine, from the Unskilfulness of the Spaniards, the is run a ground and loft.

After Cape Jacobs's sloop had been fome time at Auguftin, fhe was delivered up to the Mate; there was alfo an Englifh Ship lying there delivered'up. And Capr. Martin in the Ranger sloop Flag of Truce beirg ready to fail, they all three weighed Anchors on the 26th of November, Wind Weiterly. The Flag of Truce weighed firf, and a Boat going on board, the Menftriving to catch the Tow Rope, there being a great Head sea they ftemmed the Boat againft the Veffel, and loft three Men, one being the Captain of the Ship which was coming out. Anether Boas with 4 Men going to help, was overfet and two drowned, the other two riding on the Boats Keel was drove over the Bar in grear Difitefs, by the imperuous Force and chope ping of the Waves, the Boat was turned again, and the Men take. up two Hours after: wards fitting on the Thauts almoft perifhed.

The Flag cf Truce was loft on the Bar, had ving no Wind nor Boat to $k$ eep her a head, bue all the Men fav'd. The fhip diop'd Anchor a. gain, and did not come out till next Day. Capt. Jacobs was brought to by her Anchor out of the Bar. They rode not long here, before they ftretched away to $S \equiv a$, Courfe N.E. and in about an Hour and Halfs Time they loft their Maft, 7 or 8 Leagues from the Bar; but by God's Providence they hrought the Sloop fafe into Hawins's Hola in Virginia, with the ftump of a Malt, making it happily in 15 Days.

Governur Spotwond's Speech to the Affenting of Virginia, Novem. 3. 1720.

Gentiemsx of the Counciland Houfe of Burgejfes,

AFTER the fignal Proofs that I haveguten ot my Difpofition to Peace and Llnion. I may with a good Gracesccernmend to you Moderarion and Concord; arid whover 'hall make a juft Eltimate of what the Cobny has gained by the late Contentions. canont but reckon tinernfelves Enemies to the County who hall endearour to divide us again os willi comative an creare groundie\{s Jealoufics of my Admuiltration.
If we meet to contult and agree, General Affernbliss undoubtedly are a molt wholeícme Past of the Confitution; but it fome vulgar Notions are to prevail, as if the Boay nught to thwart and oppofe the Head, our S (Fons mait prove nothing beter than a Burthen to the Pec: ple, and that in idious Ditinetion of Country and Governor's Frend, which I ain forry to obferve fome Men have been indultious fill to keep up, mutt prove a Poilon to your Proceed ings, if you fuifer it to take Place in your Con. fullations. To confider the Stake 1 have among you, and the tree Choice l've made to fix it under this Government, you have not furely any Grounds to fuipect me of injurious Defigns againft the Weifare of this Colony: for if a confciencious Difcharge of our Duty engages us Governors to be fpecially mindful of Great Brituin's Intereft, yet I cannot fee why that may not go Hand in Hand with the Prufperity of the Plantacions; and I wili trank. ly declare to you the political Creed which I profers on this Point.

I look upon Virginia as a Rib taken from Britoin's Side, and believe that while they both proceed as living under the Marriage Compatt, this Eve muit thrive, fo long as her Adams flourifhes; and 1 am perfwaded that whatever Serpent thall tempt her to go aftray, and meddle with forbidden Matters, will but
muitiply her Sorrow, and quicken her Hufband to ruie more tiristly over her.

If your Proceedings be duily temper'd with this Perliwalion, I hardly imagine any thing that can urge us to differ this Seflion; for (prailed be (iod) this Government is at prew. font under more happy Circumftances than to need any profing you for Supplies; and as we of the Admailimion are upon beter Eftae Hithments than to become troubiefome to you for our Salaties, fo my own Dufires are more bounded than we anxious or folicilous for your Boanties.

Befides. iny Putpote is to offer nothing ic you at the Opening of this Selinan. but what you may be is forwatd to enakt as I to pais, and therefore fhall no more than barely hin: what I think fit to propofe, affuring you, tha if the Needfulnef's thereof be not as obvious to you as me, I will acquiefce with all Indifference that is contiffent with my Duty.

And fo Iremak, The naked Sure of both vour Harbours and Frontiers: The difamed Condition ot ycur Militia; The inconvenient Length oi many of your Counties: And 1 leave it to your Conliderations, Whether the giving Encouragement for extending your OutSettlements to the high Ridge of Mountains, will not be laying hold of the beft Barrier that Nature could form to fecure this Colony from the Incurfions of the Indians, and more dangerous Incroachments of the Erenci.
And laftly, I fhall lay before you the Sentiments of the Lords Commifioners of Trade and Plantations with refpect to a Treaty with the Five Nations of Northern Indians:

## London, OAZober 29.

Thuriday Morning at four of the Clock s2 Maletalters were carried from Newgate and pur into covered Lighters at Black Friars Suirs in order to go on board a Ship wair ing in Long Reach to tranfport then to his Majenties Piantations in America; among them is William Wriggleden, the Ferfon that formerly robbed the Kings Chappel at White hall, who has carried with him a great Cargo of Cutlers Ware to Traffick. At ihe fame time feveral were fent alfo on board from the Marihaifea.

Long-If.nd, fan. 29.
We have taken upwards of 20 Whales off aluis Ifland, and are in Hopes of taking many more this Seafon; but we have loft at Boats, one Man killed, and fome wounded in that Sarvice.

Newo York, fanuary 3 I.
On the righ lnitant arrived here the Ship John, Capr. Samuel Lancelotr Commander from Jamaica, which Ifland he left the 19 th of December, and brings News, That Capr. Rackum, a Pyrite, and Ten of his Men were executed for Pitacy and hung in Chuins; two Women who were taken with him were condemned, but pleaded their Beilies, and nine infer who joinel kuckum juf hefore he was taken were to be tried alfo for Pyracy.

As Capt- Lanculote came out, he met a- Pi lot Boat going in, with the Captain of a 24 Gun Ship from Guirea on board, who told him That the Winchelfea Man of War upon the Coaft of Guinea, had taken a Pyrate Ship of 40 Guns, and hung up 550 Pirates the nex: Morning, aad hoped foun to clear the Seas of thofe Vormin. He alfo told him, That two Diys betore he waschafed by three large Ships with Spanith Colours, which he tork for Men of War: that the fratlett came up with him. and offering to board him loft his Bowfutit and Foretopmaft, on which he (the Guinea Man) got away, ourfailing the other two.

London, Novem. I.
Ertain Advice from Poland intimates, That notwith ftanding they are diftrer fed on every Side; by the Peftilence, which threatens to overrun the Country; by their civil Diffentions, which are almoft come to the greateft Height amongtt chemfelves, and by the Muicovites withour, who with a powerful Army filil hover about their Frontiers, there is no Likeitiood yet of oringing their Diet to a berter Temper. Our laft Letters fay, That had not the Grandees interpofed, and ufed their utmoft Art and Perfivafion to pacify them, they had attempted e're this to cut one another to Pieces. They have now met feven times, hat without making any Piogreis or chufing cheir' Marefchal or Speaker, in order to procced: for they continue to infilt upon it, That the Crown General thall be reftored, and Velt Marefchal Count Fieming be obliged to lay down his Commifion in the Army, before they fiir a Step rowards that Elettion, or in any o. ther Affair whatfoever. If they infitt fill on this, it muft inevitably be complied with, unlets the Government can pirch upon fome fpecdy Expedient to prevent it, or will run the Rifque of the publick Safety, and oblige them by the Sword to come into them, which all their peaceful Meafures and good Management have not hitherto been able to make them fubmit to.

Twenty Sail of New Caftle Colliers are mifing, which, its feared, perifhed in the late Tempeft, on Account of which the Merchants are in Pain for feveral Ships laden with Timber from Norway:

## Pbilacelphia, February 14.

Thofe Malefactors mentioned in cur laff as fent from Newgate and the Marfhalfea to be tranfported inco the Plantations, are now arrived in Maryland, to the Number of above 180.

The Punifhment of hard Sarvice thefe Criminals are fentenced to in the Plantations, is now cunningly eluded, if they can mufter a inall Parcel of Money, as a Gratuity or -to the Merchant, for Trouble and their Paf. fige, they are fer at Liberty as foon as they fer their Eect on this Shore, and ate made equal with Freemen in thefe Purts, to 1ercle and traffick, and may in a fmall time claim a Liberty above 'em:

Inftarces of this are in this laft tranfported Gang, among whom is the Perfon we particularly mentioned with a Cargo, who is come over in Pomp, inftead of the abject Condition of a Sluve for fome time. He has brought his Miftefs reo along with him who wears, 'tis faid, rich Silk Cloaths and a Gold ftriking Watch, He lives in great Splendor at Anna* polis, jollily carroufing with fome of his Affo. ciares, who have had equal Fortune. with him of getting Moncy to buy off their Servitude. There is now with them only this Part of their Sentence to be anfwiered, that they muft not return to England in fo many Years.

We may exped. Come of thefe wild Cicatures, who were untamable and not to be brought to any civil Manners in England, to take their Traverfes into our Province, and Irive perhaps to fertle here, and fo we could do no lefs than give this publick Notice of them; nay, we have poftive Aévice that fome intend to be here in a fhort time.

When the flourifhing Condition of his Max jefties Plantations in America is confideted, ir is a fat Cafe that they cannot be ordered to be
better peopled than by fuch abfolute Villains and looie Women, as thefe are proved to be by their wretched Lives and criminal AEtions; and if they fettle any where in thefe Parts can only by a natural Confequence leave bad Seeds amongt us; for never doubt the Pro verb, What's bred in the Bone will never out of the Flejh. Out oniy Hope mutt be, that thofe whe are not likely to be reclaimed, are'very likely to be tip'd oft here, and find their Ne pius with us, though they have efcaped Tyburn.
Spain and other Kingdoms have their particular Inands for the. Banifhment of Criminais, which they referse on purpofe for fuch, in which imall Confines and Spots of Land they are obliged to get a living by painful and forced indultiry: Or elfe they find a fate Lymbo and Purgatory in the Gallies, where they are always chained and drove to fervile Bufinels by Force. In which Plases they may be fure of getting no-better Company than themifelves, and fo are unable to debauch the honeft Natures and Manners of Mankind; and its great Pity England has no fuch Iflands, Gallies or Mines to difpofe of and confine fuch untameable Ferfons in.
In thefe Weftern Parts, as it is the Defire of ou: Legiflators, fo all poffible Care is taken to cultivate and encourage Morality and.Indultry, ihat our Sovereign King George may find a plentiful Territory and ample Sirengti and Happinets from our Colonies, and He or his Succeffors by thefe Pazts may have a noble Addition to Great Britain for Empire, when our laids mall be improved and accounted rich in Comperition with very ancient-inhabitse Kingdoms. But by thefe Ways of tranfporting Villains amonglt fuch a Hourifning People, is to leffen our Improvements and Indultry, by filling the Vacancies of honelt Men with tricking, thieving and defigning Rogues, who will hardily be brought to get their Livelihood by fuch labourious and fettled Means; the ill Confequences of which would without douht be remedied in Great Britain, were they as fenfible of 'em as we who are made to by living amongit them.

