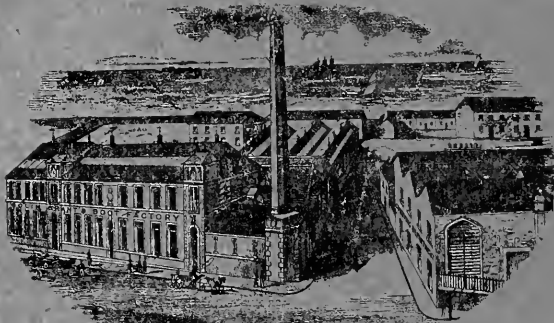

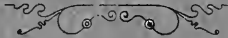

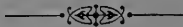

Letter Post.

To and from all parts of the United Kingdom:—Not exceeding 4 oz., 1d; 4 to 6 oz., 1½d; and so on at the rate of ½d for every additional 2 oz. Dimensions—24 ins. in length, 12 in. in width, and 12 in. in depth. No limit in weight. A letter posted unpaid is chargeable on delivery with double postage, and a letter posted insufficiently paid is charged double the deficiency. The penny stamp now issued can be used either as a postage or receipt stamp. Postage to India, British Colonies, and Protectorates (Australian Colonies, and Rhodesia excepted) are now charged 1d per ½ oz.

Post Cards.

Post-cards, available for transmission in the United Kingdom only, are sold at 10 for 5½d, or of finer quality 10 for 6d. They can also be had in smaller numbers or singly. Plain cards, with adhesive ½d stamp affixed, may also be used. Reply cards, five for 6d. Letter cards, 8 for 9d; smaller numbers in proportion. Foreign post-cards, 1d each; reply, 2d.

Inland Book Post.

The Book Post rate is one half-penny for 2 oz. Packets exceeding 2 oz. in weight are sent at letter rate. Every book packet must be posted either without a cover or in a cover, the contents of which can be easily withdrawn for inspection.

Postage on Registered Newspapers.

On each Registered Newspaper, the postage, when prepaid, is ½d. No packet of newspapers must exceed 14 lbs. in weight, or 2 ft. in length, or 1 ft. in width or depth.

Redirection.

Letters, cards, newspapers, books, and samples are redirected free of charge if reposted unopened within 24 hours after delivery. Cards, newspapers, and books which cannot be delivered, and upon which a postage fee of one halfpenny only has been prepaid, are chargeable with fresh postage when returned to the senders.

Post Office Telegrams.

The charge for telegrams throughout the United Kingdom is 6d for 12 words, and ½d for every additional word. Addresses are charged for. Postage stamps are used for payment.

Post Office Telephones.

Sixpence for three minutes' conversation within a radius of 25 miles; ninepence for 50 miles, and so on.

Money Orders for the United Kingdom.

Money Orders are granted in the United Kingdom as follows:—For sums not exceeding £1, 2d; £3, 3d; £10, 4d. Money Orders may be sent by Telegraph at the following rates of commission—for sums not exceeding £3, 4d; above £3 and not exceeding £10, 6d. In addition to the com-

mission, a charge is made at the ordinary inland rate for the official telegram of advice. Minimum charge, 6d.

Money Orders Payable Abroad

are granted in the United Kingdom as follows—On sums not exceeding £2, 6d; £6, 1s; £10, 1s 6d.

Postal Orders.

Postal Orders for fixed sums are issued at the following rates:—On those for 1s and 1s 6d the charge is ½d; for 2s up to 10s 6d, 1d; for 15s and 20s, 1½d. Broken amounts may be made up with stamps affixed to the face of the order.

Parcel Post.

Parcels up to 11 lbs. in weight may be transmitted by the inland parcel post at the following rates—1 lb. and under, 3d, and 1d additional for every lb. up to 11 lbs.—maximum charge, 1s.

Registration and Compensation.

Subject to the conditions as to Registration, compensation for loss or damage is given in respect of Inland Registered Packets of all kinds according to the following:—2d, £5; 3d, £10; 4d, £20; 5d, £30; 6d, £40; 7d, £50; 8d, £60; 9d, £70; 10d, £80; 11d, £90; 1s, £100; 1s 1d, £110; 1s 2d, £120.

Post Office Savings Bank.

