Dear Sir, — Section twenty-four of chapter three of the Revised Ordinances requires that every officer in charge of a department shall within thirty days after the close of the financial year transmit to the Mayor a report containing a statement of the acts and doings and receipts and expenditures of the department for such financial year. The abatements on account of 1896, 1898, 1899, and 1900, were due to bills uncollectible, changes of ownership, failures, shut-off for non-payment, cleaning up old accounts.

Main pipes, in danger of collapse through the operations of various contractors and corporations, were watched night and day with an attendant expense to the department of \$1,300.

The pipes in the harbor were watched and cared for, and where

necessary protected from the incursions of tide-water.

Test holes were dug along the line of the 40-inch main in Brookline avenue, also in Causeway street, to enable the Engineering Department to determine the condition of the pipes.

The cost of making various repairs in main pipes as scheduled in the foregoing statement varied in amount from \$1.11 to \$1,503.91. The most costly breaks were those in Warren street Brookline (\$1,503.91), Dewey square (\$917.99) and Dean road, Brookline (\$692.13).

The work of replacing an 8-inch sleeve on the 8-inch main in Shirley gut was a particularly difficult and expensive job, owing to the extraordinary conditions under which it was done. The

total cost of the job was \$1,744.98.

Inspectors were constantly employed looking after the interests of the Water Department where corporations and contractors were at work. Conduits and other underground fixtures are almost continually being laid in the already overcrowded streets of the city, and it is always a great temptation to those in charge of this work to either lay their conduit over our main or else so near to it as to make it impossible to reach it to make repairs when necessary. This is a serious matter, and nothing short of

eternal vigilance on our part serves to protect us.

An item of ever increasing proportions is that of "Service Pipes moved from way of various corporations," chief of which is the Sewer Division of the Street Department, which is establishing a new system of high level surface drainage in several sections of the city. The masonry work of this drainage system seems to come in contact with our service pipes quite frequently, and it is necessary to either raise or lower them so as to avoid passing through the sewer. It is more often the case that they are raised and in some cases this brings the pipes so near to the surface of the street that it is necessary to insulate them as a protection against frost. All this means additional expense and the consumption of time that could be used to advantage otherwise.

The same conditions as mentioned in the preceding paragraph

apply to our main pipes and hydrants as well.

In addition to the above mentioned work, the Machine, Carpenter, Paint, Plumbing, and Blacksmith shops performed much work of a miscellaneous nature in the maintenance of the property of the Water Department. Some of the important items are as follows:

Whitewashed and painted top loft of meter-room.

Whitewashed interiors of all the shops.

Altered rain conductors and reshingled at Dorchester yard.

Painted stable, fences, sheds, etc., at Dorchester yard. Painted house at Parker Hill reservoir.

Widened and altered door of coal bin at Albany-street yard. Built a one-story (34×12) annex to the machine shop.

Built a portable booth for use by main-pipe men when working in bleak and exposed locations.

Made general repairs to the Dorchester yard and the buildings therein

to the extent of \$100.

Painted second-hand pipes and specials reclaimed from the ground. The labor in doing the same amounted to \$895.

Made 230 repairs on tools. Aggregate cost of same, \$1,630.24. Performed 144 odd jobs, improving condition of shops. Aggregate cost, \$880.60.

Performed 81 odd jobs upon the stables. Aggregate cost, \$437. Made 419 new tools of various kinds. Aggregate cost, \$2,649.99.

Performed 12 odd jobs in and about the various reservoirs in the care

of the department. Aggregate cost, \$79.52.

Performed 19 odd jobs in the improvement of the facilities of the

Albany-street yard. Aggregate cost, \$147.42.

Miscellaneous work, including fixtures, appliances, etc., for Engineering Department, office furniture for Water Commissioner's office, etc., amounting to a total cost of \$2,616.73.

REPORT OF THE ENGINEER.

Engineering Department, 50 City Hall, February 1, 1902.

GEN. A. P. MARTIN,

Water Commissioner:

SIR, — I herewith submit the following report for the past

year of the work done and the records kept:

During the year 18.9 miles of main pipe have been laid and 12.7 miles abandoned, making a total length in the system of 719.6 miles. The following is some of the most important work done:

The 30-inch H. S. main in Washington street, Dorchester, was extended from Talbot avenue to Walton street, a distance

of 792 feet.

A 30-inch L. S. main and a 16-inch H. S. main were laid in Bowdoin street, from Beacon street to Ashburton place, after the grade of Bowdoin street had been lowered, on account of the construction of the State House park.

The 24-inch H. S. main in Columbia road was connected between Ceylon and Quincy streets, greatly reënforcing the water supply in the H. S. districts of the northerly portion of

Dorchester and of South Boston.

Two 20-inch L. S. pipes were laid in Southampton street over the N. Y., N. H. & H. R.R., to be connected at a later date with the 30-inch main, when it is raised in the new street.

Sixteen-inch mains were laid in Causeway, Lowell, Willard, Spring and Allen streets, from Prince street to Charles street, and in Staniford street, from Causeway street to Cambridge street, a total distance of 5,110 feet, connections being made with the 30-inch L. S. main, in Causeway street at Haverhill street and at Cambridge street; the pipes relaid were old, and in addition to being too small for present needs, were, in many cases, dangerously weak.

A 16-inch H. S. main was laid in Blue Hill avenue, Roxbury, replacing an 8-inch main from Maywood street to

Holborn street, a distance of 839 feet.

A 16-inch L. S. main was laid in Mason street, Charles-

town, from Front street to Bow street, replacing a 4-inch main.

A 16-inch L. S. main, replacing a 6-inch main, was laid in Miller street, Charlestown, from Rutherford avenue to Main street, a distance of 675 feet.

A 16-inch main was laid in Columbia road, South Boston, between G street and Q street, a distance of 2,288 feet.

The 16-inch main in Blue Hill avenue, Dorchester, was extended from Walk Hill street to Collins street, a distance of 1,183 feet.

A large part of the work done during the year has been the replacing of old mains with sizes that are adequate for present and estimated future needs; this policy has been consistently carried on for several years past, and the result has been a great improvement in the fire protection of the city.

The only supply of South Boston, east of Fort Point channel and north of West First street, is from the low service, through a single 30-inch main in D street; this main should be extended across Fort Point channel at Congress street or Northern avenue to afford a second main supply pipe in case of emergency.

The high service should also be carried from the city proper into this territory, to supply adequate fire pipe and sprinkler service. The main for this purpose would cross Fort Point channel in the same location as the 30-inch low service, and would ultimately connect with the existing high service in the older portion of South Boston. The assessed valuation of buildings in this part of South Boston is \$3,712,500, an increase of \$2,088,100 in the past ten years.

I recommend that the present siphons under Fort Point channel at Dover street be widened to sixty feet at an early date.
