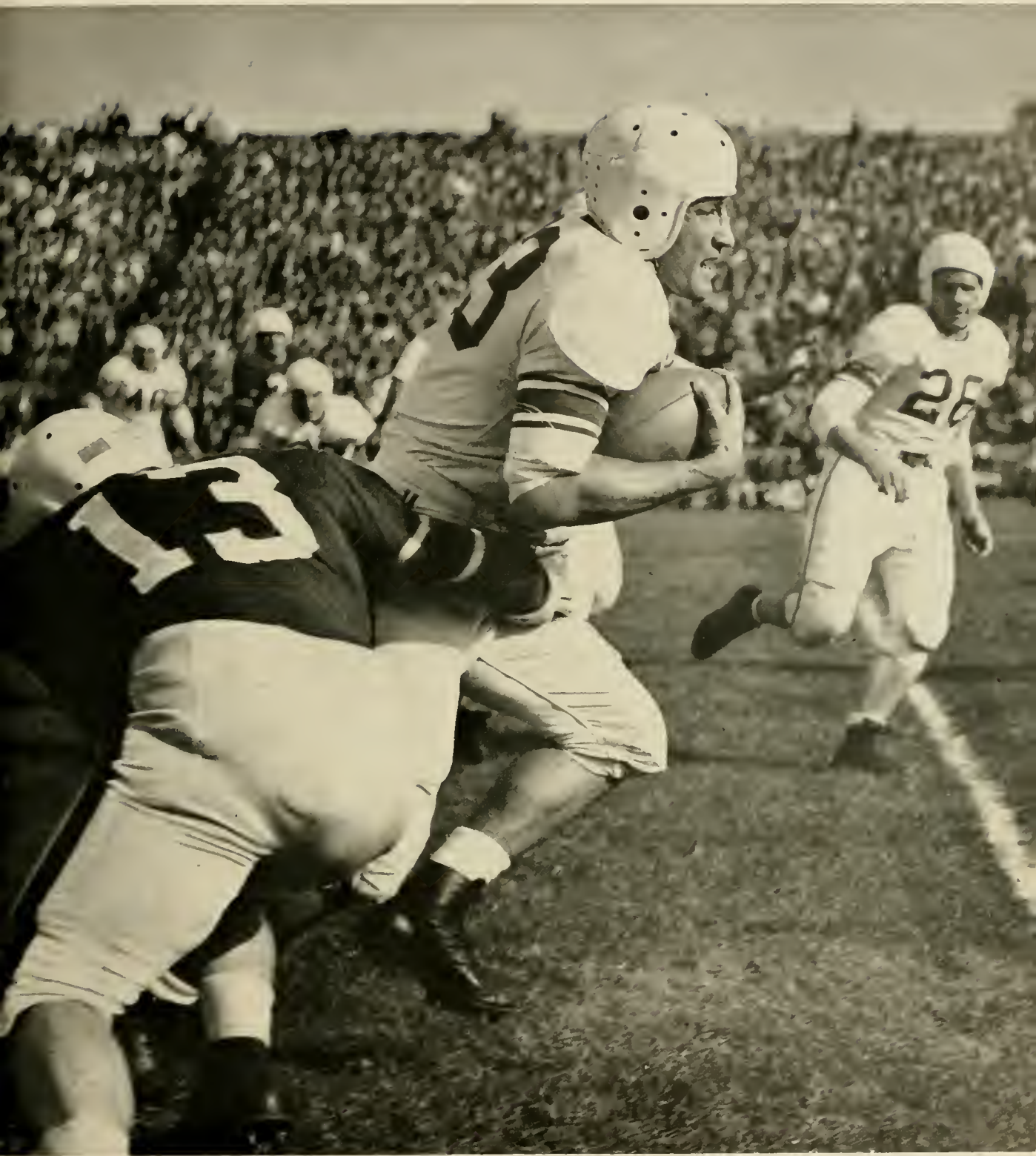

Women's League, of which every enrolled women student is a member, supervises campus affairs concerning the women of Ohio University and sponsors a well rounded social program. The League is composed of two bodies, the assembly and the senate, and all housing units are represented. McGuffey Hall serves as headquarters for meetings of the organization.

On the 47-48 calendar were weekly open houses at Dean Voigt's, mass meetings on every phase of the home, and in the spring, a conference of Women's Government Organizations from various colleges the size of OU. The annual Co-ed Prom, Leader's Rally Luncheon, freshmen mixers, the music festival and the housemother's tea are all sponsored by Women's League.