No deposit of less than a shilling is received, nor any pence, and not more than £50 in one year. No further deposit is allowed when the amount standing in depositor's name amounts to £200, inclusive of interest. Interest is allowed at the rate of 2½ per cent. (or sixpence in the pound) per annum—that is, at the rate of one halfpenny per pound per month. Separate accounts may be opened in the names of wife and children. Any person can now invest at any Post Office Savings Bank small sums in Government Stock. The amount of Stock which can be purchased or sold at one time is now reduced to the nominal sum of 1s. Not more than £100 can be invested in any one year, and the total amount paid by any one investor must not exceed £300.

Government Insurance and Annuities.

The lives of persons of either sex between the ages of 14 and 65 may be insured for not less than £5 nor more than £100. The sums charged for deferred annuities, or deferred monthly allowances, vary with the age and sex of the person on whose life it is to depend, and with the conditions of the contract.

Licenses.

Dogs of any kind in Great Britain, 7s 6d; dogs of any kind—Ireland, one dog, 2s 6d; every additional dog, 2s. Game licenses (U.K.), if taken out after 31st July and before 1st Nov., to expire on 31st July following, £3; after 31st July, expire 31st October, £2; after 31st October, expire 31st July, £2. Gamekeepers, £2; Game Dealer's License, £2; Gun License, 10s.

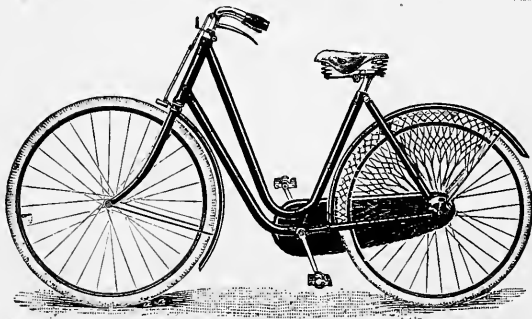

TIDE SIGNALS.—The Tide Signals at Arbroath Harbour, hoisted on lighthouse when vessels are approaching the harbour are:—Showing 8 ft. of water by having ball on top of staff; 9 ft. by ball on top with flag beneath; 10 ft. by flag on top with ball beneath; 11 ft. by two balls at top; 12 ft. by two balls at top with flag beneath; 13 ft. by flag at top with two balls beneath; 14 ft. by ball at top, flag beneath, and another ball. Each signal hoisted half-mast high, indicates half-a-foot more water than when full mast high.

All lights are changed green when dangerous to enter. *West Pier*—1 white light, fix. Apparent light. *Bell Rock Signal Tower*—1 red light, fix. Gas. *West Side of Harbour*—1 green light, fix. Gas. Gong in fog, in answer to vessels' signals.

Auchmithie.—Pier Head, 1 white light, fix, when boats are out.

Bell Rock.—Lat. 56, 26, 3, N., Long. 2, 23, 6, W. Near N. end of reef. 1 light, rev. every 2 min.; flash red and white alternately, bright 5 secs. every min. Visible 15 mls., C.D. 5. The base of light-house is covered about 10 ft. at high water. Bell in fog sounded every 30 secs.; also explosive signal given from above the lantern every 5 minutes.

Abertay.—Light vessel opposite Abertay spit in 5½ fath.; 2½ miles inside Fairway buoy. 1 white light, flash, every 10 sec. Visible 8 miles; 1½. Vessel red, 2 masts, "Abertay" on sides. Syren in fog, three blasts each of 5 seconds duration in succession, every three minutes.

Buddonness.—Lat. 56, 28, 7, N., Long. 2, 44, 53, W., on Ness. 2 white lights, fix, 401 yds. apart. Bearing N. 44 deg. W. Visible 16 and 13 mls., C.D. 7. Leading lights towards Tay. A white light shown up river, which in line with Broughty Castle clears Newcombe Bank.

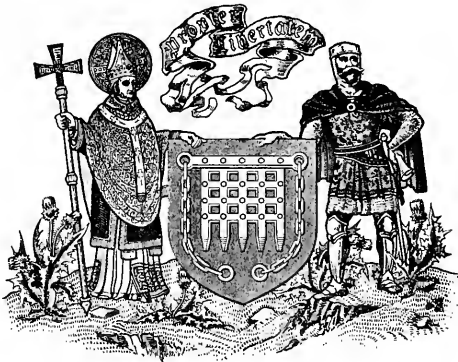

THE BURGH'S TERCENTENARY.



