

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INTRODUCTION.

During the period between the years 1877 and 1890, nearly all of the burial places on Long Island that had been in general and parish use prior to 1800 were visited by the writer, and careful transcripts made by him of such inscriptions as could then be found. In addition to these, various private or family grounds,—those that were most easily accessible,—were also visited for the same purpose. The following pages contain copies of epitaphs found in Southold, Shelter Island and Easthampton, the towns covering the eastern extremity of Long Island and forming part of the county of Suffolk, the place of record of which is Riverhead, in the town of the same name. Inscriptions from the burial places at Mattituck and Cutchogue in the westerly part of Southold, and those of the family ground of the Gardiners on Gardiner's Island, of Easthampton, are not included in this publication.

The larger number of the first settlers of eastern Suffolk were of English birth or extraction, many of them having been for a while established in the southern colonies of the New England States, relations with which, both political and ecclesiastical, were of the most intimate character. In fact, Suffolk county in colonial times was thoroughly New England in its affiliations and interests.

The early grave stones still standing are mostly either of imported slate, or of sand stone brought across the Sound from the Connecticut shore. Those of slate are generally in excellent condition. The material of which these were made was from the quarries of southwestern England and Their counterparts may be seen in all the older coast towns of New England from Portsmouth to New Haven, and examples are still standing in the old church yards of Trinity and St. Paul's in the City of New York. Their decorated heads and borders, in a great variety of forms, and carefully conventionalized in character, were engraved in the mother country, while the inscriptions were usually cut on this side of the Atlantic. On many of these slate stones the fine scratches made by the workman with the corner of his chisel, to limit the heights of the letters of the inscription, are still plainly discernible; the storms of two hundred years have failed to obliterate them or to make the slightest impression on the original surface. It is far otherwise with the stones from the home quarries of Connecticut. On many of these the inscriptions have suffered, surface disintegration having obliterated all but the deeper cut portions of the letters, while it is not uncommon to find the entire surface scaled away so that all evidences of inscription have vanished. In the light of the lesson of two hundred years it is fair to predict that at the end of this twentieth century but a remnant of the native stones whose epitaphs are

preserved in these pages will be standing. The advent of the troubles with the mother country naturally put an end to the importation of the English slates, and they were completely superseded by the brown-stones from the Connecticut valley, which, in turn, gave way in the early part of the nine-teenth century to memorials of white marble.

It has been impossible in these pages to accurately represent the styles of lettering in use during the period covered by the epitaphs. No attempt has been made to indicate the logotypes or composite letters which were common on the older stones, and which are, in some cases, of much interest archæologically. The arrangement in lines as found upon the stones has been generally observed, while the use of capitals, italics, and of superior letters has been always carefully followed. Worthy of special notice are a few stones in the old ground of Southold Village, lying horizontally, about six feet in length, portions of whose inscriptions form a border at the edges of the four sides, an extremely unusual feature in this country (see pp. 7, 8 and 10). But two examples of the use of coat armor on original stones occur in any of the grounds under present consideration; both in Shelter Island, and upon the tombs of the Sylvesters and Deerings.

Innumerable family burying grounds were scattered over Long Island, the larger portion of which were on the farms of the early settlers, and in many cases at considerable distances from the villages. Some of these grounds have been for many years unused, some have been ploughed over, and the stones either buried or removed to the nearest public cemetery. In God's acre a fair chance would seem to exist for the protection of a grave stone, but the family burial place, overrun with eattle, and subjected to the yearly encroachments of the plough, offers scant hope for the long preser-The frugal farmer finds the flat stone a convenient vation of its contents. cover for a trench or for a wall coping. Only lately the Beales were scouring eastern Long Island for their ancestor's head-stone, taken from its place on the farm to be built into a chimney, and later to be used as a door step. And not long since, a search for the death date of another Long Islander traced into Dutchess county, resulted in its discovery on his grave stone which had long made a part of the flagged walk to his granddaughter's

SOUTHOLD.

