



John Bunyan. The celebrated author of the Pilgrim's Progress was born in 1628, at Elstow, a small village near Bedford, in England. His father was a tinker, and brought up his son to the same business. He was haptized in 1655, at the age of twenty-seven years, and within a year was set apart by fasting and prayer to the ministerial office. On the 12th of November, 1660, he was convicted of the offence of not conforming to the rites and ceremonies of the Church of England, and committed, with sixty others, to the county jail. He remained in *Bedford jail* more than 12 years, and was released in 1672. He learned to make tagged thread laces, and by this employment provided for his family. In the midst of all his trials, he wrote the Pilgrim's Progress. He died in a triumphant manner, August 31, 1688, aged sixty years.

grim's Progress was published in 1678. In 1684 Bunyan published the second part of his Pilgrim's Progress. PSES IN THE YEAR 1850.

There will be two eclipses this year, and both of the Sun.

1. Tuesday, February 12. Sun eclipsed at the time of New Moon in the morning, invisible in the United States.

2. Wednesday, August 7. Sun eclipsed at the time of New Moon in the afternoon, visible in the South-western part of the United States, and the Western territories.

Morning and Evening Stars. VENUS will be Morning Star until March 2, then Evening Star until December 16, then Morning Star until September 30, 1851. JUPITER Will be Morning Star until March 8, then Evening Star until Sept. 26, then Morning Star until April 8, 1851.

Note to the Reader.—The Calendar pages in this Almanac are adapted for use in every part of the United States. It is based on the fact, that, in the same latitude, that is, on a line running due east and west, the sun and moon rise and set at the same moment by the clock or alma-nac, not only throughout the United States, but around the world—the variations being so small as to be of no importance for ordinary purposes. The changes, fulls and quarters of the Moon are governed by another principle, and are essentially the same for all places on the same longitude, that is, on any line extending due north and south.

The seventeenth annual meeting was held in the Oliver St. Baptist Church, New York, May 10, 1849. The receipts for the year ending April 1, 1849, including balance of \$2,071 from previous year, were \$29,105,90. 36 new Life Directors by the payment of \$100, and 216 Life Members by the payment of \$30. Total number of Life Directors, 268, and of Life Members, 1387. 134 Missionaries and agents were employed in 18 States, in Oregon, California and Canada. The missionaries have statedly occupied 453 stations and out-stations, performing in the aggregate the labor of one man for 92 years; reporting the baptism of 774 persons, the organization of 45 churches, and ordination of 27 ministers; 13,669 sermons preached; 27,027 pastoral visits; 7 houses of worship completed and 19 commenced; obtained 1,082 signatures to the Temperance pledge, and travelled 113,981 miles. The Monthly Concert of Prayer is observed at 92 stations. Connected with the churches are 190 Sabbath Schools and 86 Bible Classes, having 1,271 teachers and 7,104 scholars, with 22,385 volumes in their libraries. Since the formation of the Society in 1832, 1,314 ministers have acted under its commission, who have jointly performed 1,150 years of labor, baptized 17,374 persons, organized 673 churches and ordained 312 ministers.

Appropriations were made for Asamese, German, French, Chinese, Karen, Oriya, and Bengalee scriptures. Appropriatsons were made to Rev. J. G. Oncken, to the amount of \$6,125, for stereotyping, printing and distributing the scriptures in Germany.

The tenth annual meeting was held in Philadelphia, (in the First Baptist Church,) April 25th, 1849. The receipts for the year ending March 15, 1849, were \$25,416 38, being an increase of \$6,872 over the previous year. 42 Life Members by the payment of \$20 each, and 4 Life Managers by the payment of \$50, were added during the year. More than 60,000 volumes were put into circulation during the year. During the year, fifteen new publications were issued, "Pengilly's Scripture Guide to Baptism," in German; "Errors of the Romish Church," in French; "Wilson's Scripture Manual on Baptism," in French; "Pengilly's Guide," in French; "Remington's Reasons," in French; "Closing Scenes, or Death Beds of Young Persons;" "The Baptist Harp," a new collection of hymns for the Closet, the Family, Social Meetings, and Revivals, &c. New editions were issued of "Fuller's Works," "Howell on Communion," "The Psalmist," "Pilgrim's Progress," &c.; also the "Baptist Almanac and Annual Register" for 1849. 1300 pages of stereotype plates were added during the year. Value of stock in books, &c. \$9,741; in stereotype plates, \$8,977. Total \$18,719.

The Society has eighteen Colporteurs laboring in ten States; five of the colporteurs are Germans. Eleven Ministers' Libraries and twelve Sunday School libraries, were gratuitously bestowed, making 103 within five years. Grants of books and tracts were made to Canada, France, Africa, China, Burmah, West Indies, Indian Territory, Oregon, California, &c. \$100 was sent to Rev. J. G. Oncken, for tracts in Germany. The \$10,000 subscription, was completed during the year. The Building Fund amounts to \$1,659 07, the interestof which defrays, in part, the rent. The Library contains 1,032 volumes. The number of publications in the Society's list is 260, of which 68 are bound volumes. Of the

Society's Tracts, 175 are English, 5 German, 3 French, 9 Children's.

In China the Board has 20 missionaries and native assistants, of whom 7 are ordained ministers from the U.S. Canton and Shanghai are the stations occupied. In Africa, there are 7 missionaries, with 6 teachers and interpreters, all of whom are colored men. The stations are Monrovia, Bexley, Bassa Cove, New Virginia, Cape Palmas, Edina, &c., all in the republic of Liberia.