ARBROATH'S NEW COAT OF ARMS.

THOSE who are responsible for the management of public affairs in Arbroath have had their hands full of business during the year 1900. The Town Council and its associated Boards have all had important work to do, and the enthusiasm and geniality of Provost Grant have, as usual, done not a little to make business go forward pleasantly. The Tercentenary of the burgh which came round on November 23rd, 1899—Arbroath's charter as a Royal Burgh having been granted in 1599—has occupied a considerable part of the attention of the Town Council and its constituents during the year. The Chain of Office for the Provost of the Burgh, presented to the Corporation by the Town Clerk, (Mr W. K. Macdonald), as a tercentenary gift, was duly handed over to Provost Grant at a meeting of the Town Council held in September. The Provost fitly expressed the community's indebtedness to Mr Macdonald, and his own sense of pride and pleasure in having the honour of being the first to wear one of the finest chains of office possessed by any Town Council in Scotland. Mr Macdonald spared neither money nor pains to make his gift worthy of the occasion; and the characteristically admirable choice, unwearied research and fine taste which he displayed make the chain a monument of the Town Clerk's loyalty and liberality,

as well as an addition to the burgh's insignia of which this and succeeding generations of Arbroathians may well be proud. Mr Macdonald has already written his name large in the history of Arbroath, and many memorials of his own and his family's interest in and loyalty to the burgh have made the name of Macdonald a household word in our midst ; but none of these is likely to be more intimately linked with the general history of the community, or more effective in keeping the Town Clerk's name and memory fresh and pleasant in the public mind in generations to come, than the splendid chain of office which he placed upon Provost Grant's shoulders. The Town Council has had its sense of gratitude appropriately expressed and duly engrossed in the burgh's records. But it is to be hoped that some opportunity will yet be given to the general public to manifest appreciation of the splendid addition which the Town Clerk has made to the community's most cherished possessions.

New robes were certainly needed for the Provost to make his official dress worthy of the chain which the Chief-Magistrate is now expected to wear at public functions. Through the kindness of the Provost's good lady new robes have now been provided, and at the church parade after the November elections Provost Grant wore for the first time in public the tercentenary robes and chain as shown in the portrait which we are privileged to reproduce by consent of Mr A. Gibson, photographer, High Street.

No public celebration of the Tercentenary has yet taken place. It was hoped that the Queen might be induced to visit Arbroath to mark in some way the occasion ; but Her Majesty was unable to accept the invitation sent to her. It is to be hoped, however, that some fit celebration will yet be arranged to commemorate at once the burgh's Tercentenary and the advent of the twentieth century.

In the last months of the year the Town Council had brought before it in a new form the proposal to acquire Elliot Golf Links. A joint-committee, consisting of the Provost, Magistrates, other five Town Councillors, and nine gentlemen appointed at a public meeting, is at present approaching the Earl of Dalhousie and his advisers regarding the purchase of the links ; and a scheme is being prepared for securing the Golf Course as a public property should satisfactory conditions of purchase be arranged. The enterprise has the heartiest support amongst all classes in the community, and it is to be hoped that the first year of the new century will see its successful accomplishment.

The November elections brought several fresh names into the Town Council. Mr George Rutherford Thomson, who had been appointed *interim* to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Mr E. J. Leslie, was returned unopposed for Lochlands Ward. Mr James M. Wattie, tobacconist, went in from High Street Ward ; Keptie Ward selected Mr Robertson, aerated water manufacturer, and Abbey Ward returned Captain Henderson to keep Dr. T. F. Dewar's seat warm till he comes home from South Africa. The Magistrates' bench stands unchanged.

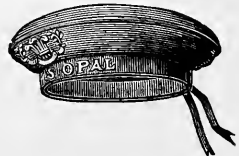

THE NEW POST OFFICE.

The new Post Office in Hill Street was formally opened on May 19th, the day on which news was received of the relief of Mafeking. A large number of ladies and gentlemen, on the invitation of Provost Grant, enjoyed a cake and wine banquet. The first letter posted was one from the Magistrates and Town Council to General Baden-Powell, congratulating him and intimating the despatch of a congratulatory telegram. The letter and telegram were despatched by Miss Grant, the Provost's daughter, and Miss J. C. C. Macdonald, Windmill House.

