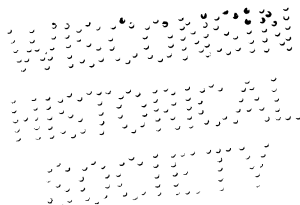

## PREFACE.

The compiler commenced to gather the facts contained in this book without the thought of publishing them, but simply for preservation ; but, becoming more interested in the matter as the material accumulated, resolved to put what had been obtained into book form, thinking that it might be of some aid to future genealogists who desire to complete the work here outlined.

Possibly some may feel aggrieved that fuller mention is not made of themselves or their families. Difficulties in tracing connections, or in obtaining full information, will explain the somewhat meagre references in some cases.

I do not expect this work is free from errors, but I have tried to have them as few as possible and I will esteem it a favor if any of my readers will inform me of any errors that may come to their notice. I would be glad to receive any additions to family records for use when occasion may offer.

In compiling this work I have made free use of public libraries, family Bibles, records of towns and cities, churches, antiquarian and genealogical societies, together with extended correspondence with scores of individuals and every other source of information within my reach.

In the course of my researches for members of my own branch of the family, I have accumulated much data relative to other families, some perhaps deriving from the same ancestor, but, so far, not identified, and others distantly connected, if at all. For the benefit of future genealogists I will include them in this work.

In arranging this record I have given each person a serial number in Arabic figures and family number in Roman numerals. The column of figures on the left margin of page is from beginning to end of each branch the general enumeration. By this plan, to trace out any particular one you have only to take the number at head of chapter or paragraph and turn back to same number in the margin and you will there find the parentage, &c., and the same process continued will take you back to first generations.

# WARDEN FAMILY.

## MASSACHUSETTS.

---

The Warden ancestors of John Warden of Worcester we have not been able to trace back of his grandfather, Samuel. Tradition has it that this branch came from Scotland and settled in the vicinity of Boston, Mass., but after a most thorough search of city, town, county, and church records and such other sources of information as we have had access to, we have been unable to trace the line back of Samuel Warden who married Miriam Bell, 30 March, 1769.

At the time of his death, which occurred at Worcester, 28 Dec., 1815, the newspaper report gave his age as 76 years which, if true, would make his birth sometime in 1739. (In the old bible of his son there is no record of him whatever.) No record of the birth of a Samuel Warden in Boston or vicinity has been found that would correspond to this date except a record of the baptism in the "West Church," Boston, of Samuel Warden, April 1740, but this does not mention parents' names. It is possible, although I have found no proof, that he was the son of Randolph Warden who married Elizabeth Herbert in 1738. They were married at the same church and the minister was a Scotchman. There is one other straw pointing in this direction. The record of the baptism of Samuel's second daughter says, "that the child was, by the mistake of the father, called Elizabeth when baptized". Now, if Samuel was a son of Randolph and Elizabeth Warden, he might have given his mother's name instead of *Abigail*, the name they had selected—but this is only a conjecture.

The first authentic record we have, is that he was living in Boston in 1769 and that he married on the 30th of March, 1769, Miriam Bell, daughter of Daniel and Miriam (Gore) Bell, of Boston, the ceremony being performed by Dr. Cooper at the Brattle Street Church. Samuel was admitted to covenant in the Second Church, 14 July, 1771, at the time his first child was baptized. The family were among the last to leave Boston at the time the British occupied the city. They moved to Worcester, Mass., where they made it their home as long as they lived. The only public record we find in Worcester is one where Samuel Warden sold shares in school-house lot, in 1795, his children being grown up at that time. He died, 28 Dec., 1815.

Of his wife, Miriam, we have been able to get more information. She was a daughter of Daniel and Miriam (Gore) Bell and a grand-daughter of Daniel and Abigail (Cunnabell) Bell of Boston. The Bells were in Boston as early as 1700. The Gores came to America in 1634 and the Cunnabells in 1674. The Cunnabell house was on what is now Hanover Street between Washington Street and Friend Street. The Bells owned land at lower end of Sudbury Street near mill pond and the Gores owned land on Orange Street, a common highway between Boston and Roxbury. (For record of their families and abstracts of their wills, see page 31.) Miriam (Bell) Warden's name is on a deed as witness where her sister Abigail Ridgway and her husband deeded land on Temple Street, Boston, in 1770. *The Massachusetts Spy*, published in Worcester, 9 Aug., 1797, gave the following notice: "Died in this town, very suddenly, Mrs. Miriam Warden, wife of Mr. Samuel Warden". Her body was the first to be buried in the cemetery known as "Mechanic Street Graveyard", her husband owning Lot No. 9. A few years ago the remains were removed to the Warden Lot in Hope Cemetery.

## GENEALOGY.

## 1.

**Samuel<sup>1</sup> Warden**, married in Boston, 30 March, 1769, Miriam Bell, daughter of Daniel and Miriam (Gore) Bell. He died 28 Dec., 1815.

Three children were born to this couple :

- 2 i. Miriam<sup>2</sup> Warden, born 1771, baptized 14 July, 1771, lived to be 78 years of age but was never married. She was blind for many years and made her home with her brother Samuel. She died of small-pox, 3 July, 1849.
- 3 ii. Abigail<sup>2</sup> Warden, born 1773, baptized April 1773. Records say this child was by the mistake of father, called Elizabeth when baptized. She married Perly Healy.
- 4 iii. Samuel<sup>2</sup> Warden Jr., born 3 March, 1775, in Boston, baptized in Second Church, 12 March, 1775, died 19 Oct., 1862.

## 3.

**Abigail<sup>2</sup> or "Nabby" Warden**, daughter of Samuel<sup>1</sup> and Miriam (Bell) Warden, born in Boston, Mass., 11 April, 1773, removed to Worcester, Mass., in 1776, and died there, Thursday, 3 Aug., 1847. She married Perly<sup>5</sup> (Joseph<sup>4</sup>, Joshua<sup>3</sup>, Nathaniel<sup>2</sup>, William<sup>1</sup>) Healy, of Worcester, the ceremony being performed by Rev. S. Austin. (For Healy family see page 36.)

They had three children :

- 5 i. Eliza Warden<sup>3</sup> Healy, born 4 July, 1804.
- 6 ii. Abigail<sup>3</sup> Healy, born 20 Dec., 1807.
- 7 iii. John Whitmore<sup>3</sup> Healy, born 5 June, 1811.

