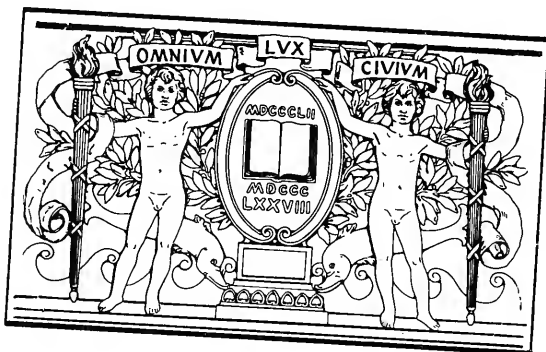

## ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

## ELECTION DEPARTMENT

FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 1980, TO JUNE 30, 1981

BOSTON JULY 1, 1981.

SIR, — In compliance with section 24, chapter 3, of the Revised Ordinances, the Board of Election Commissioners respectfully submits its annual report.

### REGISTRATION

In accordance with chapter 236 of the Acts of 1966, as amended, registration was held as follows:

At the central office from 9 A.M. to 5 P.M., Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays excepted; from July 1 to August 14, inclusive; from August 20 to September 28, inclusive; and from October 3 to November 3 for military personnel; and from November 4 to December 31, 1980, inclusive; from January 2, 1981 to June 30, 1981, inclusive.

At the central office from 9 A.M. to 9 P.M. from August 15 to August 18, inclusive; and September 29, inclusive.

At the central office from 9 A.M. to 10 P.M. August 19, for the State Primary and October 7 for the State Election.

At locations in each of the twenty-two wards from 6 P.M. to 9 P.M., except Saturdays, when the hours were from 12 P.M. to 8 P.M., from August 15 to August 19 for the State Primary and on September 29 to October 7 for the State Election.

At locations in each of the twenty-two wards from 6 P.M. to 10 P.M. on August 19 for the State Primary and October 7 for the State Election.

In answer to many requests for special registrations according to statutes, at schools, colleges, and nursing homes, extra sessions were conducted to satisfy these requests.

**Physically disabled:** In accordance with the provisions of chapter 196 of the Acts of 1946, as amended, persons qualified to vote but who were unable to appear at a registration office because of a physical disability were examined in their homes or other places of confinement upon receipt of an application for such registration. Persons so registered or found on the voting list were furnished with an application for absentee ballots.

#### ABSENTEE VOTING

In accordance with chapter 123 of the Acts of 1966, as amended, regulating the method of processing and counting absentee ballots made it mandatory that, after processing and examination of the affidavits in the central office is completed, the absentee ballots must be sent to the precinct polling places to be cast and counted. In accordance with chapter 267 of the Acts of 1975, absentee ballots received on election day shall be processed and examined in the central office and may be counted at the office at the hour of closing of the polls and after the canvass and the count has been completed each precinct tally sheet, official returns book, and check list shall be amended when delivered to the central office.

Absentee voting applied to the State Primary and State Election. Chapter 368 of the Acts of 1966, further regulating absentee voting, made it possible for a registered voter who would be absent from the city on the day of the election, and who had no mailing address outside of Boston to which a ballot could be mailed and seasonably returned in time to be sent to the polling place before the close of the polls on election day, to receive a ballot in hand and vote by such ballot in the central office before he departed from the city.

Ballot envelopes were subsequently delivered to the proper polling places prior to 9 P.M. to be cast on the day of the election, as required by law.

#### NUMBER OF VOTERS

At the State Election held on November 4, 1980, the number of voters on the list was 257,087. The number of voters on the first list published by the Board for 1980 was 218,258. From that time to the close of registration for the State Primary there were added the names of 17,514 voters. From that time to the close of registration for State Election there were added the names of 21,315. Included in this figure are the names of 5,240 who were restored to the voting list without registration under the provisions of chapter 244 of the Acts of 1973, as amended. The number

of voters on the day of the State Election held on November 4, 1980, was 182,367, an increase of 34,624 above the number of voters on the list preceding the City Election. From this figure the names of 2,076 voters were removed from the list because of deaths and removal from the city. The number of voters on the list was 255,011.

#### NOMINATION PAPERS, REFERENDUM, AND RECOUNT PETITIONS

The Board received 557 referendum petitions on which 3,048 names were certified. The nomination papers for the Special Primary held on May 19, 1981, amounted to 154. The amount of names certified was a total of 2,872.

#### RECOUNT

Recount of votes cast for the Tenth Suffolk Representative District was held in Ward 20.

#### REVISION OF THE VOTING LIST

The names of 2,026 voters were stricken from the voting list by reason of death, removal from the city and other causes.

#### JURY

The jury list prepared by the Board in 1980 contained the names of 7,021 residents of Boston. During the time covered by this report 5,501 names were drawn for jury service.

#### MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD

Commissioner James Casaletto was sworn in on July 1, 1980, as Democratic Commissioner. Commissioner William F. Arrigal, Jr. was sworn in as Republican Commissioner. Commissioner Michael A. Joyce is Chairman replacing Commissioner John M. Robinson, who retired March 31, 1981. The Board is temporarily operating with three Commissioners.

#### EXPENSES OF THE ELECTION DEPARTMENT

The expenses of the Election Department for the year July 1, 1980, to June 30, 1981, amount to \$887,180.

