



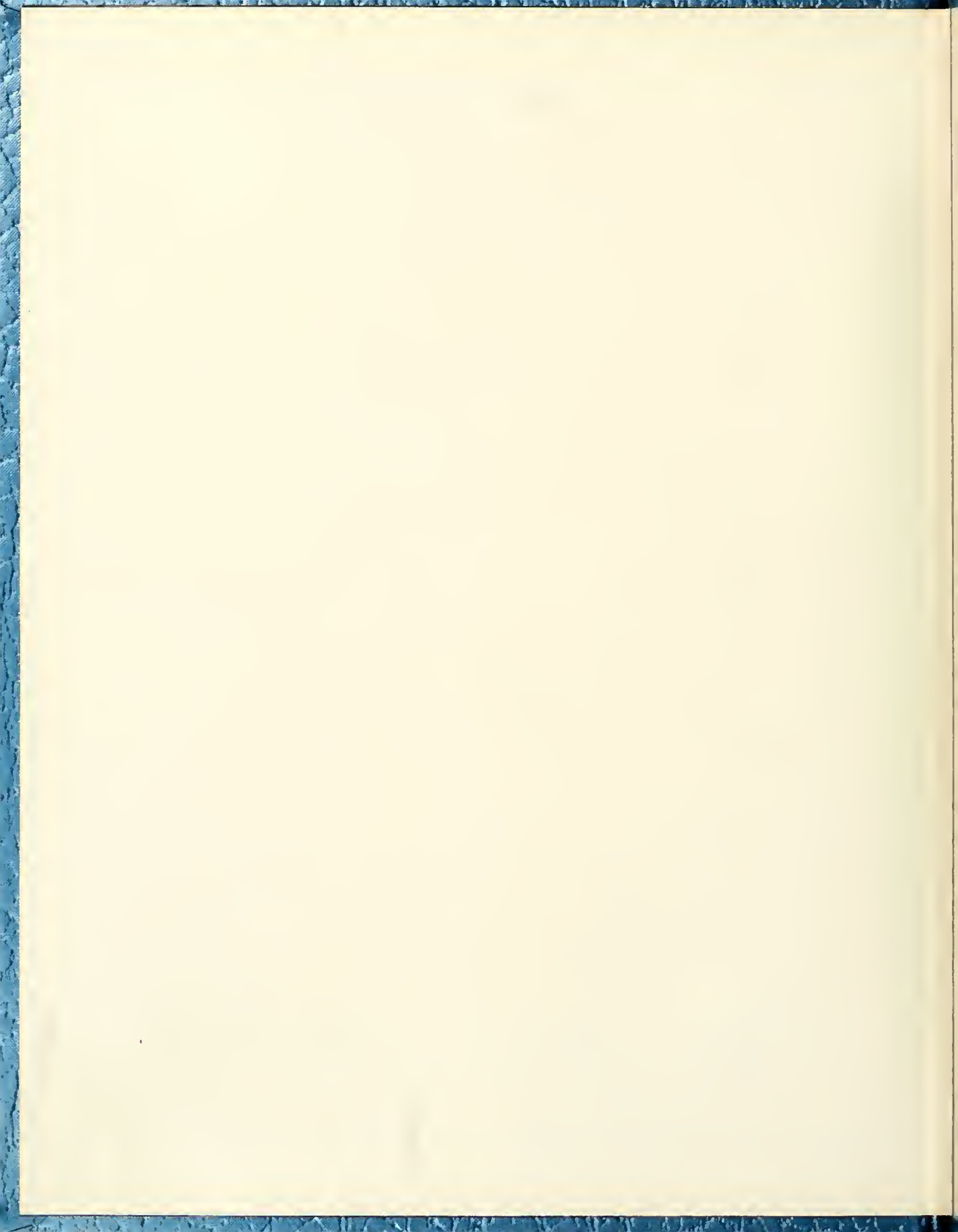

Live deep within the heart.