THE eastern end of Long Island is divided into two long and narrow peninsulas by a body of water some forty miles in length, constituting, itself, a series of connecting bays. The northerly and shorter one of these peninsulas is the township of Southold. It has an average width of hardly three miles, with an extreme length of twenty-two, being almost surrounded by the waters of Long Island Sound and the two bays, Peconic and Gardiner's. The township is traversed longitudinally by two main roads that enter its bounds from its adjoining neighbor on the west, Riverhead, but which merge into one a few miles from the castern extremity of the town. The first settlement by the whites (who were of English birth) was in 1639-40, though the town records were not begun in the form in which we now have them until 1651. The village of Southold is near the south shore, and at about the middle of the township in the direction of its length. Here was built the first church, and the burying ground, one of the oldest on the Island, was by its side, on the south side of the main street. The inscriptions following, on pages 3-24, are all that were found there in 1884, antedating 1800.

About four miles west of Southold village, on the south road, is the old burying-ground of the settlement of Cutchogue. In 1886 it was in a very neglected condition. It contained then one hundred and thirty-six stones of the eighteenth century, the oldest of which was of 1717. The epitaphs of two of the early pastors are here:—

From three to four miles further west is the burying-ground of the village of Mattituck, at the westerly end of the township, adjoining the Presbyterian church, a few rods south of the Mattituck station of the Long Island rail-road. It contained in 1886 one hundred and thirty-eight stones of the eighteenth century, the oldest date being 1723. The surnames found there are those of Aldrich, Barker, Benjamin, Brown, Case, Clark, Cleaves, Conklin (1726), Corwin, Dimon (1725), Gardiner, Goldsmith, Halliock, Havens, Howell, Hubbard, Hudson, Lamb (1729), Mann, Mapes (1732), Moore, Osborn, Overton, Parker (1727), Parshall (1725), Pendleton, Pike, Pritchard, Reeves (1723), Swasey, Terry, Tinker (1728), Turrell, Tusten, Tuthill, Wells, Wickham, Wines and Worth.

East of Southold village, and near the Sound shore, is the little burial place of Hashamomack, the epitaphs from which are to be found on pages 94 and 95.

East of Greenport, a mile and one half, is the "Sterling Cemetery," near the little village of East Marion. The inscriptions here that could be read in 1881, of dates prior to 1800, are printed on pages 25-27.

Still further east, and where the waters of the Sound and Gardiner's Bay have so nearly effected a union that but a very narrow neck of land divides them, are the old burial places of Oyster Pond (page 28) and the later one of Orient Village (page 36).

Joseph Reeve, d. 1736, p. 4. Will dated July 19, 1722, and proved June 3, 1736; blacksmith, in "perfect health"; wife Deliverance, sons Joseph, Benjamin, David, Hezekiah. Solomon and William, dans. Abigail, Mary and Hannah; sons Benjamin and William executors. (N. Y. Wills, 12, 514.)

John Gooldsmith, d. 1724, p. 5. Will dated Feb. 25, and proved Mar. 18, 1724-5; yeoman, very sick; wife Mary, sons John, Zaecheus, Jeremiah and Daniel, and daus., one of whom is Mary Wells. (N. Y. Wills, 10, 32.)

Solmon, p. 5. In Lib. 1 of N. Y. Wills are recorded the papers connected with the administration of the estate of an early William Solmon, who had married Katherine, the widow of Matthew Sunderland, a seaman, and the owner of lands at Hashamacock. By her he had four children, and by another wife, Sarah, two others, and died so that his widow Sarah could become the wife of John Conkling before March, 1666, when Conkling was appointed to administer Solmon's estate, and sets forth that he had maintained these "divers young children." The children who were the heirs of the Hashamacock lands were John, Mary (the oldest daughter), Sarah, Rebecca, Elizabeth and Hannah.

JOHN CONKELYNE, d. 1694, p. 8. No will appears on record. A later John, yeoman of Southold, made his will Jan. 15, 1705-6, and it was presented Oct. 14 following, and allowed Jan. 2, 1706-7. He gave an interest in his lands at Hashamacock to his wife Sarah, and names oldest son John, second son Henry, third Thomas and fourth Joseph, and daus. Sarah, Rachel, Mary and Elizabeth.

Barnabas Horron, d. 1680, p. 10. He made his will May 3, 1680, "findeing sundry Distemp' Dayly Growing upon me," naming sons (1) Joseph, (2) Benjamin, (3) Caleb, (4) Joshua, (5) Jonathan, eldest dau. Hannah Trevale, Joseph, the son of dau. Sarah Conckling, third dau. Mary Budd, youngest dau. Mercy Youngs, and wife Mary who shall be sole executrix. (N. Y. Wills, 2, 417.)

