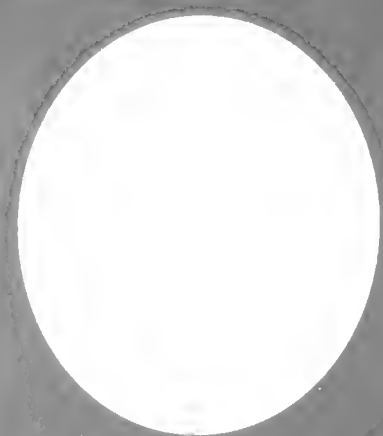

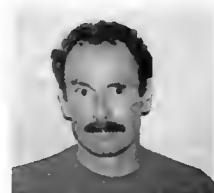

Graduated magna cum laude from North Carolina A&T (1971); named a Presidential scholar (1967-1971), a Ford Foundation Fellow (1971-1974), a National Fellowship Fund Fellow (1974-1975), a NATO Fellow (1975); winner of Omega Psi Phi Scholar of the Year Award (1975), Los Angeles Public School System's Service Commendation (1979), Distinguished Alumni Award (1979), National Society of Black Professional Engineers Distinguished National Scientist Award (1979), Friend of Freedom Award (1981), Who's Who Among Black Americans (1980), an AAU Karate Gold Medal (1976), five Regional Blackbelt Karate Championships, and numerous proclamations and achievement awards.

EXPERIENCE:

While at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Dr. McNair performed some of the earliest development of chemical HF/DF and high-pressure CO lasers. His later experiments and theoretical analysis on the interaction of intense CO₂ laser radiation with molecular gases provided new understandings and applications for highly excited polyatomic molecules.

In 1975, he studied laser physics with many authorities in the field at Ecole D'ete Theorique de Physique, Les Houches, France. He published several papers in the areas of lasers and molecular spectroscopy and gave many presentations in the United States and abroad.

Following graduation from MIT in 1976, he became a staff physicist with Hughes Research Laboratories in Malibu, California. His assignments included the development of lasers for isotope separation and photochemistry utilizing non-linear interactions in low-temperature liquids and optical pumping techniques. He also conducted research on electro-optic laser modulation for satellite-to-satellite space communications, the construction of ultra-fast infrared detectors, ultraviolet atmospheric remote sensing, and the scientific foundations of the martial arts.

The Computer Science Center was dedicated in 1970.

The Paul Robeson Little Theatre was opened.

1971 - A&T left the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association and helped form the Mid-Eastern Athletic Association.

The School of Nursing was accredited by the National League for Nursing.

1972 - A&T became a constituent institution of the University of North Carolina which is comprised of 16 public senior institutions.

The State Board of Higher Education authorized the School of Engineering to offer the degree, Master of Science in Engineering.

1972 - A special Agricultural Extension Program for NCA&TSU began offering programs outside the University.

Department of Chemistry was accredited by the American Chemical Society.

1974 - Safety and Driver Education was offered as a new degree program.

1975 - Department of Sociology and Social Service was accredited by the Commission on Accrediting of the Council on Social Work Education.

1976 - NCA&TSU was authorized to offer the following programs: B. S. Degree in Landscape Architecture; Transportation; Industrial Engineering, M. S. Degree in Adult Education; Biology, Ground was broken for construction of a Mathematics-Physics Building at a cost of \$2,755,000. Additional land was secured under the Greensboro Redevelopment Program for campus expansion adjacent to the New Market Street.



The tradition of this University is a trait that can never be destroyed, imitated, or duplicated. We must continue to highlight the energy of aggie pride and build upon its foundation. Just as we can never duplicate the traditions of other institutions, they can never generate a spirit to match aggie pride.

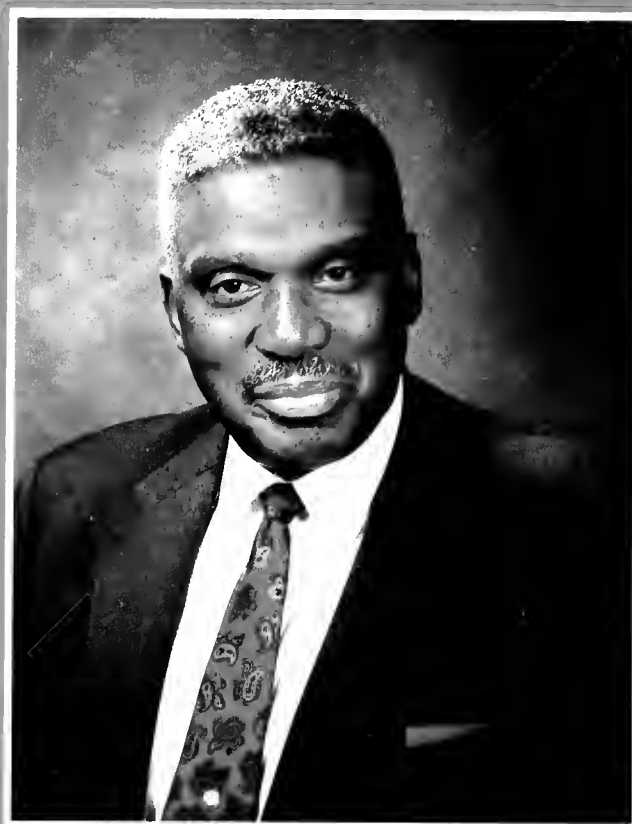

Dr. Richard E. Moore has enjoyed an outstanding 22-year career in educational public relations and teaching at North Carolina A&T State University. He currently serves as assistant vice chancellor for University Relations, as director of Information Services and as an associate professor of Communications.