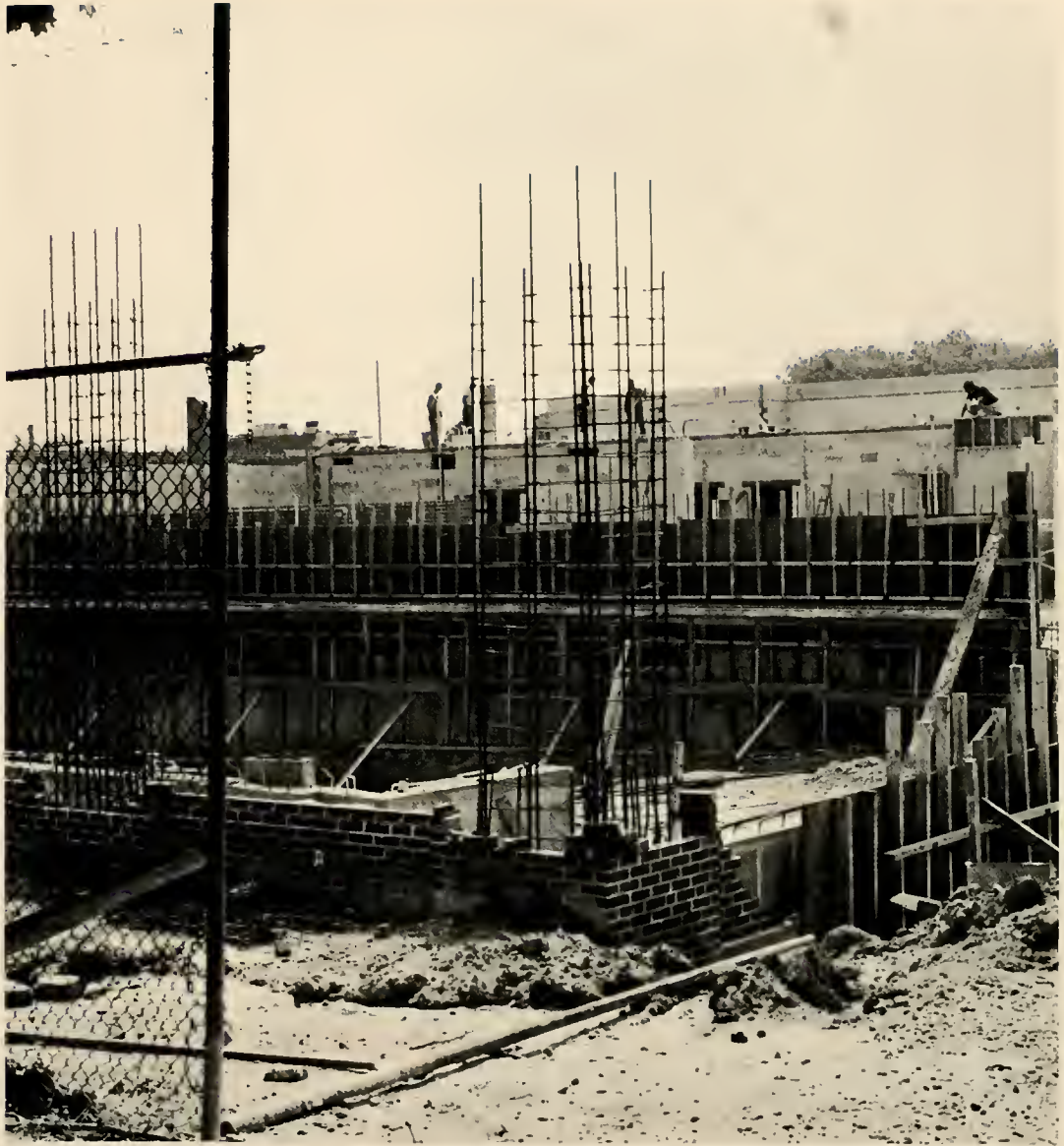