No Veifcl has arrived here fince our laft; hut the Hannover Gally is daily expeeted from Holland, and Capt Conbs in a Sloop from London.

THE Affair of the Eaft India Trade is now very perplexing to this State; as it is the Darling of this Country, and is the chief Branch of our whole Commerce and Wealth, it mult in a particular manner affect us, io fee it invaded by France on one Hand, and the new Company in Flanders on the other: And this the more, becaufe the Imperial Court is faid to countenance and encourage the latter; and as theit Stock is fupported from other Mer. chants, nor enly from a neighbouring King dom, hur even from among our felves, and that they encreafe their Trade to a prodigious Degree, we have juit Apprehenfions that our Trade maft, firt or lait, feel the Confequences of it in a ferfible Decay. We have another Dicouragement in that Part of our Trade aifo, and that is, The New French Eat India Company begin to encroach upon our Colonies: They have obtained a Liberty of Trading to the Pnillipines, and other lfands in the Pof. Teffion of Spain; and have made a kind of Settiement upon Ginolo and Ternate Iflands, adjacent to our Spice Mllands, and are partly Spice Ilands themfelves. To confirn this, a Ship laden with Cloves, and other Spices and Drugs, artived lateiy at St. Malo's in France. Our Merchants are fo provoked at this, that they are eager to be allowed to fit out Ships of War from Batavia to preferve that Erade; but the States are not willing so let Things come to that Length.

## Hague, Septem. 29.

We have been long expetting a Conclution of the Difierences in the Upper Quarrer of Guelderland, and the more, becaufe Comzidioners were now fent from the States Ge-
neral, with more particular Inffruetions than ever in the long depending Cafe; and the States of Guilder were exhorred eametlly to put an End to it; or that otherwife the Stutcs General would take it particularly upon themfelves, do it by their Sovereignty, and oblige all Sides to agree. Which wami way of working had good Effer, it feems, and they are all come to an Adjuitment of their Quota's, or Proportions of Taxes, which was the main Thing that was in Difpure, and which had made a Breach among thofe Peos ple for almoit ioo Years pait.

## Faris, September 25.

Our Want of Money continues, or zather encreafes; and what littie the Bank pays, is far from being a Supply, war gather whets the Appetite of People to croud to the Office to receive the Money, and to encreafe the Mid. fery and complear the Ruin of our Trade. The Money which we were in Hopes mould fall by Degrees, as the King's former Arrers had intimared, till it thould he at a gar with our Neighbours, is now raifed highes than ever, infomuch that the New Species of Silver is a Kind of a newy Monfer, the Crown Piece being very little bigger than an Engliifs Shilling, and weighing no more than Thiteen Pence Sterling; and our Bank Bilis contimue at an extravagant Difcount, viz. from 36 to so per Gent:

## New-York, February 33:

The Proceedirgs againft Robert Lowther, Efq; she late Governor of Barhadoes, being a Suljeat of mucb Talk now in England, we infert the following Letter from the Reverend Dr. Gordon to bis Friends in Barbadoes, which contains a particular Account of two Days Hearing before the Lords fuffices.

GENTLEMEN,

WHEN Capt.Calder arrived the Day of Hearing all Complaints was fixed, and I was apprehenfive that my firft Complaint before it could have been read, would have come to be laft heard : And therefore, without preferring any Petition, a Letter was wrote by Mr. Alleyne to Mr. Secretary Craggs, inclofing Mr. Cox's Letter and Depofition, and a Depofition of Capt. Calder's proving Friere's Difobedience.

About the fame time, Friere's Letter by Potts was fent to the Secretary by Mr. Lowther, in one of his own, undertaking to jultify Frieres Conduct.

The Sccretary laid all the Letters before the Lords Juftices, who ordered them into the Council-Office to be heard with the other Complaints. The Council having fate the fame Day on my Hearing, my L.ord Prefident had the Goodnefs upon my telling him, We were teady with Mr. Cox's Affair, to order Sir Charles Cox's Petition for retoring his Brother to be next heard, though the laft on the then Lift: And thereupon I took out a Summons for Mr. Lowther's attending, as laft Tuefday on that particularly, and with a Copy of the Petition, fent him Copies of all the Letters annexed, thereby grafting Friere's Difohedience on Sir Charles's Petition, without a freih Complaint. Mr. Lowther the very Day the Council fate, and not before, lodged a Pe. tion for Ten Days time to prepate to make good his Charge, and inftruet his Council a gainft Mr. Cox's, and Sir Robert Raymond and Sin William Thompfon fpoke for him. But
the Solicitor General Mewed, That as Mr. Lowther ought to have been prepared even before the Sulpenfion of Mr. Cox, and to have tranfmitted his Proofs, as well as Keafons, to the Secretary and Lords of Trade under the Seal, he hoped rhe Croud of Earbadues Gentlemen, then attending their Excellencies for Juftice, would not be delayed on unreafonable Suggeftions. And ro Mr. Lowther's Petition was over-ruled, and they proceeded to hear Sir Charles Cox's Petition.

Wen Sir Philip York had done fpeaking, who was that Day our only Couniel (Mr. Rceves havin been taken ill) Mr. Lowther would fpeak for himfelf; which he did, to long, fo confufedly and fo excellently well (for Mr. Cox I mean) that Sir Robert Raymond and Sir William Thompfon refufed to fpeak for him, nor did they open their Mouths either of the Days.

He had the Folly to attempt to juftify his Conduct, in holding the Government in the Queen's Time, after Reccipt of the Order un der the Sign Manuel, till my Lord Prefident told him, He was amazed ar his Daring to juftify that Conduct before that Board.

That by the fecond Claufe of the Patent, even Sign Manuel, as to the Execution of that Patent, was made a Broad Seal. That this refufing to deliver the Government was High Treafon. That the only Defence be kuew of he could make for his Conduct, was his Majefties ACt of Grace: and that it would be great Indulgence in that Board, if they did not order him to be arraigned as a Traytor, and put him under the Scandal of Pleading the AEt at the Bat.
My Lord Chancellor fooke to the fame Pur: pofe, when he came to Ipeak in Juftification of Mr. Friere and his Conduct, abour Mr. Secretary Craggs Letters of the 25 th of March and the inth of June. The Secretary ftood up, and with great Mildnefs of Speech and Sharpnefs of Refentment, took notice of what was then faid, and arraigned his Knowledge of his Duty. He obferved, That when a Counfellor was fuf: pended, he is as much a Counfellor as before, and only kept from atting till the King's Pleafure thould be known.

That

That his Signification of the King's Pleafure by Letret, was a fufficient and undouhted Sirs. ninication of it, in things of much greater Moment, than whether a Counfellor hhould at or not.
That Peace and War were nerer any otherwife figinited, an! whatever Service his Magefiy had ahroad was intimated by his Principal Secrecary, that not only, but the whole Tenor of the Inftrections, and particulaty the latt, direfed the Governor to correfpond with the Secretazy; which could only be done by receiving as well is fending Intelligence. But however, te would fay this in Excule for Mr. Lowthes, That that was rot the Eirft of many fuch Royal Commends, fent in the fame individual Mamer, he had ventured to difobey. Scon aferwards he withdrew, and appeaied no more the nex: Day, although be was at the Council Office.
The Firlt of the Six Reafons Mr. Lowther went about proving, was about the Cuftom Houfe Officers Keprefentation, which he hung upon above two Hours, and was fo indulged in his own way of Defence, that he cut himielf down with advancing Falfhoods, which he thought the Lords could not diíprove him in, about the Practice and Cuftom of Barbadoes: But we had Evidences accidentally by, who explained and confuted every thing.

About half an Hour after Four the Hearing was adjourned till Ten next Morning, at which time the Lords met, and began with the Six Reafons as they lay in Order. Mr. Lowther was his own Counfel again, and Sir Robert Raymond would not fpeak for him.

The firf Reafon fet the whole Council in Amazement; for when Mr. Cox's Paper, that he laid, reflected upon him and the Committee, was read, it was fo full of Submiffion, Refpect and good Manners. that the Duke of Argyle, my Lord Chancellor and my Lord Townfend, upbraided him with pretending, to take Offence at fuch a modelt Pdper.
The Duke of Argyle told him, He believed that Board would not have refented it from the meaneft SubjeEt in Britain; for the Queftion was not, whether what Mr. Cox faid was true or not ; hut whether it was mannerly or not: And defired him to let them know, what No tions he had of his own Almighty Power and Grandure, and of the State of thofe under his Command, that the very next Man in Autho. rity to him durft not fpeak his Mind- My Lord Townfend faid to him, That he found, who differed from him in Opinion mult be cypreffed, and by what he could obferve (he faid to him) that it was the unhappy Fate of moft of the Gentemen in the Ifland: And inflead of proving that a Crime, the Lords would not let him go to the nexr, till they made him fenfible, that it was Criminal in him to call it fo.
The next, I think, was about difcharging me out of Goal, which be had heard enough of,
one would have thougnt, at my Tryal, so have made him athamed. However he fainity faid, They diícharged me witbout Bail, when there was an Information upon Oath. Te which my Lord Chancellor anfwered, we have already told you, He did his Dury if there had been Twenty Informations on Oath, becaufe the Thing informed of was not cognizable before a Juftice of Peace

Then they went to the Third, which was abour Difoteying a Warrant to deliver up NavalOffice Bonds, though the Warrant, when produced, mentioned only Certificates. And when Mr. Cox's Anfwer and Mr. Gouch's Examination on Oath were read, the Examination was. fo apparently partial and contradictory, that the Lord Chancellor called for Gouch two or three times, and long'd to have had the Exa. mination of him and Lenoir, as they had of poor tafelles, who made himielf, by his con:fufed Prevarications, appear blacker if poffible than he is.
Mr. Cox's Anfwer was allowed futficient, becaufe he offered- to fwear to it; for there was only the Complainanis Oath againft him, and thar was inconfiftent with it felf, as my, Lord Illay plainly made out. The asking Mr. Cox to fwear about an Office he had held ever fince 1698, was declared a Tyrannical Impofition, and with great Honour Mr. Cox was acquitted from that Reafon alfo.
The Fourth had been argued the Day before on the three Counfellors Petition, as had alío the Fifth about Pachécoss Annotio, and both over-ruled; and the Sixti? about Cancelling Navy. Office Bonds, had no manner of Proof to fupport it, nor was Mr. Cox's Anfwer thereto ever required by the Goyernor. As he was forced at laft to owis to the Lord Chancellor; and when asked, why he did not demand Mr. Cox's Anfwe: ? He replied, Becaufe the Crime was unanwerabie. Ulpon which my Lord told him, He, who could prejudge a Caule, though feemingt miter fo clear, muft have made a very partial Chancellor.

