A primary goal of the School of Business and Economics is to develop business leaders who are capable of coping with new technologies and social progress. Associated with this goal is a commitment to the objective of quality instruction, research, professional development, and to programs and service for the community, state, and nation. The School of Business and Economics also serves to perpetuate a general understanding and appreciation for the Interrelationships of the national as world environments. The scope of the School's programs includes curricula based primarily upon key concepts and skills necessary for decisionmaking and problem-solving roles in business, industry, government, and education.



Dr. Danny Pogue School of Business And Economics

The student is held responsible for the selection of courses in conformity with the curriculum of his/her choice. A student who enters the School of Business and Economics has the privilege of graduating under the provisions of the Bulletin current upon admission provided all requirement are completed within six years. If all requirements are not completed within six years after admission, the student is expected to conform to Bulletin requirements specified for the class with which graduation is anticipated.

Students must complete a minimum of three semesters as a full-time student in residence at the University which includes the two semesters prior to graduation. At least one half of the student's credit hours in the major field must be earned at the University. Exception to either of these provisions may be made upon the recommendation of the Chairperson of the student's major department and the approval of the Dean of the School of Business and Economics.



Most literature and other media presented the late Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. as a civil rights leader, a minister, an orator, a pacifist, a philosopher, a writer and a devoted family man. Rarely was/is Dr. King presented as a scholar and an educator. Nevertheless, all of Dr. King's activities and accomplishments, whether at marches, in the pulpit, among friends, or at home, can be classified as educational; because King used his intensive learning and extensive knowledge to inspire and improve, in all of life's situations, the lot of his fellowman. Dr. King studied to gain an understanding and appreciation of life and its meaning while seeking to find scientific methodologies of educating the world to a functional theology of action — education by example.

After studying many religions, he sought and found within them common denominators which he reduced to the philosophy of St. John:

LET US LOVE ONE ANOTHER; FOR LOVE IS OF GOD; AND EVERYONE THAT LOVETH IS BORN OF GOD. AND KNOWETH GOD. HE THAT LOVETH NOT KNOWETH NOT GOD, FOR GOD IS LOVE ... IF WE LOVE ONE ANOTHER, GOD DWELLETH IN US. AND HIS LOVE IS PERFECTED IN US.

Because King was intelligent and articulate, because he possessed integrity and commitment, and because he could voice sound and effective views which were free of hate; he won the respect of this nation as well as the world.

AIR FORCE ROTG

The Air Force Officer Training Corps (ROTC) is an educational program designed to provide you, as a college student, the opportunity to become an Air Force commissioned officer while completing requirements for an undergraduate or graduate degree. A Four-or Two-Year Program is available.

The Air Force ROTC educational Program provides preprofessional preparation for future Air Force officers. It is designed to develop men and women who can apply their education to their initial active duty assignments as Air Force commissioned officers. To receive a commission, an Air Force ROTC cadet must complete all college degree requirements, as well as complete certain Air Force ROTC courses. Air Force ROTC courses normally are taken for academic

credit as a part of a student's electives. The amount of credit given toward a degree for Air Force ROTC academic work varies with different colleges and universities. The two major phases of the curriculum are the General Military Course and the Professional Officer Course.

During the summer before your senior year, you may volunteer to participate in this program. This program is designed to provide career orientation and leadership opportunities. You will receive the opportunity to observe and work in a career field of your choice on an active Air Force base for two to three weeks to learn the challenges of being a junior officer. Many cadets volunteer for airborne training, while others participate in leadership projects throughout the country. Transportation is provided to and from all training. With the exception of airborne training, you will receive pay and travel allowance while participating in this program. Applications are accepted the fall of your Junior year.

College Scholarships

Air Force ROTC officers up to fouryear scholarships to men and women students majoring in selected scientific and technical areas such as engineering, mathematics, meteorology, and computer science. Competitive scholarships also are available to students in selected career areas based on the needs of the Air Force. Additionally, there are twoand three-year scholarships for qualified men and women in slected medical degree programs. Nursing applicants may compete for two-year scholarships. Each scholarship pays full tuition, laboratory fees, incidental expenses and reimbursement for textbooks plus a monthly non-taxable \$100 allowance during the school year. Applications for two-and three-year scholarships are made through the professor of Aerospace studies during the freshman or sophomore year. Competitive scholarships are available at the beginning of each school term for students enrolled in Air Force ROTC but do not have a scholarship. Application forms are furnished by the professor of Aerospace Studies in the Air Force ROTC detachment. Selection for two-and three-year scholarships will be based in part on:

 Scores achieved on the Air Force Officer Qualifying Test.