Some highlights of Dr. Moore's career are as follows: He was honored by Lincoln University, Missouri in 1971 with its Journalism Merit Award for outstanding college public relations, for the past two years, he has served as a judge in the writing contests of the National Newspaper Publishers Association, the professional association for the 114 Black newspapers in the nation, for the past four years, he has served as a judge for the worldwide journalism contest for the U.S. Department of the Army, he was selected in 1985 to serve as an evaluator of Foreign Service Officers for the U.S. State Department, formerly served as chairperson of the Greensboro Human Relations Commission, has served as a consultant for the public relations offices of Elizabeth City State University and Alcorn State University, recently conducted a panel on public relations for 30 historically Black colleges, as sponsored in Atlanta, Ga., by the Philip Morris Company. In addition to his public relations role, Dr. Moore played a key role in extending the journalism offerings at A&T State University from one course to a full major.

CONSTITUTION OF THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF THE NORTH CAROLINA AGRICULTURAL AND TECHNICAL STATE UNIVERSITY

The present Student Government Association is an outgrowth of the Student Council of North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State College which was restructured on September 30, 1935 from an earlier organization by the same name.

The stated purpose of the earlier Constitution was to develop among the students a spirit of cooperation to afford development through self-expression, self-control, and leadership, and to create a high degree of cooperation between the faculty and students in matters of constructive welfare.

The Constitution of the Student Government Association was restructured in 1968 and 1979 and approved by the Board of Trustees.

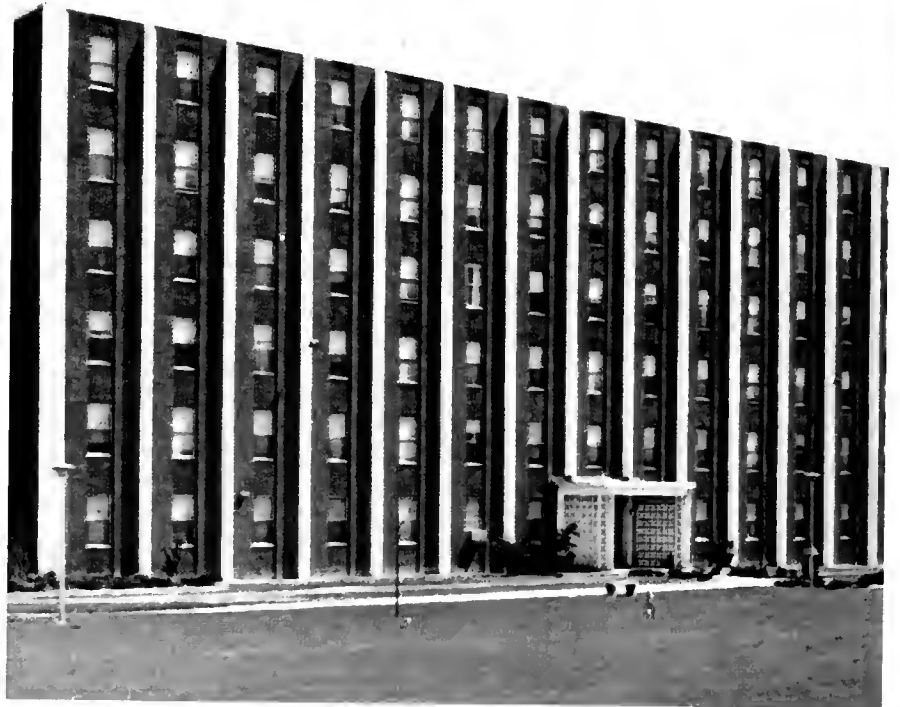

The School of Education provides curricula for students to prepare for teaching careers in the elementary and secondary schools of the state and for other professional careers in industry and government. The programs of study are planned to enable students to attain competence in both specialized and general areas of Education.

All professional teacher education programs are administered and supervised by the School of Education. The Schools of Education and Graduate Studies cooperate with the supervision of graduate teacher education programs, especially as they relate to teacher certification. Moreover, the School of Education serves as the central agency for administering all teacher education programs for undergraduates and the supervision of certification for all education majors at all levels.

The School of Education offers programs leading to the Bachelor of Science degree in Health and Physical Education, Early Childhood Education and Special Education.

In addition to the aforementioned programs, upon the satisfactory completion of an undergraduate program offered by other schools and departments in cooperation with the School of Education, the student is eligible to receive the degree of Bachelor of Science in one of the following areas: Agricultural Education; Art Education; English Education; French Education; History Education; Home Economics Education; Mathematics Education; Music Education; Physics Education; Social Studies Education; Speech and Theatre Education; Industrial Arts Education; Industrial Technology; Safety & Driver Education; and Vocational Industrial Education.