However the Sollicitor, for the Honour of his Client, would not let that pais tili he opened the Merits of it, and thewed by the Dates, That all the Sonds canceiled were in former Collegors Times when neither Lafcelies nor Gouch could know any thing of it, that the Commifioners of the Cuftoms had given Direftions to cancel Bonds on Proof withoue Certificate.

That a Lif of thoie Bonas, when cancelied, was afoully fent Home by Mr. Lane (which I got Cerrificate of trom the Office, and the Commilioners never baving found fault, was a funficient Approbation. Upon the wiole Mr. Cox was acquitted with Honour; The Reafons declated int oniy gronndlefs, but the Signing of 'em arbitrary. He is reftored to the Governisent, and Friere fent for Home to anfwer his Difobedience.

At laft, when Lowther 'faw we had proved the Difobes dience by Capt. Calder's Oath, which being a ingle Evidence we were afraid the Lords would have wanted a further Explanarion of that Matter. Eut Mr. Lowther, who always helped us out at a Dead Lift, produced the Minutes of the Fitith of Auguft, under the seal of the rlland, which cleared all Marrers to fully, that vee needed no furtice Pronf. Mr. Lightfoot got a great deal of Repuration by his linneft Opinion, there being no formal Complaint againft the Reft of the Council, ne Ceufure was par on them. And indeed, the ereat Regard of the Miniffry so Juftice, in fending for Fiiere Home in defend himfelf hefore they condemn him, is very conipicuous, eipecially in an Affarr where his own Scal and Teftimonial was Proof againft him.

During every Days Tryal there were grear Numbers of Epectarers, who unanimoully, when they ceme our, exprciied an utter Detcilation of Yo vile a Tyrant; even his own Friends abanduned him, and he was fo hanfomely (yet fo feverely) reprenaaded by the Lord Chancellor, Lord Prefident, Duke if Argyle, and ny Lord flay, and thas too to very ofren, tiarany one fenfible of the Impreffions of Honour and Shame, maft have funk under the juft Reproaches he was leaded with; and yer he flood it all, though with Confurion, however with Infoleace.

I have been the more particular in this Relation, that Mr. Lowsher's Friends may be convinced, however he may colour Facts in Barbadoes, he has nor the fame Arr here, where People are heard impartid!ly on borh sides, and Evidences be allowed their Due, and no mere than their due Weight.
Before I conclude. I can't forbear commending the indefatigable Pains raken by Sir Philip York, who alter he had made himfelf Maffer of his Brief, and wrore his Remarks on ir, let me meer him cuery Night before the Heariug, at his Chambers at Six, and for two Hours fhew'd me his Oifervations on the Brief, and gor every shing explained thar he thought dubious, or nor fully fer forth: And indeed, the luftre of our Succefs is onving to the advancegious Lighr in which he, with io happy an Arr, Shewed and sanged cerry particular fatt and Circumftance.
Ee pleafed to communicare this to cur Friends. Oa Tuefday nexs we go on on the general Complaine, and on Weanefday on the Lords of the Admiralies Complaint; We are in Hopes, notwithfanding he is heie, to get an Examination diret?d in Barbadoes, into the Patticuiars of our Complint, which would have been more compleat, had yu.ur general Reprefentation contained particular Fates' All the Gentemen, excepe my felf, are now our of Town, but have promifed to recur:, and homour the Hearing with their Brefence next Tueiday,

## GENTLEMEN,



HIS is a Mecting I have wifhed for with imparience, though my Affairs obliged me to delay it till now. I could not have a better Foundation for thinking well of this Affembly than the Charater my Predeceilor gave me of you, and I depend on the like hearty Inclinations on your Part, when you refleat on his Merit and anfection to you, and that he would not have made the Wiay fo eafy for a Perfon wholy unwotthy to come among you. We are both happy in a large Share of his Friendhip, and as we really have but one cominon Intereft, he will find it no difficult Matter to aEt upon his Refolutions of Serving us both at once, to as great Alvantage as his Capacity and great Credit at Home will enable him.
1 am the more encouraged in my Expeetatious from you, by the Loyalty of His Ma jefty and Confidence in my Conduct, which the meighbouring Colony has fhewn in the Manner of granting a Revenue. I have no Oue tion of finding the fame Difpofitions in you, and you need tot doubt of my Dividing my Time and Affections proportionably hetween the two Frovinces.
As chis Colony is daily encreafing in People, and the Land in Value, the Support of Go. vernment muft of Caurfe be eafier io raife than formerly, and the Neceffity of Officers to ferve in publick Stations for rhe fame Reafons grows daily greater. But I find that unhappily the Salaries of the Officers have been diminifhed, when thev ought to have heen encreafed, their Encouragement has been lefs and lefs, when their Trutt and Dury has been growing grearer
and greater. I hope you will find an effętual Remedy for this publick Grisvance; for in a free Country it is the People that fuffer, when there are not Hands enough, or thofe Hands not fufficiently itrengthned, on whom the Burthen of Government lies, and who are to anfwer for the Peace and Order of a Country.

While I am obferving to yon your own flourifhing Condition, I cannot. withour fome Concern, take Notice to you, That the Credit of to fine a Colony does fuffer by fo fmall a Sum of Bills, as I heat are yet unprovided: For I can attribute this to nothing but the long Interval fince your laft Nieeting, and I doube not buc you will take immediare Care to reAtote vour Credit now that you have an Opportunity.

If you can think of making any Laws that will te for the Benefit of the Country, I fhall very readily give you all the Affitance therein that my Powers will allow. And as a Proof, that I think your Interelt in all Refpects the fame with my own, I can affure you, That riever intend to leave this Country by my own Choice; and that what I do in a publick Poft, Iftill confider my felf as one that will have a confiderable Stake among you as a privàte Man, when I hall be,thought unfit to govern you any longer.

That which ought to have the greateft Weight with you, when you enter upon thofe Matters of a publick Nature, which I have recommended to you, is, That I do not fpeak of my felf, but arcording to the Powers and Intruations I have received from iny Royat Mafter, whofe bright and amiable Charader endears him to all Mankind, and whote feady and refolute Conduct has broke all the Meafures of the Enemies of his Government: So that he now enioys a peaceable Crown at Home, and holds the Ballance of Power Abroad.

An Extrall of a Letter from the Roman Mijfonaries in Chima.

THE Mandarins, who were fent to enquire into the Farticulats of the Earthquake, which hath. almot deftroyed the Province of Xenf, brought the follow. ing Account to the Emperor of China: On rie 1gth Day of June, at three of the Clock in the Murning, lome fmall Shocks were felt at Singanfou, the Capital of the Province, but they did little Damage. The fame thing happened at Seven - Clock ar Ning-hia, where the Shocks were neither long nor terrible: But at the fame tume it was more rough at Lantcheon, the South Gate whereof fell, as did the Walls of feveral Imall Towns. At Yong-ning:chin, the Mountains in the North were thrown to the South, though there was a Plain between of above two Leagues. That large Borough was entrely fwallowed up, withour leaving any Mark, either of Men, Houfes or Animals. Northward of the Town of Tongouei, the Earth opened, the Mountains fell, and falling rolled upon the Town, entering by the North Side, and paffing to the South ; fo that in the Twinkling of an Eye the whole Town was fwallowed up, and the Plain rofe in Waves to the Height of fix Eathom, or more the Houfes, publick Granaries, Trea. fury, Prifons and Prifoners, all buried under Ground; of ten Perfons, farce three could efcape: Of the Governor Hoang's whole Fa. mily, only himielf, a Son, and a Valet, were faved. At Thing ning-tchin, from three in the Morning till Eleven, the Earth trembled, thepublick Buildings and Walls to the South were thrown down. Above half of Mount Outai fell towards the South, and killed or
wounded a great Number of Men and Animals. On the gth of July a violent Shock chrew down the Walls and Houfes of the Town of Koeinning In fhorr, there is hardly a Place in the Province that is not the worfe for thefe Earthuakes.

OUl the Prifoners ar the Bar, fland convicted, one by a forromfut Confeflion, the other by plenary Evidence, of Consempts againt his Sacred Majelly King GEORGE: Bur before I procesd to Senenuce, is may norbe impercinent to expore the Sillinefs and Sinfulmets of your Crimes, by repeating what the Civil and Cumm Law Books fay concerning them, and theo I fhali beiefly fpeak to them as thex are a Violacion of the Divine Last. But becacure difaffected Perrons fpeak of the King and his Government with fuch mbecoming Freedoms as would be unmanserty to then Inferiots, and with fuch an Air of march. lest Impudence, as befpeaks shem out of the Fear of Juftice. It may be neceffarv to take a Vic.s of farme of the Genera! Heads of shis Offence, and the Punifhmencs astendiag its, that they may know when they incur Guile; And though they are fully predecermined in their own 0. pinions agaiof clear Conviction, they may ar leaft berfo difcreet as to reform their Manaers. All Contemprsagainf the Kiny's Perfon and Gevernment are highly criminal, and pumthable with Fine and Impriionment, and fomenmes with the Pillury, by Dilcretion of the Judges, upon Cotsfiderat on of aff she Circunntauces of the Cafe. Suchas Charging the Government with Oppreflian, or weak Adminiffration; Doing any AF which impliedly encourages Rebeilion; Spreading falfe Rumoirs concerning the King's Intentions; Charging bim with a Brearch of his Coinnation Oath; Speaking contempturufly of bim, as by Ckrfing him, \&cc. or giving out that he wouuts Wifdom, Valour of Steadinefs; or in general, Doing any thing which may leffen bim in the Efteem of his Subjeet s, ypeaken bis Goverrment, or trife. Fealoufies betwixt bima and bis People. But your Crimes do not ftop here,马ou have alfo denied the King's Title to the Cromen; and sinis Offence has formerly becn carried fo far, as to be adjudged an Overs At of companfing his Death: However, it is cerraully moft highly criminal, and pnnithable with Fire and Imprifonment, and alfo íuch infamous corporal Punifhmenr, as to the Diferetion of the Court fhall leem proper, according to the Heinoufnefs of the Crime and Circumfances of the Paries. As if a Man in Writing or Difconrfe ihall maintair, That the King is an Vfurter; or, That another has a better Title to the Croxon, or the like: Eor fuch Tasinuakious do manifeitly rend to raife Tumulto, and Diforders in theState, to alienate she Aftections of the People from the Prince, and incline them to favour the Pretenfions of anocher. And it is greatly impudent and prefumpruous for private Perfons to incerineddle with Matcer. of fo high a Narure; and it will be impoffible to pre-
ferve the Peace of Government, unlefis Subie?ts will quitedy fubmit themielves to thofe whom Provid nce has placed over them, and prefer the publick Good to their own private Inclinations and Opinions. For othe wife, whenever the Tiele to the Criwn fall happen to be contefted, it will be imporfible to end the Differetuce without perpecual Civil Broils and Difientions, and the Prince who prevails will be rempred to efleem thofe of the contrary Parcy, rather as Enemies than Subjects, if he finds them ready and detirous to lay hold of all Opporwnities to dinusb his Governmenr, and Thake off their forced Obedience. And fince there is no Tribuna!, bue that of Heaven, to which Princes can appeal for the Decifion of their Tisles, when that fcems to have declared fo far in Fayour of one, as ro give him quier Poffeftion of the Throne, the Publick l'eace, which is the End of all Government, requires a ductal Submiffion to him. And it would be the moft diftratted Madnets co give up chat Eate and Security, which we may enjoy from a peaceful Obedience, in Exchange for that Diforder Uncertainty and Bloodhed which cannor but be expected from an Atenpt to wreft the Scepter out of the Hands of our Prince ; and as it is the higheft ingratitude to make no other Re turns bur Dhoyaity, for all the Happine is we enjoy under his juft Adminiftration, fo it is the greateit Abrurdity to think, That the Good of the Community, for the fake of which all Government was inflieuted, ought nor to be preterfed co che difpured Title of a Particular Perfon or Family. All we can defire trom Government, is, The jectire Exjoyment of what tre may call our oxen; and whecher this or that Comperitor co the Crown be the Inftrument of this Happinefs to us, feems litele to concern us. Lee the Title of Oae out of Poffeffion of the Throne be never fo plasufible, is muft have is Original Foundaticn from fome pofixive law; which Law when it cannoc rake Effet with our involving a Nation io Difícord and Confufion (the Avoiding whereot is the very End of all Laws) it muft give way to the publick Neceflity of the State: For there can be nu Humane Inflitution whatloever, but nuift be limited by this implicir Referve from che firm Principles of Reafon, That mbenever the Execution of it Shall be abfolutely inconfiffent with the Happinefs of the People, for whofe jake it was ordained, it ought so far be fuppended. And herein the Wifdom of our Nation is brightly apparent, by adding a Now Limetation to the Law reiacing to the Succerfion of the Crown, and excluding all Papilfs from a Pombility of In heriting is; who, if they be true to their Engagements to their Own Religion, cannot but be falfe to thole they make to Ours, and can never be expected to execure thote Laws which they think void and repugnant to the Laws of God; or, to defend that Faith which they think damnable; or, to oblerve thofe Oarths, which feem to them to have been ordained for the Support of Irreligion. And from thefo Comfiderations they have been difabled from Inheriting the Growy, it feeming of abfolute Neceffity in our prefens Circumftances, for the Good of the Community, to make fuch an Alreiatiod in the Law; which, like all other Laws, depending merely upon the Policy of Man, reems to have nothing in it fo lacred, as to oblige the People unakerably to abide by if, to the Hazard of their Common Safery:

Peace

Peace and Happinefs, foit which it was frrtoro dained: For furely, there can't be fo much Dinger to the Comirion Goot from fuch an Alieration, as moln necefiatily foilow from the Goiernment of a Prince, whofe Conicience is inder the hilituence of thofe who are implacabie Enemies io the Religion of our Country, and who thiths himfelf bound, by bis Duty to God and his Church, to promote that intereft which we think our felyes under the like Obligations to oppofe: From which unhappy Circumitances wothing can be expected but endlefs Factions and Difcorass, and irieconcilesble Jealounes and Diffrults betwixt Prince and People; which if they do not occafion an open Rupture, will ar leaft he attended with fuch Convalfions and Uneafinefles, as will render a State of Government ficarce one Degree more fecure thana State of Anarchy and Confufion. And fince we have beea fo carefully delivered from theie Miferies, and have The Eftablifoment of the Succeeffon in the Illuftricus Houfe of $H A N N O V E R$ for our Security from them for the future, nothing can be more unreafonable than to deny the King, wiofe Government we are happy under, all proper Affurances of out Fidelity to him : for how can we expeat to enjoy the Privileges of Sub. jects from One, to whom we retufe to acknowledge our felves Subjeals; or hope for Protedion from One, whom we provoke to efteem us as his Enemies; or blame that Gce vernment for treatine us as Malecontenss, to which we give fo jult a Caure to rurpea our Fideliry? If we will confult the Law of Gud, th t will tell us, That the Powers which be are ordarn'd of God': If we will hear the Voice of Reafon, that will convince us, That not only the Peace and Safety of the Comisunity, but allo our own Prefervation, require us to pay a dutiful Obedience ta the Prince who governs ws; And can we think it unlawful to engage our felves to do what it is our Duty to do? If we will confult the Praftice of all Nations, that will thew us, Thas even Conquef, whici, is the wenkeft of all Titles, bas always been eficemed logive the Conqueror fuch a Right to the Obedience of the Conquer'd, that upon bis taking them into his Protellion, they bave in all Ages been ready to promi/e a reciprocal Obedi ence: And if we will confult our own Laws we fhall find them to direat us to Pay our 0 Bedience to she Prince zobo governs us.

By the Hebrew Law, he who behav'd timfelf contumaciounty againf the High-Prient, ot againf him who was hy God extraordinarily ordain'd to govern his People, was to be put ¢0 Death. And when Chriff, in the New Stitament, commanded to give Cafar his Due, couhtlefs he intended, That bis Difciples fould yield as great, if not a greater, Obedience unto tbe Higher Eowers, then what was Due
from the Fews wito their King; which St. Paul (who was beft abie to interpret his Ma. fter's Words) expounding Rom. xiii. does a= large delcribe the Duty of Subjetts, charging them, who xefit the Power of Kings, wirh no lefs Crinte than Rebucilion aguint' Gods Ordinances, and with a Judgment as great as their Sin , that they fhall receive to themjeives Demearion; and a little after he urgeth the Necelity of our Subiection. Not on? for Wrath, but a!fo for Corfcience jake, i.e. not only out of Feat of the Magiltrate, who bears not Fine Surord in vaim, nut aifo out of Duty too wards God, as knowing he is the Mizatter of God to us for Good. A Aid if the Maiming of a Starue of a Roman Emperor was punithed with Death, what Scverity can be toc harfh for thole who thus defpife Domizions, and Speak Evii of Dignities, who curfe, afperfe and deny their Supream, True, Lawful and Undoubted Sovereign; a King who has given his Subjects fuch itrong Affirances, so cone vincing Proofs of his Favour and Goodnefs, that it any one of us thould diftruft, he de ferves to forfeit them.
Bit to take off the Objections, which may be framed againft the Judgmenr to be now given, by thufe who would have fuch little Indifore. tions (as they call them) pa!s unregaided, and to become guilty of a pernicious Excefs of Commiferation towards Offenders. It may not be improper at this time to take Noitce or two things, wherein the Office of a Magifirate does confif, The one is, to preferve and keep up the Hunour, Dignity and juft Rights of the Prince, who bus em= ploy'd bim, and of the Publick, whofe Repre. Pentative be is, zuith a becoming State, with Gravity, Authoritative Bebnviour and a well. temperd Severity. Next, He is to ala like a true and faithful Transcript from the Original, an Interprésr and Executor of his Mafter's Will, to fee that this be divit declar'd and diligently obferv'd. By this Will I mean the Law: for this is the Authentick Will of the Prince, and the only Declaration of it, which SubjeEts are bound to take Notice of. Of this the Magitrate is to exaft a faithful Accoune and a Dunctual Oblervance; for which Reaion we otten find him term'd by Authors, Tine Living and Spesking Lasu. Now, though it be the Duty of a Magiftrate, and an ex: cellent Qualitication in him, to temper Juftice with Prudenee, and Severity with Gentlenefs and Forbearance; yet it muft be confefs'd mach more for the common Advaptage to have fuch Magiftrates as incline to the Excefs of Sharpnefs and Rigour, than thofe who are difpofed to Mildnefs, and Eafinefs, and Compaffion. For even God himfelf, who to highly recommends and fo frietly enjoyns
all thofe humane and foft Difpofitions upon other Occafions, yet pofitively forbids a Judge to be mov'd voith Pity The ftriat and harin Magiftate is the better Reftraint, the fronger Curb; he contains People in Bounds, and preferves a due Awe and Obedience of the Laws. The mild and merciful One expofes the Laws to Contempt, makes Magiftracy cheap and leffens the Prince, who made both the Law and the Magiftrate, in the Eyes and Efteem of his People. So that there mult go two Qualifications to the Capaciating a Man to difcharge this Office compleatiy, Integr;ty and Courage: The firlt cannot fubfift alone, but framds in need of the fecond to fupport and back it. The former will be fure to keep the Magitrates Hands clean from Avarice and Pariality, and Refpen of Perfons; from Bribery and Gifos, which are the Bane and uter Exterminators of Truth, and from any other Violation of Juitice: This will alfo be a Guard to him againt his Pafions, the Aver. froms or Affetion he may bear to the Parties concerned; and indeed, all other Kefentments, which are but fo many Enemies and Lindtr. minets of Right and Equity. But then he will find great Occafion for Courage tox, 10 fand his Ground againit the Mennaces and imporious Solliciations of Great Men, the Requetis and Importunities of Friends, who fancy they have a fort of Right to difpole of bim and will nor take a reafonable Kefufai to harden againft the Prayers and Tears, the loud Cries and oitter Complaints of the Miferable and AHtifed: For als thefe aie very forcible Inducements, and a great Violence upon Reafon and Dury. Aud the Truth is, This Firmnefs and inflexible Conftancy of Mind is the moft Matterly Virtue and particular Excellence of a Magiftrate, That he be neither terrified or fubdued by Greatrels or Power, or melted by Miferies or deplorable Circumfancer: Thefe are what very baye Men are oftein tranfported by, and therefore it is the greares Praife to continue Proof againt them. For though being fofthed by the latter, has an Air of good Nature, and is more like iy to prevail upon. the better Sort of Men; yet either of the Extreams is finful, and both foreign to the Merits of the Caufe, which is the only Thing which lies upon a Fudge. The Motives to Pity then are very dangurous Cemptations, and what a Man in Authority nught as much to fop his Ears againtt as Promiles and Threatnings: for even that God Himelf, who is Love and Mercy in Perfeation, has difcountenariced this uniealonable Compafion, and the fame Legillatos who faid, Thous nonit not recerve a Gifl to blind thy Eyes therewith, net her hait ribut acespt the Perfon of the Migbty, found it nulés ne-
ceffary for the Goot of Mankind, and the equal Diftribution of Juftice, no iefs agreeable to his own Grodnefs to add this othea Command, Thou foalt not frovour a poor Man in bsis Caufo.

Bur to return to our prefent Bufinefs; Since Punifbnents are not to be confidered barily, but with Refpeat to the Qualities, former Behaviour, and other Circumftances of Ofenders, a Wife Man, Scneca faith, will be ready to mitigate the Punifment of a guiliy Perfon, When his Sorrow for his Fuult gives him promifing Hopes of Amerdment, and wher he perceives he adted not by Principle, but only our of Ralhnefs and Folly. This feems to be your Cale, - - And therefore I am inducd not to infliat an infamous Corporal Pu. nifhment upon you; bur do adjudicare and decree, That you, ... - mall ftand under this Court-Houfe for the Spice of one Hour on swo Marker-Days, with one Paper fixed on your Breaft, and another on your Back, with rhefe Words writ upon them in fair Charaders, 1 feand bere for fpeaking con-
 GEORGE You mall alfo pay to the Re giter of this Court Twenty Marks. Stering for the King's Ufe, and pay the Cinarges of this Profecution.

