Foreword

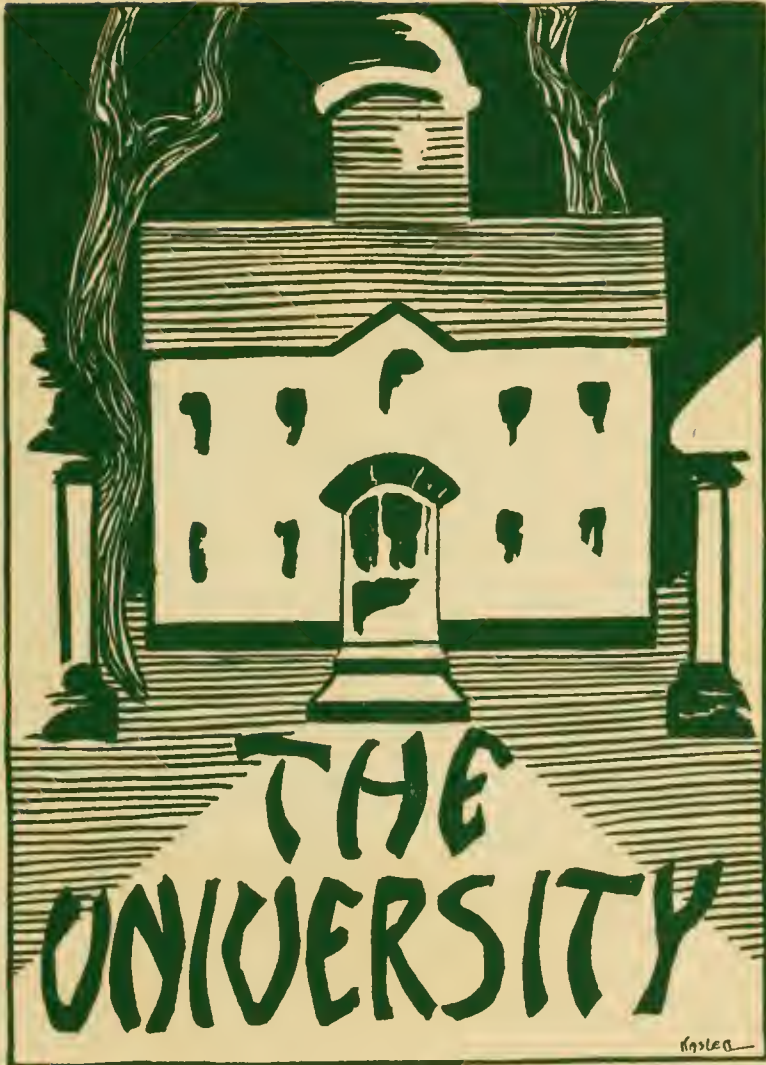

Ohio opened her season on October 2 at Parkersburg by defeating the strong Bethany team 7-0. She suffered defeat on Carson field by the University of Cincinnati in her second game. Although outweighed sixteen pounds to the man, our men fought like fiends all the way through the game. Marshall College next opposed Ohio on October 16, and it was easy victory for Ohio, O. U. winning by a score of 55-0. On October 30 Ohio defeated Otterbein at Neil Park in Columbus 53-14, first half ending 14-13 in Otterbein's favor. Ohio journeyed next to Granville where she met defeat at the hands of the Big Red team. This game without a doubt was Ohio's biggest game of the year and students took advantage of every means to get there. The score was O. U. 0, Dennison University-17.

Armistice Day again found Ohio on a foreign field meeting Heidelberg at Tiffin. The breaks of the game were against Ohio. Several times she rushed the ball within scoring distance and each time was held or lost the ball by a fumble. Heidelberg defeated Ohio 7-0.

Playing brilliantly in every department of the game, Ohio's eleven played the most spectacular football seen here this year when "The City-of-Opportunities" team was trounced 39-0.

Perfect interference, fine blocking and wonderful tackling featured the performance of the line through out the entire season. The backfield men plunged the line, shot around the ends for long gains, or displayed dazzling ability to run through a broken field. Too much cannot be said for them: They bore the brunt of the game but always got up smiling ready to carry the ball over for a goal.