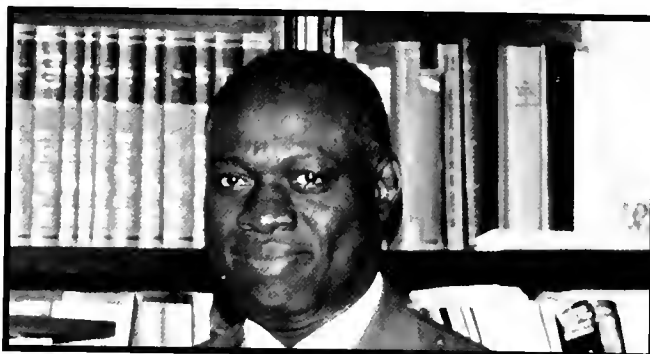
The School of Engineering grants Bachelor of Science degrees in architectural, chemical, civil, electrical, industrial, and mechanical engineering. The School also offers the master of science degree in engineering, architectural engineering, electrical engineering, industrial engineering and mechanical engineering. The Ph.D. degree is available in most engineering disciplines through an interinstitutional program between North Carolina State University and NC A&T State University.

The programs of study are aimed toward preparing a student for engineering practice in all phases of his/her chosen field. The specific objectives of the School of Engineering are:

1. To prepare the student for an active career in his/her chosen discipline within the profession.
2. To provide a comprehensive background in all phases of the engineering design process, namely; conception, planning, synthesis, analysis, design, and management.
3. To provide a basic knowledge of the mathematical and natural sciences upon which the practice of engineering depends.
4. To develop the judgment the engineer requires to utilize effectively, and economically, the materials and forces of nature for the benefit of mankind.
5. To encourage the student to develop an appreciation for the process of continuing education.
6. To develop the intellectual, professional, and social characteristics of the student in such a manner as to enable him/her to become a responsible leader in the community.

Graduate Studies

Graduate education at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University was authorized by the North Carolina State Legislature in 1939. The authorization provided for graduate training in agriculture, applied science and allied areas of study. An extension of the graduate program, approved by the General Assembly of North Carolina in 1957, provided for enlargement of the program to include teacher education as well as such other programs of a professional or occupational nature as might be approved by the State Board of Higher Education.

The Graduate School offers advanced study for qualified individuals who wish to improve their competence for careers in professions related to agriculture, applied science, education, science research, technology, the humanities and the social sciences. Such study of information and techniques is provided through courses of study leading to the Master of Science degree and through institutes, workshops, and individual courses designed for those who are not candidates for a higher degree but who desire advanced work in certain fields of study. Second, the Graduate School provides the foundation of knowledge and of techniques required for those who wish to continue their education in doctoral programs at other institutions. Third, the Graduate School assumes the responsibility of stimulating and encouraging scholarly research among students and faculty members.

It is expected that, in the course of studies, graduate students (1) will have acquired special competence in at least one field of knowledge; (2) will have developed further their ability to think independently and constructively; and (3) will have developed and demonstrated the ability to collect, organize, evaluate, and report facts which will enable them to make a contribution in their field of study.

School of Nursing

The School of Nursing offers a program leading to the Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing. The school is organized into lower and upper divisions. The first two academic years or lower division of the program encompass the core requirements of the University and the foundation courses for the major. The upper division or last two academic years is largely devoted to Nursing Courses.

The School of Nursing is an integral part of North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University and adheres to the purpose and objectives of the University. The School subscribes to the principles and theories that describe and predict man's behavior.

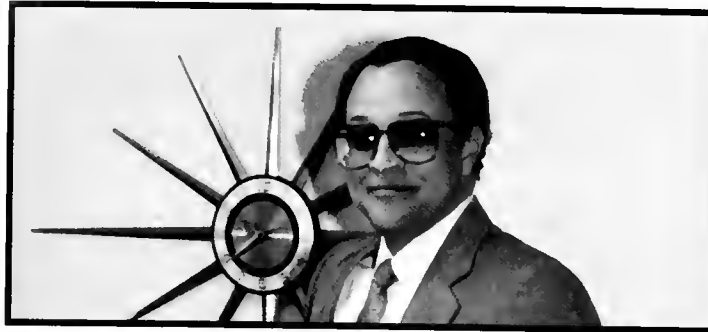
The faculty believes that man is a biopsychosocial, spiritual being who is continuously developing and adapting. 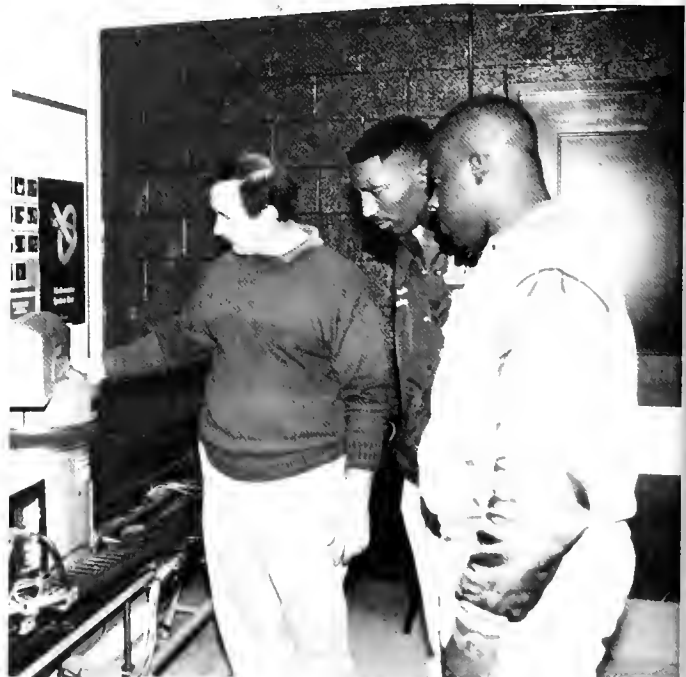

