On July 1, 2008, Judy G. Hample was inaugurated as the eighth president of UMW. Dr. Hample is the first woman president that UMW has ever seen and the third president in as many years. She comes to UMW from Pennsylvania's public university system where she was chancellor, prior to which she was chancellor at the State University of Florida where she oversaw 40,000 employees and an annual operating budget of $\$ 5.2$ billion.


Dr. Hample has over 20 years of campus experience as a faculty member and academic administrator. The University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana was her first faculty appointment, while her first administrative appointments were at Western Illinois University. She was also dean at Emporia State University, dean of Indiana Sute University and senior vice president at University of Toledo in Ohid.

Dr. Hample has published numerous scholarly articles and presented research findings in history and communication. She has alsw heen invited to make many presentations before state, regional nnd natisnal associations on topics including leadership, management, accountability, and performance budgeting.

Dr. Hample earned her Bachelor of Arts from David Lipscomh University in Tennessee, and both her master's and foctoral deqrees in communication are from The Ohio State University.

## College Republieans

This year, both Men's and Women's Track and Field saw many records broken and many athletes awarded with top honors. The Men's team brought an All-American performance by senior Justin German in the high jump at the NCAA Division III Indoor National Championships. German went on to become the cowinner of the UMW Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year, became the second men's indoor All-American in the program in as many years and the first to gain national honors in the high jump since 2003. German missed out on nationals by less than an inch in his final jump.

The Women's team has as much to brag about as the Men's, with their 16th consecutive CAC crown under CAC Coach of the Year, Stan Soper. Mae Winchester, senior, was invited to the NCAA Championships for the second straight year in the 400 m hurdles where she placed third in the heat but did not advance to the finals. Brittany Horrigan, freshman, set a new school record in javelin replacing the 25 year mark; following this, Horrigan broke her own record the next weekend; the next weekend, she once again broke her record at the CAC Championships. Finally, Horrigan broke her record for the fourth time with a NCAA provisional qualifying throw of $127^{\prime}, 1^{\prime \prime}$.

Many runners, eventers, hurdlers and jumpers made record breaking news this year as UMW Track and Field continues to be ranked high in Division III sports. Congrats and great work everyone!

Hardware and software: The book was produect using the Walsworth ycarbooks Online Design program by four staff members using their personal computers. Co-Editor Kat Drekinson used a Compaq laptop provided by Walsworth Yearbooks, while eo-Edilor Mlehelle Eseh used a Dell deskitop computer, also provided by Walsworlh. Adobz Photoshop Elements was used in order to erop and edil photos. Advertisements. senior Ads were sold to parents at ihe priees of $\$ 35$ for an elghth of a page, $\$ 65$ for a fourth, $\$ 125$ for a half, and $\$ 250$ for a full page. Parents reeeved notifieation of ad sales through the mail. Ads were designed aceording to
 TWPCChelsea (Page names), AWPClronMaiden (all Iext), and thPCEnooze (Clubs and Dividers), photographe: Underelassmen photos were provided by the University IĐ Center and were eropped and placed by co-editor in Chief Mlehzlle Eseh. Faculty photos were also eropped and plaeed by Eseh and were provided by the Offiez of Hews and Puble Information. Senior portrats were taken by appontment wilh Candid Color Photography, 11010 Baeon Raee Road, Woodbridge, Virginia 22192. deniors were notified of avalable pholo dates through the mail, emall announeements and flyers placed around campus. The photos were then eropped and placed by eo-Uditor in Chal Kat Drekinson. epports photographs were laken by Clint Often. Wriling and design: till body eopy and headlines were written by staff members. Pividers and seetion layouts were designed by Eseh and Piekinson. The lifle page, opening and elosing were designed by co-Editor in Chig Mlichelle Esch. Distribution: The 2009 Batllefield was distributed in fall 2009. Books were also malled to benior's permanent addresses that were on file with the administration. Funding for the yearbook was provided by the ODAC〕 Finanee Commillee and revenue qarned from exnior Ads.