RICHAID STIER, d. 1721, p. 14. He made his will Mar. 29, 1721, being "aged and infirm"; to Joshua Wheeler of New London "a penal obligation," to Elizabeth, wife of Nathaniel Beebe, Elizabeth, wife of Jacob Alley of New London, Mary, dan, of Nathaniel and Elizabeth Beebe, Anna wife of John Tonge, Betty or Elizabeth, dan, of John and Anna Tonge,—these six legatees being "children and grandchildren of my former wife Elizabeth,"—dan, in law Bythia, wife of Isaac Hubbard, and wife Bithye Steer. (N. Y. Wills, 9, 295.)

Con. John Youngs, d. 1698, p. 21. His will of Feb. 20, 1696-7, gave all his lands to his son Thomas Youngs, and to each of his two daus. Deborah Longworth and Martha Gardiner one third of his movable estate. A small legacy was left to his grandson Daniel Youngs. (N. Y. Wills, 5, 243.)

LIEUT. GIDEON⁴ YOUNGS, d. 1749, p. 28. He was son of Gideon¹ d. 1699)

and Sarah, and was about 76 at his death in 1749. He used a lion sejent seal.

GIDEON³ YOUNGS, d. 1699, p. 28. He was son of Capt. Joseph² and Margaret. nephew of Rev. John² Youngs, and through either father or mother, grandson of Rev. Christopher! Youngs, vicar of Reydon and Southwold, co. Suifolk. England.

EZEKIEL⁶ Youngs, d. 1727, p. 28. He was son of Gideon⁵ (Lieut, teideon⁴) by his first wife Eunice Petty.

DOROTHY YOUNGS, d. 1753, p. 28. She was daughter of Ensign Richard³ Brown (Lieut. Richard²), b. April 3, 1688, mar. 1708-9 Jonathan⁴ Youngs.

DOROTHY YOUNGS, d. 1719, p. 29. She was daughter of Jonathan. who was elder brother of Lieut. Gideon4 Youngs.

Dorothy Brown, d. 1754, p. 29. Her mother, Dorothy, is supposed to have

been a dan. of Joseph and Dorothy (Tuthill) Brown.

PATIANCE TERRY, d. 1754, p. 29. She was a daughter of Jonathan⁴ (Thomas, Thomas, Thomas) by wife Lydia Tuthill (Daniel, John, Henry, Henry).

THOMAS TERRY, d. 1753, p. 29. Brother of the last, d. Nov. 12, 1753, in his

14th year.

Esther Youngs, d. 1749, p. 29. Richard⁵ Youngs, her husband (and the father of Jeremian, 6 d. 1759) was son of Jonathan and Dorothy (Brown) Youngs. His first wife was Esther (Warren?). His will dated May 30, 1765 (vide N. Y. co. Wills, Lib. 25, p. 187), names wife Phebe, sons Richard, Warren, Daniel and Henry, and daughters Esther and Susanna not yet eighteen.

JEREMIAH VAIL, d. 1749, p. 29. He was probably son of Jeremiah. and mar. Apr. 6, 1732, Elizabeth Yonges (Joshua, Zerubabel?, Col. John, Rev. John). Jeremiah Vail was at Salem 1639, and afterwards at Gardiner's Island, East Hampton and Sonthold; his first wife, mother of Jeremiah,2 is unknown the mar. (2) widow Mary Payne, and (3) Joyce _____). Jeremiah² mar. Ann widow of Benjamin Moore, and was father of Jeremiah.³

Benjamin Tutinell, d. 1748-9, p. 29. He was doubtless son of Jonathan⁵ TUTHILL (d. 1741-2) (Henry, John, Henry, Henry), who mar. Feb. 23, 1723, Susanna (d. 1743), dan. of Benjamin and Patience (Sylvester) L'Hommedieu, grand dan, of Capt. Nathaniel Sylvester of Shelter Island, and great grand dan. of Thomas Brinley, Esq. of Staffordshire, England, auditor to K. Charles I.

CAPT. WILLIAM BOOTH, d. 1723, p. 29. He mar. 1688, HANNAH (d. 1742) King (Samuel, William), b. Jan. 26, 1666; of their issue, William (d. 1712) was b. May 25, 1689, and George (d. 1713) was b. Apr. 28, 1696. Vide Воотн GENEALOGY for earlier data of the family.