## 4.

**Samuel<sup>2</sup> Warden**, son of Samuel<sup>1</sup> and Miriam (Bell) Warden, born in Boston, 3 March, 1775, went with his parents to Worcester in 1775 or 6, was educated in the village school and learned the trade of house-joiner and cooper. On 21 April, 1804, he bought a house at what is now the corner of Pleasant and High Streets, where he lived until 23 Oct., 1833, when he sold it to David Wilder Jr. He married Tamasin Harrington, daughter of Elijah Harrington of Worcester, 22 Jan., 1796. This marriage brought eight children. In 1811, by the death of Elijah Harrington, Tamasin and Samuel received a house and eight acres of land on Grafton Street in Worcester, Mass. This land and house they sold to Clark Wellington, in 1814. Samuel was made executor of Elijah Harrington's will. In 1812, he sold the one-half pew No. 15, in First Parish Meeting House that belonged to Elijah Harrington, to John Earle. Samuel was a man above the medium height, light complexion, blue eyes, erect in his walk, a great hand to laugh and very genial to

all. He was a man much respected and loved by his neighbors. His wife, Tamasin, died in 1830, aged 54 years, and was buried in Lot No. 64 in the East Worcester Graveyard. (The remains were removed to Grove Street Cemetery when this graveyard was abandoned.)

He married a second wife in 1833. She was Miss Sallie Waters, daughter of John and Keziah Waters of Worcester. She was born in 1768 and died 3 Oct., 1861, aged 93 years. At the time of this marriage they moved to the residence on South Street (now Park Street) where they lived until their decease. He died 19 Oct., 1862, aged 87 years. No children by this marriage. His son-in-law Wilson Wheeler was administrator of his estate.

Children of Samuel and Tamasin (Harrington) Warden :

**Eliza Warden<sup>3</sup> Healy**, daughter of Perly<sup>5</sup> and Abigail<sup>2</sup> (*Samuel<sup>1</sup>*) (Warden) Healy, born Wednesday, 4 July, 1804. Married (1) George Healy, on 24 Feb., 1831. He died 7 Sept., 1831. Married (2) James White of Worcester, 15 April, 1834. She died 4 April, 1839, and was buried in the White Lot at Grove Street Cemetery.

Two children were born to this couple :

- 16 i. James Arden<sup>4</sup> White, born 9 July, 1837, died 5 June, 1839.
- 17 ii. Eliza Fox<sup>4</sup> White, born 30 March, 1835, married Benjamin Allen Aug. 1858. He was prominent and well known among musical people. They had one son, James, who died in young manhood.

## 6.

**Abigail<sup>3</sup> Healy**, daughter of Perly<sup>5</sup> and Abigail<sup>2</sup> (*Samuel<sup>1</sup>*) (Warden) Healy, born Monday, 20 Dec., 1807. Married (1) Mr. Knight, 21 April, 1829 and (2) Mr. Gates, 1 Nov., 1836. She died 22 Oct., 1838.

She had one child by second husband :

- 18 i. Abigail Elizabeth<sup>4</sup> Gates, born 9 Sept., 1838.

## 7.

**John Whitmore<sup>3</sup> Healy**, son of Perly<sup>5</sup> and Abigail<sup>2</sup> (*Samuel<sup>t</sup>*) (Warden) Healy, born 5 June, 1811. Married Lucretia Parker, 26 Dec., 1833, died at Worcester, 6 June, 1882.

Five children born to this couple :

- 19 i. Mary Elizabeth<sup>4</sup> Healy, born 23 Sept., 1834, married (1) W. H. Demond, 12 June, 1854. He died in 1857. Married (2) Walter Barber of Springfield, 3 Oct., 1857.

**Samuel<sup>3</sup> Warden**, son of Samuel<sup>2</sup> (*Samuel<sup>t</sup>*) and Tamasin (Harrington) Warden, born 22 Nov., 1798, married Sarah Cutting of Templeton, Mass. She was born in 1798 and died in 1872, aged 74 years. He was a carpenter by trade, owned land on Grafton Street which he bought of Fred. W. Paine, April 1835. He lived there many years and then moved into the house with his father on Park Street. In 1829, he received a farm of fifty acres on condition that he would give half of the income to the grantor and his wife as long as they lived. This was deeded back to them in 1832. They had no children, but a nephew, Samuel<sup>4</sup> Warden, lived with them after his father's death in 1840. Samuel<sup>3</sup> Warden died 8 Dec., 1861, his wife surviving him a number of years.

## 10.

**Miriam Bell<sup>3</sup> Warden**, daughter of Samuel<sup>2</sup> (*Samuel<sup>t</sup>*) and Tamasin (Harrington) Warden, born in Worcester, Mass., 25 Aug., 1800, married George Cleveland, a carpenter by



occupation, on the 23d of March, 1823. She died 18 Nov., 1847.

They had seven children :

- 24 i. Harry W.<sup>4</sup> Cleveland, born 18 July, 1824, died 11 June, 1882.
- 25 ii. William Liberty<sup>4</sup> Cleveland, born 29 Dec., 1826, died 27 Feb., 1850.
- 26 iii. Warren Wheeler<sup>4</sup> Cleveland, born 8 Sept., 1829. Now living.
- 27 iv. John Warden<sup>4</sup> Cleveland, born 3 Feb., 1834.
- 28 v. Mary Scott<sup>4</sup> Cleveland, born 1 June, 1837, died 13 Jan., 1879.

George Cleveland married, for his second wife, Mary G. Parminter. He died in 1877, aged 79 years.

## 12.

**Catherine Holmes<sup>3</sup> Warden**, daughter of Samuel<sup>2</sup> (*Samuel<sup>1</sup>*) and Tamasin (Harrington) Warden, born in Worcester, 8 July, 1805, where she resided until 26 May, 1830, when she married Wilson Wheeler of Orange, Mass., and removed her residence to that place, where she lived the remainder of her life. She died 2 Aug., 1876, aged 71 years, 24 days. Her husband, Wilson Wheeler, born Oct. 1804, son of Zacheus and Betsy (Dexter) Wheeler, was one of the substantial citizens of Orange. He was a man of affairs and was often called upon to administer estates of deceased persons. He held the office of deputy sheriff of Franklin County from 1852 to 1867. He died 26 Dec., 1887, aged 83 years, 2 months. His mother, Betsy (Dexter) Wheeler, was sister to Lucy (Dexter) Davis, the mother of Narcissa (Davis) Warden who married his brother-in-law, John Warden.

**Charles<sup>3</sup> Warden**, son of Samuel<sup>2</sup> (*Samuel<sup>1</sup>*) and Tamasin (Harrington) Warden, born 24 Feb., 1808, at Worcester, married in 1830, Elizabeth Manning, the daughter of Jesse and Mary (Durrah) Manning. She was born in 1810 and died in 1848. He was a shoemaker by trade and died 28 March, 1840.

They had four children :

- 40 i. Mary Elizabeth<sup>4</sup> Warden, born 3 Jan., 1832. At the death of her father she went to live with her uncle John where she died 16 March, 1843.  
 41 ii. Charles Stillman<sup>4</sup> Warden, born 20 Feb., 1833, died 16 March, 1898.  
 42 iii. Samuel<sup>4</sup> Warden, born 27 Feb., 1834. At the death of his father he went to live with his uncle Samuel.