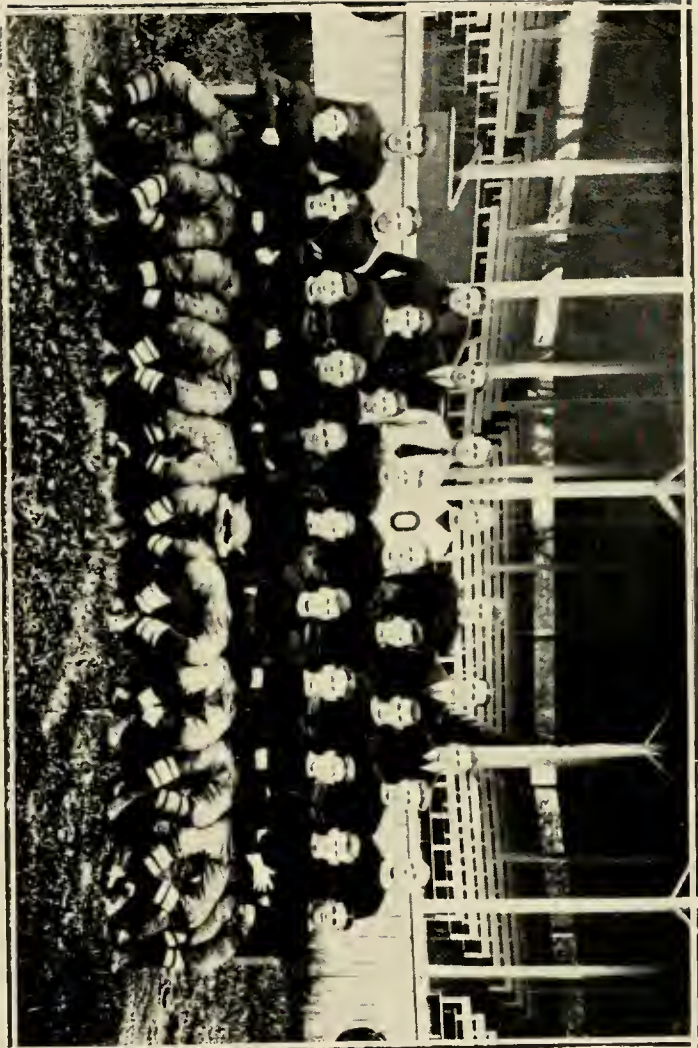

EARICH—End

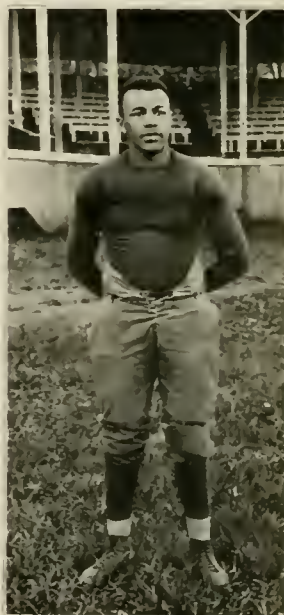

This was "Locky's" first year on the Varsity, and the games in which he participated showed him to be a real back field man. He is very fast and a good open field runner.

