



Forsey Page was one of Canada's leading architects. He was past president of the Ontario Association of Architects and the Royal Architectural Institute of Canada, a Fellow of the Royal Institute of British Architects and academician of the Royal Canadian Academy.
Mr. Page was also a member of the Senate of the University of Toronto and Knight of Grace of the Order of St. John. His firm of Page and Steele was the designer of many of Ontario's public buildings including the O'Keefe Centre in Toronto.