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENT

JOE LOUIS DUDLEY SR.

From a farm youngster in Eastern North Carolina to one of the nation's most enterprising and successful business entrepreneurs is the story of Joe Louis Dudley Sr.

Dudley is a 1962 graduate of A&T and president of Dudley Products, an international corporation that manufactures and sells cosmetics and operates cosmetology schools and salons.

His 37,500-square foot multi-million dollar manufacturing facility in Greensboro is the largest black-owned plant between Washington, D.C. and Atlanta. The firm employs more than 250 persons.

Just one year ago, Dudley purchased 54 acres of land and buildings to add a cosmetology university to his business empire. He also operates cosmetology training centers in Greensboro, Charlotte, N.C., Chicago, and New York.

Dudley, one of his parents' 11 children, grew up on a farm in Aurora in Eastern North Carolina. He worked his way through A&T by working on the university farm. After earning his degree, Dudley began selling cosmetics door-to-door for Fuller Products in New York.

He later returned to Greensboro, and in 1970 founded Dudley's Beauty and Barber Supply, operating mostly out of his home.

Today, Dudley's firm has sales representatives in 38 states and several foreign countries.

Dudley has been much honored nationally as a businessman and as a friend of education. He has made major contributions to Greensboro's Dudley High School, A&T State University and the Hayes-Taylor YMCA.

He is the husband of Eunice Dudley and the couple has three children, Joe Jr., Ursula and Genea.

NOTICE OF GRADUATION

The listing of names of degree candidates on the Commencement Program is not to be considered official evidence that all degree requirements have been satisfied. Undergraduate students receive an official notice from the registrar certifying that they have met the requirements for graduation. Graduate students receive an official notice of graduation from the dean of the graduate school.

THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

The academic costume worn today derived from practices originating in the Middle Ages. When European universities were taking form in the 12th and 13th centuries, the scholars were usually clerics as well, and consequently they adopted costumes similar to those of their monastic orders. Cold halls and drafty buildings made caps and floor length gowns with attached hoods a necessity for warmth. Probably because of the costumes' religious heritage, they remained largely drab until the universities gradually began to pass from the control of the Church, whereupon some aspects of the costumes took on brighter hues. Old prints reveal a strong similarity between the regalia worn in early universities and the academic costume worn today.

In light of the nation's strong English heritage, academic costume has been in use in the United States since colonial times. To establish a standard of uniformity with regard to the practice, an intercollegiate commission was formed which prepared a code for caps, gowns, and hoods which has been adopted by all institutions. Originally round, the shape of the cap is now the more familiar mortarboard square—a shape which resembles a scholar's book. Legend has it that the privilege of wearing a cap was the initial right of a freed Roman slave. The flowing gown has become symbolic of the democracy of scholarship for it covers any dress which might indicate rank or social strata. The hood not only indicates the type of degree, but is lined with the official colors of the University from which the degree was obtained.

THE GOWN

BACHELOR—Black, full cut with long pointed sleeves.

MASTER—Black, long or short sleeves with arc-shaped panel extended for each sleeve.

DOCTOR—Black, with velvet panels on front of gown and three velvet bars on each sleeve. Color of the velvet may be black or distinctive of the field of study.

THE HOOD

BACHELOR—Three feet in length with a two-inch wide velvet.

MASTER—Three and one-half feet in length with a three-inch wide velvet.

DOCTOR—Four feet in length with a five-inch wide velvet and panel at the sides.

The lining of the hoods, which is folded out, bears the official colors of the institution from which the degree was received.

The color of the velvet indicates the field in which the doctoral was granted.

CAP AND TASSEL

Candidates for degrees at The North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University wear the black mortarboard with a tassel the color of which is distinctive of the degree being received. The tassel colors are as follows:

Dr. Samuel D. Proctor, former President (1961-1964) of A&T, is a professor of education in the Graduate School of Education (Martin Luther King Memorial Chair) at Rutgers University, which is located in New Brunswick, New Jersey. He is also the Senior Minister of the Abyssinian Baptist Church in New York City. He is an alumnus of Virginia Union University (1942), and Boston University (1950), earning the Doctorate at the latter in Ethics. Other graduate study was done in sociology at the University of Pennsylvania, where he served as Dean. He was appointed President of Virginia Union in 1955 and served until 1960.

