RE-DIRECTION.

CONDITIONS OF FREE RE-DIRECTION.

1. Letters, Book Packets, Post Cards, Newspapers, and Sample Packets are not liable to additional postage for re-direction, whether re-directed by an officer of the Post Office or by an agent of the addressee after delivery, provided in the latter case that the letters, etc., are re-posted not later than the day (Sundays and public holidays not being counted) after delivery, and that they do not appear to have been opened or tampered with.

2. Re-directed letters, &c., which are re-posted later than the day after delivery will be liable to charge at the prepaid rate. Any which appear to have been opened or tampered with will be chargeable as freshly posted unpaid letters or packets.

3. Whenever it may be thought necessary, a receipt may be required from the addressee of a re-directed letter or packet at the second address.

4. If an inland registered letter, when re-directed, instead of being taken back to the Post Office to be dealt with as a registered letter, is dropped into the letter-box as an ordinary letter (the word "registered" not having been erased or having been erased in pencil only, it becomes liable to the same treatment as any other letter which is marked registered and found in the letter-box, and must be surcharged with a registration fee of 8d *minus* the value of any stamps already fixed for the registration.

5. Notices of removal, and applications for letters to be re-directed, must in all cases be duly signed by the persons to whom the letters are addressed, and in provincial towns they must be sent to the local Postmaster. Printed forms of notice can be obtained at any Head or Branch Office, or from the postman of the walk; and when filled up and signed, they should be given to the postmaster of the district or to the postman.

6. A Postmaster is not bound to re-direct for a person temporarily leaving his home, and not having a private bag or box, unless the house be left uninhabited.

INLAND PARCEL POST.

Parcels *not exceeding 11 lbs. in weight* are received at any Post Office for transmission between places in the United Kingdom.

Every Post Office is open to the public for Parcel Post business on week days during the same hours as for general postal business. No Parcel Post business is, as a rule, transacted in England or Ireland on Sundays, Christmas Days, and Good Fridays; nor in Scotland on Sundays and all public Holidays.

The following are the principal conditions and regulations :—

The size allowed for an Inland Postal Parcel is :—

Greatest length..... 3 ft. 6 in.

Greatest length and girth combined ... 6 ft. 0 in.

For example—

A parcel measuring 3ft. 6in. in its longest dimension may measure as much as 2ft. 6in. in girth, *i.e.*, round its thickest part ; or—

A shorter parcel may be thicker ; thus, if it measure no more than 3ft. in length, it may measure as much as 3ft. in girth, *i.e.*, round its thickest part.

The most convenient mode of measuring is by means of a tape 6ft. long, having the length of 3ft. 6in. marked thereon. So much of the tape as is not used in measuring the length is the measure of the maximum girth permissible. Such a tape, if provided by stationers, may conveniently be marked in one colour up to 3ft. 6in., and the remaining portion in another colour.

The rates of postage are—for a parcel—

Not exceeding 1lb. in weight..... 3d.

Every additional lb. or fraction of a lb. up to 11lbs., 1½d extra.

Compensation for loss or damage will be given subject to certain regulations, in accordance with the following table :—

No Parcel is accepted which weighs more than 11lbs., or is not sufficiently paid. The postage must in all cases *be paid in advance*, and by ordinary postage stamps, which must be affixed by the sender before tendering a parcel for transmission by Parcel Post at a Post Office.

In order that a packet may go by Parcel Post it must be tendered for transmission as a parcel, and should bear the words "Parcel Post," which should be clearly written in the left-hand top-corner.

Parcels must not be posted in a letter box, but must be taken into a Post Office and handed over the counter. Care must be taken that every parcel bears a clear address.

A parcel bearing the words "Parcel Post," or otherwise marked for transmission as a parcel, and posted out of course in a letter box, must be forwarded as a letter or book packet if it is fully prepaid at the rate proposed to either, and it is otherwise in accordance with the regulations of the Letter or Book Post.

If it does not comply with the above conditions, but is fully prepaid at the Parcel rate and is otherwise in accordance with the Parcel Post regulations, it will be forwarded by Parcel Post and charged with a fine of 1d, together with the deficient postage, if any, at the Parcel Post rate.