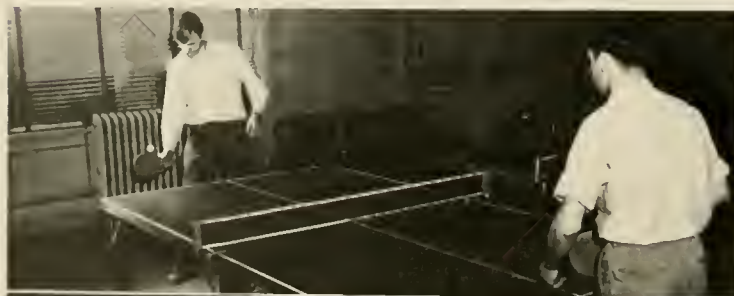
The executive body of the Men's Union, the Men's Union Planning Board, provides a social program for the campus at large and especially for the more than 4,000 men on campus. It functions as the men's administrative body in campus student government and sponsors all-campus traditional events.

The registration hop and the freshman mixer started the activities in September, along with the intramural tournaments in billiards, chess and bridge. October saw over 2,000 students trek to Western Reserve for the annual Migration Day. Homecoming with its gala floats, house decorations and Homecoming Queen was one of the year's highlights. Climaxing the football season, MUPB sponsored Dad's Day, which included a weekend of entertainment.

This year donations were made to YMCA and the Rec Hall to meet expenses and furnish newspapers. \$800 was put into the Men's Union Loan Fund.

In the spring the all men's show, the Rodeo, wound up OU's greatest year.

The Men's Union sponsors the men's small sports program, and gives the Homecoming float awards.

The Campus Affairs Committee is the official executive body governing extra-curricular life, authorized and recognized by the board of trustees.

Dean Voigt and Dean Hunkins, representatives of the administration, serve as co-chairmen.

The committee supervises allocation of a portion of student activity fees, makes decisions relative to new organizations on campus, and has jurisdiction over rules and regulations of the student body.

C.A.C. also selects the staffs of the Post and the Athena.

Student members include the presidents of Women's League and Men's Union, and the president, first and second vice-presidents of Student Council, the last three elected by student vote according to a system inaugurated at OU in the fall of 1947.

Nineteen hundred and forty-eight saw the inauguration of a new democratic era on the campus of Ohio University, with a campus-wide election held in the spring for the offices of president and the two vice-presidents. The council drew up an organizational chart of all governing bodies on campus, and this was edited into the handbook. The student governing body is comprised of the presidents of Men's Union, Women's League, and all other campus organizations including the recently admitted member of W. O. U. N. Acting as advisors are Dean Voigt and Dean Hunkins.

Student Council sponsors dances, student convocations, and the traditional caroling outside Memorial Auditorium. A Sadie Hawkin's Weekend replaced our former Apple-Polishing Weekend this spring, and the Senior Class benefit play, "The Importance of Being Earnest" was presented in November.

Courtesy and Fire Prevention Week both found the interest of the student body, accompanied by a series of articles in the O. U. Past. Definite steps promoting more student representation on the faculty committees were taken, with a student council member now a member of the Grill committee.

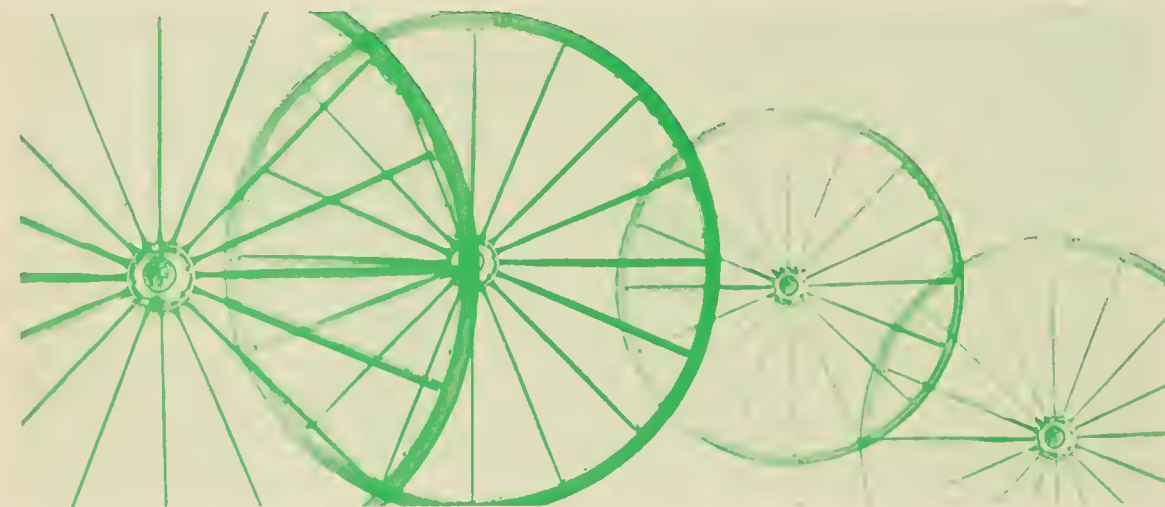
A Recreation Hall Student committee was also set up. A drive for a fund for a new Student Center Building was under way early this spring. Student Council participated actively in the National Students Association.