Jonathan Brown, d. 1710, p. 30. He was doubtless Jonathan, the second son of Lieut. Richard² Brown. He mar. Elizabeth, dan. of Capt. Nathaniel Sylvester of Shelter Island.

Samuel King, d. 1721, p. 30. He was a son of William and Dorothy (Hayne?) King of Salem, mar. Oct. 10, 1660, Frances, dan. of William and Clemence Ludlam of Matlock, England, and Southampton, N. Y., who died Jan. 14, 1692, aged about 53 yrs.*

HANNAH TUTHILL. d. 1715, p. 30. Her identity is in dispute. Keith, in his Ancestry of Benjamin Harrison, surmises that her surmanne was Crouch. Gridin says she was a dan, of Samuel⁵ Beebe of Plum Island, but a deed of Beebe's shows that his dau. Hannah mar. David King. The late Charles B. Moore stated that her name was Booth, and a careful study of the subject by the present writer would seem to render this position highly probable. If so, she was probably that dau. of Capt. William and Hannah (King) Booth (see unte)

RICHARD KING, d. 1735, p. 30. He was b. Nov. 5, 1711, son of William⁴ and Bathshua (Beebe) King.

Bezaleel King, d. 1735, p. 30. Brother of the last, b. Mar. 31, 1727.
Bathshua King, d. 1764, p. 30. She was b. May 16, 1688, dau. of Samuel and Elizabeth (Rogers) Beebe of Plum Island. Her issue by William⁴ King, b. Feb. 14, 1677-8 (William, 3 Samuel, 2 William), were: -William (mar. Elizabeth Beebe), Richard, Hannah (mar. Richard Baxter), James, Bathsheba, Susanna (mar. Robert Sheffield), Bezaleel and Paul.

PAUL KING, d. 1750, p. 30. He was b. May 2, 1731, son of above Bathshua. Susanna Sheffield, d. 1766, p. 30. She was b. May 29, 1723, mar. June 22, 1749. Four children born to Robert and Susannah Sheffield are recorded in Lib. E. Southold Records, of whom Susannah (d. 1766) was b. Dec. 7, 1750, and ROBERT (d. 1753), was b. June 21, 1752.

HANNAH KING, d. 1728-9, p. 31. She was b. Apr. 5, 1695, dan. of Samuel and Elizabeth (Rogers) Beebe, mar. Sept. 5, 1715. Her husband David King (William. Samuel. Hilliam, b. Oct. 22, 1693, was drowned Sept. 26, 1749, having mar. 1731 (2) Deborah the dan. of William³ (Samuel, Charles¹) Glover.

ELIZABETH BEEBEE, d. 1716, p. 31. She was b. Apr. 15, 1658, dau. of James Rogers of Stratford, Milford and New London, Conn., for whom May Flower ancestry, though often claimed, remains unproved. She mar. Feb. 9, 1682, Samuel Beebe of Plum Is., popularly known as "King" Beebe, who d. July, 1742. He was son, not of Joseph, as asserted by Griffin, but of Samuel4 of New London, who mar. (1) Agues² Keeney (William¹), probably the mother of all his children, and (2) her sister Mary, b. 1640. Samuel⁴ was son of John³ Beebe, who d. May 18, 1650, on the passage to America, sometime of Broughton, Northamptonshire, son of John² (and Alice), son of Alexander¹ and Elizabeth, all of Great Addington, Northamptonshire.

SARAH PAINE, d. 1716, p. 31. Her husband John Paine is not identified. Thomas Payne, the emigrant, died in Salem about 1650, leaving widow Elizabeth (possibly a dau. of Henry Tuthill of Tharston, co. Norfolk, England) who came to Southold with several of their children.

BEZELEL KING, d. 1725, p. 31. He was b. Jan. 23, 1703-4, son of William and Abigail (Brown) King.

ABIGALL KING, d. 1716, p. 31. She was dau. of Lieut. Richard and Hannah (King) Brown, and mar. Jan. 17, 1686-7, her first cousin William³ (Samuel,² William¹) King, who was b. Jan. 10, 1661-2, and d. May 12, 1740, having mar. (2 | Jan. 20, 1716, Susanna Crook (d. 1741).