The address of a parcel must be clearly written either on the outer wrapper or on a separate address label securely fastened to the parcel; and the necessary stamp or stamps, to prepay the postage must in all cases be placed (as in the case of letters) close above the address.

Parcels which bear on the outside any writing or drawing of an indecent or offensive nature, or within which any contents of a like nature may be observed, and parcels containing gunpowder, cartridges, lucifer matches, or anything explosive or liable to sudden combustion, bladders containing liquid, live animals, grossly offensive or filthy matter, and anything in a condition likely to injure other parcels or any officer of the Post Office, are prohibited.

If such a parcel be tendered for posting, it is refused, or, if detected in transit, it is detained. Parcels containing fish, game, meat, eggs, &c., or razors, scissors, needles, knives, forks, or other parcels; liquids, or semi-liquids, such as jellies, pickles, paint, varnish, &c., are not accepted unless in bottles or cans securely stoppered; nor powders, unless so packed that they cannot escape in transmission. Bottles or glass in any form can be accepted only when so packed as to be secure from breakage. If a parcel be tendered in a damaged or insecure condition, or in a condition likely to injure other parcels or any officer of the Post Office, it is refused. If a parcel in such a condition is observed in transit, it is, if possible, made secure and sent forward; but, if it cannot be so secured, it is detained.

Parcels known to contain a letter, packet, or parcel intended for delivery at an address other than that borne on the parcel itself are prohibited.

Petitions and addresses to Her Majesty, forwarded direct, are exempt from postage, and such petitions and addresses, as also petitions to either House of Parliament, if sent to a Member of either House, are likewise exempt, provided they do not weigh more than two pounds, and are without covers, or are in covers open at the ends. No letter or other enclosure, however, must be inserted, and if one be found, such enclosure, unless it bears the proper number of postage stamps, will be charged as an unpaid letter.

I N L A N D N E W S P A P E R S .

For each inland newspaper, whether posted singly or in a packet, the postage when prepaid is one halfpenny; but a packet containing two or more registered newspapers is not chargeable with a higher rate of postage than would be chargeable for a book packet of the same weight, viz., one halfpenny for every 2 oz., or part of that weight.

A newspaper posted unpaid, or a packet of newspapers posted either unpaid or insufficiently paid, is charged double postage.

The Newspaper Wrappers are sold at 7 for 4d.

The Post Cards are sold at the following prices:—Thin Cards, 5½d; Stout Cards, 6d per packet of 10.

Foreign Post Cards may be sent to all the countries comprised in the General Postal Union.

Foreign Post Cards with an impressed stamp of 1d each are sold at that rate, and are transmissible to the countries of the Union without extra charge.

Registered Letter Envelopes sold at 12 for 2s 2½d, or 2¼d each.
Letter Cards sold at 1¼d each, or in Packets of 8 for 9d.

INLAND BOOK POST.

The Rate of Postage is as follows :—

Weighing not more than 2 ounces..... ½d.
,, more than 2 ounces, and not exceeding 4 ounces, 1d.

and so on, a halfpenny being added for every 2 ounces, or part of that weight. Packets posted wholly unpaid will be *charged double* these rates ; if partly paid, double the deficiency.

The expression, "Book-packet," means a packet which contains one or more of the following articles or documents, that is to say:—

(a) Any matter wholly printed on paper or some substance ordinarily used for printing, *except paper money*.

(b) Books and other publications or works of a literary character, and any other written or printed matter not being in the nature of a Letter (on paper or on some substance ordinarily used for writing or printing.)

(c) Sketches, drawings, paintings, photographs, maps, plans, charts, and engravings on paper or on some substance ordinarily used for the purpose, provided it is not a brittle or exceptionally fragile substance.

(d) The following documents, whether containing matter in the nature of a Letter or not, provided they respectfully conform to the conditions stated in the *Post Office Guide*.

Invoices, orders for goods, credit notes, advice notes, way bills, bills of lading, receipts, statements of account, prices current, market reports. Manuscript for press and printed proofs, with corrections and instructions. Examination papers, with corrections and instructions.

Circulars, that is, Printed Notices and Letters, whether separate or on the same sheet of paper with any other document transmissible by Book Post.

Deeds, agreements, proposals and policies of assurance, powers of attorney, proxy papers, voting papers, certificates, licenses.