Each division has its laboratories where theory is demonstrated and principles are applied. The agriculture department has its farm; aviation has its airport; etc.

Engineering offers curriculum in aeronautical, structural, architectural, civil, electrical, and industrial engineering.

The home economics division offers home economics education, family relationships and child development, foods and nutrition, home economics in business, and textiles and clothing.

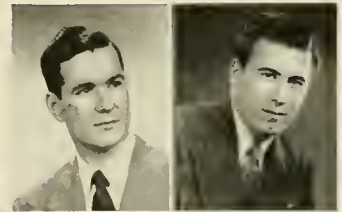

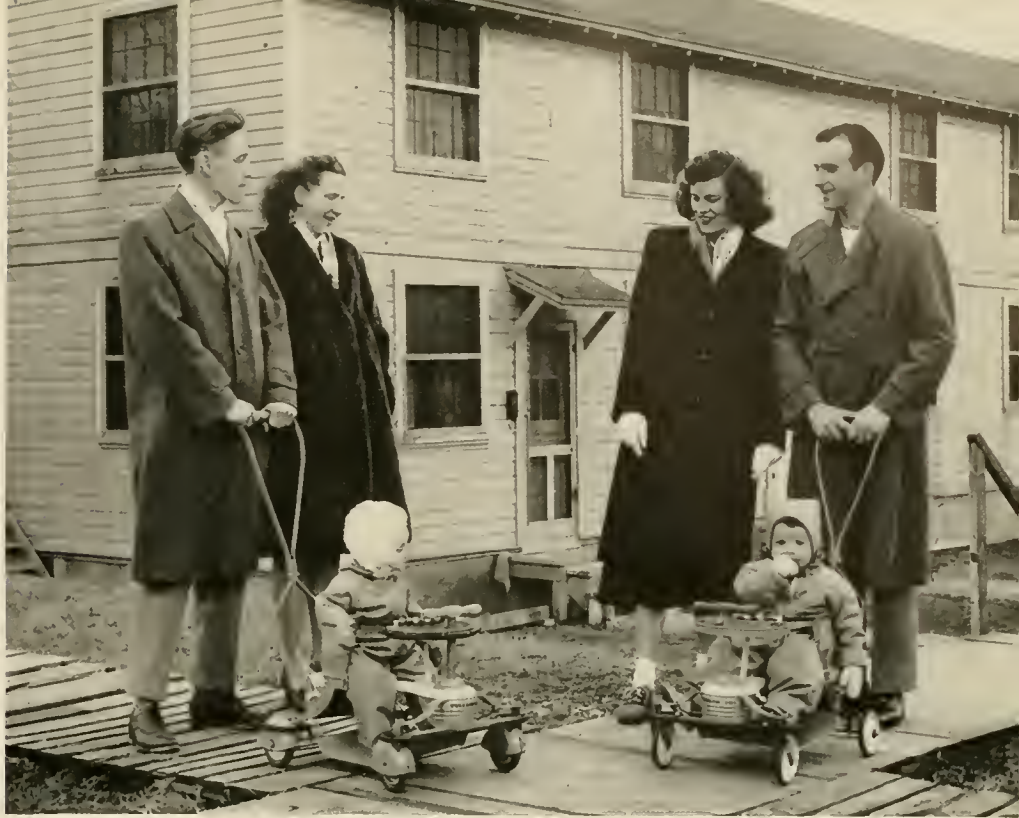
## VETS'