From 1964-1969, he held administrative positions with the Peace Corps in Nigeria and Washington, the National Council of Churches, the Office of Economic Opportunity, The Institute for Services to Education and the University of Wisconsin. Dr. Proctor has traveled in the far East and the Arab States, Eastern Europe, The Soviet Union, Africa, New Zealand and to other parts of the world. He holds many distinguished service awards, Honorary Doctorate Degrees and others.

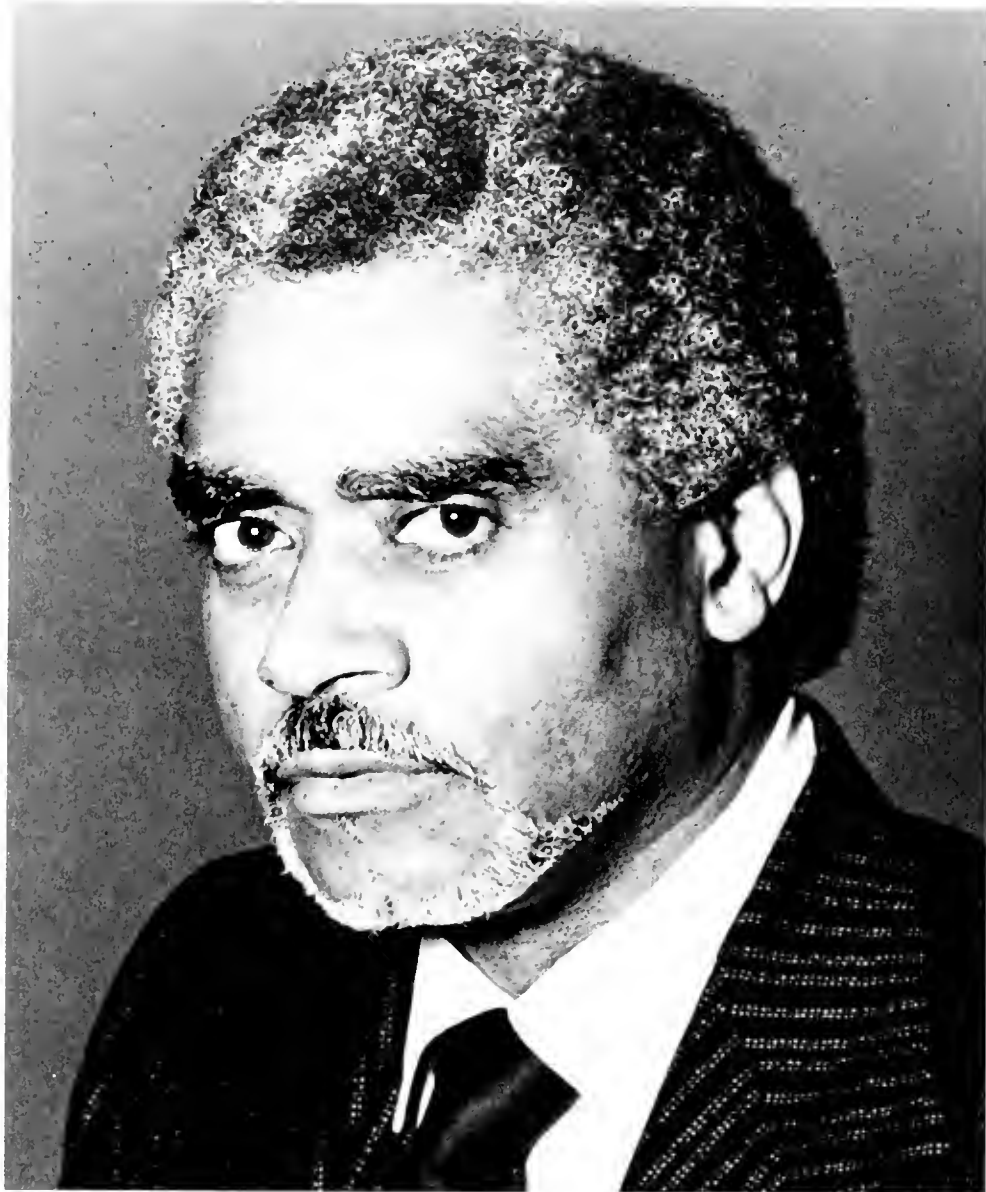

HEAD COACH - WILLIAM "BILL" HAYES

Coach Hayes

Bill Hayes has had great success in the football arena since his collegiate days at North Carolina Central, where he started for four years and earned All-America honors. Hayes has brought that successful philosophy to North Carolina A&T.

Hayes entered the coaching profession on the high school level in Gretna, VA, where he coached for one season. After seven years on the high school circuit, Hayes was tabbed as the offensive backfield coach and top recruiter at Wake Forest University. Four years later, Hayes found himself in line for the top job at Winston-Salem State.