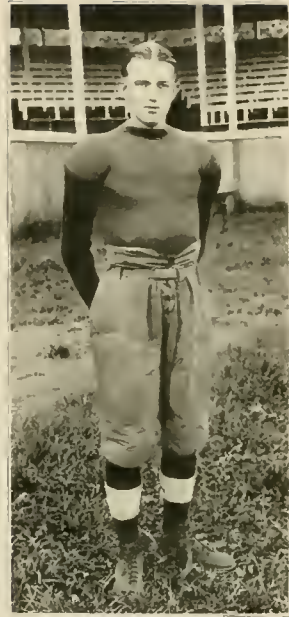
RATHBURN—*End.*

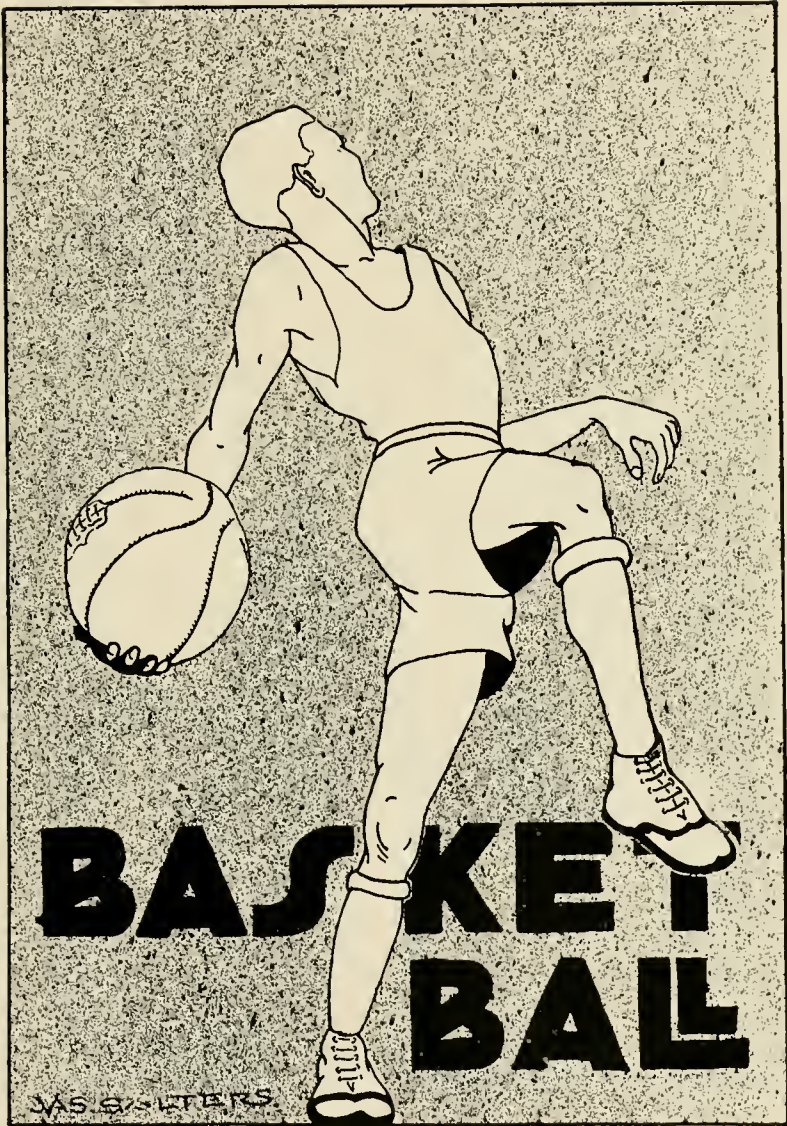


DAVIS—*Quarterback.*

Review of Championship Season



Ohio University's basketeers were awarded the championship of the Ohio Conference when they defeated Wittenberg by a 28-18 score. One of the most glorious pages in Ohio's athletic history was thus brought to a close. A resume of the season follows:

Ohio's first game was with St. Xavier at Cincinnati, when Ohio won from them by a score of 54 to 13. But Ohio's real test did not come until her first Conference game on Jan. 8, when Ohio and Miami locked horns and Ohio won by a single field goal, the score being 25-23. Next came Capital U. of Columbus, and they were easily packed away by a 38-18 score. Following this easy victory Ohio

traveled to Cincinnati and here defeated the U. of C., 28 to 13. Not satisfied with defeating U. of C., Ohio next took over Marietta who had defeated Carnegie Techs 18 to 15. In this game Don Whiting, America's foremost basket ball player scored all their points.

January 28 and 29 found Ohio again abroad and this time she added two more to her long and ever growing list by defeating Kenyon 34 to 22, and Otterbein 47 to 13. Ohio at this time was considered one of the best teams in the State, altho many critics thought that she was just getting the breaks of the game, but the next three games with the Athens H. S., Marshall and Camp Sherman, she took with greater ease than any previous ones, the scores being 33-16, 56-9, and 61-18, respectively.

Ohio's first defeat came at the hands of Capital U. King was entirely out with a sprained ankle and in the first five minutes of play Van Sickle was thrown and a gash cut in his eye that hindered him the rest of the game. Capital won 27 to 24. Next on Ohio's program appeared Kenyon again, who was easily disposed of by a 53-20 score.

Ohio's next opponent was Otterbein. Being already defeated once this season by Ohio, Finsterwald and Grover did not have much fear for them. They were cast aside 46-19.

Dennison's "Big Red" Team was the only team in the Conference that won from Ohio. This game was most thrilling and even unceanny at times. Once Ohio would be ahead, and the next moment would find Denison in the lead, but when the final gun cracked Denison led 25-23.

George Little brought his warriors baek for revenge on Feb. 25, but Finsterwald put on such an offensive game that Miami was snowed completely under, the score being more than double, 36-16.

Marietta also looked forward to her trip to Athens when she hoped to even up, but again they were turned back by a 19-17 score.

Then last on the program was Wittenberg. Coach Godfrey brought his team to Athens confident of taking the Conference honors back with him. But he, too, was foiled in the attempt. At the end of the first half the score stood 17-8 in Ohio's favor, at the close of the second, 28-18.