But as to you, - - , your former Behai viour, even to this Hour, will rather aggrak. vate than mitigate your Punifhment : It is nocorious, That you have been a conitent DiIturier of the Peace of this Place; That you have on many Ocsafions demean'd your felf infolemly to your Superiors, and been guily of Difobeying and publickly Affonting Magititraces And as the Majefty of the Mrince is violated in the Affront of the meaneft Pers fon who ads by bis Authority, fo your life for fome Yeass paft may be jufty faid to be One continued Cuntempt againft the King, and to the Ofence of Epeaking Scandalous and Contemptuous Words of Him, you have added the Sin of Curfing Him. I heartily wifh the Seatence I now pals may have a good Effect upon you; I do adjudicare and decree, That you, - - thall fland in the Pillory in this Market.Place, for the Space of two Houts on two Market Days; That afterwards on the faid Days you fhall be tied to the Tail of a Cart, and be drawn rousd two of this City Squares, and then you thali be whipped on your bate Back with Forty One Lalhes, and be imprifoned till you lave paid the Charge of this Profecution. I hall conclude what I have faid to you with the Advice of che wildet of Men, curle not the King, no not in thy Thougbts; for the Eirds of the Air will revent tobe Secret, and thax which bath Wings wiil utter the Voice.

Refolved Nemine Contradicente, that the advifing of the Directors of the South Sea Company io fet the Stock to fale by Subfrription at high and extravagant Prices, or to Declare that the high and extravagant Dividends for Chriftmas laft, and 12 Years after, by any Perfons in the Adminiftration, was a moft notorious Breach of the Truft repoled in them, to the Prejudice of His Majefty's Government, and the Intereft of the Kingdom.
The reft of the Refolutions were chiefly againft the Direfors.

Yefterday the Houfe of Commons paffed the Bill for prohibiting the Ule and Wear of Callicoes.

A Motion was made for a Claufe in the Scheme Bill, to impower the prefent Suh and Deputy Governour, and Directors of the South Sea Company, to take under Confideration the faid Bill, and lay before the Houfe a Propofal in what manner they can put the fame in Execution, fo as to make eafy the Proprietors of the Redeemable, but on the Queftion put, was carry'd in the Negative, on a Divifion, Yeas 147, No's 183. Then in a Committee went thro' the Bill, and ordered a Repart on Wednefday.

This Day the Commons resolved Nem: Con: to oblige all Persons, who had any Stock taken in for them while the Bills were depending, without paying Money for the rame, to refund the Difference to the SouthSea Company, and ordered a Bill to be brought in purfuane to this Refolution.
The Lords read the Calico Bill, and ordered it a Second Reading on Thurfday; and the Ealt India Company to be heard againft, and the Norwich Petitions for it.

To His Excelicncy Col. Sporsterod, Governor of Virginin, \&x.

The MEMORIAL of Wiliam Keich, Gevernor of Pennlylrania.

SIR,

HAVING duly confidered your Letter of the 6 th of lant March. in Arfwer to my Exprefs, wherein you are pleared to fay, That the Tributary Indians of Virginia have given folemn Afutances unto your Government, That they will not for the future pais Potowmack River, nor the high Ridge of Mountains, extending along the Back of Virginia ; provided that the Indians to the Northward of Potowmack and to the Weftward of thofe Mountains, will obferve the fame Limis: And that this is the Propofition fignified to the Pennfylvanis Indians, feated upon Safquehannah River hy the tw? Beits then fent to the afoiedaid Virginia Tributaries, which I received.

Hereupon I take I, eave to inform you, Sir, That the fame Ridge, which you call the Virginia or Appalachy Mountains, exiends it felf Northward, through the Province of Pennfylvania into the Government of NewYork ; and that all cur Indians upon the River Safquehannah, are fevied to the Eaftward of thefe Mountains. Wherefore the Conditions you propoíe feen to te more applicable to the New York Indians, known by the Name of the Five Nations, who live to the Wefward of that Ridge, than it can be to ours, who are feared amongt our own Settlements to the Eateward of it, and who feldom or never pais the River Pornwmack, unlefs it be when they go a Hunting for Fifhers, towards the Branches of Wabath and Ohio; which they conmonly do in the Fall of the Year, and do not ietarn before the Month of hay following.

I would furthe reprefent to you, Sir, That the Belrs which I fent on you lalt Augult from our Satquehannah Indians, did not only mear to fecure a perfect Peace and good Underftanding between them and the Virginia Tributanies, but a!fo berween them and all, or any other Indian Nations to the Syuthe ward, who are in Amity wirh the Virginia Tributaries, and hold a Fienily Correfpondence with your Government: So that as often as you have any Opportunity, either of renew. ing former Treaties, or of making new Ones. with the Carawbre's, Chirokees, or any other Southern Nation if you will pleafe particularly to mention and include the Peim!yl. vania Indians upon Safquehanaah, feated to the Eaftward of the above Ridge of Mountains, the Province of Penufylvania will nor only moft gratefnlly acknowledse the Eavour of your Countenance and Protection, but alro will readily concur to bear a reafonable Pro. portion of the Charge, which you may be at in accomplifhing fuch Treaties.

You very well know, Sir, That Pennfylvania, which is Three Degrees in Breadth, and exiends Five Degrees Weft from the River Delaware, muft Border upon his Majefty's Dominion of Virginia, to the Weftward of Maryland; and upon New-York to the Northwand of New Jerley. So that it is no lefs the Interalt of so fmalla Colony as Penifylvania, than ir is unquellionably thelr Duty, to culti. vate a perfect Eriendihip and conftant Agree. ment with two fuch powerfu! and rich Neigh. bours, minofe Protedion we are encouraged to hope for, thot only as we are dutiful and loyal Subjefts to the fame mof gracious Soverrign; butallo as having the fame End in View, to maintain and pronote, as much as in us lies, the Britifh Intereft, and His Majefy's Dominion on this large Continent.

Thefe Searimentr, Sir, joined to a moin perfert Regard and Eltem sor your Perfon
anic Chrafer, have brought me at this Time tr. viait upon you here; and it I may be fo happy to have my honeft Intentions, for his Majuefty's Service, well received and approved hy your Excellency, end the Honourable Gentiemen of Mis Majellys Council of this ancient Colony and Duminion, 1 thall return to $P$ ?rnfylvania with inexprefible Satistaction to my Saif, as well as a gentral Contenment to the good People of that Province.

Words of nay Letter in !ie undet, as ti, the Sifuation of your Salquelimen lodias: However, whethe the be lerted on the 0 , it or Weir Side of the Mountains, ftlll I ihink the Bounds propofed may ferve as proper Limits, even between your and out Indians: For it meither of them crofs Pormma $k$ River, they cannor in their feveral Coaries come ar one another, without pufing the high Rudge of Mountains, which is to be'their Boundary, where that River ceafes; and in this Seafe only, you will be pleafed, Sir, to underfland what I had the Honour to propofe in my Letter of the 6th of latt Month.

As, duing my Adminiffration herc, this Government had, in all its Negoriations wilh the Indians, regarded equal! $y$ with irs own the Safery of its Neighburs, fo you will do us the Jifitice to be affured, Tiar whenever a favourable Opportunity thall offer for future Fraties with the Catrarbas, Chirokees, and other Sourhern Indians, this Govemment will in a more particular Mauner, regard the interstts of your Province, and the Security of the Iudins telerinders its Protection.

The Govestimert of Virginia will always retain the like Sentiments with you, That the Subjects of the fame Sovercign, however divided into dititect Governments, ought fill to be united ir Aftection to each other; and will theretore never be wanting, in any Office of Friendifip and Benevolence, towards the Prowince of Penntylvania, being entirely fatisfied, That the fame Principles of Dutv and Loydty to Our Sovereign anit the fame View to promote and extend the Britifh Interett and Domanion, on this Conrinent. will more and more enereafe the Bonds of mutual Friend. thip betwen thefe two Colonies; and that whell the withed for Time fhall come, that the Settienents of both tiall exiend fo far We:tward as to bozder on each orher, the Inclinations of buti Governments will Atill be proportion'd to their Powei to affilt one dnether

It remains, Sir, that I affure you, on my Part, of the Pleafure I have in the Occafion which has brought ycu hither at this Time, where'ty an Opportunity is given me to renew to you the Piofeflions of a true Refpect and Eriendhip, to teftify my Readinefs to oncur with you in promoting His Majeity's Scrvice, and to give you Prools of my fincere inclination, to contribute whatever is in my Power to the Service of the Province uider your Government.

All things being prefently get in Readineis, the fown ftrongly torinied, and the Pcople heirg well affected to Gov. Moore, fruftrated Gov. John fon in his Attempr: After they had fired three Shot upon Johnfon's Party, they came to fome Capitulation, and put it upon this Iflue, That both Parties, when mey fhould hear that Governor Nichoifon was arrived at the Bur, fhould have a free Choice of one of the Council each, to go to Governor Nicholfon, and be in:formed which thould wait on him, either Moore or Johnfon; and that they would both wait for this Gnal Deififion, and lay by this Difference till then.

This Contention was fo foon made up, when both came to Action, that ahout three Hundred Mea from the remoser Parts of the Coun try, came to Charles Towa the next Monning atter it was all over; and being come fo far when they could leaft fpare Time for fuch an Enterprize, they leemd much difpleafod with Governor Moure tor this Baulk from Action. aud hoicly told him, That he had made it up too eafy, and if he did not fecure the Ringleaders and Abetors of this Faction, they would never come at his Call any more Ar. cordingly two were imprifoned to appeate them, and Capt. Hi;efly confined on Board the Phenix Man of War.

The Sveres and Mukovites go on witi their Militay Preparations, though they bort talk much of Feace, and tell us, that the Ple niporentiaties ate on both Sides appoinied, its order to meet and trear of it; bur People are fo prejudiced to the Difadvantage of their Intentions upol that Head, that they imagine nothing iefs fincote than what has been given out of that Matter: So chat if Wat enfues, 'twill he but what is expected.

