

SIR,— In compliance with section 24, chapter 3, of the Revised Ordinances, the Board of Election Commissioners respectfully submits its annual report.

REGISTRATION.

In accordance with chapter 246 of the Acts of 1945 registration was held continuously at the central office from January 3 to August 18, inclusive, from September 20 to October 6, inclusive, and from November 8 to December 31, inclusive. Registration in wards was held on August 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 18, from 6 p. m. to 10 p. m., for the State Primary; and September 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, October 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, from 6 p. m. to 10 p. m., for the State Election. This registration was held in two places in different sections of each ward, ten nights in each place.

Registration for the Special City Election in Ward 7, held on September 12, was continued to and closed on September 5. Registration for this Special Election was held in the central office from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m., and on September 5, from 9 a. m. to 10 p. m.

**NUMBER OF VOTERS.**

At the City Election held November 8, 1949, the number of voters on the list was 404,220. The number of such voters in the first list published by the Board July 15, 1950, was 365,042. From that time to the close of registration for the State Election there were added the names of 40,984 voters. Included in this latter figure are the names of 9,658 voters who were omitted from the 1950 police listing and who were restored to the voting list without registration, under the provisions of chapter 244 of the Acts of 1947. The number of voters on the final list sent to the polls on the day of the State Election, held November 7, 1950, was 406,026, an increase of 1,806 from the number on the list at the preceding City Election. The number of voters on final list December 31, 1950, was 406,128.

**NOMINATION PAPERS AND REFERENDUM PETITIONS.**

The Board received 2,007 nomination papers for the State Primary, on which 35,759 names were certified; 294 independent nomination papers for the State Election, on which 7,939 names were certified; 366 papers were submitted on 3 initiative petitions on which 4,500 names were certified; and 14 petitions for recounts of ballots cast, on which 1,560 names were certified. This makes a total of 2,024 papers, on which the names of 41,819 voters were certified.

**REVISION OF THE VOTING LIST.**

The names of 4,493 voters were stricken from the voting list by reason of death, removal from the city, and other causes.

**JURORS.**

The jury list prepared by the Board in 1950 contained the names of 9,194 voters of Boston. During the time covered by this report, 2,229 were drawn for jury service.

**REGISTRATION OF THE PHYSICALLY DISABLED.**

In accordance with the provisions of chapter 196 of the Acts of 1946, persons qualified to vote but unable to appear at a registration office because of physical

disability were examined for registration in their homes or other places of confinement upon receipt of an application for such registration. Applications were received from 8 such persons. Of that number, 7 were found to be qualified and were duly registered; 1 was found to be a registered voter on the current voting list. No applications were received after the closing date established by law. Persons found qualified to register were furnished with applications for absentee ballots for the State Election.

#### SUPPLEMENTARY REGISTRATION OF SOLDIERS AND SAILORS.

Under the provisions of chapter 51, sections 50 and 51, of the General Laws, 3 persons in the military service were registered as voters in Boston during the period from the close of registration to the third day preceding the State Election.

#### ABSENT VOTING.

Absentee voting applied to this State Election, and set forth below are statistics relating to absentee ballots:

- 857 applications received from civilians.
- 778 civilian ballots mailed.
- 625 civilian ballots returned and sent to polls.
- 863 applications received from physically disabled.
- 690 ballots mailed to physically disabled.
- 576 ballots returned and sent to polls.
- 295 applications received from members of the armed forces (both voters and S. A. V.'s).
- 0 applications received from kin for registered voters in the armed forces.
- 3 applications received from kin qualifying persons in the armed forces (S. A. V's).

- 298 total applications for servicemen's ballots.
- 200 ballots mailed to servicemen.
- 141 ballots returned by servicemen and sent to polls.
  - 8 civilian ballots returned "unclaimed."
  - 2 servicemen's ballots returned "unclaimed."
  - 27 civilian ballots returned too late to be cast.
  - 20 servicemen's ballots returned too late to be cast.
- 2,018 total applications received.
- 1,668 total ballots mailed.
- 1,342 total ballots returned and sent to polls.

**VOTING MACHINES.**

The 1950 State Primary and Election were conducted with four wards (Wards 1, 2, 3, and 4) completely equipped with voting machines, and voting machines were used in 67 other precincts throughout the city, in two or more precincts in every ward.

Assistant Registrars were assigned to give demonstrations in the evening in each ward. The public was notified as to the dates and locations of these demonstrations through the newspapers.

Demonstrations for the Primary were held on September 13 and 14, from 6 p. m. to 9 p. m., and for the Election on November 2 and 3, from 7 p. m. to 10 p. m.

There were 109 voting-machine precincts in the 1950 State Primary and Election, and election officers were instructed in their respective duties by the Voting Machine Custodian, and were given certificates when qualified.

The results as demonstrated at these two functions were highly satisfactory.

**MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD.**

The term of the Honorable Joseph A. Langone, Jr., expired on March 31, 1950. Mr. Joseph Russo was appointed to succeed him for the term of four years ending March 31, 1954, and assumed the duties of his office on April 3, 1950. He was designated by the Mayor as Chairman of the Board of Election Commissioners. Upon organization of the Board, Commissioner Gertrude A. Pfau was elected Secretary.

**EXPENSES OF THE ELECTION DEPARTMENT.**

The expenses of the Election Department for the year ending December 31, 1950, amounted to \$440,741.96.


