


The Spanish Fete

The Architectural Fete of 1923 was held in Spanish California. Ricker Library was transformed into the moonlit, trellised patio of an old Spanish hacienda surrounded by tile-roofed, stuccoed buildings which were given life and interest by lighted iron-grilled windows and gay canopied balconies. The corridors presented the spectacle of crowded streets of a Spanish town with an arch over the street here, a balcony overhanging the road there, an iron lantern yonder. Room 400 at the end of the street became a Spanish garden with a quaint, colorful, tiled well, imported from an old Moorish garden of Seville, at its center. From this well was dispensed by Spanish pages, a draught the like of which Ponce de Leon sought in his travels to the New World.

To this fete came all the countryside. Spanish soldiers and priests, the Colonial Governor and suite. Spanish sailors, pirates and buccaneers, vaqueros from the great ranchos, Indian neophites from the missions, the rancheros and their families. All mingled under the festooned trellises dancing to the lilting Spanish fandangos or tripped gaily to the sprightly castinetted melodies furnished by the swarthy orchestra. Cascarones were freely broken over many heads while the sweetness of the perfume dropped upon the brows of popular favorites, completed the spell. All present voted the fete of 1923 a great success.

The Scarab Medal in Architecture is awarded annually to a student of the Department. This prize is a bronze medal which is awarded by competition.


WILLIAM EVARETT ARMANTROUT '24, Holder for 1922