The Police Commission has had a full programme of business. The New Shambles, now practically completed, have proved a big undertaking; and, as usual, the actual cost has far exceeded the estimates. The water supply problem still remains acute. Mr Baxter, water engineer, Dundee, was appointed to make a thorough test of the water-producing power of the Nolt Loan wells and adits. His report showed a supply of $11\frac{1}{2}$ gallons per head per day, which, with allowance made for altered method of calculation of supply, practically means "as you were"—except that some £8000 or £10,000 has to be added to

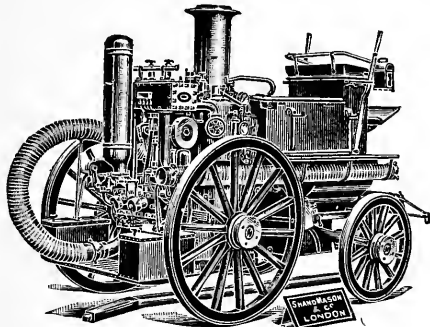

the capital expenditure. The latest phase is some unauthorised suggestions by the Commissioners' engineer regarding additional adits; but even the keenest supporters of Nolt Loan have said very emphatically—"No; no more of this meantime." A new street to run from Keptie Road to Cairnie, past "the woodie" has taken up a good deal of attention; new streets running west from Nolt Loan Road through Rosebrae are progressing; an important improvement is to be effected on the High Street by the re-erection of the Star Hotel; a much-needed clearing away of old dykes at the turn into Brothock Bridge from Millgate has been agreed to; and modern latrines in proper

positions are planned for Millgate and Tower Nook. A splendid new Steam Fire Engine from Messrs Shand, Mason & Co., Limited, London, has been added to the Commissioners' properties, and under the Hon Firemaster, Major Corsar, the Fire Brigade is being re-organised. These and many other excellent bits of accomplished work and proposed improvements make up a good record for the

Police Commissioners who—in spite of their multifarious undertakings—have been able to keep their rates at the same figure as last year—2s 5³/_d per £1.

As Local Authority, the Commissioners have had a good deal to do in the way of drainage improvements. The town, fortunately, has been practically free of contagious disease. The erection of the new Epidemic Hospital at Little Cairnie has been put off for a time on account of the offers from tradesmen far exceeding the Commissioners' estimates.

In discharging their duties as Gas Corporation the Commissioners found it necessary to increase the price of gas. This has made specially interesting the movement to introduce Electric Lighting which the Commissioners have in hand under the Parliamentary Provisional Order. The estimate by the Commissioners' engineer of the cost of the introduction of the electric light is £26,800, and the problem at present under consideration is whether the undertaking should be carried out by the Town authorities, or whether it should be handed over under a minute of agreement to one or other of the private companies who have submitted offers.

Nothing of special interest has emerged in Parish Council business during the year. The Councillors were able to reduce the rate by 1¹/_d, a mercy for which one is particularly thankful in these days. Bailie Duncan has been re-appointed Chairman of the Council, and the faithful and tactful way in which

Mr Robert Stuart, the Council's Inspector, discharges all his duties has been recognised by an increase of salary of £25.

The Harbour has not prospered during the year. The revenue fell from £3678 to £1990, a decrease of £1688. This was brought about chiefly by the great decrease in the importation of flax. The Public Library records show an issue of 61,860 volumes to 3181 readers for the year ended in June. In the reference rooms 2088 volumes were consulted, and it is estimated that 53,000 readers visited the reading room. The Town Council gave to the Library Committee, from its Local Taxation Grants, a sum of £100 to clear off a deficit in the accounts and provide new books. Mr D. Corsar has resigned the chairmanship of the Committee, and Mr George Miln has been appointed his successor. The Town Council in November elected Mr J. B. Salmond and Mr James Kinnear members of the Library Committee, but these gentlemen did not see their way to accept office.