## 15.

**John<sup>3</sup> Warden**, son of Samuel<sup>2</sup> (*Samuel<sup>1</sup>*) and Tamasin (Harrington) Warden, was born in Worcester, 13 Feb., 1814. Went to the public schools of the town. He was a man of medium height, light or sandy complexion, blue eyes and high cheek bones. He learned the business of a merchant tailor and for many years carried on that business on Main Street near Harrington Corner. Soon after his marriage he built a house on Park Street where he and his wife lived until their decease. He became interested in real estate very extensively, making 183 transfers of real estate from 1843 to 1863, but in the hard times during the Civil War, lost the fortune he had accumulated. He never recovered from this blow and died in June 1865. His estate was settled by his wife as administratrix. He was a prominent member of the first Methodist Church and when the first church was burned, was instrumental in buying the land and erecting the church on Park Street. He was always one of the earnest supporters of it until his decease.

He held the office of trustee or steward for many years, was librarian of Sunday School for more than thirty years. Was a life member of the Missionary Society of that denomination. He was a Republican in politics and took an active part although he never held public office. He was a man beloved by all, was a great friend of children and always had several with him whenever he drove out.

He married Narcissa Davis of Orange, daughter of John<sup>6</sup> (John<sup>5</sup>, John<sup>4</sup>, Elisha<sup>3</sup>, James<sup>2</sup>, James<sup>1</sup>) and Lucy (Dexter) Davis, 14 June, 1837. Her father, grandfather and two uncles were Revolutionary soldiers. She was born in Orange, 30 Nov., 1812. After the decease of her husband, Narcissa Warden continued to live at the residence on Park Street, making a home for the children. (Her daughter, Abbie L. Carpenter occupying a tenement in the same house.) She was an active member of the Methodist Church as long as health permitted. The last years of her life were years of ill health and suffering which she bore with Christian fortitude.

She died 14 Oct., 1891, aged 78 years, beloved by all who knew her. Memorial windows have been placed in Park Avenue Methodist Church in Worcester, in memory of John and Narcissa Warden. (For genealogy of Davis family, see Part II.)

## 32.

**John Wilson<sup>4</sup> Wheeler**, the oldest son of Wilson and Catherine Holmes<sup>3</sup>, (*Samuel<sup>2</sup>, Samuel<sup>1</sup>*) (Warden) Wheeler, was born in Orange, Mass., 20 Nov., 1832. His early educational advantages were limited to those afforded by the common schools which were kept by men poorly paid and often poorly qualified for their work ; but he made good use of his opportunities. Much of his early life was passed as a farmer and carpenter and, though being compelled to accept these positions, neither of them were congenial to him, yet until a better opportunity offered, he worked uncomplainingly but with the determination to change his vocation at the earliest practical moment. In 1855, he entered the grocery store of Joseph Baldwin, of Fitchburg where he worked for \$125 a year and his board. He stayed here one year and although

offered more salary, he returned to his native town and entered the general store of Daniel Pomeroy. Here he remained three years. In 1859, he succeeded Mr. Pomeroy in business which he conducted through the next three years as sole proprietor. During this time, although the financial results had not been large, he had succeeded in establishing a reputation as a business man of ability and integrity, and with the financial assistance of D. E. Cheeney and R. E. Carpenter, he was enabled to purchase the grocery store of A. J. Clark. He entered upon his new venture with that determination which has since been so clearly shown in his business enterprises and conducted it with marked success until 1867 when he became a member of the firm of A. F. Johnson & Co., who had just started, in a small way, the manufacture of sewing machines in Orange. This new enterprise on a wider plan at once afforded him a full scope for his marvelous energy and ability, and there was need of all his resources. His cool and careful judgment was a most necessary adjunct at that experimental stage of the sewing machine manufacture. The product was small and the trouble about patents was constantly claiming attention, and it required the finest skill and judgment to successfully carry the business through this trying period. The firm was changed to a corporation and Mr. Wheeler became secretary and treasurer. It continued under this management until 1882, when its name was changed to "New Home Sewing Machine Company" and Mr. Wheeler became vice-president and treasurer and from the beginning he has been the financial manager of the entire industry. When the business started they employed forty men while now there are over six hundred employed and the daily capacity amounts to four hundred sewing machines, and this institution justly ranks among the leading and representative industries of Western Massachusetts. Mr. Wheeler has not only been the active head and manager of this large corporation, the duties and details of which are very exacting, but he has also found time to interest himself in every movement tending to advance the interests of Orange. He is president of

the Orange Savings Bank, president of the Orange National Bank, president of the Orange Power Company, president of the Orange Board of Trade, president of the Boston Mutual Life Insurance Company, a director of the Athol and Orange Street Railroad and of the Leavitt Machine Company. He married, 9 Oct., 1856, Miss Almira E. Johnson, daughter of Daniel and Almira (Porter) Johnson of North Orange. Three children blessed their union. Mr. Wheeler is a social and genial man prominently identified with the Masonic Fraternity. He was one of the founders of the Orange Lodge, was its first secretary and afterwards its treasurer. He is a member of Crescent Royal Arch Chapter and for several years its treasurer, and he is also a member of the Orange Commandery of Knights Templar. Politically, Mr. Wheeler is a Republican and has ever taken an earnest and active interest in the success of his party. He has held various positions always discharging his duties with honor to himself and satisfaction to his fellow townsmen. He was town clerk of Orange from 1861 to 1867. In 1864, he was appointed a justice of the peace. He was selectman in 1866. In 1876, he represented the First Franklin District in the Legislature, serving upon the finance committee. In 1888, he was a delegate from the Eleventh District to the National Convention at Chicago, which nominated Harrison and Morton. Mr. Wheeler also takes a decided interest in agricultural affairs and is owner of a beautiful farm near Orange Village, called "Grand View". He is a breeder of fine horses and cattle and a lover of good stock generally. In 1891, he was president of the Worcester Agricultural and Mechanical Society at Athol, and in the annual report a high tribute was paid to him for the enthusiasm and interest he manifested in the success of the Society. Mr. Wheeler is strongly attached to his native town and although having travelled extensively throughout our country, he always returns to Orange with increased love for the old town. In 1898, Mr. Wheeler was elected president of the "New Home Sewing Machine Company" and he also retained the office of treasurer. The secret of Mr. Wheeler's success is



due to his tireless industry, to his promptness, that never failed to meet every financial obligation, however trivial or however large, to his remarkable personal attention to details and to a probity and courage tempered with caution which have made him sagacious and successful in a remarkable degree. Cautious and shrewd, a business man of the highest integrity and signal ability, rich in experience, large hearted, of great energy, faithful in all his relations, above fear and beyond reproach.