**ATHLETICS . . .**



*In their 1947-48 season the OU cagers won ten of twenty games played.*



Coach Trautwein led the Bobcat basketball team through a stiff schedule with ten wins and ten losses despite numerous injuries to his players. In Mid-American Conference competition, the Bobcats finished third behind Cincinnati and Butler by winning four out of eight conference games. Butler was the only team to defeat the Bobcats twice during the season. The OU team posted double victories over both the Miami and Ohio Wesleyan squads. The

Bobcats were led through the season by three seniors, Dick Shrider, Mark Wylie, and Harry Gordon. All three of these men were accorded national honors. Shrider had a 16.4 points scored per game average to place him eighteenth in the nation. Wylie, who completed 32 consecutive foul shots during one stretch of the season, finished third in the nation among major colleges in the foul shooting department. He completed 88 out of 102 tries for a percentage of .863.

Harry Gordon finished second in the nation in average personal fouls committed per game with a percentage of 3.95. Shrider led the Bobcats in total points scored with 311 in 19 games. Wylie totaled 170 points for second place among the Bobcat players. Harry Gordon was the only member of the squad to start in all of the Bobcat games. In the previous season, he had started in all of the Bobcat's 23 games. Gene Kinsley was the only other player who saw action in all of the Bobcat's games during the season, but he failed to start in all of them.

A resume of the season shows that the Bobcats won their first three games beating Dayton, Marietta, and Xaxier. Bowling Green handed the Bobcats their first loss, Miami and Wayne were both easy victories for the O. U. team, a great Kentucky team beat O. U. by 22 points, Western Reserve beat us by one point, we beat Ohio Wesleyan and then lost to Akron by 2 points. 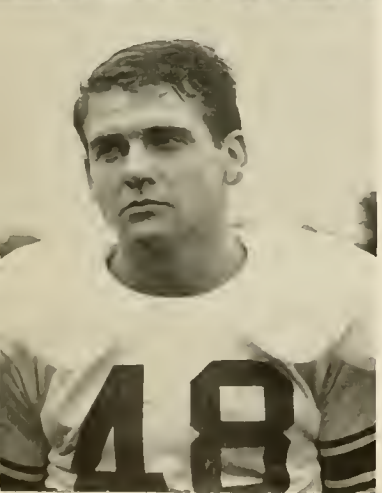

A final note-worthy project on campus was a collection of notebooks and pencils for European students during the spring.