Epeated Injuries in their Trade the Dutch have long fuffered from the Corfairs of Tunis, Tri poli and Algier, and having ap plied by their Ambacadors at Conltantinopis, to procure Sa tisfaction and a Truce with thofe Rovers, but without Effer; though ever the Porte interefted themfelves on their Behalf. They have at length refolved to fit nur a Squadron of Men of War to make Reprifals and proteit their Trade, and the Ships are getting ready with all pofible Expedition, which, tho ${ }^{2}$ they may not be able much to annoy or hurt the Rovers, may yet prevent the Damajes the latter might do wiem, and bring them to fuch Terms as there feems no other way left to engage them to.
The king of Sweden has made prefling Inftances to the Court of Great Britain, that the Sailing of the Squadron defigued tor Sertice in the Bultick, may be haftened with all poffible Expedition; and, we are cold, that in a few Days all the Ships that are to compoíe the fame, will fail for Black Stakes, the Place appninted for the General Rendezvous.
They write from Cadiz, that five Ships, of which no is a Man of Wat, are lately arrived in that Port from the Spaniin Welt Indies, laden with the following valuable Commodities, viz Eight Millions of Dollars, Tobacto, Snuff, Brazil-Wood, Hides, E゙c.

## London, March 25.

Affairs on the Side of Hungary are but in a doubtful unfetled Polture, and the Motions of the Turks feem to give no little Alarm. They continue to march their Troops towards the Frontiers, where their Numbers daily increafe. they fill their Magazines, are ftrengthning their Fortifications of the Barrier Towns, and aie making many other fuch like Signs of

Hoftilities; though at the fame Time they talk very fair, and give the Imperial Court good Words, and by their Miniffer there have affured the Emperor that they intend nothing againt his Majefty's Dominions, or to the Diladvantage of the late Treaty of Poffirowitz: But whether thefe Intidels have not learn'd the Method which has of late been much in Ule, of meaning the Reverfe of what they fay, mufa be left to the Event to make appear; and by the way, though they may intend otherwife than they act, and man Pence where they threaten War yet it mult be al lowed to be very juft to fuifeet thofe who by the whole Tenour of their Attions contradie all the hold Affuranccs shey give out.

The Poles keep quit, and 'tis no litte Sur. prize to their Neighbours that they do fos there being a very great Body of Malecontents, who are not wanting in their Attempts to render then otherwife; but 'tis thought in deed to he rather owing to their Incapacity of ating to Advantage, than any real Inclination in them to Peace, that lias been hitherto chiefly inftrumental in preferving the publick Tranquility; but how long this happy Situation of things may continue there, is uncertain, and the more fo, as there are thofe that infinuzie, That the Poles have fome very powarful Neighbours, who flatrer themfelves, that they thould find their Account in keightning the Animufities amongit them, and pufhing things to a Rupture; fo that if Marters fhould foon take a Turn to their Detriment, it ought to be no manner of Surprize to us.

By Letters from Copenhagen, we have an Account, That her Danth Majefty died there on the 5 th Inftant, in the 54 th Ye I of her Age, to the great Regret of the whole Court. She was a Daughter of Guftavus Adolphus, Duke of Mecklenberg. Guftraw, and was married to the King of Denmark in the Year 1695.

The Peice fo much talk'd of botween the Swedes and Mufenvites, 'as faid, is now like ly to go on, through inc Interpofition of the Court of France; but this dous not meet with entite Credir here, and we wait with no litele limpatience to be fet right in that Matter.

The Congrefs of Brunfwick is again talk'd of 25 a thing neat at hand, and tis faid now. that feveral of the Northern Powers ate noi a litile follicturs to have it formed, which, if truc. may produce much fooner than was expected.

Two Diys after, the Lords defign'd to have examined Sir Fobn Elunt, the grand Projector of the South-Sea Scheme, who had been fummon'it to appear before them; and it was genesally expected that he would make great Dif. coveries: But inftead of thar, he would not fo muck as be fworn to anfwer to fuch Interrogatories as thouid be put to him; alledging, that he had already been examined befure the Secret Committee of the Houfe of Commons, and io fuch Extent of Affairs, that unlefs he lesd a Copy of his former Examination, he coutid not remember every Particular ; and as no Man is obliged to accufe himfelf, he would not run the Hazard of Prevaricating The Lords were much furprized at this extraordinary Proceeding ; but $u_{i}$ pon a Surmize that Sir folm Blugt mighe thereby defign to bresk the Harmony that had hitherto been preferv'd, in this nice Affar, berween the iwo Houfes Their Lordhips rhought fit not to thew immediattly their Indignation againt his Oottinacy. After he had been order'd to withdraw, their Lordinips debared, how they fould proceed in this unprecedented Cale; And it unluckily fell our, That tome ungracious Refiections were made aganit thofe in Power by a noble Duke, who obferved that the Government of the teft of Frinces was, fumurimes, made incolerable to theis Subjetts by il Miniters; which his Grace illultrated hy the Eample of Sejanus anho had made a Divition in the Impetial Lami is and rendred the Reign of the Empetor Clumhers odious to the Rumans. This nome ReHetion was highty sefented by the Earl of Stanhope, who took upon him to vindicate his Colleagers; and brought in feveral inftances finm the Romantilitory patticularly that of the Great Partion, 3rutes who in order to alfert the Lithety of Rome, and free it from Tyrants, facrificed lis own degencrase Son. My Lord Standope fpoke with fo greit Vehemence, that finding himple saten biddenly with a volent Head-ake, he went homsand wascuppd, which eafed him a little. The next Morning he was let Blood; and contintied pretty well tili about fix a Clork in the Evening, when falling into a Drowzinef, his Phyficians thoughi fir to order hima Glyfter ; but as the was turning himfelf to receive it, he fell on his Face and was infiantly lutiocated The new's of his Death being brougat to the King; Lis Majechy
was fo fenfihly touch'd with it, That he conld not ear his Supper, and his Majefty retired for two Hours into his Clofer, to lament the lofs of fo able and fo faithful a Minifter, of whofe Service his Majefty had fo great Need, at this critical Juncture. We thall, in a proper Place, give our Readers the Charafter of that great Man; and, in the mean Time, take Notice, that,: iwo days atter being Febr. 7th, Mr Secretary Craggs was taken iil of the Srnall Pox, which for fome days, was unattended with any ill Symptom; But whether the ftriat inquiry into the Mifmanagement of the South Sca Scheme, and the Apprehention of his Father's, or himfelf, being involv'd in shat odious Affair, ftruck a fatal Dimp upon his Spirits, he died on Thur fáay the 36 th February, about fout a clock in the Attarnoon, at the very time that the Report of the Secrer Committee was reading in the Houfe of Commons. Was read the fecond 「:me, and a Morion being made fur cunnmiring is cul a Cummitree of the wione- Houfe, the thine ctinf rid a hivh Detate, in which Mr. Robert Waloole, Mr. Heath, and fome uthers, infined for the Affirnarive; and Mr. Milner, Mr. Sleper, Mr. Clarton, and Sir fofeph fekyll tor the Negative: And ir was, ar lati, carried for the $t$ iner by d Majority of 237 Vnices agzinf 839 . A Queltion was afo terwards purs whether it be commited so triada; or Morday next? And it was carried for the lacter.

Gazedor and the Major took faeth Horfes, and ordering only four ot the beft mounted Dragoons to go with them, bidaing the roft follow 3.5 they could made the beit of their Way to Birlemont. where they put into the fame mn at which the two faid Gentlemen had foop, of which they hat Intelligence by a Poftillion which they had fenc before to make Enquiry. Mre Guidot entering the Ina met Mit. Knight, who with his Compunion inftamtiy yeilded themfelves Prifoners to him and the Major, Soon afrer, Mr. Knights Son, and anothat Englifh Gentleman, arrived as Tirlemont, who being alfo feized, iney were aliffur carried back to Braflels: Arriving about one of the Clock in the Morning the $3 d$ Infunt at the ourer Barrier of that Place, whethes they had difatehel Advice of their Succeis, therf: Found there a Coatch with four Hories, a Derathoment of 12 Dragoons to relieve the other, and a Letter from Count Wrange? with a Warrent inclofed from front the Meto quils de Prie, ordering Majoz Erandon to carry Mr. Knight to she Citadel of Antwerp, witheur pating thro Briffcls Mr. Knights Son wert with his Father to the Citadel, Mr. Guiscoct having at the Merquis ofe Prie's Defire waited on him as foon as he got to Bruffols to acquaint him with his Procecd. ings ; went the third in the Evening to Antwern, the Marquis Faving ordered that none thould be admitted to ipsak to the Prifoner except the Gentieman who was taken with him, and he only in 31 . Gazdot's Prefence and Hearing. Mr. Knight is kept in fafe Cultody by an Oficer who lyes in the fa me Room with him, and four Centinels withoui, and as many within the Houie, and is not al lowed the wie of Pen, Inik and Paper.

This I muft confefs is the preferie Pratice, but is a yery modern one, and leaves a vaft Power in the Judge to controul, or even fubvert the Trgals by Juries: For though at prefent the Bench may be filled by Perions of great Learning and Integrity, yet ins future Ages there may arife fuch corrupt Judges as have formerly been, who, upon their bare Allegation, may fer afide any Verdiat.

There are indeed fecret Reafons againft this Bill, which no Man that knows the Law dare owin. It is a common Prattice for a Clerk of Affize, and his Affociate, to receive Money to excufe the Appearance of Men returned upon Juries; and the Under Sheriff's Office will receive a confiderable Lofs if this Bill Thould pafs. Som Great Men alfo may think it too great a Dimination of their Powes, who, having the Nomination of Sheriffs, will, by this Bill, lofe their Influence in the Return of Juiies: which. in feveral Counties, has been made llie of to fupport very great Oppreflion. I could fay much more upon this Subject, but I believe there's enough for your Journal.

Death was the fire Mijuife to all Children, and Infants paffed immediacely fiom the Womb to the Grave. Who would not burft with Grief, to fice the Grock for 3 future Generation hang on the Breafts of their dead Minthers? To what Part of the Chrinizn World their Views are diested is not عeitain; however, the Imperial Court feem révived not to be manting to shemfelves, but to keep an Eye upon their Motions on athe Side of Hungrey; in corder to this the Emperor is not only compleanng his fingimentas bas allo raifing in Niew Ones, tcur of Horfe and iwo of foot. Though tis, upon the whole, hoped the Soorro may yer blow over, whish, fall where-ever it would ia Eurpe, might at thistime, from the adverfe Siruation of Things, prove more derimental to the geacrai Hupoine's, than eis eafy to imagine, or proper to reprefent.

## Gersa, April 2 2.

This Day died the Merquis de Villa Major, the Spanih Envoy here, after one Day's llinefs. The Plague at Toulon, aco cording to our Leters from Proveace, encreafes more and more; fince the loth of March, when the Infection began there, to the zit of this Month 949 Perfons died of it, and 177 inferted Houfes have heen fhut up: They have there only fix Ioung Surgeons, one Phylician, and one Capuchirs Monk to adminifter the Sactaments to the Sick; upon which the Bihop has not only ordained feveral young Mer to affift that Monk, but has likewife defired the Bithop of Aix to fend fome Esclefiaticks thithers but his Anfwer was, he could fpare none, becaufe the Peftilence is not entierly ceafed there, and that befides, abundance of Chilidren and others, die of the Small pox, and other Diftempers, merely for want of Nurfes ro tend them. The News from Marfailles is lef's favourable than we expelted, fince the Eafter Faftival was nor celebrared there, and the confeflion of the People was deferred to Whirfontide: 'Tis added, that the Mieazles
and Small pox make a grear Havoke in that Town, and that a rich Farmer who paffed the Barriet witbout Permifion, was hot to Death, tho he offered 10000 Livies to fave his Life.