The firm had under their control several large estates in addition to doing a regular brokerage business and in 1889, they added the business of buying and developing large tracts of suburban property. In this they were quite successful and some of the beautiful suburbs owe their origin to this firm. Scores of beautiful houses have been built by

this firm and sold to people desiring suburban homes. Mr. Warden was often consulted in regard to value of real estate and has acted as expert witness in many real estate cases in court. His services were often secured in appraising property for probate purposes in settling estates. He has acted as conveyancer in a great many cases. He held commission as justice of the peace and notary public under Governors Robinson, Ames, Brackett, Russell, Greenhalge, Walcott, and Crane. In politics, he was always a Republican and took an active interest in all such matters, was a member of the ward and city committees of that party for many years, and was inspector of elections several terms. Was interested in the no-license campaign and was treasurer of both city and county committees. ## CUNNABELL.

John Cunnabell, the first of this name to come to America, was born in London, England, 25 Jan., 1649-50, came to America and located in Boston about 1674, where he remained until his death in 1724. He was a joiner by occupation and lived on what is now the south side of Hanover Street between Washington and Friend Streets. He was married three times. The name of his first wife is not known. She died in Boston in 1687. He had by his first wife, two sons and three daughters. The sons had no children. He married for his second wife, Sarah Clayes, daughter of Peter and Hannah (Littlefield) Clayes of Salem, Mass. By her he had four children, one son and three daughters and through this son all bearing this name in America have descended. He married for his third wife, Martha Hely, 10 Dec., 1700, and by her he had one child. He died in Boston in 1724.

He left a will, dated 25 March, 1724, in which he left the income of his estate and so much of the principal as was necessary for her support, to his wife, Martha Cunnabell, and at her decease the estate was to be divided as follows, viz : Samuel, his son, was to have his working tools and was to have the first chance to buy the house where they lived and was to have twelve months in which to pay for the same, and all of the estate, except the tools, was to be divided equally between the following children : Samuel Cunnabell, Elizabeth, now wife of Thomas Wharton, Martha, now wife of Nathaniel Breck, Abigail, now wife of Daniel Bell, Hannah, now wife of William Bond, Mary, now wife of William Beuker.

He and his brother-in-law, Daniel Bell, bought and sold land near the lower end of Sudbury Street in 1715.

**Daniel<sup>1</sup> Bell**, of Boston was a mason by occupation and was married to Abigail Cunnabell, 3 Aug., 1710. He owned land in 1715 on Sudbury Street.

What money was advanced at the time of the marriage of Hannah, Martha and Katherine is to be taken from their share. The will was made 12 Feb., 1749.

To my daughter, Desire Bell, £31 12s. 8d., which makes her equal with her sisters. I discharge and free all my children from any

charges I have on my books against them. I give my wife, Desire Bell, the rest and residue of my estate. Wife to be executrix."

## GORE.

**John<sup>1</sup> Gore**, the first of the name in America, was born in England about 1610, came over to America previous to 1635, when he was at Roxbury, Mass. He and his wife, Rhoda, were church members there. They had eleven children. He died in 1657 and left a will. The inventory amounted to £812. His widow married St. John Remington.

**Samuel<sup>2</sup> Gore**, the youngest son of John<sup>1</sup> and Rhoda Gore, was a carpenter by trade, married, 28 Aug., 1672, Elizabeth, daughter of John Weld. They had seven children. He died in 1692. His widow married ——— Tucker.

**Obadiah<sup>3</sup> Gore**, the youngest son of Samuel<sup>2</sup> (*John<sup>1</sup>*) and Elizabeth (Weld) Gore, was born 13 July, 1688. He was a carpenter by trade and was married, 26 Oct., 1710, to Sarah Kilby of Boston. They had five children, all baptized at Brattle Street Church. He died 8 Oct., 1721. The Warden family has been a difficult one to trace, owing to the imperfect state of many records. A manuscript history and pedigree was for a long period possessed by the family, but many years ago was lost under the following circumstances, related by Miss Anna Ross<sup>s</sup> Warden of Salem, Mass. :—Dr. Elisha Story of Marblehead, Mass., requested his cousin, Sarah Bridge Gorman, wife of John<sup>s</sup> Warden (and grandmother of above mentioned Anna Ross<sup>s</sup> Warden of Salem) to send him for perusal, the family history and records, which he promised to return. In those days the only means of conveyance was by the stage coach, and by the driver of one of these she sent the manuscript. Unfortunately, as the coachman later confessed, he encountered a driving snow-storm on his way to Marblehead and lost his hat in which he had placed the document. Although a search was made, the latter was never recovered. Miss Warden says that she often heard her father express regret over this incident and remark “at any rate we can trace back to a king.” Whether this literally meant a royal descent she does not know and probably nobody will ever be able to shed any light upon the subject.

There seems to be no *proof* that Thomas “Wardin” of Scituate was the ancestor of the Salem family of *Wardens*. I, however, for the following reasons consider him as such :—Although the name appears as “Wardin” in the History of Scituate, it does not in the least follow that it is correctly spelled. *Warden* was sometimes written thus by mistake, as for instance, in the Salem City Records :—“John Wardin and Sarah Gorman, both of

Salem, married Nov. 13, 1772, by Rev. Asa Dunbar." Thomas "Wardin" of Scituate, had children, Thomas, Samuel, and "Frances." The spelling of the latter I believe to have also been a mistake, either in the records or in copying them, and in reality not to mean a *daughter* but a *son Francis*. Taking this for granted, the three sons would correspond perfectly to the Thomas, Samuel, and Francis who appear in Boston about 1715 and later (it is stated in the History of Scituate on page 377, that Thomas Wardin and family probably removed to Boston after 1698.) It may also be added that Francis was a very uncommon name in the "Colonies" at that time and it is unlikely that in a small place like old Boston and vicinity there existed more than one Francis Warden of the same generation. Another point which strengthens my theory, is the fact that Francis Warden of Boston, named his eldest son, *Thomas*, presumably for his father Thomas of Scituate. There is no deed in Suffolk County that states the place from which the family had come, therefore, there is no actual *proof* of the family connection unless it be found in Plymouth County records. There was also some doubt respecting the next generation, as it was not at all certain that John<sup>3</sup> Warden of Salem was the son of the above mentioned Francis of Boston. I believe that I have succeeded in proving the parentage as follows:—The birth of John<sup>3</sup> Warden of Salem is not found in Boston Records, but this is not surprising, for they are known to be very incomplete. His death, however, is given in the family Bible (at the old Salem homestead) and occurred on the "27th of April, 1820, aged 85 and 3 months," which would make the date of his birth *January 1735*. Knowing the customs of the times, it is not likely that he had not married before November 1772, on which date he would have been nearly thirty-eight years of age. It is therefore reasonable to suppose that Sarah Bridge Gorman was his second wife, and this is strengthened by the Salem Records which give "Elizabeth Blyth" as wife of a John Warden *before 1772*, after which date Elizabeth Blyth disappears and a John Warden appears with wife *Sarah*. Moreover, Salem records give to John Warden and wife Elizabeth, a son with that uncommon name of *Francis*, who was baptised "Nov. 22, 1761 (Episcopal)"; see Essex Institute Historical Collections, Vol.