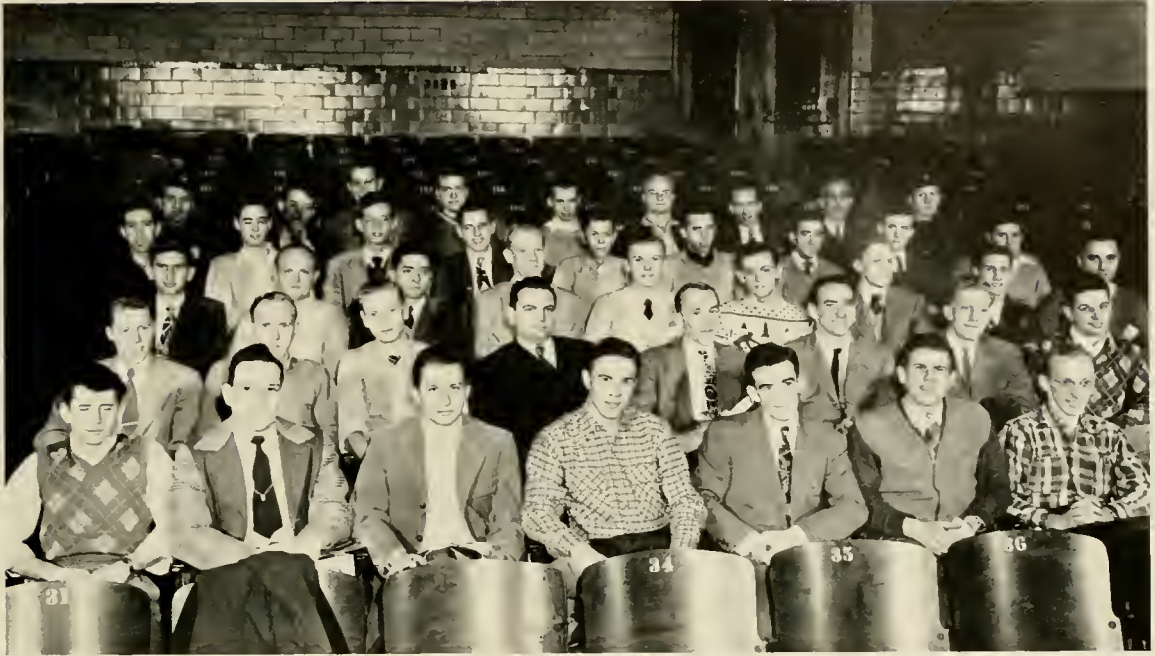

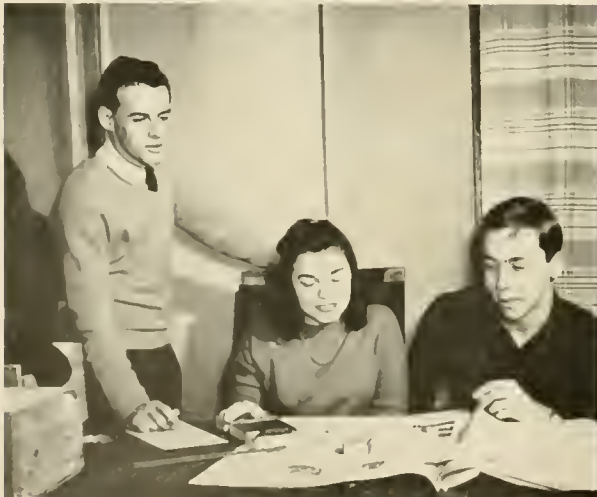
## OHIO UNIVERSITY POST

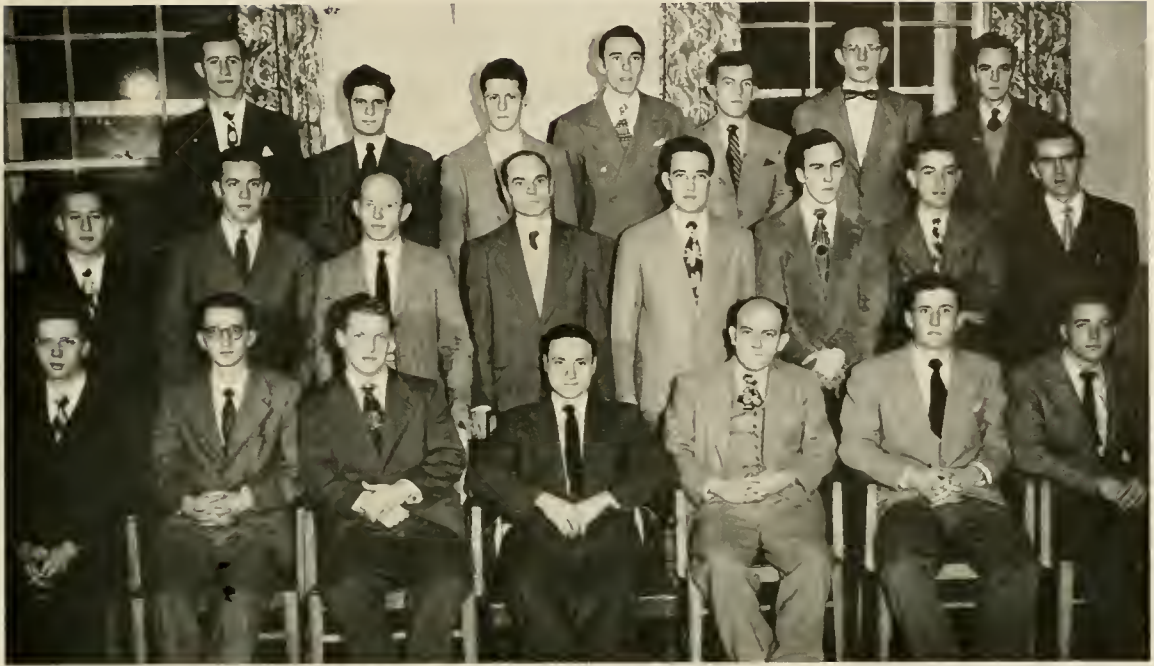