The obituary of the year includes many well-known names. Alexander White, Maule Street (92 years); Alexander Rodger, factory manager (67); George T. Scott, marine engineer; James Robb, farmer, Springfield (63); James Sturrock, builder (90); Andrew Tarbat, gardener (80); W. J. Anderson, banker; Thomas Kininmonth, flax inspector (70); William Small, retired schoolmaster (75); Captain James Harris (55); E. J. Leslie, solicitor (53); James Hogg, marine engineer (32); John Smail, Prudential Assurance Superintendent (52); William Archer, teacher, Stonehaven; Philip Sheridan, Forfar; Lieutenant Walter Garnet Rait (22); Sidney Duke (32); John Mann (84), and C. W. Corsar (66). — These are the more prominent names in the list of those who have passed away. Lieutenant Rait, son of Colonel Rait of Anniston, and Mr Sidney Duke, son of Rev. Dr. Duke, have both been cut down in the prime of their young manhood. The death of Mr C. W. Corsar, Seaforth, makes a great blank in the industrial and public life of the town. In public life Mr Corsar was one of our most honourable citizens. Every scheme and institution which commended itself to him as wisely organised for the public weal had his benediction and shared his beneficence; where he found he could bestow neither he

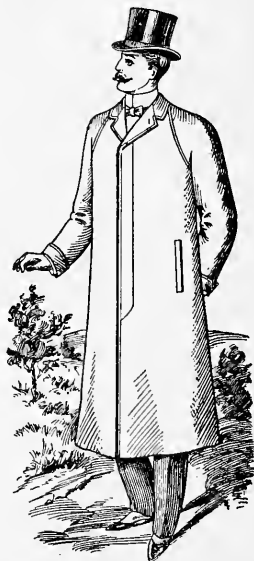

kindness which enhanced their value immeasurably. One had only to see the immense crowds which quietly watched his funeral procession, and to understand the sincere pathos expressed in many faces, to know how widely and deeply Mr Corsar had won the community's regard and affection. He was a kindly and genial man, upright in all his dealings.

The General Election was the only event in home politics which created any stir in the community during the year. The Right Hon. John Morley was unable to take part personally in the contest on account of throat trouble, so that Mr J. B. Don, of Maulesden, who championed the Unionist cause, had to fight an absent antagonist; and very generous and courteous was his attitude to Mr Morley all through. The poll gave Mr Morley a majority of 1570, the figures being—Morley, 3960; Don, 2390. In the County the Hon. C. M. Ramsay attacked Captain Sinclair's seat; but in spite of the khaki fever, Mr Ramsay's personal popularity, and the rallying of every possible influence that would tell in his favour, the gallant Captain came out victorious by 248 votes, the figures being—Sinclair, 4962; Ramsay, 4714. The Unionists opened in October excellent club rooms in Millgate, Lord Camperdown giving an address at the opening ceremony.

The School Boards of Arbroath and St Vigeans have had plenty of educational business to occupy their attention. The method followed in providing a pension for Rector Ross excited keen controversy in connection with the School Board election in March. The result of the election was the return of Revs J. M. Scott, Alex. Rust, J. V. M'Donald, and Messrs A. King, and A. M. Dundas, all new members, along with Messrs George Reid, Andw. Lorimer, and Samuel Mollison, members of the former Board. Mr Samuel Mollison was elected chairman, and, in his discharge of the duties of the chair, has shown the impartiality, tact, and geniality which tend so much to the pleasant discharge of business. Mr C. Milne, from George Watson's College, Edinburgh, was elected Mr Ross's successor as Rector of the High School. An increased Government Grant has enabled the Board meantime to strengthen the staff considerably, and to rescind the former Board's resolution to reduce certain salaries. The County Education Committee seems inclined to oppose continuation of the £750 grant, but it is to be hoped that the Department will not go back upon its