23, page 271. Compare to this the first entry in the Warden family Bible (Salem homestead) which states that "Francis Warden, died about 1776 on board the Jersey Prison Ship, New York, aged 18." This Bible was only published in 1810 (in Philadelphia) and evidently the person who wrote the above was not positive concerning the date of death and wrote "about 1776"—it probably occurred later. Does not this correspond with the Francis, son of John Warden and wife Elizabeth Blyth, and baptised (as stated above) in Salem 22 Nov. 1761? It seems to be a certainty that these John Wardens were one and the same man. The *strongest* proof, however, that John of Salem was the son of Francis of Boston is the entry found in Records of Old South Church, Boston:—"John, son of Francis Warden and wife Elizabeth, baptised *Jan. 5, 1734-5.*" This agrees *exactly* with the record in the family Bible, which says that John Warden died "27th of April 1820, aged 85 years and 3 months!"

In the *Massachusetts Spy* of 3 May, 1775, is found this: In a letter about the battle of Lexington the writer says: "A young man who was taken prisoner and made to assist the British in removing the wounded, said that he saw a barber, who lived in Boston, thought to be one Warden, with the troops and he heard them say that he was one of their pilots. He likewise saw the said barber fire twice at our men." This must have referred to the above Warden as he left the city when the British did and was proscribed and banished in 1778. By an Act of the General Court, 1781, a commission was appointed to sell all the property of the "so-called" conspirators and

absentees, and under that law, Saml. Henshaw and Saml. Barrett sold at auction, 1783, the estate of Wm. Warden and Sarah (Coburn) Warden his wife, situated on Marlborough Street, etc., to Christopher Clark for £70; said Warden being an absentee.

BOSTON, 8 March, 1747.

In the name of God, Amen. I, Thomas Warden, of Boston, in County of Suffolk, and Province of the Massachusetts Bay, in New England, Inholder, being weak and infirm of body, but thro' mercy of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, hereby revoking and making null and void all former and other wills by me at any time heretofore made. First, and principally, I commit my precious and immortal soul into the hands of God, my creator, relying solely on His mercy through the merits and satisfaction of my Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, for the pardon of my sins and gracious acceptance with Him. My body I commit to the earth to be decently buried at the direction of my executor herein named, and for my temporal goods and estate, I will that the same be employed and bestowed in manner as is hereinafter expressed, that is to say, I will and order that all my just debts and funeral expenses be well and truly paid by my executor.

Item :

I give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife, Mary Warden, all and every, the household goods and furniture of household and whatever she brought unto me at the time of our marriage, together with one-half moiety or half part of all my other estate both real and personal, whatsoever and wheresoever the same be found.

All the remainder of my estate, I give and devise and bequest unto my well beloved child, Anna Warden, to be holden by her, her heirs, and assigns forever, and it is my desire, and I do hereby will and order, my executor to make division of my estate between my wife and daughter in the more just manner as the same is before given and devised.

I now constitute and appoint my trusty friend, Mr. Sampson Salter, of Boston, to be the executor, 11 Nov., 1747.

## THOMAS BRIDGE.

Thomas Bridge, was born at Hackney, in England, in 1656, was regularly educated at Oxford. His family is said to have been very wealthy. Shortly after his birth, occurred the "Great Fire" in London. That terrible conflagration swept away the family mansion and all the contents (except one hamper of plate) of all their large possessions. Among other treasures, the family records disappeared. His origin and antecedents, therefore, cannot be fully stated. After graduating from Oxford, Mr. Bridge travelled extensively in Europe and the East. During this tour, events occurred which changed his views and induced him on his arrival in England to study for the ministry and finally take orders. About the same time, he married Miss Elizabeth Turner, the only child of a widow who married William Paterson, "a Scotch gentleman" (see Knight's History of London), the projector of the Bank of England. In his will, dated "Westminster, London, July 1, 1718", her step-father says: "I give and bequeath to Elizabeth my daughter-in-law, the only child to my first wife Elizabeth Turner, relict of the late Thomas Bridge, minister of the Gospel in New England, £1500.

Before he came to New England to settle, Mr. Bridge led a wandering yet useful life. He preached in Jamaica and Bermuda and in each of these places had received an invitation to settle as a minister of the gospel. His first place of residence in North America was West Jersey. He there also received an invitation to settle, refused this call and arrived in Boston on the 17th of March, 1704. He was regularly installed as a colleague and pastor with Messrs. Allen and Wadsworth, May 10th, 1705. In the unsuccessful expedition made against Port Royal in 1707, he was appointed by the Governor and Council to accompany the Commissioners, June 5th. He sailed from Boston July 5th and returned the first of the following September. He received the degree of Master of Arts in 1712 from Harvard College; his name

is affixed to the class which was graduated in 1675. He died suddenly of apoplexy on the 26th of September, 1715. His funeral sermon was preached by Rev. Mr. Colman and his remains were treated with particular respect. The church voted to pay his funeral expenses which amounted to £104. His wife Elizabeth died May 22, 1722. They had one son and four daughters.

The birth of a son was considered a very important event in this family as there had been a great deficiency in male heirs. Mr. Bridge made arrangements with his family in England, that his son should be educated in that country. His only brother came to America for the boy, who died very young of the small-pox. No male of this family in America. When he came to West Jersey he had four daughters. His children were as follows :

- i. Elizabeth<sup>2</sup>, married to Bryant Parrot, 7 Feb., 1710, by her father. She died 29 Dec., 1711. They had a child: Elizabeth, who died 29 May, 1712.
- ii. Ellen<sup>2</sup>, married to Joseph Marion<sup>3</sup> (*John<sup>2</sup> John<sup>1</sup>*), 7 June, 1711, by her father.
- iii. Lydia<sup>2</sup>, married to Benjamin Grey, 23 Aug., 1715, by her father. They had a daughter: Indicia, who, after her parents' death returned to her relatives in the British Provinces or in England.
- iv. Copia<sup>2</sup>, married to Richie Love of Ireland, 5 Nov., 1719, by Rev. Joseph Sewall. They had children: 1, William Richie, born Aug., 1820, married Margaret Ross, 7 Oct., 1746 and went to the British Provinces; 2, Ebenezer, born June, 1724.
- v. Sarah<sup>2</sup>, born 1 Mar., 1705, baptized 4 Mar., married to John Gorman, 3 Aug., 1740 by the Rev. Henry Caner. She died in Boston, 1762. Their daughter: Sarah Bridge, married John Warden of Salem, 13 Nov., 1772.