Hayes took the reins at Winston-Salem State at a time when the Rams had suffered one of the longest losing periods in the school's history. During a 14-year span, from 1962 to 1976, the Rams two bright spots were a CIAA Southern Division Crown in 1971, followed by a winning campaign in 1972. Hayes quickly forged a new direction for the football program.

After a losing season in his first year, the Rams became a dominant force in the CIAA. Employing a veer offense, the team took the CIAA title in 1977 and 1978. The Rams also had the distinction of being the number one team in Division II with two consecutive undefeated regular season marks of 10-0.

In 1979, the Rams record slipped to 8-2-1. For the next two years, Hayes' team posted 5-5 records.

In 1982, the Rams dropped to a low of 3-7. The following year, Hayes instituted a new Wing-T offense, and the Rams rebounded with a 8-1-1 regular season record, and again took the CIAA Southern Division Crown.

In 1984, the Rams repeated as Southern Division Champs with a record of 9-1. The following two years, 1985 and 1986, saw the team from Winston-Salem State earning their third and fourth title.

Hayes got the nod and came aboard as team boss of the Aggies after the 1987 season. With most of the Aggies veterans lost to graduation, the new coach faced a formidable challenge as he geared up for the 1988 season. Hayes experienced his worst season as a coach, compiling a 2-9-0 record in '88. Last year his squad put together a 5-6-0 season as they started back on the road to recovery.

As he looks ahead to the 1990 campaign, Hayes is very optimistic that this team will be one to be reckoned with in the MEAC and the nation. "We have put together a good foundation of very good athletes," said Hayes. "We have some good football players returning, and we have had a good recruiting year. Not only that, we have set some team goals. With the talent and enthusiasm that this team has, we are hopeful that we can be very competitive this year."

A native of Durham, NC, Hayes received the bachelor of science degree in physical education in 1965 from NCCU, and in 1975 was awarded the master's of science degree from A&T. Hayes and his wife Carolyn, are parents of a daughter, Sherrie, and a son, William, Jr.

In 1908, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority became America's first Greek Letter Organization established by and for Black Women.

Today, nationally and locally, Alpha Kappa cultivates and encourages high scholastic and Ethical standards, promotes UNITY and FRIENDSHIP among college women, alleviates problems concerning girls and women. Maintains a progressive interest in college life and serves all mankind.

Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc.

Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Inc., the first intercollegiate Greek letter fraternity established for Black college students, was organized at Cornell University, Ithaca, New York in 1906. The first unit of this national fraternity, organized by college men of Afro-American descent, was called Alpha Chapter. The fraternity was born out of desire for maintaining close association and unified support for members of this small minority group, inasmuch as they were denied, for the most part, the mutual helpfulness which the majority of students attending their university regularly enjoyed. The seven visionary founders at Cornell, Henry Arthur Callis, Charles Chapman, Eugene K. Jones, George Kelly, Nathaniel Murray, Robert Ogle and Vertner Tandy, labored in the year of severe economic struggle and racial conflict in the United States. Despite their difficulties of organization in this untried field of student life, the early fraternity pioneers succeeded in laying a firm foundation and remained steadfast in their goals pointing toward development of the fraternity's membership — That is the espousing of the principles of good character, sound scholarship, Christian fellowship and the uplifting of humanity.

Beta Epsilon Chapter, the local satellite of Alpha, continues to keep ALPHA PHI ALPHA, FIRST OF ALL BLACK GREEKS.

EDUCATING AMERICAN BLACK UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES — STRENGTHS AND CRISES



Ebenezer D. Bassett was the first black diplomat. He was appointed minister to Haiti from 1869-1877.



Edmonia Lewis (1845-1890?) was the first American black woman sculptor to achieve prominence. She spent most of her adult career in Italy.



After publishing his first book, his autobiography, Frederick Douglass went to England fearing his master would recapture him.



Jesse Owens won four gold medals in the Olympic Games held in Berlin, Germany, 1936.



General Oliver Davis, Sr., the first black general in the active regular army, was a special advisor and coordinator to the theatre commander, European Theatre of Operations, 1944-1945.



Lt. Colonel Charles C. Rogers became the highest-ranking black officer to receive the Medal of Honor on May 14, 1970.



Patricia Roberts Harris became the first black woman to represent this nation as Ambassador. She was named Ambassador to Luxembourg in 1965.

DR. JESSE JACKSON, SR.



HE said, "We as a people will get to the promised land." Nelson Mandela says, "The struggle *is* my life." To me the meaning, tradition and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s life are not those of a conservative who is insensitive or a liberal with a seasonal or part-time commitment, but those of a *liberator* whose total life and soul and essence are committed to the freedom and dignity of all God's children. Neither race nor color qualifies or disqualifies one from identifying with and following in that tradition.

To me, Dr. King means that the price we must pay for peace is justice. Quiet is the absence of noise, but peace requires the presence of justice.

