

Hadley Read, practicing innovator and retired professor and head of the Office of Agricultural Communications at the University of Illinois, conceived the idea for an Illinois amateur art show and made possible the Town and Country State Amateur Art Exhibit in Champaign-Urbana.

The idea achieved expression in 1956 when Hadley encouraged the establishment of a rural arts show in conjunction with the 55th Farm and Home Week. Exhibitors during the early years of the show were rural residents, amateur artists living in the open country and in towns with populations of less than 10,000.

This rural population is very special to Hadley. Born and raised on a Hamilton County, Iowa, farm, Hadley received his early education in a one-room country school that featured a library of 16 books. His University of Illinois Press publication *Morning Chores* and Other Times Remembered (1977) lovingly captures his sensitivity to the beauty and pain of rural living. The rural arts show Hadley conceived nurtured the visual arts across the countryside that Hadley loves.

To Hadley Read.....

Hadley's rural roots were cultivated in sophisticated academic soil. He studied journalism and economics at Iowa State University and spent his spare time participating on the University's debating team. He received his B.S. degree in 1939 and his M.S. degree in 1941 from Iowa State.

Before coming to the University of Illinois in 1947 as head of the Office of Agricultural Communications, he worked as an economisteditor for the Ralston Purina Company of St. Louis, spent two years as a daytime farmer and nighttime publisher of a weekly newspaper, and served as an assistant extension editor at Iowa State University.

At the University of Illinois, Hadley headed a professional staff of 26 writers, editors, broadcasters, teachers and visual communication specialists.

Throughout his career Hadley has been committed to encouraging intelligent and worthwhile communication. By communicating his own vision of an amateur-juried art show to his colleagues Duke Regnier, Walter Johnson and Hal Bean, Hadley made it possible for artists all over Illinois to share public their private aesthetic visions.

The Town and Country Amateur Art E hibit has grown from its exciting beginnin Today it is the most juried art show in t country. This year artists from all parts Illinois have competed and won in cour and regional shows before entering the sta exhibit in Champaign-Urbana. Hadley e couraged this growth. He supported it co sistently and imaginatively with the efforts his professional staff of communicators.

Hadley, who is familiar to professional c leagues through books such as Partners W India: Building Agricultural University Communication: Methods for All Media a Getting Information to Farm Families, well as the many lectures he has given, forever familiar to us for the Town a Country Art Exhibit he initiated and work to develop.

It is to Hadley Read with whose vision t art show began that we dedicate this 19 Town and Country State Art Exhibit a Catalog.
