1946 TOWN WARRANT

Article 1. To choose by ballot and major vote, one Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, and two Auditors for ensuing year.

Article 2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.

Article 3. To raise such sums of money as are necessary for the support of the town poor and other town charges.

Article 4. To see what sums of money the town will raise for maintenance of Town Roads and Bridges.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise \$851.00 for T.R.A. the state share to be \$3,404.73.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise \$500.00 to be expended on the upper part of the Davis Hill, on the Smith Road.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the Barrington Library.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise \$67.00 for the Lakes Region.

Article 9. To see what action the town wants to take on the Gulf Road.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise \$50.00 for the Jr. O.U.A.M. for Memorial Day.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow \$3,000.00 in anticipation of taxes.

Article 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this town meeting.

PREVENT FOREST FIRES --- IT PAYS

An average of 7,300 acres of woodland are burned over by forest fires in New Hampshire each year destroying many thousand dollars worth of property of all description. It costs many additional thousands of dollars and requires valuable man hours, taken from other essential work, to extinguish them. These losses affect the personal fortunes of the owners and town and state economies. Everyone loses because of them.

Analysis of fire causes reveal the fact that more than 98 percent of all forest fires are, consistently, the result of human carelessness and are preventable!

We have been extremely fortunate during the past few years. Favorable fire weather and war time restrictions on travel which kept people off the highways and out of the woods have aided materially in reducing fire risks, keeping fires fewer and fire losses low.

We now face changed conditions. People can travel freely. Their love for travel and the freedom of the woods will bring them out in ever increasing numbers. This will step up fire risks materially. The accelerated cutting of the war years has resulted in additional thousands of slash acres. These factors, combined with a possible dry season and human carelessness could easily produce a catastrophe. Everyone must, consequently, be on their guard. They should

1. Be careful with fire or when smoking in or near woodlands.
2. Cooperate with the local forest fire warden and his deputies by
 - a. Abiding cheerfully with whatever restrictions it may be necessary to impose. They are intended only to be helpful.

- b. Securing permits to burn debris when the ground is not covered with snow.
- c. Seeing that others comply with requirements.
- d. Promptly coming to the warden's assistance when needed.

If these few fundamental practices are followed it will be possible to PREVENT a large proportion of FOREST FIRES from starting—that PAYS!

With the end of World War II last summer, certain defense measures in the schools, such as air-raid precautions, came to an end. However, the savings program through bonds and stamps is intended to continue indefinitely. Post-war educational plans and policies were outlined in my report last year.

It now appears that the new Barrington school building was constructed at a very opportune time. Even if the government again offers aid (which is by no means certain), the costs of future building opera-

tions will probably be much advanced. For the time being, the Grange is holding its meetings in the school buildings. In return, this organization has contributed substantially to the cost of additional furnishings for the room occupied.

Transportation has been reorganized in part, relieving overcrowding of buses and furnishing a more acceptable schedule for the Green Hill section. By a slight adjustment in school hours, it has been found possible to provide means of transportation to Dover High School, a great accommodation to a number of families.

Audiometer tests for hearing were given last year, and a dental clinic was held in April, at which 31 pupils were treated. Miss Margaret MacDonald withdrew to accept another position, after 15 years of service in the district. State Commissioner of Education James N. Pringle has recently retired. He was always interested in Barrington school affairs, and was a speaker at the dedication of the new school.

The date of this report is the 200th anniversary of the birth of Johann Heinrich Pestalozzi, Swiss educational pioneer. Instead of the prevailing methods of education for the few, consisting in memorizing written words without regard for their meaning, beaten in by continual floggings, this great man advocated education for the common people, inculcated by kindness, and including such humanities as music, drawing, history, geography, and science, as well as improved methods in the three R's. Colburn's Arithmetic and other progressive textbooks of the nineteenth century were based on his principles, which he carried out with a group of refugee children in a situation very much like that in Europe today. He believed in the education of "the whole child" by teachers trained for their profession.

One of the striking features of our own day is the advance in visual education. No modern school is complete without access to audio-visual equipment for instructional purposes. Steps are now being taken to interest organizations in Barrington in a cooperative project for the ownership and use of a moving picture projector with sound. Besides its entertainment value in community programs, such an outfit would go far toward fulfilling the obligations for adult education facilities, as well as furnishing an indispensable adjunct to classroom instruction.