The fourth annual meeting of the Board of Domestic Missions was held in Charleston,

S. C., May 23, 1849. The receipts for the year ending April 1, 1849, were \$14,042. The disbursements were \$13,891. 57 Missionaries and agents have labored, occupying 170 stations; they report 5,782 sermons, 789 prayer meetings; 75,643 miles travelled; 683 baptized; 10 ministers and 15 deacons ordained; 27 Sunday schools, with 137 teachers,

1,222 pupils, and 2,280 volumes in libraries.

The Society has Missions among the Choctaws, Creeks, Cherokees, Putawatomies, Weas and Miamies. There are 23 missionaries, of whom 8 are ordained ministers; 14 churches; 883 members; 117 baptized; 4 schools, and 127 scholars. The "Indian Advocate" is published monthly.

"Armstrong Academy," (Choctaw) is very prosperous. Manual Labor Schools will also

be established among the Putawatomies and Creeks.

Baptism of Baptist W. Noel.—The Hon. and Rev. Baptist W. Noel, a distinguished Episcopalian, and Chaplain of the Queen, was baptized in London, Aug. 9, 1849, in the presence of an immense congregation. On Lord's day morning, Aug. 5, he preached an admirable sermon on baptism, at John Street Chapel, (Rev. J. H. Evans'.) Before his baptism, on Thursday evening, the latter part of the 8th chapter of Acts was read, beginning at the 25th verse. Mr. Noel entered the pulpit, and said:

"Having been asked, my brethren, to address a few words to you on this occasion, I gladly avail myself of the opportunity of speaking a few words on this particular point—Why a person who is unhaptized should be baptized, after having made a profession of faith in Jesus Christ in other ways, and perhaps for many years. I believe I have weighed well every considerable argument that has ever been adduced in the maintenance of infant haptism as an addition to, and which evidently becomes a substitution for, the baptism of believers in Christian churches; and have come distinctly to these two conclusions, which appear to me, at least, to be certain. It appears to me to be distinctly proved, first, that baptism, as ordained by Christ, is an immersion in water—a being buried in the water; and. excendly, that immersion is meant to be a profession of faith in Christ. If those two conclusions are correct—and I believe they will completely prevail with the Christian world eventually—then it follows that a person, who, like myself, has only been sprinkled in infancy, is unbaptized, because such a person has neither been immersed, nor has he made a baptismal profession of faith: and these two things constitute Christian baptism. So that if these conclusions are correct, then I, and others, who have been sprinkled in baptism, are in neither sense baptized."

After further remarks by the candidate, a hymn was sung, and prayer offered. Mr.

Noel, and sixteen others, were then baptized.

In the "Metropolitan Pulpit," published in London, in 1839, there is a full description of this eminent minister. It states that Mr. Noel's father "was a baronet, and his mother a peeress in her own right; which accounts for his possessing the title of 'honorable.' Lord Farnham, his brother, and Lady Farnham, his sister-in-law, form part of the household of the Queen." The same writer adds, "I am sure I shall be borne out by all who know anything of the state of religious matters in London, when I say, that he has done more good than any other man of his years."

FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH, NEW YORK.

This Church originated in 1745. In 1747 the Scotch Plains Church, N. J., was organized, and as there were but 13 brethren and sisters in the city, who agreed in their views of doctrine, it was deemed advisable to unite with that Church in 1753, with the understanding that the pastor, Rev. Benj. Miller, should preach in New York occasionally. His preaching was so acceptable that those who wished to hear him could not be accommodated in a private dwelling. A rigging loft in Cart and Horse street, now William street, was hired by the Church. As their numbers increased, they purchased ground in Gold street, and erected a small meeting-house, which was opened March 14, 1760. In 1762, June 19, twenty-seven members of the Scotch Plains Church, having previously received letters of dismission, were recognized as an independent Church. Rev. John Gano entered upon the pastoral charge, and in a few years there were more than 200 members, and the meeting-house was enlarged. The Church continued to prosper till the members were scattered by the war of the Revolution. At the close of the war 37 members were collected. The meeting-house was repaired, having been used as a storehouse and stable. In two years the Church again numbered more than 200 membets. In 1788, Rev. Mr. Gano removed to Kentucky, having been for 26 years the faithful pastor of this church. Rev. Benj. Foster, D.D., was the successor of Gano, and labored ten years, when he was suddenly cut off by yellow fever, Aug. 26, 1798. In Oct., 1800, Rev. William Collier, of Boston, commenced his pastoral labors. The old house was removed in March, 1801, and a stone edifice, 80 feet by 65, erected at a cost of \$25,000, and opened for public worship, May 2, 1802. Rev. J. Chaplin was pastor for a short time. In April, 1805, Rev. Wm. Parkinson, of Md., accepted the pastoral charge. His labors were much blessed, and in 1809 the Church numbered 564 members. He resigned the office, Aug. 11, 1840, having held it for 35 years. Rev. Spencer H. Cone, D.D., became the pastor July 1, 1841, having preached in the Oliver Street Church for 18 years. Among the conditions upon which the present pastor accepted the call, were these: "that the Church should erect such a building on their Broome street lots, as would accommodate our Bible and Missionary Societies, at a merely nominal rent; besides suitable accommodations for the Church and congregation."

The building, (see page 1,) was opened for public worship Feb. 20, 1842. The entire edifice measures 75 feet wide, by 110 on the east side, 87 on Broome street, and 90 on Elizabeth street. The auditory is 75 feet square; the remainder of the building, fronting on Broome street, is occupied by the American and Foreign Bible Society, and the American Baptist Home Mission Society, at an annual rent of one dollar each per annum.

The whole cost of lots and house, interest, &c., was \$75,000.

The number of members reported May, 1849, was 600.

Disciples, Reformers or Campbellites.—Rev. Alexander Hall, of Loydsville, O., has taken much pains to obtain the returns published in "The Christian Register." He reports 848 preachers, 902 meeting-houses, 1898 churches or congregations, and 118,618 communicants. The