Joseph's grandfather, John<sup>1</sup> Marion, was living in Watertown in 1641, he married Sarah Eddy, daughter of John Eddy, who emigrated to America in 1630 and was the son of William Eddy, Vicar of St. Dunstan, Cranbrook, County Kent, England. William was educated

at Trinity College, Cambridge, and was Vicar of Cranbrook from 1609-1616. The children of Joseph<sup>3</sup> Marion and wife Ellen Bridge were as follows :

- ii. Ellen, born 1714.
- iii. Elizabeth, born 22 Sept., 1721, married William Story.
- iv. Prudence, born 1727.

Joseph Marion educated his daughters as he would have educated sons, following the example of his honored father-in-law, Rev. Thomas Bridge. They were accomplished in the languages, painting, drawing and needlework. "Mr. Joseph Marion was very aristocratic and exclusive, valued himself upon his pedigree, had a genealogy of his family upon parchment, illuminated and painted." This parchment was destroyed when his house was burnt. His daughter Elizabeth married William Story "Deputy Registrar of the Vice Admiralty Court at Boston". At the time of the Revolution his office was sacked and his public and private papers burnt by the mob. William Story was the son of Elisha and Sarah Cooper Story, and the father of Dr. Elisha Story of Marblehead who was in Col. Little's Regiment at Concord. Was also at Bunker Hill in the trenches with his friend Dr. Warren. He was a leader of one of the gangs who destroyed the tea in Boston Harbor, also one of the two commanders who gagged and bound the sentinels and siezed the two brass field-pieces placed on Boston Common to overawe the inhabitants. It was to him, that his cousin Sarah Bridge Gorman (*wife of John<sup>3</sup> Warden*) sent the Warden family genealogy, on which occasion it was lost, as stated on the first page of these records.

Dr. Elisha Story and his second wife Mehetable Pedrick, were the parents of Justice Joseph Story, who was the father of William Story, the celebrated sculptor and poet, and grandfather of Julian Story, the celebrated artist and portrait painter, who was educated in England and resides in Paris, France.

Dr. Elisha Story died in Marblehead, 27 August, 1805.

He lived to be over ninety years old, respected and honored by all.

He was born in Marshall County, W. Va., in what is called the Pan-Handle of the state, within a few miles of the city of Wheeling. He spent his boyhood days on his father's farm. He attended school near his home. In early life he was led to become a Christian. He felt his life-work to be in the ministry. He attended the West Alexander Academy in Pa., which was under the presidency of the Rev. Alexander, D. D.

From this institution he went to Meadsville, Pa., finishing his education in Alleghany College. It was his purpose to enter the ministry of the Presbyterian church, of which his parents were members, but his theological views underwent a change and he entered the ministry of the Methodist Episcopal Church. He joined the West Virginia Conference, of which he is now a member. He has spent fifty years in the active work of the ministry. He was assigned to work in the southern part of the state. A loyal Union man during and before the Civil war, he experienced many trying vicissitudes. After an enforced absence with his family away from his work, he returned to find his home and all his earthly possessions a heap of ashes. Nothing daunted, he continued at his post. Heartily disliked by the Confederacy of that section, frequent attempts were made on his life. He was pursued upon one occasion until he came under the protecting folds of the old flag. At another time a warrant was issued for him living or dead, but he eluded capture and death. **William<sup>t</sup> Warden**, was born in Scotland, and died in the West Indies, (according to his grandson, Richard Crease, who died in 1866, at 72 years,) and he may have been the William Warden who died in Kingston, Jamaica, (gravestone in Parish Cemetery). It is supposed that William Warden was a connection of the Kingston family, but it is not certain. He married Elizabeth Masters, daughter of Edward and Elizabeth (Marriner) Masters, of Boston. She was born there, 4 Jan., 1732-3; died 15 Mar., 1809, at 77 years. They lived in Boston until near the close of the Revolutionary War, when he went to Shelburn, Nova Scotia, with his family of four and a servant, where 50 acres of land, a town and water lot were granted him, he claiming to have lost £350 by his loyalty. In the tax list there, for 1786-7, we find William Warden, clerk, Dock Street, and in Nov., 1787, William Warden, shop-keeper, St. Andrews Lane. About this time he went to the West Indies and died soon after. His family returned to Boston, and in the U. S. Census for 1790 we find, Mrs. Warden, two females in family. There is a family tradition that at the commencement of the Revolutionary War, Mrs. Elizabeth Warden was living with the Inches family of Boston as a companion, was sent out of Boston during the siege, and was domiciled with the family of Deacon Gibson in Stow, also that there was a connection with the Edgely, Royall, Calton, Andrews and Cheney families.

*Copied from the Massachusetts Centinal, March 22, 1786.*—On Saturday, Mch. 18, departed this life, after a lingering illness, in the 25th year of his age, MR. WILLIAM WARDEN, Seniour Editor of the Centinal. His funeral will be from his house near Trinity Church this afternoon at 4 o'clock, which his friends and acquaintances are desired to attend.

He was of the firm, Warden & Russell, publishers of Massachusetts Centinal. They first published the paper 24 Mar., 1784, at the southeast corner of State House, afterwards moved to No. 9 Marlborough St.

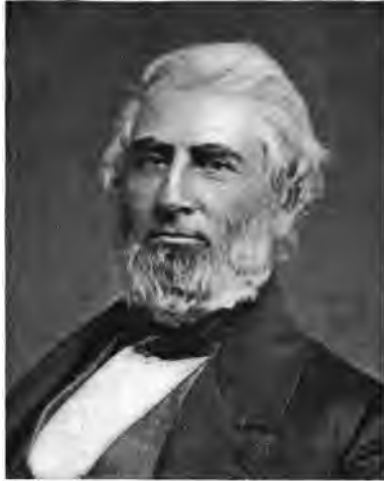

In ——— married Harriet Eliza Randall, daughter of Roswell and Harriet (Stephens) Randall; she was born at Courtland, N. Y., 20 June, 1817. He was known among his friends as "The General", was a man of remarkable physique, full 6 feet 2½ inches in height, weight, in his prime, about 260 lbs., nobly proportioned, with leonine head, large, expressive, kindly eyes, manner gentle and gracious, and a voice low and musical in tone and cadence.

"None knew him but to love him,  
Nor named him but to praise."

