SIR, — In compliance with section 24, chapter 3, of the Revised Ordinances, the Board of Election Commissioners respectfully submits its annual report.

REGISTRATION

In accordance with chapter 236 of the Acts of 1966, registration was held as follows:

At the central office from 9 A.M. to 5 P.M., Saturdays, Sundays and holidays excepted; from January 3 to January 25, inclusive; from January 27 to February 15, inclusive; from February 17 to July 15, inclusive; from September 14 to September 23, inclusive; and from November 9 to December 30, inclusive.

At the central office from 9 A.M. to 10 P.M., Saturdays included as noted: On January 26, for the Special State Primaries in Wards 3 and 5; on February 16, for the Special State Election in Wards 3 and 5; from July 18 to August 5, inclusive; on Saturday, August 6; from August 8 to August 12, inclusive; and on Saturday, August 13, for the State Primaries; from September 26

to September 30, inclusive; on Saturday, October 1; from October 3 to October 7, inclusive; and on Saturday, October 8, for the State Election.

At locations in public buildings in each of the twenty-two wards from 6 P.M. to 10 P.M., from July 18 to August 5, inclusive; from August 8 to August 12, inclusive; and on Saturdays, August 6 and 13, from 9 A.M. to 10 P.M., for the State Primaries; from 6 P.M. to 10 P.M., from September 26 to September 30, inclusive; from October 3 to October 7, inclusive; and on Saturdays, October 1 and 8, from 9 A.M. to 10 P.M., for the State Election.

Physically disabled: In accordance with the provisions of chapter 196 of the Acts of 1946, persons qualified to vote, but who are unable to appear at a registration office because of a physical disability were examined in their homes or other places of confinement upon receipt of an application for such registration. Applications were received from 181 such persons. Of that number 66 were found to be qualified and were duly registered. It was found that 36 of the applicants were previously registered and on the voting lists. Persons so registered or on the voting lists were furnished with applications for absentee ballots for the State Election. Fifty persons requesting such registration, either refused to be registered when visited or were found not qualified for such registration. Applications for registration from 29 persons were received too late to be acted upon in accordance with the law.

Supplementary registration of Federal Service Personnel: Under provisions of Chapter 51, sections 50 and 51 of the General Laws, as amended by chapter 283 of the Acts of 1966, extended the time for such registration to on or before 4 P.M., of the day preceding a primary or an election. There were 19 such registrations in Boston.

NUMBER OF VOTERS

At the City Election, held on November 2, 1965, the number of voters on the list was 299,194. The number of such voters in the first list published by the Board, August 2, 1966, was 269,287. From that time to the close of registration for the State Election there were added the names of 25,613. Included in this latter figure are the names of 4,660 voters who were restored

to the voting list without registration, under the provisions of chapter 244 of the Acts of 1947. The number of voters on the final list sent to the polls on the day of the State Election, held on November 8, 1966, was 294,900, a decrease of 4,294 from the number on the list at the preceding City Election. The number of voters on the final list, December 30, 1966, was 294,907.

NOMINATION PAPERS, REFERENDUM, INITIATIVE AND RECOUNT PETITIONS

The Board received 139 nomination papers for the Special State Primaries in Wards 3 and 5, on which 2,091 names were certified; 3,321 nomination papers for the State Primaries, on which 82,206 names were certified; 1 initiative petition for repeal of parts of the sales tax, consisting of 4 papers on which 10 names were certified; 1 initiative petition for repeal of other parts of the sales tax, consisting of 5 papers on which 17 names were certified; 1 referendum petition for repeal of the sales tax, consisting of 353 papers on which 6,080 names were certified; 1 question of public policy regarding the sales tax, consisting of 6 papers on which 251 names were certified; 1 question of public policy regarding automobile insurance, consisting of 6 papers on which 253 names were certified; 1 question of public policy regarding legislative pay raise, consisting of 6 papers on which 251 names were certified; 1 initiative petition for reduction of the House of Representatives, consisting of 202 papers on which 3,427 names were certified; and 4 petitions for recounts of ballots cast at the State Primaries, consisting of 8 papers on which 240 names were certified; making a total of 4,050 papers filed, on which the names of 94,826 voters were certified.