Martha Glover, d. 1713, p. 31. Charles Glover, her husband, was probably son of Lient. Samuel² (Charles¹) Glover, and his wife Sarah² (Thomas¹) Moore, as the dates hardly admit of his having been the son of Samuel³ as stated in a modern note in the Southold Town Records. The emigrant, Charles Glover, a shipwright, was at Salem, Mass., in 1632, and died at Southold in Jan., 1665. His first wife died in March, 1648, the mother of Mary, wife of John Corwin, Elizabeth, wife of Geoffrey Jones, and Lieut. Samuel. His second wife was divorced, and he mar. (3) Esther Saunders, widow, probably dau, of John and Ann Rolfe of Southampton, L. I., and Newbury, Mass.

Mary Brown, d. 1711, p. 31. She was doubtless first wife of Samuel (Ensign Richard, Lieut. Richard, Richard ?), who was b. Mar. 21, 1686, and d. Apr. 30, 1725. He doubtless was the same who mar. (2) Jan. 14, 1712-13, Rebecca, dan, of Samuels and Elizabeth (Rogers) Beebe, b. Mar. 25, 1690.

Samuel King, d. 1725, p. 31. He was b. 23 (1) 1675, son of Samuel (Wiltiant). He mar. Jan. 1, 1697, Hannah, erroneously supposed to have been a dan, of Jonathan Havens.

The mutilated inscription on the next stone may, with a good deal of confidence, be restored thus:-

> [HERE LYES Ye] BODY [OF Mrs] HANNAII KING [W]IFE [OF M^r] [SAMUEL] KING [JUN^r] [WHO DEP]ART» THIS [LIFE] [AU]GUST Yº 17, [1712] IN Yº 39th YEAR OF HER AGE

Mary Wiggins, d. 1766, p. 32. She was b. Jan. 27, 1726, dau. of Ensign John⁴ King (Samuel, Samuel, William) by his wife Mary (Corey). She mar. (1) May, 1746, Dr. Peter Brown, (2) Mar. 6, 1754, John Wiggins; issue by both

EDWARD JOHNSON, d. 1717, p. 32. One Mr. Edward Johnson of New London bought land at Orient in 1718. He was described in 1714 as a shipwright, and was a married man at the time. Possibly the Edward buried here was a relative of Lot Johnson of Southold, of William Johnson who mar. Elizabeth³ Tuthill (Henry, Henry 1), or "of the wife of John Tooker of Southold and Brookhaven, whose first wife was probably Mary Johnson from Hingham, England."

Absalom King, d. 1752, p. 32. He was b. Oct. 5, 1733, son of Ensign John⁴

and Mary (Corey) King.

Ensign John King, d. 1753, p. 32. He was b. July 15, 1699, son of Samuel³ (Samuel, William,), and mar. June 25, 1724, Mary Corey, probably dau. of Abraham³ (Abraham, John¹), b. Jan. 11, 1707. Her surname has been sometimes erroneously given as Brown.

Capt. John 3 King, d. 1741-2, p. 32. He was b. Jan. 26, 1677. (Samuel, 2 William¹), mar. Aug. 22, 1704, Katharine (d. 1752) Osborne, b. Aug. 21, 1684. His will (N. Y. co. Lib. 14, p. 269) names among other children, his daughters Mary Booth and Elizabeth Hopkins. Of these, Mary, 4 b. July 22, 1705, mar. Oct. 1726, her 1st cousin, Lieut. Constant³ (Capt. William² by wife Hannah³ (King)) Booth, b. Jan. 8, 1701; and Elizabeth, mar. Dec. 26, 1734, Abijah, son of William and Rebecca Hopkins of Shelter Island, William being buried at Orient, as are Capt. William and Hannah Booth.

CHRISTOPHER Brown, d. 1739, p. 32. He was b. June 29, 1714, son of Capt.

Richard⁴ and Anna (Youngs) Brown.

Peter Brown, d. 1747, p. 32. He was b. Sept. 11, 1719, brother of the last, and grandson of Ensign Richard³ and Dorothy (King) Brown, and great grandson of Lieut. Richard² and Hannah (King) Brown. Apparently Richard² was a son of Richard, who d. Oct. 16, 1655, according to Moore's Indexes.

Anna Brown, d. 1753, p. 32. Doubtless the dau, of Richard⁵ Brown (brother of Christopher and Peter above) and his wife Hannah (Hawk), b. Apr.