## London. fune 17,

The War berween Pcland and Turkey is not yet begun, as both Armies are on their March towerds the Frontiers, 'tis feared that we may foon hear of a Rupture on that Side.

On the stb Inftant ariived here the Ship Queen Ann Gally of White Haven, burthen about 140 Tons William Lowes Ma?cr; who seports that on the 12 th of June laft, he Sail'd from Cork in Ireland, bound for Potomuck in Virginia, having on board a Cargo of European Goods; and that on the $12 t h$, Day of July abour fixa Clock in the Morning in the Latitude of 41 Degrees and 52 minit. The name of the Mip and Mater (who was of that Country) he could not learn: She bore down upon hirn and Commanded the faid Lowes on Board in his own Boat, Thereafter the Pirates took his Boat. boarded his Ship, broke open her hatches, Plundered her, carriea away all the Cargo, and moft of the Provifions on boards and then fove the Ships Boat to pieces ; cut down her Main Maft and caft it inro the Sea with all its Tackie and Apparel. And aftes thaing kepe faid Lowes fixteen Hours and bear and abured feveral of his Mariners, they gave him his Ship again; in which difabled and Melancholy Circumitances he was recelfifated to porcesed to the neareft Eort in order to recruit and repair his Ship: and on the 35 th Inftant being hapily favoured with fair Weather he made the Iand of Cape-Ann.

On the isth Capt. Rubifon arrived here in a Sloop from Rhode Iflarid. On the $17: 5$ Capt. Ellifon arrived in a Sloop from Boiton and Hook in a Slocp from Jamaica and yeferday Ehenezer Coffin in a Sloop from Nantucket with Fi!h and Oyl arrived here.

They alfo Report, that one William Chafe Mafter of the sloop bound from Rhode Itland to Barbadoes, The left Rhode Ifland abous the ifth of June laft, and was raken according to the Report of the Pirates about the ad of July, her Cargoe was Chiefly Horfes and about one Hundred and five Sheep which they took from her, and feveral of our Paffengers faw thern on Board their Ship. ## ROME, April z.

HE following Account of the death of the late Pope, written by an Englifh Gendieman, who being then at Rome, was an Eye-winneli of what he re. lates, cannot but be very acceptable, and as it contains feveral curious Paro ticulars, we think fit to oblige our Reader with inferting fome Pant.

Rome, dpril 8 The late Pope Johno Frano cis Albani was a Nutive of Urbino, and eleared to this Honour, November: : 21700 . and then took upon hum the Name of Clement Xl. (the Day of his Eleftion being on the faftival of St. Clement) The Character he bore in the World, was thar of one who affected Peace, and sacrificed much to that End He was generally belov'd, and did fome Publick Aat. ions; but was naturally timorous, and frequently terrify'd into Meafures contrary to his own Intereff, and to that of the Ecclefia. fical $S$ zee How far he was guilty of Ne. potifn Time mult difcover, tho it is not an Objettion urg'd ftrongly againft him; and all the prudent Relations of a Pope preferve that Secret lafe, at leaft during the Life of their Patron. As to his Perfon, he was of a graceful Prefence; and his inward Accomplinh. ments, tho not bright, yet not too obffure: In fhorr, he filld she Chair as handfomely as moft of his Predeccffors. He was taken I:1 on Monday, Mrich 6. in the Pontifical Palace on Mount Cavallo, and died on the Wednefday following ahmur one in the Af rernoon, after.a Reign of Twenty Years, Three Months. and Twency fix Days, at the Age of Seventy two. About an bour after he was dead. Cardinal Annibal Albani, his Nephew and Chamberlain of the Holy See. declared his Uncle dead, thewing his dead. Corpfe before the Publick Notaries, and taking a Seal Ring from his Finger deliverd it to M . Rarponi, Mafter of his Houfhold, who deliver'd it to
the firft Congregation of Cardinals, where it was broke in their prefence : Soon after, the great Bell of the Capitol was toll'd, to give certain Notice of the Pope's Death; and im. mediarely the Goals were open'd and the Prifo. ners fer at fuil Liberiy. On Thurfiay March 9, the Body difembowel'd and embaim d, was carryed in a Sort of an open Bed from the Place rafter having been expofed for above halif the fame day to publick View) to the Chapel of Sixtus $V$. in the Place of the Vatican attend. ed by the Papal Light-Horfe, the Swifs FootGuards, the lare Popes Menial Seryants, and the Jefuit Penirentiaries of St. Peter's Church. all finging folemnly with Wax-Lights in their Hands: Behind followed Cannons reverfed, Drums and Trmpets in Mourning. In the above mentioned Chapel the Corpie was repofited for that Night, and guarded by the Penitentiaries, Soon a fier it was removed inio the Chappel of the Holy Sacrament, where the Feet lay to the grated Door. to be kiffed by all who were ambitious of that Honour. It was particularly obferved. that almof infinite was the Num. ber of the Female Sex who paid this Rerpect to a dead Pope, though withont particular Licence, they cannot be permited into his Prefence, nor even into the Palace where he did refide when living. This Ceremony continued for near three Days.?
After this pormpous Manner the Funeral of the lare Pope was celebrated till March 20, as hy this Lerrer, when the Cardinals entered by Pairs into the private Cells appointed for the Conclave, the Particulars too tedious to infert now.

of a Council of War; and ordcred the Che: valier Langon to out to Sea in Purtuit of the Burbarians: which be accordingly did, and uted fo great Diligence, thas he came up with the Algerine Admiral, fought him brave. ly, took him, and brought him Prifoner into this Iftand.

## Eondon, April 29.

They talk dubioutiy of the Preparations and Motons of the Turks on the Erontiers of Hurgary; and as their Numbers rather increafe than diminith there, the tair Proteffa. tions and Affurances they have given of their having no Defigns to the Difadvantage of the Peace of Paffarowitz, leffen in Credit, and lofe Ground every Day; and the rather, becaufe, though they thould have no immediate Intention to aft on that Side; yet if their Vievis are directed to Poland, they mult of Courfe involve the imperial Court on $B=$ half of the later. And therefore they tell us, That the Emperor has given the neceffary Orders to prevent all Surprize, and that the Fiontier Towns, the Magazine and the Army. fhould all be putinto a Condition fuitable to what ve: the Neceffity of Affirs may require.
Bya lettertoa Gentleman of this City we hear, that a Matter of a veffel arrived in that Port from Nants, Hath made Declatation, before the faid Commandant, That he the Mafter, making the hef of his Way up the Channel, did, the isth of April, when he was go: about the Heighth of Dartmourt, meet at Sex with an Algenine Erivatcer of about io or :2 Guns. And further faith, that when he lay at Cosfique, there put in there a Dutci Ship, the Muffer and Men of which did declare there, that they had been attackid the Day betore with the faid Privateer, who much endeavoured to board his Ship; but the Seas punning wery high prevented them, and occalioned their Efeape from their E. nemy.

We have Ail! imoft fad Complaints of the Procesdinge of the Smugglers and Owlers in Kent, who ari grown io intolerably outragious and impulent, that the Cuitom-Houfe Officers are no manner of Check upor them. They bring their Goods a flare in open Day. light, and terid the French Sloops which come upon the Coalt with Brandy, $\mathcal{O}^{\circ} \mathrm{c}$. by Fourty and Fifty in a Gang: fo that at prefent there's no Power fufficiert to oppofe them. And they tell us, That one of the King's Officers was thot by them a few Days ago in the Exercife of his Duty, and ro render him a

Terror to others, they fabb'd him in about a Dozen Places after he was dead.

Itey write furcher, That asothet Officer, for whom thofe Mifcreants had a fmall Res gard, falling into their Hands a few Days after the Commitment of the former Fad, they did not think proper to erear him in fuch a barbarous Manner; but obliged him to drink Brandy as long as he was fenfible, and after he was dead drunk, they poured it down his Throat wich a Funnel, to the A. mount of about two Quarts and a Pint. This being done, they fet him on Hor reback, tied him on, and turned his Horfe adrify which carried him in that Condition a Mile or two; when, the Cords breaking, he drop'd in the Highoway, and there lay ill the next Day; when he was relieved by Paffengers acciden. tally coming by, and prevented his expiring upon the Place.

## Lonton, Misy 6.

Laf Week a Perion being apprehended for Pyracy, was carried before a Juftice in Ro:herhith: As he was palfing by a Publick.Houre, where a Captain of a Ship was drinking, the Captain enquised what was the Reafon of the Croud, and heing informed, it was occafioned by a Perfon lufpetued to be a Pirate he went to see him. who to his great surprize, he imaediately knew to be one that was ori Board a Pyrate Ship, and then before the Mait, when he the laid Captain loit his firft Ship; and that he was Lieutenant of a Pyrate Ship, and took him a fecond and third Time; when, at the laft Taking his Ship, he was for nalling the Captain's Ears to the Main-maft. The faid Pyrate has impeached eight Perions more, and the Juftice has iffued out his Warrants for their apprehending.

We hear that reveral of wur Merchants Ships have declined carrying any more Eelons to the Plamations, notwithftanding they have been wery much prefs'd upon that Score, and have had large Offers to engage them to it; alledging in Excufe, that though they may in the general be ferviceahle to the Planters; yet they are fo notorioufly guilty in corrupting the People there, that tue Conntry are heartily weary of them,

## London, fune 3.

The Accounts from Midrid mention, That at a Tribunal of the Inquifition lately held there, they palfed Sentence upon 18 Perfons s 4 Women were convilted of Witcherafe, and the reft of Judaifm. ## FOREIGN AFFAIRS.

RANCE has been at lait moved with the Cries of the People, to execute Juftice upon the Author of their Calamities. All the Effeets of Mr. Law's Wife have been feized, and his Brother Mr. William Law has been raken up and committed to the Baftile. This theweth, that if the late Comptroller of the Finances of France had nor priudently withdrawn himelf out of the King. dom, they would probably call him to an Account, and perhaps he is not altogerher fare in the Place where he has taken Sanktuary. We have had many Accounts of the Miferies of the French People, hut I think the fult lowing has fome new Strokes, which have not been taken Notice of before, or clfe were but faimly repreiented. This is a leerter from the Bifhop of Cafres to the Maro quis de la Vrilliese, Secretary of State, to acquaint him with the Reafons that have hindered the People of his Diocefe from contriburing to the Relief of the Countries afflicted with the Piague, fo literally and largely as otherwife they would have done.