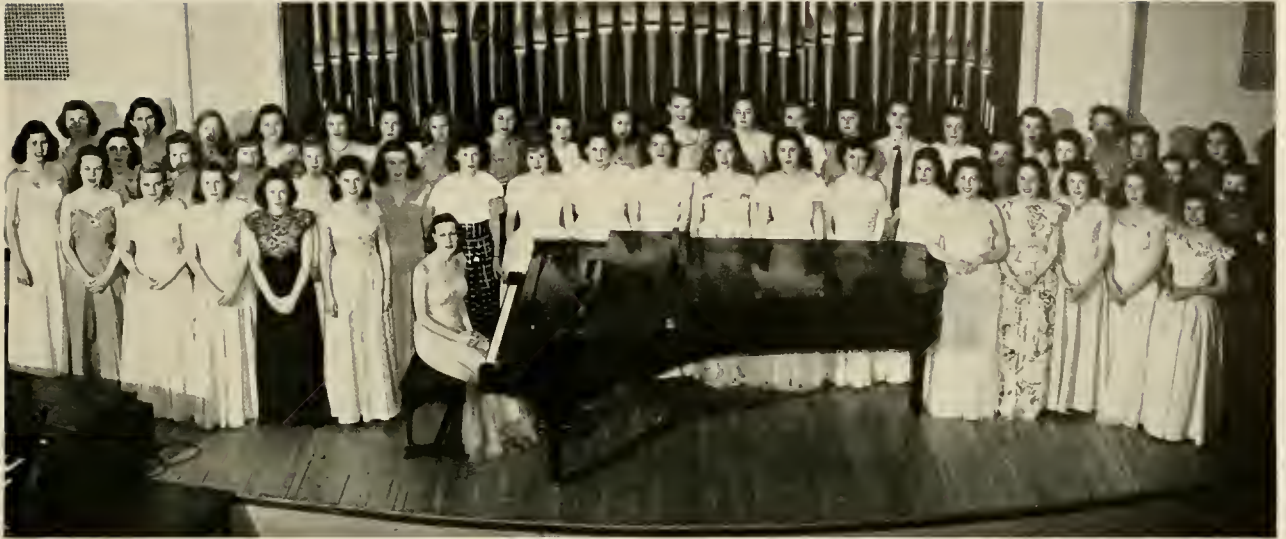

The organization provided entertainment between the halves of the basketball games and jointly sponsored the Homecoming Queen contest with MUPB.