Notices, reports, returns and certificates issued, made, or given by officers of a Court of Justice, or other public officers in the discharge of their duties, and returns or reports made to public officers or public bodies.

N.B.—**TYPE-WRITING.**—Typewritten Circulars and Letters are not admissible by Book Post. Circulars, however, printed or lithographed in characters resembling those of the Type-writer, or produced by means of the Mimeograph or other mechanical process from the type-written originals, are admitted to the privilege of the Book Rate of Postage, provided that they are posted by being handed in at the counter of the Head Office or any of the Branch Post Offices (this does not include Sub or Town Sub-Offices), that special attention is called to their nature, and that at least twenty copies, precisely identical, are posted at the same time.

It must be clearly understood that any Circulars in Type-Writing characters which are not posted in the prescribed manner will be chargeable at the Letter Rate of Postage.

No Book-Packet may exceed 5lbs. in weight, 18in. in length, 9in. in width, or 6in. in depth. A Book-Packet found to contain a Letter or a communication of the nature of a Letter, or any other enclosure not allowed by Book Post, is charged, if under 8 oz. in weight, as a Letter-Packet, and if over 8 oz. it is transferred to the Parcel Post, and charged a fine of 1d in addition to any deficient Parcel Postage. Book-Packets exceeding the prescribed weight or dimensions, are in all cases transferred to the Parcel Post.

Book-Packets should be posted either without covers (in which case they must not be fastened in any way) or in unfastened envelopes, or in covers which can be easily removed for the purpose of examination. If anything is written or printed on the outside of the covers, the covers must be left unfastened. It is not forbidden to tie the ends of a Book-Packet with string, but the string should be easy to unfasten.

REGISTRATION.

The fee for registering a letter, newspaper, or book packet passing between any two places in the United Kingdom is 2d.

Compensation for loss or damage of registered letters, books, or newspapers will be given, subject to certain alterations, as follows:—

Every letter, &c., to be registered should be presented at the counter, and a receipt obtained for it, and should on no account be dropped into a letter box. If, contrary to this rule, a letter marked "Registered" be dropped into a letter box, it will, "if directed to any place in the United Kingdom," be liable in a registration fee of 8d, instead of the ordinary fee of 2d.

Every article presented for registration must be enclosed in a strong cover, securely fastened. If the article contains money, it must, in order to gain the benefit of the guarantee, be enclosed in a Registered Letter Envelope sold by the Post Office; and if coins are sent, they must on no account be put in loose, but must be packed and enclosed in such a way as to move about as little as possible. The compensation given in respect of the loss or damage of coin shall in no case exceed £2.

All inland letters which contain coin, watches, or jewellery, even though they are posted without registration, are treated as registered, and are charged on delivery with a registration fee of 8d in addition to the ordinary postage; and any such letters which cannot be registered in time to be forwarded by the Mail for which they are posted are detained for the next despatch.

The registration of a packet makes its transmission much more secure, inasmuch as under ordinary circumstances, a registered packet can be traced through its whole course, and thus the loss of a registered packet is a very rare occurrence.

ARTICLES NOT ALLOWED TO BE SENT BY POST.

1. It is forbidden to forward by post any indecent or obscene print, painting, photograph, lithograph, engraving, book, or card, or any other indecent or obscene article, or any letter, newspaper, publication, packet, or card, having thereon any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, libellous, or grossly offensive character. Anything posted contrary to this prohibition will be stopped and sent up to the Returned Letter Office, Edinburgh.

2. Postmasters are instructed not to receive any letter which there is good reason to believe contains anything likely to injure the contents of the Mail bag, or to do bodily harm to any officer of the Post Office. If such a packet be posted without the Postmaster's knowledge, or if at any time before its despatch he should discover any such packet, he is directed not to forward it, but to report the case, with the address of the packet, to the Secretary.

The following are the examples of the articles referred to:—

A glass bottle or glass in any form; leeches, game, fish, meat, fruit or vegetables; bladders or other vessels containing liquids; gunpowder, lucifer matches, or anything which is explosive or liable to sudden combustion; razors, scissors, needles, forks, or other sharp instruments are also forbidden, except when sent in packets or samples to foreign countries on the condition mentioned in Rule.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST, INLAND.