## S 1 R,

IReceived your Letter about the late Con: Hlagration at Rennes. I thall not be wanting to obey the Orders of His Royal Highnels the Duke of Orleans, though I find it almoft impoffible to get over the Difficulties in the Execution of them. The Agents of the Clergy of France lately affembled at Paris, have required me to order a Collection of Money for the Relief of the Places now vifited with the Plague; but notwithftanding my utmolt Endeavours, my whole Diocefs raifed no more than One Hundred Piftoles in Money, but Five Thoufand Livres in Bills and other Paper Effects; the Inundation of which has
done more Mifchief in there Parts than the Flames did at Rennes. The Difference only is, That our Diftreffes are not fo terrible to the Eyes, yet the Effeets are no lefs deftructive, and though they be latent and concealed, yet the Mifchiefs they do are as teal and more remedilefs. Our Houfes here, 'tis true, are not burnt down, but yet we are not much the better for that, fince of all Things moft requifie for the Support of Life, nothing remains but Paper-Money, goad for norbing but to be burnt. We read in Hiftory, that large Towns which happened to be deftroyed, were foon after rebuilt, and appeared to be more magniticent and flourilhing than before; but our Pofterity will hardly fee this Province reChored to its prittine wealthy Condition, nur perhips to fuch a tolerathe One as we enjoyed Siy Months ago. Alas! what Diftreffes have overwhelmad the richeft amongit us, who employed their Subftance in the bef? Manner. Thofe who have nor feen it will certainly be incredulous, hat fuch as are Eye-witneffes cannor but rememher this Tragedy with the greateft Horror. No more Traffick. ne more Trade. and no more Confidence: and even the moft Prudent and Diligent have no ways left to fubfit, either by their own Labours, or the Charity and Munificence of others. The Decav of Trade has rendered even Induftry it fele infignificant and ufelefs: Want of Truif breaks all Friendrhip, and makes Men coné clude, they muit not lend Money to their Friends and neareft Relations, though formerly they chearfully did it so Srangers. Charity itfelf, which always contrives inethods of doing Good, has her Hands tied, fince there is now no other way left her than to weep with thofe that defpair of ever having their Tears wiped away.

As to the Condition of the Clergy of my Diocefs, they lofe more by pretended Res imburfements than they can gain by Reductions.

I daily

I daily expeat to fee them fo fat neduced, that they will not be able to exercife their FunCtions, and preferve the Purity of Religious Worfhip, rotwithftanding the Ecclefaltica! Difcipline and the Subordination of the Clergy, particularly with Refpett to my poor Ivuns, who wanting thas Relief which their Prents and Friends could formerly give them, but cannot now, will oblige me to fuffer them to go out of the Cloyiter to feek for Bread.

There Diffiters, which are alteady fo intollerable, are agsravared hy the Plague, which rages in Provence, and threatens us, who are in no Condition to contribure to the Charges for guarding the Avenues to my Diocefs. If we mould be vifited with that dreadful Scourge, we mult undergo the Lot of thofe Towns, whofe excefive Riches were infufficient to help their Sick, or bury their Dead; and in fuch Cafe our Diftreffes would be worfe

There is nothing of an Hyperbole in what I fay, but it is the fimple naked Truth; fo that I find it imporfible to execute fuccefsfully the Orders of His Royal Highneís. If the People would ftill be fatisfed with Bank-Bills, and other Paper-Serutities, they may have enough of them; but they want Money, of which none is left here.

I comforted my difconfolate Flocis with fay. ing. at the firf Collestion, That God bad fuffered that Juddain Change of their Gold and Silver intn Paper, for no aber Eind than to weantheir Hiaris from it, and to make tbeni more inclined to furit Alts of Piety, as might be meritcrious, and necelfary io our Neighbours : But their Grief will be much encreafed, when they thall perceive, that all their worlaly Subftance has been fo firangely and in fo flort a Time metamorphifed, that it is even unfit for Alms; and that thofe who are poliefled of their Goods, cannot ufe them for the Support of their Bodies, or the Salvation of their Souls. It is their Misfortune to know, that they cannot poffefs or keep them, but through an immoveable Patience and an ir.vincible Submition; and fince they are likewife fenibie, that the Profpect of the Great depends no lefs upon their atterding to the Neceffities of the Prople, as the Weltare of the iatter doth upon Obedience to them, $\mathfrak{C i c}$.

Thus for the Letter of the Bifhop of Caftres, and his Defcription of the Calamities of France are very livelily reprefented, and in a great Meafure pleure out to us our own Country's Miferies, by a no»lefs ruinous and deftructive Schere. The South See Bubble, commencing it Projedion from the Firf Miffifippi Politicks of France, with their extravagant and unred-
fonabie Prefumption of Riches, arifing from no Certainty in the World. Out gencral De. cay of Trade, Manufactures and Credir caufed by thele Means, have been lid before the Parliament, in Petitions both from the Country and City of London: And the Misfortunes and Unhappinefs of Englund very nearly fym bolize thole of France. The Poet has a witty Tuin of Thought upon this, when he fays,

> Our Sourb Sea Sbips bave golden Strouds, They bring us Wealth, itis glanted; But lodge their Treafure in the Clouds, To bide it till'tis zuantel.

Nothing can be more ridiculous than this affumprive and imaginary Thought of Riches, e'te the wealrhy Ships were arrved, nay even before they had fer out on their goiden Expedition; what is this tut gaining to our felves vaft Effates in the Clouds, afluming it as real, trading and deluding our felves with fititious Trealures, till at laft we find it all a gilded Nothing, and our felves in real Porerty.

Afiuirs in England being unhappily come to this Pafs, and the People furprized and awak'd fiom their golden Dreams, they now entirely trult their Circumfances to be fome way retrieved by the able Management of the Parliament, who have partly difclofere this Scene of Mitchief, and the guilty Maragers muft make fome Reftitution by the Lofs of their Eflates, which they have fo unjuftly acquired; molt of which Betrayers and Eelons of their Councry's Happinefs, have am.ffed to themfilues prodigious Sums of Money, yetall that can be found of their Treafure, reckoned up, amounts but to $2,014,123$ \% 16 s. 7 d . Whent the Sum the South Sea Company are account: able for comes to above Seven Millions Sterl. The Darkett Part of there Defigns are fuppored not to be anfolded yer, by Reafon of Mr. Knighr's ablence, who was the Company's Cathier; but Means have been ufed to induce the Country of Blahant, were he is fe ured, to let him he fent Home, and he himfelf teams willing now, bur iome Perfons too gluiley in whis Scheme of Villany, are fuppofed to hinder him from coming : hy whom we expect a more full Difcovery of large Sums of Money taken by Puifons of too gieat Diftinction to make bold with their Names here at prefent.

Thus the Affairs hoth of France and Englund, remain at prefent, in Relation to thefe airy Bubbles, conserning which malt of the News Papers are Wcekly filled, which makes a Scarcity of other News; whillt we have nothing from our Squadron which are crufing in the Baltick.Sea, to prevent the Incurfions of Muicory

Mufcove upon the Firntiets of Sweten, anå it it jet uncertion wherher thofe Northern Princes of Ruffic and Sweden will be brought to any reafonable Terrus of Peace, hefore they have ventured the dubious Succefs on either Side of arother Campaign.

The Ele Etive Kingion of Poland, whofe Civil and Inceftine Difsentions have lafted many Years, is now furprized with the fup. pofed Defigns of the Turks, who are faid to have their [roops in Motion on the Part of Podolia; and it is hoped that they will lay atide the Quarrel among chemfelves, and join their Forces againf their Common Eriemy. They are promifed all offfible Affilance from the Emperor, and the King has ordered all the Nobility on Herforck, and their Forcos got together already conift of 100000 able and gallant Soliiers, to oppofe the reftefs Infidels, who would force a Patsage through the u ihzppy, yet warlike Dominions of Po lund, to the leis fortified Parts of the Empite,

A Waterman finhing lately at a Place called Magdaien Bridge, had the Misfortune to be devoured by a large Sea Dog, in Sight of feveral other Fifhermen who had made theirEfcape: But confidering what a Prejudice this Monfter might do to their Fifhing. and being aifo defirous of revenging their Companions Death, they provided themfelves with Iron Inftruments and Steel Hooks, and getting into Barques, followed the Fi!h hy his Tract; for he had appeared thereabouts feveral times. Coming up with him the 6th of June, they threw out Hooks conncealed in a Horfe's Buttock; but as it the Monller had been aware of the Houks, he blew upon the Flefh with. out taltiog it. Whereupon the Fifhermen went another way to work; which was, by calting into the Sea a Cord with a Slip Knor, in the middle whereof was a Bait, and fo holding both the Ends in their Hands. The Moniter fprang upon the Bais with fuch VioInce, that his Head went clear through the Noofe, and the Fifhermen pulling the Coid, had thsir Prey faft. The Filh. to difintangle hinfelf, pitchea Tail over Head, brcke the Nape of his Neck, and threw himiclf on Shore. The Fishermen, and other People who min to fee, wite overjoyed at that. Hie was 20 Palms long, had a very wide Throaf with tatee Rows if Teeth like Saws in the upper Jow, and one in the under. He had two Fins three Pdims long, and another upon his Bick longer than the reft. His Till was in the Form of a B.w, fix Palms wids. The Buily was not proporsionable, being 14 Palmis in Circumference. It was a Female; and weighed fix Cantaras, of 25 Pound each. The nest Day, the Watermen opened the Belly, where they tound, befites a large Quanticy of Fish, Halt a Mans Scull with the Hair on, both the Jaws, and Part: of the Rack Bone with irs kits, which they judged to helung to their untorturate Coinpanion, who had leen devoured fome Days before. Our Commisree of Health ordered the Fish to be burnt, for fear of Inteetion.

HERE is landed the Copy of a Letter wrote by the Czar, the Purport of which is to affure the King and Republick, That His Czarifh Majefty will not make neither Peace nor Truce with the Crown of Sweden, without the Farticipation of the King of Poland.

Stockbolm, fuly 15.
Sir John Norris arrived here from the Fleet on the iith Inflant, and with him an Exprefs from our Pleniporentiaries at Neultadto As far as we can hear, the Preliminaries of Peace are in a great Meafure regulated, but not figned, there ftill remaining iome Difficulty about an Ifland called Fzel, fituated near the Coafts of Courland and Livonia, and other Matters, fome of which are faid to concern the Duke of Holftein. The King, who now enjoys a perfeft State of Health, has given Diredtions for relealing the two Dutch Ships, which were detained on Account of their being defigned for Petershurg:

## Venice, July 19.

Letters from Porto Ferrajo of the ift Inf. fay, that in the Night betweer the 29:h and zoth of lalt Month, theg had a tertible Storm of Thunder and Lighining, by which a Magazine fill'd with Powder and Grenado's, under one of the Angles of the Fortrefs Faicon, was blown up. They write frotri Cambray, that the Diff culties which returd the Opening of the Congrets there, the Emperor's Renunciation of his Pretenfions to Spain, and that of the King of Spatin th the Crown of France. Prince Charles of Heffe Philipidahl fer out on the izth Inftant for Paris, and Prince Wilitam his Brother for Caffel.