RECOUNTS

Recounts of the votes cast in the State Primaries for Democratic Representatives in the General Court were held in the First Suffolk District (Ward 1), and the Twelfth Suffolk District (Ward 16), on September 23, 1966; in the Fourteenth Suffolk District (Ward 18), and the Seventeenth Suffolk District (Ward 22), on September 26, 1966.

There were no recounts following the State Election.

REVISION OF THE VOTING LIST

The names of 4,055 voters were stricken from the voting list by reason of death, removal from the city, and other causes.

JURORS

The jury list prepared by the Board in 1966 contained the names of 8,036 residents of Boston. During the time covered by this report 4,665 were drawn for jury service.

On August 18, 1966, G. Joseph Tauro, Chief Justice of the Superior Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, issued an order beginning October, 1966, that jurors in Suffolk County would be expected to serve for a two-week period instead of the previous period of thirty days. This more than doubled the number of prospective jurors to be drawn for possible service, greatly reduced the number of such jurors remaining on the 1966 jury list, and increases the number necessary to be drawn for the 1967 and subsequent jury lists.

ABSENTEE VOTING

Absentee voting applied to the State Election. Chapter 123 of the Acts of 1966 further regulating the method of processing and counting absentee ballots made it mandatory that after processing and examination of the affidavits in the central office is completed, the absentee ballots must be sent to the precinct polling places to be cast and counted, then said count of absentee ballots cast had to be added to the count of the votes cast by the use of voting machines, so that the precinct total could be recorded and reported at the precinct level.

Chapter 368 of the Acts of 1966 further regulating absentee voting, made it possible for a registered voter who would be absent from the city on the day of the election, and who had no mailing address outside of the city to which a ballot could be mailed and seasonably returned in time to be sent to the polling place before the

closing of the polls on election day, to receive a ballot in hand, and vote by such ballot in the central office before he departed from the city.

Of the 2,404 absent voter envelopes returned and examined, 198 were rejected for various reasons by the examiners, and none of the ballot envelopes, so rejected, were opened to reveal the contents therein. The remaining 2,206 ballot envelopes were subsequently delivered to the proper polling places prior to 9 P.M., to be cast on the day of the election as required by law.

MEDICARE

The central office remained open until 8 P.M., on March 30 and 31, 1966, in order to assist the public regarding records of age for Medicare.

NEW LEGISLATION — ACTS OF 1966

Chapter 13: Relative to reading examinations of applicants for registration as voters.

Chapter 16: Clarifies the provisions of law relative to the time for newly registered voters to establish enrollment in a political party.

Chapter 29: Further regulates the time within which state conventions of political parties shall be held.

Chapter 56: Relative to the nomination of candidates for offices to be filled by all the voters of the Commonwealth.

Chapter 107: Makes permissive the appointment by the Governor of election supervisors and providing for a hearing in certain cases.

Chapter 109: Relative to the place where a married woman shall be eligible to register and vote.

Chapter 118: Requires notice by mail of change of a polling place in a voting precinct to be given to each registered voter therein.

Chapter 123: Further regulates the method of processing and casting absentee ballots.

Chapter 134: Requires the use of red pencils or red ink by election officers in recording and tabulating votes.

Chapter 141: Provides for the filling of vacancies among delegates elected to the State Conventions.

Chapter 176: Provides for the disqualification of a candidate for election to a ward or town committee who accepts nomination for such office more than once.

Chapter 236: Relative to sessions for registration of voters.

Chapter 277: Relative to the holding of the State Primaries in the current year.

Chapter 283: Extending the time within which Federal Service Personnel or others may be registered to vote.

Chapter 308: Relative to the registration as voters of persons in hospitals, sanatoriums, rest homes or convalescent or nursing homes.

Chapter 367: Relative to applications to qualify for voting for electors of President and Vice-President and furnishing partial ballots.

Chapter 368: Further regulating absent voting by permitting a ballot to be delivered in hand.

Chapter 407: Relative to Presidential Primaries.

Chapter 436: Prohibits the use of electronic recording or broadcasting of names of certain voters.