1. Trade Patterns and Samples of Merchandise may be sent between places in the United Kingdom at the following rates of postage :—

For a packet not exceeding	4 oz. in weight,	-	1d.
”	” 6 oz. ”	-	1½d.
”	” 8 oz. ”	-	2d.

2. No packet must exceed 8 oz. in weight. The limits of dimensions are 12 in. by 8 in. by 4 in.

3. A packet posted wholly unpaid will on delivery be chargeable with double postage ; and if insufficiently paid will be chargeable with double the deficient postage.

4. Patterns and Samples must be sent in wrappers (marked “Pattern Post” or “Sample Post”) entirely open at both ends, and must be so packed that they may be easily withdrawn for examination ; but Samples of seeds, flour, drugs, and such-like articles, which cannot be sent in open wrappers, may be enclosed in boxes (but in such a way as admit of easy examination) or in bags of linen or in other like material, tied at the neck. Closed bags, even if transparent, will not be allowed.

5. The name, address, and trade of the sender must be in all cases *printed* (not written) on the outside of the wrapper above the address. If this rule be not complied with the packet will be liable to be charged on delivery.

6. The number, price, and private business marks may be written (at the top left-hand corner), and they may contain, in addition to patterns, any article or document transmissible in a book packet.

7. No glass bottle, or glass in any form, may be sent ; no explosive liquid, semi-liquid, or greasy matter, nor powders of any kind which may stain or do other damage ; nor any living creature.

8. Patterns of scissors, knives, razors, and other sharp articles must be so packed and guarded as to completely prevent injury to the other contents of the Mail bags, or to the officers employed. but the packets must at the same time admit of easy examination. When these requirements are not complied with, the packet will be stopped.

9. The Postmaster-General wishes it to be clearly understood that the Post is expressly intended for the benefit of, and is absolutely restricted to *bona fide Trade Patterns and Samples of Merchandise*. Packets not containing *bona fide* Patterns and posted prepaid at the pattern-rate only, will be charged with double fee deficient postage, *at the letter rate*, together with a fine of 6d.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST, FOREIGN.

1. The Pattern and Sample Post to Foreign Countries and the Colonies generally is restricted to *bona fide trade patterns or samples of merchandise*. Goods sent for sale or in execution of an order are not admissible, nor any article liable to Custom Duties. Patterns and Sample Packets must be prepaid.

2. Patterns or Samples, when practicable, must be sent in covers open at the ends, and easy of examination. But samples of seeds, drugs, &c., may be enclosed in boxes or in bags, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened.

3. There must be no writing or printing upon or in any packet for non-Union Countries except the address of the person for whom it is intended, the address of the sender, a trade mark or number, the price of the articles, the weight or size, and quantity to be disposed of. But a packet for any country in the Postal Union may contain Printed Papers; and, if the rate applicable to Commercial Papers be paid, it may also contain Commercial Papers.

4. Samples of saleable value must not be sent to any foreign country in the Postal Union. Eider down, raw or thread silk, woollen or goats' hair thread, vanilla, or isinglass, fall under this rule, if weighing more than three ounces.

5. Samples of scissors, knives, razors, forks, steel pens, nails, keys, watch machinery, metal tubing, pieces of metal or ore, must be packed and guarded so as not to injure the contents of the Mail bags or the officers of the Post Office, while at the same time they may be easily examined. Indigo, liquids, or explosives cannot be sent.

DIMENSIONS.—A packet of patterns or samples sent to any British Colony or Possession or non-Union country, must not exceed 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth, but to any foreign place comprised in the Postal Union a packet must not exceed 12 inches in length, 8 in width, or 4 in depth, unless it be in the form of a roll, in which case the limit of size is 12 inches in length and 6 inches in diameter.

WEIGHT.—The limit of weight for patterns or samples for British Colonies or Possessions, or for non-Union countries is 5 lbs., but for the Argentine Republic, Austria, Belgium, Bolivia, Bulgaria, Congo Free State, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Egypt, France, Greece, Guatemala, Hawaii, Holland, Honduras Republic, Hungary, Italy, Japan, Liberia, Luxemburg, Mexico, Persia, Peru, Portugal, Roumania, Salvador, Servia, Siam, Spain, Switzerland, Tunis, United States, and Venezuela, the limit is 12 oz., and for other countries in the Postal Union, 8 oz.