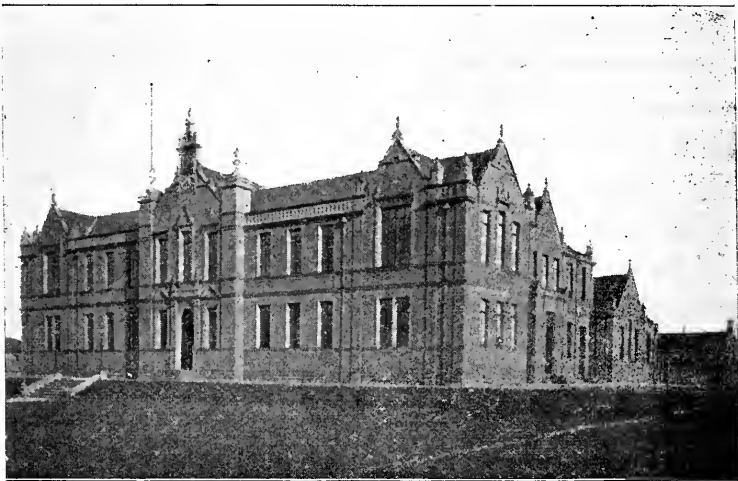

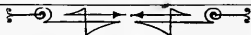
present resolution. A beginning has been made with Temperance teaching in the schools, a series of Saturday evening lectures by Dr Pirie, Dundee, delivered in the High School, being largely attended both by scholars and teachers, and proving exceedingly successful.



ARBROATH HIGH SCHOOL.

Trade during the year has been pretty prosperous in the industries in which Arbroath is specially interested. The South African War has created a strong demand for canvas and other fabrics, and the textile factories in Arbroath have shared largely and creditably in orders from the Government and other customers. Towards the close of the year the demand fell considerably, and this, along with the high prices of raw material prevailing, brought about the stoppage of the Greens and Union mills. Brothock Mill was re-started after reconstruction, and it may be regarded as indicating a fairly hopeful prospect in the textile industries that Burnside factory is now in process of being rebuilt. The jubilee of Mr Thomson, of Messrs M. C. Thomson & Co., was celebrated during the year. Messrs Douglas Fraser & Sons, Westburn Foundry, have made very large additions to their works, and have been developing a large engineering business; Messrs Shanks, Dens Iron Works, have also been busy during the whole year. The boot and shoe trade has also been prosperous. All the smaller industries appear prosperous; in spite of the growth of trawling, several important additions have been made to the local fishing fleet; and it may be taken as a sign of general prosperity that the last balance-sheet of the Savings Bank showed a very handsome increase in the sum at the credit of depositors.

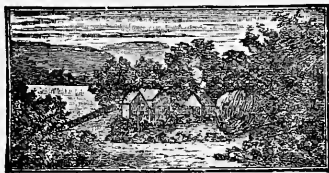

The Hon Major Miller, who went out to South Africa in command of the Active Service contingent from the 2nd V.B.R.H., was entertained to dinner in Arbroath before leaving. The scene of enthusiasm at the departure

of the contingent from Arbroath will not soon be forgot. Dr T. F. Dewar, George Francis, J. Robb, and D. T. Low went out as members of the Fife and Forfar contingent of the Imperial Yeomanry. Nearly every week letters from soldiers at the Front have been appearing in the *Arbroath Herald* and have been read with deep interest. Mourning over the dead and wounded has been heard in not a few homes in town. The death of the Earl of Airlie in battle on 11th June sent a thrill of sorrow throughout the whole of Angus; but no death touched more deeply Arbroath and district than that of Lieutenant Walter Garnet Rait, who died of enteric fever at Wynberg on 22nd June. A memorial service, attended by the Provost and Town Council, was held in the Old Church on 1st July; and from all classes there came expressions of the deepest sympathy with Colonel Rait and the Anniston family in the irreparable loss

of their gallant son. A service in memory of Trooper E. A. M'Grady, Kelly Castle, who also died in South Africa of enteric fever, was held in Arbirlot Church on 23rd December.

The community subscribed about £700 to the Patriotic Relief Fund; a grand entertainment organised by Mrs Lindsay Carnegie, Mrs Ouchterlony, and the Misses Macdonald brought over £70 for the same purposes; and other liberal offerings have been forthcoming on behalf of the families of soldiers.

An effort to aid the Indian Famine Fund brought from the town and district a sum of over £506. This sum, along with other offerings by local ladies and gentlemen made through the churches, represented a creditable addition to the means provided to diminish the fearful havoc in India. Mr A. Oliver, S.S.C., acted as treasurer of the local fund. A Gymkhana, organised by the Misses Macdonald and other ladies, and held at Gayfield Park in May, brought over £110 to the famine fund.

The Infirmary has been favoured of fortune during the year. A special effort to clear off a deficit in its accounts brought a goodly sum to its coffers, and at the same time increased considerably its ordinary income.

