Of the above cash in the Treasury, the sum of $\$ 1884$ belongs to the surplus revenue.

It should be noted that the Town has at the Alms House for their use, a yoke of oxen, valued at $\$ 13500$, which were received from the Surveyors of Highways for board of hired men, and which explains the difference between their accounts of cash paid for board. This circumstance was not known to the auditors when they prepared that part of their report.

An estimate of the receipts into the treasury, and of the sum necessary to be raised by taxes, for the present year, has been prepared by the Selectmen and Treasurer, and is herewith annexed for the consideration of the Town.
'I'he Auditor's regret that the system, "that all disbursements should be made by the Treasurer. and receipts paid into the Treasury," as recommended in the last Auditor's report, has not been practised to its full extent. It must be obvious that such a course would make a more perfect system of expenditures, and lessen very materially the duties both of the Selectmen and Auditors; at the same time they are gratified with the assurance that this course will be pursued in future as far as practicable.

They present this, their" second printed report, in a more detailed form than that of last year; and while they have aimed at correctness, they do not pretend that it is entirely perfect, but essentially a fair statement of the finances of the Town.