POST OFFICE TELEGRAMS.

Telegraph business is transacted from 7 A.M. till 9 P.M. on Week Days, and on Sundays from 9 till 10 A.M.

Ayr Docks, from 9 A.M. till 5 P.M. Saturdays, from 9 A.M. till 2 P.M. No Sunday attendance.

INLAND TELEGRAMS.

The charge is 6d for the first 12 words, and $\frac{1}{2}$ d for each additional word. Addresses are charged for.

INLAND POST.

Express Delivery of Letters and Parcels.

I.

LOCAL SERVICE. EXPRESS THROUGHOUT.

Under this Service Messages, Letters, and Parcels, and other articles, are conveyed *the entire distance* by Special Messenger.

In London they are accepted at 260 Post Offices, and are delivered in any part of the London Postal Area.

In the Provinces they are accepted at all Post Offices from which there is a delivery of Telegrams, and are delivered in any part of the Town or Rural District.

The Offices in question are designated Express Delivery Offices.

SCALE OF CHARGES.

(a) For a Letter, Packet, or other Article not exceeding 1lb. in weight the Express Fee is—

For every mile or part of a mile 3D.

For a Letter, Packet, or other Article over 1lb. in weight, the Express Fee is—

For every mile or part of a mile 3d.

For every lb. or part of a lb. after the first lb..... $1\frac{1}{2}$ d.

(b) If the sender desires that a special conveyance be used, the actual cost (generally 1s per mile) must be paid in addition to the above charges.

(c) If the distance exceeds two miles, and a public conveyance (*i.e.*, railway, omnibus, or tramcar) is not available in both directions, the actual cost of a special conveyance must be paid in addition to the Express Fees.

(d) All charges must be prepaid in postage stamps, to be affixed to a form provided for the purpose.

POSTING AND DISTINCTIVE MARKING.

- (a) Every packet must be handed in over the counter. In no case may it be posted in a letter box.
- (b) The words "Express Delivery" must be boldly and legibly written by the sender above the address in the left-hand corner of the cover.

HOURS OF POSTING.

Week-days, 8.0 A.M. to 8.0 P.M. In London certain offices are open later.

There is no Express Delivery on Sunday, Good Friday,* or Christmas day.

REPLIES AND FURTHER SERVICES.

On the delivery of an Express Packet the delivering Messenger may take a reply or perform a further Express Delivery service before 8.0 P.M. The Express Fee must be paid by the sender of the first service or by the sender of the reply or further service.

When a reply or further service is required by the sender, the words "Wait Reply" or "Further Service" should be written above the address of the Packet, and the Messenger is allowed to wait 10 minutes free of charge, but after that time 2d is charged for every quarter of an hour or part of a quarter of an hour during which the Messenger is required to wait for a reply.

When a Packet on a return or further service is taken to an address within half-a-mile of the Post Office from which the Messenger started on the original service, half only of the Express Mileage Rate is charged.

ACCEPTANCE BY TELEGRAPH MESSENGER.

A Telegraph Messenger, on delivering a Telegram, may, if desired, take back to the Post Office where he is employed a Packet or Express Delivery. If the Office is not an Express Delivery Office, the Letter or Parcel will be sent by Post to the first Express Delivery Office. Charges to be paid by the sender by means of postage stamps affixed to the Packet.

LETTERS POSTED AT RAILWAY STATIONS.

Letters to be posted in the Late Fee Letter Boxes attached to the Mail Trains may be handed in at any Post Office at which the Express Service is in operation, for immediate conveyance to the Railway Stations. The postage and late fee must be prepaid in stamps affixed to the letter.

SINGLE LETTERS CONVEYED BY RAILWAY.

Railway Letters not exceeding 1 oz. in weight, for transmission by ordinary trains, may be handed in at any Post Office at which the Express Service is established, for immediate conveyance to the Railway Stations.

*Scotland excepted as regards Good Friday.

POSTING OF LATE LETTERS AND PARCELS.

Letters and Parcels are accepted for conveyance by Express Messenger to the General Post Office, or other Post Office in London, or to the Chief Offices in Provincial Towns, in time for an outgoing Mail.