30, 1745.

John Hopkins, d. 1727, p. 32. He was son of William, b. 1660 (Giles, 2

Stephen¹ of the Mayflower).

WILLIAM HOPKINS, d. 1718, p. 32. Rebecca (Havens?), wife of William, d. Apr. 23, 1746. His will mentions eight children, but six of whom are known by name, viz: William, Eferam, Hannah, Samuel, John, and Abijah, who mar. Elizabeth, dau. of Capt. John³ King, in 1734.

Eunice Youngs, d. 1725. A mutilated stone contains enough of an inscription to enable us, with the help of the town records, to construct the following:-

> Here lyes ye Body of Eunice Youngs ye Wife of Gideon Youngs Jung who died May ye 8 1715 In ye 24 year of her Age.

Gideon's Youngs (Lieut. Gideon, 4 Gideon, 3 Capt. Joseph, 2 Rev. Christopher'!?) b. Dec. 7, 1698, d. Dec. 25, 1780, mar. (1) Eunice Petty, (2) Rachel Rackett, b. Sep. 12, 1708, d. Nov. 23, 1787.

MICHAL TUTHILL, the fragment of whose stone remains, was dan, of Gideon5 and Rachel (Rackett) Youngs, b. Sep. 9, 1734, d. Feb. 26, 1756, O.S., mar. Aug. 7, 1755, N.S., Nathaniel Tuthill (Nathaniel, Daniel, John, Henry, Henry).

SOUTHOLD.—ORIENT VILLAGE.

The following inscriptions are from stones in a small burial-ground on the south side of the main road in the village of Orient. The slabs are of sand stone from the Connecticut quarries across the Sound, and only six bearing dates earlier than 1800 were standing in 1882. As a King and his wife Mary conveyed this land by deed, dated August 26, 1790, to Christopher Brown, and others, for burial purposes.

In Memory of Mr. Benjamin King, who departed this Life Sepr. 23d 1793, Aged 71 years & 3 Months.

Come friends & children who furvive my fall Drop a fad tear & hear your Saviour's call Death foon will lay you as you fee me lie Prepare to meet your God before you die.

My friends and all who come to view my grave Remember you this bed of clay muft have.

KING NOTE.

The King family, so largely represented in the burial-grounds of Southold, is descended from William King, who sailed from Weymouth, England, in March 1635-6, accompanied by his wife Dorothy, and five children, and settled at Salem, Massachusetts. The father died in Salem about 1650, intestate, and his estate was settled by the widow, and oldest son, William.

Some time later, the second son, Samuel, was found at Southold, where he was ultimately joined by his mother, Dorothy, and where she was living certainly as late as in 1684. The identity of mother and son with the Salem people is fully established. Samuel² married Abigail, the daughter of William Ludlam. He died in Southold, Nov. 29, 1721, aged 88. Three sons, all of Southold, outlived him, William, Samuel³ and John³, whose descendants liberally populated the eastern end of Long Island in both male and female lines.

Capt. John³ King, the youngest son of Samuel,² b. 1678, d. Jan. 19, 1741-2, was the father of that Benjamin (b. June 24, 1722) who with his wife Elizabeth are buried in the Orient Village ground.

beth are buried in the Orient Village ground.

Mr. Rufus King, of Yonkers, N. Y., to whose genealogical labors at home and abroad a large number of Kings are indebted for their family history, is a descendant of Capt. John's older brother, Samuel. of Southold, through John, John, Rufus and Rufus-Sylvester, the last of Southold and of New York City.

SHELTER ISLAND.

SHELTER ISLAND, situated in the waterway between the two eastern peninsulas of Long Island, and equidistant from the towns of Southold and Easthampton, is of very irregular shape, with an extreme length in one direction of about six miles, and in the other of about four. Formerly belonging to Southold, in 1730 it was incorporated as a separate township. The Sylvesters were, for a time, its sole owners, parting with portions in 1695 to William Nicholl and George Havens.

The burial ground from which these inscriptions were taken is near the geographical centre of the island. It is in two parts, the larger being on the south side of the road, and opposite the Presbyterian church editice, while the smaller is in the rear of that building, and on the north side of the road. All epitaphs of date prior to 1800, which were found there in August, 1881, are here printed. A small private ground of the Nicoll Family, about three miles to the south, contained in 1883 no old inscriptions.