It would provide that no otherwise qualified handicapped individual could on the sole basis of that handicap, be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or subjected to discrimination in any program or activity.

Limit Taxes

Law Proposed by Initiative Petition

Do you approve of a law summarized below, which was disapproved by the House of Representatives on May 6, 1980, by a vote of 5-146, and on which no vote was taken by the Senate before May 7, 1980.

SUMMARY

The proposed law would limit certain taxes, and change laws relating to school budgets and compulsory binding arbitration. It would impose a limit on state and local taxes on real estate and personal property equal to 2½ percent of the full and fair cash value of the property being taxed. If a locality currently imposes a tax greater than 2½ percent of that cash value, the tax would have to be decreased by 15 percent each year until the 2½ percent level is reached. If a locality imposes a tax of less than 2½ percent, it would be allowed to increase the tax rate. In either situation a city or town could raise its limit by a two-thirds local vote at a general election.

The proposed law would provide that the total taxes on real estate and personal property imposed by the state or by localities could never be increased by more than 2½ percent of the total taxes imposed for the preceding year, unless two-thirds of the voters agreed to the increase at a general election.

It would further provide that no law or regulation which imposes additional costs on a city or town, or a law granting or increasing tax exemptions, would be effective unless the state agrees to assume the added cost. A division of the State Auditor's Department would determine the financial effect of laws and regulations on the various localities.

The proposal would limit the amount of money required to be appropriated for public schools to that amount voted upon the local appropriating authority. It would also repeal the law which provides for compulsory binding arbitration when labor negotiations concerning police and fire personnel come to an impasse. In addition, the petition would provide that no county, district, or authority could impose any annual increase in costs on a locality of greater than 4 percent of the total of the year before.

The proposed law would also reduce the maximum excise tax rate on motor vehicles from \$66 per thousand to \$25 per thousand, and it would allow a state income tax deduction equal to one-half of the rent paid for the taxpayer's principal place of residence.

 Law Proposed by Initiative Petition

Do you approve of a law summarized below, which was disapproved by the House of Representatives on May 6, 1980, by a vote of 2-147, and on which no vote was taken by the Senate before May 7, 1980.

SUMMARY

The proposed law would limit local property taxes and state taxes and would provide for increased state aid for local educational purposes.

The act would limit local property taxes in the years 1981 through 1984 to the amount levied in the previous year increased by the percentage increase in personal income of the residents of the Commonwealth during the previous year. The local property tax limit could be exceeded to offset decreases in local aid, to cover shortages for prior years and to pay court judgments. Pension and retirement allowances, payments to other governmental units, principal and interest on any indebtedness, unemployment compensation, amounts required to be raised as a condition of a state or federal grant, and costs for special education programs would be exceeded by a two-thirds vote of the local appropriating body.

The cost of regional and independent vocational schools would be subject to the same limitations.

The proposed law would also limit state taxes imposed in the years 1981 through 1984 to an amount no greater than that imposed the previous year, increased income of Massachusetts residents in the previous year. This state tax limit could be exceeded only to increase local aid or to assume other costs approved by a two-thirds vote of the state Legislature. The amounts necessary to pay principal and interest on state indebtedness, pensions, retirement allowances, unemployment compensation and court judgments, and money required to be raised as a condition of a federal grant would not be subject to the state tax limit. The total amount of local aid for any year which would be subject to legislative appropriation could not be less than the total amount of aid for the preceding year increased by half the increase in collected state taxes during that preceding year. The state tax limit would be reduced by any excess taxes actually collected over the tax limit for the preceding year.

The proposed law also would require, subject to legislative appropriation, a gradual increase in the percentage of local educational costs paid by the Commonwealth to a level of 50 percent in 1984. The proposal would also require, again subject to legislative appropriation, that school aid paid by the Commonwealth in any year between 1981 through 1984 must be at least 15 percent greater than that provided in 1980.

 Referendum on an Existing Law

Do you approve of a law summarized below, which was approved by the House of Representatives on November 1, 1979, by a vote of 83-62, and which was approved by the Senate on November 1, 1979?

SUMMARY

The law provides for increases in the salaries of members of the Legislature and the constitutional officers of the Commonwealth.

The law increases salaries of members of the Legislature by an annual amount varying from \$1,853 to \$17,923. The size of the raise conferred on a particular individual depends upon his position within the Legislature. The law has the effect of setting the base salary for a legislator at \$20,335, but under the law legislative salaries range as high as the approximately \$55,920, paid to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

The salaries of the constitutional officers are increased either by \$20,000 in the case of the Governor, or \$10,000 in all other cases. The law raises the annual salary of the Governor to \$60,000, that of the Attorney General to \$47,500 and the salaries of the Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of the Commonwealth, Treasurer and Receiver General and the Auditor to \$40,000.

The law also amends the statutes pertaining to the organization of the office of the Secretaries of Administration and Finance and of Human Services and to the compensation of senior officials within those offices. It gives the Secretaries of Administration and Finance and of Human Services greater flexibility in establishing positions and setting salaries for those under their supervision.

Local acceptance would not be required if the Legislature either passed the law by a two-thirds vote or provided, during the same session in which the law was enacted that the additional costs would be assumed by the commonwealth.