MESSENGERS CALLED BY TELEPHONE OR PRIVATE WIRE.

The Subscribers to the Telephone Exchanges of Post Office, and Renters of private wires terminating at a Post Office can use their wires for the purpose of summoning a Messenger for the Express Delivery of Letters or Parcels. The fees for such Express Service are charged to deposit account.

EXPRESS DELIVERY OF LETTERS, &c., AFTER TRANSMISSION BY POST.

Under this Service, Letters and Parcels are forwarded by Mail in the regular course of Post, and on arrival at the office of delivery are sent by Special Messenger.

FEES.

1. (a) In addition to the full ordinary postage the Express Fee is—

For every mile or part of a mile, 3d.

(b) If the sender desires that a special conveyance be used, or if the distance exceeds two miles, and a public conveyance is not available in both directions, the actual cost of a special conveyance (generally 1s per mile) must be paid in addition to the above charges.

(c) The sender is responsible for the fee and charges. The fee is in no case less than 3d, and this and the postage must be prepaid by means of stamps affixed to the Letter or Parcel. When the distance exceeds two miles at least one half of the amount payable in respect of fee and charge for special conveyance must be prepaid, and the deficiency, if any, will be demanded from the addressee.

(d) If one half of the amount so chargeable is not prepaid, the Letter will not be delivered by Special Messenger, but will be treated as an ordinary Mail Letter.

In London a single Express fee of 3d is as a rule sufficient to cover the cost of delivery when the Letter or Parcel is expressed from the usual delivering office.

POSTING AND DISTINCTIVE MARKING.

2. (a) The word "Express Delivery" must be boldly and legibly marked above the address on the left-hand side of the cover, and in the case of an Express Letter the cover must in addition be marked with a broad perpendicular line from top to bottom, both on front and back.
- (b) Letters may be handed in at a Post Office, or to a Rural Postman, or, if not for registration, posted in a Letter Box.
- (c) Parcels and Registered Letters for this Service must be handed in at a Post Office, or to a Rural Postman.

DELIVERY—ON WEEK DAYS.

3. (a) By Special Messenger during the hours in which the Office of Delivery is open for Telegraph business.
- (b) To Callers, whether by day or by night when the Postal Staff is in attendance, if the Letter or Parcel arrive too early or too late for delivery by Special Messenger, or if it be addressed to the Post Office "To be called for."

ON SUNDAYS—LETTERS ONLY.

- (c) By Special Messenger during the hours in which the Office of Delivery is open for Telegraph business, and to Callers for letters.

N.B.—In London there is no Express Delivery on Sunday.

PARCELS.

- (d) There is no delivery on Sunday.

REPLY AND FURTHER SERVICES.

On the delivery of a Letter or Parcel under this Service the Special Messenger may, if desired, take a Letter or Packet for Express Delivery under any of the Services described in this Notice.

EXPRESS DELIVERY OF MAIL LETTERS FROM CHIEF OFFICES.

Letters and Parcels transmitted by Mail in the Regular course of Post from any Provincial Office in London can be delivered by Special Messenger from the General Post Office or other Chief District Office at which the bag containing the Letter or Parcel is first opened, thus gaining considerably in time of delivery. Similarly, Letters and Parcels addressed to any part of the town or rural district served from a Provincial Head Post Office, can, if desired, be sent out for delivery by Special Messenger immediately on their arrival at the Head Office.

FEE.

The Express Delivery Fee is chargeable subject to the same conditions as in the foregoing Service. In no case must a fee of less than 3d be prepaid in addition to the Postage, and if the distance be over two miles, one-half of the amount chargeable must be prepaid in stamps affixed to the letter or parcel.

DISTINCTIVE MARKING.

The words "*Express Delivery from Chief Office*" must be boldly and legibly marked above the address on the front of the cover of Letters and Parcels, and letters must in addition be marked with a perpendicular line from top to bottom both on the front and the back.

EXPRESS AFTER FIRST STAGE.

Express Letters and Packets may be handed in at any Post Office which is not an Express Delivery Office under the following conditions :—

The Letter or Packet takes the ordinary course of post from the Office where it is handed in, until it reaches the first Express Delivery Office, and thence it is conveyed direct to destination by Express Messenger.