EASTHAMPTON.

Or the two peninsulas forming the eastern end of Long Island, one half the length of the longer, terminating in what is known as Montauk Point, constitutes, with Gardiner's Island to the eastward, the township of Easthampton. From west to east this main portion of the town is twenty-three miles in length, its south side being an unbroken, straight stretch of beach, pounded unceasingly by the waves of the Atlantic Ocean. More than twelve miles of the easterly end consists of only a range of low sand hills, averaging hardly a mile in width, and containing no villages. Just west of this the land abruptly widens to six miles or more, the northern line broken by deep harbors from Gardiner's Bay. Within this wider portion of the township lie the principal villages, Amagansett, Easthampton and Wainscott.

AMAGANSETT.

The home of the whale fishers. Amagansett, the eastern village of the township, is within sound of the ocean surf on the great south beach, and three miles east of the principal settlement, Easthampton. Its wide main street is crossed by another, leading to the ocean, and at their junction is the old burying ground, containing in 1887 the following inscriptions antedating 1800.

EASTHAMPTON VILLAGE.

The village of Easthampton, the principal settlement in the township, is distant between three and four miles from the westerly line, and but a short distance from the south beach. The old burying ground is a long and narrow enclosure lying as it were in the middle of the main street. It is among the oldest, and most important, in an historical sense, in the county. In 1887 no other epitaphs of a date prior to 1800 were to be found there than these that follow.

APPENDIX.

SOUTHOLD.—HASHAMOMACK.

A small burying-ground in Hashamomack, now Arshmomoque, a district lying between the villages of Southold and Greenport, east of Mill Creek, which runs almost across the Island. The creek was formerly known as Thomas Benedict's or Tom's Creek.

The deed for Hashamomack has not been found. The earliest conveyances in the Southold Town Records are those of James ffarrett, agent of the Earl of Sterling, to Matthew Sinderland, in 1639. Sinderland's widow married William Salmon who owned the Hashamomack land. Salmon's second wife, Sarah² Horton (Barnabas¹), mar. 2d, Capt. John² Concklyne (John¹), whose descendants still own land at Arshmomoque. Henry Whitney, Edward Treadwell, Thomas Benedict and John Corey were early owners at Hashamomack.

The following inscriptions were copied in September, 1900, by Miss L. D. Akerly, and the accompanying notes have been prepared by her.

Mary Bradley, d. 1785; her maiden name was Conkling; she was mar. Feb., 1754.

JOHN CONKLING, d. 1751, calls Henry Conkling his "brother" in his will on

file in the N. Y. Surrogate's Office. He was son of John's and Sarah.

SARAH CONKLING, d. 1753, aged 89, was not Sarah² Horton (Barnabas¹), who mar. Capt. John² Concklyne in 1657, but was doubtless wife of John³ Concklyne (Capt. John²). The will of Capt. John is given in Pelletreau's Early Long Island Wills; that of his son John, before mentioned, is alluded to on p. 24 of this work, dated in 1705-6.

HENRY CONKLING, d. 1753, mar. Jan. 16, 1716-17, Temperance² Bailey (Stephen¹), b. Aug. 7, 1691, d. 1739. He mar. 2d, May 12, 1742, widow Mary Budd, dau. of Cartaret Gillam. She d. in 1771, wife of Silvanus Davis.‡ Henry's will is in N. Y. Surrogate, Lib. 18, 489.

Lieut. Joseph⁴ Conkling, doubtless son of Joseph³ and Abigail (Tuthill) Conkling, grandson of Capt. John² Concklyne, b. Aug. 7, 1691, d. 1739-40, iu his 49th year, His wife Lydia d. 1743.§ Their son, Capt. Joseph, d. 1756, mar. Sarah Wickham (Joseph).

NATHANIEL TUTHILL, d. 1768 (Nathaniel, Daniel, John, Henry, Henry), mar. 1st, Michal Youngs. 2d, Mary Havens. Their dau. Abigail died 1769.

SUSANNA CONKLING (ward of Col. Isaac Arnold of Southold, who mar. her widowed mother) was dau. of John Washburn of Flushing and his wife Sarah (Cornell). Susanna mar. Samuel Conkling, doubtless son of Jacob² (John¹), in 1702.