To me, Dr. King means that we must always have the vision to put our struggle in a national *and* international context. His moral opposition to the war in Vietnam was a witness that we should *not* be killing abroad, and we *should* be healing at home.

To me, Dr. King means that it is both morally right and politically necessary that we join with others whose economic, social and political interests converge with our own in the struggle for a just society and a peaceful world.

To me, Dr. King means that we must use what we've got, and God will give the increase. He had an extraordinary mind, but he cultivated and developed it through disciplined study—then applied it to the process of social change.

To me, Dr. King means that even if he had known in advance how his life would end, he would not have changed it or his mission. He loved his people that much.

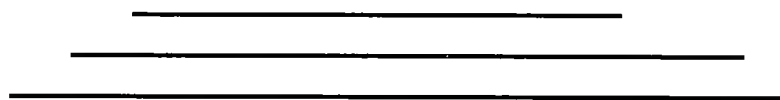

CELEBRATION AND CHALLENGE

Most literature and other media presented the late Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. as a civil rights leader, a minister, an orator, a pacifist, a philosopher, a writer and a devoted family man. Rarely was/is Dr. King presented as a scholar and an educator. Nevertheless, all of Dr. King's activities and accomplishments, whether at marches, in the pulpit, among friends, or at home, can be classified as educational; because King used his intensive learning and extensive knowledge to inspire and improve, in all of life's situations, the lot of his fellowman. Dr. King studied to gain an understanding and appreciation of life and its meaning while seeking to find scientific methodologies of educating the world to a functional theology of action — education by example.

After studying many religions, he sought and found within them common denominators which he reduced to the philosophy of St. John:

LET US LOVE ONE ANOTHER; FOR LOVE IS OF GOD;
AND EVERYONE THAT LOVETH IS BORN OF GOD.
AND KNOWETH GOD. HE THAT LOVETH NOT KNOWETH
NOT GOD, FOR GOD IS LOVE . . . IF WE LOVE ONE
ANOTHER, GOD DWELLETH IN US. AND HIS LOVE
IS PERFECTED IN US.

Because King was intelligent and articulate, because he possessed integrity and commitment, and because he could voice sound and effective views which were free of hate; he won the respect of this nation as well as the world.

MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. PRACTICED WHAT HE PREACHED AND
LEFT THE CHALLENGE FUNDAMENTAL TO EDUCATION:

Education is the only medium through which we can work for a sense of individual identity while striving for a unity entertained at a global level.