The Express Fees are charged as from the Express Delivery Office, and not from the Office of Posting, and must be prepaid by the sender.

It must be clearly understood that this Service is a merely supplementary one and is less expeditious than the Service described as Express throughout, because the article posted must wait until it is collected by the Postman in the ordinary course.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

Except where otherwise specified, the Express Delivery Services are subject to the existing Regulations governing the Inland Post.

Compensation is paid for loss or damage of Express Registered Letters and Registered Parcels ; and, up to £2. for loss or damage of an Express Unregistered Parcel. Registration of Letters and Parcels is not undertaken as regards reply or further services.

 COMPENSATION FOR LOSS OR DAMAGE.

Compensation to an amount not exceeding in some cases 20s, in other cases 12s, is given for loss or damage of Parcels addressed to Foreign Countries and to certain Colonies. For particulars apply at any Post Office.

I N S U R A N C E.

Parcels for the under-mentioned Foreign Countries and British Colonies and Possessions can be insured. Insurance is obligatory in the case of parcels addressed to these places containing coin, jewellery, watches, or any article of gold or silver. Any such parcel posted uninsured will generally be returned to the sender.

BRITISH COLONIES AND POSSESSIONS.—Aden, Antigua, Ascension, Bahamas, Barbados, Bermuda, British Guiana, British North Borneo (as far as Sandakan), Ceylon, Cyprus, Dominica, Falkland Islands, Gambia, Gibraltar, Grenada, Hong Kong, India, Labuan, Lagos, Mombassa, Montserrat, Nevis, Newfoundland, Niger Coast Protectorate, St. Helena, St. Kitts, St. Lucia, St. Vincent, Straits Settlements (Malacca, Penang, Province of Wellesley, and Singapore only), Tobago, Tortola, Trinidad, Zanzibar.

FOREIGN COUNTRIES.—Austria - Hungary, Belgium, Beyrout, Cameroons, China (Amoy, Canton, Foochow, Hankow, Hoihow, Macao, Ningpo, Shanghai, and Swatow), Constantinople (by sea direct only), Denmark, Egypt (via Gibraltar), Finland, France, Germany, Holland, Italy (via Belgium and France), Luxemburg, Montenegro, Norway, Roumania, Servia, Smyrna (by sea direct only), Sweden, and Switzerland (via Belgium and France.)

The scale of fees are as follows :—

A fee (in addition to the postage) of

5d., | 7½d., | 10d., | 1/0½d., | 1/3,

will ensure compensation to an amount not exceeding

£12, | £24, | £36, | £48, | £50.

No parcel can be insured for more than £50. A parcel addressed to Holland, Italy (via Belgium), or Montenegro, cannot be insured for more than £40, or to Beyrout, Constantinople, Egypt (via France), Finland, France, Italy (via France), Roumania, Servia, Smyrna, or Switzerland (via France), for more than £20.

When an uninsured parcel received from the above mentioned places is discovered to contain coin, watches, jewellery, or any article of gold or silver, it is compulsorily registered, and a fee of 8d is charged against addressee.

P A C K I N G .

More careful and substantial packing is necessary for all Foreign and Colonial Parcels than for Inland Parcels owing to the much greater distance over which, as a rule, the former have to be con-

veyed, and the very different condition of transit, and the influences of climate. This is a consideration which must necessarily be taken into account in dealing with claims for compensation. A Parcel for any Foreign Country must be so sealed with wax or lead by the sender that the Parcel cannot be opened without breaking the seals or leaving traces of violation. Every Foreign or Colonial Parcel tendered for insurance must be sealed in the following manner—All the seals of a Parcel must be of the same kind of wax or lead, and must bear distinct impressions of the same device ; the device must not consist of straight, curved, or crossed lines, nor must a coin be used for sealing. It is strongly recommended that, when possible, an impression of the seal used on the parcel should be made on the counterfoil of the despatch note, where such is used. Parcels containing coin, watches, jewellery, or articles of gold or silver, must be enclosed in strong boxes or cases, which must be sewn up or otherwise fastened in wrappers or linen canvas, strong paper, or other substantial material, the seals being placed not further than 3 inches apart. Further, insured Parcels, if packed in cloth or paper, must be sealed along the join, and over each loose flap of the covering ; if packed in wood or tin they must bear seals protecting each join. If string be used to close a Parcel, a seal must be placed on the ends of the string where they are tied.