## Mortifications, &c.

**ARROT'S MORTIFICATION.**—The late Dr James Arrot, Dundee, by his trust-disposition and settlement, bequeathed the residue of his Estate to the minister and kirk-session of the parish of Arbroath to be applied by them, at their discretion, for the benefit of aged, poor, deserving persons resident within their jurisdiction, and not in receipt of parochial relief. The sum presently held by the trustees amounts to about £4600, and an additional £1000 or more will accrue on the death of a life-renter. At a meeting recently held, the trustees granted annuities of £6 each to 19 persons, besides giving small grants of 20s and 30s to several others. **ARBKIE FUND, 1876.**—This Fund was created by the late John Mudie, Esq., of Pitmuies, who bequeathed the personal estate of his sister, the late Miss Catherine Mudie, of Arbikie, to which he had succeeded as her Residuary Legatee, for the purpose of dividing the Free Revenue in annuities of £40 each, amongst deserving persons residing in the parishes of Arbroath and St Vigeans. In case of equal merit, preference to be given to a candidate belonging to St Mary's Episcopal Church, Arbroath. Sir Leonard Lyell, Bart., of Kinnordy and Arbikie, the Minister of St Mary's Episcopal Church, Arbroath, the Parish Ministers of Arbroath and St Vigeans, and the Provost and Town-Clerk of Arbroath, Trustees. J. & W. Macdonald, Agents.

**ARROATH EDUCATIONAL TRUST.**—This Governing Body, constituted under the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1882, deals with the educational endowments under the Gibson Fund, the Colvill Mortification, Dove's Charity, Rickards Legacy, and the Funds of the Female Benevolent Society. The scheme constituting the Trust provides that the Colvill Mortification Trustees shall pay to the Trust the sum of £60 yearly, and the Trustees of the Gibson Fund shall pay £100 yearly, and in the event of the annual revenue of the Gibson Fund exceeding £1050, that not exceeding one-half of such excess shall be paid over to the trust, in addition to the annual payment of £100. For the promotion of higher education the School Board of Arbroath receive from the Trustees £120 yearly, exclusive of the sum provided to be paid them out of the Morgan (Dundee) Trust for a like purpose, in respect of which eight poor boys, to be elected by the Governors, receive higher education gratuitously. Should such payment cease, the sum of £120 shall be devoted to bursaries of from £15 to £20 each yearly, and tenable for a period not exceeding four years at a University or technical school—these to be exclusively for behoof of pupils from schools in the burgh. Not exceeding £60 yearly shall be applied to bursaries of from £5 to £10 yearly, to be called the Colvill or Dove Bursaries, tenable for two years at higher class schools, candidates to have passed the fifth standard and be pupils from schools in the Burgh of Arbroath or parish of St Vigeans, who require aid in obtaining such education. The residue of the income, which will include £40 provided for free elementary education shall be devoted for behoof of the last-mentioned class of pupils from schools within the Presbytery district of Arbroath, to bursaries, to be called Gibson Bursaries, of from £10 to £15 yearly, and tenable for three years—candidates not to exceed fourteen years of age. In the case of all the bursaries, competition shall obtain. Governors:—Representatives of Town Council—Ex-Provost Keith and James A. Dickson of Woodville. Representatives of the School Board of Arbroath—George Miln, solicitor, and Andrew Bennet, solicitor. Representatives of the School Board of St Vigeans—The Hon. F. J. Bruce of Seaton House and Rev. Alexander Mills, Colliston. Representative of the Minister and Kirk-Session of the Parish of Arbroath—The Minister. Representatives of the Gibson Fund Trustees—Rev. J. R. MacGregor, and Rev. A. E. Crowder. Representatives of the Trustees of the late John Colvill—Rev. Wm. Duke, D.D., St Vigeans, and Councillor Sandeman. Chairman—J. A. Dickson. Clerk—W. K. Macdonald, Town-Clerk.

**PETRIE'S TRUST.**—In 1875, Mr William Petrie, manufacturer, bequeathed to Trustees properties supposed to amount to about £2000, the rentals of which, at the death of a life-renter and annuitant created by him, to be distributed by them in £10 shares amongst "poor deserving women, of respectable character, being in and belonging to, and at the time resident in, the parish of St Vigeans, who have not been in receipt of parochial relief for the preceding five years at least." Geo. Miln, solicitor, clerk. The Three Trustees are—The Minister and Kirk Treasurer of St Vigeans, and the Provost of Arbroath.