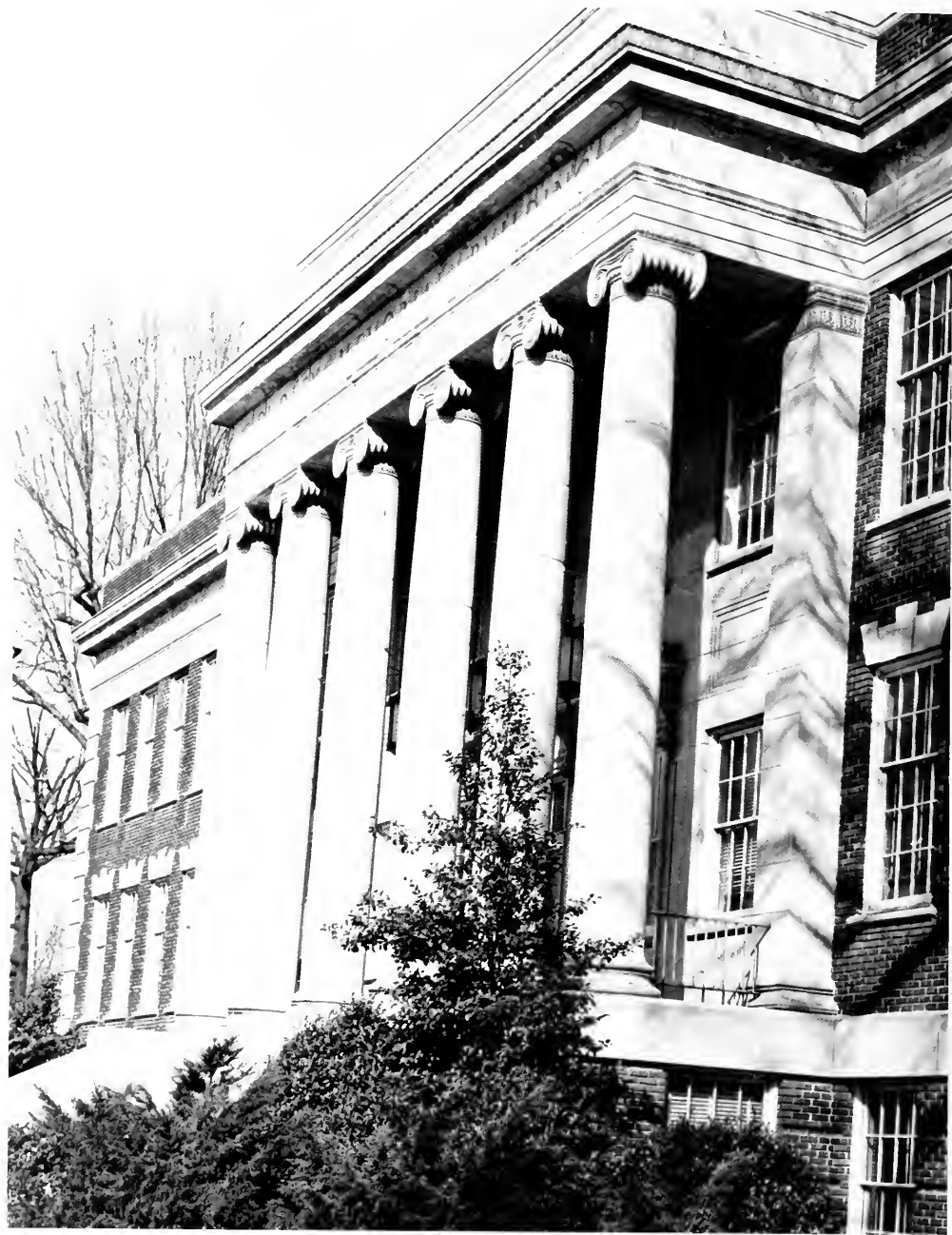

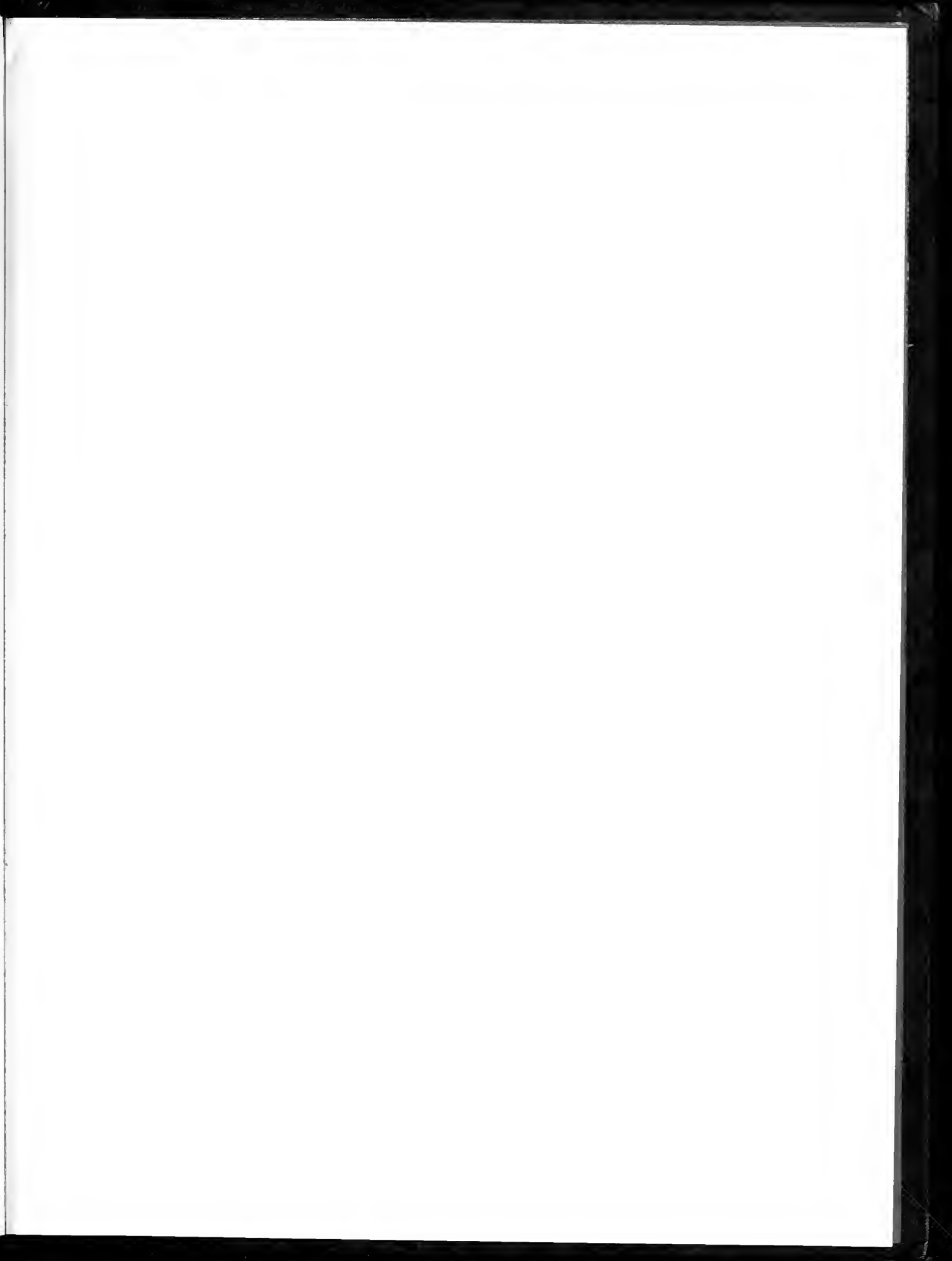