PROHIBITED ARTICLES.

As in the case of the Inland Parcel Post, certain dangerous and perishable articles and contraband articles must not be sent by means of the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post. Liquids may be accepted if securely packed in proper cases.

GENERAL.

Where not repugnant to the foregoing rules, the general regulations of the Inland Parcel Post will apply.

REGULATIONS.

(2.) The maximum dimensions allowed are as follows :—

Parcels for British Possessions (except Canada), Beyrout, Colombia, Constantinople, Costa Rica, Egypt, Jeddah, Hawaii, Siam, Smyrna, Tangier.—Greatest length, 3 ft. 6 in.; greatest length and girth combined, 6 ft.

For European countries (except Spain, Portugal via Spain, Greece, and Turkey), and for Japan, Liberia, and Madeira.—Greatest length, breadth, or depth, 2 ft.

For other Foreign countries.—Greatest length, 2 ft.; greatest length and girth combined, 4 ft.

For Canada.—Greatest length, 2 ft.; greatest breadth or depth, 1 ft.

(3.) Dangerous and offensive articles, and contraband articles (a list of which can be seen at any Post Office) must not be sent by means of the Parcel Post. Parcels exceeding £50 in value are not transmissible to Aden, India, Egypt, St Helena, Ascension, the Cape of Good Hope, Natal, and Zanzibar.

(4.) Foreign and Colonial Parcels must not be handed to a Rural Postman or a Mail Cart Driver.

(5.) One declaration or more of the contents and their value must accompany every parcel. Custom duty is collected on delivery.

(6.) Parcels for Foreign Countries, the Australian Colonies, South and Central Africa, Natal, Fiji, New Zealand, Jamaica, Mauritius, Seychelles, the Straits Settlements, and Trinidad, must not contain a letter.

(7.) Parcels for the under-mentioned Foreign Countries and British Possessions may be insured. Insurance is obligatory in the case of parcels addressed to these places containing coin, jewellery, watches, or any article of gold or silver:—Algeria, Austria-Hungary, Belgium, Beyrout, Camerouns, China, Constantinople, Corsica, Denmark, Egypt, Finland, France, Germany, Holland, Italy,* Luxemburg, Montenegro, Norway, Roumania, Servia, Smyrna, Sweden, Switzerland. Aden, Antigua, Ascension, Bahamas, Barbados, Bermuda, British Guiana, British North Borneo (as far as Sandakan), Ceylon, Cyprus,† Dominica, Falkland Islands, Gambia, Gibraltar, Grenada, Hong Kong, India, Labuan, Lagos, Mombasa, Montserrat, Nevis, Newfoundland, Niger Coast Protectorate, St. Helena, St. Kitts, St. Lucia, St. Vincent (West Indies), Straits Settlements (Malacca, Penang, Province Wellesley, and Singapore only), Tobago, Tortola, Trinidad, Zanzibar.

* No compensation is given for fragile or perishable parcels damaged in Italy.

† No compensation is given for parcels containing watches or jewellery lost or damaged in Cyprus.

A parcel addressed to Holland, Italy, or Montenegro cannot be insured for more than £40, or to Algeria, Beyrout, Constantinople, Corsica, Egypt viâ France, Finland, France, Italy viâ France, Roumania, Servia, Smyrna, and Switzerland viâ France, for more than £20.

(10.) Any insured Parcel must be packed with special care and sealed with wax by the Sender. The sum for which it is insured, which must not exceed the real value of the contents, must be inscribed on the cover.

(11.) There is at present no system of insurance for parcels exchanged with any Foreign Country or British Possession, except those mentioned in paragraph 7.

No letter for a colony or foreign country may exceed 2 feet in length or 1 foot in width or depth. The same dimensions are allowed for packets of books and other printed papers sent to British Colonies and Possessions and non-union countries, but to foreign countries of the Postal Union the length is limited to 18 inches.

Letters, &c., for officers on board ships of war on the Pacific Station (North or South) are subject to the same rates of postage as ordinary correspondence for Chili.