**MILN'S CHARITY, 1880.**—The Annual Revenue of £200, bequeathed by the late Robert Miln, Esq., of Viewfield, to be applied annually in the purchase of coals and meal for the poor of the parish of St Vigeans, within the Parliamentary boundary of the Burgh of Arbroath. Trustees—The Minister and Kirk-Session of Inverbrothock Parish Church, Arbroath. Andrew Bennet, solicitor, clerk.

The number of recipients on this fund are 7, who each receive £15 yearly.

**COLVILL'S 1811.**—The Parochial Schoolmaster of Arbroath, and the Parochial Schoolmaster of St Vigeans formerly received Thirty Pounds each for the education of five poor children in each of their respective schools. The money is now administered by the Arbroath Educational Trust. (See pp. 101.) The Episcopal Clergyman, Arbroath, receives Ten Pounds. Ten Pounds are distributed among the poor by the Kirk-Session of Arbroath, and a like sum by the Kirk Session of St Vigeans. The residue is divided among twenty poor householders. The Provost, Bailies, Town-Clerk, Dean of Guildry Incorporation, Convener of Trades, Minister and Kirk Treasurer of Arbroath, Minister and Kirk-Treasurer of St Vigeans, and Minister of Episcopal Church, Arbroath, patrons. J. & W. Macdonald, Arbroath, clerks. The number of recipients on this fund are 20, who each receive £18 yearly.

**MRS RENNY STRACHAN'S.**—About Fifty Pounds are yearly expended, one half on coals, the other half on oatmeal, and distributed at Christmas among the most necessitous poor. Patrons—The Provost, Bailies, Town-Clerk, and the Parish Ministers of Arbroath, St Vigeans, and Inverbrothock, and the Minister of the Episcopal Church, Arbroath. Clerks—J. & W. Macdonald. 100 recipients.

**GIBSON CHRISTMAS CHARITY, 1868.**—Annual revenue of £2000 to be applied, one-half in the purchase of groceries, oatmeal, and clothes, and the other half in the purchase of coals yearly, and divided at Christmas among the necessitous poor. Patrons, &c.—Same as above, with the addition of the second minister of Arbroath. There are 100 recipients, who each receive value to the extent of £1.

**FORBES FUND, 1864.**—This Fund is distributed among destitute widows and old unmarried females, in sums not less than Eight Pounds, nor more than Ten. The recipients must be residents. Patrons—The Magistrates, Parish Minister, Dean of Guild, and Town-Clerk. Clerks—J. & W. Macdonald. There are 18 recipients who receive from £8 to £10 each.

**GIBSON FUND, 1868.**—The annual produce of this Fund is applied as follows:—£100 was formerly paid annually to the Rector of the High School for the education of eight boys. This is now altered under the constitution of the Arbroath Educational Trust. (See pp. 101.) The residue to be divided yearly, at Whitsunday, in sums of not less than £20, and not exceeding £25, among poor householders. The preference to be given to worthy persons of fallen fortune. Patrons—Magistrates, Town-Clerk, Dean of Guildry Incorporation, Convener of Trades, Minister, Assistant Minister, and Kirk-Treasurer of Arbroath; Minister and Kirk-Treasurer of St Vigeans, and Minister of Episcopal Church, Arbroath. J. & W. Macdonald, cashiers and agents. The number of recipients on this fund is 47, who each receive £20 yearly.

**GIBSON MORTIFICATION FOR SIXTEEN POOR HOUSEHOLDERS, 1868.**—The annual revenue of £4000 is divided yearly at Whitsunday, among sixteen poor householders residing in Arbroath. Patrons—Same as above. Amount payable to annuitants—£11 10s.

**DUNCAN'S CHARITY, 1869.**—The annual revenue of three-eighths of the residue of the trust-estate of the late David Duncan, Esq., Greenbank, is divided amongst poor, aged, and reduced of either sex, being natives or old residents and not in receipt of parochial relief. Patrons—Magistrates and Town Council. W. K. Macdonald, cashier and agent. The annuitants on this Fund number at present 33, who each receive £10 yearly.