Chapter 511: Relative to granting of licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages by certain hotels.

Chapter 551: Authorizes the establishment of municipal data processing centers.

Chapter 666: Authorizes registrars of voters to enter in the annual register of voters the name of certain persons whose name has been changed by decree of court or by marriage.

MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD

The term of Mr. George H. Greene expired on April 1, 1966, and he was reappointed for the term of four years ending April 1, 1970. Commissioner Greene continued as Chairman of the Board, and Commissioner Maurice L. Smith continued as Secretary.

EXPENSES OF THE ELECTION DEPARTMENT

The expenses of the Election Department for the year ending December 31, 1966, amounted to \$520,180.53.

If the General Court fails to disapprove a reorganization plan within sixty days of its presentation and has not prorogued by the end of such sixty days, the plan at that time shall have the force of law.

Do you approve of the adoption of an amendment to the constitution summarized below which was approved by the General Court in a joint session of the two branches held July 16, 1963, received 208 votes in the affirmative and 43 in the negative, and in a joint session of the two branches held May 19, 1965, received 219 votes in the affirmative and 39 in the negative?

SUMMARY

The proposed amendment confers considerable authority upon cities and towns with respect to the conduct of municipal government, including the authority to adopt, repeal and amend city and town charters and, in accordance therewith, local ordinances and by-laws. The General Court retains general power to act in relation to cities and towns and classes thereof and, in some circumstances, to enact special laws regarding a particular municipality, including laws for its incorporation, dissolution or merger. Cities and towns are not empowered to act with respect to general elections, taxation, pledges of credit, dispositions of park land, general civil relationships, the punishment of felonies, or the imposition of imprisonment except as the General Court may lawfully confer such powers upon them.

QUESTION NO. 5

LAW SUBMITTED UPON REFERENDUM AFTER PASSAGE

Do you approve of a law summarized below, which was approved in the House of Representatives by a vote of 118 in the affirmative and 102 in the negative and was approved in the Senate by a vote of 21 in the affirmative and 16 in the negative?

SUMMARY

The Act imposes a temporary tax upon all retail sales of tangible personal property at the rate of three percent of the selling price. Sales of certain items are exempted from the tax, including but not limited to sales of food products for human use, articles of clothing, prescription medicines, agricultural machinery and certain publications. The statute contains specific provisions relating to the registration of vendors, the filing of returns and the payment of the amounts collected by such vendors. Vendors may apply to the State Tax Commission for abatements of the amounts owed where they believe such amounts to be excessive, and decisions of the Commission on such applications may be reviewed by the Appellate Tax Board. The Commissioner of Corporations and Taxation shall have the usual powers and remedies provided for tax collection for the collection of the taxes imposed by this section. The State Tax Commission shall issue regulations necessary for proper administration and enforcement of the section.

The Act further imposes a temporary excise upon the storage, use or other consumption in Massachusetts of tangible personal property at the rate of three percent of the sales price of such property. Sales upon which the retail sales tax described above has been imposed, or which are exempt from the retail sales tax, shall be exempt from the use tax. Sales upon which a tax has been paid in another jurisdiction shall also be exempt. Assessment, abatement and collection of the use tax shall be governed by the provisions which relate to the tax upon retail sales. The tax upon retail sales and the excise upon storage, use or other consumption shall be effective during the period from April 1, 1966 to December 31, 1967.

Each qualified taxpayer shall be entitled to a credit of four dollars for himself, four dollars for his spouse and eight dollars for each qualified dependent, but such credit shall not be allowed if the taxable income of such individual and his spouse exceeds

five thousand dollars for the year. In addition to the taxes described above, the Act provides for new excises upon certain banks; new taxes upon the income of certain corporations; new taxes upon cigarettes; a room occupancy excise upon rent paid for the use of hotel rooms and other lodging places; and excises upon sales of certain alcoholic beverages.

The Act creates the Local Aid Fund for the purpose of providing educational assistance, and authorizes the periodic distribution of amounts from such Fund to the cities and towns. In addition, the Act contains a variety of provisions relating to the program of State aid to public schools, and to its administration.