Overall grade-point average.

 The rating froman interview board. The Air Force ROTC four-year program has two phases: the General Military Course and the Professional Officer Course. Freshmen enroll in the four-year program as they would for any other class. There is no obligation. The first phase of the four-year program is the General Military Course. This is taught at freshman and sophomore level. Courses cover management principles, national defense, military history, and leadership. Cadets who show the potential to become an Air Force officer and who complete the physical and scholastic requirements of the General Military Course are eligible for the second phase, the Professional Officer Course.

Acceptance into the Professional Officer Course is competitive. It helps if you are majoring in selected scientific and technical areas such as mathematics, meteorology, engineering, and computer science. The Professional Officer Course is usually taken during the final two years of college. It includes instruction in organization and management, professionalism and additional leadership development.

During the summer between the sophomore and junior years, Professional Officer Course cadets attend a six-week training session on an Air Force Base.

Applications for the Professional Officer Course are taken early in the sophomore year.



Aggie Football, 1988

After All That Was Said And Done, Aggie Spirit And Pride Surfaced

Coming off its first ever outright Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference title and tying a record for most wins in a season, North Carolina A&T found the going tough in 1987 and plummeted to a disappointing 3-8 record.

The coach made a stunning exit and the Aggies moved swiftly to replace him with Bill Hayes, a coach with exceptional success at Winston-Salem State.

Hayes' Ram team won six divisional titles and a CIAA championship in 12 years. When Hayes packed his bags to make the 25-mile journey to

A&T, there was the hope that he brought along the success his WSSU teams enjoyed over the years.

But that hope was met with the reality that only a handful of proven veterans return, that Hayes has a short time in which to install a high-risk offense that Hayes himself will be swimming the stormy waters of the MEAC for the first time.

Those are imposing challenges, but to hear Hayes tell it, he thrives on challenges, the major reason the A&T position seemed so appealing.

"I accepted the A&T coaching position for the challenge,"

Hayes said on the day he was introduced as Mo Forte's successor. "I think there's something challenging about coaching in Division 1-AA and at a fine Institution like A&T.

I was particularly impressed by his proven record as a head football coach his extensive experience in high level student recruitment, based on positive interface with the high schools of the state, and his history and commitment to the academic monitoring and counseling of student athletes. I was further impressed by his proven ability to operate a first class program within the confines of the university-determined budget, his proven ability to work co-operatively with a nationally based alumni association and other support groups, and by the national esteem that he gained from coaching colleagues and former players.'





This wasn't the first time applying for the position. I just can't wait to get the season under way."

When the season gets under way, Hayes obviously would have made several crucial decisions. One involves the choice of a quarterback to run his Wing-T offense. Alan Hooker is no longer available.

Hooker, who signed as a free agent with the national Football Leagues Dallas Cowboys, set the standard for an A&T quarterback while performing at the position for the last three and a half season. Hooker owns virtually all A&T passing records and it is the all-time leading passer in MEAC history.



No one knows that better than veteran Coach Don Corbett, whose teams have won seven consecutive titles and participated in the same number of NCAA tournaments.

"We have our work cut out for us," Corbett said. "Experience will be in short supply because you can't lose four quality players like we did and not suffer."

Corbett was referring to the graduation loss of forward and MEAC Player of the Year Claude Williams, guard Thomas Griffis, center Kenny Cox and valuable reserve center Lee Robinson

Those four players were the primary reason the Aggies posted the first perfect mark in MEAC history en route to a 26-3 overall record last season, including a setback to Syracuse in the first round of the NCAA tournament. A&T went 16-0 in the conference and had only close call in all league skirmishes.

With the loss of 6-8 Williams, 6-9 Cox, and 6-8 Robinson, the Aggies were left without any appreciable experience on the frontline, prompting Corbett to remark: "Their loss is going to make my job that more difficult

and will put a lot of pressure on the players coming in as replacements."

Redshirt freshman Kevin Mumford is a leading candidate to fill a void on the frontline. At 608, Mumford must come in and develop consistency in a hurry. Another candidate is 6-5 sophomore Travis McRae, who got an extended look in several games last season.

If Mumford and McRae live up to expectations, the Aggies still would lack a legitimate big man in the pivot. Corbett fell short of that goal in his recruiting effort, landing four frontcourters only 6-8 in height.

But Corbett's success over the years has defied belief. Somehow he manages to make an adjustment to the players available and succeed with them in the lineup. If he opts in favor of a three-guard offense, he's well-equipped to do so. WE ARE PULLING FOR YOU COACH CORBETT! WE ARE STILL #1...