His heart, as his person, was large, his sympathies were quickly touched by any tale of want, and his hospitality and generosity were bounded only by his ability to relieve. His keen sense of humor gave sparkle and cheer to his companionship. He began his business life at Auburn, N. Y., becoming the partner of his brother-in-law, A. D. Leonard, in the



Milling business, which business had previously been established by his father, Allen Warden. About 1837 or '38, Satterlee Warden moved to Montgomery County, Tennessee, and there constructed the first grist mill in that state in which silk bolting cloths were used. This improvement on the previous methods of flour making made a considerable reputation for his mill throughout the larger towns of Tennessee and the river towns as far South as New Orleans; consequently a larger mill was built by capitalists on the Red River, a branch of the Cumberland, and placed in his charge, under the name of the "New York Mills", of which he became the final sole owner. This mill had the effect of changing in a large degree the farming methods of the planters through a wide region of country, introducing the growing of wheat which previously had been very little grown throughout that portion of the state. The local supply of wheat not being ample for his demand, he went as far north as Galena, Illinois, to buy wheat, which was shipped to his mill in barges, converted into flour, and the barges reloaded and sent down stream to New Orleans, where the flour was sold at a high price. In those days it took between five and six bushels of wheat to make a barrel of good flour. Here he lived and prospered until 1857, when having occasion to visit Nashville, he there heard the late General Zolicoffer of the Confederate army make a political speech, which clearly indicated, if not threatened, secession, and which firmly persuaded him that the ultimate outcome of the existing feeling would be war. He therefore returned to his home and began to dispose of his estate, and in '57 moved north, tarrying in New York State a while, and thence moved west to Beloit and Darlington, Wisconsin. Here he constructed several mills and grew comparatively wealthy. In 1876 he went to Irving, Marshall Co., Kansas, and there constructed a large flouring mill, which was afterward sold to an English syndicate. He then moved to Frankfort, Kansas, and became the Vice President of the First National Bank of Frankfort. He died at Frankfort, Kansas, 9 April, 1890.

He became a member of the Standard Oil Co., was President of Atlantic Refining Co. of Philadelphia, President of United Gas Improvement Co., and many other companies. He had large interests at St. Augustine, Florida, where he had a winter residence. Mr. Warden was a man whose sphere was something gigantic in the business life of this country. He was a man of rare intuition to discover the great lines along which the business world was tending the trend of human affairs in commercial matters; he had practical genius to conceive the measures which would adapt themselves to the necessities of the hour, and he had the skill to select the instruments or persons to execute these great schemes. He was a man of invincible will. If he selected a line of action, which he knew to be just, proper and right, he never swerved so much as a hair's-breadth. Yet he was not obstinate, and could change, and change quickly, if he

found he was not right, and could adapt himself to the circumstances and the exigencies of the hour. He was much interested in Mission work, and he gathered in the little unkempt children from the street, and toiling as long as health lasted among those classes who needed such work most, giving them the highest form of charity—the personal presence and personal touch. He was a man who was always in favor of practical reform. He was a great friend of temperance. He was a friend of “the brother in black.” His frequent sojourns at St. Augustine, gave him a nearer view of the colored race. His heart went out in pity toward the colored people whom he saw huddled together in the swamp, and he stretched forth his kindly hand to them and helped them up bodily out of the swamp and transplanted them to higher ground, put them into better homes and surrounded them with better conditions. Thus he came to be regarded as a wise counselor, and guide and friend of the colored people.

They settled upon a farm in that part of Augusta County which is now known as Hardy County, Va. The place was located on Lost River above the hanging rocks, and about twenty miles from the county seat, Moorefield ; (the county formed in 1786 takes its name from Samuel Hardy, who was a member of the United States Congress.) He bought the farm of Lord Fairfax. The deed is dated 4 June, 1750, and the survey was made by George Washington (who was afterwards President of the United States.) The farm has been in the possession of the family ever since. He was a farmer, with all that implies in those times when the family had to be protected from the Indians and the land cleared before any planting could be done. A fort was built not far from the river, on the left bank, as a resort for the neighbors and a defense in time of attack of hostile Indians.

The lads startled by the noise of a broken branch, discovered a party of Indians stealthily advancing upon them, they instantly set out on a run for the fort. William being swift footed, though hotly pursued, escaped. James was captured or killed. William on being asked about his brother could only answer, "He's hid in the alders." The fort was destroyed by the Indians some time afterwards.

## 3.

**William<sup>2</sup> Warden**, son of William Wallace<sup>1</sup> and Elizabeth (Williams) Warden, was born in Virginia 9 July, 1749. He was a farmer and lived upon the ~~old~~ homestead where he was born. He was a Baptist of the old school as ~~agreeing~~ agreeing with the ancient faith of the Scotch Calvinists. He was oftimes a messenger of his church to the Association. He also officiated at funerals among his neighbors. He married in 1773 Sarah Christman; she was born 18 May, 1757, died 1832. She was the granddaughter of Joist Hite (a large owner of land in Virginia) and who married a sister of President James Madison. William<sup>2</sup> Warden died 19 Sept., 1823, aged 74.

Wm. Calhoun, to Mary Leas, the daughter of Jacob Leas a well-to-do planter near Staunton, Va. (Mr. Leas was a native of Pennsylvania, born 28 May, 1765, died 14 May, 1843. He had resided in Virginia for 53 years, respected by all who knew him. He was a good citizen, long an acting magistrate of the county and was High Sheriff during the last years of his life. He united himself to the Presbyterian church about 1808, and remained an elder of the church to the time of his death.) Jacob<sup>3</sup> Warden died 14 Jan., 1828, at the early age of 39 years, leaving six children.

J., and having a competency of his own, he located near Wardensville, W. Va., and for many years preached in the sparsely settled regions of Hardy county. While he was a man of rare intellect and classical



attainments and was a fit companion for the most cultivated, yet he was simple in his manner, and visited and mingled freely with the most humble classes. He was a friend of the rich and poor alike and loved by all. While attending the Synod at Culpeper, Va., he met Miss Mary Wade Ashby, and was married to her 28 Oct., 1862. She was the youngest daughter of William Ashby, Esq., and Lucy (Strother) Ashby, and grand-daughter of Capt. John Ashby of Revolutionary fame. She was a cousin of the distinguished cavalry officer, Gen. Turner Ashby, C. S. A. Shortly after his marriage Mr. Warden removed to Rappahannock county, Va., and purchased a farm and raised his family. He continued to preach until shortly before his death, which occurred 2 March, 1894. He was a devoted, humble, Christian man, always ready to worship God with any denomination, though he was a firm Presbyterian. He was great lover of English, Latin and Greek classics, was devoted to Milton's "Paradise Lost," and read Shakespeare a great deal. He loved the old hymns of Isaac Watts, John and Charles Wesley. # WARDEN FAMILY.

SCOTLAND.

---

From an old manuscript book written by Hugh Warden of Scotland, in 1782, in which he writes about his family and about a trip to America that he made in 1763, I copy a few facts about his family and his account of the origin of the name *Warden*. This book, together with the copy of the record of the old Bible, was loaned me by the courtesy of H. P. Warden of Danville, Ky.