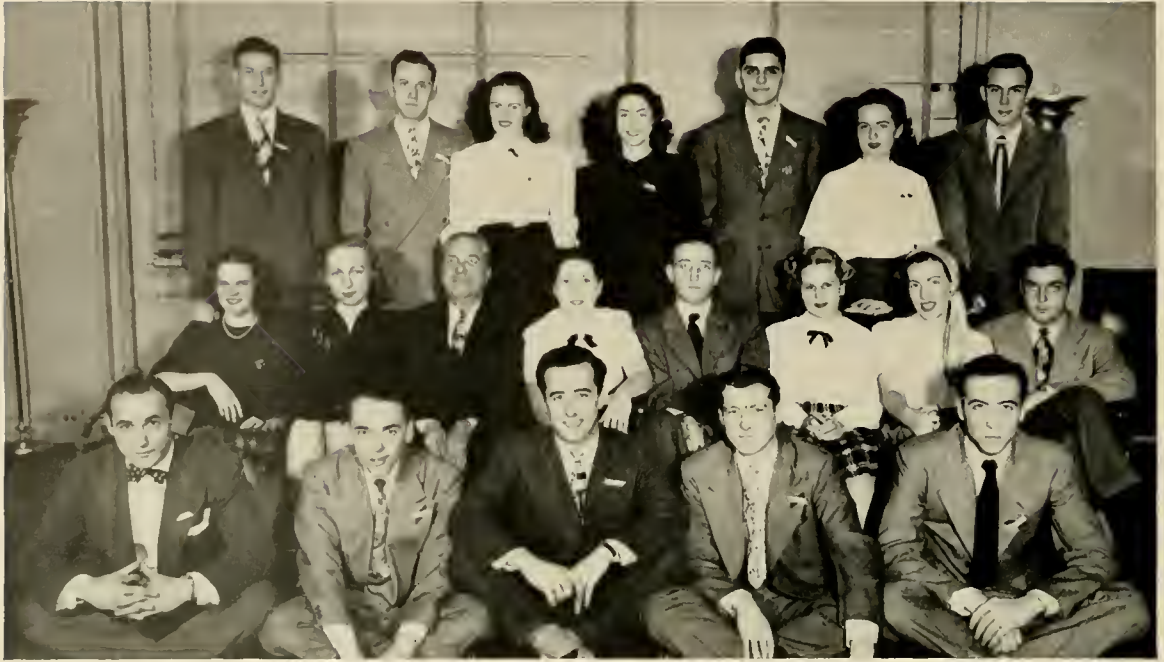

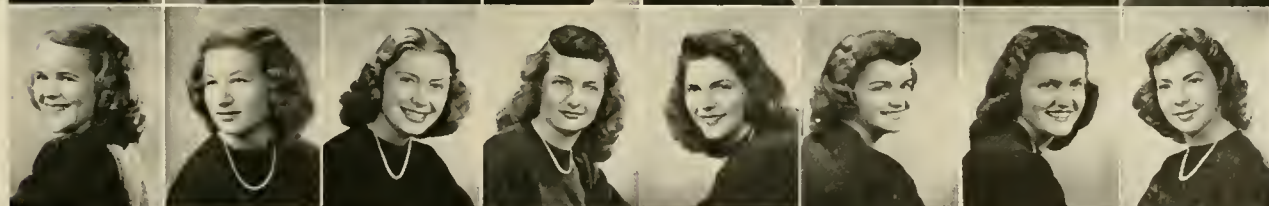

Fraternity functions bolstered the campus swing back to pre-war undergraduate life with Inter-Fraternity Council pacing at the head of the 14 male Greek organizations resident on the campus.

The council had the honor of extending to three new local fraternities, Sigma Beta, Sigma Omicron Nu, and Trowel, recognition as part of the 1,000 or so fraternity men in the university.

Functioning as an arbitration board for disputes and as a policy-setter, the council re-vamped the constitution and rules governing fraternities on the campus to coincide with the normalcy trend; financially sponsored an international exchange student and eclipsed the spring social season with the inter-fraternity dance.

The first post-war class of non-veterans posed new pledge-training problems for the fraternities which I. F. C. helped solve by correlating fraternity activities. A pledge Inter-Fraternity Council was reactivated by the senior I. F. C. to help in this work.

Blue Key, a pre-war Greek honorary organization, was another institution re-introduced by the council as part of a restoration program to provide fraternity men with fraternity life which would be beneficial both to the students and to the university.

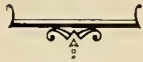

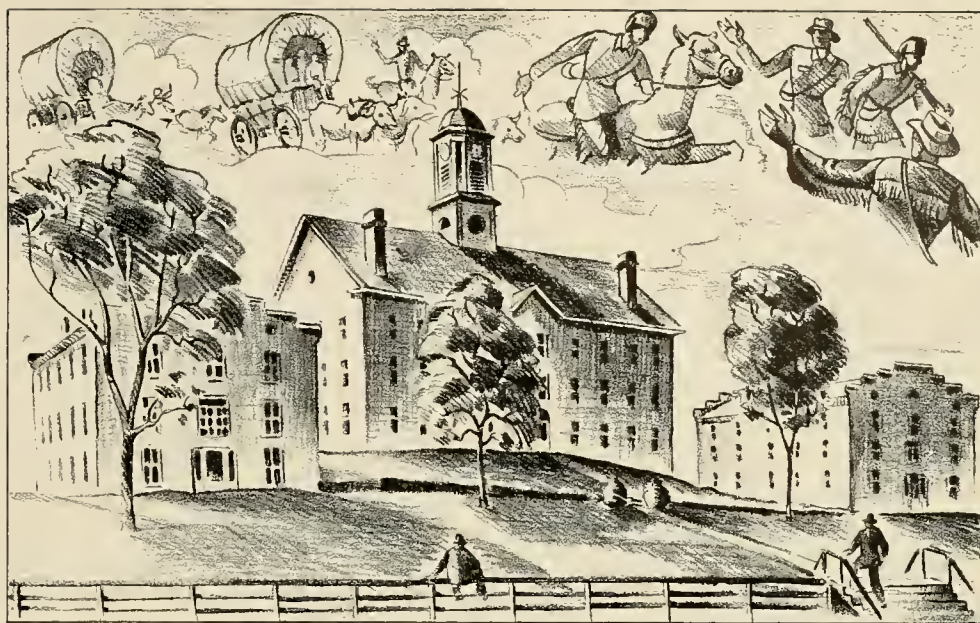
