MARS HILL

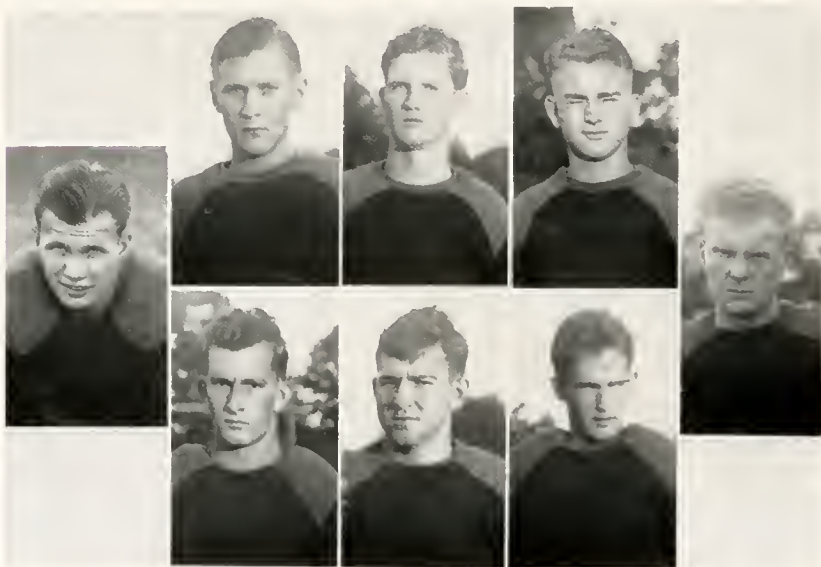
Before a large Home Coming through the Mars Hill Mountain Lion found Presbyterians very tough foes. Welch, Dorsey, Wells starred.

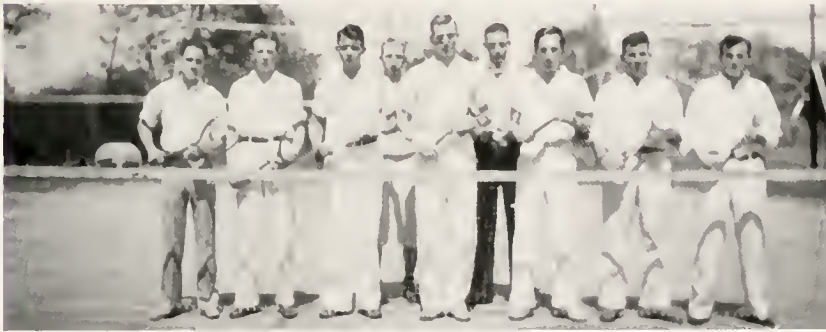

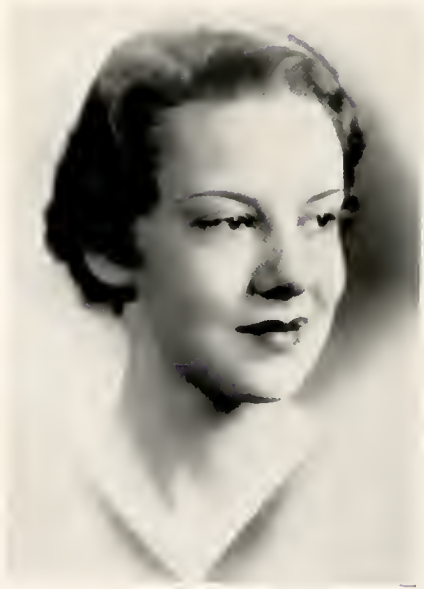