“That part of Great Britain called Scotland is my native country ; I was born on the 20th day of November (old style), 1745, in a Market-town called Alyth, fourteen Scottish miles north of Perth, the Shire-town. On the verge of the famous Grampian mountains, which, being guarded by their sons, the Romans attempted in vain to take, lay the seat of my youthful studies, my father being my school-master—he yet lives and conducts that seminary, his education was regularly classical, and being intended for the church he also went through his years of study in divinity—he is an acknowledged man of genius, but the warmth of his constitution led him to deeds disallowed by the clergy in that country, and he then became rector of the school of Alyth, the post his father had occupied. My mother is yet alive, my father’s only wife ; she is of the Stewart family, and a lineal descendant from the Royal blood by an illegitimated youthful exertion—her father was Laird of Armagog, a spot of ground close by Dunkeld, and was Factor to the Duke of Athol at the time of his death. My mother is a woman of a generous, brave mind, and has been a very careful manager of her household concerns. My father draws his descent from Sir William Wallace, and says



that Sir William's heir, on the captivity of that hero, fearing the persecution of his enemies, shifted his place of abode and took the name of Warden from Sir William having been Warden of the Scotch marches—so that, to this account my father used always to add, his children should be brave blood. There were eight of us—four only arrived at the years of maturity, and there are but three now alive, viz : John, who was bred for the church, but is now an attorney at law in Virginia ; Grome, who is married to William Panton, Notary Public and land surveyor now living in Alyth, and Hugh, the author of these memoirs."

pendence and the Constitution of the United States, and took part in the Virginia conventions. He was a very shrewd lawyer and his pleadings were very fine productions. A story is told of him that he was at one time in contempt before the House of Delegates for speaking disrespectfully of the members who voted against a certain bill. He was called before the committee. The committee reported that "Warden had appeared before them and waiving the necessity of examining any witnesses as to the charges against him, delivered in the following acknowledgement signed with his name:

"I do acknowledge that, in a mistaken opinion that the House of Delegates had voted against the payment of British debts, agreeable to the treaty of peace between America and Great Britain, I said that, if it had done so, some of them had voted against paying for the coats on their backs. A committee of the House judging this expression derogatory to the honor and justice of the House, I am sorry for the offence I have given, and assure the committee that it never was my intention to affront the dignity of the House or insult any member of it."

The House immediately resolved that the acknowledgment was satisfactory, and John Warden was discharged out of custody of the sergeant at arms. The above gave rise to the story that went the rounds at the time, viz: That John Warden was summoned before the House and made to beg pardon on his knees for insulting the members. This he did, as soon, however, as he arose from his knees, pretending to brush the dust from his knees, though really pointing his hands toward the House, he uttered audibly in broad Scotch, and evidently with a double meaning, "Upon my word a *dommed dirty house* it is, indeed." This could not have been true, as he did not appear before the House, only before a committee.

**James' Davis**, the pioneer of this branch of the Davis family was probably born in Marlborough, Wiltshire County, England, about 1583-8. He came to this country with his wife and three sons and settled first at Newbury, Mass. He with twelve others, under the lead of Rev. John Ward, secured a grant from the government and settled what is now Haverhill; they went there in 1640. Samuel Gile, who seven years later became his son-in-law, was among the twelve. They went about clearing the woods off and making a settlement. In 1642 they bought out the rights of the Indians to the land, and Thomas Davis, a brother of James, was one of the witnesses to the deed. This Thomas was a sawyer and came from Marlborough, England, soon after James did. James must have been a man of considerable wealth for those times, for in 1643 he was one of three in the settlement that were worth over £200, and in 1646 James Davis paid the largest tax. When the town elected its first selectmen in 1646 they were: James Davis, Thomas Davis, Thomas Hale, Henry Palmer and William White. In 1645 there were thirty-two land-holders in the town, and James Davis, James

**NOTE.** James Davis Sr. and his son Ephraim signed a paper presented to Ipswich Court, February, 1658, against John Godfrey, accusing him of witchcraft.

**NOTE.** In 1650 a law was passed that forbid any person whose estate did not exceed £200 from wearing any gold or silver lace or buttons, silk hoods, ribbons or scarfs, under penalty of 10 shillings.



Davis Jr. and John Davis were among them; also John Eaton and Joseph Peasley, whose daughters married James Jr. and John Davis. The first meeting house was built in 1646, and "Thomas Davis was given £3 to ground-pin and daub it. He to provide the stone and clay." In the second division of land, made in 1652, James Davis had 10 acres, James Davis Jr. 10 acres, John Davis 6 acres, Thomas Davis 8 acres, John Eaton 10 acres.

His wife was Cicely or Sissilla ———. His wife and three of the children must have come over with him, for James, John and Judith were born before his arrival in this country. He died 29 Jan., 1678-9, and left a will which was proven in in 1680. His wife died 28 May, 1673, at Haverhill.

The following sketch of Hamilton S. Peck was written in 1898, by Hon. G. G. Benedict, editor of the *Burlington (Vt.) Free Press*.

“Hamilton Sullivan Peck, mayor of Burlington, was born in Royalston, Mass., Oct. 22, 1845, son of Sullivan and Czarina (Davis) Peck. He is of English descent. The branch of the extensive Peck family to which he belongs, dates back through

over twenty generations to John Peck of Belton, Yorkshire, England, and the motto on the family coat of arms '*Probitatem quam divitias*'—probity rather than riches—has characterized many of the descendents. The first American ancestor was Joseph Peck, who, fleeing from Hingham, England, to avoid religious persecution, came to the Plymouth Colony in 1638, and settled in Rehoboth, Mass. The early education of Hamilton S. Peck was

received in a 'little red school house' in his native town; in Athol, Mass., High School; and in the High School in Burlington Vt., where he fitted for college. He entered the University of Vermont in 1866 with creditable rank as a scholar. While in college he became a member of the Sigma Phi fraternity. After his graduation he taught school for three years, pursuing at the same time the study of law. He was admitted to the Bar of Chittenden County, April, 1873, and commenced practice in Burlington. He soon established a reputation as one of the rising young lawyers of Vermont. In 1878, he was elected State's Attorney for Chittenden County and held the office for two years. In 1883-5, he was a leading member of the Board of Aldermen of Burlington. He held the office of City Judge for six years, 1888-94. In 1896, he was elected Mayor of Burlington. He filled the office with marked ability and credit, and received a re-election in 1897 without opposition. He has been an active, earnest and working Republican. He became a member of the Republican State Committee in 1892, and was its efficient secretary for four years, 1892-6. He is President of the Republican League of Vermont, 1896-8. Mayor Peck is a prominent member of the Masonic Order and of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. He has been Master of Burlington Lodge, Free and Accepted Masons, is a Mason of the thirty-second degree and a member of the Mystic Shrine. Now in the prime of life, he is emphatically a 'man of progress', and if his life and health are spared, he will be heard of more hereafter in public life. On Jan. 28, 1875, he was married to Miss Selina A. Aiken, daughter of Hon. D. W. Aiken, of Hardwick, Vt. They have one child: Roy Hamilton Peck."

In 1900, Hamilton S. Peck was elected Judge Advocate General of the State of Vermont by the Legislature.

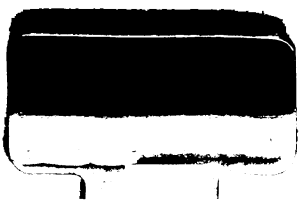
